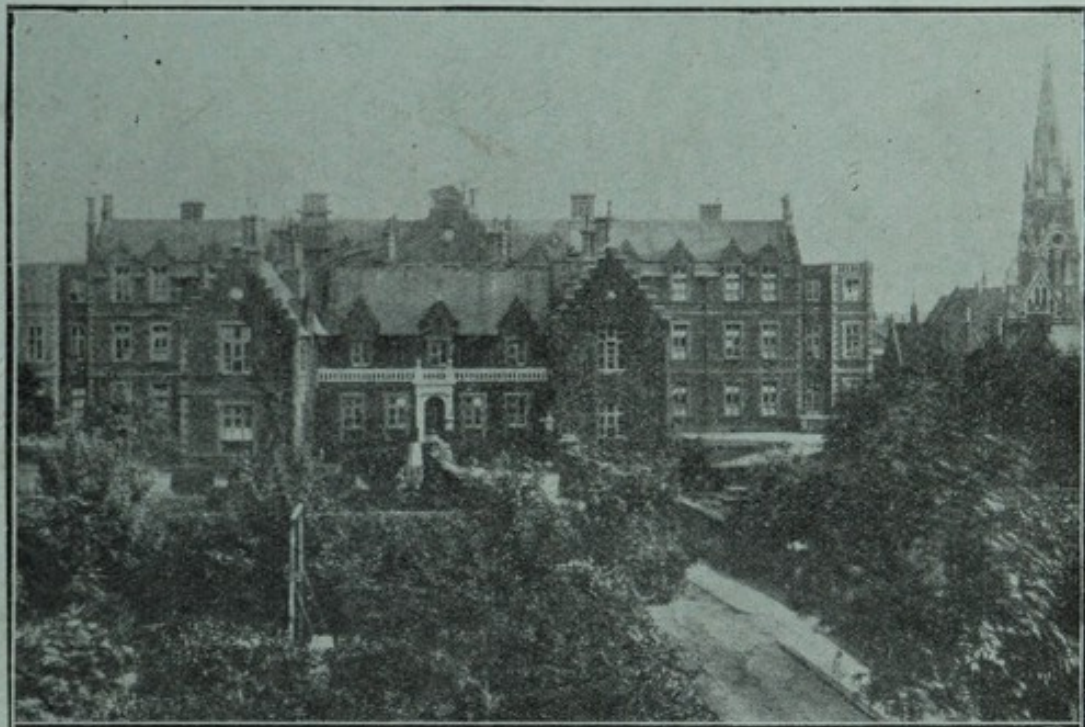

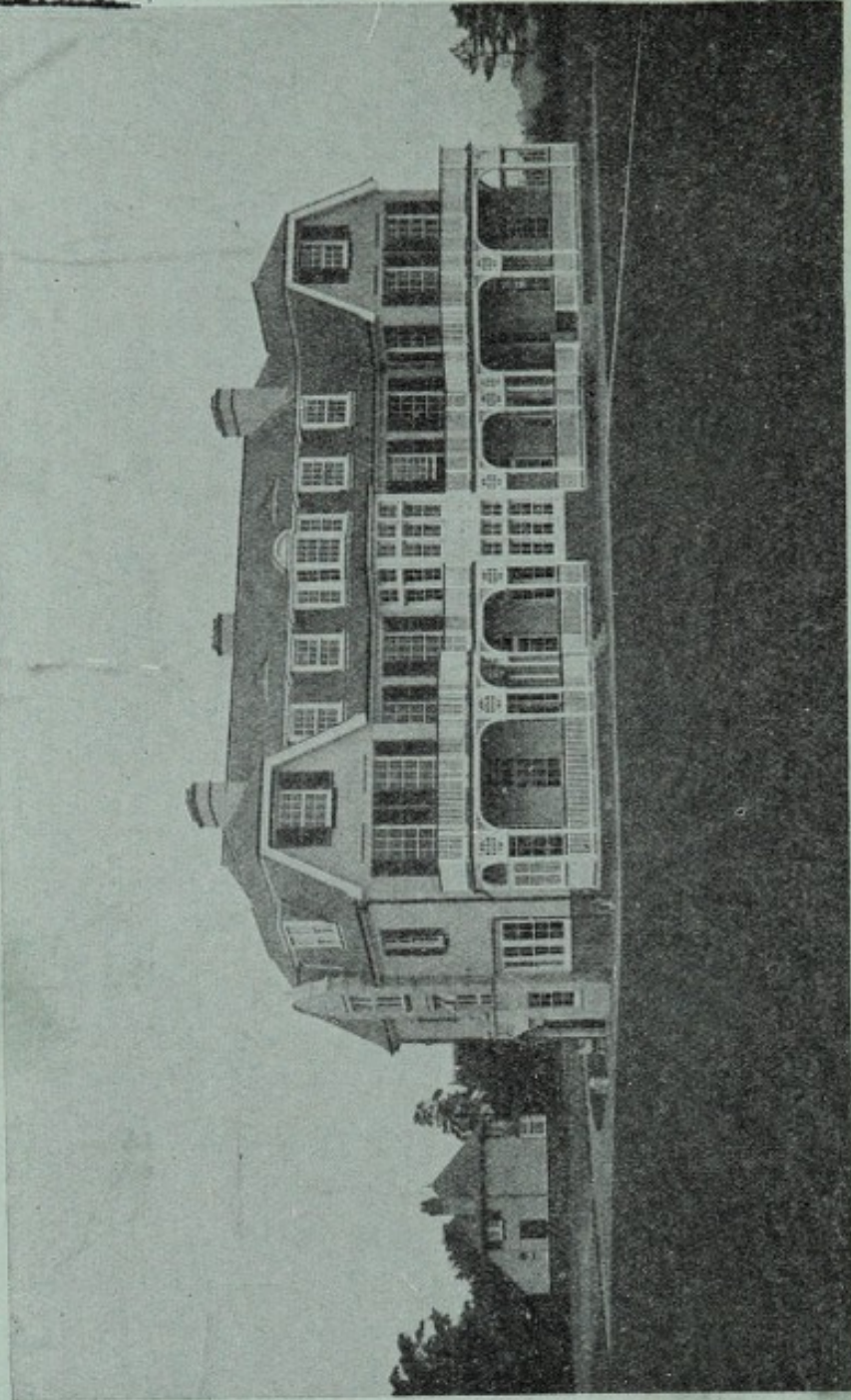

In-patients are admitted between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on weekdays. Accident and urgent cases are, however, admitted at all hours, Sundays included, provided accommodation is available.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Out-patients other than Germans and those who speak the German Language as their mother tongue, must produce an Out-patient's Letter, which can be obtained from Subscribers, or a Letter from a Doctor recommending Hospital treatment. Hospital Saturday Fund and Hospital Saving Association Vouchers will also be accepted.

New cases will not be admitted after 2.30 p.m. and 10 a.m. respectively, and boys under 14 years, accompanied by women, cannot be admitted on Tuesdays after 2 p.m.

Old cases not after 3 p.m. and 10 a.m. respectively.

In-patients may receive visits on Sundays and Wednesdays between the hours of 3 and 4 p.m.

Only two visitors are allowed at the patient's bedside at the same time, and not more than four visitors on the same day.

Children under 14 years of age are not admitted as visitors.

88th ANNUAL REPORT

For the Year ending 31st December, 1932.

The Committee of the German Hospital herewith present their 88th Annual Report, and desire to express to all Subscribers and friends sincerest thanks for their continued support.

The Hospital suffered a great loss during the past year through the death of K. E. Markel, Esq., Ph.D., who for many years was an active Member of the Committee and always took the greatest interest in the affairs of the Hospital.

Building Improvements.

During the past year various necessary building improvements were completed, which included the reconstruction of the former Dispensary into a Children's Ward containing 12 Cots and an Operation Theatre for the exclusive use of tonsil cases.

In-Patients.

2,244 patients were admitted during the year against 2,073 in 1931 ; 1,773 of these were of English Nationality.

Out-Patients.

The closing of the Out-Patients Department for redecoration during the month of August, caused a slight decline in the number of patients' attendances, compared with the previous year, viz. :—

Convalescent Home.

Patients admitted to the Convalescent Home numbered 388, of whom 154 occupied the Trust Beds of Mrs. A. Pusinelli. The Committee takes this opportunity to express their highest appreciation of Mrs. Pusinelli's grant of £800 annually, which enables many poor and deserving convalescent patients to stay at the Home free of charge.

Finance.

The Revenue Income for the year is, on the whole, quite satisfactory, although there is an adverse balance which is mainly due to a number of building improvements carried out during the past year. Payments received from patients and their societies are maintained, which can be observed from the following tables:—

SYNOPSIS OF HISTORY OF THE HOSPITAL.

1843.—Proposal to erect a Hospital, supported by the then reigning King of Prussia, as well as Her Majesty Queen Victoria and Her Royal Consort. Former Infant Orphan Asylum, Dalston, was purchased for £3,000, which sum was advanced by the King of Prussia and two German merchants.

1845.—Public Meeting held 18th June, 1845 (Anniversary of Battle of Waterloo) at which the late Duke of Cambridge presided. Rules and Regulations were drawn up, and on the 15th October of the same year, the Hospital was opened for the admission of patients, and two Dispensaries for the poor established, one in the East End and one at the Hospital.

1860.—The demand on the Hospital became so great that it was resolved to create a Building Fund for a new Hospital, which fund in a very short time reached the sum of £10,000, including a gift of £2,500 by their late Treasurer, Fred. Huth, Esq.

1863.—Building was commenced and the new Hospital opened on the 15th October, 1864, by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, exactly 19 years after the opening of the old Hospital. Total cost, £20,000.

1865.—Old Hospital pulled down and space used for garden and new roads.

1876.—Further enlargements and alterations of the Hospital. A new German Lutheran Church, formerly situated in Trinity Lane, E.C. (where now Mansion House Station is), was erected on a piece of land adjoining the Hospital. The new Out-patients' Department was also built at a cost of £10,000.

1883.—A large commodious detached house opposite the Hospital in Dalston Lane was opened as a Convalescent Home.

1897.—New wings were built on the East and West sides of the Hospital for bathrooms, etc., as well as a large new Operating Theatre and two new Consulting Rooms at a cost of £8,000.

1902.—Electric light installed throughout the Hospital.

1905.—Iron staircase erected outside the wards for means of escape in case of fire.

1908.—New Convalescent Home opened at Hitchin, Herts, which was presented by Messrs. F. A. and H. H. König, with an Endowment Fund provided by Baron von Schröder and Baron Bruno von Schröder.

1911.—New quarters for Nursing Sisters and Female Servants opened.

1913.—New quarters built for Resident Medical Officers and Male Nurses. The building also contains two small wards, the latter are reserved for old-age Germans, male and female, who require constant medical supervision. In the same year a new laundry and disinfecting chamber was erected.

1924-5.—Mortuary, Post-mortem Room and Chapel rebuilt, enlarged and completely modernized at a cost of £1,900.

1925-6.—X Ray Department rebuilt and new Apparatus installed at a total cost of £3,100.

1926.—New Isolation Wing built with six additional Beds at a cost of £1,500. Operating Theatre roof rebuilt, cost £314. New Veranda, Convalescent Home, cost £803.

1929.—New Sterilising Plant and X Ray Table installed. Dental department opened.

1930.—Installation of New Boilers for the Heating, Hot Water System and Laundry, consuming oil fuel at a cost of £5,000. Hot and Cold Water Installation in Sanatorium at a cost of £600. Ophthalmic Department enlarged and re-equipped at a cost of £320.

1931.—Rebuilding of Out-Patients' Departments and Dispensary at a total cost of £12,000.

1932.—The old Dispensary reconstructed and converted into a Ward with 12 Beds and a fully equipped Operation Theatre for Tonsil Cases.

GERMAN HOSPITAL CONVALESCENT HOME, HITCHIN.

The Convalescent Home is devoted to the following purposes:—

- (A) The reception of such In-patients of the Hospital as are recommended by the Honorary Medical Officers.
- (B) The reception of such German Patients, although not Inmates of the Hospital, as are, in the opinion of one of the Honorary Medical Officers of the Hospital, in need of rest and change of air. All such recommendations to be countersigned by the Secretary.

The period for which patients remain in the Home shall not exceed three weeks.

CASES INELIGIBLE.

1. Incurables, in whose cases no improvement can be expected.
2. Consumptives.
3. Persons whose ulcers, ailments or unclean clothing render them offensive to others.
4. Lunatics, idiots and persons subject to epileptic fits.
5. Persons of immoral character.
6. Helpless persons, who require special nursing and attention.
7. Persons previously guilty of misconduct in the Home.

THE CONVALESCENT FUND

Was originally established by an appeal of several benevolent ladies in Manchester as a separate Fund for the purpose of furnishing some assistance to those Patients who, on leaving the Hospital, are not able immediately to find employment.

THE ALMONER'S FUND

Was started in 1902, to assist poor Out-Patients to obtain surgical appliances, extra nourishment, &c.

THE "STURGE" SAMARITAN FUND

Owes its existence to the generosity of George Sturge, Esq., who in 1884 presented the Hospital with a donation of £750, to be held in trust and the interest thereon to be applied for the relief of poor persons who have been In-Patients of the Hospital.

These Funds are of the greatest benefit to poor Patients, and prove to be excellent auxiliaries to the usefulness of the Institution.

Donations and Annual Subscriptions will be thankfully received by the Committee for the above Funds.

Rules and Regulations

OF THE

GERMAN HOSPITAL.

- I.
- Object.** THIS Hospital is established for the admission and relief of sick and diseased natives of Germany, others speaking the German language as their mother tongue, as well as for all accidents, and the treatment and relief of English Out-patients.
- II.
- Constitution.** It has Protectors, Patrons, a President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Governors, a Treasurer, a Sub-Treasurer, Auditors, a Chaplain, a Secretary, Physicians and Surgeons.
- III.
- Annual Governors.** Subscribers of one guinea or more yearly shall be Annual Governors, and for every guinea subscribed and paid shall have one vote, but never more than ten votes. All arrears must be paid up before the privilege of voting can be exercised.
- IV.
- Ditto.** No Annual Governor shall have the privilege of voting until six months after payment of his first annual subscription.
- V.
- Life Governors.** A donation of, or donations amounting to twenty guineas (£21. 0s. 0d.) either in their own names or that of anonymous friends, shall constitute the donor a Life Governor and entitle him to one vote; and for every additional donation of twenty guineas (£21.0s.0d.) he shall have an additional vote; this privilege however, being limited to ten votes independent of such Life Governor's privilege of voting as an Annual Governor, pursuant to Rule III.
- VI.
- Clergymen.** Clergymen preaching for the Hospital, as also those who lend their pulpits for the purpose, shall be Life Governors and have one vote for every twenty guineas of the Collection.

VII.

Firms. Firms, Societies or Congregations, being either Donors or Annual Subscribers, may appoint a partner or member to exercise their privilege of voting.

VIII.

Legacies. In case of a legacy of £50, or upwards, bequeathed to the Hospital, the first named acting executor shall be a Life Governor, and entitled to one vote.

IX.

Governors. Every Governor shall be entitled to two Out-patients' letters (no recommendation being required for patients of German Nationality) for every vote he is entitled to, by virtue of his Contribution.

X.

Annual General Court. A General Court of Governors shall be held in the months of January to April in each year, to receive the report of the Committee, the financial statement of the Treasurer, to elect for the ensuing year the Committee, Treasurer, Sub-Treasurer and Auditors, and to determine on such matters relative to the Hospital as may be brought under consideration either by the Committee or by individual Governors; in the latter case, notice of intended motion or motions to be given to the Secretary in writing, seven days at least, previous to the time appointed for holding such meeting.

XI.

Special General Courts. Special General Courts shall be convened by the Secretary on a requisition addressed to him by at least forty-eight Governors, or by a resolution of the Committee, setting forth the object of such meeting; but no business shall be entered upon, except that specified in the requisition or resolution.

XII.

Notice of General Courts. Notice of every General Court to be at least twice advertised in two London daily newspapers.

XIII.

Proceedings at General Courts. All questions brought before a General Court shall be decided by a majority of Governors present at the meeting, unless by a requisition in writing, addressed to the Chairman, and signed by five or more Governors, a poll shall be demanded, and in every such case, the Chairman shall determine the time and place of holding such poll (unless the Committee shall have previously made the necessary arrangements), at which proxies shall be allowed. The Chairman on all occasions to have a casting vote, in addition to his vote or votes as a Governor.

XIV.

Minutes of
General
Courts

At every General Court the minutes of the preceding Annual or Special General Court shall be read over for confirmation.

XV.

Committee.

The Committee shall consist of ex-officio members, viz., the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, the Senior Hon. Physician and Senior Hon. Surgeon of the Hospital, and of eighteen Governors elected at the Annual General Court, with the privilege of filling up any vacancy that may occur in the number of the latter during the current year.

XVI.

Appoint-
ments
by the
Committee.

The Committee shall elect the Trustees, the Chaplain, Surveyor and the Resident Medical Officers. They shall appoint the Secretary, the Collector, the Chemists of the Hospital, the Matron and the Nurses, and they shall have power to fill up *ad interim* any vacancies that may occur among the Honorary Officers of the Hospital.

XVII.

Bye-Laws.

The Committee are to make such Bye-laws for the internal administration of the Hospital as they shall from time to time deem expedient.

XVIII.

Complaints
against
Officers.

Should a complaint in writing be made to the Committee upon any subject connected with the Hospital by one or more Governors, the Committee shall investigate the same in the presence of the complaining parties, if desired by them, and reasonable notice, specifying the place, day and hour, of the investigation, shall always be given to the parties complaining. The Committee shall be empowered to suspend any Officer against whom a complaint has been laid in the above manner, or by any member of their own body, at the meeting to be specially convened for the purpose of investigation; such suspension to remain in force until a report of the facts, with the opinion of the Committee thereon be made to a General Court, which shall be holden within one month from the time of such suspension.

XIX.

Election of
Vice-Presi-
dents.

The Committee shall have the power to propose for election, at the Annual General Courts, the Vice-Presidents and Honorary Life Governors of the Institution.

XX.

Committee Meetings.

The Committee shall meet for the transaction of business and receive the reports of the Household Committee on the 4th Thursday, or any other day of that week of the months of January, March, May, July, October and December, and on such other days for which a special meeting may have been convened by the Secretary at the written request of three members of the Committee. Such day shall be fixed not later than ten days from the delivery of the request, and the notice shall contain the substance of the same; other business may be added, but no business shall be entered upon at special meetings, except that specified in the notice. At all meetings of the Committee, five members shall form a quorum.

XXI.

Household Committee Meetings.

At the first meeting after the Annual General Court, the Committee shall name not less than five of its members who, with either one of the Hon. Physicians or Hon. Surgeons of the Medical Committee, shall act as the Household Committee, which shall meet twice a month. At these meetings, three members to form a quorum.

XXII.

Powers of the Household Committee.

The Household Committee receives communications from the Medical Officers, examines the accounts, directs the necessary payments, orders the purchase of all necessary articles and, subject to any Bye-laws that may be made by the Committee, superintends and arranges the ordinary concerns of the Hospital, but any question arising at any meeting shall, if any two members present shall so demand in writing, be referred to the Committee for decision.

XXIII.

Monthly Balances and Annual Accounts.

The Secretary is to furnish the Household Committee with a statement of the balance, and produce the banker's book every month; the annual accounts are to be regularly audited and signed by the Treasurer previous to the Annual General Court held in the month of January or February.

XXIV.

The Trustees.

The Trustees, who are appointed by the Committee, and in whom the property of the Hospital is vested, shall not sell or dispose of any property of the Hospital, or any part of the funds that may have been invested in their names, except by order of a General Court.

XXV.

The Auditors. The auditors are to examine the Treasurer's Annual Accounts, and, if correct, to certify the same prior to the Annual General Meeting.

XXVI.

The Secretary. The Secretary is to act under the directions of the Committee. He is to attend the General Courts, and to superintend the manner in which the minutes and other records are kept.

XXVII.

The Chaplain. The Chaplain shall regularly visit the Protestant patients in the wards. Every facility shall also be afforded to patients professing any other than the Protestant Religion to be visited by Ministers of their own persuasions.

XXVIII.

The Architect and Surveyor. The Architect and Surveyor shall visit the Hospital whenever required, to inspect as to the state of repair; shall superintend any works requiring to be done; examine, adjust and certify the accounts for works executed, and perform any other duties in his professional capacity.

XXIX.

Consulting Medical Men. One or more Physicians and one or more Surgeons of eminence, practising in London, shall be requested to lend their services as Honorary Consulting Medical Officers.

XXX.

Election of Hon. Medical Officers. The Physicians and Surgeons of the Hospital, whose appointments are honorary, shall be elected by a General Court. In case of a vacancy occurring, notice of the same and of the intended period of election shall be given two weeks previously at least by public advertisement in such newspapers as the Committee shall deem advisable.

XXXI.

Qualifications of Hon. Medical Officers. The Physicians and Surgeons of the Hospital must be natives of Germany, or prove themselves to be fully conversant with the German language and the peculiarities of German Medical Science; they must produce a Diploma from a Foreign or British University, and be fully qualified to practise as Physicians or Surgeons in this country.

XXXII.

Duties
of Hon.
Medical
Officers.

The Physicians and Surgeons shall visit the Hospital regularly on at least two days in the week, and when necessity arises. They shall superintend the Medical Officers residing in the house, the nurses and other attendants in the wards, the arrangements of the proper diet, treatment and comfort of the patients; examine into the state of the drug department at least once in six months and report on these and other matters within their province to the Committee.

XXXIII.

Honorary
Assistant
Medical
Officers.

There shall also be elected by the General Court, one or more Honorary Assistant Medical Officers, whose duty it shall be to see Out-patients on two or more days of the week, and to take the place of the Visiting Physicians and Surgeons in case of leave of absence and illness. They must have the same qualifications as stated in Rule XXXI.

XXXIV.

Out-pa-
tients' De-
partment.

Should any one of the Hon. Visiting Medical Staff attending the Out-patients' Department be unable to be present, the Secretary to be vested with the duty and authority to instruct one of the medical house-staff to take his place.

XXXV.

The Hon. Medical Officers of the Hospital form the Medical Committee.

XXXVI.

The

Officers.

The Resident Medical Officers must be natives of Germany and produce satisfactory testimonials as to character and professional qualifications.

XXXVII.

Officers.

The Resident Medical Officers shall accompany the Honorary Medical Officers during their visits to the wards, attend to the in-patients under their directions, watch over the diet and treatment of the patients, see that the orders of the Physicians and Surgeons are duly observed, and keep a diary of all their patients. In cases of difficulty or danger, they are to hasten the arrival of one of the Honorary Medical Officers. The first Resident Medical Officer has the charge of the Surgical Instruments, of which he must keep an inventory.

XXXVIII.

The
Resident
Medical
Officers.

The Resident Medical Officers are never to be absent from the Hospital at the same time, and one house-surgeon and one house-physician must always remain on duty in the Hospital.

XXXIX.

The Apothecaries or Dispensers. The Apothecaries or Dispensers must produce satisfactory testimonials as to character and professional qualifications. The first must be either a native of Germany, or well conversant with the German language and the German Dispensing System.

XL.

Ditto. At least one of the Apothecaries or Dispensers shall reside in the House, and they are never to be absent from the Hospital at the same time.

XLI.

Duties of Apothecaries or Dispensers. The Apothecaries or Dispensers are required to preserve and keep in proper order, the prescriptions of the Medical Officers.

XLII.

The Collectors. The Collectors are to provide securities to the amount of £100 at least, and to pay over to the Treasurer or Sub-Treasurer every Saturday or Monday the moneys received on account of the Hospital.

XLIII.

The Matron and Nurses. The Matron and Nurses are to be natives of Germany, and Protestants; and, if possible, persons who have been trained in Institutions in Germany, established for the purpose of providing Hospitals with good nurses.

XLIV.

Duties of Matron. The Matron will have the care of the House, bedding, linen, furniture and all articles belonging to the household department. She will have under her direction, the Nurses and house-servants, and be responsible for the proper preparation and administration of the diet prescribed for the patients, as also for the cleanliness of the wards and the House generally.

XLV.

Admittance and discharge of In-patients. Patients will be admitted into the Hospital every day (Sunday excepted) between the hours of 9 a.m., and 12 noon, and at any time in cases of sudden emergency. Every patient shall be discharged at the end of two months from the time of admission, unless the time should be extended by the Committee upon the recommendation of one of the Honorary Medical Officers.

XLVI.

Infectious Diseases. Persons afflicted with infectious disease cannot be received into the House, but will be attended to as Out-patients.

XLVII.

Out-patients.

Out-patients other than Germans are admitted only on the recommendation of a Governor or a doctor.

XLVIII.

Sanatorium
or private
Rooms

Though the German Hospital is intended chiefly for the benefit of poor Germans of the working classes, several convenient rooms are set apart and fitted up to serve as a Sanatorium for the accommodation of better educated natives of Germany, and others speaking the German language, of literary persons, merchants, clerks, governesses, teachers of language, artists, etc., who will be admitted on payment of a fixed sum per week, which can be learnt at the Hospital, and is regulated by their circumstances, and whether they require a room to themselves, or share it with another patient of their own class.

XLIX.

Convalescent Fund.

The Convalescent Fund, formed for the assistance of poor patients on their discharge from the Hospital, consists of donations invested in the Funds in the name of Trustees, and of Annual Subscriptions, the administration of which is left to the Chaplain and the Honorary Medical Officers, under the direction of the Committee.

L.

The Committee charges the Secretary with the duty to see that these regulations are observed, and report any omissions or irregularities to the Committee.

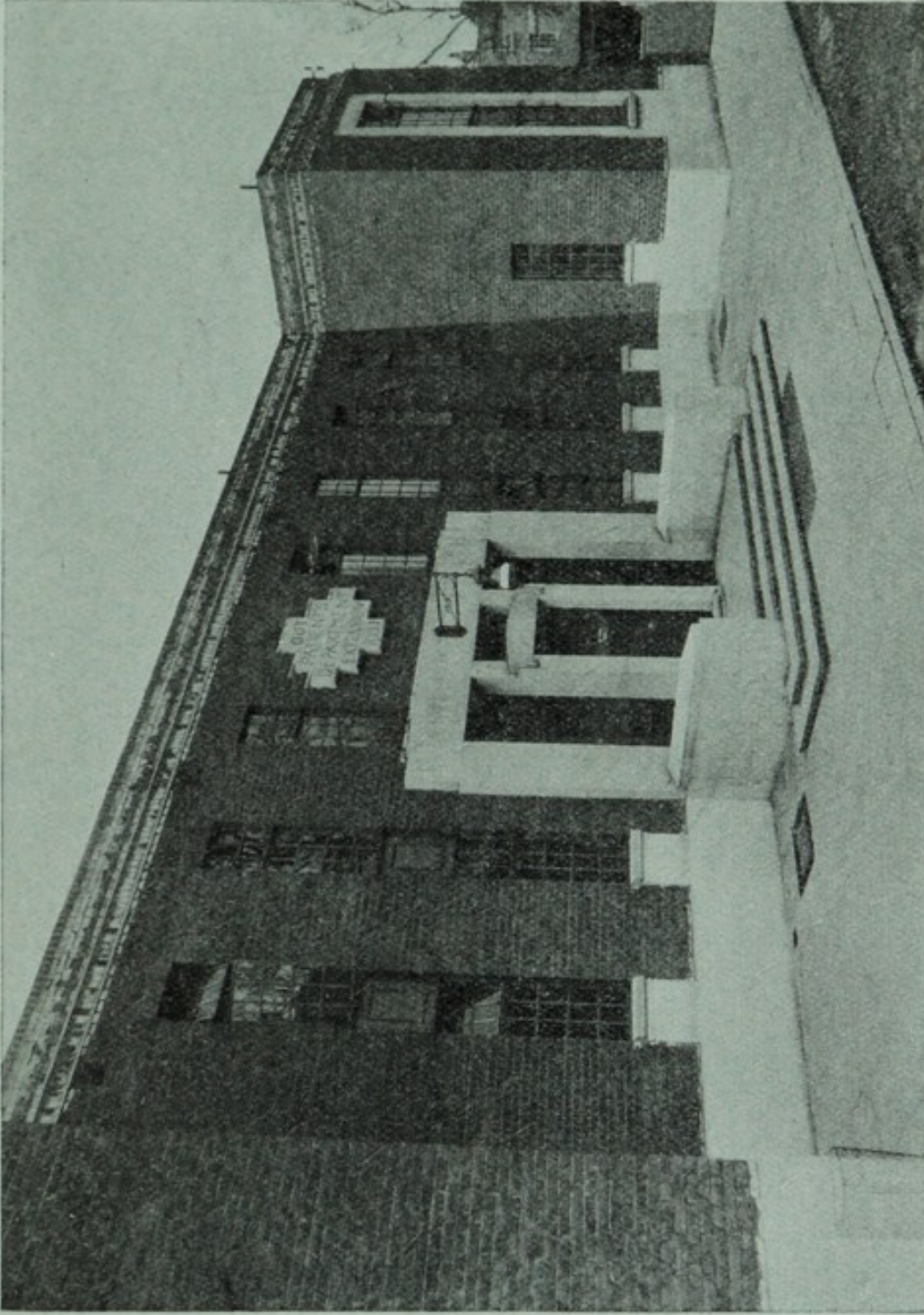

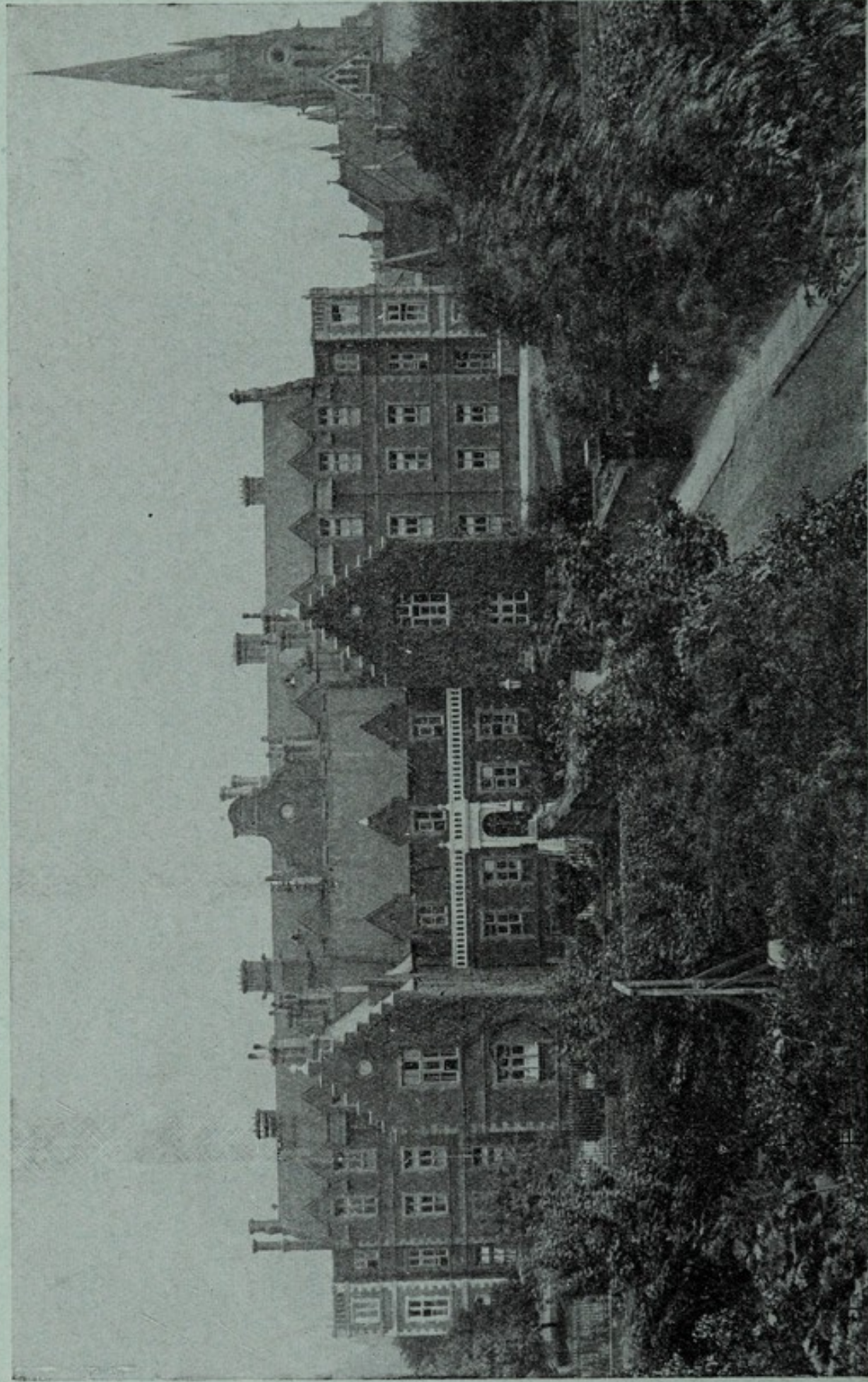
