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# THE EAST END MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

## CLINICAL REPORT.

1937.

### MATERNAL MORTALITY.

1. Case No 3968. Multipara, age 40, admitted with prolapse of cervix and offensive discharge. Temperature  $100.2^{\circ}$ . Two days later, rigor; came into labour and delivered of a still-born stinking foetus. Transferred to Queen Charlotte's Isolation Hospital where she died.

P.M. Intense general peritonitis, uterus infected throughout, becoming gangrenous. Mixed infection of both peritoneum and blood. Hæmolytic streptococcus not present.

2. Case No. 3486. 11 Para, age 43. Continuous abdominal pain; no dilatation. Sudden collapse and death.

P.M. Uterine rupture into both broad ligaments. Heart wall thin and fatty.

3. Case No 3,915. A patient, had one miscarriage, admitted with a marginal placenta prævia. Labour was slow and delivery effected with forceps. There was a good deal of bleeding before delivery and atonic post-partum hæmorrhage from which she died.

The attendances at the Ante-Natal Clinic totalled 11,684 and 1,435 of these visits were made to the Medical Officer's Clinic.

The homes of all patients booked for attendance in the District were visited, and 462 special visits paid to those patients suffering from ante-natal disorders.

Although in all cases a Wassermann reaction was taken if the history was suspicious either pre-natally or post-natally, no specimen of blood proved positive.

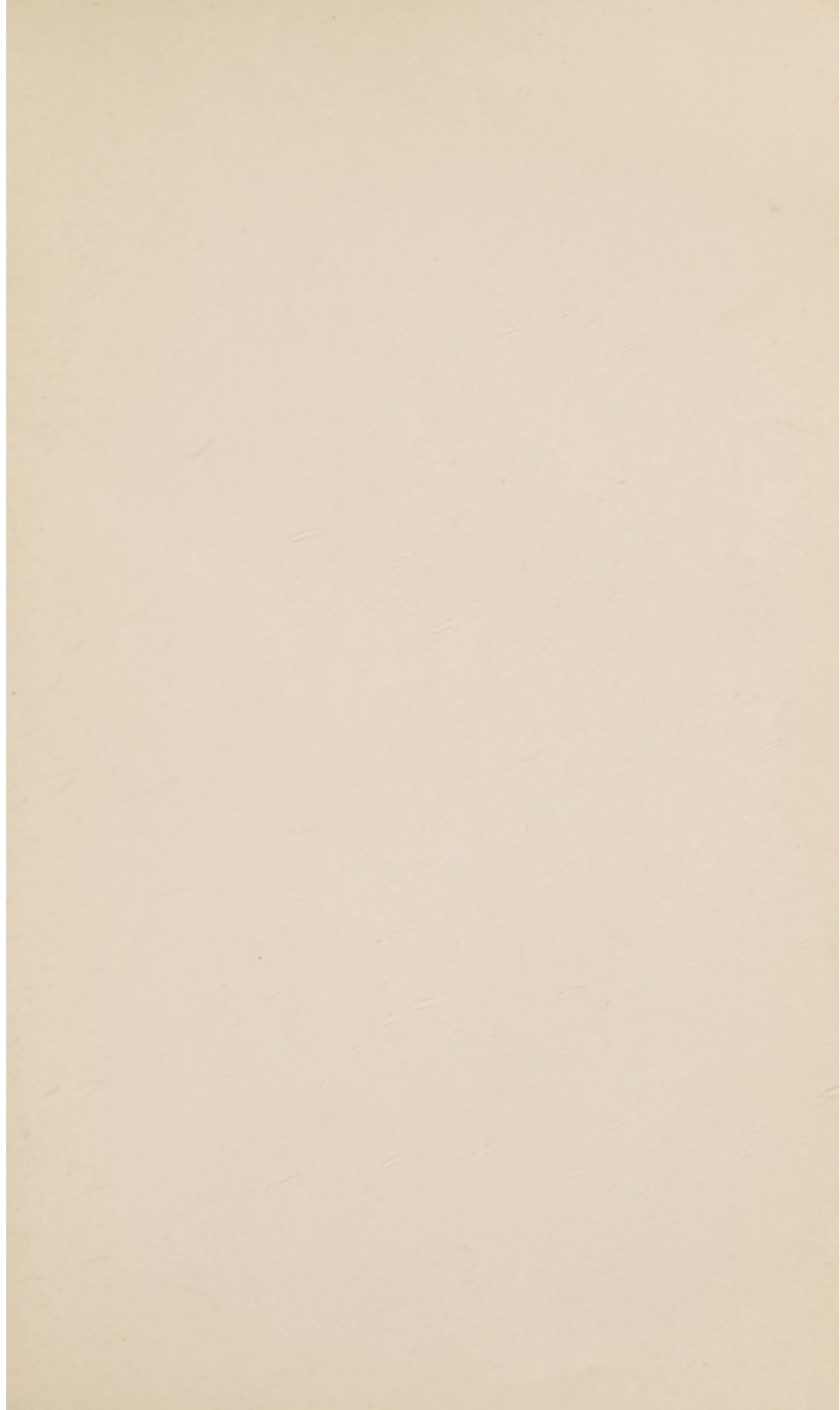
