



Forty-Second Annual Meeting of Donors and Subscribers.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee have pleasure in submitting to you the Forty-Second Annual Report of the Hospital and Statements of Account for the year ended 31st December, 1940.

During the year Patients have been treated in the Hospital from 49 places near and 8 places outside our immediate area.

The number of cases treated was 209 as against 205 in 1939. Fifty-eight of the cases were Medical and 151 Surgical, 87 Operations being performed. Eleven of the cases were Motor Accident cases, accounting for 221 "Patient Days." The cost of treating these Motor Accident cases works out at £121 11s., towards which the sum of £22 17s. has been received from the Patients themselves or from Insurance Companies.

There were 177 X-Ray cases, 192 Photographs being taken and 36 Screen Examinations.

In addition to the above there were 13 Out-Patients treated (requiring 3 minor operations).

The number of * "Patient Days" was 3,435 as against 3,728 for 1939.

The average daily number of inmates was 9.308 and the average cost per patient per day works out at 11s. 0d. as against 9s. 10½d. for 1939. This increase is inevitable owing to increased costs which may go up further.

During the year Mr. Hartley has again visited the Hospital at regular intervals and has performed 25 major operations, and we record our thanks and appreciation of his continued services which are of material benefit to the Hospital and the area which it serves.

The Committee express their thanks for all financial support received during the past year. Particulars are set out in the various lists attached to the accounts.

* e.g.—One Patient who is in for, say, 10 days, counts as ten "Patient Days."

The following legacies have been received:—

Bequest by the late Mrs. Jane E. Frogson, deceased, £200 and residue of her Estate £855 12s. 7d. in cash and £100 Glasgow Corporation Stock; Miss Sarah Telford, deceased, £20; Miss Jane Scott, deceased, residue of estate, £22 14s. 7d.; Miss E. A. Howe, deceased, legacy £50.

The financial position of the Hospital calls for little comment. Upon referring to the Maintenance Account on page 8 it will be observed that at the end of the year the account closed with a debit balance of £6 10s., as against a credit balance of £7 1s. 11d. at the commencement of the year. The expenditure on this account during the year shows an increase of £82 above the previous year's total whilst subscriptions show a fall of £5 and income from entertainments was £25 down. These reductions were covered by an increase in the amount received in Donations and Patients' Fees. It has again not been possible to transfer anything from the Maintenance Account to the Repairs and Renewals Fund. The amount expended on Repairs and Renewals throughout the year was £62 10s. 1d., and the fund shows a debit balance of £179 15s. 10d.

The Committee decided in September last to adopt the scheme of Covenanted Subscriptions. Under this scheme subscribers who are liable to pay income tax at full standard rate sign an agreement covenanting to pay their subscription to the Hospital for a fixed number of years. Under Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1922, the Hospital is enabled to claim from the Inland Revenue Income Tax at standard rate on the amount of the covenanted subscriptions. The subscriber is credited in the subscription list with the amount of his subscription and the amount of Income Tax the Hospital can recover thereon.

The response to the scheme to date has been satisfactory, some 27 Subscribers having signed agreements. The Committee invite further subscribers to adopt the scheme which will benefit the Hospital. Further details and a form of Agreement may be obtained from the Honorary Secretary.

The Ladies' Committee have continued their activities in their usual efficient manner.

They again held "Pound Day" and organised the "Linen League." Considering wartime conditions the response to both efforts was highly satisfactory. The following were received on "Pound Day":—

Cereals 294 lbs., Butter 5 lbs., 880 Eggs (110 lbs.), Tea 86 lbs., Miscellaneous Provisions 320 lbs., Soap 26 lbs., Other Goods 149 lbs., 1 Sack of Potatoes and £22 11s. 6d. in cash.

A number of useful articles and the sum of £19 14s. 0d. were received through the Linen League.

With the money received the Ladies' Committee have renewed all the Blinds to comply with black-out requirements, renewed the stock of Under Blankets and White Bedcovers, and also provided a number of smaller Comforts including the provision of a Gas Fire in the Nurses' Sitting Room.

The Committee renew their thanks and appreciation of the services of the Honorary Medical Staff, the Honorary Dental Surgeons and all others who have worked for the welfare of the Hospital during the past year.

SYMOND'S BENEFACTION.

The District Nurse has spent another very active year and has done much useful work.

The advent into the town of people from evacuated areas tends to increase the Nurse's activities.

The financial position of the fund is satisfactory and the sum of £100 was invested in 3% Defence Bonds during the Penrith War Weapons Week held last November.

The Statement of Account of the Fund appears on page 8.
