

EMERGENCY ARRANGEMENTS.

The Hospital is earmarked as a Casualty Receiving Station with 100 casualty beds, a proportion being available for civilian sick.

ACCOMMODATION AND FACILITIES.

The bed complement of the Hospital at 31st December, 1940, was 105, divided as follows:—

Private Ward Charges range from £3 13s. 6d. to £5 5s. 0d. per week. These charges include accommodation, board, nursing, medical, necessary stimulants and surgical dressings. Private patients make their own arrangements for their personal laundry. A charge of £1 1s. 0d. will be made for the use of the operating theatre. Patients should arrange with their physician or surgeon the fees to be paid for treatment or operation and the fee for the anæsthetist, all such sums being paid direct by the patient, and being additional to the Hospital charges.

The Nelson Hospital, although situated outside the Parish of Wimbledon, deals with a large number of cases from that area. As will be seen from the statistics given on page 8 37% of its in-patients and 29% of its out-patients treated in 1940 were Wimbledon residents.

The Nelson is the only Voluntary Hospital in the Districts of Wimbledon, Merton and Morden that has a Maternity Department.

Forty-First Annual Report

THE Council of Management of The Nelson Hospital has pleasure in submitting its Report for 1940, together with audited accounts. The latter show an excess of expenditure over receipts of £980, income amounting to £15,932 and outgoings of £16,912.

The following contributions are gratefully acknowledged:—Mr. Louis

Club, £18; Merton Cricket Club (per Mr. W. Paice), £12 3s. 7d.;
Merton Football Club (per Mr. Clayton), £7 14s. 2d.; Boys of Kings
College School, £20; Pupils of Wimbledon High School, £25.

In addition to the £50 contributed by Mr. Louis Dreyfus referred to above, the Hospital is indebted to him for an air conditioning plant for the main operating theatre.

Subscriptions and Donations together show a decrease of £206, the former being up by £36 and the latter down by £242. Included in the subscriptions is the sum of £101 representing income-tax recovered in respect of Seven Year Covenants.

The Hospital is indebted to Dr. Wilkins for collecting the sum of £55 6s. towards the cost of a much-needed Boyle's Anæsthetic apparatus.

Receipts on account of services rendered amounted to £11,541 against £11,322 in 1939—made up as follows (a) from Patients and their Societies, £7,337 (against £7,734), (b) from Public Authorities £594 (against £620); Government Emergency Scheme—contributions towards Cost of Casualty Service £3,610 (against £2,968).

The extent of the Government payments on Maintenance Account is confined to contributions, at an agreed rate, towards the cost of services rendered.

The rising tendency in the cost of running the Hospital is being accentuated by further increases in the prices of necessary commodities coupled with the addition of the Purchase Tax. As regards the latter there is no exemption under the Finance Act in favour of Hospitals or other charitable institutions.

The Council has to record, with deep regret, the passing away of Mrs.
V. H. Blackman, a highly respected member of the
OBITUARY. Board of Management, who for 15 years served the
Hospital with loyalty and devotion.

In accordance with the Constitution and Rules a proportion of the members of the Council retire at each ANNUAL RETIREMENTS. Annual General Meeting and are eligible for re-election. Those retiring in 1941 are Mr. J. D. Casswell, K.C., Miss I. B. Jeeves, Mr. Wm. Paice, the Rev. F. Rankin, S.J., and the Rev. T. H. Voysey.

By the death of Mrs. Blackman and the resignation of Mrs. H. Rathbone two vacancies are created on the VACANCIES ON THE COUNCIL Council. During the year, owing to AND MEDICAL RESIGNATION. removal from the District, Dr. G. A. Eason resigned from the Hon. Medical Staff, the vacancy being filled by the appointment of Dr. F. Seaton Winton.

The Council is greatly indebted to Lt.-Col. H. E. Fooks, O.B.E., who so kindly offered his services in a voluntary EQUIPMENT OFFICER. capacity as Equipment Officer. Under his direction a complete inventory has been prepared of the contents of the Hospital.

The Association, having a year ago bought as much material and as many blankets, etc., as possible before prices rose LADIES' LINEN and permits had to be obtained, is still solvent. The number of subscribers is, unfortunately, still decreasing owing to various reasons, chiefly evacuation. The Association is hoping to carry on till better days return, and new subscribers are obtained. The Mending Guild is doing heroic work; some of the articles might now be described as a little original material entirely surrounded by patches. Eggs are a great problem as they are very badly needed for the patients, and so far none have been available for preserving. Last year's Pound Day was far more satisfactory than had been anticipated, though, naturally, there was a very marked falling off in many of the goods collected, such as sugar.

The Council records its high appreciation of the generous support afforded to the Hospital by Subscribers and Donors, Religious Bodies, Social and Sports Clubs, and other organisations.

The grateful thanks of the Council are extended to the Hospital Departmental staffs, who have carried out their onerous duties in a spirit of loyalty and self-sacrifice. In connection with the voluntary workers special mention must be made of the relief afforded to the Secretarial Department by Mr. Wm. Paice who acts as Food Officer to the Hospital in supervising the ration books of Patients and Staff; also of the assistance so willingly and efficiently rendered by Reception Clerks, Stretcher Bearers, Telephonists, etc.

The receipt is acknowledged with many grateful thanks of medical apparatus on loan from the American Red Cross Society.

Of the 1,664 patients 406 were admitted to the Maternity Wing, including 29 Emergency Cases and 22 admitted MATERNITY, for Ante-Natal treatment. The number of ANTE-NATAL, ETC. infants born was 388. New patients dealt with in the Ante-Natal Department totalled 266, attendances being 1,435. The new patients treated in the Infant Welfare Department numbered 131. Attendances in this Department totalled 1,067.

OPERATIONS. The operations in the Theatre under anæsthetics numbered 523. In addition 1,012 anæsthetics were adminstered in the Casualty Theatre.

The Association of Friends of The Nelson Hospital.

The "Association of Friends" is now in its ninth year. The principle of giving one penny a week regularly appeals to most people. No one misses one penny a week, but pennies soon mount up. We are sure that our many good "Friends" who have already joined the Association will never regret their timely help in our great need. We are very grateful to them not only for their actual giving but for the hearty goodwill with which they and the members of their households have done it. At the present time we have 684 household boxes out, but we hope that friends of the Hospital will help us to increase this number. These boxes are in addition to the 83 old wooden hospital boxes and the 18 Trafalgar Guild boxes which we took over. There are also 12 "Friends" who give subscriptions or donations instead of having boxes.

The boxes are opened every three months. Hon. Stewards, who have special Warrants of Authority, call at the houses, open the boxes, count the money in the presence of the householders, mark on the boxes the amounts collected and give official receipts for them. They then re-seal the boxes and, where the totals collected to date have exceeded Half a Guinea, One Guinea, Two Guineas and so on, they put on special coloured labels to indicate this. At the end of each quarter the Appeal Committee, which governs the Association, meets, and at this Meeting allocates the money to the Hospital. Thus, the money is paid over quarterly instead of annually.

Since the Association started in 1932, up to the end of 1940, we have been able to pay over to the Hospital the sum of £3,784. This total is the result of the regular giving of all our "Friends," whether by the contributions in their boxes, by annual and quarterly subscriptions or by donations.

There are three things we still urgently need. First, we want more "Friends." Everyone who is interested in the Hospital should join the Association by taking one of our boxes. Secondly, we want those who have joined to keep up their contributions and to help us still further by telling their friends about the Association and by asking them to take a household box. Thirdly, we want many more Hon. Stewards to help us during the four collecting months. This merely means work on a couple of evenings every three months, but such work is invaluable. The Appeal Secretary will be only too glad to give any further information about this work of Stewards and about the Association generally.
