



Annual Report for 1941.

The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting the 117th Annual Report to the Governors.

It is a matter of very great thankfulness to the Board that they have been able to carry on their work during the past twelve months with comparatively little interruption or restriction, and that the City of Bradford has been spared the terrible experiences which have befallen other cities in Great Britain.

The restrictions upon the use of the Infirmary have been relaxed in some small degree, but it is still impossible to use the whole of the accommodation available in peacetime. In spite of this, the number of patients admitted to the Infirmary during the year is greater than ever before, and actually has passed the previous record which was set up in 1939.

In order to free still further the available beds for civilian patients, the nurses' classroom has been converted into a resuscitation ward which stands ready at all hours of the day and night to receive patients who may be in a badly-shocked condition owing to war injuries. The provision of this ward enables the percentage of emergency beds retained in the other wards to be reduced. A temporary classroom has been provided in the Medical Society's Room.

The Infirmary, in common with most other undertakings, has suffered from the shortage of labour caused by the calling-up and the demands of munition works. This has necessitated in many cases harder work and longer hours on the part of the remaining staff, but the Board are glad to say that up to the present it has not been necessary to curtail the facilities for the treatment of patients in any material degree.

Patients treated.

As might be anticipated, the pressure on the beds of the Infirmary in all sections has materially increased, and whereas there is no evidence to suggest that the public health has deteriorated, there are many circumstances in an industrial area such as this which tend to increase the demands on hospital services. The actual figures of patients admitted and treated in the Infirmary (including the Duke of York Home and the Radium Department) are as follows:—

In spite of all efforts to reduce it there is a waiting list of some hundreds for admission, but it should not be assumed, therefore, that any emergency case has to be refused admission or that any very considerable hardship is caused to patients. As approximately 150 patients are admitted to the Infirmary every week, a waiting list of 300 represents merely a fortnight's delay, and the waiting list is kept constantly under review so that the more serious cases are admitted first. It will happen, therefore, that occasionally a patient with some comparatively trivial condition may have to wait several weeks, but, on the other hand, patients requiring immediate treatment can be admitted without a moment's delay.

Finance.

Twelve months ago, the Board in its Annual Report referred to the great anxiety with which the members regarded the financial prospects of the Infirmary during another year of war. It is with the very greatest pleasure they record that those fears were not substantiated, and, owing to the magnificent support given to the Infirmary by all classes of the community, the Infirmary finished the year 1941 in a happier financial position than it started. This truly remarkable result is due to several factors, but it is with gratitude that the Board record this evidence of the regard which the citizens of Bradford have for their leading voluntary institution.

The financial statistics are dealt with in detail in an addendum to this Report by Mr. Allan Welch, Chairman of the Finance Committee, and the Board would take this opportunity of expressing to Mr. Welch and his colleagues on the Finance Committee their grateful thanks for the care and diligence with which they have supervised the financial affairs of the Infirmary. It will be noted that not only has the income of the Infirmary reached a higher

level than ever before, but that the expenditure on maintenance, in spite of rising prices and increased work, shows but a comparatively small increase over last year, and is, in fact, considerably less than the budget figure which was adopted by the Board at the commencement of the year.

At this point the Board would refer to the great work performed by the Bradford and District Hospital Fund (Incorporated). By a progressive and enlightened policy, the Executive Committee of the Fund have enlisted the goodwill of the workpeople of the city to a greater extent every year, and a very substantial proportion of the cost of maintaining the voluntary hospitals is now contributed directly by the workpeople. The appeal of the Fund for an increased contribution of 3d. per week received an enthusiastic response, and undoubtedly this fact contributed very materially to the happier financial position of the Infirmary.

The increased support of the workers gave the Board of the Infirmary a very good reason for approaching employers of labour with the request that they would follow this good example, and it is with gratitude the Board report that their appeal met with an equally enthusiastic response from the employers. The amount received in increased annual subscriptions is considerable for the year 1941, but the full effect of these increases will not be felt until the end of 1942.

Improvements and Extensions.

The restrictions upon supplies and the need for the concentration of all available labour in the war effort has prevented the carrying out of any extensions or improvements upon a large scale. It has not been possible to recommence work on the much needed extension to the Nurses' Home, and the Board fear that this will have to be postponed until after the war. The Trustees of the Bradford Regional Radium Institute are proceeding with the completion of this building which is being erected within the Infirmary grounds, and it is hoped that in spite of war conditions the Institute may be at least partly opened in the near future. The need for the treatment of sufferers from cancer still remains very urgent, and the completion of the new Institute would provide more beds for this purpose, and at the same time free other beds in the present Infirmary buildings for other urgent cases.

The most striking addition to the Infirmary services during the year has been the erection of a Gas Decontamination Station for stretcher cases on top of the X-Ray Department. This unit has been skilfully designed by the City Architect in conjunction with the Ministry of Health, and provides for the swift and efficient decontamination of gassed cases who may also be suffering from other serious wounds. The entrance to this department is entirely separate from the remainder of the Infirmary, but ensures that immediately after decontamination these patients can be quickly transferred to the resuscitation ward or operating theatre.

Reference has already been made to the provision of a resuscitation ward in the nurses' classroom. This ward, which is complete with its own kitchen, sterilizing arrangements, etc., is kept constantly ready with specially warmed beds, provision for administration of oxygen, blood transfusion, etc. It is very much to be hoped that neither of these additions will have to be used in earnest, but the Board feel that it will be a matter of reassurance to the public of Bradford to know that this provision has been made and is kept at all times ready for use at a moment's notice.

Appointment of Almoner.

During the year 1941, for the first time, an Almoner, in the person of Miss K. M. Pierce, has been added to the Staff. The Board feel sure that this appointment will be for the good of the patients in enabling them to obtain the maximum benefit from their treatment at the Infirmary, and will also have the effect of reducing the risk of any abuse of the services provided.

Obituary.

The Infirmary has suffered a heavy blow during the year by the death of Dr. T. Jason Wood. Dr. Wood was first connected with the Infirmary in 1893, and there is no doubt that from that date until the time of his death the Bradford Royal Infirmary was one of the major interests of his life. After retiring from the active Staff he was an indefatigable attender at the meetings of the Board and its Committees, and took a very large part in the administration of the Institution. A man of definite views and of direct address, Dr. Wood was at the same time a most loyal colleague, and he will be very greatly missed.

The Honorary Staff also suffered another grievous loss in the death of Dr. G. E. MacVie, who was Anæsthetist to the Infirmary from 1924 to 1941.

Board.

The Board of Management have carried on during the year somewhat under difficulties of which the chief has been the very much regretted absence through illness of the Chairman, Mr. George E. Priestman. The Board feel that all subscribers and friends of the Hospital will share with them the pleasure with which they hear of Mr. Priestman's gradual recovery, and the hope that he may soon be able to take his accustomed place in their deliberations.

The Board have also very much regretted the absence of Mr. H. J. Dunnington for quite a considerable period owing to illness, and they are glad to know that he has made a very good recovery. This pleasure is tinged with regret that Mr. Dunnington has felt compelled, for health reasons, to tender his resignation from the Board of which he has been a member since 1932, and the Board would record their very grateful thanks for the good work which Mr. Dunnington has performed both on the Board and its various Committees.

The resignations have also been received with very great regret of Mr. J. W. G. Butterfield and Mr. J. E. Patefield, who had been valued members of the Board for a long period. The Board were also deprived of the services of Alderman Louis F. W. S. Smith, J.P., on his election as Lord Mayor, but they trust that this is merely a temporary absence and that they may welcome him back at the end of his year of office.

The Board would accord a welcome to the following new members, some of whom have already performed yeoman service for the Infirmary—Mr. H. J. Guild, Councillor Thomas Keighley, Mr. G. H. Longley, Mr. K. W. Parkinson and Mr. E. Gordon Whitley. They would also like to accord their good wishes to Mr. L. Bateman Briggs who is absent on Active Service.

Honorary Staff.

There have been no changes in the personnel of the Honorary Staff during the year as, in accordance with a request from the British Medical Association, all existing appointments are being extended for the period of the war, and no permanent new appointments are being made until after the termination of hostilities.

Mr. Peter McEwan, in addition to his duties as Medical Superintendent under the E.M.S., has undertaken the duties of Hospital Resuscitation Officer.

The Board very greatly regret that Dr. Franklyn has been incapacitated by illness for the whole of the year, during which time Dr. W. Garton has kindly carried on his duties at the Infirmary. It is hoped that Dr. Franklyn will be able to resume his attendance at the Infirmary early in 1942.

On behalf of the citizens of Bradford and the surrounding districts, the Board place on record their grateful thanks to the Honorary Staff for their good work during the year.

Ladies' Committee, Ladies' Linen League and Samaritan Society.

The Annual Report of the Infirmary would not be complete without a reference to the good work of the Ladies' Committee, the Ladies' Linen League, and the Samaritan Society, and cordial thanks are due to them for their generous help during the past year.

Named Beds and Cots.

The following beds have been named in the Infirmary during the year:—

The "Elsie Jenkinson" Bed and the "Nellie Jenkinson" Bed, named by a bequest of £2,000 by the late Mr. Arthur Jenkinson.

The "Dr. Jason Wood" Bed, named by a donation of £1,000 by Mrs. T. Jason Wood.

The list of named beds and cots has been omitted from the Report this year, but this is merely a temporary measure in view of the need for national economy, and the publication of the list will be resumed as soon as possible after the war.

Gifts.

The year 1941 has been marked by a succession of most valuable gifts of equipment which have been generously given by various donors to meet needs which have become evident during the year. If this quipment had been purchased by the Infirmary the total cost would have been something in the neighbourhood of £2,000. The Board are most grateful to these donors, and would assure them that in every case a very real need has been met and the usefulness of the Infirmary greatly enhanced.

Mention should also be made of the efforts of the Girl Guides and Boy Scouts in the area who made a collection of rose hips on behalf of the Infirmary in order to provide the necessary supplies of Vitamin C for those patients requiring it. This collection was extremely successful, so much so, in fact, that it was only with the greatest difficulty that the hospital staff were able to cope with the quantity of rose hips which poured into the Infirmary. Sufficient rose hip syrup has been made to last throughout the winter.

Volunteers and Staff.

One very pleasant feature of the war period has been the willing and arduous service performed for the Infirmary by various bodies of volunteers. Particular thanks are due to the members of the British Legion who have acted as a night emergency squad ever since the beginning of the war; to the auxiliary nurses who have given yeoman service in the wards; and to the members of the Home Guard who have manned the observation post at the Infirmary and prevented a good deal of unnecessary disturbance to the staff during air-raid alarms.

The working of the National Service Acts has depleted the Infirmary staffs in many ways, and the shortage of labour has made it very difficult to replace those who have been called-up or who have left. The Board would express to all members of the staff their thanks for the self-sacrifice with which they have met the difficult circumstances of the past year, and for the good work which they have carried out during the year.

In conclusion.

Once again the Board would like to place on record their grateful thanks for the splendid services rendered to the Infirmary by their many good friends. It is difficult to find words to express adequately appreciation of all the help which has been given, but the Board would like to say to all that their work has been of the greatest possible value to the Infirmary. The number of those who have helped in one way or another is far too large for individual mention, but those whose names do not figure here will know that their work is duly appreciated. Amongst those whose names might be mentioned are the Press, especially the "Yorkshire Observer," "Bradford Telegraph & Argus" and the "Yorkshire Post"; the Clergy and Visitors; the Executive Committee and members of the Bradford and District Hospital Fund (Inc.); the Auditors, Messrs. Bovce. Welch & Co. Ltd.; the Solicitor, Mr. T. Hubert Firth; and many others.

In this time of war the difficulties which beset individuals or institutions become of minor importance as compared with the national need, but the Board feel that the best work they can do for the Nation in these times of stress is to make available as far as possible the normal services of the Infirmary to the sick and disabled. When the services of every man and woman are of such importance to the Nation, the Infirmary cannot do better than restore as many as possible to full health and strength in as short a time as possible. By the mercy of Providence this Infirmary has been spared up to now the trials which have beset hospitals in other less fortunate parts of the country, and the Board would appeal to all those living in the district to help by their gifts this good work to continue.

In January, 1941, the Chairman of the Board made a special appeal to firms and business houses for increased financial support. It was largely due to this appeal and to amounts received for the purchase of special instruments as referred to in the Chairman's Report that there is an increase of £980 in the Subscriptions and Donations. During the year the Bradford Hospital and Convalescent Fund Committee decided to increase the weekly contributions from 2d. to 3d. Even though this increase has not been in operation for a full year, it has resulted in an increased contribution to the Infirmary of £7,455.

The satisfactory result for the year is largely due to the increased income from the Bradford Hospital and Convalescent Fund, and the Board wish to express their sincere thanks to the Executive Committee, Officers, Helpers and Contributories to the Fund for the magnificent result of their efforts.

The amount received in respect of Emergency Hospital Service for the year to 31st December, 1941, was £5,115. Whilst no settlement has yet been reached as to the final amount payable for the year, it is certain that the amount which will eventually be received for such service will be in excess of the amount for which credit has been taken.

The practice in previous years has been to credit the sum received to a Suspense Account pending settlement. As, however, the method of payment is now more stabilised the Board have decided that in future the Income and Expenditure Account should be credited with the amount received for services rendered during that particular year.

The increased expenditure under the heading of Domestic is largely accounted for by the increased cost of Laundry and Electricity. The expenditure on Electric Current includes a sum of £445 due to the omission of a reserve in 1940 in respect of the liability for the quarter to 31st December, 1940.

The increased charge for Miscellaneous is mainly accounted for by a charge of £1,076 under the heading of Insurance of Buildings and Equipment in respect of War Damage Contribution.

Included in the charge of £2,781 for Renewals and Repairs of Buildings and Plant is a provision of £1,000 for Deferred Repairs. Even including such provision, the expenditure on Repairs and Renewals and Air Raid Precautions shows a decrease of £760 as compared with the expenditure in 1940.

The increased contribution to the Bradford Auxiliary Hospital is due to the increased number of Infirmary patients treated at the Auxiliary Hospital.

Balance Sheet.

New Infirmary Fund.

The Board estimate that a sum of approximately £50,000 is still required to complete the New Infirmary and the Nurses' Home. Whilst they feel that the present time is not an opportune one to make a special appeal, they would be grateful for donations in order to enable them to meet this expenditure.

General Fund.

Attention is drawn to the improved position of the General Fund, for whereas the Capital Fund at 31st December, 1940, amounted to £12,768, the Fund now stands at £39,358—an increase of £26,590. Of this increase, £13,261 relates to transactions up to 31st December, 1940. Details are clearly set out on the face of the Accounts.

The additional amount due of £5,538 in respect of the Emergency Hospital Service has not at the date of the issue of this Report been received; the amount has been agreed with the Ministry of Health.

Reference has previously been made to the sum of £13,023 received during the year from Free Legacies which has so materially assisted the finances of the Infirmary. The Board again express their pleasure in being able to record that, after providing £1,000 for deferred repairs, the income for the year on the General Fund has exceeded the expenditure by £305.

In conclusion, the Board wish to place on record their appreciation of the financial assistance given by all subscribers and donors, and trust that this valuable support will long be continued so as to maintain, improve and increase the existing services.

Lady Superintendent's Report.

The Training School for Nurses.

In answer to enquiries during 1941, 204 application forms were sent to prospective candidates. Of these, 98 were returned and 74 candidates were accepted for training, 14 for the shortened two years' course and 3 for the three years' course without preliminary training.

Of 47 candidates entering the Preliminary Training School during the year, 10 left during or after the trial period, leaving 37 to continue the three years' training.

32 candidates entered for the Preliminary State Examination, of whom 26 passed, six being referred for re-entry in Part I. 33 candidates completed three years' training. Of these, 31 passed; two being referred for reentry in one subject. 43 were successful in passing the Training School Examinations, one being referred for reentry in Medicine. Of these nurses, 10 accepted posts as Staff Nurses at the Infirmary. 11 nurses completed the two years' course and passed the Final State Examination; of these, four are remaining a third year as Staff Nurses to qualify for the Hospital Certificate.

The Gold Medal for 1941 has been awarded to Nurse Dorothy Clark, who gained 804 marks out of a possible 1,000. Bronze Medals have been awarded to Nurses Mildred C. Marshall and Mary W. Meek with 783 and 752 marks respectively. 21 nurses have been awarded the Hospital Certificate of Merit with an average of over 65% of the total available marks.

Qualified Staff.

There have been several changes in the qualified staff. Sister Cole left Ward 12 early in the year to be married—no appointment being made to fill the vacancy owing to the closing of the top floor wards. Sister Bucknell from Ward 10 and Sister Garland from the Preliminary Training School left to take up industrial nursing. Sister G. Jones, Junior Sister in the Basement Wards, was transferred to Ward 10, and Miss J. M. Abbott was appointed to the Preliminary Training School. Miss Langdon and Miss Galt left the Housekeeping Department—Miss Langdon to become Matron of the Ilkley Coronation Hospital, and Miss Galt

to take the post of Night Sister there. Miss Scott Carmichael, after a three months' leave of absence, returned as Food Supervisor to take control of the food services in the Hospital and Duke of York Home, and Miss M. Mathers has been appointed Assistant Housekeeper and Dietitian in the Duke of York Home. Miss Whyte left the Diet Kitchen in April and Miss M. Taylor has been appointed Assistant Dietitian to supervise that Department, which has now been approved for the training of Dietetic Pupils.

Staff Nurses Hobson, Duell and Bird have left to join the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service, and Male Nurse Ambler has joined the Nursing Service of the Royal Air Force as a qualified nurse.

In the Massage Department, Miss M. Claridge, Miss A. L. Beale and Miss M. Johnstone have been appointed to replace Miss Munro, Miss Fletcher and Miss J. Thompson, who have resigned, and in the X-Ray Department Miss H. E. Fleming has been appointed to take the place of Miss D. R. Parker, who left to return to South Africa.

There have been 86 cases of reported sickness among the Nursing Staff during the year. Most of these consisted of upper respiratory tract infections and minor ailments.

Miss J. A. M. Sefton has been honourably mentioned in despatches for her services in Irak as a Sister in Princess Mary's Royal Air Force Nursing Service.

The generous voluntary work given by members of the Civil Nursing Reserve and other helpers in relief work during the summer holidays, and in the weekly blood transfusion clinics has been much appreciated by the Nursing Staff. Several trained nurses and some former members of the Staff have given very helpful service in this way, and this work still continues.

Although there is now no longer a waiting list of candidates for training as Auxiliaries in the Civil Nursing Reserve in the Bradford area, at the request of the Regional Nursing Officer two courses of 14 days' intensive training have been given to 23 candidates for mobile service in the Reserve. This has been made possible by the willing co-operation of the Sister Tutor and Ward Sisters.

A request to the Ladies' Committee for the provision of new ward screen covers has met with a generous

response from a number of kind donors. Due to the indefatigable efforts of Mrs. Moulson, over £102 has been received up to the present, and as a result, seven wards have been equipped. Gifts for this purpose have been received from:—

We were very honoured and gratified by a visit from Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal when she came to distribute the Medals and Certificates to the successful candidates in March. The Nurses and patients were all charmed by her gracious manner and obvious interest in all she saw when she was later taken round the Hospital to see some of the Wards, Theatres, and Emergency Departments.

We were also honoured in November by a visit from Miss Florence Horsbrugh, Parliamentary Secretary to the Ministry of Health, who came with representatives of the Ministry on a tour of inspection of the Emergency Medical and Nursing Services. They expressed great satisfaction with the emergency arrangements at the Bradford Royal Infirmary, and Miss Horsbrugh gave an interesting and stimulating address to the Nursing Staff.

A Christmas effort by the Nursing Staff on behalf of Mrs. Churchill's Russian Red Cross Fund resulted in a sum of £260 being raised within a month by means of a Shilling Trading Scheme and individual gifts from the Nursing, Massage and Domestic Staffs.

The increases in salary granted to the Nursing Staff in August have been much appreciated by all, and much satisfaction is expressed at the good conditions which they enjoy at the Bradford Royal Infirmary.

Ladies' Committee and Ladies' Linen League.

Report for 1941.

The Ladies' Committee of the Bradford Royal Infirmary have pleasure in presenting their Report for 1941.

While there is nothing of outstanding note to mention, their usual activities have continued in spite of the many other calls upon their time due to the war. Visiting in the Wards has gone on as usual—228 visits having been paid during the year. Those members who enrolled in the Civil Nursing Reserve have helped regularly with the Blood Transfusion Service, and from time to time other help to the Infirmary has been rendered in different ways.

It was found necessary to replenish some of the stocks of linen early in the year, naturally at a greatly increased price plus purchase tax. Unfortunately, subscriptions have decreased by £31/9/0 and the Committee appeal to subscribers to continue to support the Ladies' Linen League as generously as possible. Several of the Wards required new material for screen covers, and through the generosity of various friends material has been bought to equip seven wards.

The Committee suffered a severe loss by the death of Mrs. Farnish, but were very pleased to have Lady Hill once again as a member.

While thanking all those who have supported the Ladies' Linen League, the Committee express regret that owing to paper shortage the Report can only appear in leaflet form; the full list of subscribers can, however, be seen at the Infirmary.

Samaritan Society.

Report for 1941.

The Committee of the Samaritan Society have pleasure in submitting the 58th Annual Report, and are glad again to record a useful year. They thank their subscribers for their continued support, and hope they may again rely on it for the future.

During the year, needy patients have been helped in various ways, principally by the provision of surgical appliances or of part of the cost of these, as in many cases the patient is able and anxious to provide some share of these expenses. Artificial limbs have been provided for other patients, and in more than one case the supply of a limb has rendered the recipient able to return to employment and made him once more self-supporting. Dentures have been supplied, and the usual food allowances have been made to discharged and needy patients.

Owing to the closing of so many Convalescent Homes there has not been as much scope for the Society's Convalescent Fund, but whenever possible patients who needed this kind of help have been sent to the Bradford Auxiliary Hospital or helped in their own homes. Clothing has also been provided where necessary. An allowance was made in one case for the provision of a foster-mother for an infant whose mother was an in-patient of the Infirmary.

The Charles Priestley Fund for tuberculous patients has been used during the year for three cases. One was for an artificial leg, one a food allowance case, and the third was that of a young man whose doctor was anxious that he should enter the Papworth Village Settlement for treatment. The Samaritan Society undertook the financial responsibility for this, but unfortunately, owing to the pressure of cases due to the war, the patient could not be admitted there for some time and he died during December. A food allowance was made to him for some months. The patient who was for so long in Switzerland and who returned from there last year, is so greatly improved in health that he is now in full-time employment.

During the year, some changes have been made on the Committee, and several new members have been elected, including Mrs. A. Prescott, Mrs. H. Sharpe and Mrs. W. Singleton. A lady almoner (Miss K. Pierce) has been appointed by the Royal Infirmary, and she also has joined the Committee where her advice and help are greatly appreciated.

A legacy of £25 was left to the Society by Mr. H. K. Burnet, an old subscriber, and has been gratefully received. It was decided to add this sum to the Endowment Funds, and it was therefore invested and is now included in the Samaritan Fund.

The Library still continues to do its part in helping to make the patients as happy as possible whilst in the wards, and once more thanks must be given to Mrs. McEwan and her helpers, who, though fewer in number owing to war-work, are still as enthusiastic as ever. 4,236 books have been given out during the year.

Thanks have again to be given to the City Guild of Help for visiting and reporting on some of the cases; and to Messrs. Boyce, Welch & Co. for auditing the accounts.

Voluntary Blood Transfusion Service.

Report for 1941.

In 1941 the total number of donors who gave blood at the Bradford Royal Infirmary was 4,505. The comparative figure for 1940 was 265.

The explanation for this very large increase is that in 1941, under the Ministry of Health, a central depot, or "blood bank," was started in Leeds for the purpose of turning very large quantities of "whole" blood into forms more readily stored or transported for national use.

Our donors have reason to be proud of the fact that, not only did they provide for 235 transfusions at the B.R.I. and maintain our emergency plasma at the standard considered adequate, but also that they contributed 4,339 pints of blood for the use of areas which had suffered heavy air raid casualties, our forces abroad, and ships at sea.

As continuous demands are likely to be made on this service, the Infirmary has done its best to encourage the attendance of donors, by adding to the comfort of their visit, and by lessening still further any wastage of time.

That this has been appreciated is shown by the fact that by their voluntary contributions they have paid for all the extra instruments necessary for the larger numbers. In spite of this, the Infirmary has expended about £300 in rendering this national service.

The Committee is extremely grateful to the many Voluntary Workers who have relieved the already hard-pressed resident staff of much of this extra work. They quickly became skilful in their various tasks, have been regular and punctual in attendance, and are doing excellent work.

Radium therapy at this Centre was carried on throughout the whole of 1941 under difficult circumstances imposed by war conditions.

Shortage of beds and repeated changes in the technical staff were severe handicaps during the earlier months of the year, and with an increasing number of applications for treatment there was for some time an unusually long list of patients awaiting admission. By staggering the hours on duty of the technical staff and making increasing use of deep X-ray therapy some improvement was effected but no marked reduction in the waiting list was achieved until further beds were made available towards the end of the year.

The building of the New Radium Institute should be completed during 1942, and if the necessary equipment can be secured it will be possible to continue radiotherapy under more favourable conditions and at the same time release for general purposes beds in the Royal Infirmary and Duke of York Home now occupied by Radium department patients.

The Duke of York Home

DUCKWORTH LANE, BRADFORD.

(Under the Management of the Bradford Royal Infirmary). Telephone: Bradford 8840-1.

The Duke of York Home has been built to meet the needs of those members of the community who, when ill, do not wish to have treatment in the wards of a charitable hospital, but who cannot afford the charges of ordinary Nursing Homes. The site is about 600 feet above sea level, in one of the healthiest parts of Bradford.

The Home, which is equipped with all the most modern appliances for dealing with medical or surgical cases, contains accommodation for 70 patients, mostly in single rooms. No infectious, mental or normal maternity cases can be admitted.

Patients may be admitted after consultation with any member of the Honorary Medical Staffs of the three Voluntary Hospitals, and St. Luke's Hospital, in Bradford.

Medical Fees are entirely a matter to be arranged between the patient and the Physician or Surgeon.

CHARGES.

From five guineas upwards a week, according to accommodation. These charges include maintenance, nursing and dressings.

EXTRA CHARGES.

Special or extra nurses.

Massage treatment, stimulants and specific prescriptions.

A theatre fee of £1/1/0 will be charged to surgical patients who are in the Home for not more than one week.

The personal laundry of patients must be arranged and

paid for by the patients.

No responsibility for money or other valuables belonging to patients will be accepted unless handed in for custody, and an official receipt obtained. It is hoped that valuables will not be brought into the Home.

The visiting hours are 3-0 p.m. to 4-30 p.m., and 7-0 p.m. to 8-0 p.m. daily. Not more than two visitors can be admitted to the same patient at a time.

It is requested that no presents or gratuities be offered to any member of the nursing or domestic staffs, the acceptance of such being forbidden by the Rules.
