BENEFACTIONS.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

Donors of £50 and upwards at any one time are entitled to become Life Governors of the Hospital, and their names will be entered in a special book kept as a list of the Life Governors of the Hospital.

Donors of £100 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for five years.

Donors of £200 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for ten years.

Donors, either individually or collectively, of £500, are further entitled to name a bed or a cot in either Branch of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and also have that name inscribed on a board placed in the Hospital for this purpose.

Donors, either individually or collectively, of £1,000, are entitled to name a bed or cot in both Branches of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and have that name inscribed on a board in the Hospital.

Any individual who collects and presents to the Hospital the sum of £100 shall be entitled to have a Life Governorship of the Hospital conferred on him.

Any Society, Institute, Organisation, Committee, Club or School, etc., other than Hospital Aid Societies, presenting in any one year the sum of £100 and upwards, shall be entitled to nominate one representative as a Life Governor of the Hospital.

Hospital Aid Societies are not entitled to name more than one bed in each Branch of the Hospital.

LEGACIES.

A Legacy of £500 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a board in the Hospital, also a bed may be named during the lifetime of any one he may have nominated, or the care of his grave undertaken by the Hospital if desired by the Testator.

A Legacy of £1,000 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a board in the Hospital; to have a bed named as he may wish in perpetuity, and also have the care of his grave undertaken if desired by the Testator, provided it is situated within twenty-five miles of the Hospital.

NAMING WARDS, ETC.

The Board of Management shall have the power to recommend the Governors of the Hospital to confer on any donor, or in memory of any Testator, a mark of appreciation or distinction, such as the naming of a ward or a portion of a ward, the naming of a bed or the erection of a tablet, etc.

Rule II. GOVERNORS:—

(1) The Life Governors shall be:

- (1) The Life Governors of the Royal Victoria and the Royal Boscombe and West Hants Hospitals who qualified prior to 1st January, 1911.
- (2) Donors of Fifty Pounds and upwards at one time to the Funds of the Charities or their nominee.
- (3) Benefactors under Rule v.
- (4) One of the Executors of any person bequeathing £500 and upwards to the Funds of the Charities.
- (5) Such donors or Nominees of Schools, Clubs, Institutions and Societies, etc., collecting in any one year One Hundred Pounds and upwards as the Board of Management may determine.
- (6) The Board of Management may elect as Honorary Life Governors those to whom it wishes to show a mark of appreciation for having rendered some distinctive personal service to the Hospital.

Report for the year 1937.

The Board of Management has pleasure in presenting to the Governors the Annual Report and audited Statement of Accounts for the year 1937.

For the third year in succession there has been a record number of Patients admitted and also Out-patients attending the Specialist Departments showing the services of the Specialised Staff have been increasingly utilised.

Special efforts have been made to reduce the number of Patients awaiting admission, but owing to the increased population of the district served by the Hospital it has been found difficult to accommodate every patient immediately, but no urgent case requiring admission has ever been kept waiting.

Progress.

The Board is pleased to report the completion of the Building of the Operating Theatre Block—this extension, which is of the latest and most modern design, provides in three Units, three Operating Theatres, complete with Anæsthetic Rooms, Surgeons' Scrubbing-up Rooms and all necessary offices for the Operators, their Assistants and the Nursing Staff. One of the Theatres is specially equipped for Fracture operative work which has become a Specialist Department.

The X-Ray and Radiological Department has been re-modelled and enlarged to meet increasing demands in the methods of diagnosis which are improving from time to time.

The thanks and appreciation of the Honorary Staff have been expressed for these improved and latest additions to the Hospital, which afford modern equipment and facilities for up-to-date technique.

The provision of such an extension has meant much work and close consideration of detail in order to produce additional accommodation of which all can be proud.

The Board is deeply conscious of the supervision of the Building Committee under the Chairmanship of Mr. A. Godwin Pratt.

The necessary funds have been raised under the ever watchful eye of the Honorary Treasurer, Mr. Percy M. Bright, and it is gratifying to know the buildings have been paid for.

Private Wards.

There has been a constant demand for this accommodation and all available beds have been in continual use; the popularity of this service is increasing and ere long further beds will be required to meet this need. Many letters of thanks have been received expressing appreciation of these facilities.

Cancer Appeal Fund.

The Appeal has made progress and active measures have been taken to obtain the amount necessary to provide a Centre at this Hospital for the Treatment of Cancer. A Broadcast Appeal was made by Sir Charles Gordon Watson, K.B.E., C.M.G., F.R.C.S., and resulted in the sum of £916 16s. 3d., and at a Public Dinner held in October in Bournemouth Mr. and Mrs. Alex Maclean most generously made an offer to give £5,000 if the balance of £10,000 were subscribed within a reasonable period. This magnificent offer, coming as it does in succession to the gift of £10,000 to the Extension Fund which was recorded in last year's Report, has stimulated interest in the Cancer Appeal Fund and the very best thanks of the Hospital and its Governors are due to Mr. and Mrs. Maclean for this further proof of their generous interest. A public appeal has been issued and efforts in many ways have been made to secure this splendid offer. At December 31st the sum received and promised, including Mr. Maclean's personal promise, amounted to £10,624 9s. 4d. The co-operation of the British Empire Cancer Campaign has assisted. Further efforts are to be made and a House-to-House Collection by ladies is being organised by which it is hoped to obtain the balance required. The Board wishes to express very sincere thanks to all who have helped and are helping in this great effort and to add the assurance that the project is most worthy and will ensure much wanted facilities for the Hospital's work in its treatment of Cancer.

The generous support, kindly consideration and whole-hearted co-operation given by the respective Mayors of the Borough during these efforts are much appreciated.

Poole Road.

Close consideration has been given to the Hospital at Poole Road. Difficulties have arisen owing to the dearth of Nurses which is general. The Poole Road Hospital, which is doing good service, is difficult to adapt to modern methods and the work has

outgrown its original capacity. At a Special Meeting of Governors the recommendation of the Board of Management and Committees was accepted and authority has been given to close that Hospital when suitable accommodation has been provided to cater for the beds now there. The Board regrets this step in view of the history and sentiment attached to this Hospital which has done such splendid service since 1887.

Nursing Staff.

In common with other Hospitals much difficulty has been experienced in obtaining sufficient entrants to the Nursing Profession; your Board has endeavoured to make the conditions better and many improvements have been made for comfort, recreation and duty times, the latter of which have been reduced, necessitating a larger number of Nurses, in consequence of which the cost has grown, also by the salaries being increased following a rising Scale adopted by other Hospitals, particularly Public Authority Hospital. The amenities available for members of the Nursing Staff include a first class Hard Tennis Court which has been laid during the past year, exclusive use of Bathing Huts, and frequent Passes to many of the Entertainments in the Borough, this latter privilege being due to the courtesy of the Management of the respective Houses, of which the Board is very appreciative.

Finance.

The past year has been a difficult one financially owing to the increasing amount of work for the larger numbers of patients requiring the skilled assistance of the Institution, also the rise in cost of commodities and salaries of the Nursing Staff.

As will be seen by the Statement of Income and Expenditure on page 24 the Total Ordinary Income increased from £49,838 to £51,192, showing a gradual improvement, and the very sincere thanks of the Governors are due to every friend who helped to increase the funds.

The Expenditure has risen from £50,006 to £56,540, showing an increase of £6,534. It must be borne in mind in considering the rising figures of expenditure that constant expansion is taking place. The year 1937 was the first in which the extra cost of maintenance of beds provided in the Winson Ramsay and Charles Hodges Wards was fully felt, these wards having been in use only for a few weeks at the end of 1936. In addition, the transfer of the Maternity Department to its present accommodation involved the addition of thirty-one beds to the establishment, for the wards vacated were immediately brought into use for other patients.

Private Wards for Paying Patients.

Beds are provided for the admission of suitable patients who, while ineligible for the General Wards of the Hospital and unable to afford the fees of a Nursing Home, can pay reduced fees for Maintenance, Nursing and Medical Attendance. Applicants must satisfy the Committee that the patient is eligible. Patients will only be admitted when referred by a Medical Practitioner, except in cases of emergency, when the patient's own Medical Attendant will be informed.

Maternity Cases are eligible for admission.

Infectious or Mental Cases are not eligible for admission.

The charges payable to the Hospital are £4 14s. 6d. per week or at the rate of 13/6 per day for shorter periods, and include maintenance, nursing, massage, dressings, medicines which are included in the Hospital Pharmacopœia, and the use of the Operating Theatre. A form of application and promise to pay must be signed and delivered to the Secretary, before admission wherever possible.

All payments must be made by the patient or guarantor weekly.

The fees for medical treatment are in accordance with a special reduced maximum scale. Fees are payable to the Secretary, together with maintenance charges.

The Private Wards are not intended for Chronic Cases and the Committee retains the right to arrange for the discharge of any patient for this or any other reason.

The ordinary hours of visiting are from 10.30 a.m. to 12 noon and from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. daily.

All accommodation for Paying Patients is in Single-Bed Private Wards.

The Secretary will be pleased to arrange for friends to view the Hospital, if they will first communicate with him for an appointment.



The Secretary will be much obliged to anyone who will send to him the names and addresses of persons, not already contributing, who are likely to subscribe to the Hospital.

Particulars of Contributory Scheme.

Patients are entitled to receive the Free Benefits of the Institution provided they are consistent subscribers under the following Scheme, and are considered by the Medical and Dental Staff to be suitable cases for Hospital treatment. Except in cases of accident or sudden illness they shall bring a letter or certificate from their own Doctor.

If a contribution of **3d. per week** has been made for not less than three months prior to applying for treatment, the contributor, his wife and children, up to the age of 16 years, are **entitled to Free Hospital Maintenance as In-patients or Free Out-patient attention.**

In the case of Business Firms or recognised Committees the contributions may be collected by an agreed Representative who will be responsible to the Hospital for contributions received. The names and addresses of the Contributors will be filed at the Hospital for reference. All contributors attending should bring a note from the agreed Representative certifying that he or she is entitled to receive the free benefits of the Institution as outlined above and a certificate from their Doctor.

In individual cases contributions may be registered by means of Hospital Stamps placed on Official cards. Hospital Stamps and Cards may be obtained direct from the Hospital or through the agreed Representative for the district in which the contributor resides. When attending the Hospital contributors under this section should bring with them their Hospital Cards and a certificate from their Doctor.

The following are not considered eligible for Free Maintenance as In-patients or Free Out-patient attendance under the Scheme :—

1. Persons who would have been liable to pay Income Tax on the scales in force at April, 1931.
2. Women who are admitted for confinement.
3. Cases admitted under agreement with a Health Authority, for whom such Authority is responsible.
4. Persons who are ordered treatment by the Ministry of Pensions.
5. Patients attending the Venereal Clinic, who obtain free treatment under public health schemes.
6. Patients who are able to pay a private Dentist.
7. Panel patients who can obtain the treatment required through their Approved Societies in the form of additional benefits. (This applies particularly to Dental and Ophthalmic benefits provided under National Health Insurance).

Free Maintenance as In-patients or Free Out-patient attendance will not include the supply of Instruments, Appliances, Dentures or Spectacles, although these will be obtainable on special Hospital terms.

The Association is composed of President, Vice-Presidents, Associates, and Juvenile Branch. The duty of each Vice-President is to obtain as many Associates as possible, who will work under her direction.

REPORT FOR 1937.

In presenting the Report we are glad to record an encouraging Special Meeting of Vice-Presidents last year, when plans for sustaining and increasing interest in the Association were discussed, and valuable responses were received then and subsequently.

We hoped for a considerable increase in our returns, but various causes have prevented us from realizing all that we desired. An unusual amount of illness throughout the winter and additional appeals of various kinds, have made the work for the Vice-Presidents and the Executive very difficult. Without this special effort there is no doubt that we should have to report a serious decrease. On the contrary, in various directions we have more than held our own and have secured encouragement in new Vice-Presidents and a considerable number of new Associates.

Twenty-nine promises of help were made at the Special Meeting and more have followed during the year.

It was agreed that in addition to asking the Clergy to make the work known on Hospital Sunday and in Church Magazines, out-lying areas sending patients to the Hospital should be asked to contribute. Shops have been approached and leaflets distributed, while the Vice-Presidents have been asked to enquire among their Associates as to whether any would volunteer to become Vice-Presidents. One of the Meetings held was successful in enrolling twenty Associates and our Ringwood Vice-Presidents also very kindly arranged a meeting. It will be realized that every year Vice-Presidents and Associates are lost owing to removal and other causes, so that continuous effort is needed to keep up our lists and members, an effort which many of our Vice-Presidents maintain steadily. In future also we shall have new claims to meet.

The year has been marked by the great loss in the resignation of our Hon. Treasurer, Mrs. Sydney White, for health reasons. For 21 years Mrs. White has carried on the work with the utmost devotion, and has been connected with the Association for a still longer period.

We are sure that everyone connected with the work will share with the Presidents and the Committee the deepest regret. Happily Mrs. White has consented to remain Vice-Chairman and Vice-President and to allow the Executive and General Committees to meet at her house.

A new Honorary Treasurer was duly elected and we are grateful to Miss Dorothy Smythe for consenting to undertake the work so successfully carried on in the past.

We regret to report the resignation of Mrs. Cox, Mrs. Jackson, Miss Kerle Harvey and Mrs. King King, whose work has been greatly appreciated, and also the death of Miss Hull. Mrs. Jackson has kindly introduced Mrs. Fetherstonhaugh, who has been elected to carry on her work, and for the present Mrs. Chilvers and Mrs. Wright of Ringwood are good enough to add Miss Hull's Associates to their own.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LINEN.

Mrs. White's connection with the work has extended over a considerably longer period, and grateful appreciation of such a record was expressed by Lady Malmesbury, and had been stressed by Mr. Godwin Pratt, Chairman of the Board of Management. The Association is fortunate in retaining Mrs. Sydney White's help as Vice-Chairman and Vice-President.

Lady Malmesbury then presented the gift of Linen, which was accepted by Mr. Godwin Pratt on behalf of the Hospital, with the assurance of the gratitude of the Board of Management at receiving such a large and necessary part of the equipment required by the Hospital.

The Mayor of Bournemouth after welcoming Lady Maud Hoare to the town, congratulated the Association on its important work, and added that this is done so quietly that it is not so well known as it should be.

Then followed a very interesting address by Lady Maud Hoare on the development of the Naval Medical Service, prefaced by an appreciation of the prompt issue of accounts by the Association, and the low costs of administration.

The Earl of Malmesbury and the Rural Dean then proposed a vote of thanks to Lady Maud Hoare, and were followed by Canon Hedley Burrows, who, in proposing a vote of thanks to Lady Malmesbury, said that by our President, we were given a wonderful lead.

POUND DAY COLLECTION.

Annual Pound Day was held on Thursday, 28th October. The total weight of gifts received was 29,716 $\frac{1}{4}$ lbs., a decrease of 4,060 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. as compared with the preceding year, largely accounted for by the fact that no Pound Day Collection was made in the Ringwood area, because of the special Ringwood Bazaar effort which immediately preceded the Pound Day date. At contract prices the value of the goods amounted to £226 15s. 11d. as compared with £274 4s. 7d. in 1936. Cash receipts, after deducting the cost of printing and advertising, were £25 6s. 0d. The total value of the Pound Day in Goods and Cash was £252 1s. 11d.

The Schools in the town and neighbouring districts again were responsible for the success of Pound Day. There is no doubt of the special value of Pound Day in building up a tradition of generous interest of which the benefit to the Hospital is incalculable. The Board expresses warmest thanks to all who work to ensure the success of the effort, and its hope that Pound Day will continue to result in valuable help for the Hospital.

EGG COLLECTION.

The Board of Management expresses its very grateful thanks to the many friends who have materially helped the Hospital by organising Egg Collections and Egg Services in the areas from which patients are sent, particularly to the organisers of Egg Week at Ringwood and Verwood, and to the Winton and North Bournemouth Hospital Sunday Fund Committee and its Hon. RECOVERY OF INCOME TAX ON ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.

By virtue of Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1922, Hospitals can, in certain circumstances, recover Income Tax at the current rate on Annual Subscriptions.

The essential point is that the subscriber shall undertake under a simple Form of Agreement to pay a subscription annually for a period of at least seven years or for life (whichever is the *shorter* period).

A large number of subscribers have already signed such agreements and more than £200 per annum has been added to the available income. In view of the considerable additional income which would accrue to the Hospital from general adoption of this arrangement, it is hoped that all who are eligible and who have not yet considered this matter will signify their willingness to sign the necessary Agreements, a specimen copy of which is appended. There are probably few who do not intend to continue their subscriptions for the stipulated period and in cases where subscribers wish to discontinue the subscription for financial or other reasons the Committee willingly agree to cancellation of the agreement.

The Agreements do not involve subscribers in any additional expense. To give a concrete example:—On every 15/- of Taxed Income a subscriber paying the present standard rate of Income Tax pays 5/-. Therefore on the amount of a subscription of say £5 0s. 0d. (100/-) he would pay Tax amounting to 33/4. All this is recoverable by the Hospital provided the subscription is paid under covenant. Therefore an existing subscription of £5 0s. 0d. can (by signing a Covenant) be transformed into one of £6 13s. 4d. without the need of any payment by the subscriber beyond the continuance of the present subscription, and without any additional entries on the subscriber's own Tax Return.

An Agreement can be made in respect of a subscription of any amount and is terminated by death, so that the subscriber's estate is not liable for further payments under the Deed.

The amount of the subscription remains constant irrespective of any change in the rate of tax payable.

It is not necessary for subscribers who have given Bankers Order Forms to alter such forms in any way.

The Secretary will be glad to hear from any subscribers subject to tax at the standard rate, who are willing to benefit the Hospital in the manner suggested, and to give any further information which may be desired.

FORM OF AGREEMENT.

I, of hereby covenant with the Honorary Treasurer of the Royal Victoria and West Hants Hospital, Bournemouth, that for a period of seven years from the day of , 19 , or during my life, which ever period shall be shorter, I will pay annually to the said Hospital such a sum as will, after the deduction of Income Tax, leave in the hands of the Hospital a net sum of £ , such sum to be paid from my general sum of taxed income so that I shall receive no personal or private benefit in either of the said periods from the said sum of £ , or any part thereof.

A little thought and a little trouble in putting the foil aside and bringing it to us will mean the addition of considerable sums to the Hospital's income. About two tons were sent to the Hospital last year; this quantity can be greatly increased if all will help.

Silver Paper from Cigarettes, Chocolates, Tobacco, Tea, etc. Paint and Cream Tubes of all kinds. Lead from Tea Chests, Lead Caps from Bottles. Lead Buttons, Toys, Type, Bullets, etc., and Old Brass, Copper, Pewter, Spelter, Broken Lead.

Your collection may be delivered to either Branch of the Hospital, Poole Road, or Shelley Road, Boscombe.

Although prices fluctuate any additional effort will be well worth while.
