





The Eighty-First Annual Report

of the

Committee of Management of

The Royal Eye and Ear Hospital,

for the year ended December 31st, 1937.

THE Committee of Management has pleasure in reporting a year of continued activity during 1937. The services rendered by the Hospital are not only local, but its valuable and efficient treatment is appreciated over a wide area, as the enclosed chart indicates. The number of patients passing through its Wards, as shown in the appended lists, gives some idea of the amount of time, care and labour given by the Honorary Surgeons, Matron and Staff. To them, everyone, the Committee wishes to express its very warm thanks for all they have done during the past twelve months.

The increased cost of foodstuffs and commodities has meant a considerable strain on the finances of the Hospital, and it is only by constant watchfulness on the part of the Secretary-Superintendent, and the collaboration of the Matron and Staff, combined with the increased contribution from the Bradford Hospital and Convalescent Fund that the accounts show such a satisfactory result.

The extension announced in the last Report has taken rather longer than was anticipated, but is now near completion and will provide a bright and comfortable home for the Nurses. This is the first move towards the very necessary extension of the Hospital itself, for which plans are now under consideration.

The increase of staff mentioned in the Orthoptic Department in the last Report has been fully justified.

The Nursing Home has been taxed to capacity on various occasions during the year, and is a valuable and much appreciated adjunct to the Hospital activities.

The Committee regrets that Mr. E. W. Humphries decided to relinquish the Chairmanship after one year's tenure, and would like to record its grateful thanks and appreciation of his 28 years on the Committee, including 19 years as House Chairman.

Report on

Orthoptic Department for year 1937.

A T the commencement of this year the number of weekly clinics was increased to five, which enabled the Department to reduce the waiting list to small proportions, and to deal with a greater number of patients.

The total number of attendances during the year was 2,294. The patients who actually received treatment totalled 77.

Of the above, 26 were discharged cured; 8 failed to respond to orthoptics, but were improved cosmetically by operation; while 4 ceased to attend after initial treatment had commenced. The remainder are either still on treatment or have been postponed for various reasons.

The average number of treatments per discharged patient was 34. As the average figure of 48 is expected in large clinics, this may be considered satisfactory. Some variation is inevitable year by year, according to the difficulty of the cases sent in to the Department.



Report of the Ladies' Committee, 1937.

THE Ladies' Committee has pleasure in presenting their Thirty-first Annual Report and Balance Sheet.

During the year, 143 visits were made to the Hospital. One patient was sent to Semon's Convalescent Home.

The thanks of the Committee are due to everyone who helped to make the "Pound Day" a success. £165/15/5 was received in money, and £111/6/3 in provisions and cleaning materials, making a total of £277/1/8.

The Needlework Guild again sent us fifty garments, for which we are very grateful.



IN-PATIENTS.

LINEN.—In-Patients must bring Slippers and a change of Clean Linen.

DISCIPLINE.—They must obey the orders of the Medical Officers, the Matron and the Nurses. They must not leave the Hospital without the special permission of the Medical Officers or the Matron.

VISITORS.—The friends of patients may visit them between the hours of Two and Four p.m. on Wednesday and Saturday, and Two and half-past Three on Sunday; two visitors are permitted to each patient. Visitors are strictly prohibited from conveying provisions and spirituous or other liquors into the Hospital. Any infraction of this rule will be punished by withdrawal of the privilege of visiting in future.

The Committee hope that Patients and Visitors able to do so will contribute towards the maintenance of the Hospital by means of the Donation Boxes.

The Prevention of Blindness.

The Committee, being painfully impressed with the fact that loss of sight might have been prevented in the case of many persons who apply for treatment, are anxious to make it known as widely as possible, that one of the most common causes of blindness is INFLAMMATION OF THE EYES OF NEW-BORN INFANTS, due to contagious matter getting into the eyes during, or soon after, birth.

The essential precautions to be adopted are:-

- 1.—Immediately after the birth of the baby, and before anything else is done, wipe the eyelids and all parts surrounding the eyes with a soft, dry, white rag; soon afterwards, wash these parts with clean tepid water, before any other part of the body is washed.
- 2.—If the child's eyelids become red and swollen, or a yellowish white matter appears between the eyelids within a few days after birth, IMMEDIATELY seek the advice of a doctor. The disease is very dangerous, and if not at once skilfully treated may destroy the sight of both eyes; but if attended to in time, it is nearly always cured without impairment of vision.
- 3.—In the meantime, until advised by the doctor, keep the eyes as clean as possible by washing away the discharge every hour during the day, and every two hours during the night. This is best done by separating the eyelids carefully with the finger and thumb, and allowing a gentle stream of clean lukewarm water to run between them from a piece of white rag or absorbent cotton wool, held by another person two inches above the eyes. The small pieces of linen or wool used must be burned immediately afterwards. Sponges must never be used for this purpose.
- 4.—If one eye only is affected, be very careful the discharge from it does not get to the other eye. The matter is very infective.
- 5.—After each attention to the eyes of the baby, the hands of the person attending to them must be thoroughly washed.
- 6.—Many other diseases of the eyes of children would be considerably modified and relieved if the eyes were kept scrupulously clean.


