IMPORTANT.

Appointment of Governors.

The Statutes definitely state :-

"Any Company, Firm, Body of Employees or Charitable Organisation contributing in any one year the sum of £10 shall be entitled to elect one of their members as a Governor for the succeeding year in respect of every £10 so contributed."

The financial year extends from January 1st to December 31st. Contributions therefore, must be received before December 31st in order to qualify for the nomination of Governors in the succeeding year.

- "Every person subscribing £2 2s. 0d. or more per annum shall be a Governor."
- "Any person giving £100 or more at any one time or in any one year shall be a Governor."
- "Every person bequeathing a legacy of £100 or more may nominate by his will one person to be a Life Governor or if no such nomination be made his executor or executors may nominate a Life Governor."
- "Any person rendering special services in collecting or raising money for the Institution may be appointed a Life Governor."

The House Governor will be pleased to supply any further information on request.



Named Beds and Cots.

It would be difficult to suggest a better means of keeping in perpetual memory a relative or friend than the naming of a bed or cot.

A celebration of an event or a thank offering can be marked by the endowment of a bed or cot in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

A bed may be named by a donation or legacy of £1,000 and a cot by a donation or legacy of £500. These amounts should be nett and not subject to any deductions for tax.

Every year approximately 26 patients occupy each bed or cot and money received for an endowment fund is invested and the income applied towards the maintenance of the bed or cot.

A tablet appropriately worded is affixed to each named bed or cot.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS.

ALL SUBSCRIBERS TO THE HOSPITAL WHO PAY INCOME TAX GIVE THEIR SUBSCRIPTIONS OUT OF INCOME UPON WHICH THEY HAVE ALREADY PAID TAX, BUT THE HOSPITAL CAN RECOVER THE TAX, AMOUNTING TO ONE GUINEA FOR EACH GUINEA SUBSCRIBED SO LONG AS THE INCOME TAX REMAINS AT 10/- IN THE £.

BY RECOVERY OF INCOME TAX.

Acts, it is possible for the Hospital to effect an increase of its income by the recovery from the Inland Revenue Department of the Income Tax that has been paid by its subscribers in respect of their subscriptions. To enable the Hospital to do this, however, it is necessary that each subscriber should enter into a legally binding contract to pay to the Hospital an annual subscription of definite amount during a period of at least seven years.

The agreement is terminable by death, so that a subscriber's estate would not be liable for subsequent payments of the subscription.

During the year 16,258 patients were admitted to the General wards of the Royal Victoria Infirmary (analysis of which is shown below) compared with 16,106 in 1943, an increase of 152.

The percentage of beds occupied shows only slight deviation from the preceding year, being 88.49 against 88.5.

The average length of stay of each in-patient was 12.31 days, which compares with 12.37 days in the previous year.

New out-patient registrations numbered 103,001, compared with 104,159 in the previous year.

Out-patient attendances numbered 205,293, compared with 197,765 in the previous year, an increase of 7,528.

OPERATIONS.

The number of operations performed was 15,774, which compares with 16,886 in 1943.

A review of the above figures will give some idea of the vast amount of work done by the Royal Victoria Infirmary during the past year, and this has been accomplished under increasing difficulties. Many additional duties and responsibilities have been undertaken by the Staff of the Infirmary since the outbreak of war, and during the past year there has been much additional work on the reception and treatment of casualties from the battle area in Western Europe.

The Royal Victoria Infirmary is scheduled as a 1A General Hospital in the Emergency Medical Services Scheme, and it may be of interest to publish the text of a message from the Minister of Health on July 31st, 1944:—

"I have been much impressed during the past few weeks by the smooth efficiency with which the hospitals and casualty services of the Emergency Scheme have carried cut their duties. These have included the reception, transport and treatment of casualties arriving in this country from the battle area in Western Europe and of civilians injured by the flying bombs, in addition to the casualties arriving from other theatres of war and the various other categories of patients for whom the Emergency Medical Services are responsible.

This reflects the utmost credit on the medical, nursing and other staffs and also on the administrative officers. Many of them have carried out their duties as mobile surgical teams and reinforcements under difficult circumstances, while others have shouldered heavy extra burdens in order that these reinforcements might be released for service where they were most required.

The country owes a deep debt of gratitude to all members of hospital staffs for contributing so much in this and other ways to the success of the Emergency Hospital Scheme during this important phase of the war."

MINISTER OF HEALTH.

Mr. H. U. Willink during his recent visit to Newcastle paid a visit to the Royal Victoria Infirmary, when he inspected the Hospital, and his visit also provided an opportunity for an informal discussion on hospital government and administration.

INCOME LIMITS OF PATIENTS.

The House Committee have agreed that there shall be a revised scale of income limits for subscribers and non-subscribers for admission to the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

The new scale will be :-

Subscriber Income limit up to £450 p.a. Non-subscriber Income limit up to £250 p.a.

TRANSFERRED CASES TO MUNICIPAL HOSPITALS.

Satisfactory arrangements have now been made with Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation, Northumberland County Council and Gateshead Borough Council for payment by the Royal Victoria Infirmary for those subscriber patients who are transferred to Newcastle General Hospital or Shotley Bridge Hospital at the direction of the Physician or Surgeon of the Infirmary for neuro-surgery, thoracic and prostatic surgery only. For those subscriber patients who are transferred by the direction of the Infirmary to the above specified clinics only, the Royal Victoria Infirmary has assumed responsibility and the transferred subscriber patient will not be required to make any direct payment to the Local Authority.

Negotiations are proceeding for a similar arrangement with Durham County Council.

REDISTRIBUTION OF WARDS.

The Royal Victoria Infirmary has been informed by the Regional Hospitals Officer that some relaxation of the restrictions on the admission of civilian patients, imposed on 6th May, 1944, may now be permitted. Provision will still be necessary for service casualties but it will be possible to revert in the main to the position prior to 6th May, 1944. It has therefore been decided by the House Committee that military wards not being used to capacity should revert to civilian use and that any Service casualties received at the

Infirmary should be distributed to the wards of the various Physicians and Surgeons. The redistribution of wards is as follows:—

Ward 1. Male Surgical ... Professor Barclay.

7. Do. ... Mr. Hodgson.

8. 6. Female Surgical ... Professor Barclay and Mr. Hodgson (jointly).

9. 4. Male Surgical ... Mr. Hindmarsh.

10. Female Surgical ... Mr. Hindmarsh and Mr. Gilmour (jointly).

About four beds will be reserved in Ward 3 for Aural Leazes Hospital patients.

HOSPITAL CENTRE.

It is already known that the Royal Victoria Infirmary is anxious to proceed with the development of the University Teaching Hospital Centre on the Castle Leazes site. Much discussion has taken place on this subject, and the following memorandum has been sent to each of the participating hospitals:—

- "(1) It is generally agreed that the Royal Victoria Infirmary must be developed as a Teaching Hospital Centre, with such other hospitals as consent to participate. Recent discussions have strengthened this agreement, and have resulted in a scheme of joint administration which seems likely to be accepted in principle by the participating hospitals.
- (2) These discussions have, however, brought the participating hospitals no nearer to plans for practical development; and the time has come when immediate steps in this direction should be taken.
- (3) The Royal Victoria Infirmary is responsible to the City for the development of the site entrusted to it, and must assume the leadership corresponding to its responsibility.

- (4) In these circumstances, the Infirmary should take whatever steps may be necessary for the immediate production of plans for the proposed Hospital Centre.
 - (5) Three steps are immediately necessary:-
 - (a) Abrogation of all previous Hospital Centre agreements with other participating hospitals.
 - (b) A decision by the Infirmary to engage such architects, draughtsmen, and other personnel as will ensure the production of complete plans and the beginning of construction.
 - (c) A decision by the Infirmary to engage such staff as may be necessary to develop an immediate appeal for capital funds."

Progress along these lines is still under discussion with the other hospitals.

DEVELOPMENT OF THE HOSPITAL CENTRE.

The House Committee have considered in general principle the advisability of improving the Royal Victoria Infirmary by building additions or by major general upgrading, and are of the opinion that the maximum amount of money available should preferably be applied in the beginning of new buildings in the proposed Hospital Centre and that temporary buildings should be restricted to essential purposes. Within this general direction the Committee considered the need for upgrading the existing buildings and of temporary extensions which might be required, and approved in principle.

THE PRINCESS MARY MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

The Chairman of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital, with the approval of his Management Committee and Court of Governors, has formally proposed to the House Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary that the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital should become the Princess Mary Maternity Department of the Hospital Centre and that the Infirmary should take an immediate direct interest in the administration of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital during the period of transition. The basis of the new arrangement which has been approved by the House Committee is as follows:—

- "ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRINCESS MARY MATERNITY HOSPITAL IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ROYAL VICTORIA INFIRMARY.
- (1) The administration to be under the direct management of a Committee entitled the "Princess Mary Maternity Hospital Committee," which shall operate as a Standing Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary House Committee.
 - (2) The Committee to be constituted as follows:-
- Appointed members 12 To be appointed by the House Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, not necessarily from its own members.
- 6 The President of the Princess
 Mary Maternity Hospital at the
 time of the agreement; the
 Professor of Midwifery and
 Gynæcology; the Professors of
 Medicine and Child Health; the
 Dean of Medicine; the Sub-Dean
 of the Dental School; the Senior
 Obstetric Physician and such
 other medical staff as may be
 appointed by the House Committee.

Representative members—
Local Authorities 10

Foundation Members of whom one shall represent Workmen's Charities . . .

To be nominated on the first constitution of the Committee by the Management Committee of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital and thereafter by the Trustees.

Co-opted members—up to 3.

The Appointed, Foundation and co-opted members to hold office for three years and to be eligible for re-election.

(3) The Committee to appoint the Matron, subject to confirmation by the House Committee, and to control through her all appointments of nursing staff, pupil midwives and domestic staff.

The Matron not to be under the control of the Royal Victoria Infirmary Matron; but in the event of the Royal Victoria Infirmary desiring, at a future date, to appoint a Matron Superintendent with general responsibilities for the nursing administration of all Hospital Units situated on the Castle Leazes site, the functions of such an officer in relation to the Maternity Department to be the subject of future consideration. The first Matron of the Department to be the present Matron.

- (4) The Committee to be the legal successor of the present Management Committee. The capital assets of the Hospital, present and future, to be by Trustees, whose consent, together with the consent of the Foundation Members of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital Committee, and of such other members of the Committee as were members of the Princess Mary Management Committee at the time of the present agreement, to be necessary to any variation of that agreement.
- (5) The Rules of the Princess Mary Maternity Hospital to be revised in accordance with the above provisions, and Rules 5, 6 and 7 constituting and regulating the Court of Governors, to be abrogated."

THE BABIES' HOSPITAL.

The House Committee record with regret the disastrous fire which occurred at Blagdon Hall, the residence of Lord and Lady Ridley. This fire has temporarily suspended the in-patient work of the Babies' Hospital which was accommodated at Blagdon.

It will be remembered that the Babies' Hospital is one of the participating hospitals in the proposed Teaching Hospital Centre, and the Babies' Hospital have indicated that they would like to find a course whereby the experience of the Babies' Hospital and its medical, surgical and nursing methods may be used in the development of a new and better hospital service for children. To this end a memorandum has been prepared under which the Babies' Hospital and the Children's Wards might forthwith be amalgamated to form a combined Children's Department of the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

CHILD WELFARE CLINIC.

At the request of the Health Committee of the Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation a Child Welfare Clinic has been established at the Royal Victoria Infirmary and is holding one session each week. The establishment of this Welfare Clinic is a further step in the development of the Children's Department of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and is important for teaching purposes and for the benefit of the parent and child.

FULL-TIME PROFESSOR OF SURGERY.

The University has made proposals for the appointment of a full-time Professor of Surgery. The House Committee welcome this proposal and undertake to make arrangements for his accommodation and requirements in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

PART-TIME PROFESSOR OF SURGERY.

Mr. J. Hamilton Barclay, M.D., M.S., F.R.C.S., Senior Honorary Surgeon of the Royal Victoria Infirmary has been appointed to the part-time Chair of Surgery in the University of Durham.

Mr. Barclay has been associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of 33 years and has held appointments as House Physician, House Surgeon, Surgical Registrar, Temporary Assistant Surgeon and Honorary Assistant Surgeon.

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL MEDICINE.

An offer of a grant from the Nuffield Foundation towards the establishment of a Department of Industrial Health has been made to the University of Durham. In the event of a Chair of Industrial Medicine being created in the University of Durham, clinical, laboratory and clerical facilities will be required for the Department.

The House Committee agreed to the following resolution :-

"The House Committee learns with satisfaction that the Nuffield Foundation have offered to make a grant towards a Department of Industrial Health in King's College in the University of Durham, and that this offer has been accepted by the University. The University have asked that such clinical and other facilities as may be required for this Department of Industrial Medicine should be provided in the Royal Victoria Infirmary. The House Committee wishes to offer every possible encouragement and assistance for the development in the North-East Region of this important branch of social and industrial medicine and will welcome an opportunity of discussing with the University Authorities how a full clinical association of the new Professor and his department may be established with the Royal Victoria Infirmary as the University Teaching Hospital."

A NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE.

It will be well known that the Government has issued a White Paper on a National Health Service, and that a report of an Interdepartmental Committee on Medical Schools has been issued under the Chairmanship of Sir William Goodenough. The proposals in these two documents may have far-reaching effects on the organisation and development of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and the House Committee have appointed a special Sub-Committee to consider this subject and to draw up a report of the Infirmary's views for submission to the Minister of Health.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

The House Committee are conscious that much additional work has been undertaken by members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff during the past year, and that this has been accomplished in spite of war-time difficulties, shortage and frequent changes of staff. The House Committee take this opportunity to express their gratitude for the personal service which the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff have given to the patients who have come under their care, and for their co-operation in the many problems which face the Royal Victoria Infirmary in these difficult times.

APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY SURGEON—THROAT, NOSE AND EAR DEPARTMENT.

Mr. F. McGuckin, M.D., B.S., F.R.C.S., has been appointed Honorary Surgeon in Charge of the Throat, Nose and Ear Department, in succession to the late Mr. Robert Whillis, M.A., M.B., B.Ch., F.R.C.S.

Mr. McGuckin has been associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of 16 years, his first appointment being House Surgeon in 1928, then House Physician in 1929, and Registrar to the Throat, Nose and Ear Department in 1930. This last appointment he held until 1937 when he was appointed Honorary Assistant Surgeon to that Department.

MEDICAL RESEARCH COUNCIL.

Professor J. C. Spence, M.C., M.D., F.R.C.P., Professor of Child Health, has been appointed a member of the Medical Research Council.

The Medical Research Council, established in 1913, was incorporated under the present title by Royal Charter in 1920 and comes under the immediate administrative direction of a Committee of the Privy Council consisting of the Lord President, the Minister of Health, the Secretaries of State for Scotland, for Dominion Affairs, for the Colonies, and for Home Affairs. The Council apply monies voted by Parliament or received from private sources for the furtherance of Medical Research.

The House Committee has conveyed to Professor Spence their appreciation of this further recognition of his merits as a worthy ambassador and a wise counsellor.

HUNTERIAN ORATION.

Professor G. Grey Turner, LL.D., D.Ch., M.S., F.R.C.S., F.A.C.S., F.R.C.A.S., an Honorary Consulting Surgeon of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, has been honoured by being appointed to deliver the Hunterian Oration for 1945.

In the year 1813 Dr. Matthew Baillie and Sir Everard Home, Bart., Executors of John Hunter, "being desirous of showing a lasting mark of respect to the memory of the late Mr. John Hunter," gave to the Royal College of Surgeons of England a sum of money for the endowment of an annual Oration, to be called the Hunterian Oration, and to be delivered in the Theatre of the College on the 14th February, the Birthday of John Hunter (in 1853 this was changed to biennially instead of annually), by the Master, or one of the Governors for the time being, or such other Member of the Court of Assistants as should be appointed by the Master and Governors or any two of them—such Oration to be expressive of the merits in Comparative Anatomy, Physiology, and Surgery, not only of John Hunter, but also of all such persons, as should be from time to time deceased, whose labours have contributed to the improvement or extension of Surgical Science.

KING'S HONORARY PHYSICIANS.

The House Committee have much pleasure in congratulating two former students of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and graduates of the University of Durham, Dr. J. A. Charles, M.D., F.R.C.P., D.P.H., late Medical Officer of Health for Newcastle upon Tyne, and Dr. E. R. A. Merewether, M.D., F.R.S., (Ed.), upon their appointments as King's Honorary Physicians.

The Heath Examinations for Nurses were held in November, and 47 Nurses presented themselves for the Hospital Certificates of Training, all but three being eligible for the Heath Prizes. 42 passed the examination and gained certificates.

The Heath Medal and 1st Prize was awarded to Nurse J. B. Smith, of Llangalbn, North Wales.

The House Committee desire to express thanks to the Trustees of the Heath Bequest Fund for administering the Fund and for the prizes.

Dr. W. D. Arnison again ably conducted the examination and the House Committee are indebted to him.

The House Committee have much pleasure in placing on record the following awards which have been conferred by His Majesty The King on members of the Nursing Staff of the Royal Victoria Infirmary who are at present on active service:—

Sister E. D. Murray, Q.A.I.M.N.S., has received the award of the Royal Red Cross, Second Class, A.R.R.C., for services in Italy. The citation states "on the nights of February 14th, 18th and 22nd, 1944, on the Anzio bridgehead, when bombs were bursting all around the camp, Sister Murray completed tours of all wards, supervising her patients and staff, with complete disregard for her own personal safety. Her magnificent devotion to duty did much in reassuring the patients. Her administration and tactful supervision of the nursing officers and orderlies was excellent and was in keeping with the best Florence Nightingale tradition."

Sister H. B. Durey, Q.A.R.N.N.S., has received the Royal Red Cross, Second Class, A.R.R.C., in the New Year's Honours.

Sister Dawson (nee Brentnall) has been made a Member of the Order of the British Empire in the New Year's Honours.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

Advice has been given to 8,193 patients in 1944, as compared with 7,171 in 1943. Of these, 4,064 were assisted and 3,057 were given advice.

There were 4,044 instruments supplied and repaired during the year, as compared with 4,574 in 1943.

The House Committee again express their thanks and appreciation to all who have assisted in the work of the Almoner's Department.

LEAZES HOSPITAL.

CASTLE HILL CONVALESCENT HOME, WYLAM-ON-TYNE.

The total number of patients transferred from the Royal Victoria Infirmary to Castle Hill during the year was 1,821, compared

with 1,799 in the previous year, an increase of 22.

The number of available beds was increased from 100 to 114 on 17th August, 1944, which made the average number available throughout the year 103.32. The average number occupied was 88, with a maximum of 110 and a minimum of 61.

CHILDREN'S CONVALESCENT HOME—GREYCOURT AND NEWBROUGH.

Greycourt Convalescent Home for Children, the gift of Mr. and Mrs. N. D. Newall, was destroyed by fire in 1940 and since then has remained unused. After careful consideration the House Committee decided it was not advisable to continue to maintain the present Greycourt site with a view to rebuilding, and it was offered for sale. The sale has now been completed.

After the fire at Greycourt, Newbrough Lodge was offered as temporary accommodation by Mr. and Mrs. Newall and this was

used for the convalescence of children until April, 1944.

The House Committee has expressed its thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Newall for providing this accommodation for the convalescence of children.

TRAINING IN HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATION.

The House Committee have decided to institute a system of administrative training in the Royal Victoria Infirmary, and applications will be invited from suitably qualified persons.

FINANCE.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT.

In the year 1944 ordinary income has exceeded expenditure by £6,820, and the bank overdraft has been reduced to £19,885. This breaks a sequence of six years since 1937 during which income has been insufficient to meet expenditure by an aggregate of £112,000. The Finance Committee hope that the year 1944 will mark the beginning of a period during which the income of the Infirmary will be sufficiently improved and strengthened to allow the hospital to be properly maintained and developed, free from financial anxiety.

The balance of income and expenditure for the year 1944 is satisfactory, but attention must be called to three principal factors

which have influenced the result :-

(1) The people of the North-East have responded to repeated explanations of the Infirmary's requirements and the subscribed income has been increased by £45,472. This increase is commented upon more fully in the report of the Subscriptions Committee, but the

Finance Committee wish to express their deep appreciation of this positive action taken by subscribers to maintain the hospital.

(2) A large part of the improvement is accounted for by an increase of £14,000 in the credit from the Ministry of Health for services given to military and other patients for whom the Ministry have accepted responsibility. The credit for the cost of emergency medical service patients in 1944 was £29,000. It must be realised that the withdrawal of these military patients and return of the beds to civilian use will result in a large loss of income without

any equivalent reduction of expenditure.

(3) The continuous increase in the amount of expenditure necessary to maintain the hospital. This must be remembered when assessing the Infirmary's need of income in the immediate future. This increase is almost entirely outside the control of the management and is caused by the steady and continuous rise in the prices of labour and materials. There are no signs that these rises in prices have yet reached a maximum. A further increase of expenditure amounting to £30,000 is anticipated in 1945 for continuing the service provided in 1944. This does not take into account additional increases in expenditure which will occur if and when supplies of foodstuffs, bedding, linen, furnishings and equipment which are now unobtainable are once more available.

While 1944 is therefore the best year the Infirmary has experienced financially for seven years, there is still a great need for the public of the North-East to retain and increase their interest in and support of the funds necessary to maintain the key hospital of the region.

MINISTRY OF HEALTH EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE CONTRIBUTIONS.

During 1944 claims upon the Ministry of Health for contributions to the Emergency Medical Service have been brought fully up to date and the Government have paid all arrears of contributions due to the hospital. The total paid in 1944 was £91,245, being the cost of Emergency Medical Service patients and also a contribution to the standing charges for beds maintained ready for immediate use by the Emergency Medical Service. The beds so maintained and in part paid for by the Ministry of Health have been largely used for civilian purposes except in periods of emergency such as the period commencing in May, 1944. The payment for the treatment of Emergency Medical Service patients has been credited to the ordinary income of the hospital but the contributions to standing charges for beds reserved for but not actually used by the Minister of Health represent extraordinary and fortuitious income to the Infirmary, which the House Committee have retained in a Suspense Account for special purposes.

After transferring £100,000 in 1944 to a Development Fund referred to later, the balance of the Suspense Account at 31st December, 1944, was £582.

LEGACIES.

The amount received in legacies and endowments during 1944 was below the average received in the past few years. A total of £17,336 was received, of which £9,442 has been added to the Endowment Fund in accordance with the instructions of the testators, the balance being carried to the Legacies Reserve Account.

After transferring £25,000 in 1944 to a Development Fund referred to later, the balance of the Reserve Account at 31st December, 1944, was £21,389.

BANK OVERDRAFT.

Prior to the war the Infirmary had built up over a series of successful years sums of money available for further extensions and improvements to the hospital. At the outbreak of war these savings were represented by General Fund investments amounting to approximately £140,000.

During the war years, owing to the large insufficiency of income year by year, it has been necessary to pledge these investments with the Bank in order to obtain cash to carry on the hospital. The overdraft on General Account at the beginning of 1944 had risen to £161,468, and the Bank asked what proposals the Infirmary had to reduce this borrowing.

During 1944 the increase in ordinary income obviated further Bank borrowing and in order to reduce the Infirmary indebtedness opportunity was taken of the current favourable stock market prices to realise the Infirmary's General Fund investments. This decision to part with the savings of past years was taken with much reluctance but it was felt that the consequences of the past six unfortunate years should be squarely faced and that the Bank borrowing must be redeemed. In consequence of these transactions the Bank overdraft at 31st December, 1944, was reduced to £19,944.

DEVELOPMENT FUND.

During the year the House Committee resolved to create a Development Fund available for use when it is possible to carry out improvements and extensions at the Infirmary; this Development Fund to receive any monies allocated to it from the House Committee or from other sources. To begin the Fund an amount of £100,000 was transferred from the Emergency Medical Services Suspense Account and £25,000 from the Legacies Reserve Account.

During the year the Northern Sportsmen's Committee very kindly promoted a number of efforts in aid of the Royal Victoria Infirmary. These efforts realised £3,682 and the Sportsmen expressed a wish that this money should be used to develop the Children's Department. £3,682 was therefore added to the Development Fund, together with an amount of £964, part of fees for their work at the Leazes Hospital which the Honorary Staff of the Infirmary had reserved for contingency expenses. These contingencies had not materialised and the Staff kindly donated the amount to the Infirmary.

The Development Fund with accumulated income from investments amounted in total to £129,902 at 31st December, 1944. This substantially replaces the General Reserve of £140,000 existing before 1939 and referred to above in connection with the Bank overdraft.

CONCLUSION.

The year 1944 has been a year of fundamental change in the finances of the Infirmary, a change very much for the good of the hospital.

With the assistance of legacies bequeathed to the Infirmary, and the Government Emergency Medical Service contributions it has been possible in a large degree to repair the damage during the war years caused by the failure of income to increase with expenditure. The Infirmary now again possesses funds freely available for development when the Government allows development plans to proceed.

Even more important, the current annual income has been almost brought into line with the expenditure required to provide the present services of the hospital. Only if this equilibrium is maintained during the coming difficult years can the work of the Infirmary proceed efficiently.

OBITUARY.

The House Committee record with profound regret the loss they have sustained by the death of the following:—

Sir James E. Woods, J.P., who died at his London residence, at the age of 94. He was a Vice-President and an Honorary Life Governor of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and succeeded his father, John Anthony Woods, as Honorary Treasurer. Sir James Woods rendered most valuable service in this capacity and also as a member of the House Committee. In 1908 he was High Sheriff of Northumberland and for a number of years was closely associated with the affairs of the County.

Mr. Charles Irwin, J.P., who died at his country residence at Alston, at the age of 87 years. Mr. Irwin was a member of the House Committee and various Sub-Committees from the year 1901 to 1940. He took a very keen and active interest in the work of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and was from 1901 to 1906 a member of the Building Committee and also the Works Committee. From 1903 to 1912 he was Vice-Chairman of the Subscriptions Committee and Chairman from 1913 to 1918. He was also Chairman of the Wages Committee from 1917 to 1920 and Chairman of the Massage Committee from 1921 to 1940. Mr. Irwin was one of the best known figures in the North-East Coal Trade and in the public life of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne.

Mr. J. Walker, who represented Gateshead District on the House Committee from the year 1914 to 1943, when he resigned owing to ill-health. Mr. Walker was appointed an Honorary Life Governor in 1918 for special services rendered to the Royal Victoria Infirmary. He was a member of many Sub-Committees and was Chairman of the Entertainments Committee from 1923 until his retirement from the House Committee. He was also Vice-Chairman of the Patients Admission Committee during the years 1933 to 1941 and Chairman 1941 to 1943. Mr. Walker was an ardent worker for the Royal Victoria Infirmary and spared no effort to further its welfare.

Mr. Philip Wilson, who served the Royal Victoria Infirmary Infirmary as Junior Assistant Technician and who met his death in tragic circumstances through the result of a motor accident whilst returning from Shotley Bridge Emergency Hospital.

REPORT OF SUBSCRIPTIONS COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR 1944.

The total subscribed income collected in 1944 was £160,181 9s. 6d., an increase of £45,471 18s. 1d. on the amount collected in 1943. Contributions from all sources have materially increased. The increase from workmen is the largest in amount but there has been a proportionate increase in the contributions raised by the very numerous voluntary workers for the Royal Victoria Infirmary. Firms and Personal Subscribers have also contributed more.

The increase of £34,089 given by workmen subscribers is remarkable and the response of the workmen to the appeal for subscriptions on the basis of a minimum of 3d. per head per week direct to this hospital, together with an increase of £11,382 in other subscriptions, has undoubtedly arrested the decline of the Hospital's finances, a decline which if it had continued would soon have forced the Royal Victoria Infirmary into a state of financial bankruptcy.

It has been difficult to appreciate that such a danger should have been possible at a time when the level of employment and wages in the North-East are higher than they have been for many years.

The Subscriptions Committee are very appreciative of the liberal support given to the Infirmary during 1944, especially by the workmen, and extend sincere thanks on behalf of the Infirmary to all contributors for their generous financial support and to all the very many voluntary workers for the valuable help they have given in making collections and organising efforts in aid of the hospital.

Almost 80 per cent. of present workmen subscribers are now contributing on a basis of 3d. or 4d. per week direct to the Infirmary. Many of the remainder have increased their rate of contributions but have not yet increased to 3d. A small number have refused any increase; most of these are small groups situate outside the immediate area of the Infirmary. There are, however, a few large groups in and around Newcastle and Gateshead who have not increased to the threepenny minimum. Efforts are being continued to persuade all workmen to contribute on an equal basis.

It cannot be too strongly emphasised that anyone resident in the North-East region not making an adequate contribution direct to the Royal Victoria Infirmary is withholding his or her share of the money necessary to maintain and develop the Infirmary as the key hospital of the region, with the largest volume of routine work of any local hospital and responsible for the duties of a university teaching hospital:—

- (a) to raise the standards of hospital practice in the treatment of the sick;
- (b) to raise the standards of medical education;
- (c) to provide full facilities for medical research; and
- (d) to provide for the training of specialists.

The Finance Committee's estimate of the funds required to maintain the hospital, to which reference is made in the report of the Finance Committee, makes it essential for the Infirmary to receive a further large increase in subscribed income in 1945.

The Subscriptions Committee are actively continuing their efforts to persuade all workmen to contribute on the uniform basis of subscription; to enrol additional groups of workmen contributors; to enlist more personal subscribers; to add to the number of firms subscribing and to the amount of their subscriptions; and to strengthen and enlarge the work of voluntary committees in aid of the Royal Victoria Infirmary throughout the region served by the hospital.

The Subscriptions Committee are convinced that their inability to collect an adequate subscribed income in the past has arisen mainly from a failure fully and adequately to explain the Infirmary's work, policy and functions to the general public and that this year's increase in subscribed income is in a large part due to the better understanding which has been developed in the public during the year.

The people of the North-East expect the Infirmary to be responsible for vital and essential work and development. £230,000 was spent on this service in 1944 and the comparable expenditure in 1945 is estimated at £260,000. The expenditure of the Infirmary on appeals work and collection of subscribed income in 1942 was less than £500; an extended appeals organisation in 1944 cost £1,885, little more than 1 per cent. of the income collected.

The Subscriptions Committee are convinced that an appeals organisation on a more extensive and understanding basis is urgently required to explain the Infirmary's work and needs; to co-ordinate the work of the voluntary supporters of the Royal Victoria Infirmary throughout the Infirmary's region of influence; and to stimulate the will of the public to enlarge and maintain their support at the level which will be necessary to maintain and develop the work of the hospital.

The Subscriptions Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary are inflexible in their determination that the work of the Infirmary shall not be impeded by a lack of subscribed income.

Ward 14.—The "Armstrong" Ward.—This tablet is to commemorate the gift of £100,000 by the Rt. Hon. Ward 20.—THE "INNES-HOPKINS MEMORIAL" WARD. This ward is named "Innes-Hopkins Memorial" Ward to perpetuate the memory of Charles and Castel, the two sons of Col. C. H. Innes Hopkins, who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-1918.

LEAZES HOSPITAL (PAY-BED SECTION).

Pavilion 1.—The Bewick Wing.—This Wing was named "The Bewick Wing" to commemorate the gift of £17,226 15s. ld., given in memory of the late Thomas John Bewick and John Wm. Bewick, formerly Catholic Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, both of whom were for many years closely associated with the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. In the Bewick Wing are the Stirling Newall and the Hannah Ochiltree Wards. The Stirling Newall Ward is so named to commemorate the gift of £10,000 given by the late F. Stirling Newall to the Special Appeal Fund for building extensions, and the Hannah Ochiltree Ward to commemorate the gift of £6,000 given by the executors of the late Hannah Ochiltree to the Orthopædic Building Fund.

PAVILION 2.—THE SHIPLEY WING.—This Wing was named the Shipley Wing in memory of the late J. A. D. Shipley, who left under his will the sum of £24,604 to the general funds of the Infirmary. In the Shipley Wing is the Watson Ward for children, so named to commemorate the gift of £5,000 left to the Infirmary under the will of the late William Watson "for the purpose of endowing and maintaining a Ward for children, to be named after myself and my wife, Emmeline, and to the memory of her."
