Fortieth Annual Meeting of Donors and Subscribers.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee have pleasure in submitting to you the Fortieth Annual Report of the Hospital and Statements of Account for the year ended 31st December, 1938.

During the year Patients residing in the following Parishes or Places have been treated in the Hospital:—

Asby, Askham, Blackburn, Blencarn, Blencowe, Bolton (Lancs.), Bowscar, Bradford, Brougham, Calthwaite, Catterlen, Cliburn, Clifton, Culgaith, Dacre, Dalston, Dockray, Eamont Bridge, Fatfield, Fence Houses, Gamblesby, Glenridding, Great Salkeld, Great Strickland, Greystoke, Hackthorpe, Helton, Hetton-le-Hole, Jarrow, Kilmarnock, Kirkby Stephen, Kirkoswald, Langwathby, Leamington, Levenshulme, Leyland, Leytonstone, Little Strickland, Long Marton, Lowther Village, Manchester, Mapperley, Martindale, Melkinthorpe, Melmerby, Morecambe, Newby, Newton Reigny, Ousby, Paisley, Patterdale, Penrith, Plumpton, Plymouth, Pooley Bridge, Preston, Red Hills, Selby, Skelton, Skirwith, Stainton, Temple Sowerby, Tirril, Troutbeck, Wallasey, Whinfell, Winskill and Unthank.

The number of cases treated was 187 as against 207 in 1937. Sixty-three of the cases were Medical and 124 Surgical, 36 Operations being performed. Thirty-five cases were Motor Accidents, accounting for 434 "Patient Days." The cost of treating these Motor Accident cases works out at £193 18s. 10½d., towards which the sum of £56 8s. 5d. has been received from the patients themselves or from Insurance Companies.

There were 194 X-ray cases, 229 photographs being taken and 27 Screen Examinations.

In addition to the above, 38 out-patients (requiring 16 minor operations) were treated.

The number of * "Patient Days" was 3,905 as against 2,968 for 1937.

The average daily number of inmates was 10.7 and the average cost per patient per day works out at 8s. 11½d. as against 10s. 4¼d. for 1937.

* *e.g.*—One Patient who is in for, say, 10 days, counts as ten "Patient Days."

As intimated in last year's report, the new Sterilizing Equipment required has now been installed and a new shadowless lamp fitted in the Theatre.

Various improvements to a bathroom and other parts of the Hospital premises have been effected and a new gas cooking range has been installed in the kitchen.

Some new Surgical Instruments have been purchased since the end of last year and now all the equipment has been modernised it should be sufficient to meet normal requirements.

The cost of these improvements and the provision of new equipment has amounted to £826. To meet this outlay the Chairman very generously gave a donation of £210 as a thankoffering for the preservation of peace in September last and the Penrith General Workers' Committee also gave £25 towards the cost of new instruments. The repairs fund shows a debit balance of £45 5s. but since the close of last year Mr. Joseph Harrison has very kindly given a donation of £50 towards the cost of the new instruments.

The Committee extend to Mr. Bolton, Mr. Harrison and the Penrith General Workers' Committee their grateful thanks and appreciation for these donations which have enabled the improvements to be effected without debiting the repair fund with a large deficit.

Mr. Hartley of Carlisle has very kindly offered to come to Penrith from time to time to perform operations and operated at the Hospital on the 8th of February for the first time. The Committee are very glad to think that with the benefit of Mr. Hartley's skill the Hospital will be still more useful to the district in the future while at the same time some small reduction will be made to the waiting list of the Cumberland Infirmary.

The Committee also wish to express their thanks for the following legacies and donations :—

Bequest by late Mr. Wm. A. Fairbairn, £45 ; Lloyds Bank, Ltd., part of residue of Estate of James Henry Stephens, deceased, £50 ; Penrith General Workers' Committee, £175 ; Skelton, Ellonby and Lamonby District General Workers' Committee, £8 13s. 6d. ; Great Blencowe District General Workers, £1 2s. ; London, Midland and Scottish Railway Hospital Fund, £7 7s. ; Tirril and District Hospital Fund, £5 ; and other donations.

Complete lists of all subscriptions, donations, etc., are given on pages 12 to 15 of this report.

The Financial position of the Hospital is satisfactory.

The cost of administration has been heavier than usual, whilst the income from some sources has fallen. The income from investments was reduced last year by over £200, but the greater part of this is only a temporary reduction.

The Committee note the income from subscriptions has again fallen and they would welcome new subscribers in the place of people who have died or left the district.

The Committee renew their thanks for the continued help and support rendered by the Ladies' Committee. With their usual efficiency they have again done splendid work for the welfare of the Hospital and patients. "Pound Day" was again successful and the following is a summary of the goods received :—

Sugar 440 lbs., Cereals 278 lbs., Butter 35 lbs., Eggs 107 lbs. (855 eggs), Tea 51 lbs., Cocoa and Coffee 9 lbs., Miscellaneous provisions 247 lbs., Soap 247 lbs., other goods 64 lbs., and £26 15s. 3d. in cash.

The sum of £20 7s. in cash and some useful articles were also received through the "Linen League." From these funds the covering of the Hall and passages with Linoleum has been carried out, the stock of Blankets renewed and many comforts provided for the staff and patients.

It is with deep regret the Committee record the death of Miss Wright, who died last July. Miss Wright had been a member of the Committee for many years and was held in the highest esteem by her colleagues.

We also regret to record the passing of Colonel J. H. Bates and of Mr. George Wainwright. Colonel Bates had been connected with the Hospital work and was Treasurer for 20 years, whilst Mr. Wainwright had been connected with the Hospital since its foundation and for a time served as Honorary Secretary.

The Committee also regret the loss by retirement of Canon Byard who took a keen interest in the affairs of the Hospital and its work and who had been a member of the Committee for 27 years and we extend to him our best wishes.

The Committee renew their thanks for all financial support and for help and service rendered by the Honorary Medical Staff, the Honorary Dental Surgeons and other Officers of the Hospital.

SYMOND'S BENEFACTION.

Much good work has been done by the District Nurse during the past year and a record of the cases treated is given on page 7.

A further grant of £25 to this fund was given by the Penrith General Workers' Committee and the Committee record their thanks for this sum and for other donations received.

The Statement of account is shown on page 8.
