THE 117th ANNUAL REPORT of the Committee.

To the Governors and Friends of the Hospital.

The year 1944, so full of important events, was especially memorable in Dover. It was a year of great anxiety, which also brought deliverance from the constant menace of Shell Fire, from which the district had had little respite for just over four years. In addition to its final intense shelling, Dover had the trial of the flying bombs, especially in the rural area.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL AND NURSING STAFF.

A special strain was thrown on the members of our Honorary Staff, who were working at full pressure at times in Dover during the final bombardment in August and September. Mention should also be made of those members of our Nursing Staff who so courageously continued with their duties at the Out-Patient Department at Dover, and who resided at the Dover Hospital throughout that trying and dangerous period. Letters were received in appreciation of the way our work was continued during these grim ordeals.

The Committee tender their sincere thanks to the following members of the Staff:—Dr. J. R. W. Richardson and Dr. G. W. Hinchliff (Physicians); Mr. T. J. Cobbe and Mrs. G. M. B. Toland (Surgeons); Mr. C. H. Adamson (Ear, Nose and Throat Department); Dr. Morton Kahn (Radiologist); Mr. V. G. Smith (Dental Surgeon); and Dr. T. J. Nicholl (Ophthalmic Department).

The Committee also thank Dr. I. M. MacLean and Dr. Brenda Vale for their services as House Surgeons during the year.

The Committee also thank the following for their continued valuable services:—The Matron and Nursing Staff; Miss Young (Masseuse); and Mr. Petchey (Dispenser).

ROYAL PATRONAGE.

It is with much pleasure that the Committee records the high honour that has been conferred on the Hospital by Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, who has consented to become our Patron. This is a recognition which will be greatly appreciated by Doverians all over the world.

An International Appeal will shortly be made for £250,000 to build a new Hospital, in which it is proposed to embody a Memorial to the heroes of the Battle of Britain.

THE FINANCE OF THE HOSPITAL.

The Income and Expenditure Account for the year shows a deficit of £28 1s. 11d., but the Committee point out that £5,757 15s. 10d. of the Income came from Ministry of Health Grants and from Legacies. The Ordinary Income amounted to £9,430 11s. 8d., against an expenditure of £15,050 1s. 11d.—a deficiency of £5,619 10s. 3d. It must be anticipated that the Grants from the Ministry will at some time in the future cease, and that Legacies—always an uncertain figure—may not be so large, the Committee, therefore, hope that every effort will be made to increase the Ordinary Revenue so that the expenses may be met from this source. In this connection a very good start has been made. Rose Day was revived, and the Dover Fur and Feather Society ran a very successful Show on August Bank Holiday in aid of the Hospital, and the Committee record their very sincere thanks to the Organisers and many helpers, who assisted in making both events such outstanding successes.

It will be noticed that the total cost of running the Hospital in 1944 amounted to £15,216 9s. 5d.—an increase of over £1,300 on the previous year. It is certain that, owing to the adoption of the Rushcliffe and Heatherington Scales of Salaries for Nursing and Domestic Staff respectively, this expenditure will be unavoidably increased in 1945. The Committee are grateful and extend sincere thanks for the useful gifts from "Bundles for Britain," also for a donation of £25 from the same source.

The Committee also feel indebted to Mrs. Davies for the many hours she devoted last year to patching and mending the linen, and to all those who send gifts and subscriptions, including The British and Canadian Red Cross.

CONCLUSION.

The Committee offer their sincere thanks to all subscribers and donors, and to those who have rendered service to the Hospital in many ways, including those friends away who have continued to help us financially, and those members of our Committee who have so regularly attended meetings and visited at Waldershare, and it is hoped that all friends of the Hospital will continue to support us in the days to come, when, doubtless, many new problems will arise. Especial thanks are due to the Earl and Countess of Guilford for their continued interest and kindness to patients and staff.

Finally, the Committee desire to acknowledge the loyal services of the Rev. J. Pranker, Chaplain; the Auditors; the Hon. Treasurer; the General Secretary and her Staff; and the Police and Press.
