# Report.

To the Governors and Subscribers of the Pershore Cottage Hospital.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee present their Thirty-third Annual Report and Balance Sheets with General Lists.

During the year 144 patients have been treated in the Hospital; 121 were cured; 11 were relieved; 5 were transferred to other Institutions; 7 died, and 4 remained under treatment on December 31st. There have been 118 operations performed. The total number of patients who have been attended in the Hospital since its foundation now reaches 3,774.

The cost of each patient is approximately £11 8s. and the average length of stay in the Hospital is between 15 and 16 days which makes the cost of each patient per week about £5 4s.

In perusing the Balance Sheets for the past year it must be remembered that owing to the alteration in the Rules as to the date of closing the Financial Year of the Hospital on December 31st instead of October 31st the year which is past contained 14 months. The expenditure for this period shows an increase of about £1 per week in excess of the expenditure for the previous year. The Committee are fully aware of the urgent need for economy and have this matter under consideration and are exploring every possible channel with a view to keeping the expenses down consistent with doing the necessary work of the Hospital. Unfortunately the receipts show a reduction in actual figures as compared with last year when allowance is made for the 2 years' returned Income Tax which is credited in this year's account and all the main sources of income are below last year, the subscriptions being nearly £30 down, so it is hoped that further help may be forthcoming in this direction both from old and new subscribers.

In last year's Report attention was called to the position which would arise if the payments by patients were reduced, and in the past year, notwithstanding having 14 months in the year, the receipts from this source have

diminished by £65. The Committee do not altogether regret the diminution of payments by private patients s they feel that the Hospital is serving its purpose better by being able to look after the poorer patients sent in with a Letter of Recommendation from a subscriber, but obviously more support must be forthcoming financially to enable them to do this.

The Worcester Hospital Contributory Scheme referred to in last year's Report has been in force during the past year and the question of joining in this Scheme has excercised the minds of the Committee and has been fully considered in all its bearings. A Sub-committee appointed specially for the purpose has had a number of meetings and some of its members have personally visited hospitals in the Oxfordshire district under a similar scheme. Many questions have had to be carefully gone into and the position up to a certain point was put before a Special Meeting of Subscribers, but eventually acting upon a resolution passed at such Special Meeting, the Committee have decided that it was not possible for the Pershore Cottage Hospital to join the Scheme, and it appears that only one other hospital in the County, namely, the Tenbury Cottage Hospital, has joined forces with the Worcester General Hospital in this matter.

During the year the Institution has lost a very devoted friend and helper in the death of Dr. H. L. Askham' For many years he acted as an Honorary Surgeon to the Hospital and to all those with whom he came in contact he endeared himself by his kindness and consideration in every way, and the Committee desire to express their sympathy with Mrs. Askham and Mrs. Whiteley in the great loss sustained by them.

During the year a legacy has been received, namely, one of £10 less duty from the late Mrs. F. P. Caldwell\*

The Committee once again wish to express their thanks to the Flower Show Committee for allowing the annual collection to be taken in the grounds and to the Nurses who once again so kindly made the collection; to the Hospital Football Competition Committee for their valuable financial assistance; also to Mrs. Rusher, Miss Checketts and Mrs. Kennedy and their willing helpers in organising and carrying out respectively Hospital Saturday, Pound Week and Alexandra Rose Day, and to Mrs. Browning for her work connected with the Linen League. Thanks are also due to the Officers for their work throughout the year.

The whole of the Committee retire on the day of the Annual Meeting but are eligible for re-election.

### BYE-LAWS.

- 1. No person suffering from an infectious or incurable disease can be received into the Hospital.
- 2. Every patient must bring decent clothing, and a sufficient supply of personal linen. All patients shall have their personal linen properly washed at their own homes or elsewhere at their own expense, so often as the Medical Officer or Matron shall require.
- 3. Patients' friends shall be allowed to visit them on Sundays and Wednesdays, between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 o'clock p.m., but on no other day of the week without leave of the Medical Officer or Matron, and not more than three persons can be allowed to visit the same patient in one day.
  - 4. Patients shall strictly observe the hours appointed for all arrangements of the Hospital.
  - 5. No patient shall go beyond the garden without the special leave of the Matron.
- 6. No male patient shall enter the female wards, and no female shall enter the male wards, without the special permission of the Matron.
  - 7. No smoking shall be allowed within the House, except with the special permission of the Medical Officer
  - 8. No patient shall use bad language.
  - 9. All patients whom the Medical Officers deem able shall assist in the work of the Hospital.
- 10 Each patient must strictly obey the directions of the Medical Officers and the Matron on pain of instant dismissal.
- 11. General visitors shall be admitted on Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 o'clock p.m.
- 12. Patients, except in cases of accident or acute illness, shall be admitted only on Mondays and Tuesdays, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 a.m.
- 13. In cases requiring prolonged treatment at the Hospital, patients must apply to the House Committee for their names to be re-entered on the registers after each period of eight weeks.
- N.B.—Donors of Letters of Recommendation are requested to make careful enquiries before recommending any patient for admission to the Hospital, that such patient has not been in recent contact with any case of intectious disease.

### PAYMENTS FOR PATIENTS.

Each Patient or nearest relative will be asked to sign a Form of Admission.

The fees for Patients shall be as follows :-

Patients with a Letter of Recommendation will be charged 10/6 per week.

Private Patients in the General Ward will be charged £2 2s. per week.

Private Patients in a Ward with 2 beds (if available) will be charged £4 4s. per week.

Private Patients in the Private Ward will be charged £4 4s. per week. The above charges for Private Patients do not include the cost of stimulants, dressings, or special nurse if case necessitates. The House Committee have the power to vary these charges.

The charges for Private Patients in either Ward are in addition to their Medical Attendant's usual fees.
