





THE 118th ANNUAL REPORT of the Committee.

To the Governors and Friends of the Hospital.

The year 1945, during which the war in Europe and the Far East was concluded, also saw the return, in September, of our In-patient Department from Waldershare to Dover. For six years our In-patients and the majority of our Staff enjoyed comparative quiet and safety in the beautiful and healthy surroundings of Waldershare Park, and it is difficult adequately to express the sincere thanks of all concerned to the Earl of Guilford for the loan of the Mansion for this purpose, which was greatly appreciated.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL AND NURSING STAFF.

After the shortage of Honorary Staff and House Surgeons during the war years, we were particularly glad to welcome Dr. McLean and Dr. Rusack back to our Staff early in the year, and later Dr. Laird and Dr. Toland, who also returned to us safely.

At the end of March, Dr. C. H. Adamson tendered his resignation from the active post of Ear, Nose and Throat Specialist, which he had filled for many years since he retired as a General Surgeon of this Hospital, to which post he was first appointed in 1910. The Committee sincerely thank Dr. Adamson for his many years of service to the Hospital and to a very large number of patients who have attended him here during 35 years.

Since Dr. Adamson's retirement, the work of the Ear, Nose and Throat Department has been carried on by Mr. C. E. S. Oxley, D.L.O.

The Committee tender their sincere thanks to the following members of the Honorary Staff:—Dr. J. R. W. Richardson, Dr. W. B. Laird, Dr. C. P. K. Toland and Dr. G. W. Hinchliff (Physicians); Mr. T. J. Cobbe and Mrs. G. M. B. Toland (Surgeons); Mr. C. H. Adamson and Mr. C. E. S. Oxley (Ear, Nose and Throat Department); Dr. T. J. Nicholl and Dr. D. W. McLean (Ophthalmic Department); Dr. Morton Kahn and Dr. A. C. Rusack (Radiologists); and Mr. Victor G. Smith (Dental Surgeon).

The Committee also thank Mr. H. O. Merewether and Mrs. Marchant for their welcome assistance.

In November Miss G. Lang-Davis resigned from her post of Matron and Miss M. R. E. Eales was appointed to the vacancy.

The Committee thank the following for their continued valuable services:—The Matron, Sisters and Nursing Staff; Miss Young (Physio Therapist); and Mr. Petchey (Dispenser).

THE MEDICAL REPORT.

In spite of the curtailment of admissions in September, when our In-Patient Department moved back to Dover, an increase will be seen in the statistics both for In and Out-Patients, due to the continued return of our population and the greater facilities offered for treatment on the return of members of our Honorary Staff.

DOVER'S BATTLE OF BRITAIN MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

THE APPEAL FOR £250,000 to rebuild the Royal Victoria Hospital, on a new site, was launched in April at a Press Reception given by the Chairman, at Grosvenor House, London. It was launched in Dover by Major Christopher Stone, D.S.O., M.C., in May. By the end of February, 1946, £25,000 had been received and promised. The re-building scheme is planned to provide Dover and District with an up-to-date hospital of a 100 beds and a separate Maternity Home of 24 beds. This complies with the recommendations of the Ministry of Health Hospital Survey Report of 1945.

Within the Memorial feature of the new hospital it is proposed to inscribe the name of every airman who fell in the Battle of Britain, thus making this new edifice in the service of mankind a symbol of Thanksgiving to the heroes of that epic victory. As an additional commemorative feature, visible externally, the plan includes the erection of a light turret to the new building. From this beacon of Thanksgiving a light will flash by night to remind planes above and passing ships in the Straits, that Dover is ever grateful to the men who laid the foundations of Victory which safeguarded the Freedom of mankind.

ROYAL PATRONAGE OF THE HOSPITAL.

In March the plans for the Appeal were submitted to Her Majesty The Queen, who graciously approved the honour of Royal Patronage of the Hospital by Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth. This Her Majesty did "In recognition of Dover's record during the war years and that the Hospital is to be re-built as a Memorial to the heroes of the Battle of Britain."

It was felt that people of good-will world-wide would wish to co-operate in so notable a Memorial to stand at the very Gateway to our Homeland. To this end the Appeal is being spread at Home and abroad. First to respond to the Mayoral Appeal in the Home Country was the Corporation of the City of Glasgow with the gift of £1,500, with which to endow a bed, followed likewise by the City of Auckland, New Zealand, in response to the Mayoral Appeal to the Dominions. Many other places in the Home Country have and are raising local Appeals on our behalf. The 112 Transit Camp, Calais, has undertaken to endow a bed and already raised over £1,000. In support of the Appeal both in revenue raising and publicity, an

Appeal stamp, bearing the view of Dover's White Cliffs and Castle, has been produced for use on the backs of mail, and is proving a very popular aid. A brochure detailing the plan in full is available on application to the Hospital, and donations will be gratefully received by the Chairman.

THE FINANCE OF THE HOSPITAL.

The Hospital in 1945 incurred a deficit of £3,464 5s. 5d., The expenditure during 1945 amounted to £16,922 13s. 4d., being an increase of £1,706 over 1944. In spite of strict economy, the cost of running the Hospital rises each year with the increase of wages and prices generally. The income, on the other hand, does not increase in proportion, the receipts in 1945 being only £200 more than in 1944. Several successful events were held during the year in aid of the Hospital, and the Committee wish to record their sincere thanks to the Organisers and helpers. With the return of many Doverians, it is hoped that all friends of the Hospital will endeavour to obtain new subscribers and generally increase the income by every means within their power. The Committee also wish to thank the many subscribers and donors, especially those who have maintained their gifts while living away from the Town.

The Committee thank Lady Guilford most sincerely for her support and practical interest in the Hospital and patients during so many years and in such trying circumstances.

OBITUARY.

It is with great regret that we record the death on the 28th October last of the Rev. J. Embry, who was for many years the Chaplain to the Hospital. On the 14th November we sustained a

further loss on the sudden death of Colonel F. G. Hayward, a Governor of long standing and our Architect and adviser in many matters.

CONCLUSION.

In concluding this report, the Committee offer their sincere thanks to all subscribers and donors and to all those who have rendered service to the Hospital, including the Rev. J. Prankerd and the Rev. H. M. Russell (Honorary Chaplains); the Honorary Auditors; the Honorary Treasurer; the General Secretary and her assistant; the local Police and the Press.


