



# THE 120th ANNUAL REPORT of the Committee.

### To the Governors and Friends of the Hospital,

Notification has been received that the Ministry of Health will take over this Hospital on 5th July, 1948, under the provisions of the National Health Service Act, 1946, and the long foreseen time has, therefore arrived when your Committee are placed in the novel and somewhat melancholy position of presenting the last Annual Report of this Institution which has carried out such a great work in the Town and District since 1828, under the direction of voluntary committees.

The year 1947, now under review, has been one of considerable interest, as it saw the accomplishment of the amalgamation of this Voluntary Hospital with the County Hospital, Union Road, Dover—an experiment which was watched with interest in the Hospital world and which has justified the work entailed in its organisation. All staff concerned may be congratulated on the result.

### HONORARY MEDICAL & SURGICAL & NURSING STAFF.

The Committee take this opportunity to record a very hearty vote of thanks to the Medical Staff—not only for their valuable services during the year under review, but for the many years during which they have served the Hospital and the patients so well. The three senior members of the Honorary Staff have together given 64 years of service to this Institution.

The Committee tender their sincere thanks to the following members of the Honorary Staff for their support during 1947:—Dr. J. R. W. Richardson, Dr. W B. Laird, Dr. C P. K. Toland and Dr. G. W. Hinchliff (Physicians); Mr. T. J. Cobbe, Mrs. G. M. B. Toland and Mr. H. O. M. Merewether (Surgeons); Mr. C. E. S. Oxley (Ear. Nose and Throat Department); Dr. D. W. McLean (Ophthalmic Department); Dr. A. C. Rusack (Radiologist); and Mr. R. T. Proudler (Dental Surgeon).

The Committee are also grateful to Mr. M. G. Allen-Mersh for the help given in the absence of Mr. Merewether and to the following, who acted as Resident Medical Officers during 1947:—Dr. W. J. Keating, Dr. W. R. McAllister, Dr. J. L. Anderson, Dr. S. K. Talty, and Dr. G. E. Manley.

The Committee also thank the following for their loyal services: The Matron, Sisters and Nursing Staff and Mr. Cox (Pharmacist). A special note should be made of Miss Young, our Physiotherapist, who is now the senior member of our staff—having worked here for 29 years and throughout the war. Her conscientious and untiring work has been very much appreciated.

### THE MEDICAL REPORT.

Turning to the Medical Report, a comparison with 1946 shows a further increase of Maternity Cases, which proves the wisdom of the Committee's decision, on the return of the In-Patient Department from Waldershare, to open a larger Maternity Ward, which has been a great asset to the district.

Less school children have been admitted during the year as Tonsil cases have been treated at the County Hospital. The average number of beds occupied is slightly reduced, owing to the closure of wards in the autumn for the purpose of decorations. E.M.S. cases were a new feature, and were partly responsible for a very large increase in the general Out-Patient work. The increase is specially noticeable in the Orthopædic and Ear, Nose and Throat Departments and in the X-Ray work.

Owing to the sharp rise in expenditure, the average cost per diem per In-Patient is much greater, but the Out-Patient Expenditure is less, being shared among many more patients.

### FINANCE.

The Accounts for the year 1947 show a deficit of £18,008 11s. 5d.—the largest ever recorded; the cost of running the Hospital being £33,898 5s. 0d., while the Income amounted to only £15,889 13s. 7d. It will be seen that this figure is approximately equal to the amount paid in salaries to Nursing Staff and Servants and Administrative Officers, leaving all the other expenses to be met from capital.

The rise in the cost of maintaining hospitals is general throughout the country, and without State aid it would be impossible for many voluntary hospitals to continue to give the same efficient service. The Hospital gratefully received a Grant of £2,216 5s. 6d. from the Ministry of Health in respect of services rendered under the Emergency Medical Scheme, and also a Grant of £1,384 12s. 2d. towards Nursing Salaries. Both these items were a considerable increase on the previous year. The Committee have endeavoured to meet the needs of Dover and District, but have at the same time incurred no needless expense. The fact that the Hospital has dealt with all surgical cases, the medical cases being treated at the County Hospital, has undoubtedly increased the cost of running the Hospital. It is, perhaps, opportune that

the 5th July next has been fixed as the "appointed day" when the National Health Service comes into operation, as from a financial point of view, the Committee could not continue for long

to run the Hospital at such a tremendous cost.

The Income has maintained its steady level and subscribers, donors and others are gratefully thanked for their continued support in spite of the Government's decision to transfer hospitals to the State. Many people are enquiring what will be the position as to Voluntary Gifts after the 5th July, 1948, and an explanatory memorandum published by the British Hospitals Association accompanies this report.

### DOVER HOSPITAL WORKERS & JOINT BOX COMMITTEE,

In view of the publicity given to the transfer of the Voluntary Hospitals to the Ministry of Health, there has been a certain reluctance on the part of contributors to continue their payments, but, in spite of this, the total collected by this Committee exceeded that of last year, and this is greatly appreciated.

Sincere thanks are hereby expressed to all donors, collectors

and to Mr. Jeffery and his assistant.

Some of our present contributors have been regular subscribers since the inception of the scheme over 25 years ago, and many of the collectors have worked indefatigably through peace and war with faith and pride in the Hospital they supported so well.

### HOSPITAL LIBRARY.

RUN BY MEMBERS OF THE INNER WHEEL CLUB, DOVER (ROTARY CLUB).

Our very warm thanks are again due to Mrs. H. W. Youden and all the ladies who assisted her during the year in the collection of books and their distribution twice a week to the patients. This regular service has filled a long-felt want, and has been very greatly appreciated by all concerned.

### LINEN LEAGUE.

It is with real grief that we have to record the death on the 8th December, 1947, of the Countess of Guilford, President of the Linen League. Lady Guilford founded the Linen League in 1917, and during thirty years she never missed a meeting of the Organisation, in which she was so keenly interested and which, during part of the war, she carried on singlehanded; her very practical interest and advice and her gracious presence has been of great assistance to the League.

The thanks of the Committee are tendered to all donors, subscribers and members of the Linen League for their continued support during the last year, and especial mention is made of Mrs. Cobbe and Mrs. Hogben for their work as Secretary and Treasurer for so many years, and to Mrs. Llewellyn Langley and the ladies who assist her at the weekly Working Party. The Linen League has been of immense value to the Hospital during the past thirty years, and the work of all connected with the League has been very highly appreciated.

### OBITUARY.

It is with very much regret that we have to refer to the deaths in August last of Dr. C. Wood, our oldest Trustee, and Mr. G. Gore, a member of the Executive Committee.

The death took place on the 8th December, 1947. of the Countess of Guilford, Patron of the Hospital and Founder and President of the Hospital Linen League. Lady Guilford's keen interest in all Hospital affairs, and her kindness to patients and staff during the war, when the In-Patients were housed in Waldershare Mansion, will always be remembered by those who came into contact with her. The absence of her practical and kindly personality will constitute a very real loss to many.

The death also took place in December last of Mr. Stephen Lewis, a very old subscriber and friend to the Hospital and member of the General Committee.

### CONCLUSION.

In conclusion, it is fitting to record sincere thanks to all those members of the Committee who have given so much time and thought to the problems of the Hospital for so many years; and to all subscribers, donors and workers on behalf of the Hospital, including the Rev. H. M. Russell (Honorary Chaplain); the Honorary Auditors for their increasingly arduous task; Mr. G. H. Youden, the Honorary Treasurer, for professional and general assistance in many directions; to the General Secretary, Miss Elwin (now completing 26 years of service to this Hospital) and to her staff for their willing and loyal co-operation during the past difficult year; and to the Local Police and the Press for help on many occasions.
