

Information as to the Admission of Patients.

THE JENNY LIND HOSPITAL FOR CHILDREN.

Parents are asked to contribute a small amount towards the cost of treatment, unless they have provided for this through one of the contributory funds.

IN-PATIENTS.

No child can be admitted without the recommendation of a Subscriber, except in cases of accident or great urgency, when the patient is admitted without delay.

Children eligible for admission as in-patients are boys from two to ten years, and girls from two to twelve years of age, **not** suffering **from an infectious or contagious disease.** A limited number of children under the age of two years are admitted at the discretion of the Committee of Management.

All patients are discharged at the expiration of two months, unless the Medical Officer is of opinion that further treatment is requisite, in which case a fresh recommendation must be obtained at the expiration of the first two months and every two succeeding months.

TIME OF ADMISSION :- Daily, before 11 a.m., except Sunday.

VISITING HOURS :- Saturdays, from Two-thirty to Three o'clock in the Afternoon, but owing to risk of infection, Visitors are not to be allowed inside the Wards except under special circumstances.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Children of both sexes, up to the age of twelve years, are treated as out-patients, without recommendation.

TIME OF ADMISSION :- At 9.30 a.m., every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday.

PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS

Governors (i.e., Subscribers of $\pounds 1$ 1s. at least annually) and Subscribers are each year entitled to In-door Recommendations for patients according to the following scale :—

- Annual Subscribers for each £1 1s. may recommend One In-patient.
- The representatives of organised Collections and Friendly Societies for each £1 1s. may recommend One In-patient.
- For each Church or Chapel Collection the Clergyman, Minister or representative for each £1 1s. may recommend (within a year after payment) One In-patient.
- The Norwich Hospitals and Medical Institutions Sunday and Saturday Fund Committee for each £1 1s. may recommend One In-patient.
- Benefactors of not less than 20 Guineas may recommend One In-patient annually.

No individual Governor is entitled to have more than two patients in the Hospital at one time.

All Subscriptions are due on the 1st of January in each year, and no Governor or Subscriber whose subscription is six months in arrear is entitled to exercise any privilege in connection with the Hospital. No new Subscriber has the right to vote at a Board meeting unless his or her subscription shall have been paid three months previously, but Life Governors are at once entitled to every privilege of the Hospital.

FINANCE.

The Income for the year amounted to $\pounds 7,865$ 4s. 4d., as compared with $\pounds 7,902$ 16s. 8d. in 1927, whereas the expenditure for 1928 was $\pounds 7,590$ 3s. 0d., compared with $\pounds 8,185$ 0s. 3d. for 1927, showing a balance of income over expenditure of $\pounds 275$ 1s. 4d.

It is gratifying to know that the Annual Subscriptions have increased by £93 5s. 1d., although a large number of Subscribers have died during the year.

£228 was received for the support of Cots.

The average daily cost per patient was 6/9, and the average stay of each child in Hospital was nine days and excluding cases of Tonsils and Adenoids was $18\frac{1}{2}$ days.

The Norwich Hospitals and Medical Institutions Sunday and Saturday Fund, by their excellent Contributory Scheme, has again exceeded all records in providing £3,480 or £84 more than last year.

A Legacy was received during the year under the Will of the late Mr. J. B. Forrester, amounting to £100.

A list of friends who have remembered the Hospital in their distribution of Clothing, Linen, Toys, Fruit, etc., is given on page 53. Gifts of this kind are welcomed by the Matron, who can always find use for the smallest contribution.

A list of special donations received during the year in connection with the Building Fund appears on page 33.

The Committee of Management is very grateful for the interest and financial support received. Special efforts to help the Hospital Funds have again been numerous and are specifically mentioned on page 34.

THE LATE MR. J. B. FORRESTER.

Your Committee have been unfortunate in losing one of its oldest members, Mr. J. B. Forrester, who died on 7th July.

Mr. Forrester had been connected with the Committee of Management for a long period of years, lately as Trustee, and was Chairman from 1909 to 1911. He had recently subscribed £500 for a Cot in his Sister's name—" The Ann Forrester " Cot.

Mrs. F. G. L. Moore, Miss Southall, and Mrs. White were also elected Honorary Life Governors on the nomination of the Alexandra Rose Day Committee.

Mr. Arthur Blanden was appointed as Honorary Life Governor in recognition of his services as Honorary Secretary of the Alexandra Rose Day Committee for the past six years.

RESIGNATION OF DR. BURTON MARSHALL.

The resignation of Dr. Burton Marshall, Honorary Physician was accepted with great regret and Dr. B. K. Nutman, the Senior Assistant Physician, was appointed to take his place.

NORWICH EGG WEEK.

Norwich Egg Week, organised by Mr. F. B. Seago, has again resulted in this Hospital receiving 20,000 eggs. Your Committee desire to express their great appreciation to Mr. Seago for his untiring efforts in this connection.

COTS.

No new Cots have been founded this year, but Cots still provided for are enumerated in the Income Account on page 20.

VISIT OF H.R.H. THE PRINCE OF WALES.

The Hospital was honoured by a visit of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales on May 30th, who made a tour of inspection of all Wards, expressed his appreciation and signed the Visitors' Book.

STONE-LAYING CEREMONY, NEW OUT-PATIENT AND SPECIAL DEPARTMENTS BLOCK.

On July 2nd, the Foundation Stone of the new Out-Patient Department was laid by Mrs. Raymond Maude, O.B.E., daughter of "Jenny Lind," who was accompanied by her son, Mr. Charles R. Maude. The ceremony of dedication was performed by the Lord Bishop of Norwich.

PYM HOUSE (NURSES' HOSTEL).

This Hostel was declared open by Mrs. Raymond Maude on July 2nd. The comfort and quiet is much appreciated by the Nurses.

GIFTS.

Two dining room chairs, forming formerly part of a suite belonging to Jenny Lind, have been presented to the Hospital by Mr. H. E. Stringer, of Sheringham.

A letter, a very interesting Memento of Jenny Lind, was received from Mrs. Raymond Maude, as a gift to the Jenny Lind Hospital. The letter is from Bishop Stanley, of Norwich, to Jenny Lind, and is dated 10th July, 1847, and it was asking her to stay at the Palace when she came to sing at Norwich that year.

LADIES' WORK ASSOCIATION.

The Annual Presentation of Linen was made on October 10th by Miss Southall, sister of the Sheriff, in the Eaton Parish Hall. This Association has again made a splendid contribution of linen and garments and very grateful thanks are due to Mrs. Harker (President), Miss Muriel (Treasurer), Mrs. R. W. Collinson (Honorary Secretary) and the Vice-Presidents and Members who devote so much time and thought all the year to provide the work.

The total number of garments presented was 1274, made up as follows :—Ladies' Work Association, 897; Norfolk and South Walsham District Division of Red Cross, 236; Red Cross (County), 40; Drayton Working Party, 101.

In addition to this, Mrs. Bullard's Working Party at Wroxham presented 706 articles of clothing. Materials have

been made up by Working Parties at Cley, Aldborough, Kirby Bedon and the Reepham Red Cross Society, the Whissonsett Mothers' Union and the Women's Institutes at Brundall, Barningham, Holkham, and Krapton.

TINFOIL.

This Hospital is now in a position to appeal for Tinfoil and it is hoped that in due time sufficient money will be obtained from this source to endow a Cot. By this means a very great deal of money has been received by various Hospitals and it is hoped that all friends will encourage children to save and collect so that the proceeds of the sale may be put towards the endowment of a Cot. The class of material which is suitable is :—Tobacco wrappings (free from paper), Foil from cigarettes and chocolates, metal capsules, lead soldiers, or any piece of broken lead.

This should be sent to the Almoning Office at the Hospital, or, on receipt of a post card, arrangements will be made for collection.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The Honorary Secretary has this year made a personal appeal for new Subscribers, which has resulted in obtaining 52 new Subscribers and a total additional income of £87 15s. 0d. In this he was helped by a gentleman in the County offering an annual subscription of Twenty Guineas if twenty new annual subscribers of £1 1s. 0d. each could be obtained before the end of the year.

Your Committee feel that they owe a further debt of gratitude to Mr. Harper Smith for this additional service he has rendered to the Hospital.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT.

Your Committee cannot conclude this report without mention of the services rendered by the Hospital Staff. The Honorary Medical Staff, the Lady Superintendent, the Sisters, Nurses, and Domestic Staff, have all through the year given devoted service and the Committee on behalf of the public generally tenders them grateful thanks for work un-

grudgingly done. The Committee also desires to acknowledge the services rendered by the Honorary Secretary for his devoted work, and to Messrs. Bullimore & Co., the Honorary Auditors.

The Committee of Management desires, in its concluding paragraph, to express its deep and sincere gratitude to all contributors to its funds, for the generous help which it has received in the past year. The support received has been a great encouragement and it is hereby most warmly acknowledged.

Medical Officers' Report

In nearly every Department of the Hospital the work done in 1928 shows a considerable increase over that of the previous year, as the figures accompanying this report testify. The total number of beds, including 12 set aside for tonsils and adenoid cases and 6 in the two Observation wards, is 80, and the average daily occupation throughout the year was 60. On several occasions every bed and cot was occupied. It was only possible to maintain this high average by the exclusion of infectious diseases, which are filtered by the Observation Wards, but in spite of these precautions infection will occasionally gain entry into the general wards, each of which had to be closed for one week on this account during last year.

The drop from sixteen-and-a-half days to nine days as the average duration of stay of each In-Patient is explained by the large increase in the number of children admitted for throat operations, an increase of 379 over that of the previous year. These children stay for one or two nights only.

The number of treatments given in the Artificial Sunlight and Massage and Electrical Departments shews an increase of over 4,000, and at the Ear, Nose, and Throat Clinic there was an increase of nearly 300 attendances.

With the increase in the population in the vicinity of the Hospital the number of cases treated in the Casualty Department is increasing yearly, which all points to the need for the increased accommodation which will be provided in the nearly completed new Out-Patient and Special Departments Block. Provision has been made in this Block for these various special departments.
