

PARTICULARS OF CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Rate of Contribution, 4d. per week.

This contribution covers a man, wife, children under 16 (and any other children or relatives who are ordinarily resident with and wholly dependent on the contributor) for Hospital Maintenance as in-patients or for out-patient attention should the occasion arise.

Income Limit.

£420 per annum. So far as earned income is concerned, this should represent the contributor's basic rate including war bonus, but excluding overtime. The wife's earned income will not be taken into account, but any other income should be included.

Individual Contributors.

Contributions are paid by means of Hospital stamps placed on official cards. These cards and stamps may be obtained from the Hospital, or from an Honorary Agent for the Scheme in the district in which the Contributor resides.

When Attending the Hospital.

When attending the Hospital, except in cases of accident or sudden illness, patients must bring :—

1. A letter or certificate from their own Doctor.
2. The stamped Contribution Card. Neglect to do this will involve a request for payment.

Other Hospitals.

When attention is received by Contributors or their dependants in any Voluntary Hospital outside Bournemouth, the Scheme will make a payment for such in accordance with the reciprocal arrangements in force and relieve the contributor of liability. This privilege is also extended to cover any case that would be normally admitted to a Voluntary Hospital, subject to a maximum period of twelve weeks for those Hospitals with which there is no reciprocal agreement. Contributor's stamped card, with voucher slip filled in, must be forwarded to Boscombe Hospital, and a voucher will then be sent to the Hospital concerned.

Benefits.

Contributors will receive the services of the Hospital provided :—

1. They are considered by the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, and, in special cases, by the Honorary Dental Staff, to be suitable cases.
2. A contribution of 4d. per week has been made for not less than 3 months prior to applying, and that contributions are not more than 3 months in arrear.

The Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staff give their services, and contributors receive free maintenance as in-patients and free out-patient attention. This does not include the supply of Instruments, Appliances, Dentures or Spectacles, although these will be obtainable on special Hospital terms.

The following special Out-Patient Departments are included :—Ear, Nose and Throat; Electrical and X-Ray; Orthoptic; Eye; Maternity and Diseases of Women; Fracture; Orthopaedic; Skin; Functional Nervous Disorders; Vaccine Inoculation; Dental; Chiropody.

Ambulance Transport Service.

The Scheme will bear the cost of (Public) Ambulance Transport Service when ordered by the contributor's Doctor or the Hospital Authorities. Ambulance Certificate must be signed by Doctor, and Contributor's Card, Ambulance Certificate, and Receipted Ambulance Account forwarded to Hospital.

Private Wards.

No concession will be made to contributors desiring admittance to Private Wards.

Exemptions.

The following are not considered eligible under the Scheme :—

1. Those persons whose income exceeds the Income Limit.
2. Dental patients who are able to pay a private Dentist.

3. Persons who are ordered treatment by the Ministry of Pensions.
4. Women who are admitted for confinement.
5. Cases admitted under agreement with a Health Authority, for whom such Authority is responsible.
6. Contributors who can obtain the attention required through their Approved Societies in the form of additional benefits. As Dental and Ophthalmic benefits come within the scope of National Health Insurance as additional benefits, contributors requiring those services must first apply to their Approved Societies for assistance. Ophthalmic treatment is available to members who cannot obtain assistance from their Approved Societies; **but in the case of contributors requiring dental treatment, this is only available at the Hospital for patients who are unable to pay a private Dentist and whose income must not exceed the following special scale:**

Special Scale Dental Treatment Only.

Parents of Children attending the Bournemouth Elementary Schools should apply to the School Medical Officer, Town Hall, for treatment of Eye conditions, Ear, Nose and Throat, and Dental conditions in their children. These ailments in Bournemouth Elementary School Children are not treated in the Out-patient Department, unless the condition is acute and requires urgent medical attention in which case they are dealt with.

BENEFACTIONS.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

Donors of £50 and upwards at any one time are entitled to become Life Governors of the Hospital, and their names will be entered in a special book kept as a list of Life Governors of the Hospital.

Donors of £100 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for five years.

Donors of £200 are entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for ten years.

Donors, either individually or collectively, of £500, are further entitled to name a bed or a cot in either Branch of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and also have that name inscribed on a Board placed in the Hospital for this purpose.

Donors, either individually or collectively, of £1,000, are entitled to name a bed or cot in both Branches of the Hospital in perpetuity in any one name they may choose, and have that name inscribed on a Board in the Hospital.

Any individual who collects and presents to the Hospital the sum of £100 shall be entitled to have a Life Governorship of the Hospital conferred on him.

Any Society, Institute, Organisation, Committee, Club or School, etc., other than Hospital Aid Societies, presenting in any one year the sum of £100 and upwards, shall be entitled to nominate one representative as a Life Governor of the Hospital.

Hospital Aid Societies are not entitled to name more than one bed in each Branch of the Hospital.

LEGACIES.

A Legacy of £500 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a Board in the Hospital, also a bed may be named during the life-time of anyone he may have nominated, or the care of his grave undertaken by the Hospital if desired by the Testator.

A Legacy of £1,000 shall entitle the Testator to have his name inscribed on a Board in the Hospital, to have a bed named as he may wish in perpetuity, and also have the care of his grave undertaken if desired by the Testator, provided it is situated within twenty-five miles of the Hospital.

EXTRACT FROM RULES.

Rule II. GOVERNORS:—

(1) The Life Governors shall be:

- (1) The Life Governors of the Royal Victoria and the Royal Boscombe and West Hants Hospitals who qualified prior to 1st January, 1911.
- (2) Donors of Fifty Pounds and upwards at one time to the Funds of the Charities or their nominee.
- (3) Benefactors under Rule v.
- (4) One of the Executors of any person bequeathing £500 and upwards to the Funds of the Charities.
- (5) Such donors or Nominees of Schools, Clubs, Institutions and Societies, etc., collecting in any one year One Hundred Pounds and upwards as the Board of Management may determine.
- (6) The Board of Management may elect as Honorary Life Governors those to whom it wishes to show a mark of appreciation for having rendered some distinctive personal service to the Hospital.

(2) The Temporary Governors shall be:

- (1) Annual Subscribers of two guineas and upwards.
- (2) The nominee (in writing) of any firm body corporate board of guardians, school club or society subscribing ten guineas and upwards.
- (3) Donors of ten guineas and upwards in any one year.
- (4) Temporary Governors shall continue qualified for 12 months from the receipt of the donation or collection.
- (5) Members of the Hon. Medical and Dental Staff.

Beds are provided for the admission of suitable patients who, while ineligible for the General Wards of the Hospital and unable to afford the fees of a Nursing Home, can pay reduced fees for maintenance, nursing and medical attendance. Applicants must satisfy the Committee that the patient is eligible.

A fixed income limit will be applied to decide the question of eligibility for admission. The following scale is approved:—

For a single person ... up to £500 per annum.
For a married couple ... up to £600 per annum.

with an additional £50 per annum for each dependant; these being defined as (a) children under 17 years of age, (b) children over seventeen if still receiving education and not earning, and (c) other persons wholly dependent (a person whose only source of income is an Old Age Pension or Widow's Pension from the State being accepted as a dependant).

All cases admitted to the Private Wards shall be admitted on the recommendation of and treated in consultation with a member of the Honorary Staff in charge of beds (at the time or previously) in the General Hospital. In emergency admissions the patient's own Medical Attendant will be informed.

Maternity cases are eligible for admission, and are not included in the foregoing regulation.

Infectious or Mental cases are not eligible for admission.

The charges payable to the Hospital are £7 7s. 0d. per week, or at the rate of 21/- per day for shorter periods, but £7 17s. 6d. per week for Maternity Patients, and include maintenance, nursing, dressings, and medicines which are included in the Hospital Pharmacopoeia, and the use of the Operating Theatre. An Application Form must be completed and delivered to the Secretary before admission wherever possible.

A Waiting List will be kept by the Resident Medical Officer, through whom all admissions to Private Wards must be arranged. Patients will not be entered on the Waiting List until an Application Form has been completed and received at the Hospital. For emergency cases application must be made to the R.M.O.

All payments must be made by the patient, or guarantor weekly.

There shall be no fixed maximum scale of medical fees, but it shall be left open to the local Doctor, the Consultant and the patient to fix fees—as far as it is practicable to fix fees—in advance of admission.

Medical fees are payable to the Hospital Secretary, together with maintenance charges.

The Private Wards are not intended for chronic cases, and the Committee retains the right to arrange for the discharge of a patient for this or any other reason.

The ordinary hours of visiting are from 10.30 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 4 to 6 p.m., daily.

All accommodation is in single-bed private wards.

**ROYAL VICTORIA AND WEST HANTS HOSPITAL,
BOURNEMOUTH.**

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1946.

The Board of Management has pleasure in submitting to the Governors its Annual Report and Financial Statement for the year 1946.

The Board assures the Governors that notwithstanding any uncertainty there may be as to the future of the Hospital, they have not relaxed their efforts to maintain efficiency in all departments of the work, also to ensure the progress necessary to adopt new methods of treatment for the benefit and best interests of the patient.

Statistics of Work Done.

The work of the Hospital during the year 1946 has again increased in many Departments. The full statistics will be found on page

The number of In-Patients admitted was 7,486, the highest number in the history of the Hospital, the nearest being 7,110 in 1942.

A considerable increase in the number of Out-Patients is recorded, 37,768 were treated, an increase of 7,082. Attendances registered were 181,520 as compared with 165,884 in the previous year.

A greater number of patients has been admitted to the Private Wards, 919 as against 852 in 1945. There is generally a list of patients awaiting admission to these wards.

The Ministry of Health has released a further number of beds for the use of civilian cases, thus enabling the staff to cater for additional patients. The work in all Departments shows an increase, consequently the number of staff employed has increased.

The Board is still preoccupied by the shortage of beds needed for Bournemouth and the surrounding area, and has endeavoured to obtain authority to increase the number. There is a long list of patients awaiting admission but all critical cases have been admitted. In consultation with the Bournemouth Hospitals Advisory Board representations to the Ministry of Health have been made to enable the Bournemouth Borough Council to equip and open the ex-American Army Hospital at St. Leonards.

A scheme has been prepared to build a temporary ward of 32 beds in the grounds of our Hospital at Shelley Road, and permission and licences have now been obtained from the Ministry of Health for the work to proceed. It is hoped to complete this addition during the next six months.

Additional accommodation is also required for the Rehabilitation Department, and two huttied extensions will be situated adjacent the existing premises in Shelley Road, which will allow for expansion of the work and dealing with a greater number of patients. Approval has also been obtained for huttied extensions to give more room for our Teaching School for the Student Nurses, also for more sleeping accommodation and a recreation room for members of the Domestic Staff.

All these additions have meant much consideration and planning in these days of restrictions in supply of materials and labour.

The cost of all the additions is approximately £17,000 and your Board is pleased to report this sum is available from a fund which has been accumulated from generous legacies received during the past years.

Finance.

The total Ordinary Income received during the year was £95,806, a decrease of £7,672. This is mainly accounted for by reduced grants from the Government under the Emergency Medical Service.

The total Ordinary Expenditure for the year, amounting to £135,444, was an increase of £26,937, and exceeded the Total Income by £39,638. The increases are spread over most of items of expenditure, the largest amounts being Surgery and Dispensary £7,750, Domestic £3,893, Salaries and Wages £11,962.

Against the additional expenditure on Nursing Salaries must be set the State Grant received during the year amounting to £4,015. After using all available legacies the Maintenance Account has been balanced by a transfer from the other reserve Accounts of £25,322.

The average cost per patient per day was 19/2.55 as compared with 14/9.04 in 1945, and the average cost per Out-Patient attendance 2/6.2 against 2/2.3 the previous year.

In conjunction with the Oxford University Post Graduate Centre we are operating the Government Scheme for the temporary employment of demobilised Medical Officers and have attached for duty Physicians, Surgeons and Anæsthetists.

The Board has received with regret the resignation of Mr. J. G. Reid, F.R.C.S., Surgeon, and Mr. T. D. Wren, L.D.S., Dental Surgeon; both are leaving the town.

Members of the Auxiliary Medical Staff who were elected by the Board for special Honorary Services during the war years, and other retired members of our Honorary Medical Staff who had been asked to continue during that period, have been released, and appreciation of their services has been conveyed to them from the Board.

In compliance with the authority of the Board, a full time Medical Registrar, with the title of First Assistant to the Medical Department, was appointed at a salary of £1,000 per annum, also a Pathologist with special experience in Morbid Anatomy and Histo Pathology has been appointed at a salary of £1,000 per annum. These two specialist appointments were most essential for the continued efficiency of those sections of the work.

Future of Hospital.

The National Health Service Act was passed on 6th November, 1946, and under its provisions this Hospital will pass into the control of the Government and be in the South-West Metropolitan Region which comprises S.W. London, part of Surrey and West Sussex, Hampshire, East Dorset and the Isle of Wight. This Hospital will be attached to the Teaching Hospitals of St. Thomas, The Westminster, and St. George's.

A Regional Board will be appointed by the Minister of Health to control the area and other Committees will be elected in due course.

General.

The Board, in recognition of long service to the Hospital, is unanimous in recommending the Governors to elect as a Vice-President Colonel Wm. Roberts Thomson, T.D., D.L., J.P.

The Board has with regret received the resignation of the Rev. H. J. Parsons, M.A., one of the Honorary Chaplains at Poole Road Hospital, and the Rev. C. L. Heilpern, visiting Chaplain to both Hospitals.

A National Joint Council for Staffs of Hospitals and Allied Institutions has been appointed and a Provincial Council for the Area of South Midlands embraces the counties of Berks, Bucks, Hampshire, Isle of Wight and Oxford. The main duties are consideration of rates of pay and conditions of workers in Hospitals. I had the honour of acting as the first Chairman, and Mr. Gordon M. Saul as First Honorary Secretary of the Provincial Council during 1946.

We have had joint meetings with representatives of the Cornelia and East Dorset Hospital, Poole, resulting in suggestions being made to the Ministry of Health for additional beds. Consideration has also been given to specialist appointments where these can be shared.

In spite of shortages and difficulties of supplies the kitchen service has been maintained and many letters of thanks from patients have contained compliments to the staff on the dietary and service of meals. The appointment of a chef is providing additional variety to meals.

Thanks of the Board.

On behalf of the Governors and the public in this area the Board records its warmest thanks to all members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical and Dental Staff, past and present, who have given of their time and skill to the patients under their care, and to those members of the staff who have assisted in Committee work. It is pleasing that one of our valued members of the Board of Management and the House Committee, Mr. J. W. Moore, has been elected Mayor of Bournemouth.

The Hospital Linen Association, under the Presidency of the Countess of Malmesbury, C.B.E., contributed in cash and kind gifts to the value of £1,252.

The Bournemouth Alexandra Rose Day Committee, the Hospital Saturday and Sunday Fund Committees and similar Committees in the surrounding area have successfully continued their collections on our behalf.

The Board gratefully acknowledges its debt to the many who have helped with Flag Days, Contributory Scheme Agents, Box holders, and organisers of entertainments and special efforts to increase the income.

There have been many and varied gifts and we record our sincere thanks to the donors for their generosity and kind thoughts for our needs. Splendid gifts of food, equipment, etc., have been received from the British Red Cross and St. John Ambulance Society, and Associations, and the Authorities in Canada, Australia and South Africa.

There is a mistaken idea amongst many of our friends that the Hospital will not need their financial support after the Government Hospital Scheme comes into operation.

We know there will be many objects in common with Hospital life and all it means, which a Government scheme does not financially cover. It is in order that we may still be able to provide these "extras" which will be so necessary for the complete recovery of the Patients, that we confidently appeal for the continuance of that measure of financial support in the future which has been given in the past remembering that it will always be "Our Hospital."

Nursing.

In June, 1946, the direction and distribution of the newly qualified State Registered Nurses by the Ministry of Labour and National Service ceased.

During the year, 59 candidates entered the Preliminary Training School, of whom 56 were successful in their entrance examination, and have entered the Hospital to commence training. Thirty-three Nurses have completed their training and qualified for the Hospital Certificate. The results of both Hospital and State Examinations have been very satisfactory. Forty Nurses entered for the Final State Examination. Thirty-eight were successful, two candidates having failed in one subject. Sixty-three Nurses entered for the Preliminary State Examination, 55 were successful, 8 having failed in either Part I or Part II.

Miss Payne, Sister of the Preliminary Training School, has had leave of absence for a year in order to study for the Sister Tutor's Diploma. She returned to us in January, 1947, as a fully qualified Sister Tutor. The Preliminary Training School for the past year has been under Miss Robson's very able supervision and guidance.

In May, 1946, Miss Jenkins, our Senior Sister Tutor, was appointed Assistant Matron of the Swansea General and Eye Hospital. Miss Jenkins had been a tower of strength to the Nurses in their studies for a period of seven years, and her loss was keenly felt throughout the Hospital.

The Nurses' Benevolent Fund has made contributions to various charities amounting to £39 19s. 6d.

The Nurses Medical and Surgical Reference Library which came into being in 1946, has had new publications added, and is of great help to the Nurses in their studies.

The Annual Prize Giving was held in December. Miss E. Cockayne, Matron of the Royal Free Hospital, presented the awards and her helpful and inspiring address will long be remembered by all who were privileged to be present on that occasion.

The Heygate Vernon Gold Medal for the best Nurse in her final year was awarded to Staff Nurse Doris Mary Brierley.

The Cecil Heygate Vernon Prize for the Nurse obtaining the second highest marks was awarded to Staff Nurse Ida Joyce Broadway.

The Earl of Malmesbury's Prize was awarded to Nurse P. Moore.

The Countess of Malmesbury's Prize was awarded to Nurse F. G. Voice.

The Sir Arthur Watson Prize to Nurse Pauline Cooper.

ROYAL VICTORIA AND WEST HANTS HOSPITAL LINEN ASSOCIATION

REPORT FOR 1946

The President, the Countess of Malmesbury, and the Executive Committee, have pleasure in presenting their Annual Report which covers a memorable year, and one which they look back upon with profound thankfulness for the victory which it brought, and for encouraging results of hard work and generous support culminating in the collection of £918 10s. 1d. and 895 articles. £851 15s. 1d. of this sum was collected by the Vice-Presidents, and the rest is made up by donations which have brought the total to £30 2s. 2d. over that of last year.

The Hospital Linen Association has in some ways felt a far greater effect of war conditions than before. Comparing last year's figures, less money and fewer articles have been collected by the Vice-Presidents and a decrease of 177 is shown in the number of associates; also many are unable to afford the higher cost of the coupon-free materials so that fewer garments have been made. Deliveries are much slower, and the hospital has sometimes to wait months for its new supplies.

If it were not for the fact that some Vice-Presidents have introduced new associates, the number lost during the year would have been a serious one; as it is the loss of 177 is to be regretted. Some have left the district, some have died, and the loss of many others may be attributed to the prevailing uncertainty of the future of the voluntary hospitals.

The reason for a comparatively small number of articles given again this year is an obvious one. Until coupons no longer have to be surrendered by the individual for linen articles, the Association must buy them. Coupled with advanced prices this means a considerable increase in expenditure. In spite of these adverse conditions the Linen Association has fulfilled its obligations to the hospital. £1,061 11s. 3d. has been spent on linen and materials, and the approximate value of the articles given is £190 15s. 2d., making the total value of the gift presented to the Board of Management £1,252 6s. 5d.

In addition to the annual subscriptions, but included in the total, are the following donations and collections which the Committee wish to acknowledge with many thanks : £50 allocated by the Bournemouth Justices from the Sunday Cinema Entertainment Fund; £15 from the Argyll Bowling Club; £10 from Mrs. Harry Abbott; £5 from the sale of Mrs. Lord's needlework, and £8 from the Christmas Draw in Hurn Village. A penny-a-week collection amounting to £5 made by Miss Mayo among a small circle of friends; Whist Drives in Ringwood arranged by Miss Gates which realised £13; £1 from the Ringwood Parish Church Infants' Sunday School, and £17 0s. 6d. contributed by the patients to Mrs. Adeney's ward boxes. The collection of Foreign and Colonial stamps so strongly recommended at a Vice-Presidents' meeting proved a little disappointing, only £1 15s. 0d. being realised.

Seven Vice-Presidents have resigned during the year, four of whom have been associated with this work for a considerable time and to whom our special thanks are due. They are : Mrs. Clayhills-Henderson who, during the past 35 years, has in no small way contributed to the growth and present success of the Association; Mrs. E. C. King, also a member of the Executive Committee, whose devoted work for this and other charitable organisations has led to a breakdown in health. Supported by her many friends at Richmond Hill Church, she has collected large sums of money every year, amounting to £100 on several occasions; Miss Brand and Mrs. Warde, Vice-Presidents for 15 and 12 years respectively; and Mrs. F. King, Mrs. Boyd and Mrs. Holwell, whose work on behalf of the Linen Association is most gratefully acknowledged. The Committee welcomes Mrs. McNeil on her return from war work overseas, also the following newly appointed Vice-Presidents :—Mrs. Rees, Mrs. Lawrence Bell and Mrs. Harlow.

The vacancy on the Executive Committee caused by Mrs. King's resignation has been filled by Mrs. Caldwell who will represent the work in the country districts, where, in spite of a certain amount of competition, the Vice-Presidents have again met with a friendly response to their efforts. 133 articles have been made by the Women's Institute at Hangersley who, with their leader Mrs. Baker, paid a visit to the hospital and were able to see to what use their articles were put. The Bournemouth East Townswomen's Guild and the members of the Winton Christadelphian Dorcas Class have also made useful garments.

The effects of the war have also been felt in the Council and Church Schools, where for lack of teachers the classes have been too large for individual supervision and work for the hospital has been rather limited. During the year, 114 babies' garments have been made by them and the pupils at Queensmount School. Wentworth School has again contributed two guineas, and a collection of £5 12s. 6d. was made at St. Christopher's.

After a lapse of five years, the Annual Report and List of Subscribers will be printed again. It will be remembered that the printed report was discontinued in response to the Government's request for rigid economy in paper.

We should like to thank the Clergy in Bournemouth and the district for their co-operation; the local Press for their courtesy and help at all times, and Plummer Roddis for their help in arranging our Display of Linen.

In conclusion, the President and the Committee especially wish to thank the Vice-Presidents for their unfailing support in spite of very little free time, and, in some cases, of serious illness. They feel confident that each one will do her utmost to increase the membership of the Association during the coming year for that is the foundation upon which to build and to progress, and upon which its continued success will depend in the post-war years.

THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT, given in detail at the end of the report, shows an income of £918 10s. 1d. from subscriptions and donations, £36 19s. 6d. from the sale of coupon-free materials, £900 from the Trustee Savings Bank and a balance of £143 5s. 1d. brought forward from last year, making a total of £1,998 14s. 8d. and an expenditure of £1,867 18s. 2d., which includes the transfer of £700 to the Trustee Savings Bank. A balance, therefore, of £130 16s. 6d. is carried to the next year's account.




