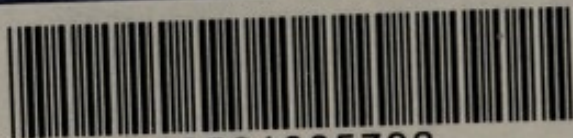

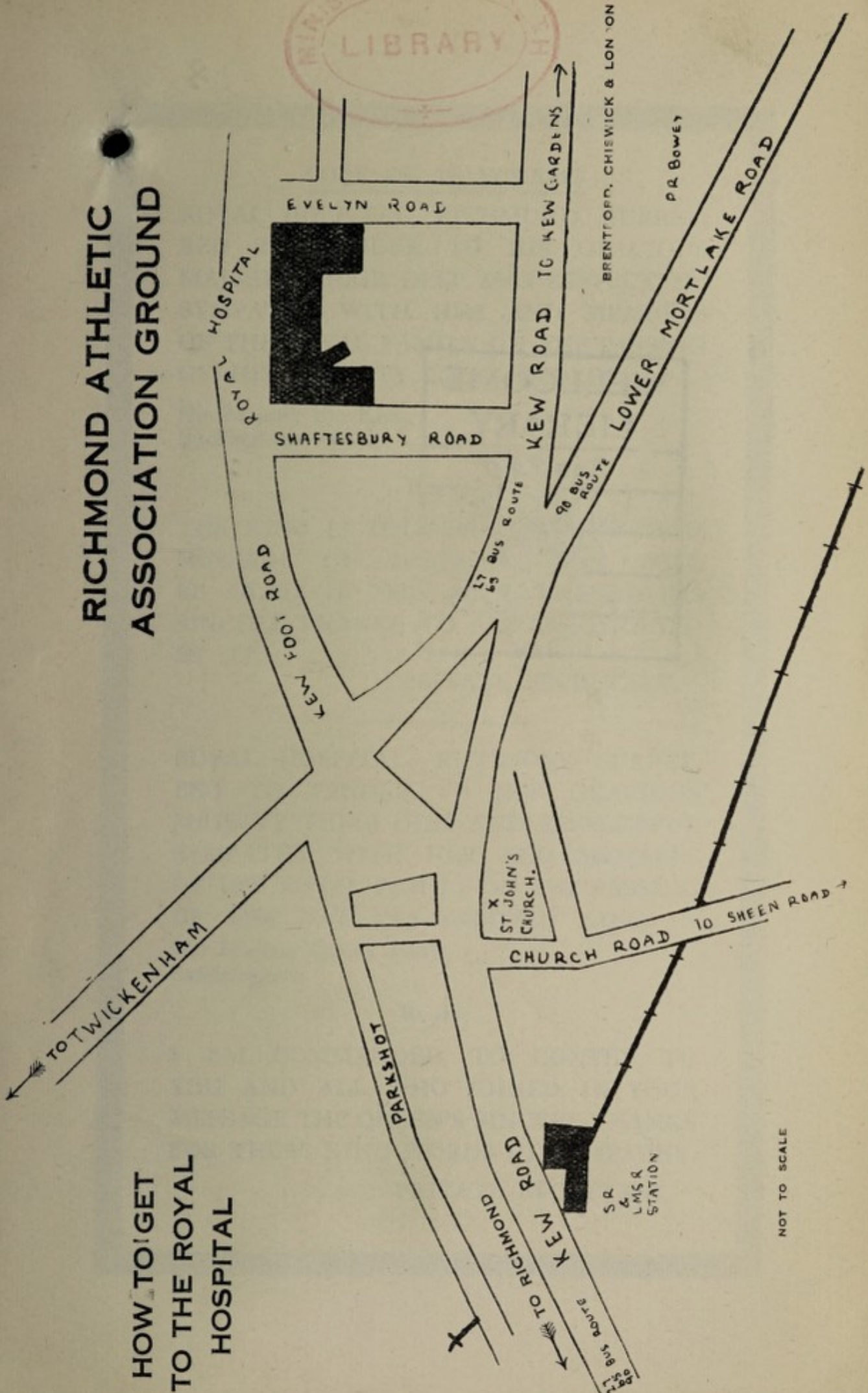

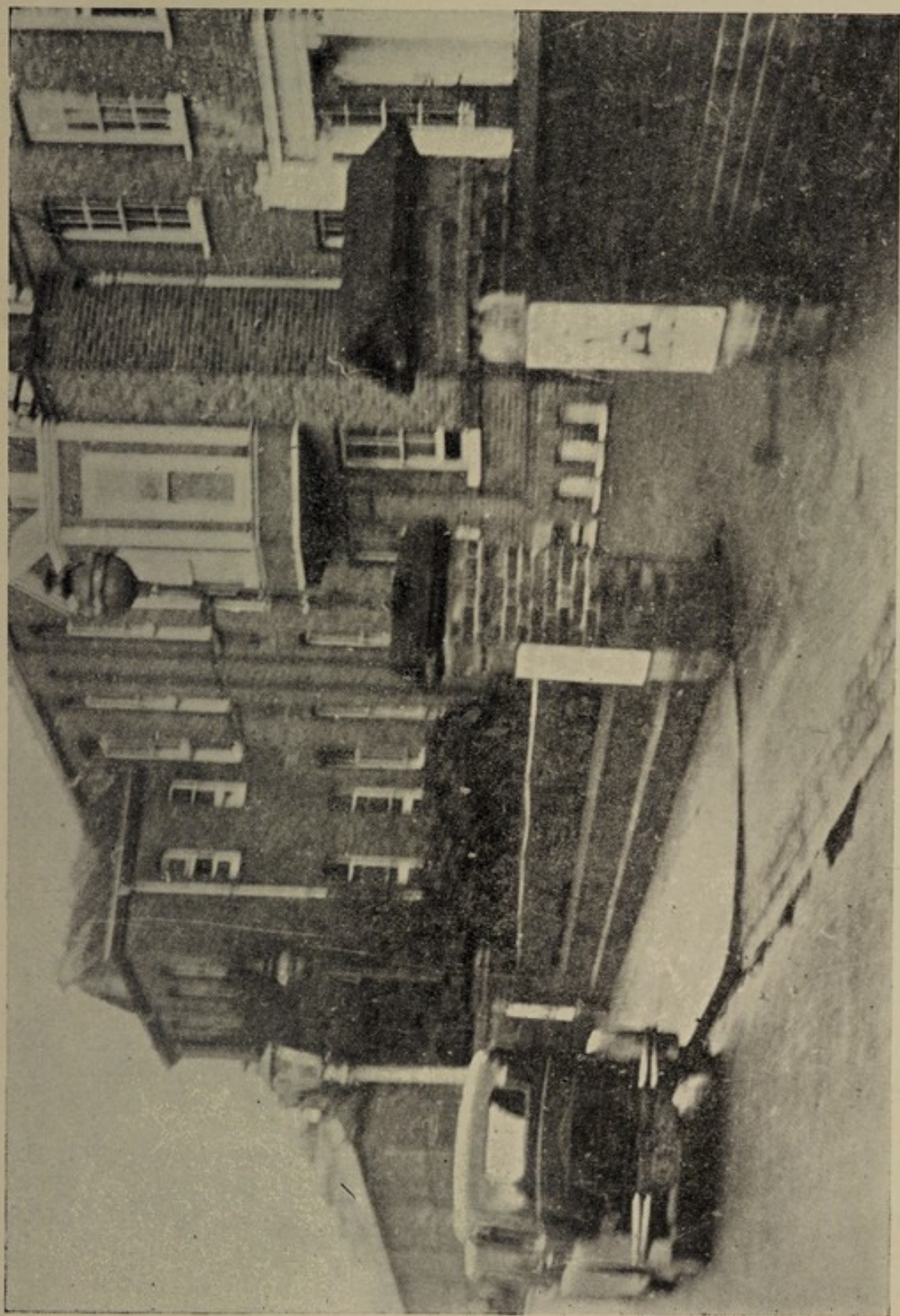

Sixty-Eighth Annual Report

1935.

1935 was perhaps the most eventful year in the history of the Royal Hospital. The splendid generosity of the late Mrs. Annie Pattison, by the bequest under her will, has enabled the administration to carry into effect extensions and improvements that a few months ago were merely hopes and aspirations. The work made steady progress under the supervision of the Secretary-Superintendent, and when completed will provide the following:—

A complete new kitchen, stores, cold storage, and still-room, with the most modern equipment, built over the Children's Ward. Another storey added to the Nurses' Home, giving 13 additional bedrooms, Sisters' sitting room, and Staff Nurses' sitting room. The entire redecoration of the Children's Ward, a new Jarrah wood floor, the rebuilding of the Ward kitchen, lavatory block and the provision of a sun verandah for the use of children who are convalescent.

A duty room for the Theatre Staff.

Redecoration of the main Wards, enlargement of the Ward kitchens, equipped with refrigerators and tiling of Ward lavatories.

The conversion of the old kitchen block into general offices, heat treatment and massage departments.

A sun verandah for the Women's Ward.

Hotlock waggons to convey the food to the Wards by means of a new electric lift.

A seven horse power Austin van for the use of the collector. This has been found very useful, not only for his duties as collector of money, but also for the conveyance of goods in connection with "Pound Day" and in many other ways.

A shed for Out-patients to house perambulators, erected near the Out-patients' entrance.

The Committee hope to retain a substantial portion of the invested funds taken over from the late Mrs. Pattison's estate, but would remind its supporters that increased facilities invariably mean additional yearly expenditure, and their generous

help will not only have to be maintained, but augmented if the better service created is to be rendered in its fullest capacity.

Pay Beds.—Since the opening of the new extension in 1931 the two pay beds have been well occupied, and from the time of opening to the end of 1935 have yielded no less than £1,300 8s.

Vice-Chairman.—Owing to ill-health, Mr. A. H. Etherington, J.P., who for some years has been Vice-Chairman of the Hospital, found that he was unable to continue, and Mr. G. C. Sunley kindly took over the duties of Vice-Chairman and Chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee.

Vice-President.—Mr. A. H. Etherington has been appointed a Vice-President.

Alderman J. T. Mears.—A great loss was sustained by the death of Alderman J. T. Mears, who for many years had been a generous supporter and had defrayed the cost of a complete new wireless installation throughout the Hospital in 1934.

Joint Honorary Treasurer.—It is with much regret we have to report the resignation of Captain W. L. E. Gordon, who was the Joint Honorary Treasurer since 1927. Councillor Calvert H. E. Smith has been appointed in his place.

Committee of Management.—Members retiring this year in accordance with the Articles of Association, and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election, are:—Mr. H. C. Blyde, M.C., Admiral E. M. Phillpotts, C.B., Mr. J. C. Shoobert, Major-General Sir Dudley Ridout, K.B.E., C.B., C.M.G., Mr. G. C. Sunley, and Mr. W. Sanderson, J.P.

Resident Medical Staff.—Dr. E. D. Falconer and Dr. Keith F. Stephens have been appointed to succeed Dr. E. Pugh-Jones and Dr. J. Patrick Fitzgerald.

Training Department.—Lectures in accordance with the syllabus of the General Nursing Council have been given as usual. Medical Lectures, Dr. T. A. Matthews; Surgical and Gynæcological Lectures, Mr. J. W. Heekes, M.B., B.S.; Anatomy and Physiology, Dr. D. Dunlop; Hygiene, Dr. C. S. Brebner, D.S.O. (M.O.H.); Practical Nursing, tests and revision, Matron.

Examinations have been held at the end of each course with satisfactory results.

Thanks are due to the Examiners for setting papers and conducting viva voce examinations. Examiners: Dr. T. A. Matthews, Mr. J. W. Heekes, M.B., B.S., Dr. D. Dunlop, Dr. C. S. Brebner, D.S.O., and Miss M. Scott Riddell, A.R.R.C.

Six nurses have completed training and gained the Hospital Certificate and Badge. Some are holding appointments at other Hospitals and others are taking additional certificates.

The results at the State Examinations have been satisfactory.

Thirteen Probationers entered the Hospital during 1935; of these six have signed for the full period of training, three are awaiting medical examination prior to signing their agreement, four have left, two to train nearer their homes and two to train later.

A Sister Tutor has been appointed to act as Home Sister and to give the lectures, revision and coaching classes. These take place daily and classes are duplicated where necessary.

Classroom.—A series of special instruction charts and anatomy models have been added to this department, which is equipped in accordance with the syllabus of the General Nursing Council. These additions are of the greatest possible service in training the Nurses, and the Committee desire to express their gratitude to the donor.

Public Health Act.—The Committee once again have pleasure in acknowledging the annual grants, as set out in the list of subscriptions and donations, made by the following Authorities under the power conferred on them by the Public Health Act, 1925, and desire to offer their thanks publicly for the sympathetic consideration of these bodies:—

Linen League and Ladies' Working Party.—The Committee desire to express thanks to the Linen League and Ladies' Working Party for the valuable work which they have continued for so many years, and this assistance is a source of great encouragement to the Committee. In 1935 they gave £50 towards the Linen League Bed in the Women's Ward, £30 towards the maintenance of a cot in the Children's Ward, over £180 to provide house linen, etc., and £20 for anæsthetic gowns. To Mrs. Wm. Sandover, the Hon. Secretary, the mem-

bers of the Linen League, and the members of the Working Party, the Committee take this opportunity to express their sincere appreciation of their splendid work and unfailing support.

Junior Branch of Linen League.—A Junior Branch was formed in September, 1935, for children of all ages, with Lady Mary Cambridge as the President, the object being to collect during the year either money, tinfoil or used postage stamps, to maintain a cot in the Children's Ward. The Committee also desire to express their thanks to Miss Sandover, the Hon. Secretary, and the members of the Committee, and to wish this new branch of the Linen League every success.

Friends of the Hospital.—The Committee of Management very much appreciate the continued help received from the Friends of the Hospital Association, and desire to express their thanks to all those who have assisted in its work.

The Association has now completed its third year, and once again the policy has been to help and increase the existing Hospital functions, such as Pound Day, Rose Day and the Christmas Tree collection, and has been most successful.

In addition, the sum of £200 has been raised by a Bridge and Whist Drive, and the Garden Fete held at the Hospital in June. The Committee of the Friends of the Hospital are most grateful to the Girls' County School, the Old Vicarage School, and Broomfield House School for their kindness in holding Concerts, Sales of Work, etc., and to Mrs. Riley for a Sale of Work, all of which brought in welcome donations to the funds.

The Associates now number 230, and all of them have been called on for help from time to time. The Committee consists of representatives from Richmond, Kew, Kew Gardens, North Sheen, East Sheen, St. Margaret's, East Twickenham, Twickenham, Barnes, and Petersham. The aim of the Committee is to extend its representation to all districts served by the Hospital, and the Hon. Secretary, Mrs. J. H. Houghton, 5, Holmesdale Road, Kew Gardens, will be glad to have the names of any ladies who would be willing to join the Association. There is no subscription, and Associates may choose when, where, and how they like to help.

Pound Day.—This was again organised by Councillor Mrs. Ellen Edwards, and was a greater success than ever. The Committee are most grateful both to Councillor Mrs. Ellen Edwards and to all those who so generously assisted her. The Hospital was honoured by an inaugural visit from the Mayors and Mayoresses of Richmond, Barnes, and Twickenham. In the afternoon the Arthur Rees Players again came in costume to present their gifts.

Hospital Cricket Match.—Unfortunately it was found impossible to arrange for this match during the season, but a strong Committee, under the Chairmanship of Captain W. L. E. Gordon (founder of the match), has now been formed, and there is every prospect of a renewal of this interesting and helpful function.

Blood Transfusion Service.—During the past year the London Blood Transfusion Service have supplied many donors to this Hospital, without fee or cost, and the Committee are very grateful to both the donors and the Service for this assistance.

Gifts in Kind.—The Committee are particularly grateful for the many valuable and useful gifts in kind, a list of which appears on pages 83-86. The fund for the entertainment of the patients at Christmas received generous support, and the arrangements made by the Staff to brighten the wards were much appreciated by both patients and visitors.

Special Departments.—The Massage and Electro-Therapeutic Department and X-Ray Department continue to afford facilities for the treatment and care of the patients.

Legacies and Contributions of £50 and Over.—Particulars of these will be found on pages 87 and 68 of the report.

Special Efforts.—During the year special efforts have been made by organisations outside the Hospital to raise funds, and the Committee desire to express their thanks to the following for the very kind assistance given:—Alexandra Rose Day (Mrs. Riley and Mrs. J. 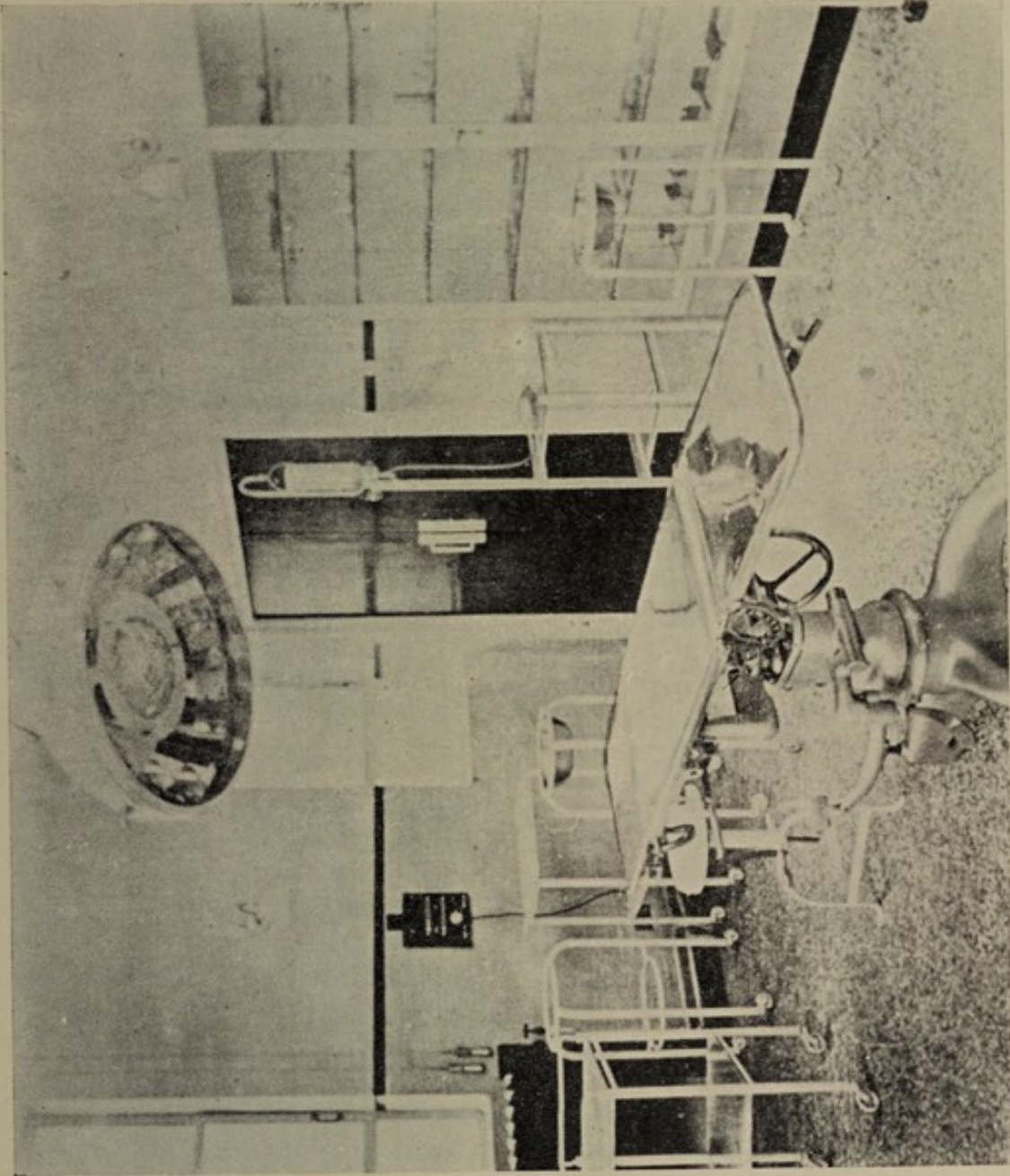

Children whose physical condition may be the result of neglect or indifference on the part of their parents are referred to the N.S.P.C.C.

Arrangements made for the care of children during the mother's stay in Hospital.

A blind patient whose husband died suddenly, leaving her very little money, was put in touch with a Blind Society and is now in receipt of a pension.

A small boy suffering from an incurable and very crippling disease was attending in the Out-patient Department. It became increasingly difficult for his mother to look after him properly, not only on account of her own health, but also because an older brother totally crippled from the same disease claimed all her attention. Arrangements were made for his admission to a Cripples' Home, where he is now perfectly happy and contented with other children.

The cost of convalescence and fares this year amounted to £232 5s. 9d. and of instruments and dentures £771 4s. 8d., a total increase of £155 2s. 5d. on 1934. The following figures indicate the varied sources from which this money was raised:—

HON. CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

The patients are visited every Friday afternoon, and services are held in the wards every Sunday from 5—6 p.m. The clergy are available for special calls at all hours. Holy Communion is celebrated in the wards at the greater festivals, and the Blessed Sacrament is brought to individuals at any time as need and opportunity arise. A number of children have been baptised.

The clergy are always glad to be notified of people going into Hospital, and especially of those desiring to receive the Holy Communion there, so that there may be no fear of their being missed, as may happen through their being asleep or receiving medical attention at the ordinary visiting time.

The Chaplain desires to record his thanks to the Rev. V. A. Demant, Vicar of St. John's, who took over the work for the summer during a period of shortage of staff at the Parish Church, and who still takes one week each month. The Rev. W. N. McCann also made himself responsible for one week a month, until his greatly regretted departure from Richmond in February, 1936.

ABSTRACT FROM ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

52. The Governors shall have the privilege of recommending poor persons as patients, and although the Hospital shall be open to all suitable cases, preference in admission shall be given to such recommendation should the number of patients in the wards or circumstances generally, make a selection necessary.

53. Patients shall not be admitted to the Hospital, even on a recommendation, without the sanction of one of the Honorary Medical Staff or Resident Medical Officers unless in case of accident, or of special emergency.

54. No patients shall be admitted whose circumstances are such as to enable them to pay for their treatment, except upon payment of such sum weekly as may be fixed by the Committee, and all patients shall be expected to contribute as they may be able to the funds of the Hospital.

55. Patients receiving compensation for accidents or any patients receiving money benefit under the National Insurance Act, 1911, or any subsequent or amending Act or for special treatment to other than Hospital patients shall make such payments as the Committee may require.

56. Accommodation may be set apart for private patients on terms to be fixed by the Committee not being less than £5 5s. per week, but in no case should this be done to the exclusion of the poor.

57. Assistance shall be afforded at the Hospital to persons suffering from minor casualties, in the department specially provided for out-patients. A charge to cover the cost of surgical dressings shall be made in all cases where such out-patients are able to pay therefor.

FORM OF LEGACY AND DEVISE.

To those benevolent persons who may be charitably disposed to become Benefactors by Will, the following forms are recommended as perfectly simple, yet answering every purpose.

For a Bequest of Money.

I bequeath to Royal Hospital, Richmond, Surrey, the sum of £ (free of duty) for the general purposes of that Institution; and I declare that the receipt of one of the Treasurers for the time being of such Institution shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

For a Devise of Land or Houses.

I devise and bequeath all that

unto the Trustees for the time being of Royal Hospital, Richmond, Surrey, upon trust, to sell the same within one year from the date of my decease and to apply the proceeds for the general purposes of that Institution.

N.B.—Land and Houses, etc., can now be given by will for charitable purposes (as well as money, stock, and other personal property), but any Land or Houses, etc., so given must be sold (notwithstanding anything in the Will contained to the contrary) within one year from the death of the testator (or testatrix) and the proceeds applied for the purpose of the charity.
