



Forty-First Annual Meeting of Donors and Subscribers.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee have pleasure in submitting to you the Forty-First Annual Report of the Hospital and Statements of Account for the year ended 31st December, 1939.

During the year Patients residing in the following Parishes or Places have been treated in the Hospital :—

Askham, Bowscar, Botcherby, Brampton, Burn Banks, Carlisle, Catterlen, Calthwaite, Clifton, Cliburn, Cleator Moor, Cocker-mouth, Dacre, Dalston, Dalemain, Dockray, Eamont Bridge, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Glassonby, Greystoke, Great Salkeld, Great Strickland, Harrington, Hackthorpe, Helton, Howtown, Keswick, Laithes, Langwathby, Lazonby, Lamonby, Leeds, Light Cliff, Little Salkeld, Long Marton, Lowther, Lowther Village, London, Manston, Martindale, Morland, Middlesborougn, Newby, Newbiggin, Newton Reigny, Nottingham, Ousby, Penrith, Plumpton, Pooley Bridge, Rosgill, Sale, Shap, Skelton, Skirwith, Stevenage, Temple Sowerby, Tirril, Troutbeck, Windermere, Yanwath and York.

The number of cases treated was 205 as against 187 in 1938. 46 of the cases were Medical and 159 Surgical, 91 Operations being performed.

30 of the cases were Motor Accident cases, accounting for 490 "Patient Days." The cost of treating these Motor Accident cases works out at £242 8s. 11½d., towards which the sum of £55 18s. 6d. has been received from the Patients themselves or from Insurance Companies.

There were 184 X-ray cases, 219 Photographs being taken and 32 Screen examinations.

In addition to the above, there were 30 Out-patients (requiring 29 minor operations) treated.

The number of * "Patient Days" was 3,728 as against 3,905 for 1938.

The average daily number of inmates was 10.02, and the average cost per patient per day works out at 9s. 10½d. as against 8s. 11½d. for 1938.

* e.g.—One Patient who is in for, say, 10 days, counts as ten "Patient Days."

As foreshadowed in the last Report, Mr. Hartley has visited the Hospital at regular intervals (except for a short period after the outbreak of War) and has performed 41 major operations. This has had the very satisfactory results that Penrith cases have not had to wait for treatment at Carlisle, and also that the waiting list at Carlisle is reduced, but it has also resulted in considerable extra expenditure in equipping and running the Hospital. We extend to Mr. Hartley our grateful thanks for his honorary services which have been much appreciated by the Patients and your Committee.

At the outbreak of War in September the Committee were ordered to empty as many beds as possible. This was done, and for a time practically no patients were admitted and our activities were curtailed. Fortunately, the restriction was removed in November and since then the normal work of the Hospital has proceeded and all beds can be used.

During the year the Committee have received the following sums :—

Anonymous Donation, £50 ; Bequest by Mr. H. Lawrence, Calthwaite Hall, £500 ; Residue of Estate of Mr. Edward Schofield, deceased, £210 4s. 11d. ; the residue of Estate of Mrs. Anne Eddy, deceased, £41 19s. 9d. ; Penrith General Workers' Committee, £200 ; Skelton, Ellonby and Lamonby District General Workers' Committee, £6 4s. 3d. ; Great Blencowe General Workers, £1 2s. 6d. ; Tirril and District Hospital Fund, £5 ; Mr. E. C. H. Dowson, Toronto (towards cost of Black-out), £10 ; and other Donations.

Complete Lists of Subscriptions, Donations, &c., are given on pages 12 to 15 of this Report.

The Committee express their thanks for these donations and all other financial support during the past year, and express the hope that it may be continued during the current year in spite of the difficult times through which we are passing.

The Committee regret that, owing to deaths, the list of subscribers tends to diminish. In view of the extra cost of running the Hospital, the Committee would welcome new subscribers. In the last 3 years the Committee have spent about £740 in modernising and equipping the Hospital and making it possible to perform major operations. So far as can be seen there should be no more abnormal expenditure for some time.

The Financial position of the Hospital is fairly satisfactory, the Maintenance Account showing a balance of £7 1s. 11d. in hand at the end of the year, but it was not found possible to transfer anything towards the expenditure on repairs and renewals which are charged to the Repairs and Renewals Fund.

Upon referring to the Repairs and Renewals Fund it will be noticed that the sum of £247 0s. 9d. has been expended under this head. Of this sum £81 14s. 8d. represents the cost of Surgical instruments purchased, towards which Mr. Joseph Harrison kindly gave a donation of £50 and the Penrith General Workers' Committee gave £25. The account shows a debit balance of £217 5s. 9d.

Our thanks are due to the Ladies' Committee for the part taken by them in the work of the Hospital. Another successful "Pound Day" was organised by them, also the "Linen League." The following is a list of goods received on "Pound Day":—

Sugar 506 lbs., Cereals 346 lbs., Butter 26 lbs., Tea 37 lbs., Coffee and Cocoa 13 lbs., Soap 240 lbs., Miscellaneous provisions 200 lbs., other Goods 96 lbs., 850 Eggs and 10 st. of Potatoes; also the sum of £23 9s. 10d. in cash.

A number of useful articles and the sum of £20 15s. 0d. were received through the Linen League.

The Committee are very grateful for support received from various directions during the past year, and take this opportunity of thanking all who have assisted in the work of the Hospital, including the Honorary Medical Staff, the Honorary Dental Surgeons and other Officers of the Hospital.

SYMOND'S BENEFACTION.

The District Nurse has been kept busy during the year and a record of the cases treated is given on page 7.

The Penrith General Workers' Committee gave a donation of £25 to the Fund, and the Committee record their thanks for this sum and other donations received. A Statement of Account is given on page 8.
