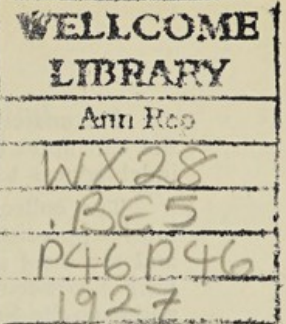

Report.



To the Governors and Subscribers of the Pershore Cottage Hospital.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee present their Thirty-second Annual Report and Balance Sheets with General Lists.

During the past year 111 patients have been treated in the Hospital; 87 were cured, 15 were relieved, 4 died, and 8 remained under treatment on October 31st. There have been 78 operations performed. The total number of patients who have been attended in the Institution since its foundation now reaches 3630.

Last year it was unfortunately necessary to point out that expenditure had exceeded income by £78, and this year once again the income is below the expenditure to the extent of £93. The Committee therefore renews its appeal to the generosity of the residents in the neighbourhood for increased financial support, as, if there had not been a reserve fund available in the Donations Account, which is decreasing, there would unfortunately be a deficit.

Payments by patients are practically the same as last year, and if this source of income should be reduced the position would be a very difficult one financially, but one that the Committee feel they ought to be able to meet in the interests of the District. The cost of each patient is approximately £11, and of each patient per week £4, which is a clear indication that the charge made per patient is very small in comparison with the expense.

During the year a Scheme, upon a Contributory basis, was outlined by the Worcester General Hospital who asked for the support of the Committee, and this has been and is still being considered, but the Worcester Hospital has launched its Scheme in the District served by the Hospital without any decision being made. A similar Scheme is being considered by the Evesham Hospital Committee, and it is a matter which vitally affects the position of the Hospital in the future.

Fortunately, further additions have been made to the Donations Accounts, though not sufficient to meet the call upon this Account to Maintenance Account, and the Committee desire to express their sense of indebtedness to all those who have contributed or aided in doing so.

The collection taken at the Flower Show gates shows a very welcome increase, and the Committee much appreciate the courtesy of the Committee of the Horticultural Society in allowing this to be taken, and are most grateful to the Nurses who so kindly attended to make the collection. Considerable sums have also been realised from the Children's Dance so kindly organised by Mrs. S. G. Parkes and Mrs. A. Lees, and from the Football Hospital Cup Competitions. The proceeds of the Alexandra Rose Day Collection, divided with Worcester Hospital, shows a considerable shrinkage. The gift from Mr. Downing in memory of the late Reverend H. Wilkinson is also much appreciated.

The Committee have to record the receipt of a legacy of £350 kindly left by the late Mrs. T. Kings, whose death was referred to in the last Report.

During the year a generous supporter in many ways has passed away in the person of The Viscount Deerhurst, and the Committee and Subscribers all sympathise with the family in their loss. Since the termination of the financial year yet another valued friend and an old member of Committee has died, namely, Mrs. A. H. Hudson, the wife of Col. A. H. Hudson who for nearly twenty years has been Chairman of the Committee, and the deepest sympathy of all concerned in the Hospital is felt for Col. Hudson and his family in their great loss.

The House Committee has lost its Chairman since the end of the past financial year, owing to the appointment of the Right Reverend H. Gresford Jones as Bishop of Warrington, and he took a very great interest in the internal affairs of the Hospital whilst resident in Pershore.

The Committee once again desire to express their thanks to Mrs. Rusher, Mrs. Askham, Miss Checketts, and Mrs. Kennedy, and their willing helpers in organising respectively, Hospital Saturday, Pound Week, and Alexandra Rose Day; to Mrs. Browning for help with the Linen League, and also to all the Honorary Officers for their work throughout the year.

The whole of the Committee retire on the day of the Annual Meeting, but are eligible for re-election.

BYE-LAWS.

1. No person suffering from an infectious or incurable disease can be received into the Hospital.
 2. Every patient must bring decent clothing, and a sufficient supply of personal linen. All patients shall have their personal linen properly washed at their own homes or elsewhere at their own expense, so often as the Medical Officer or Matron shall require.
 3. Patients' friends shall be allowed to visit them on Sundays and Wednesdays, between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 o'clock p.m., but on no other day of the week without leave of the Medical Officer or Matron, not more than three persons can be allowed to visit the same patient in one day.
 4. Patients shall strictly observe the hours appointed for all arrangements of the Hospital.
 5. No patient shall go beyond the garden without the special leave of the Matron.
 6. No male patient shall enter the female wards, and no female shall enter the male wards, without the special permission of the Matron.
 7. No smoking shall be allowed within the House, except with the special permission of the Medical Officer.
 8. No patient shall use bad language.
 9. All patients whom the Medical Officers deem able shall assist in the work of the Hospital.
 10. Each patient must strictly obey the directions of the Medical Officers and the Matron on pain of instant dismissal.
 11. General visitors shall be admitted on Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 o'clock p.m.
 12. Patients, except in cases of accident or accute illness, shall be admitted only on Mondays and Tuesdays, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 a.m.
 13. In cases requiring prolonged treatment at the Hospital, patients must apply to the House Committee for their names to be re-entered on the registers after each period of eight weeks.
- N.B.—Donors of Letters of Recommendation are requested to make careful enquiries before recommending any patient for admission to the Hospital, that such patient has not been in recent contact with any case of infectious disease.

PAYMENTS FOR PATIENTS.

Each Patient or nearest relative will be asked to sign a Form of Admission.

The fees for Patients shall be as follows :—

Patients with a Letter of Recommendation will be charged 10/6 per week.

Private Patients in the General Ward will be charged £2 2s. per week.

Private Patients in a Ward with 2 beds (if available) will be charged £4 4s. per week.

Private Patients in the Private Ward will be charged £4 4s. per week. The above charges for Private Patients do not include the cost of stimulants, dressings, or special nurse if case necessitates. The House Committee have the power to vary these charges.

The charges for Private Patients in either Ward are in addition to their Medical Attendant's usual fees.

RULES.

Copies of the Rules of the Institution may be obtained upon application to the Hon. Secretaries.

LADY VISITORS.

THE Committee meet on the second Wednesday in December, March, June, and September, except when the second Wednesday in March is Ash Wednesday, in which case the meeting is held on the following Wednesday.

The House Committee meet on the same days as the Committee, and upon the second Wednesday in every month. Notices of the meetings are sent to the members by the Secretaries.
