Issued with the authority of the Management Committee, who express appreciation of the splendid support given by the many friends of the Hospital during the period under review.

The Committee particularly desire to draw the attention of the Public to the following points :—

THAT the Hospital is open to Members of the Contributory Association for both In-patient as well as Out-Patient treatment without charge—provided they are in benefit.

Non-Members of the Contributory Association are required to pay for such treatment.

Patients have "free choice" of a Doctor on the General Staff of the Hospital.

The Medical Superintendent will see responsible friends of Patients at any hour when professional information is desired, or when anxiety or uncertainty needs to be relieved.

All Medical urgencies, all obscurities and uncertainties and all patients needing observation will be placed under the care and name of Dr. G. F. Walker, the Medical Superintendent.

Maternity Patients are admitted to Thorpe Hall Annexe, where they will be under the care of their own Medical Practitioner, but it is necessary for them to apply, well in advance of the required date, on a Friday or Saturday afternoon at the Hospital, Midland Road. :—

- (a) For a Professional interview with the Medical Superintendent and, if accepted by him, and there is a vacancy,
- (b) to apply to be seen by the House Governor and Secretary in order to make financial arrangements and to obtain confirmation of the booking which is only given upon the prompt payment of the booking fee of £8/8/0 (£6/6/0 if applicant is entitled at the time, to a Contributory Scheme Voucher).

The One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Annual General Meeting of the Governors

*of the Peterborough & District Memorial Hospital
held on 10th March, 1945, at the Town Hall,
Peterborough.*

Present :—The President, Sir P. Malcolm Stewart, Bart., in the Chair, and some 150 Governors.

The House Governor and Secretary read the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and they were duly confirmed and signed by the President.

Sir Malcolm Stewart in addressing the meeting said, it was three years since they did him the honour of electing him, an honour which he had much appreciated, and now, in accordance with the statutes, he retired. He could assure them that the contacts he had made and the friendly relationships that had been established with the Hospital staff would result in his taking a great interest in its future welfare. He hoped that in the scheme which the Government were propounding for the Health Services, their Hospital would be found continuing as a voluntary movement, which was in accordance with our national traditions and brought out the best.

Mr. Joseph Stephenson, Chairman of the Management Committee, presented his Report.

Mr. H. le P. Grimwade, the Treasurer, reported upon the Balance Sheet and presented the Accounts for the year.

The Medical Superintendent read the Medical Officer's Report.

Mr. A. T. Andrews, as Chairman of the Hospital Contributory Association, reported upon the Association's work for the past year.

All the Reports were duly adopted.

The following Resolution was unanimously passed,

"That the thanks of the Meeting be given to the Medical and Surgical Staff of the Institution for their services during the past year and that in accordance with Law 68 which directs that 'The interest accruing from the Medical Officers' Fund, shall from time to time be disposed of by vote at a Meeting of the Governors in presents to the Honorary Acting Staff of the Charity'—the interest for the year 1944 amounting to £50/9/0, be presented to the Treasurer of the Medical Board, to be disposed of as the Board thinks proper."

Upon the proposition of Mr. Joseph Stephenson, seconded by Mr. F. C. Cane, Mr. H. B. Hartley was unanimously elected President of the Hospital for the ensuing year, whereupon Sir Malcolm Stewart vacated the Chair, which was then occupied by the new President.

Mr. H. B. Hartley expressed his thanks to the Meeting for electing him as President.

Mr. A. J. Dillingham proposed a vote of thanks to the retiring President, and this was carried with acclamation.

Report of the Management Committee for the Year ending 31st December, 1944.

Mr. President, My Lords, Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Hospital, I have pleasure in submitting the Annual Report for the year 1944.

We have continued to make progress with the facilities available at the Hospital notwithstanding the war.

The Rehabilitation Department at Thorpe Hall was opened on the 1st January, 1945. A Physio-Therapist has been appointed and she took up her duties on the opening date. We hope shortly to appoint a full time Occupational Therapist. The Department is in the charge of Mr. Noel Smith, our Orthopaedic Surgeon, and it is confidently expected that it will prove of great benefit to patients.

The Maternity Ward at Thorpe Hall has been taken full advantage of and the beds are always fully booked. During the year under review there were 322 patients admitted and 321 babies were born.

The new Operating Theatre is now complete and is in use. The Theatre with its air conditioning plant and other equipment is up-to-date in every way.

The Consultant Specialists referred to in the 1943 Report have all been appointed and this arrangement has proved of very great value to patients. In addition, the Management Committee has decided to appoint a Consulting Cardiologist and it is expected that a suitable appointment will be made in the very near future.

The House, "Castlegate," and grounds in Alderman's Drive adjoining our property have been purchased which will give us a valuable site for future extensions of the Hospital. When released by the London and North Eastern Railway Company the house will be a very useful addition to our accommodation.

A house, No. 19 Thorpe Lea Road, has been taken on lease and is in use as an extra Home for Nurses.

The Balconies referred to in the 1943 Report have not yet been satisfactorily enclosed in consequence of the necessary permits not having been given by the Ministries concerned. This has been very disappointing, as the extra sixteen beds which can be provided would be most useful. We are persevering with alternate methods and hope that we shall succeed in the comparatively near future.

We continue to be indebted to the Hospital Contributory Association for increasing contributions. A record was established for the year ended 30th September, 1944, a total of £25,500 being handed over to the Hospital and £2,635 paid to other Hospitals under reciprocal arrangements for the benefit of patients.

The Management Committee has been able to make further satisfactory arrangements with Local Authorities, namely, with the South Kesteven District Council to take in Puerperal Sepsis cases and with the Infant Welfare Committee of the Peterborough City Council for Orthopaedic treatment of pre-school age children.

We congratulate our Pathologist, Dr. D. H. Fulton, upon his appointment as an Assistant Home Office Pathologist attached to the North Midland Laboratory for the Police Force of the City and Liberty of Peterborough and the Counties of Huntingdon and Norfolk. This entails very little time away from the Hospital but enhances Dr. Fulton's prestige and incidentally that of the Hospital also.

I feel that mention should be made of the continued valuable services of the Honorary Medical men, namely, Dr. Joe Walker, Dr. W. Marshall, Dr. E. A. Holmes and Dr. C. C. Forsyth. The duties at the Hospital take up a great deal of their time, but this is submitted to willingly and pleasantly upon all occasions and all praise is due to them. I might say in passing that the team work amongst the Medical Staff, honorary and paid, is everything that can be desired.

During 1944 there has been a considerable reduction in the number of beds reserved by the Government for Emergency Medical Services. This will have the effect of greatly reducing our annual income, but I leave the Honorary Treasurer to refer more particularly to this matter.

It is not possible for me to thank all donors to the Hospital but I may be forgiven I hope for referring to some items in particular. The late Mr. D. B. Y. Tanqueray's Memorial Fund provided £1,062 for the naming of a bed. Mrs. F. Smith of Eastfield, £500 for the new Operating Theatre equipment. Mr. Joseph Coles of Eye, £500 for the naming of a cot. The L.M.S. Hospital Fund new Operating Table and equipment, £200. Short Wave Therapy Set from the Villagers of Yarwell, £145. Westwood Works Sports Club, proceeds of Sports and Gala, £371/6/4. Two Tilting Cot Bedsteads from Westwood Works Male Employees Benevolent Fund, £24. Food Trolley for Maternity Department from the South Ward Sewing Party, £64. Peter Brotherhood's Benevolent Society, £80/5/0 for equipment. The Standard Chums, Curtains, Blinds, and Painting in the Children's Ward, £207/18/0, and so I could go on almost indefinitely.

Rather important alterations have been made in the Scheme governing the Hospital by order of the Charity Commissioners, and these include the addition of six representatives on the General Committee to be nominated by the Peterborough Hospital Contributory Association.

The work of the Pathological Department is greatly on the increase and the room available is now quite inadequate. It has therefore been decided that an extension be made, and if the necessary Licenses from the appropriate Ministry for materials and labour can be obtained the work will be put in hand forthwith.

The Committee has decided to appoint a fully qualified Almoner. The title does not properly explain the nature of the duties which she will carry out. A better description would probably be Welfare Officer. There is a shortage of qualified people and we are waiting for someone to be recommended by the Institute of Almoners.

There are many things the Management Committee would like to do for the improvement of the Hospital, but there is always the difficulty of obtaining the necessary permits for the supplying of materials and labour and we have to content ourselves with exercising patience and continuing to marvel at the mysterious ways of Government Departments.

Post War Policy is ever before us. We are most anxious to work in conjunction and happy association with the local Authorities who are charged with us in doing everything that can possibly be done to improve the health services of the area served by the Hospital. We have recently asked the Medical Staff to carefully consider future requirements and policy, confer

with the Medical Officers of the local Authorities, and report to the Management Committee in due course. Peterborough will undoubtedly continue to be an important centre from the Hospital point of view after the war, and the responsibilities devolving upon us are onerous and far reaching.

We wish to express our grateful thanks to all donors of money and gifts in kind, to Collectors in the Wards and in the Villages, the Hospital Contributory Association and all the Works Collection Committees, the Clergy and Ministers who have arranged collections from their congregations and visited the sick in the Hospital, the donors of gifts and valuable equipment, voluntary Stretcher Bearers, blood donors, decontamination squad members, voluntary clerks, Women's Voluntary Service, members of Toc H and of St. John Ambulance Brigade, as well as the Nursing Members of that Brigade, and last, but not least, the members of the Hospital Ladies' Linen Association who have given the sum of £350/4/11 for the purchase of Hospital linen.

Finally, our thanks are once again due to Messrs. Swallow, Crick & Co. for acting as honorary Auditors of the Hospital accounts, the Medical Superintendent and resident Medical Staff, to the Hospital Acting Staff, Acting Matron, Sisters and other members of the Nursing Staff, Radiological, Pathological, Dispensary and Massage Staffs and to Mr. F. A. C. Taylor, House Governor and Secretary, and his staff, whose hours have been invariably long throughout the year.

Treasurer's Report for the Year ending 31st Dec., 1944.

Mr. President, My Lords, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my duty to present to you the accounts of the Hospital for the twelve months ended 31st December, 1944, but as these have been printed and are already in your hands I presume you will wish to take them as having been read. I must read the Auditors' Certificate which is as follows—

"We have examined the Books of Account of the Peterborough & District Memorial Hospital and have obtained all the information and explanations we have required. We certify the foregoing Statement to be correct in accordance therewith to the best of our knowledge and belief."—Swallow, Crick & Co.

and with the exception of one comment I propose to leave any further enquiry to you and I shall be pleased to endeavour to give you any explanation you may seek.

The item I wish to give particular mention is No. 4 on the Income side—£23,596 from the Ministry of Health on account of Emergency Hospital Service.

Firstly, one must deduct from this the sum of £1,065 which appears on the Expenditure side under heading 10 as paid to Medical Officers. This is a payment due to the Doctors by the E.M.S. and not by the Hospital and is merely passed through the Hospital Accounts as a matter of convenience.

This leaves a nett receipt o/a E.M.S. of £22,531 of which some £12,500 was on a/c. of underpayment for the years 1942 and 1943 and £10,000 (estimated) for 1944. These payments must not be looked upon as a regular income as they are received in payment for certain options that have not been fully exercised and are receipts which will tend to decrease substantially as time goes on and may well eventually disappear.

If one deducts the Balance being excess of Income over Expenditure for the twelve months, £8,737 from this nett receipt of £22,431 we should have been left with a nett deficiency of £13,794 on the year's working but we did actually carry out work for the E.M.S. which on the basis of the approximate daily cost of treating all In-patients, i.e. 16/1d. per day and Out-patients at 19/- per patient, would represent an expenditure of £8,920. This might have reduced the nett deficiency to £4,874 were it not that some of these beds would undoubtedly have been occupied by ordinary patients now on our waiting list so again swelling the deficiency.

You must appreciate that, without an elaborate "costing" system, it is impossible to correctly calculate what our actual deficiency for 1944 would have been failing this payment by the Ministry of Health, but I think I must have said enough to make us all realise that our "Working Loss" would have been a very substantial one and although we should be very thankful that as a matter of fact we had a surplus in hand we must not face the coming years in a spirit of too great optimism.

I shall now be pleased to endeavour to reply to any enquiry as to the accounts which you may wish to make.

At this stage I think a brief summary of the work of the Hospital as a whole, in-patient and out-patient, might be given in round figures :—

Accidents at work, on duty, in the home or on the roads	20 per cent.
Diseases peculiar to women	10 per cent.
Diseases peculiar to men	10 per cent.
Diseases of the digestive tract including appendicitis	20 per cent.
Varicose Veins, hernia, haemorrhoids	10 per cent.
Diseases and injuries of the nose, eyes and ears	15 per cent.
Constitutional Diseases and Deformities	15 per cent.

Furthermore I should like to point out that a great deal of our work is the investigation of disease and the application of scientific methods to the study of symptoms. In round figures about a third of our work is the investigation of patients and many thousands of reports are sent to general practitioners annually.

Although the in-patient figure is slightly reduced, yet, taking into account a slightly longer residence per patient and a very great increase in the various out-patient procedures, more work was done at the Hospital in 1944 than in any other period of our history.

We welcome our growing association with the medical profession in the city and district and with the medical officers of local authorities. Medical isolationism is fast disappearing.

Our share in great events of 1944 was threefold. On Good Friday we were asked to stand by and make certain preparations to take part in a scheme for the reception of casualties. Secondly we have sent medical and nursing teams to other hospitals during the summer to assist in surgical work. Thirdly we have continued to treat large numbers of men and women of His Majesty's forces both from home stations and from overseas.

Allow me to return thanks again to Matron and her staff for unflinching co-operation and courtesy. Very heavy demands are made upon the nursing and ancillary services in view of the large volume of work we do. Similarly we desire to return most grateful thanks to the technical and auxiliary staff in the various special departments, dispensary, physiotherapy and radiology.

The Medical Staff retain unswerving confidence in the present Management Committee and in these days of change and uncertainty we willingly acknowledge the enterprise and sympathetic understanding extended to us by the lay management.

The service which we now provide is the result of the joint efforts of the medical, nursing, and lay staffs. It is attracting favourable notice outside Peterborough and our ambition to be the hospital centre for a wide area has been brought appreciably nearer. Wartime restrictions on staff and building are holding us back but we are preparing plans for the new era.

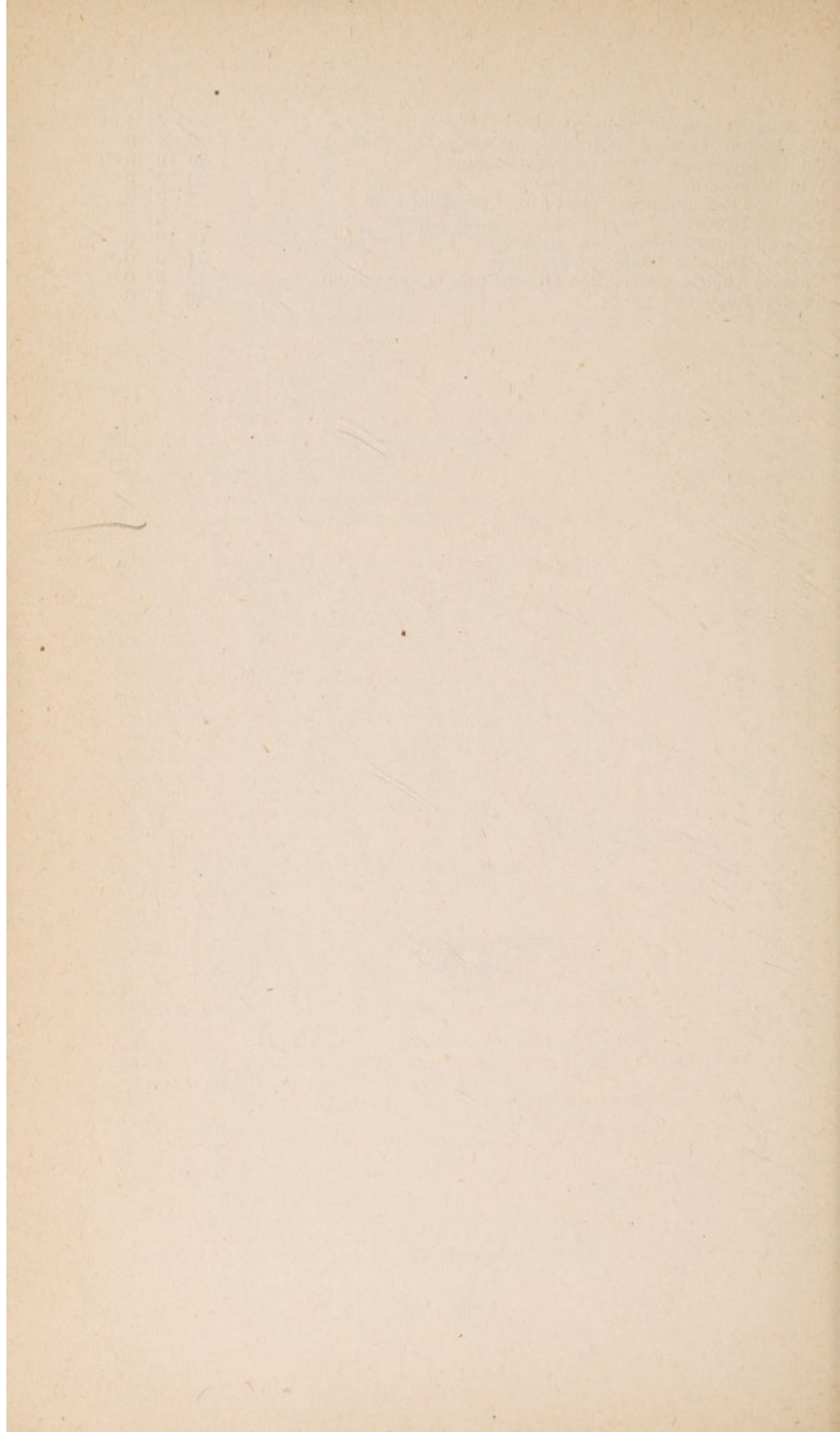
