Those referred to the Special Departments should attend at the stated times. (N.B.—Medicine will not be supplied to Out-Patients.)

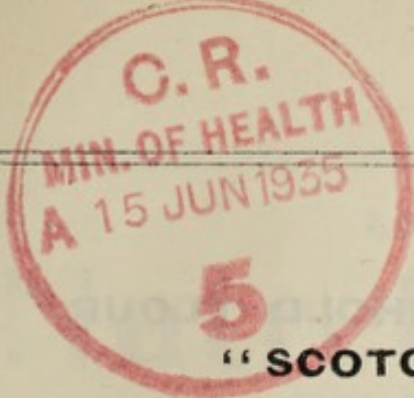

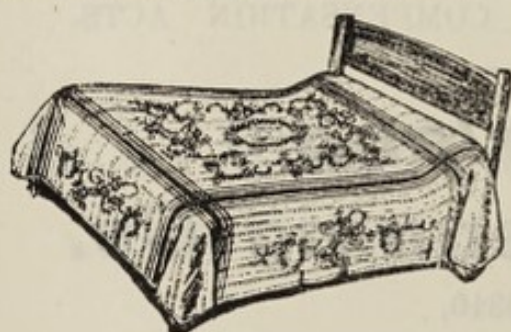

The notice convening the meeting having been read, the following resolutions were adopted:—

(1) Moved by the Chairman.

“That the Minutes of the last General Court of Governors be taken as read, and signed.”

(2) Moved by the Chairman.

“That the report of the Board of Management having been sent to each Governor be taken as read.”

The Chairman, in moving the adoption of the Report and Accounts, called the attention of the Governors to the increased work done in the Institutions during the past year, Mr. Storey said their capacity had

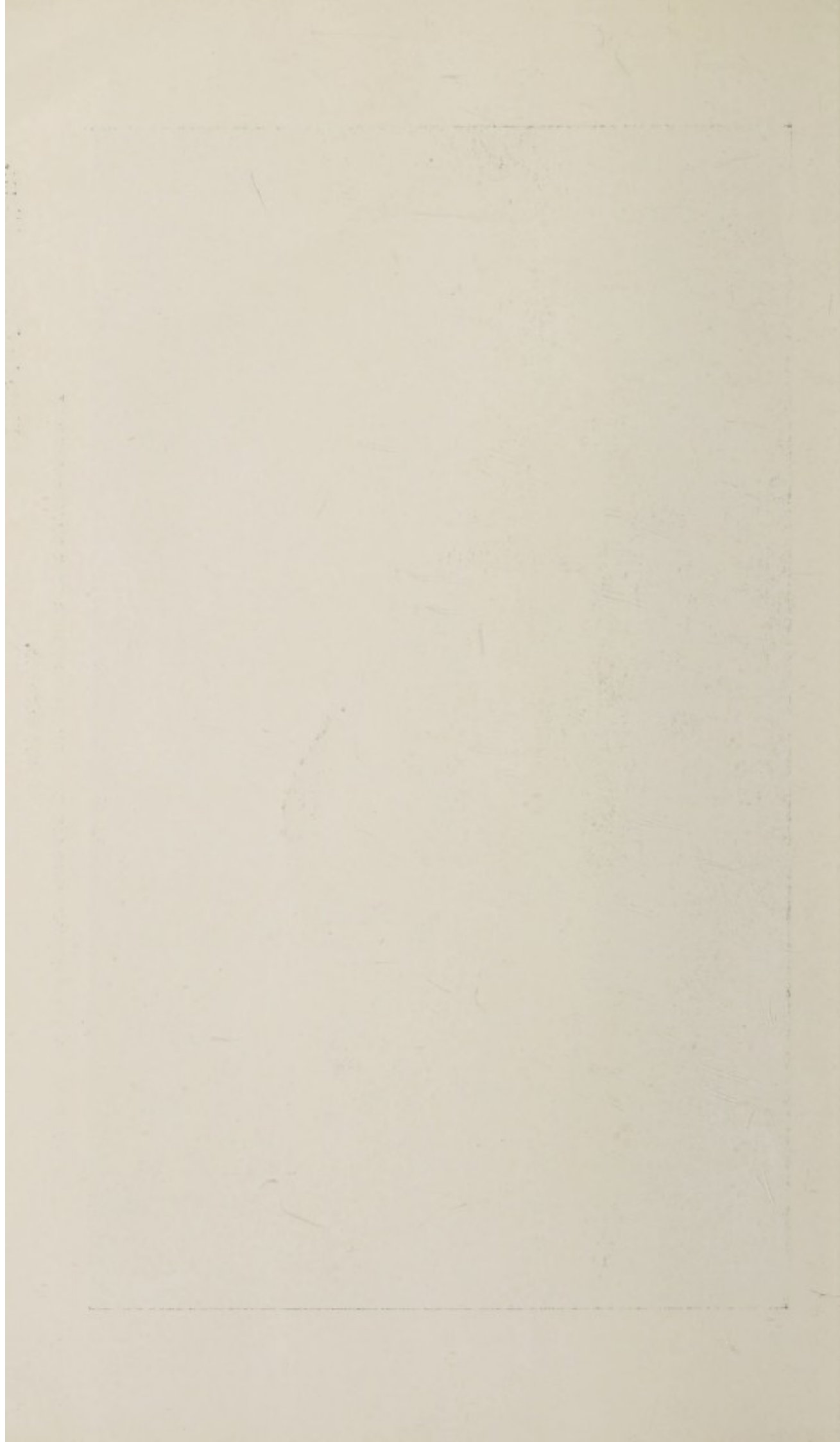




THE ROYAL INFIRMARY FLOOD-LIGHTED BY GAS DURING THE SILVER JUBILEE

been used to the full and yet they had an increasing waiting list. That showed there was work still for them to do, and they could only do it if they had the full support of the district which they served.

**HE THOUGHT THEY COULD CLAIM THAT THE FINANCIAL POSITION OF THE INFIRMARY WAS SOUNDER THAN IT WAS 12 MONTHS AGO, BUT EVEN THEN HE WAS NOT GOING TO SUGGEST IT WAS ALTOGETHER SATISFACTORY.**

Ordinary income showed an increase during the year of £1,665, whilst ordinary expenditure had decreased by £26, but, in spite of that increase in ordinary income, their deficit between ordinary income and ordinary expenditure was still £2,293, compared with £3,985 the previous year.

Although there was an improvement they were still faced with the position to which he had called attention on many occasions in the past, that their ordinary income was not sufficient to meet their ordinary expenditure, and that, if it were not for their extraordinary income it would be a poor look-out for the institutions, because they would not be able to maintain the services which they at present kept going.

Extraordinary income last year amounted to £4,295 against £5,308 in the previous year, and in addition they received for endowment £1,550.

#### **RAISING OF MONEY.**

The extraordinary income of £4,295 should have been available for development and extension, continued Mr. Storey.

**" I HAVE ALWAYS MAINTAINED," HE SAID, " AND WILL CONTINUE TO MAINTAIN THAT WE MUST REACH A POSITION WHERE OUR ORDINARY INCOME EQUALS OUR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE, AND OUR EXTRAORDINARY INCOME IS AVAILABLE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND EXTENSIONS AND FOR PUTTING SOMETHING TO RESERVE TO MEET SUCH PERIODS OF DEPRESSION AS WE ARE PASSING THROUGH AT THE PRESENT TIME.**

" But instead of that money being available for development we have had to use a large portion of it to meet our ordinary expenditure, and we have had to use the rest of it to pay off some of the debt which we owe to the bank."

Mr. Storey said he would like to urge the Finance Committee to take every possible opportunity of raising money.

" I would like to see a more active policy in raising money for the institution so that we may next year find our ordinary income balancing our ordinary expenditure, for there are many heads under which the amount collected by the Infirmary is not as big as the amount collected by other hospitals of our standing. I should like to see Sunderland Royal Infirmary compare favourably with every other hospital in the matter of raising funds.

#### **" DON'T FORGET 1924."**

" There is one item, though, where we do compare favourably with other hospitals, and I should like once again to congratulate the workmen's governors on an increase in workmen's subscriptions. Last year the workmen subscribed £16,645, an increase of £516, but even to them I would say 'Don't forget 1924, when we got £18,901 from workmen's subscriptions.'



"I know that more people were in work then than now, but as people get into work do let us see that they are all subscribing to this institution if they are using it. If that is the spirit, then I think we will gradually get back as trade improves to the figure of £18,901, and even surpass it."

Mr. Storey also thanked the Ladies' Guild for their splendid work, and also the Children's Hospital League, the Young People's Brick Scheme, the organisers of the successful Egg Week, and all other workers for the Infirmary funds.

Referring to the efforts of voluntary hospitals to secure a bigger return of what they spent on road accident cases, Mr. Storey said he was sorry to say they were unsuccessful in securing a concession from the Minister of Transport in last year's Road Traffic Act. They must admit, however, that under the Act of the previous year there had been some improvement in the position, and the deficit on the treatment of road accident cases had not been so great as in previous years.

#### **RECORD NUMBER.**

It was still serious, though, and they could rest assured that the British Hospitals Association and the King Edward Hospital Fund would raise the matter again at the first opportunity, because they felt that, although it might not perhaps be entirely fair to put the whole burden on the motorist, it was certainly not at all fair that it should be placed on the hospital.

Mr. Storey drew attention to the Infirmary's Insurance Scheme, under which for 30s. a year people of moderate means may insure for hospital treatment for themselves and their families.

During the past year they had had a record number of enrolments under the scheme, and he hoped the day was not far distant when they could increase the paying patients' accommodation, because he was perfectly sure that if that were done the insurance scheme could be greatly developed and be made a real success.

Mentioning the developments and extensions during the year, Mr. Storey referred to the opening of the new radiological department and the ear, nose and throat operating theatres, two departments which were absolutely up-to-date and a real acquisition to the Infirmary. They were grateful to all those who had made it possible for the hospital to obtain these extensions.

#### **SPLENDID WORK.**

In passing, Mr. Storey referred with regret to the retirement of Mr. W. H. Robertson from the position of Chairman of the Building Committee, and thanked him for the splendid work he had done since they started on their reconstruction scheme, launched in 1925.

**TURNING TO THE FUTURE, MR. STOREY SAID THAT A NEW OUT-PATIENTS' DEPARTMENT WAS A REAL NECESSITY, AND HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE IN THE NEAR FUTURE SOME GREAT EFFORT TO ENABLE THEM TO PROCEED WITH THAT EXTENSION.**

A nurses' home might not be so urgent, but it was a need which they ought to keep in mind. It was certainly very desirable that the hospital should have a proper nurses' home.

"Then, too," added Mr. Storey, "I have not given up hope that the day will come when we will be able to duplicate the Princess Mary



wing. It is perhaps a long way off, but there is no harm in keeping it in mind, and it is something I feel must come before many years have passed.

"Increased accommodation for paying patients is one of the things I consider we ought to proceed with before very long, but I want to make it quite clear that I do not want paying patients' accommodation provided by money which might be given for the development of the infirmary.

#### **" COULD BE DONE."**

"Personally, I think it would be quite possible to raise the money on a strictly business basis—to borrow it—and I would like to see an effort made in that direction, so that we could borrow the money to build, as we have planned, two new floors above the administration block, which would be reserved entirely for paying patients.

"I believe it could be done as a business proposition, and that the increased income which would result would enable us to pay the interest on the money and repay the money borrowed over a term of years.

It was only by taking such measures as these, emphasised Mr. Storey, measures for maintaining the efficiency of the hospital at a very high standard, that they would be able to maintain the position of the voluntary hospitals as a vital link in any co-ordinated system of hospital treatment for the community.

It was not only in the realm of buildings and equipment that they must keep themselves thoroughly up-to-date and efficient, but they must see to it that they had the best possible staff available for the patients treated at the hospital.

#### **STAFFING QUESTION.**

##### **POSITION CAUSED BY RETIREMENTS.**

"During the next 12 months or so," continued Mr. Storey, "we are going to be faced with the retirement of some members of our surgical staff who have rendered splendid service to the institution. We will all very much regret when the time comes for them to leave us, but I do think that, knowing we will be faced with these retirements under the rules, we ought to consider very seriously the staffing of the hospital when there are vacancies to be filled.

**" I THINK THE TIME IS RIPE WHEN AN INQUIRY SHOULD BE SET ON FOOT INTO THE WHOLE QUESTION OF THE STAFFING OF THIS HOSPITAL. THERE ARE MANY PROBLEMS—WHETHER, FOR INSTANCE, SUCH A HOSPITAL SHOULD HAVE AN ORTHOPÆDIC SURGEON, AND WHETHER WE SHOULD BE ABLE TO MAKE AVAILABLE TO PATIENTS HERE SPECIALIST SERVICES WHICH PERHAPS IT WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE TO MAINTAIN IN THE TOWN BUT ARE AVAILABLE IN THE DISTRICT AND MIGHT BE BROUGHT INTO SOME CO-ORDINATED SYSTEM.**

"Those and many such problems call for consideration, and I hope in the near future it will be possible for some step to be taken to make a thorough inquiry into the best possible means of staffing this hospital so that we can feel we are marching all the time in the right direction."



# DONE MARVELLOUSLY WELL.

Sir Walter Raine, supporting the adoption of the report, said that having regard to the unemployment still unfortunately prevailing in the district they had done marvellously well during the past year. He hoped, with Mr. Storey, that it would not be long before they were able to put all legacies aside for investment and for further development.

Mr. William Hall (Hetton Lyons), Chairman of the Workmen's Governors, also supported, and the report was unanimously adopted.

Messrs. F. O. Chapman, H. C. Coatsworth, J. Johnson and A. C. Middleton were elected life governors.

On the motion of the Chairman, the amended rules as submitted to each Governor, were adopted.

The Board of Management reported that in accordance with Rule 13 the following members retire:—Miss E. V. Laing, Messrs. S. Corder, A. H. Dickinson, J. P. Hall, J.P., T. C. Squance, A. F. Maling, C. On the motion of Dr. Paige Arnold, seconded by Mr. I. Jacobs Miss E. V. Laing, Messrs. S. Corder, J. P. Hall, T. C. Squance, A. F. Maling, R. Scott, Dr. H. Bruce Low, Mr. S. Raw, Mr. S. Ritson, Dr. Hamilton Ross, Dr. A. Ayre Smith and Dr. J. B. Waters were re-elected to the Board of Management, together with Messrs. S. P. Richardson, R. Baitey, R. Hope, G. Lowden, E. D. Mago and S. Spears to fill vacancies.

Messrs. Rawlings and Wilkinson were re-appointed auditors on the motion of Mr. J. T. Forster, seconded by Dr. A. A. M. Nicol; and on the proposition of Mr. D. R. Pinkney, seconded by Mr. J. Levy, the thanks of the Governors were given to the members of the medical and surgical staff of the three institutions—Royal Infirmary, Children's Hospital, and Heatherdene Home—for valued services rendered.

Sir Walter Raine, proposing a vote of thanks to Mr. Storey for his services in the chair and as Chairman of the Infirmary during the last six years, referred to Mr. Storey's decision to retire from the chair. The Board of Management, he said, had placed on record their appreciation of his services, and he was sure the Governors would wish to do the same. (Applause.)

Although he would cease to be Chairman Mr. Storey had assured them that he intended to take just as much interest in the institution.

Mr. Storey, replying, confirmed Sir Walter's statement that his retirement from the chair would not diminish in the slightest his interest in the Infirmary. He felt that the time had come when perhaps he could do better work as an ordinary member of the Board than as Chairman, and he would do all he could to forward the many things which he still wished to see done at the Infirmary. (Applause.)

# ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1934.

The Board of Management have pleasure in submitting the 140th Annual Report to the Governors. They record an increase in the number of patients who have benefited by the Medical, Surgical and Specialized services provided, which, despite being utilized to their utmost capacity, have proved inadequate to stem the increasing list of patients awaiting admission. It is gratifying to report a sounder financial position than in 1933 for the Ordinary Income has increased by £1,664 10s. 5d. and is accompanied by a further slight reduction in Ordinary Expenditure **but the latter has still exceeded the former by the sum of £2,292 17s. 11d.** A further reduction in expenditure cannot be anticipated if the present services are to be maintained and the Board therefore reiterate their annual appeal for further financial support to eliminate the above deficit which continues to be a source of anxiety and a bar to progress.

**INFIRMARY.****In-Patient Statistics.**

The number of patients treated during the year was 7,408, the daily average number of beds occupied being 243·54 and the average stay of each patient 11·99 days. The cost per patient was £3 17s. 8d. and the cost per occupied bed £118 2s. 10d. as against £4 0s. 3d. and £118 1s. 1d. in 1933.

**Out-Patient Statistics.**

The number of patients treated during the year was 21,036, the attendances totalling 96,616. The cost per out-patient was 43·23 pence and 9·41 pence per attendance.

**Finance.**

The Ordinary Income amounted to £32,246 15s. 0d., being an increase of £1,136 14s. 6d. on the previous year.

**Workmen's Contributions.**

The Income derived from this source amounted to £16,644 16s. 3d., being an increase of £515 10s. 7d. as compared with 1933. This increase is in a small measure a very welcome sign of a return to employment and the Board are hopeful that trade conditions will

continue to improve in order that the Institution's Income from this source may again reach or exceed the total of £18,900 11s. 2d. achieved in 1924. The Board continue to hope for a uniform contribution of 3d. per week from all workmen in the town and district, which would cover the cost of treatment for themselves and dependents—such a contribution would place the Hospitals on a sound financial basis and enable additional beds to be provided with the consequent reduction of the ever growing waiting lists.

**Investments.**

The following changes in Investments are recorded:—

- £1,000 3½% Conversion Loan transferred from General to Endowment Investments to represent the donation of £1,000 from the Ladies' Guild, the cash being held in General Funds as a temporary offset against overdraft.
- £130 5% Mortgage on land at Thornley (part of estate bequeathed to the Children's Hospital by the late Miss H. I. Harper).
- £5,000 Sunderland Corporation Loan, representing Mrs. Edwin Richardson's bequest, repaid to meet expenditure in connection with the equipment of the New Radiological Department.

**Expenditure.**

The Ordinary Expenditure for the year was £32,562 5s. 2d. as against £32,635 10s. 3d. in 1933, showing a reduction of £73 5s. 1d.

**Road Accidents.**

A sum of £303 1s. 6d. was recovered from Insurance Companies as against £138 2s. 3d. in 1933. This increase is to a small extent due to the amendments made in the Road Traffic Act which enables Hospitals to charge up to a maximum of £50 instead of £25 for In-patient treatment and also to make a charge for Out-patient services. There still continues to be a large deficit between the income derived from and cost of the services given to these unfortunate victims and it is hoped that additional legislation will be introduced as soon as practicable whereby the financial burden on the Hospitals will be removed.

**Ladies' Guild.**

The activities of the Captains and Members of the Guild continue unabated and it is a pleasure for the Board to again record their grateful thanks to this ardent body of workers for the welcome donation of £1,000 to endow their 27th bed, which is to be called "The Mrs. George Morgan Bed." The successful Annual Fete and Sale of Work was opened by the Hon. Mrs. Alington and raised the sum of £1,088 5s. 5d.—a truly remarkable achievement, and appreciation is recorded to all who helped or gave their support.

**Young People's Brick Scheme.**

Congratulations are due to Mrs. E. W. Bartram, O.B.E., and her indefatigable helpers for raising a further sum of £100 towards the maintenance of the "Brick Scheme Bed." This sum represents a great amount of labour in collecting pennies from the children of Sunderland and District who also deserve a word of praise for their efforts which have resulted in the sum of £576 being raised since 1929.

Total 111. Six of the above Nurses work at the Children's Hospital.

A class of Senior Nurses completed the Course of Theoretical Instruction.

19 Nurses completed training and gained Training School Certificates.



Lectures on Hygiene, Practical Nursing, Anatomy and Physiology, Dermatology, Medical and Surgical Nursing were given during the year.

34 Nurses presented themselves for the Preliminary State Examination and all were successful.

Final State Examination—20 entered—15 passed.

On October 23rd the Fifth Annual Re-Union was held. Lady Londonderry presented Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals, also Honours Certificates to the successful candidates.

### **Obituary.**

### **British Hospitals' Association.**

The Annual Meeting and Conference was held in London in June when a wide range of important subjects were surveyed, including such practical matters as building construction and Almoners' work, questions of policy on the co-operation between Voluntary and Municipal Hospital services, the function of the Cottage Hospital and the Out-Patient Department.

### **Egg Week.**

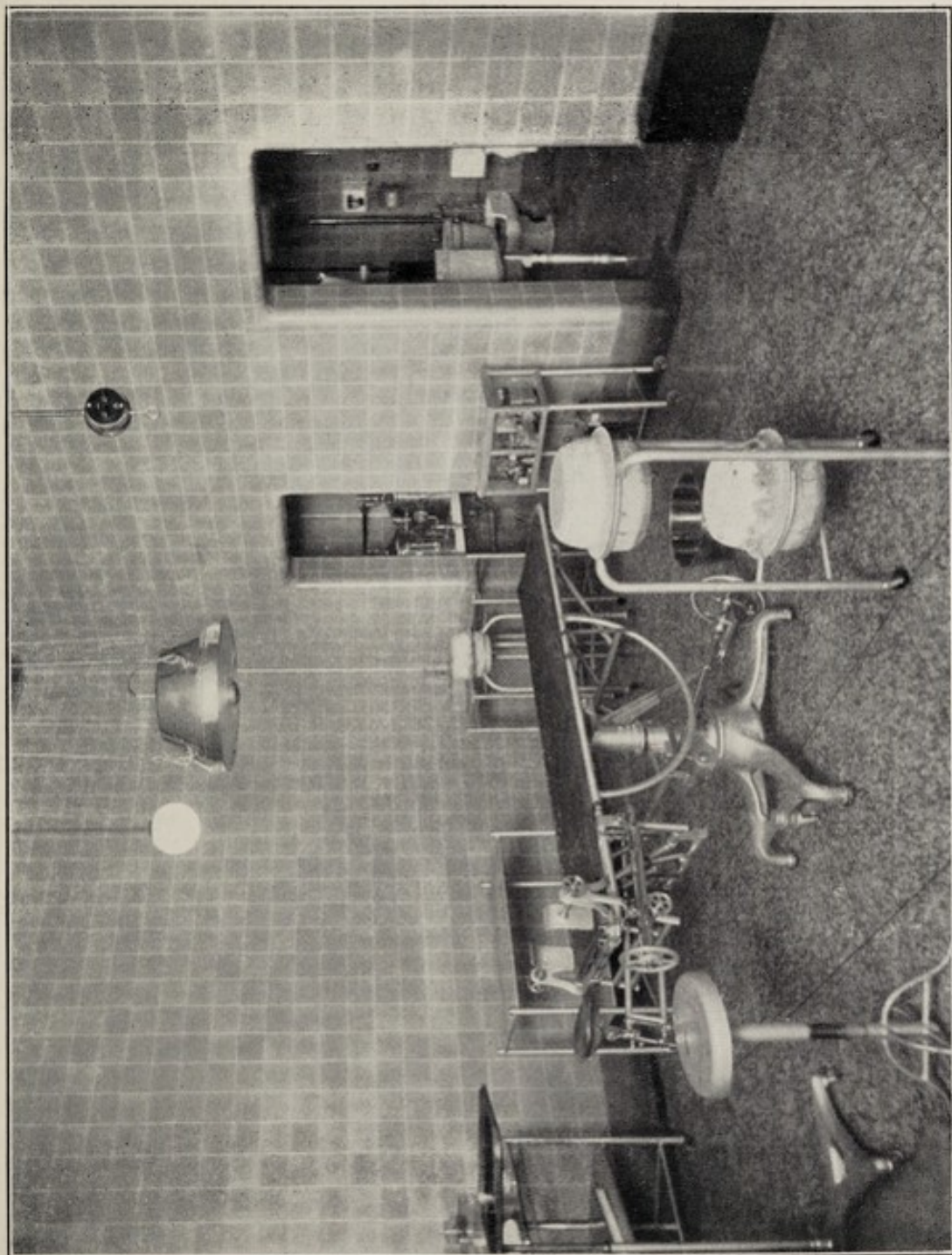
The splendid organising of Egg Week by Mrs. W. Grant Waugh and her Committee resulted in a record collection of 62,776 eggs and £40 in cash, and it was found possible to benefit an increased number of charitable organisations including the Heatherdene Convalescent Home. Out of the total collection the Infirmary and its allied Institutions received 40,500 eggs for which the Board record their grateful thanks.

### **Insurance Scheme (Private Wards).**

The advantages of this Scheme are becoming more widely known and a record number of enrolments has been received. It has been found possible to extend the scope of the Scheme to include under the premium paid by a widower any one of his children, over the age of 16 years, who is regularly acting as his housekeeper, and the benefits of this provision have been appreciated.

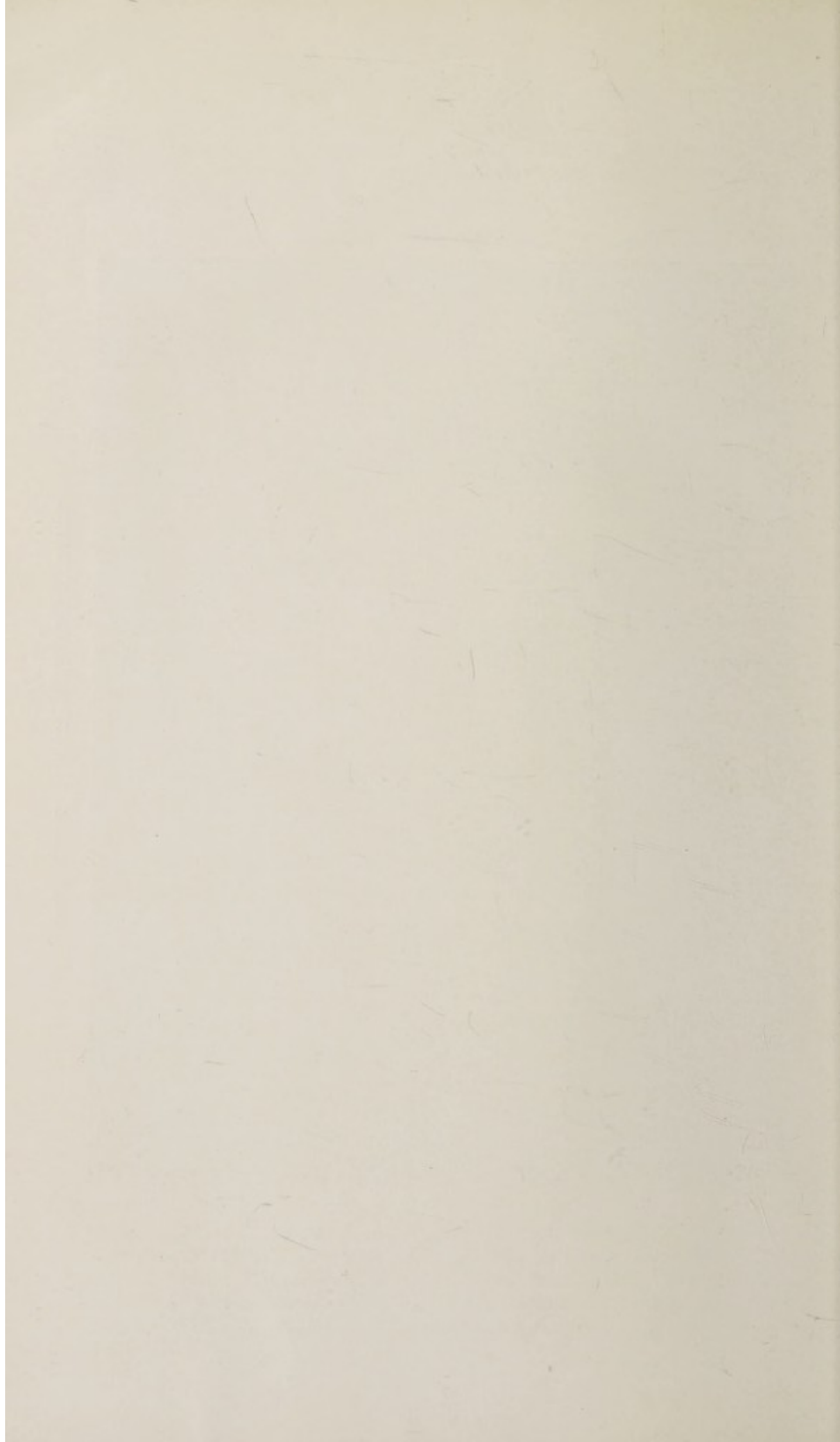
### **Additions and Extensions.**

Another step towards the re-construction of the Infirmary was taken in July when the new Radiological Department and Ear, Nose and Throat Operating Theatre were opened formally by T. S. Short, Esq., J.P., when Mrs. Stansfield Richardson set the apparatus working in the former extension. The Radiological Department has been named "The Greenwell Block" to commemorate the name of the late Mrs. Martha Greenwell from whose estate the necessary building costs were allocated. Reference was made in the last report

to the utilisation of the bequest of £5,000 from the estate of the late Mrs. Edwin Richardson for equipment purposes and this sum has enabled the Board to provide the first completely shockproof Radiological Department in the country. Mrs. Greenwell's estate also bore the cost of tiling the walls of the J. Y. Short Operating Theatre and equipping the Ear, Nose and Throat Operating Theatre and Urological Room with the most up-to-date apparatus.

In view of the increasing demand on the accommodation for Paying Patients the Board are considering extension of the present facilities but their proposals are not yet complete.

After serving as Chairman of the Building Committee for nine years, Mr. W. H. Robertson has resigned from the position and the Board take this opportunity of recording their sincere thanks for the able services rendered in connection with the re-construction and development of the Institution.

### **Building Fund.**

Sums received for the Building Fund during the year, including a further £297 6s. 5d. from the estate of the late Mr. C. Acklam and a bequest of £253 5s. 11d. from the late Mr. J. Nattrass, amount to £1,049 19s. 2d. and increase the total to £81,703 0s. 7d. No further contributions have been received for the Equipment Fund, which remains at £4,035 12s. 7d. The expenditure on Building and Equipment to December 31st, 1934, amounted to £86,558 8s. 9d., which includes outstanding accounts at December 31st amounting to £800 0s. 0d.

### **General.**

Mrs. R. Challoner, J.P., nominated by the Ladies' Guild, and Mrs. Frank Dawson have been elected members of the Board to fill the respective casual vacancies caused by the resignations of Mrs. C. R. Common and Mr. E. A. Cotton.

The resignation from the Board of the Rev. Preb. A. B. Wynne Willson, who has left the district, has been accepted with regret and thanks are tendered to him for arranging the Religious Services at the Infirmary during his term of office as Rector of Bishopwearmouth Church.

Owing to a continued increase in the number of patients requiring Orthopaedic treatment it was found necessary to increase the Staff in this Department, involving an additional annual expenditure of £156.

Arrangements have been made with the Borough Health Committee, for a trial period of 12 months, whereby X-Ray examinations of Tuberculous patients are carried out by the new equipment, and the Board welcome the co-operative spirit displayed in the co-ordination of these expensive services.



It has been found necessary to renew, at a cost of £60, the Wireless Receiving Set, which became ineffective in performance, and the new installation is greatly appreciated by the patients and staff.

### **Rules and Bye-Laws.**

A revision of the Institution's Rules was considered necessary and the Board have approved, for adoption at the Annual Court, the amendments as submitted to each Governor.

The Bye-Laws have also been revised and codified in accordance with the Rules.

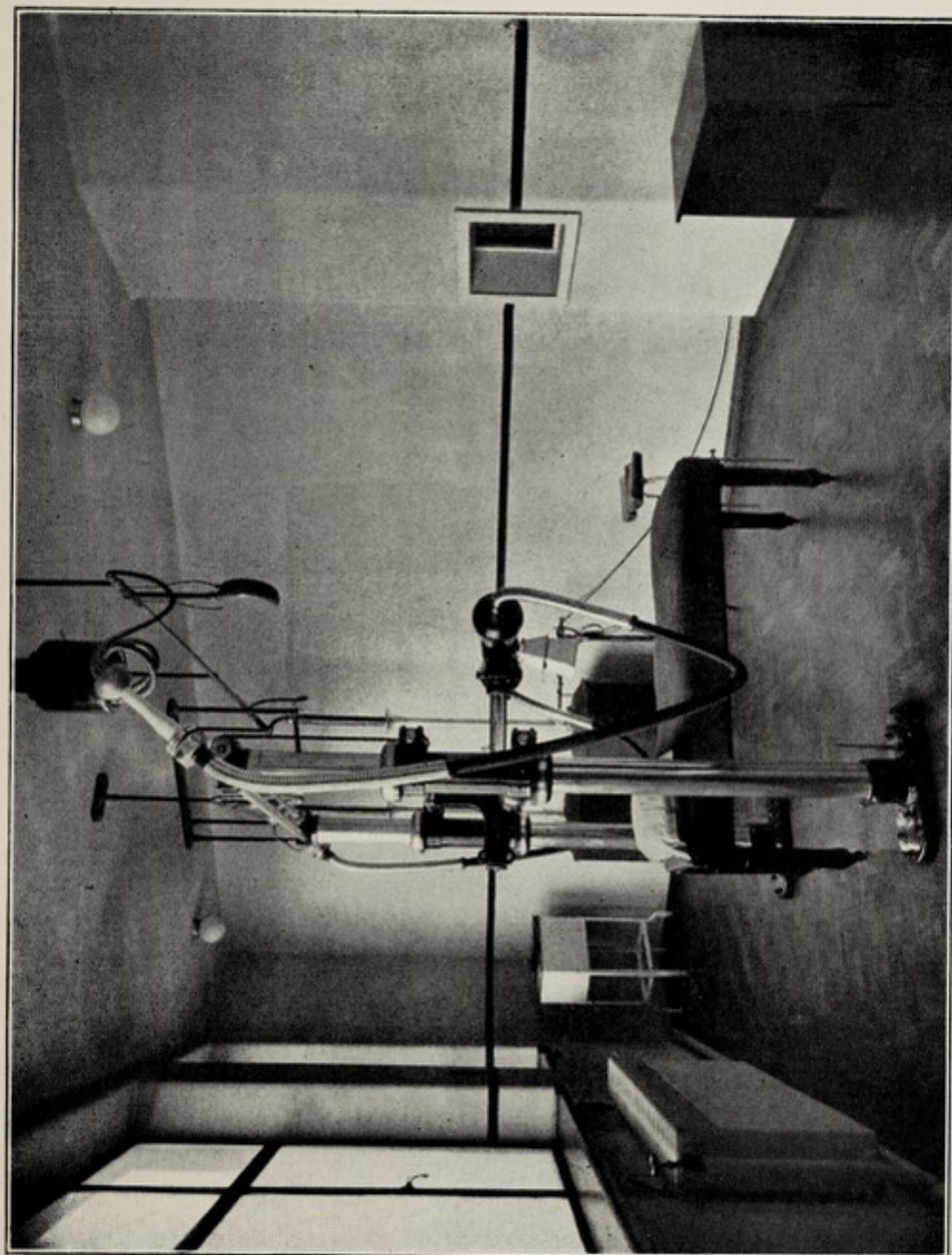

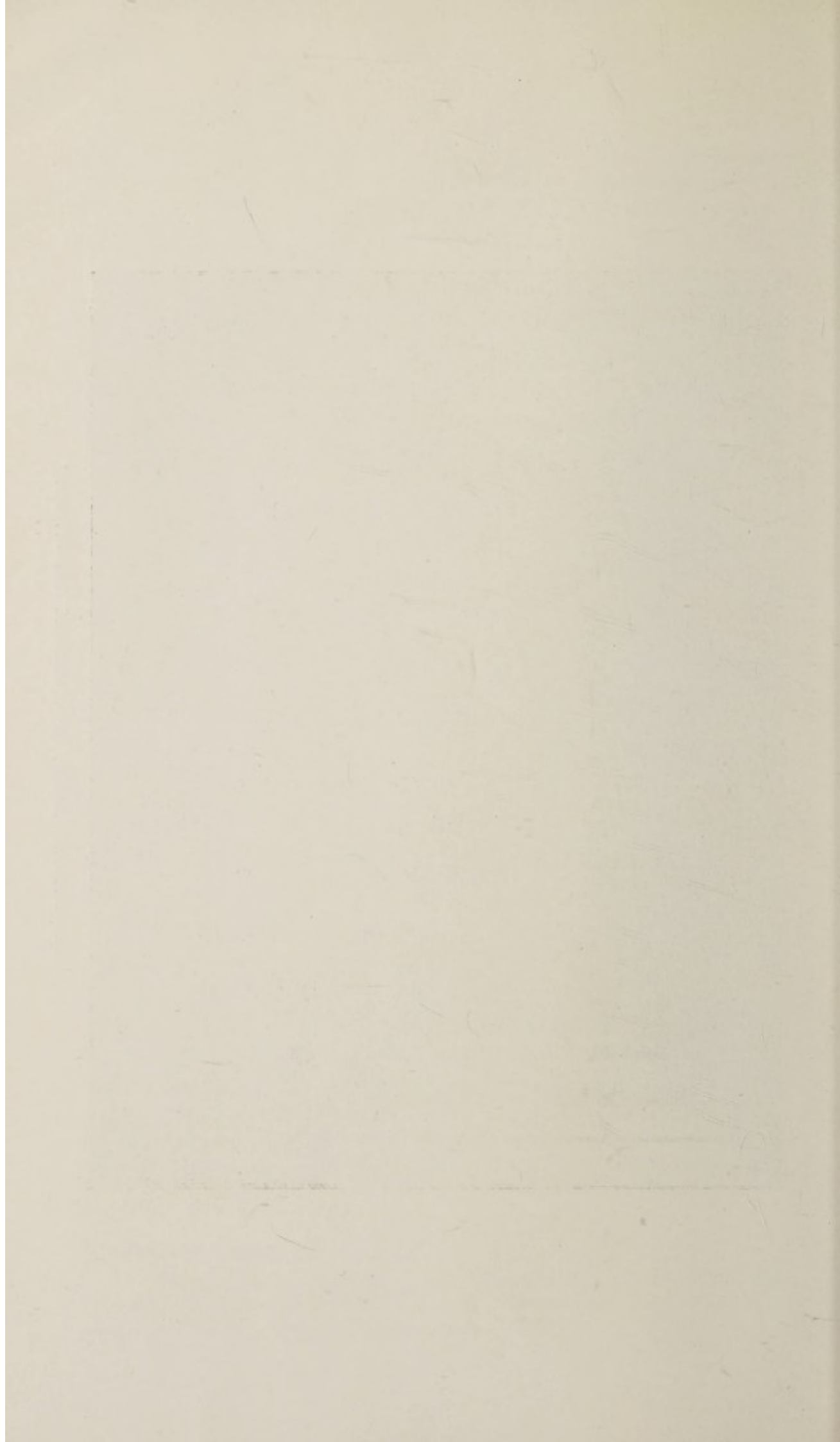

## HEATHERDENE CONVALESCENT HOME.

---

The Home was re-opened for the admission of Patients on April 24th, and closed October 16th.

The total number of Patients admitted was 362 as compared with 390 in 1933. This number was made up of 92 men, 244 women and 26 children, of whom 47 were transferred from the Infirmary as against 64 during 1933.

The daily average number of Patients was 33.97 as compared with 33.57 in the previous year, and the average duration of stay of each Patient was 16.42 as against 16.87.

The average cost per Patient was £3 16s. 9d. as compared with £3 4s. 4d. in the previous year, and the cost of each Patient per day was 4/8 as against 3/9 in 1933.

The Ordinary Income of the Home for the year was £1,081 3s. 0d. as compared with £929 5s. 4d. for 1933, and the Expenditure £1,389 0s. 3d. as against £1,255 9s. 2d.

The amount received from Workmen who make Special Contributions to the Home was £730 14s. 0d. as compared with £599 1s. 3d. in 1933.

The Flag Day Collection held in aid of the funds of the Home on June 16th produced £137 18s. 5d., and the Board is grateful to the Workmen's Governors who were responsible for this effort.

By the desire of Mrs. Stansfield Richardson the Home was equipped with an electrical installation, the cost being met out of the monies available from the estate of the late Mrs. Edwin Richardson, and this addition is greatly appreciated. A new Kitchen Range has been installed and sundry other improvements effected which have contributed towards the efficient administration of the Home.

The Board again extend their grateful thanks to all who have assisted the Institution by Contributions, Service or Gifts in kind, and look forward to a continuance of this support.

The need remains for co-operative effort to free the Institution from the incubus of debt, and it is hoped that the improvement in trade conditions, which is apparent in the increased Contributions from Workpeople, will continue to manifest itself in additional Ordinary Income to meet Ordinary Expenditure so that the Board may apply Bequests and Legacies for the provision of a new Out-Patient Department, Ward Block and Nurses' Home which are so sorely needed.

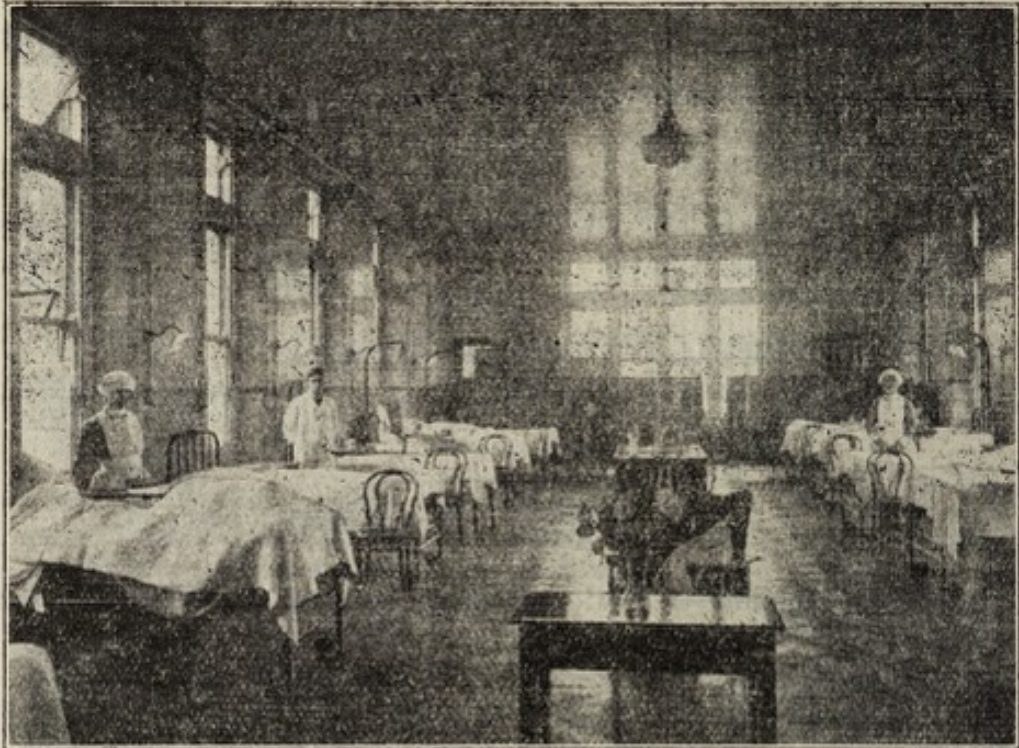

## Private Patients' Department.

Hospital Treatment Insurance Scheme at an Annual Premium of  
**THIRTY SHILLINGS.**

### INSURANCE SCHEME.

Persons whose incomes fall within the following limits may obtain treatment in the Private Wards on payment of 30/- per annum. (The Secretary will supply to staffs of schools, groups of officials, etc., particulars in regard to payment of premiums by an instalment system.)

- Class (a) Single adult persons under £300 per annum.
- (b) Married Couples without children under 16, £400 per annum.
- (c) Widows and widowers with a child or children under 16, and one female child over 16 years who is regularly acting as Housekeeper, £400 per annum.
- (d) Married Couples with a child or children under 16, £500 per annum.
- (e) Single persons between the ages of 16 and 21 years, not in receipt of over £100 per annum, annual premium 20/-.
- (f) Single adult person with wholly dependent relatives, £400 per annum.

Patients are under the care of a member of the Visiting Medical Staff of the Hospital.

Members will not be eligible for treatment until six months from date of joining scheme.

Members requiring In-Patient treatment will be admitted as accommodation permits, but urgent cases will be received at any time.



The premium covers all medical and surgical nursing and maintenance costs, whilst the patient is in the Infirmary, but does not cover the cost of any special appliances, drugs or instruments which may be ordered for treatment after discharge.

Alcoholic stimulants of any kind must be provided or paid for by the patient.

No patient shall remain as an In-Patient for more than four consecutive weeks, except by special arrangement and with the permission of the Board of Management.

Maternity, Mental, or Infectious cases cannot be admitted.

Visitors are allowed daily, between the hours of 2-30 and 4-30 in the afternoon, and from 7 to 8 in the evening, subject to the consent of the Medical Officer in charge.

Out-Patient treatment is limited to

1. X-Ray and Pathological investigation for Diagnostic purposes.
2. Such Orthopædic treatment as may be necessary after discharge from the Wards, but not exceeding a period of four weeks.

The decision of the Board of Management on any question relating to the admission or care of patients shall be accepted as final.

The Board of Management reserve the right to refuse any application for membership of the Insurance Scheme, to cancel any existing membership, or to revise the conditions under which members have joined.

## ADMISSION TO THE PRIVATE PATIENTS' WARDS OF NON-MEMBERS OF THE INSURANCE SCHEME.

So far as accommodation will permit, patients who have not adopted the Insurance Scheme will be received as In-Patients, at a charge of £3 - 3 - 0 per week, and an additional charge for medical attendance by arrangement with the Doctor concerned.

The income of patients admitted under this arrangement must come within the limits laid down under the Insurance Scheme.

## ADMISSION OF PRIVATE PATIENTS ABOVE INSURANCE SCHEME INCOME LIMITS.

Persons in receipt of incomes above the Insurance Scheme limits are not eligible for admission to the Private Wards, but may be admitted to Private Rooms, the charge for which shall be not less than £5 - 5 - 0 per week with a minimum of £1 - 1 - 0.

In the event of a Private Room not being available, such persons, if they so wish, may be admitted to the Private Wards but shall be requested to pay not less than £3 - 3 - 0 per week with a minimum of 10/6 for maintenance. Medical fees are in addition and must be arranged with the Doctor concerned.

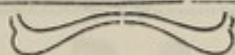

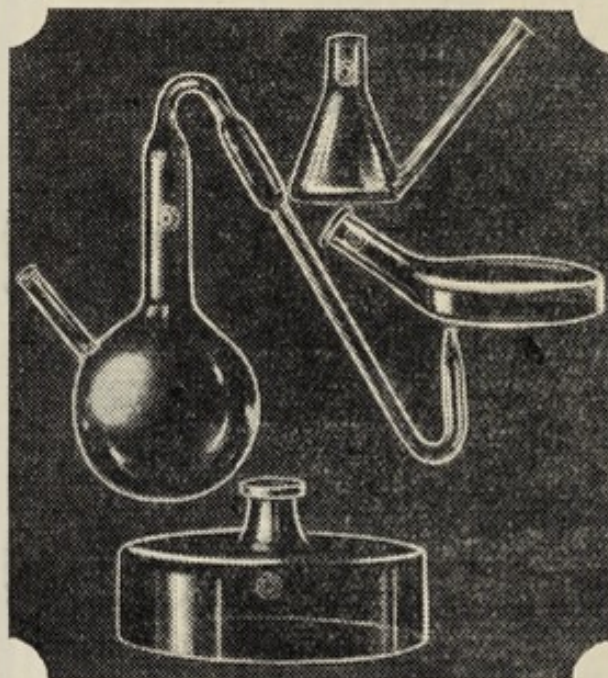

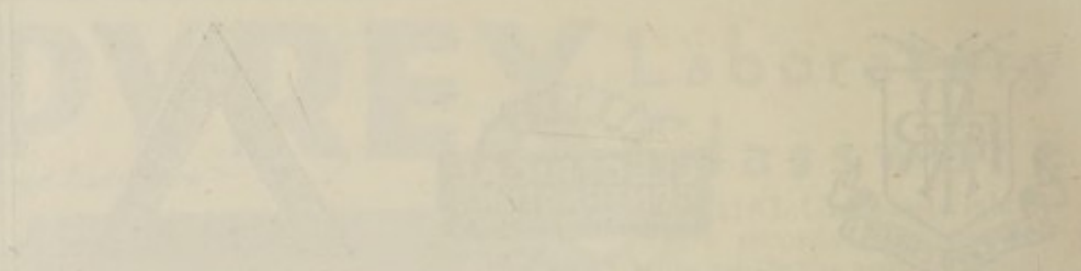

## **HEATHERDENE CONVALESCENT HOME, HARROGATE.**

Applications to be made on special forms (obtainable from Secretary's office), which, when completed, must be brought by the patient to the Royal Infirmary any morning at 11-30 a.m. Patients pay their own train fares to and from Harrogate.

### **SURGICAL TUBERCULOSIS.**

Patients thought to be suffering from Surgical Tuberculosis must, in the first instance, be referred to the T.B Medical Officer for the district in which they reside, who, if he considers necessary, will arrange for their admission.

### **PAYING PATIENTS.** (See page 44.)

Paying patients are admitted on the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner.

### **ORTHOPÆDIC DEPARTMENT.**

Paying patients requiring treatment in this Department should attend at 2-15 p.m. any Monday and bring with them a note from their Medical attendant.

### **PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.**

Facilities for Laboratory examinations are provided. Any form of Pathological examination will be undertaken by arrangement with the Pathologist.

### **AREA.**

Patients will be admitted from any district if accommodation is available.

### **GENERAL.**

Patients shall be admitted free. In all cases, however, in which there shall appear to the House Committee ability to repay to the Institution the whole or part of the cost, payment shall be demanded.

Accepted cases, for which there is not room, will be sent for by the Medical Resident Officers as vacancies occur.

Patients who have been recently discharged from this or other hospitals shall not be received unless suffering under some more recent accident or dangerous ailment. The following cases are also considered ineligible for reception as In-patients at this Institution:—

Those who upon examination are deemed incurable or not likely to receive considerable permanent relief.

Those suffering from an infectious disease, and those whose complaints are likely to be so tedious of cure as to preclude the admission of more urgent cases.

All patients shall be discharged within two months after admission, unless their Physician or Surgeon certify to the Board of Management that there is a probability of their being cured or receiving considerable relief, in which case the Board shall exercise its discretion.

---

### **VISITING DAYS.**

Friends of In-patients are, subject to the Rules of the Royal Infirmary, allowed to visit between the hours of 2 and 3 o'Clock on **Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday Afternoons.**

Children's Hospital 2 to 3 o'Clock on **Sunday Afternoons** for adults only.

Not more than two visitors are allowed at the same time to each Patient.

Only those in possession of **Visiting Tickets** are admitted to the Royal Infirmary on ordinary Visiting Days.

Children under 14 years of age are not admitted to the Wards without special permission.
