EXTRACT FROM RULES.

Rule II. GOVERNORS:—

- (1) The Life Governors shall be:
 - (1) The Life Governors of the Royal Victoria and the Royal Boscombe and West Hants Hospitals who qualified prior to 1st January, 1911.
 - (2) Donors of Fifty Pounds and upwards at one time to the Funds of the Charities or their nominee.
 - (3) Benefactors under Rule v.
 - (4) One of the Executors of any person bequeathing £500 and upwards to the Funds of the Charities.
 - (5) Such donors or Nominees of Schools, Clubs, Institutions and Societies, etc., collecting in any one year One Hundred Pounds and upwards as the Board of Management may determine.
 - (6) The Board of Management may elect as Honorary Life Governors those to whom it wishes to show a mark of appreciation for having rendered some distinctive personal service to the Hospital.
- (2) The Temporary Governors shall be:
 - (1) Annual Subscribers of two guineas and upwards.
 - (2) The nominee (in writing) of any firm body corporate board of guardians, school club or society subscribing ten guineas and upwards.
 - (3) Donors of ten guineas and upwards in any one year.
 - (4) Temporary Governors shall continue qualified for 12 months from the receipt of the donation or collection.
 - (5) Members of the Hon. Medical and Dental Staff.

PARTICULARS OF CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Rate of Contribution, 4d. per week.

This contribution covers a man, wife, children under 16 (and any other children or relatives who are ordinarily resident with and wholly dependent on the contributor) for Hospital Maintenance as in-patients or for out-patient attention should the occasion arise.

Income Limit.

£420 per annum. So far as earned income is concerned, this should represent the contributor's basic rate including war bonus, but excluding overtime. The wife's earned income will not be taken into account, but any other income should be included.

Individual Contributors.

Contributions are paid by means of Hospital stamps placed on official cards. These cards and stamps may be obtained from the Hospital, or from an Honorary Agent for the Scheme in the district in which the Contributor resides. A list of Honorary Agents is given in this Pamphlet.

When Attending the Hospital.

When attending the Hospital, except in cases of accident or sudden illness, patients must bring:—

1. **A letter or certificate from their own Doctor.**
2. **The stamped Contribution Card. Neglect to do this will involve a request for payment.**

Other Hospitals.

When attention is received by Contributors or their dependants in any Voluntary Hospital outside Bournemouth, the Scheme will make a payment for such in accordance with the reciprocal arrangements in force and relieve the contributor of liability. This privilege is also extended to cover any case that would be normally admitted to a Voluntary Hospital, subject to a maximum period of twelve weeks for those Hospitals with which there is no reciprocal agreement. Contributor's stamped card, with voucher slip filled in, must be forwarded to Boscombe Hospital, and a voucher will then be sent to the Hospital concerned.

Benefits.

Contributors will receive the services of the Hospital provided:—

1. They are considered by the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, and, in special cases, by the Honorary Dental Staff, to be suitable cases.
2. A contribution of **4d. per week** has been made for not less than 3 months prior to applying, and that contributions are not more than 3 months in arrear.

The Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staff give their services, and contributors receive free maintenance as in-patients and free out-patient attention. This does not include the supply of Instruments, Appliances, Dentures or Spectacles, although these will be obtainable on special Hospital terms.

The following special Out-Patient Departments are included:—Ear, Nose and Throat; Electrical and X-Ray; Orthoptic; Eye; Maternity and Diseases of Women; Fracture; Orthopaedic; Skin; Functional Nervous Disorders; Vaccine Inoculation; Dental; Chiropody.

Ambulance Transport Service.

The Scheme will bear the cost of (Public) Ambulance Transport Service when ordered by the contributor's Doctor or the Hospital Authorities. Ambulance Certificate must be signed by Doctor, and Contributor's Card, Ambulance Certificate, and Receipted Ambulance Account forwarded to Hospital.

Private Wards.

No concession will be made to contributors desiring admittance to Private Wards.

Exemptions.

The following are not considered eligible under the Scheme:—

1. Those persons whose income exceeds the Income Limit.
2. Dental patients who are able to pay a private Dentist.

3. Persons who are ordered treatment by the Ministry of Pensions.
4. Women who are admitted for confinement.
5. Cases admitted under agreement with a Health Authority, for whom such Authority is responsible.
6. Contributors who can obtain the attention required through their Approved Societies in the form of additional benefits. As Dental and Ophthalmic benefits come within the scope of National Health Insurance as additional benefits, contributors requiring those services must first apply to their Approved Societies for assistance. Ophthalmic treatment is available to members who cannot obtain assistance from their Approved Societies; **but in the case of contributors requiring dental treatment, this is only available at the Hospital for patients who are unable to pay a private Dentist and whose income must not exceed the following special scale:**

Parents of Children attending the Bournemouth Elementary Schools should apply to the School Medical Officer, Town Hall, for treatment of Eye conditions; Ear, Nose and Throat; and Dental conditions in their children. These ailments in Bournemouth Elementary School Children are not treated in the Out-patient Department, unless the condition is acute and requires urgent medical attention in which case they are dealt with.

BENEFACTIONS.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

- Donors of £50 and upwards at any one time are entitled to become Life Governors of the Hospital, and their names will be entered in a special book kept as a list of Life Governors of the Hospital.
- Donors of £100 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for five years.
- Donors of £200 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for ten years.
- Donors, either individually or collectively, of £500, are further entitled to name a bed or a cot in either Branch of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and also have that name inscribed on a board placed in the Hospital for this purpose.
- Donors, either individually or collectively, of £1,000, are entitled to name a bed or cot in both Branches of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and have that name inscribed on a board in the Hospital.
- Any individual who collects and presents to the Hospital the sum of £100 shall be entitled to have a Life Governorship of the Hospital conferred on him.
- Any Society, Institute, Organisation, Committee, Club or School, etc., other than Hospital Aid Societies, presenting in any one year the sum of £100 and upwards, shall be entitled to nominate one representative as a Life Governor of the Hospital.
- Hospital Aid Societies are not entitled to name more than one bed in each Branch of the Hospital.

LEGACIES.

- A Legacy of £500 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a Board in the Hospital, also a bed may be named during the life-time of anyone he may have nominated, or the care of his grave undertaken by the Hospital if desired by the Testator.
- A Legacy of £1,000 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a board in the Hospital, to have a bed named as he may wish in perpetuity, and also have the care of his grave undertaken if desired by the Testator, provided it is situated within twenty-five miles of the Hospital.

THE ROYAL VICTORIA AND WEST HANTS HOSPITAL PRIVATE WARDS, SHELLEY ROAD.

Beds are provided for the admission of suitable patients who, while ineligible for the General Wards of the Hospital and unable to afford the fees of a Nursing Home, can pay reduced fees for maintenance, nursing and medical attendance. Applicants must satisfy the Committee that the patient is eligible.

A fixed income limit will be applied to decide the question of eligibility for admission. The following scale is approved:—

For a single person ... up to £500 per annum.

For a married couple ... up to £600 per annum.

with an additional £50 per annum for each dependant; these being defined as (a) children under 17 years of age, (b) children over seventeen if still receiving education and not earning, and (c) other persons wholly dependent (a person whose only source of income is an Old Age Pension or Widow's Pension from the State being accepted as a dependant).

All cases admitted to the Private Wards shall be admitted on the recommendation of and treated in consultation with a member of the Honorary Staff in charge of beds (at the time or previously) in the General Hospital. In emergency admissions the patient's own Medical Attendant will be informed.

Maternity cases are eligible for admission, and are not included in the foregoing regulation.

Infectious or Mental cases are not eligible for admission.

The charges payable to the Hospital are £5 15s. 6d. per week, or at the rate of 16/6 per day for shorter periods, but £6 6s. 0d. per week for Maternity Patients, and include maintenance, nursing, dressings, and medicines which are included in the Hospital Pharmacopœia, and the use of the Operating Theatre. An Application Form must be completed and delivered to the Secretary before admission wherever possible.

A Waiting List will be kept by the Resident Medical Officer, through whom all admissions to Private Wards must be arranged. Patients will not be entered on the Waiting List until an Application Form has been completed and received at the Hospital. For emergency cases application must be made to the R.M.O.

All payments must be made by the patient, or guarantor weekly.

There shall be no fixed maximum scale of medical fees, but it shall be left open to the local Doctor, the Consultant and the patient to fix fees—as far as it is practicable to fix fees—in advance of admission.

Medical fees are payable to the Hospital Secretary, together with maintenance charges.

The Private Wards are not intended for chronic cases, and the Committee retains the right to arrange for the discharge of a patient for this or any other reason.

The ordinary hours of visiting are from 10.30 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 4 to 6 p.m., daily.

All accommodation is in single-bed private wards.

ROYAL VICTORIA & WEST HANTS HOSPITAL, BOURNEMOUTH.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1945

The Board of Management submits for the approval of the Governors its Annual Report and the Financial Statement for the year 1945, in an abbreviated form owing to continuing restrictions.

Statistics of Work Done.

The work of the Hospital during the year has again been affected by war-time obligations, but the number of patients treated in 1945 was much greater than the previous year, and the Hospital is serving to its fullest capacity a very large area, and the increase in the work has added appreciably to the duties of the Staff.

A Survey under the instructions of the Ministry of Health has been carried out in this area by Dr. A. M. H. Gray, C.B.E., F.R.C.P., and Dr. A. Topping, M.R.C.P., D.P.H.

Their report showed the Hospital accommodation for this growing district is insufficient, and whilst commenting favourably on this Hospital, it suggested great improvement should be made by the local authorities in providing increased facilities in this area.

At the request of the Government, accommodation and facilities were continued for the reception and treatment of members of His Majesty's and Allied Forces and civilian Emergency Medical Service cases, and a considerable amount of work has been carried out for these Authorities.

A message of thanks has been received from both Houses of Parliament for the services rendered by the Hospital and its Staff during the War.

The need for more beds is still acute, and your Board has been endeavouring to arrange, in conjunction with the Health Authorities of the Borough Council, for additional accommodation to be provided.

Meetings with members of the Council and representatives of the Ministry of Health have resulted in a request for the use of the American Services Hospital at St. Leonards, about six miles from Bournemouth, and negotiations are still proceeding. The Board has offered to assist the Local Authorities in every practicable way.

During the year, following "V.E." and "V.J." Days, the Government relaxed the restrictions on the use of beds, which released a further number for the use of Civilian Patients; this has enabled the Staff to use the beds to fuller capacity, and a greater number of patients have been admitted to the wards.

Accordingly the number of In-Patients admitted increased from 6,795 to 7,355 in 1945, and the average number of patients resident daily increased from 300.1 to 331.74. The number of new Out-Patients decreased from 30,089 to 29,378, and the attendances consequently were reduced from 166,877 to 165,884, this reduction being mainly due to the withdrawal of Service members from the town and district.

The accommodation in the Private Wards for Paying Patients has been utilised to capacity, and there has been a list of patients awaiting admission to that Department throughout 1945. The number admitted was 852.

The Appointment System has been enlarged and revised whereby appointments can be made for Out-Patients to attend for special consultations and clinics. It will mean a great saving of patients' time and is much appreciated.

The Department for Rehabilitation of Patients has been increased, and the number of specialist patients attending is growing monthly. Premises adjoining the Hospital, Shelley Road, have been purchased and a portion of the necessary appliances and training equipment has been installed. A trained Certificated Occupational Therapist has been appointed to instruct and train patients in leatherwork, weaving, carpentry and bookbinding.

Finance.

The total Ordinary Income received during the year under review was £103,478, a decrease of £14,669. This is mainly accounted for by the reduction of beds under the Emergency Medical Service, but most of the items from voluntary income show an increase, which is evidence of the popularity of your Hospital and the voluntary principle still being appreciated.

Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £108,507, an increase of £8,610, which is spread over all the headings and is a reflection of the growing cost of necessary articles for an essential Health Service. A large sum of money will be required for the cleaning, painting and re-equipping of the two Hospitals and Private Ward Block, and I am pleased to report that your Board has been able to reserve a sufficient sum to meet that necessary expenditure.

The average cost per patient per day was 14/9.04d. as compared with 14/10.99d. in 1944, and the average cost per Out-Patient attendance 2/2.3d. against 2/1.8d. the previous year.

The Tables for comparisons of finance and work done are published in accordance with the Revised Uniform System on page 23.

Your Board has further considered the question of payment to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, and as a token payment increased the amount to £6,000, which has been placed at the disposal of our Medical Council. This is an effort to recognise what has been considered due for some years, and your Board wished to keep faith with that understanding.

Legacies.

Your Board is pleased to record its appreciation of the fact that many friends remember this Hospital when making their Wills, and last year the sum of £17,648 was received partly from balances of legacies bequeathed many years ago, and also from bequests made recently. After taking £3,822 from the Legacy Account to liquidate the excess expenditure on the main account the sum of £13,525 had been invested.

This evidence of continued good will and interest emphasises the confidence of the public in the management of the Hospital and approval of the services rendered under the existing voluntary principle.

Many special donations have been received with gratitude from our good friends who have helped to maintain the work of the Hospital, including generous gifts from war-time organisations, including the Bournemouth Civil Defence Sports and Social Fund, Bournemouth Traders' Raid Salvage Scheme, Fire Guards and Fire Watching Groups of several districts.

Future of Hospitals.

The future of the Hospitals in the country is not yet outlined, and at the time of preparing this report no official information has been received from the Government as to the planning of the National Health Service, and whether or not the inclusion of the Voluntary Hospitals is in that plan. Your Board desires to offer its service to co-operate in any scheme for the benefit of the patients in this area, and contact has been maintained by our representatives on the Executive Committee of the British Hospitals Association, London, with representatives of the Ministry of Health.

The arrangements made at the request of the Local Authorities are being continued for the treatment of patients suffering from Cancer and the work in this Department is increasing.

Honorary Medical Staff.

The Board has received with much regret the resignation of Dr. Doris Odlum, Honorary Psychiatrist. The rank of Honorary Consultant Psychiatrist has been conferred on her.

Ransom, all of whom have been great friends of the Hospital for a number of years.

Attached Staff under Oxford University Post-Graduate Scheme.

At the request of the Oxford University Centre arrangements have been made for Medical Officers released from H.M. Forces to be attached to the Hospital and its Medical, Surgical and Specialist Staff for the purpose of studying latest methods of diagnosis and treatment of civilian patients, the Board is pleased to be of help in this direction for the benefit of those Doctors returning from the Forces.

The Thanks of the Board.

Before concluding this Report, it is my pleasing duty, on behalf of the Board of Management, to express to our many friends, heartiest thanks for their contributions toward the successful continuance of the great work of the Hospital. The work has many facets and makes heavy demands on many people. In the forefront of these stand active members of the Honorary Staff, who, through another strenuous year, have continued to give freely of their time and skill for the benefit of the growing number of patients who seek their aid. The Hospital depends primarily on the services of its Honorary Staff; the Governors are fortunate in being served with such skill and kindness in this sphere.

There are many ancillary services, and gratitude is due also to the members of the Nursing Staff and the Technical Staff in many special departments.

Your Board is appreciative also of the services rendered in the wards throughout the year by the Honorary Chaplains. Their ministrations help many patients and friends in most difficult circumstances, and contribute in no small measure to the success of the physical treatment offered by the Hospital.

Finally reference must be made to those many friends who contribute less directly, but no less vitally to the work we are doing. The reference is to the general body of subscribers and donors, the members of the Contributory Scheme and to those who undertake the organisation of functions in aid of their Hospital throughout the area we serve. It is difficult to particularise, but nevertheless mention must be made of some of the sources of support. Reference has already been made to the various organisations whose efforts have been recognised by the naming of Wards or Beds in the Hospital. It is pleasing now to pay tribute to the work of the Linen Association and the Ladies' Working Parties who spend much time in the care of the Linen presented by the Association. The Association presented in 1945, Linen to the value of £811, and under the Presidency of the Countess of Malmesbury, continues to succeed in meeting the greater part of

our requirements for General Ward patients, an achievement which reflects the enthusiastic interest of the President and Vice-Presidents as well as the generous disposition of the Association's members.

Your Board is grateful also for the usual substantial contributions raised by the Bournemouth Alexandra Rose Day Committee, £1,830; the Winton, Moordown and North Bournemouth Hospital Fund, £1,250; the Bournemouth Hospital Saturday and Sunday Fund, £1,050; and for the useful sums contributed from various other Alexandra Rose Day Collections, Hospital Sunday Collections, and from Hospital Aid Committees in various parts of the area we serve. The sum total of the efforts of these organisations provides, with personal subscriptions and donations, the voluntary income which alone makes possible the continuance of our work on its present basis. The need for such support will become more pressing in future years; even when the Voluntary Hospitals become part of the National Service.

Life Governors.

The Board during the year has elected Mrs. K. M. Powne and Mrs. S. A. Bennett as Life Governors in respect of special donations.

Nursing.

The past year has been a difficult one for the Nursing School, owing to the direction and distribution of the newly qualified State Registered Nurses by the Ministry of Labour and National Service; fortunately direction ceases on June 1st, 1946.

During 1945, 59 candidates entered the Preliminary Training School, of whom 56 were successful in the entrance examination and have entered the Hospital to commence training; 38 Nurses have completed their training and qualified for the Hospital Certificate; 38 Nurses entered for the Final State Examination and 34 were successful; 58 Nurses entered for the Preliminary State Examination, of which 54 were successful.

The Nurses' Benevolent Fund has made contributions to various charities amounting to £37 17s. 0d. During the war years £174 13s. 8d. has been sent to the Red Cross Penny-a-Week Fund. The Savings Group through the war years has accumulated a total of £1,950.

Our branch of the Nurses' Christian Movement, with Nurse Donald as Honorary Secretary, has a membership of 15; regular meetings are held during the winter months.

The Annual Prize-giving was held in December. Miss Muriel Edwards, Secretary of the Nurses' Recruitment Centre, W.1, presented the awards, and gave an inspiring address to the Nurses.

The Heygate Vernon Gold Medal for the best Nurse in her final year was awarded to Staff Nurse Barbara Margaret Thomas.

The Cecil Heygate Vernon Prize for the Nurse obtaining the second highest marks was awarded to Staff Nurse Evelyn Muriel Howe.

The Earl of Malmesbury's Prize was awarded to Nurse P. M. Corner.

The Countess of Malmesbury's Prize was awarded to Nurse P. K. Dowling.

The Sir Arthur Watson Prize to Nurse I. J. Broadway.

The Norman Brown Prizes to Nurse S. K. Grayer and Nurse L. Burgess.

The Prize awarded for the Nurse taking a shortened course of training to Nurse Sylvia May Brown.

The First Year Prizes were awarded to Nurse D. G. Rowlands and Nurse P. Gallon.

In April, with a balance of £44 from the Nurses' Fund, a Medical and Surgical Reference Library was formed. Mr. Mitchelhill, through the Halford Bequest, very kindly gave us a donation of £100, and, thanks to this generous and practical help, we now have a very fine selection of Medical and Surgical text books at the disposal of the Nurses. The Library is well used, and is of great help to the Nurses in their studies.

ROYAL VICTORIA AND WEST HANTS HOSPITAL LINEN ASSOCIATION REPORT, 1945.

The outstanding feature to be recorded in this Report, which the President, the Countess of Malmesbury, and the Committee have pleasure in presenting, is the resignation of Mrs. Sydney White. It severs a long connection with the Hospital Linen Association dating back to 1912. With the interest of the Association always at heart she has been, in turn, Vice-President, Hon. Treasurer, and Vice-Chairman of the Executive Committee. Such a record of disinterested service calls for a special vote of thanks and appreciation.

It is a striking fact that after nearly six years of war, given the money and the facilities, it is still possible to buy linen for the Hospital. It is no less remarkable that the required money has been collected by the Vice-Presidents; so that with the special facilities granted by the Board of Trade and the Ministry of Health the diminished stocks of linen in the Hospital have been amply replenished.

The Vice-Presidents have collected £886 5s. 11d. (£46 12s. more than last year), and 1,021 articles valued at £218 11s. 10d., of which 545 are garments specially required and made by associates from materials issued by the Association.

Another notable feature of the year's work has been the increasing support in the rural areas, from Ringwood and the surrounding districts to Highcliffe, New Milton and Christchurch. Whist Drives in Ringwood arranged by Miss Gates realised £23 7s., and a donation of £1 came from the teachers and children in Ringwood Parish Church Infants' Sunday School. In West Parley the collection has been nearly doubled by Mrs. Cumberland. The Women's Institute at Hangersley, under the leadership of Mrs. Baker, raised £22 and made 200 articles from the materials they bought; and the women in Hurn Village have made 39 articles.

In Bournemouth, too, the influence of the Vice-Presidents has gained fresh interest and support. The Boscombe Congregational Church Social Circle have given their Thrift money, and the Choir a donation. The patients have contributed £9 15s. 2d. to the boxes in the Hospital Wards, and the Rotary Ladies' Sewing Party at the Hospital collected £3 13s. 6d. from the sale of articles made by them. We are deeply indebted to the members of Richmond Hill Church, and the Little Church, for their generous help; to Mrs. Abbott and Mrs. Lord for special donations; to the Winton and Moordown, and the Bournemouth East, Townswomen's Guilds, and the Winton Christadelphian Dorcas Class for the useful garments they have made.

The following resignations are reported:—Miss Livesey, a Vice-President and member of the Executive Committee; Miss Ridley and Miss Purkess, liason Vice-Presidents with the Schools, and Mrs. Hastings and Miss Forster. The work they have done for the benefit of the Linen Association is acknowledged with gratitude. Miss Livesey's sympathetic advice and vision have helped to guide the Association through some difficult years of the war. None the less we extend a warm welcome to Miss Slarke, our new Matron and member of the Executive Committee, and to Mrs. Hamilton, Miss Lennox Boyd and Mrs. Trim, our newly elected Vice-Presidents.

An important part of the Association's work is the Junior Branch, whose activities the Committee follows with keen interest. 94 baby garments and articles have been made, and 52 more are being made by the senior girls in the Council Schools whose teachers arranged for this work to be done in spite of their own many war-time difficulties, and 14/6 has been given by them and the girls towards buying materials. Wentworth School, though still away from Bournemouth, sent a donation of two guineas, and the pupils at St. Christopher's School collected £6 7s.

The interest and enthusiasm displayed by the Guides and Rangers in the help they give to the Linen Association was always encouraged by the late Miss Jones as being a practical response to the Hospital's ever open door to all those who need its skill and care. The Committee looks forward to the day when her wish will be fulfilled—when all the Guide and Ranger Companies in Bournemouth will have joined this Association. A special effort to raise money this year was made by the 1st Verwood Company which realised £3 2s.

The President and the Committee acknowledge with sincere gratitude all this work that has been done to achieve the excellent results of the past year, and wish to thank every one for his or her part in it. They are proud of the useful purpose the Linen Association has again served in the town, and of its growing support. With the knowledge of this support behind them, the rising prices, of which they have been warned, will be met by them with a certainty that the Hospital will not be allowed to fall short of its needs even though the housewife has to go without.

THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT, details of which are given at the end of this Report, shows an income from subscriptions, donations, etc., of £926 5s. 8d., a balance of £322 19s. 8d. brought forward from 1944, and £600 transferred from the Trustee Savings Bank, making a total of £1,849 5s. 4d.; and an expenditure of £1,706 0s. 3d., which includes the investment of £865 in the Trustee Savings Bank. A balance, therefore, of £143 5s. 1d. is carried to the next year's account.

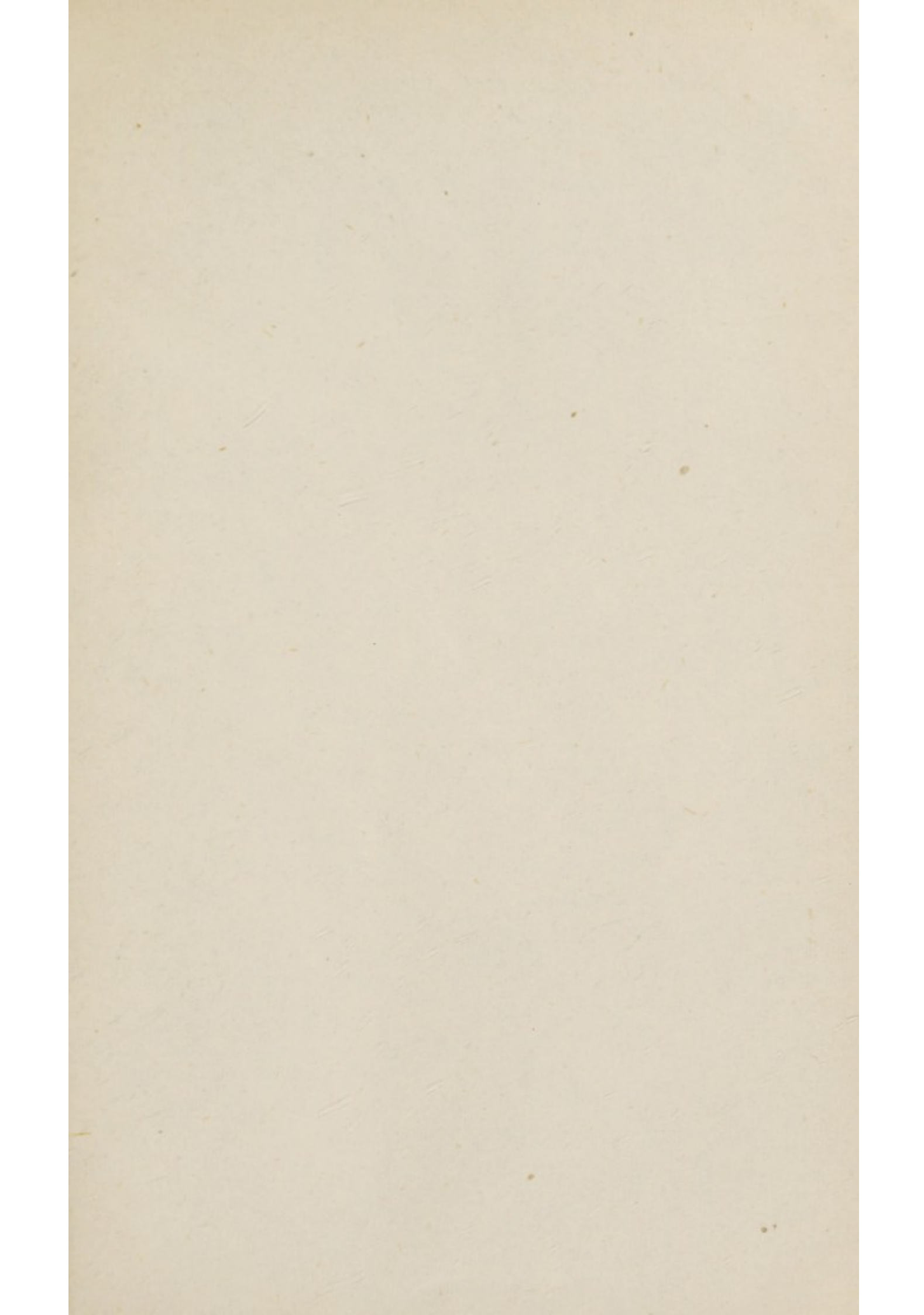

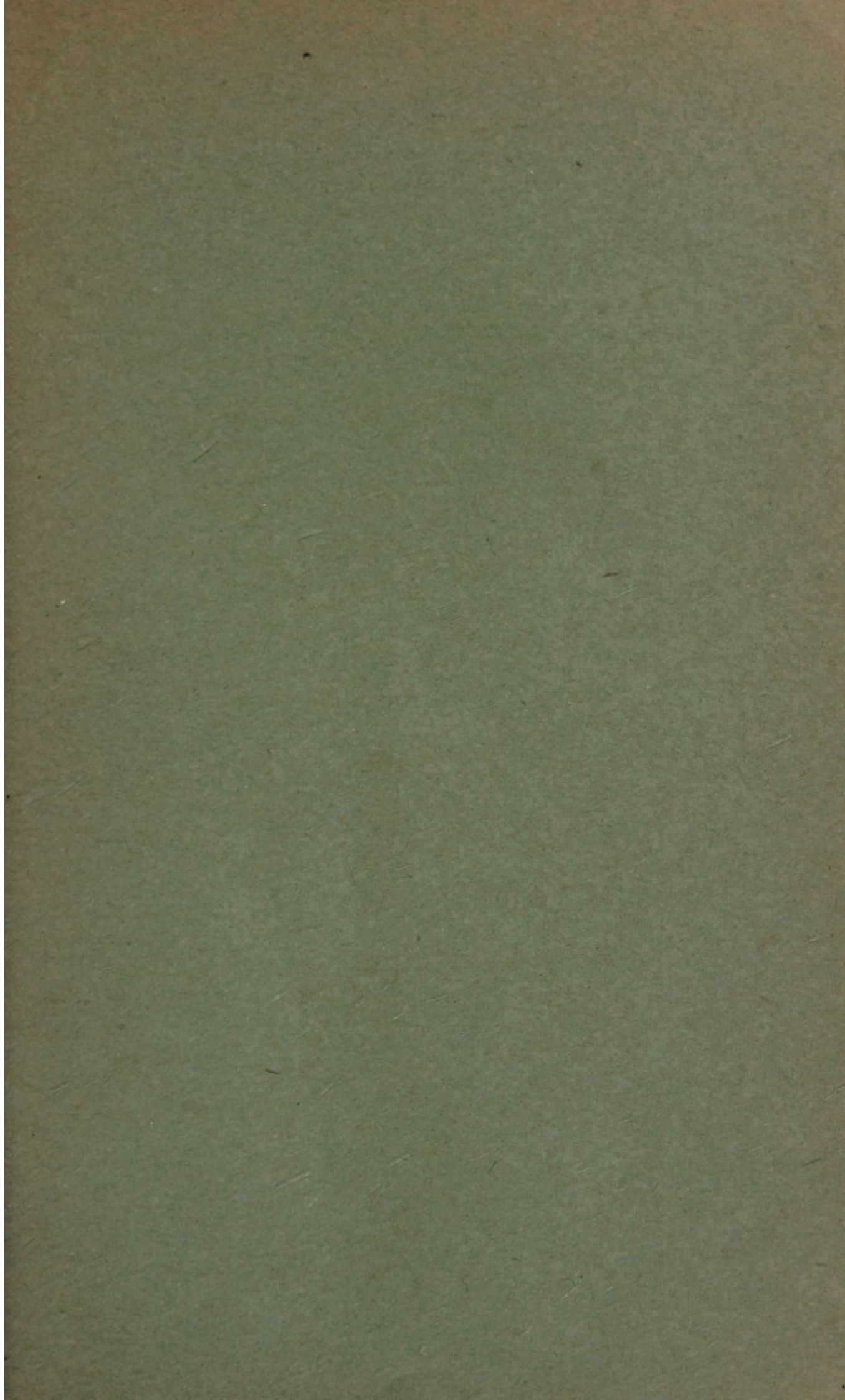
