IMPORTANT.

Appointment of Governors.

The Statutes definitely state :—

“ Any Company, Firm, Body of Employees or Charitable Organisation contributing in any one year the sum of £10 shall be entitled to elect one of their members as a Governor for the succeeding year in respect of every £10 so contributed.”

The financial year extends from January 1st to December 31st. Contributions therefore, must be received before December 31st in order to qualify for the nomination of Governors in the succeeding year. ‘

“ Every person subscribing £2 2s. 0d. or more per annum shall be a Governor.”

“ Any person giving £100 or more at any one time or in any one year shall be a Governor.”

“ Every person bequeathing a legacy of £100 or more may nominate by his will one person to be a Life Governor or if no such nomination be made his executor or executors may nominate a Life Governor.”

“ Any person rendering special services in collecting or raising money for the Institution may be appointed a Life Governor.”

The House Governor will be pleased to supply any further information on request.

Named Beds and Cots.

It would be difficult to suggest a better means of keeping in perpetual memory a relative or friend than the naming of a bed or cot.

A celebration of an event or a thank offering can be marked by the endowment of a bed or cot in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

A bed may be named by a donation or legacy of £1,000 and a cot by a donation or legacy of £500. These amounts should be nett and not subject to any deductions for tax.

Every year approximately 26 patients occupy each bed or cot and money received for an endowment fund is invested and the income applied towards the maintenance of the bed or cot.

A tablet appropriately worded is affixed to each named bed or cot.

**ALL SUBSCRIBERS TO THE HOSPITAL
WHO PAY INCOME TAX GIVE THEIR

PAID TAX, BUT THE HOSPITAL CAN
RECOVER THE TAX, AMOUNTING TO
ONE GUINEA FOR EACH GUINEA SUB-

INCREASE OF SUBSCRIPTIONS BY RECOVERY OF INCOME TAX.

By virtue of the Income Tax Act, 1918, and subsequent Finance Acts, it is possible for the Hospital to effect an increase of its income by the recovery from the Inland Revenue Department of the Income Tax that has been paid by its subscribers in respect of their subscriptions. To enable the Hospital to do this, however, it is necessary that each subscriber should enter into a legally binding contract to pay to the Hospital an annual subscription of definite amount during a period of at least seven years.

The agreement is terminable by death, so that a subscriber's estate would not be liable for subsequent payments of the subscription.

NOTABLE DATES IN THE HISTORY OF THE NEWCASTLE INFIRMARY.

1751. January. "B.K.'s" letter in the *Newcastle Courant* urging the necessity of "founding an Hospital" in the Town.
1751. May 23rd. Infirmary started in a house in Gallowgate with 23 beds and out-patients.
1751. Sept. 5th. Foundation Stone of the Infirmary on the Forth Banks laid by Bishop Butler on ground given by the Corporation.
1753. Oct. 8th. Infirmary opened for the reception of patients as a "Letter" Hospital, with 90 beds. Subscriber of one guinea could recommend one In-patient or two Out-patients.
1801. General reconstruction, with additional beds, begun.
1803. New Wards and Buildings opened.
1807. Two guineas—one In-patient or four Out-patients; One guinea—two Out-patients.
1847. Jan. 12th. First Operation performed under a general Anæsthetic (Ether) in the Infirmary.
1848. Jan. 4th. Chloroform was administered for the first time when Sir John Fife removed a stone from the bladder.
1851. April 3rd. Extensions decided upon.
1852. August. Foundation Stone of "Dobson Wing" laid by the Duke of Northumberland.
1854. March 11th. Wards in the top flat of the Dobson Wing were occupied for the first time.
1854. Oct. 6th. Great fire and explosion in Newcastle and Gateshead: 58 cases were admitted to the wards, and 63 were treated as out-patients. That night there were 234 in-patients in the Infirmary.
1855. Jan. 18th. Formal opening of the Dobson Wing by the Duke of Northumberland.
1872. Operating Theatre given by Sir William Armstrong.
1885. Jan. 20th. Further extensions (temporary) decided upon.
1885. Oct. 26th. Ravensworth Ward opened.
1887. March 3rd. The "Letter" system was abolished and the Infirmary made free.
1887. June 16th. Designated "Royal Infirmary," by permission of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.
1888. March 24th. Representatives of the Working Men Governors elected on to the House Committee.
1896. Oct. 7th. Decided at a meeting in Council Chamber, Town Hall, to build a new Infirmary.
1898. Jan. 29th. Walkergate Fire—26 patients admitted to the wards.

**NOTABLE DATES IN THE

1900. June 20th. Foundation Stone of Royal Victoria Infirmary laid by Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, K.G., as the representative of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.
1905. July 28th. Nurses' Home in R.V.I. opened.
1906. July 11th. Royal Victoria Infirmary opened by His Majesty King Edward VII., accompanied by Her Majesty Queen Alexandra.
1906. Sept. 15th. Old Infirmary on the Forth Banks evacuated.
1907. June 6th. Electrical Department opened.
1918. September. Massage School founded.
1923. Oct. 6th. Innes Hopkins Memorial Home, Ryton-on-Tyne, the gift of Col. C. H. Innes Hopkins, in memory of his two sons, Charles and Castel, who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-1918, opened for the reception of patients. This Home was eventually disposed of and the proceeds devoted to the up-keep of the Ward named "The Innes Hopkins Memorial Ward."
1929. Nov. 14th. Foundation Stone of Nurses' Home extension laid by Sir Walter Runciman, Bart., J.P.
1931. Jan. 8th. Runciman Wing of Nurses' Home opened by Sir Walter Runciman, Bart., J.P.
1931. April 9th. Leazes Hospital (Pay-bed Section) opened by Mr. G. Stirling Newall, D.L., J.P., in the absence of his mother, Mrs. H. F. Stirling Newall. This Hospital is comprised of three pavilions containing 86 beds, Operating Theatre, etc.
1931. Oct. 2nd. Dental Hospital transferred to new building in the Infirmary grounds.
1931. Nov. 1st. New block of buildings for Resident Medical Staff opened, containing accommodation for 28 Residents.
1931. November. Radium Institute jointly established by the Royal Victoria Infirmary, the University of Durham College of Medicine, and the North of England Council of the British Empire Cancer Campaign Fund.
1933. Aug. 30th. Orthopædic Buildings opened, containing bed accommodation for 48 In-patients, with Operating Theatre, Out-patient Department, and a fully equipped Massage School.
1933. Nov. 2nd. Two new Wards, viz. : "Rutherford Morison" Ward 19, and "Innes Hopkins Memorial" Ward 20, each containing 30 beds, built on top of Wards 10 and 12 to replace wooden structure, Wards 5A and 6A, temporarily provided during the Great War.
1934. June 9th. Castle Hill Convalescent Home, Wylam-on-Tyne, the gift of Mr. Geoffrey Stirling Newall, O.B.E., D.L., J.P., in memory of his Father and Mother, Frederick and Helen Frances Stirling Newall, opened for the reception of patients.
1935. July 4th. Informal visit to the Infirmary of H.R.H. The Duke of Kent on the occasion of his visit to Newcastle to open the Royal Agricultural Show.

1937. Sept. 4th. Greycourt Convalescent Home for Children, Riding Mill, Northumberland, the gift of Mr. Norman D. Newall, O.B.E., J.P., officially opened.
1938. Oct. 22nd. Extension of Castle Hill Convalescent Home, Wylam-on-Tyne. (50 female beds), opened for the reception of patients.
1940. June 5th. Greycourt Convalescent Home, destroyed by fire, and later sold in 1945.
1941. April. Extensions to Department of Pathology.
1942. June. New Lecture Theatre built.
1942. Aug. 6th. Chair of Child Health founded in the University of Durham. Clinical facilities provided at the Royal Victoria Infirmary by the development of the Children's Department.
1945. Jan. 1st. Amalgamation of Royal Victoria Infirmary and Princess Mary Maternity Hospital.
1945. August. Full-time Chair of Surgery, founded in the University of Durham. Clinical facilities provided at the Royal Victoria Infirmary.
1945. December. Chair of Industrial Health founded in the University of Durham. Clinical facilities provided at the Royal Victoria Infirmary.
1946. May. Visit of the British Orthopædic Association.
1946. Amalgamation of Royal Victoria Infirmary and the Babies Hospital.
1946. July. Appointment of Head of Department of Anæsthetics and Reader in Anæsthetics in the University of Durham.
1947. March. Chair of Psychological Medicine founded in the University of Durham. Clinical facilities provided at the Royal Victoria Infirmary.
1948. April 19th. Dental Hospital and School transferred to premises in Northumberland Road, Newcastle upon Tyne.
1948. July 5th. Appointed Day of Transfer of Royal Victoria Infirmary under National Health Service Act, 1946.

The House Committee have to report that the year under review again shows an increase over previous years in the volume of work done; the number of in-patients treated having exceeded all previous figures. Compared with last year there is an increase of 677, although

the number of available beds remains the same. The daily average number of beds occupied was 605.1 which represents 90 per cent. of the total beds available. The daily average has on many occasions been exceeded in consequence of the heavy demands from accidents and other cases, and as hitherto, extra beds have been put up to meet these emergencies.

It is a matter of great regret that the beds are so heavily taxed for urgent cases as to leave a comparatively small margin for cases of a less serious character.

The number of applicants awaiting treatment in the wards is still at a high figure and this obtains in spite of the Infirmary's resources being used to their utmost capacity.

Taking a comparison with 10 years ago, the number of in-patients treated has risen by 30 per cent. which has in turn lowered the average length of stay of each patient from 14.2 days to 11.42 days.

New out-patients show an increase of 7,510 over the previous year, and out patient attendances an increase of 3,314.

Operations show an increase of 1,868.

The pressure of work in the Infirmary is no doubt due in part to the fact that the area is gravely under-hospitalized; there are not enough beds for the treatment of the urgently ill, and in consequence more work is thrown upon the Infirmary than it can reasonably cope with.

BABIES' HOSPITAL AND CHILDREN'S DEPARTMENT.

The Babies' Hospital and Children's Department continue to give important and valuable service within the Region. During the year 1947, 1,649 patients were admitted, an increase of five over 1946, and include a wide range of medical and surgical conditions. In the Out-patient Consultation Department 9,741 attendances were recorded, and of this number 4,660 were new out-patients. In addition to these out-patient clinics the Department has continued its special clinics, follow-up clinics, Speech Clinic and Child Welfare Clinic. The value of this consultation service and the special clinics cannot be estimated in mere numbers of attendances, but it is impressive to observe that about 30,000 persons are passing through this Department annually, including relatives accompanying the patients. The Department carries the main burden of the clinical work and the consultation work of the region. The daily reception of patients and the urgent nature of the illnesses impose heavy duties on the Department.

The adaptation of the premises belonging to the Royal Victoria Infirmary at 34 and 35 Leazes Terrace for the accommodation of the Babies' Hospital Unit within the Children's Department are nearing completion. These premises will provide accommodation for 12 babies and eight mothers.

The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account of the Hospital are shown on pages 116 to 119 of this Report.

PRINCESS MARY MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

The work of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital has been carried on with difficulty over the past few years and great credit is due both to the medical and to the nursing staff for their high standard of efficiency and the successful results in the treatment of the mother and the new born baby. In this Hospital much important progress is being made in obstetric and in pædiatric practice.

The number of in-patients treated during the year was 2,882, a decrease of 93 as compared with the number in 1946.

The total attendances at the Ante Natal Clinic were 9,186 which shows a decrease of 3,753 on the figures for the previous year. 1,096

patients attended the Post Natal Clinic, a decrease of 167. 2,368 babies were born during the year, an increase of 17 on the figures for 1946.

The internal structural alterations and renovations to the Ante Natal Clinic at the Jubilee Road premises have now been completed and the clinic is in use. These alterations have resulted in substantial improvement in the level of accommodation available to the Obstetrician for consultation and have given improved standards of privacy and comfort for the patient.

Work on the alterations to the North Road premises have begun and the work is making good progress.

Dr. C. C. Bowley, M.B., B.S., has been appointed Resident Obstetric Officer in succession to Dr. T. Wilson Roddie, M.B., Ch.B., B.A.O., D.R.C.O.G.

Mr. H. R. Arthur, M.B., F.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., M.R.C.S. and Mr. E. L. Nicolson, M.B., Ch.B., M.R.C.O.G., have been re-appointed First Assistants in Obstetrics and Gynaecology for a further period of one year.

CHAIR OF PATHOLOGY AND HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
PATHOLOGY IN THE R.V.I.

Professor John B. Duguid, M.D., Ch.B., to the Chair of Pathology, King's College, and Head of the Department of Pathology in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

Professor Duguid graduated M.B., Ch.B., in 1920 and M.D. (with highest honours) in 1925 at Aberdeen University. After spending two years in resident hospital posts he joined the staff of the Pathology Department of Aberdeen University. In 1925 he was appointed Lecturer in Morbid Anatomy at Manchester University and in 1926 became Lecturer in Pathology in the Welsh National School of Medicine. On the resignation of Professor Kettle in 1927, Dr. Duguid

was made temporary head of the Department of Pathology, and with the exception of a period of 18 months, when Professor J. Henry Dible occupied the chair, he remained in charge until 1932, when he was appointed to the Chair of Pathology and Bacteriology in the University of Wales. Professor Duguid has many publications to his credit.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGICAL MEDICINE:—

Dr. A. Kennedy to the Chair of Psychological Medicine.

Dr. Kennedy was a student at St. Thomas's Hospital Medical School and qualified as M.B., B.S. (London), M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (London), in 1931. He proceeded to the M.D. (London) in General Medicine in 1934 and to the M.R.C.P. (London) in the same year. In 1935 he took the D.P.M. After holding appointments at St. Thomas's he joined the staff of the Maudsley Hospital in 1935 and has been Senior Physician until leaving to take up his Chair.

In 1936 he was awarded a Rockefeller Fellowship and studied in the U.S.A. holding an Assistantship at John Hopkins Hospital. From 1937 to 1941 he was Chief Assistant for Psychological Medicine at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, concurrently with his appointment at the Maudsley Hospital, and from 1938-41 he was Physician in Charge of the Department of Psychological Medicine at St. Thomas's Hospital. In 1941 he joined the Army, and was at various times Adviser in Psychiatry to the Intelligence Services; Adviser in Psychiatry, Middle East Command; Command Psychiatrist, Southern Command; and Scientific Adviser and Chief of Psychiatric Field Team, F.I.A.T. Dr. Kennedy left the Army with the rank of Lieut-Colonel, R.A.M.C.

At a Quarterly Court of Governors held on 27th September, 1947, Statute 2 was altered to include an Honorary Physician in the Department of Psychological Medicine.

DEPARTMENT OF BACTERIOLOGY.

Dr. C. A. Green, M.D., Ph.D., D.P.H. as Clinical Bacteriologist in succession to Dr. H. J. Slade, M.B., B.Hy., D.P.H., M.R.C.S., who has retired.

Dr. Green graduated M.B., Ch.B. in 1932, D.P.H. 1934, Ph.D. 1941 and M.D. (Gold Medal) 1941.

After six months in General Practice, Dr. Green in 1933 was awarded the Crichton Research Fellowship in Bacteriology and spent five years in the Bacteriology Department, Edinburgh University, where he attained the position of Senior Lecturer.

In 1938 he was appointed Director of the Naval Research Foundation of the Empire Rheumatism Council. In September, 1939 he was granted an honorary commission as Surgeon Commander, R.N.V.R. and appointed as Assistant to the Professor of Pathology R.N. Medical School. In April, 1942 he was transferred to salaried R.N.V.R. service and carried out research until demobilisation in April, 1946. Since demobilisation he has assisted in research with the Distillers Co. and acted as medical adviser to the Speke Penicillin Factory.

Dr. Green has many publications to his credit.

PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPARTMENT AND SCHOOL.

Miss M. G. Nicholson has retired from her appointment as Principal of the School of Physiotherapy and left the Infirmary in May, 1947.

The House Committee have placed on record their appreciation of her long and loyal service to the Infirmary and wish her every happiness in her retirement.

Miss M. H. S. Roper has been appointed in succession to Miss Nicholson and is now in office.

Miss Roper was previously Assistant Teacher at the Swedish Institute and St. Mary's Hospital, London, and holds certificates for teaching of massage and medical gymnastics and teaching of massage and medical electricity.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

RETIREMENT.

The House Committee record with regret the retirement from active membership of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff of Professor J. Hamilton Barclay, M.D., M.S., F.R.C.S., on reaching the statutory age limit.

Professor Barclay has been associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of 35 years and from 1912 to 1920 he held appointments as House Physician, House Surgeon, Acting Temporary Assistant Surgeon, Surgical Registrar, Temporary Assistant Surgeon. In the year 1920, Professor Barclay was appointed Honorary Assistant Surgeon and in 1929 Honorary Surgeon. In the year 1944 he was appointed Professor of Surgery.

Professor Barclay's long association with the Infirmary has gained for him the affection and esteem of his colleagues in the profession and the Infirmary is particularly grateful to him for his unfailing loyalty and interest in the welfare of the patients who have come under his care.

In recognition of such services, Professor Barclay was appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon at the last Annual Court of Governors held on 29th March, 1947.

APPOINTMENTS.

Mr. J. Brumwell, M.B., M.S., F.R.C.S., Honorary Assistant Surgeon, has been appointed an Honorary Surgeon. Mr. Brumwell has been Associated with the Infirmary for a period of 34 years and he has held appointments as House Physician, House Surgeon, Surgical Registrar and from the year 1931 as an Honorary Assistant Surgeon.

Dr. C. C. Ungley, M.D., B.S., F.R.C.P., Honorary Assistant Physician has been appointed a full physician.

FRAMLINGTON HOUSE.

Owing to the shortage of accommodation for Nurses in the Royal Victoria Infirmary and the necessity for increasing the nursing personnel to meet modern requirements, Framlington House, Framlington Place, the gift of Mrs. Featherstone Fenwick, has been furnished and equipped as a Student Nurses' Preliminary Training School. This house provides accommodation for 20 student nurses with a Sister-Tutor in charge.

Other properties in Framlington Place have been purchased and will be utilised as Hostels for Nurses. By the acquisition of these properties it is hoped that to some extent the pressure on the accommodation in the Nurses Home will be relieved. This, however, is only a temporary expedient and in no way effects the policy that at some future date extensions to the present Nurses Home will be necessary and should be accomplished as soon as building operations become possible.

COLONIAL STUDENT NURSES.

The House Committee have agreed to the introduction of Colonial Student Nurses to the Preliminary Training School, provided that the numbers do not exceed four to six at any one time.

MATRON.

Miss G. Lang-Davis, who was appointed Matron in succession to Miss Charteris in 1946, has resigned. The House Committee have recorded their appreciation of Miss Lang-Davis' services during the period she has held office as Matron.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

Advice has been given to 7,893 patients in 1947 as compared with 8,585 in 1946. Of these 4,840 were assisted and 2,735 advised.

Instruments supplied and repairs to instruments were 4,735 as compared with 4,718 in 1946 (of these 1,512 were obtained direct from the Makers under supervision and 3,223 through the agency of the Department, as compared with 1,524 direct and 3,194 through the Department in 1946.

CASTLE HILL CONVALESCENT HOME, WYLAM-ON-TYNE.

The total number of patients transferred from the Royal Victoria Infirmary to Castle Hill Home during the year was 2,033 compared with 1,987 in the previous year, an increase of 46.

The average number of beds occupied was 81.8 with a maximum of 100 and a minimum of 46.

Castle Hill Convalescent Home still continues to be used as a medical and surgical annexe of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and its accommodation is most valuable in relieving the pressure on the beds in the Infirmary. The patients sent to this Home derive much benefit from its ideal surroundings.

FINANCE.

During the year 1947, the Finance Committee has been continuously presented with requests for funds for additional accommodation, equipment and staff to meet the needs of the Hospital as a modern centre of medical treatment and clinical training of Doctors and Nurses; additional funds have also been required to meet the continuing increase in costs of available supplies of labour and material. These requests besides making a call for capital expenditure also result in increasing the annual cost of maintaining the hospital. To meet expenditure at the present necessary level, the whole basis of financing the hospital requires revision.

On 5th July, 1948, the people will be required to make payments for hospital services by means of weekly insurance contributions and by central taxation. The Finance Committee has not yet any information as to the amount which will be directed to the Royal Victoria Infirmary for cost of maintenance after 5th July, 1948. Until this date the Infirmary will continue to rely on its present sources of income and this income is now insufficient to meet the needs of the hospital.

In these circumstances, the Infirmary is fortunate to have had available for use during the past two years surplus funds which have been carefully husbanded in a development fund. These funds have been used to meet the deficiency of income required to finance ordinary maintenance and have also been used to provide some of the more urgent items of additional accommodation and equipment needed.

During the year 1947, £377,261 7s. 11d. was spent on ordinary maintenance and £9,659 8s. 5d. on renewals and improvements of equipment, a total expenditure of £386,920 16s. 4d. compared with £312,489 1s. 4d. in the year 1946. To meet this expenditure, income of £333,214 9s. 8d., an increase of £73,918 over the ordinary income of 1946, was received. The 1947 total includes income from legacies and extraordinary sources, the equivalent of which in previous years was retained in a development fund for capital purposes.

Even after including legacies and other extraordinary revenue, the total income of £333,214 9s. 8d. was £53,706 6s. 8d. less than expendi-

ture. To meet the deficiency the remaining available balance of £4,047 17s. 3d. has been used from general funds and an amount of £49,658 9s. 5d. has been transferred from the development account.

In addition to the expenditure of £386,920 16s. 4d. already mentioned, £55,502 0s. 3d. has been spent out of the development fund on premises and on equipment needed to extend the services of the Royal Victoria Infirmary; after expending this sum and transferring £49,658 to meet the revenue account deficit, there remains in the development fund a balance of £53,399 13s. 6d., which forms the last remaining reserve of the Infirmary, out of which to make good any further revenue deficits, or pay for any further capital improvements before 5th July, 1948.

During 1947, the Infirmary has received legacies and endowments totalling £64,337 10s. 1d. of which £16,515 1s. 4d. has been added to the endowment fund; £30,000, being a balance remaining on the Northumberland-Durham War Needs Fund which the Trustees of that fund, with the permission of the Charity Commissioners, directed to the Infirmary to assist in the provision of new ward accommodation to be named the Northumberland and Durham War Needs Fund Wing is being held in an accumulating trust fund.

The total of the Infirmary's endowment fund at 31st December, 1947, was £419,729 19s. 5d. This fund, together with other assets of the Infirmary will vest in the Minister of Health on 5th July, 1948, but as the Infirmary has been designated under the Health Act, a teaching hospital, the Infirmary endowment fund will remain within the control of the new Governing Board of the Infirmary and will be available for purposes connected with the teaching hospital.

OBITUARY.

The House Committee record with profound regret the loss they have sustained by the death of the following:—

PROFESSOR A. F. BERNARD SHAW.

Professor Shaw was Assistant Pathologist at the Infirmary from 1918 to 1932, having previously served with the R.A.M.C. in the first World War. He resigned in 1932 to take up the post of Professor of Pathology in Cairo and returned to Newcastle in 1938 as Professor of Pathology in the University and Head of the Department of Pathology in the Infirmary. He was a member of many learned societies and was a Commander of the Order of the Nile.

CANON F. G. GODDARD, M.A.

Canon Goddard who was Vicar of Jesmond Parish Church, a Governor of the Infirmary and a Trustee of the Chaplaincy Endowment Fund.

REV. E. MITCHELL.

The Rev. E. Mitchell who was Honorary Chaplain of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital for many years.

DR. W. SEYMOUR, M.B., B.S.

Dr. Seymour, who was an Anæsthetist at the Infirmary from 1906 to 1941, a period of 35 years. During this time he gave loyal service to the Infirmary, and expressions of thanks and appreciation were recorded on his retirement from this post in 1941.

MR. A. BURNS.

Mr. Burns, who was associated with the Infirmary as a member of the House Committee and various sub-committees during the years 1919 to 1941. A personal subscriber for many years, Mr. Burns took a keen and personal interest in the work of the hospital which was much appreciated.

MR. JOHN G. MOORE.

Mr. Moore who was a member of the House Committee and various sub-committees for a period of 15 years. He was Vice-Chairman of the Patients Admission and Physiotherapy Committees. He was a personal subscriber for many years and always took a deep interest in the work of the Infirmary.

MR. J. M. CRAWHALL.

Mr. Crawhall who was First Assistant Pharmacist at the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of 41 years. Mr. Crawhall commenced his service at the old Infirmary, Forth Banks, and was a loyal and devoted employee. The Committee recorded their appreciation of this service.

MR. W. TAYLOR.

Mr. Taylor of 18, Summerhill Terrace, Newcastle, a Porter in the employ of the Infirmary from 1919 to 1938 when he retired.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ROYAL VICTORIA INFIRMARY.

As this may be the last published Annual Report of the Royal Victoria Infirmary as a Voluntary Hospital, prior to the Minister of Health taking control, it may be of interest to outline briefly some of the important events in the history of this premier hospital of the north.

The Infirmary started in a house in Gallowgate on the 23rd May, 1751, with 23 beds. Out-patients were also seen. The founding of the Infirmary was the direct result of a letter signed "B.K." which appeared in the *Newcastle Courant* on Saturday, 5th January, 1751, in which the writer urged the necessity of "founding an Hospital" in the Town. On the 5th September, 1751 the Foundation Stone of the Infirmary on the Forth Banks was laid by Bishop Butler, Lord Bishop of Durham, on ground given by the Corporation, and on the 8th October, 1753, the Infirmary with 90 beds was opened for the reception of patients. It is recorded that no charitable undertaking had ever begun in Newcastle with greater enthusiasm than the building of the Infirmary.

In 1801 at the end of its first 50 years of existence, a proposal was made for the reconstruction and extension of the Infirmary, and additional wards were added to the building. The population of Newcastle and the district for which the Infirmary was founded continued to grow and in 1830 further extensions to the Infirmary were necessary, again in 1850 further extensions were proposed and in 1855 the Dobson Wing was opened. The bed accommodation of the Infirmary was now 220.

In 1885 a Special Committee with Lord Ravensworth as Chairman was appointed to carry out a scheme for the enlargement of the hospital. The Medical Staff were not in agreement with this scheme and recommended that a new hospital should be built on another site, but in view of the urgent need for temporary provision, the medical staff agreed this should be supplied without delay, and a temporary block for 50 beds as an out-shoot from the main building was erected. The new wards were opened for patients in the ensuing October by the Earl of Ravensworth, after whom they were named. The opening of the Ravensworth Wards greatly relieved the pressure in the hospital. They were occupied by male patients, the withdrawal of whom from the main building gave space for fifteen additional female patients, for three suitable wards to constitute a children's department, and for a small addition to the nurses' accommodation. The Infirmary now had accommodation for 270 patients.

This was the last addition to the Old Infirmary for in 1896 it was decided at a meeting in the Council Chamber, Town Hall, to build a new Infirmary. On 16th June, 1887, the Infirmary was designated "Royal Infirmary" by permission of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

On 20th June, 1900 the Foundation Stone of the present Royal Victoria Infirmary on the Castle Leazes site was laid by Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, K.G., Patron of the Hospital, as the representative of Her Majesty Queen Victoria. The Queen had already commanded that the new Infirmary should be called the "Royal Victoria Infirmary for the Counties of Newcastle upon Tyne, Durham and Northumberland."

The Royal Victoria Infirmary was opened by His Majesty King Edward VII., accompanied by Her Majesty Queen Alexandra on the 11th July, 1906.

The new Infirmary provided accommodation for 400 in-patients, and cost, for building, equipment and furnishings, in the region of £300,000.

Various extensions have been made to the original building among which are an extension to the Nurses' Home named the Runciman Wing, the Leazes Hospital (Pay-bed Section), Block of buildings for Resident Medical and Surgical Staff, Orthopædic Department, two new Wards "Rutherford Morison" Ward and the "Innes-Hopkins Memorial" Ward.

In 1934 Castle Hill Home, Wylam-on-Tyne, was gifted to the Infirmary by Mr. Geoffrey Stirling Newall, O.B.E., D.L., J.P., in memory of his father and mother. This residence was converted into a hospital annexe of the Infirmary and had accommodation originally for 50 patients.

In 1938 an extension provided accommodation for a further 50 patients at Castle Hill.

The total bed complement of the Infirmary including Castle Hill, Wylam, and the Leazes Hospital is now 810.

This brief sketch of the history of the Infirmary would be incomplete without reference to the part it has played as a School of medical training. When the School of Medicine was established in 1834 the career of the Infirmary as a teaching hospital began and since this date the Royal Victoria Infirmary as a centre of medical education has steadily grown in importance. It is now one of the largest Schools of Medicine in the Country.

In May 1948 the Royal Victoria Infirmary completes 197 years as a Voluntary Hospital and its record of service to the North-East is one of which it can be justly proud.

NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE ACT.

The Governors will remember that the National Health Service Act was passed by H.M. Government on 6th November, 1946, with the express purpose of providing for the establishment of a comprehensive health service for England and Wales. Reference has been made at various Courts of Governors to the way in which this Act will affect the Infirmary.

It is now understood that the appointed day when the Minister of Health will assume control under the Act is 5th July, 1948.

Section 6(1) of the Act states that subject to the provisions of the Act, there shall, on the appointed day, be transferred to and vest in the Minister by virtue of the Act all interests in or attaching to premises forming part of a voluntary hospital..... In simple terms the section means that the premises and equipment of the Infirmary will be transferred from the control of the present Governors to the control of the Minister of Health on the appointed day.

After consultation with the University of Durham and the Newcastle upon Tyne Regional Hospital Board the Minister proposes that the following hospitals should comprise the teaching hospital for Newcastle upon Tyne :—

- Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle upon Tyne, including
Castle Hill Convalescent Home, Wylam.
- Princess Mary Maternity Hospital, Newcastle upon Tyne.
- Newcastle upon Tyne Dental Hospital.
- Babies' Hospital, Newcastle upon Tyne.

These hospitals, having been designated as Teaching Hospitals, shall, as from the appointed day, be deemed for the purposes of the Act to be a single hospital, and the Minister, in accordance with Part III of the Third Schedule of the Act, shall constitute a Board of Governors for the purpose of exercising functions with respect to the administration of the hospital or group.

The Board of Governors of this teaching hospital shall consist of a chairman appointed by the Minister and such number of other members so appointed as the Minister thinks fit, and of those members :—

- (a) not more than one-fifth shall be nominated by the university with which the hospital is associated ;
- (b) not more than one-fifth shall be nominated by the Regional Hospital Board for the area in which the hospital is situated ;
- (c) not more than one-fifth shall be nominated by the medical and dental teaching staff of the hospital ; and

- (d) other persons shall be appointed after consultation with such local health authorities and other organisations as appear to the Minister to be concerned, including, in the case of the original members of the Board of Governors of a teaching hospital designated before the appointed day, the governing body of any voluntary hospital comprised or to be comprised in the teaching hospital.

The House Committee desire to express gratitude to the various Committees, the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, the Honorary Treasurer, the Honorary Solicitors, the Auditors, the House Governor, the Matron, the various Heads of Departments, the General Staff, the Arnison Surgical Aid Society, the Blood Transfusion Service, the Singing Band, the Ward Garment Guild, the voluntary drivers for the Hospital Car Service.

The House Committee are also grateful to all friends who have assisted in entertaining the patients, and all those who have so generously helped in other ways.

The House Committee wish to repeat the thanks expressed in previous Annual Reports to the Medical and Surgical Staff, the Matron and Nursing Staffs of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital for the services they have rendered to the hospital during the year.

The House Committee are grateful to the ex-Lord Mayor of Newcastle (Alderman J. Pearson, J.P.) for presiding at the Annual Court of Governors last year.

The House Committee again express their thanks to the Press of Newcastle and District for giving publicity to matters relating to the work and needs of the Royal Victoria Infirmiry.

SUBSCRIPTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT.

The Subscriptions Committee are pleased to report that voluntary contributions to the Royal Victoria Infirmary have been maintained during the year 1947 at the level of the two previous years.

The total contributions for the year 1947 compared with the total for the two previous years are as follows:—

The total collected for the year 1939 was £74,344 10s. 9d. Thereafter voluntary contributions increased each year until 1946 when a record of £180,219 9s. 8d. was received, including £8,005 1s. 11d. from the King's College Students Rag which had been renewed that year after being in abeyance during the war. For the year 1947 the proceeds of the Students' Rag were divided equally between the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital and Newcastle Dental Hospital, and these contributions do not form part of the total of £176,314 18s. 10d. for 1947.

The Subscriptions Committee are pleased to report that the contributions of workpeople for the year 1947 reached a new high level, the amount received, £126,788 3s. 7d. being over £4,000 greater than the previous record amount in the year 1945. This increase in contributions is mainly due to the continued enrolment of additional subscriber groups of employees most of them engaged in relatively small concerns throughout the district.

Also reaching a new high level was the amount received in subscriptions and donations from firms, companies and other employers.

There had been a prospect of a reduction in firms' subscriptions, owing to the loss of contributions from the Colliery Companies transferred from private ownership to the National Coal Board. Private owners' contributions for the last few years totalled about £4,500 per annum and the Subscriptions Committee were very pleased when the National Coal Board undertook to continue subscriptions to the Infirmary by making a contribution of £4,500 for the year 1947.

There has been a small reduction in personal subscriptions during the year as some subscribers have withdrawn their support in view of the coming Health Service. There has been also a reduction of income from efforts in aid of the Infirmary, from district collections, and from collecting boxes. Some voluntary workers in aid of the Infirmary have transferred their efforts to other causes in view of the proposed National Health Service, but the present reduction of income is chiefly due to the severe weather in January, February, and March when many dances, concerts and collections in aid of the Infirmary were cancelled owing to snow storms.

The prospect of an early introduction of the National Health Service has made many contributors consider withdrawing their financial support. The Government is not yet collecting contributions or taxation for the hospital service and will make no general State contributions to voluntary hospitals until the National Health Service is introduced on the 5th July, at which date increased National Insurance contributions will become payable by the general public. Until 5th July the Infirmary relies upon voluntary contributions for its continued maintenance and existing contributors should continue their full support until that date. After 5th July there may well be opportunity for Voluntary contributions to the Royal Victoria Infirmary but until some details of the Government's proposals for the financing of the Infirmary are known it is not possible to determine in what way voluntary contributions can be best employed in the interest of the hospital.

While recognising that the present volume of voluntary income is no longer adequate to meet the Infirmary's needs the Subscriptions Committee is nevertheless very appreciative of the continued interest and support of its very many subscribers and wish to take this opportunity of conveying to all concerned their sincere thanks for these voluntary contributions given to enable the Infirmary to continue its object of providing free treatment at the Infirmary for the Sick and Lame Poor of the Counties of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Northumberland and Durham.

DESCRIPTION AND NAMES OF WARDS.

Ward 1.—THE “KING EDWARD” WARD.—This ward is named the “King Edward” Ward, after H.M. King Edward VII., Patron of the Institution, by whom the opening ceremony, on the 11th July, 1906, was performed.

Ward 2.—THE “QUEEN ALEXANDRA” WARD.—This ward is named the “Queen Alexandra” Ward, after H.M. Queen Alexandra, who was present with H.M. King Edward VII., at the opening ceremony on the 11th July, 1906.

Ward 3.—THE “GIBSON” WARD.—*Male side*: This ward is named the “Gibson Ward,” after Thomas Geo. Gibson, Esquire, J.P., of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, to commemorate his gift of £5,500 to the Queen’s Commemoration New Infirmary Fund.

THE “HEATH” WARD.—*Female side*: This ward is named the “Heath” Ward, after George Yeoman Heath, Esq., M.D., D.C.L., F.R.C.S., a distinguished Surgeon, and a Consulting Surgeon to the Institution. Elected Surgeon, 9th November, 1854; re-appointed Surgeon, 1869; appointed Consulting Surgeon, 1880; died, 4th March, 1892.

Ward 4.—THE “NORTHUMBERLAND” WARD.

Ward 5.—THE “RILEY LORD” WARD.—This ward is named the “Riley Lord” Ward, after Sir Riley Lord, J.P., Chairman of the Building Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary by whose zeal and energy, when Mayor of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in 1896-7, a fund of over £100,000 was raised for the re-building of the Royal Infirmary in commemoration of the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria in 1897.

Ward 6.—THE “HUME” WARD.—This ward is named the “Hume” Ward, after George Haliburton Hume, Esquire, M.D., D.C.L., F.R.C.S., Ed., Honorary Surgeon to the Royal Infirmary, 1878-1905, and afterwards a Consulting Surgeon to this Institution.

Ward 7.—THE “WORKMEN’S MEMORIAL” WARD.—This ward is named the “Workmen’s Memorial” Ward, in acknowledgment of the contribution of £18,670. 2s. 7d. by the workmen of the Counties of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Northumberland and Durham, to the Queen Victoria Commemoration New Infirmary Fund. The following Workmen Governors were members of the House Committee at the time of the opening of the Royal Victoria Infirmary on 11th July, 1906:—Mr. E. W. Blake, Mr. Hugh Boyle, Mr. Thomas Buckham, Mr. James Eckford, Mr. J. Mitchell, Mr. T. Potts, Mr. R. Redhead, Mr. C. Stout, Mr. G. W. Trewick, Mr. Geo. Watson, Mr. F. Wake, Mr. G. Young.

- Ward 12.—THE "RAVENSWORTH" WARD.
- Ward 13.—THE "JOHN HALL" WARD.—This ward is named the "John Hall" Ward, after John Hall, Esquire, J.P., Shipowner, of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, to commemorate his gift of £100,000 to the Governors of the Royal Victoria Infirmary.
- Ward 14.—THE "ARMSTRONG" WARD.—This tablet is to commemorate the gift of £100,000 by the Rt. Hon. William Henry Armstrong Fitzpatrick Lord Armstrong, and his wife, Winifreda Jane Lady Armstrong, towards the building and endowment of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, in memory of William George Lord Armstrong of Cragside, and Margaret his wife; and in further memory of the glorious reign of Her Revered Majesty Queen Victoria.

This ward is named the "Rutherford Morison" Ward, after James Rutherford Morison, Esq., M.D., F.R.C.S., a distinguished Surgeon, and a Consulting Surgeon to the Institution. Elected Honorary Assistant Surgeon, 1st November, 1888. Elected Surgeon, 1st April, 1897; re-appointed, 30th May, 1912. Retired, 6th November, 1913. Appointed Honorary Consulting Surgeon, 27th November, 1913.
- Ward 20.—THE "INNES-HOPKINS MEMORIAL" WARD. This ward is named "Innes-Hopkins Memorial" Ward to perpetuate the memory of Charles and Castel, the two sons of Col. C. H. Innes Hopkins, who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-1918.

LEAZES HOSPITAL (PAY-BED SECTION).

- PAVILION 1.—THE BEWICK WING.**—This Wing was named “The Bewick Wing” to commemorate the gift of £17,226 15s. 1d., given in memory of the late Thomas John Bewick and John Wm. Bewick, formerly Catholic Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, both of whom were for many years closely associated with the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. 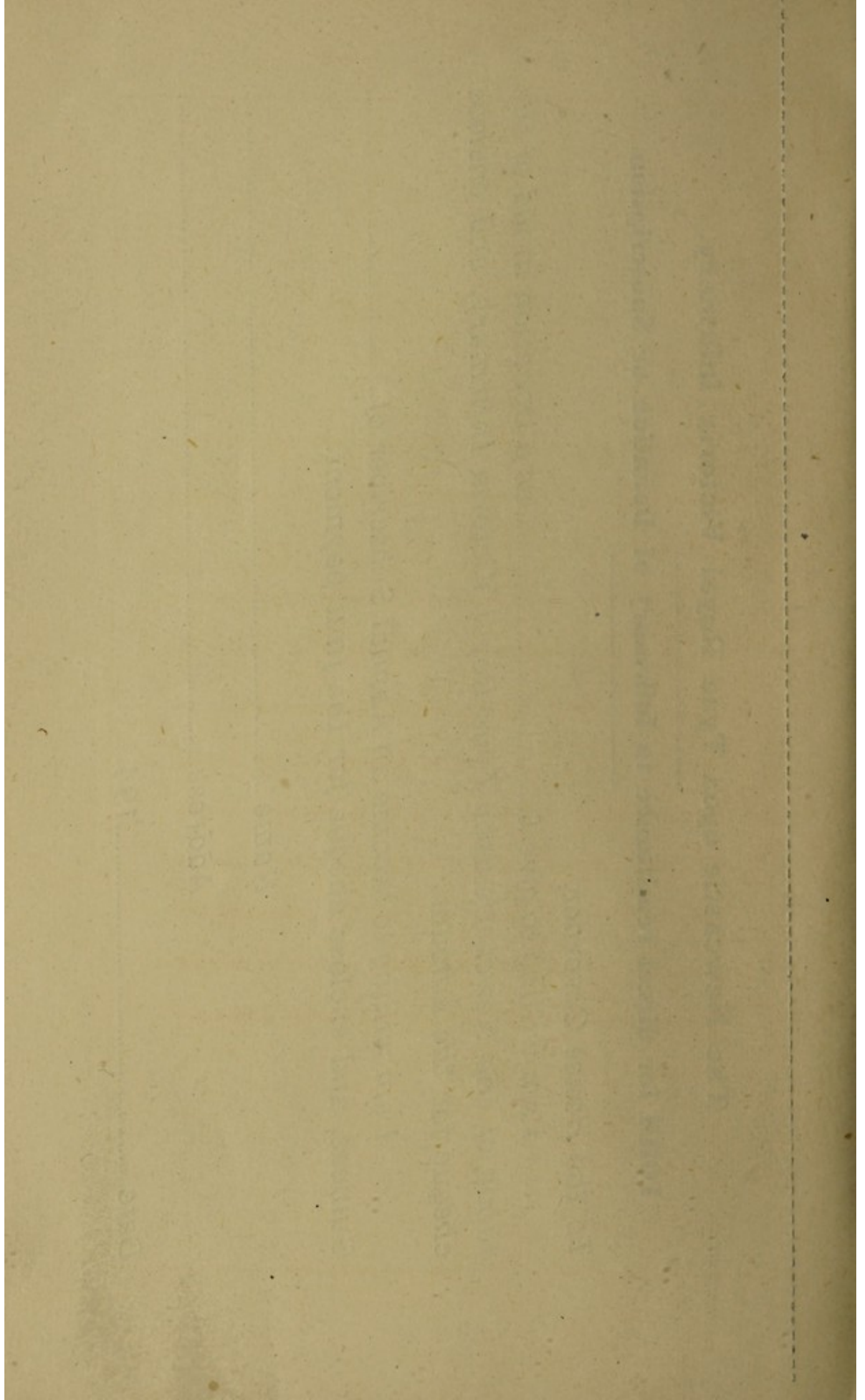
