Forty-Ninth Annual Meeting of Donors and Subscribers.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee have pleasure in submitting to you the Forty-Ninth Annual Report and Statements of Account for the year ended 31st December, 1947.

The year has been a very busy one and the number of cases treated was the record figure of 233 as against 198 cases the previous year. Of the cases treated 107 were medical and 126 surgical. The number of * "Patient Days" was 3,883. In addition 160 out-patients were treated. The number of out-patients has greatly increased on account of treatment with the Sun Ray Lamp.

The number of X-ray Cases was 154—165 photographs being taken and 42 screen examinations made.

Details of the result of cases treated are given in the comparative list in Appendix "A."

The average cost per patient per day is 16s. 6½d. as against 11s. 1d. for 1946. The extra expenditure is due to higher working costs, more particularly the increase of salaries under the Rushcliffe Scale, and establishment items.

The pension paid to Miss Park out of Maintenance Account has been provided for by the purchase of an annuity.

The Financial position continues satisfactory and the Maintenance Account shows a balance in hand of £34 19s. 6d. at the close of the year.

The Accounts are detailed on pages 6 to 9 of this Report.

The Committee express their thanks to Donors and Subscribers and to the Penrith Branch of the Hospitals Contributory Scheme for their continued support, also for the following legacies received during the year:

Miss Sarah Gedling, deceased, £200.

Mr. Joseph Harris, deceased, £200.

Miss Sarah Simpson, deceased, £451 12s. 3d.

The legacy received from the late Miss Sarah Simpson was paid to Maintenance Account.

Since the close of the year the sum of £658 16s. 1d., being a share in the estate of Mr. Thomas Dixon, deceased, has been received.

Thanks are also due to the Ladies' Committee for their untiring efforts and continued help with the Hospital affairs. "Pound Day" was again organised by them and proved very successful. A quantity of useful goods were received and the sum of £42 6s. in cash.

* e.g.—One Patient who is in for, say, 10 days, counts as ten "Patient Days."

As intimated in the last Report the Committee have paid attention to the question of much needed renovations and improvements.

The stocks of blankets and linen, which had not been renewed during the war years, have been replenished, and new surgical equipment has been received and is in use.

The Nurses' sleeping quarters have been altered by division into separate rooms. This is a big improvement. Various other improvements have also received attention. The Ladies' Committee have provided new wardrobes for use in the Private Ward and the Nurses' bedrooms, and have also paid for the renovation of other furniture.

The Committee have in hand the question of providing more adequate and improved dining room and kitchen staff facilities if and when the necessary Licences can be obtained. Plans have been passed for these and estimates accepted.

The "Appointed Day" for hospitals to be taken over by the State has been fixed for the 5th July next. By that date the Committee hope to have completed their plans for improvements and renovations and to be able to hand over the Hospital premises in good condition. It is intended to issue a further Report up to the end of the Committee's period of management.

The Committee would like to take this opportunity of expressing to the Hon. Medical Staff, the Hon. Dental Surgeon and all others their grateful thanks and appreciation of the many services and help so freely given for the welfare of the Hospital, and also to Donors and Subscribers for their interest and financial support.

SYMOND'S BENEFACTION.

The work of the District Nurse in the homes of the sick continues to be a useful service in the town and suburbs and the Nurse has had a fairly busy year. The number of cases treated was 87, and 1,860 visits were paid. The result of the year's cases are set out in Appendix "B," shown on page 10 of this Report. At the end of the year Nurse Westmorland retired after serving the town as District Nurse for 24 years. During this period Nurse Westmorland has given loyal and devoted service to the people of Penrith and District, and there are many who join with the Committee of Management in wishing her many happy years of retirement.

In recognition of her services the Committee have been able to make suitable pension provision and, in addition, a fund has been opened providing the public with an opportunity of subscribing to a testimonial.

Nurse Westmorland has been succeeded by Nurse W. M. Douglas, a former Penrithian. She has had a wide experience in Nursing and spent some years abroad in the nursing services during the second world war.

Donor's Qualification.—A Payment of not less than £12.
