



The Board of Management have pleasure in submitting their Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1927.

The number of patients admitted in 1927 was 398, of whom:

340 were discharged cured.

12 died.

23 were discharged for various reasons.

7 were discharged incurable.

16 remained in Hospital on the 31st December, 1927.

Notwithstanding the severe depression in the trade of the district and the reduced subscriptions from Colliery Companies, the Board are glad to report a surplus of £83 4s. 3d. in income over expenditure. This has been achieved mainly by the Colliery

Workers renewing their subscriptions as well as making good the shortage in their subscriptions during the previous year's stoppage of work.

The addition during the year of £858 9s. 0d. towards the Building Extension brings that Fund up to £9,868, all of which is invested in British Government Securities.

Owing to the outbreak of Smallpox, regulations laid down by the Medical Officer of Health were adopted in September last and are still in force. The rule that all cases admitted other than acute emergency cases must have been vaccinated or revaccinated withing the previous 5 years or re-vaccinated not less than 14 days prior to admission has caused a reduction in the number of Patients admitted.

The Prudential Assurance Company Ltd. have very kindly undertaken to contribute the sum of £20 per annum towards the support of one cot. This is our first endowment and it is hoped that other friends will follow their generous example.

Upon the suggestion of the Ladies' Committee a collection of Tin Foil has been organised from which it is hoped a substant al sum will be raised.

The Board desires to express their gratitude to the Members of the Ladies' Committee and the South Wales Power Company's Employees for organising successful Dances, and to the Abercynon Operatic Society and Hopkinstown Flower Show Committee for their substantial contributions towards the funds.

The Board regret to record the great losses sustained by the death of Lord Pontypridd, one of the original subscribers to the Hospital; Mrs. J. Morgan Rees, for many years a Vice-President and Member of the Ladies' and Hospital Ball Committees, and Mr. T. Mayberry Williams, a Member of the Board of Management from the opening of the Hospital and Hon. Treasurer since 1921.

Upon the recommendation of the Governors from the Abercynon District, Mr. William Horgen, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., of Penrhiwceiber, has been appointed on the Hon. Medical Staff.

The Board desire to express their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Hon. Medical Staff, Matron and Nursing Staff.

DELEGATED VICE-PRESIDENTS & GOVERNORS.

Rule 8.—Any corporate body, employers, or workmen engaged in any Colliery, Works, Factory or Business Establishment, the Members of any Company, Trade or Society, Club or Association, including therein any Carnival, Ball, or such like Committee, or the Member of any Church or Congregation, who shall have given or shall hereafter give a donation of One hundred pounds or upwards, shall be entitled to nominate and appoint for themselves respectively a Vice-President annually; every Twenty guineas subscribed annually they shall be entitled to nominate and appoint a Vice-President during the payment of such subscription; for every donation of Twenty guineas they shall be entitled to nominate and appoint a Governor annually; and for a guinea subscribed annually they shall be entitled to nominate and appoint a Governor during the payment of such subsc iption, p ovided that in no case any Corpo ate body or Committee be entitled under this Rule to nominate for themselves more than five Vice-Presidents and five Governors.

Rule 9.—A donation may be paid in two instalments, provided not more than six months elapse between the two payments.

Rule 19.—Subscriptions are to be considered due on the 1st day of January in each year.






