



THE Committee of Management has pleasure in presenting its Annual Report for the year 1940.

The functions of the Hospital under war conditions have been clarified since the last Report, and it is a matter for congratulation that it has been able to carry out its duties so efficiently under difficult circumstances.

130 Nursing Auxiliaries have received their practical training at this Hospital.

The further provision of shelters, bunks, etc., has been dealt with during the year as experience and advice have suggested, and the Committee believe that all steps have been taken, as far as can be foreseen, for the security and comfort of the Staff and Patients.

The Committee would like to record its very warm appreciation of the loyalty and devotion of the Honorary Surgeons, Matron, Secretary-Superintendent and Staff to the service of the Hospital under trying conditions. This applies particularly to those resident on the premises, who have had many broken nights due to alarms, followed by full duties on the following day, and who have had the constant strain of increased responsibilities to bear. The Committee feel confident that, whatever may be in store, they can rely upon the same splendid spirit of sacrifice and devotion in the service of the Hospital.

The Nursing Home has responded during the year to all calls made upon it. The Assistant Matron, Miss L. Hipkins, left during the year to take up the post of Matron at Wolverhampton and Midland Counties Eye

Infirmery at Wolverhampton. The Committee would like to express its appreciation of her many years of efficient and devoted service.

The Ladies' Committee was unable to hold its usual "Pound Day" due to rationing difficulties, but has rendered its customary valuable help and service, and merits the best thanks of the Committee of Management.



IN-PATIENTS.

LINEN.—In-Patients must bring Slippers and a change of Clean Linen.

DISCIPLINE.—They must obey the orders of the Medical Officers, the Matron and the Nurses. They must not leave the Hospital without the special permission of the Medical Officers or the Matron.

VISITORS.—The friends of patients may visit them between the hours of Two and Four p.m. on Wednesday and Saturday, and Two and half-past Three on Sunday; two visitors are permitted to each patient. Visitors are strictly prohibited from conveying provisions and spirituous or other liquors into the Hospital. Any infraction of this rule will be punished by withdrawal of the privilege of visiting in future.

The Committee hope that Patients and Visitors able to do so will contribute towards the maintenance of the Hospital by means of the Donation Boxes.

The Prevention of Blindness.

The Committee, being painfully impressed with the fact that loss of sight might have been prevented in the case of many persons who apply for treatment, are anxious to make it known as widely as possible, that one of the most common causes of blindness is INFLAMMATION OF THE EYES OF NEW-BORN INFANTS, due to contagious matter getting into the eyes during, or soon after, birth.

The essential precautions to be adopted are:—

1.—Immediately after the birth of the baby, and before anything else is done, wipe the eyelids and all parts surrounding the eyes with a soft, dry, white rag; soon afterwards, wash these parts with clean tepid water, before any other part of the body is washed.

2.—If the child's eyelids become red and swollen, or a yellowish white matter appears between the eyelids within a few days after birth, IMMEDIATELY seek the advice of a doctor. The disease is very dangerous, and if not at once skilfully treated may destroy the sight of both eyes; but if attended to in time, it is nearly always cured without impairment of vision.

3.—In the meantime, until advised by the doctor, keep the eyes as clean as possible by washing away the discharge every hour during the day, and every two hours during the night. This is best done by separating the eyelids carefully with the finger and thumb, and allowing a gentle stream of clean lukewarm water to run between them from a piece of white rag or absorbent cotton wool, held by another person two inches above the eyes. The small pieces of linen or wool used must be burned immediately afterwards. Sponges must never be used for this purpose.

4.—If one eye only is affected, be very careful the discharge from it does not get to the other eye. The matter is very infective.

5.—After each attention to the eyes of the baby, the hands of the person attending to them must be thoroughly washed.

6.—Many other diseases of the eyes of children would be considerably modified and relieved if the eyes were kept scrupulously clean.
