REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee have pleasure in submitting to you the Forty-Third Annual Report of the Hospital and Statements of Account for the year ended 31st December, 1941.

In order to reduce the paper used and printing, this Report has been curtailed and the list of gifts in kind, which have been regularly acknowledged in the Press, has been omitted.

The number of cases treated was 171 with 193 X-ray cases and 14 Out-patients.

The number of * "Patient Days" was 2,946 and the average cost per patient per day was 12s. 7d.

The financial position (which is satisfactory) and legacies received are shown in the accounts.

"Pound Day" and the Linen League were again very successful.

The Committee record with much regret the loss of Miss Brooks, Mr. Toppin, Mrs. Shaw and Mr. R. Hunter, all of whom had done much for the Hospital for many years.

The Committee renew their thanks and appreciation of all financial support and of the services of the Honorary Medical Staff, the Honorary Dental Surgeons and all others who have worked for the welfare of the Hospital during the past year.
