



The notice convening the meeting having been read, the following resolutions were adopted:—

(1) Moved by the Chairman.

“That the Minutes of the last General Court of Governors be taken as read, and signed.”

(2) Moved by the Chairman.

“That the report of the Board of Management having been sent to each Governor be taken as read.”

In formally moving the adoption of the annual report and asking Mr. S. P. Richardson to support this, Mr. Storey said he thought they had been extraordinarily fortunate in their new chairman. He had

given a great amount of time to the position, and they must all be grateful to him for the splendid work he had done for the Institution during the last twelve months.

Mr. Richardson said the fact that his family had been connected with the Infirmary for very many years added to the peculiar pleasure he felt in occupying the chairmanship.

ECONOMIES REACH LIMIT.

The ordinary income last year, continued Mr. Richardson, amounted to £37,741, a decrease of £329 on the previous year. The extraordinary income of £3,430 was £864 less than in the previous year. The main reason for the decrease in the ordinary income was the lesser receipts from the treatment of patients, and they must face up to the fact that these were likely to be lower in future years owing to the approved societies ceasing to pay hospital benefits.

Extraordinary income was a fluctuating asset, and if it had not been for the valuable contributions, amounting to £1,600, which they received in celebration of the Jubilee of the late King the deficit would have been considerably greater.

Ordinary expenditure was £40,015, a decrease of £348. The present cost of running the Institution was £5,000 less than in 1930.

**"LET NOBODY RUN AWAY WITH THE IDEA THAT FURTHER
CONSIDERABLE ECONOMIES ARE POSSIBLE," SAID MR. RICHARD-
SON. "THEY ARE IMPOSSIBLE IF THE INSTITUTION IS TO BE KEPT
UP IN A STATE OF EFFICIENCY. WHAT WE HAVE GOT TO DO IS TO
SEE THAT WE INCREASE OUR INCOME, AND NOT ADOPT A CHEESE-
PARING POLICY IN AN EFFORT TO DECREASE EXPENDITURE
FURTHER IN WAYS THAT MAY RE-ACT UNFAVOURABLY UPON THE
WORK OF THE INFIRMARY AS A WHOLE."**

"If it were not for the extraordinary income our deficit would go on increasing and we would not be able to make ends meet even to the extent that we do now.

WORKMEN'S CONTRIBUTIONS.

"The cost per bed had been reduced in the last five years from £129 to £109 per annum, but I am not going to promise you—in fact it would be wrong if I did—that there can be any further reduction. Efficiency must be kept up, and I am sure I am speaking for the Board of Management when I say that they will not be a party to economies which necessitate a decrease in efficiency. (Applause.)

Mr. Richardson said he was glad to note that workmen's contributions were again on the upgrade. That was an indication that times were getting better, and he hoped that the time was not far distant when workmen might see their way to increase their contributions to three-pence per week. If only that could be accomplished he would feel that the finances of the Infirmary were on a more satisfactory basis.

**MR. RICHARDSON WENT ON TO REFER TO THE UNSATIS-
FACTORY POSITION REGARDING THE COST OF TREATING ROAD
ACCIDENT CASES. LAST YEAR THEY EXPENDED £337 UNDER THIS
HEAD, AND THEY WERE ONLY ABLE TO GET BACK FROM THE
INSURANCE COMPANIES £278.**

Parliament ought to improve the position of the voluntary

hospitals in this respect. Meantime they owed a great debt of gratitude to Mr. Storey for his unceasing activities in pressing this matter upon the attention of the Government, and he hoped Mr. Storey would continue to urge that justice be done to the hospitals.

Mr. Richardson said a gymnasium had been provided for remedial exercises at a cost of £725, of which £400 had been collected by the medical officer and staff of the Orthopædic Department.

INCREASING ACCOMMODATION.

Mr. Richardson next referred to the application made by the Infirmary to the Commissioner for Special Areas for a grant towards the cost of building a new outpatients' department, a new nurses' home, and other additions. He hoped that by next year he would be able to announce that success had crowned their efforts.

He was most anxious, too, to get on with their plans for providing further accommodation for paying patients, because by so doing they would be able to increase the accommodation for the ordinary non-paying patients.

POINTING OUT THAT THERE WAS AN INCREASING PUBLIC DEMAND FOR MEDICAL SERVICES OF ALL KINDS, MR. RICHARDSON SAID THAT IN ORDER TO GET THE BEST POSSIBLE SERVICES THERE MUST BE MORE CO-ORDINATION BETWEEN THE PUBLIC AUTHORITIES AND THE VOLUNTARY BODIES CONCERNED. IF THEY WENT ON IN THEIR OWN PAROCHIAL WAYS THE ONLY RESULT WOULD BE THAT THE HEALTH SERVICES OF THE COUNTRY WOULD NEVER REACH THE HIGH STANDARD THEY WISHED TO ATTAIN.

Mr. Stanley Raw, Chairman of the Medical Board, supporting the adoption of the report, expressed the thanks of himself and his colleagues to Mr. Storey for his valuable work as a member and during his chairmanship of the Board of Management.

Mr. W. Hall (Hetton Lyons), Chairman of the Workmen's Governors, spoke briefly in supporting the motion, after which questions were invited.

GUARANTEE GIVEN.

Mr. J. Devlin (Dawdon) raised the question of additional accommodation for paying patients, and suggested that the Infirmary was established not to provide this kind of accommodation but for poor people who could not afford to pay fees.

Mr. Storey replied by reminding the Governors that when he launched the appeal for the reconstruction of the Infirmary it was pointed out that one of their objects was the provision of accommodation for paying patients, and a guarantee was given that such accommodation would be additional to the accommodation available for ordinary patients.

If the scheme they now had in mind were proceeded with, the money would be raised quite separately and the paying patients' accommodation would be provided where it would not be used for ordinary cases.

IT MIGHT BE SAID THEY OUGHT NOT TO PROVIDE PAYING PATIENTS' ACCOMMODATION IN A VOLUNTARY HOSPITAL, BUT HE THOUGHT THAT WAS A WRONG ATTITUDE. THE INFIRMARY WAS STARTED AS A HOSPITAL FOR THE SICK POOR, BUT AS MEDICAL

SCIENCE PROGRESSED VOLUNTARY HOSPITALS HAD BECOME MORE AND MORE GENERAL HOSPITALS AND CERTAIN SURGICAL TREATMENT WAS PROVIDED THERE WHICH COULD NOT BE OBTAINED ELSEWHERE.

"I don't think it is right," said Mr. Storey, "to say that the facilities provided in a hospital such as this should be limited to one class of the residents of the district. They should be available to everybody—for those who cannot afford to pay for it, free of cost; for those who can afford to pay a little, by paying their penny or twopence, or threepence, a week; for those who can afford to pay more, by paying full charges; and for those who can afford to pay a lot, by paying something more than the full charges."

"BEST POSSIBLE."

He would not be content with the hospital system of the country until everybody, rich or poor, could go into the voluntary hospitals and get the best possible treatment available.

Replying to a further criticism by Mr. Devlin, Mr. Storey said at present they had two wards for paying patients, with six single-bed rooms underneath for paying patients. To build their new out-patients' department they would have to take away those six rooms on the ground floor.

"Now the paying patients' department is one that we want to develop, for it brings not only people who can afford to pay but also people who are in the 30s. a year insurance scheme. They go into the paying patients' ward and they free the beds in the rest of the Infirmary.

"If we are going on with the new out-patients' department and we do not want to cut down the paying patients' ward, we have got to provide new accommodation, and in doing that we intend to provide enough to take the whole of the paying patients' accommodation from where it is now.

"That would give you the out-patients' department on the ground floor, and on the top floor it would free two wards for ordinary patients.

"If we get the Commissioner for Special Areas to pass the whole scheme we are putting forward it will enable us not only to have a new out-patients' department but will enable us to duplicate the Princess Mary Wing, so I think you can rest assured that the plans which have been put forward will not in any way curtail the accommodation for the ordinary patients and will not in any way take any of the services away from them.

"Further, I give you this assurance that the scheme for financing the paying patients' department is one that stands on its own feet. It will provide the money for all the building and will be no drain whatever on the funds of the Institution."

The annual report was then adopted.

STAFFING OF INSTITUTION.

Mr. Richardson mentioned that he was at present engaged in an inquiry into the whole question of the staffing of the Institution with a view to bringing it as up-to-date as possible.

Miss M. Moore and Mr. J. L. Balbach were elected Life Governors.

On the motion of the Chairman, the undermentioned recommendations were adopted:—

(a) That the following be added to Rule 21:—

“Any member of the Staff on whose behalf such discretion is exercised, shall take up his Consulting Appointment immediately the Board has decided upon the recommendation, pending confirmation or otherwise by the next Court of Governors.”

(b) That the portion of Rule 21 referring to the retiring age of members of the Honorary Staff be suspended until the next Annual Court of Governors.

The Board of Management reported that in accordance with Rule 13 the following members retire:—Rev. R. S. MacLauchlan, Coroner J. C. Morton, Mr. A. C. Patterson, J.P., Mr. D. R. Pinkney, Mr. J. The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting the 141st Annual Report to the Governors. The medical and surgical facilities have been extensively utilised, and an increase is recorded in the number of patients applying for treatment. Special efforts have been made to reduce the number of patients awaiting admission, and it is pleasing to record success in this direction. The financial position shows little variation over the previous year—the Ordinary Income shews a decrease of £329 12s. 8d., which has fortunately been offset by a decrease of £348 3s. 0d. in the Ordinary Expenditure, but had it not been for Extraordinary Income there would have been a deficit on the year's working of £2,274 7s. 7d.

It is emphasised that efforts to increase income must be continued, and the Board earnestly appeal to all Subscribers to consider and complete the form of agreement inserted between pages 72 and 73 of the report in order that the Institution may recover Income Tax paid on the amount of their subscriptions.





British Hospitals' Association.


The Annual Meeting and Conference was held at Leamington Spa in June, when several subjects on Hospital Administration were surveyed, and the following important resolution adopted:—


"That a Commission be appointed to take into consideration the present position of the Voluntary Hospitals of the country; to enquire whether, in view of recent legislative and social developments, it is desirable that any steps should be taken to promote their interests, develop their policy and safeguard their future; and to frame such recommendations as may be thought expedient and acceptable."

Egg Week.

Mrs. W. Grant Waugh and her Committee are again to be congratulated on the success of their efforts, which resulted in the collection of 90,870 eggs and £32 8s. 11d. in cash.

The Board are very grateful to the organisers for the apportionment received, totalling 57,000 eggs and £19 14s. 6d. in cash.





Insurance Scheme (Private Wards).

Attention is directed to page 44, on which full details of this scheme are given. The facilities offered are becoming more widely known, as evidenced by the year's enrolments, which break all previous records. Special arrangements are now in force for monthly group collections, and particulars may be obtained from the House Governor and Secretary.

Federated Superannuation Scheme.

In May last, the Board decided to become a participating Institution in this scheme, as it was found to be advantageous in recruiting suitable applicants to the staff. The cost of participation will be spread over a period of years, as new entrants are admitted.

Additions and Extensions.

At the request of the Town and County Authorities, the Board agreed to the extension and modernisation of the Venereal Diseases Department accommodation, which has been completed at an approximate cost of £1,218. This sum is to be repaid to the Infirmary funds by annual payments and interest over a period of years.

Internal reconstruction has been carried out in the Hartley Wing to provide two side wards, each accommodating 3 beds.

Authority has been given for the erection of a Gymnasium adjoining the Orthopaedic Department at an approximate cost of £725, and the work on this extension will be commenced shortly.

Consideration is still being given to the proposal to extend the accommodation for paying-patients, and it is hoped that concrete proposals will be placed before the Board early in 1936.

Building Fund.

Sums received for the Building Fund during the year amount to £423 7s. 0d., and increase the total to £82,126 7s. 7d. In addition, £35 has been received for the Equipment Fund, making the total £4,070 12s. 7d. The expenditure on Building and Equipment to December 31st, 1935, amounted to £86,818 14s. 2d., which includes outstanding accounts at December 31st amounting to £800 0s. 0d.

General.

The Revs. R. W. Stannard and R. S. MacLauchlan have been elected members of the Board to fill vacancies caused by the resignations of the Revs. S. R. Bawtree and Preb. A. B. Wynne Willson.

Messrs. A. H. Dickinson and C. R. Walker have also resigned from the Board, and this opportunity is taken to express thanks for the assistance these gentlemen rendered in their respective spheres.

In view of impending retirements, a Committee has been appointed to consider and report on the future Medical and Surgical Staffing of the Institution.

It has been found necessary to renew the electrical wiring in Ward 9, renew the cylinder of the water softening apparatus, and to install a Refrigerator in the meat store, the total sum involved being £168 2s. 0d.

The number of Patients treated during the year was 2,518, the attendances totalling 5,582. The cost per Out-Patient was 26·68 pence and 12·04 pence per attendance.

Finance.

The Ordinary Income amounted to £4,672 5s. 11d., being a decrease of £70 12s. 9d. on the previous year. The contributions received from workmen totalled £2,474 6s. 1d., a decrease of £51 8s. 3d. on the total for 1934. HEATHERDENE CONVALESCENT HOME.

The Home was re-opened for the admission of Patients on April 2nd, and closed October 15th.

The total number of Patients admitted was 390, as compared with 362 in 1934. This number was made up of 130 men, 230 women and 30 children, of whom 58 were transferred from the Infirmary as against 47 during 1934.

The daily average number of Patients was 31·12 as compared with 33·97 in the previous year, and the average duration of stay of each Patient was 15·64 as against 16·42.

The average cost per Patient was £2 16s. 5d. as compared with £3 16s. 9d. in the previous year, and the cost of each Patient per day was 3s. 7d. as against 4s. 8d. in 1934.

The Ordinary Income of the Home for the year was £985 13s. 9d. as compared with £1,081 3s. 0d. for 1934., and the Expenditure £1,100 0s. 5d. as against £1,389 0s. 3d.

The amount received from Workmen who make Special Contributions to the Home was £606 18s. 8d. as compared with £730 14s. 0d. in 1934.

The Flag Day Collection held in aid of the funds on June 22nd produced £159 3s. 10d., and the Board are grateful to the Workmen's Governors, who were responsible for this effort.

During the year Dr. Stanley Van S. Boyd resigned the position of Honorary Surgeon, and has been succeeded by Dr. T. Glen Reah.

It is desired to place on record an appreciation of Dr. Boyd's services, which have extended over a period of 16 years.

Through the generosity of an anonymous donor, the old wireless set at the Home has been replaced by a modern electric set and the improvement in the reception of programmes is greatly appreciated by the patients.

Thanks.

The Board again extend their grateful thanks to all who have assisted the Institution by Contributions, Service or Gifts in kind, and look forward to a continuance of this support.

In Conclusion,

The Board would reiterate that their most urgent need is new accommodation for Out-Patients and a Nurses' Home. The present provision for the former is most inadequate to meet modern demands, whilst the lack of suitable housing for the Nurses is advanced as a contributing cause of a real difficulty in obtaining Probationers for Training. An application for financial aid towards the provision of the foregoing requirements is before the Commissioner for the Special Areas, and the Board earnestly hope that success will attend their endeavours in this direction.

Whilst fully aware of the financial difficulties affecting the Area served by the Institution, they feel that failure to provide these necessary facilities may endanger the high standard of service so long associated with the Institution in the alleviation of suffering and disease.

INSURANCE SCHEME.

Persons whose incomes fall within the following limits may obtain treatment in the Private Wards on payment of 30/- per annum. (The Secretary will supply to staffs of schools, groups of officials, etc., particulars in regard to payment of premiums by an instalment system.)

- (a) Single adult persons under £300 per annum.
- (b) Married Couples without children under 16, £400 per annum.
- (c) Widows and widowers with a child or children under 16, and one female child over 16 years who is regularly acting as Housekeeper, £400 per annum.
- (d) Married Couples with a child or children under 16, £500 per annum.
- (e) Single persons between the ages of 16 and 21 years, not in receipt of over £100 per annum, annual premium 20/-.
- (f) Single adult person with wholly dependent relatives, £400 per annum.

Patients are under the care of a member of the Visiting Medical Staff of the Hospital.

Members will not be eligible for treatment until six months from date of joining scheme.

Members requiring In-Patient treatment will be admitted as accommodation permits, but urgent cases will be received at any time.

The premium covers all medical and surgical fees, nursing and maintenance costs, whilst the patient is in the Infirmary, but does not cover the cost of any special appliances, drugs or instruments which may be ordered for treatment after discharge.

Alcoholic stimulants of any kind must be provided or paid for by the patient.

No patient shall remain as an In-Patient for more than four consecutive weeks, except by special arrangement and with the permission of the Board of Management.

Maternity, Mental, or Infectious cases cannot be admitted.

Visitors are allowed daily, between the hours of 2 and 4 in the afternoon, and from 7 to 8 in the evening, subject to the consent of the Medical Officer in charge.

Out-Patient treatment is limited to

1. X-Ray and Pathological investigation for Diagnostic purposes.
2. Such Orthopaedic treatment as may be necessary after discharge from the Wards, but not exceeding a period of four weeks.

The decision of the Board of Management on any question relating to the admission or care of patients shall be accepted as final.

The Board of Management reserve the right to refuse any application for membership of the Insurance Scheme, to cancel any existing membership, or to revise the conditions under which members have joined.

ADMISSION TO THE PRIVATE PATIENTS' WARDS OF NON-MEMBERS OF THE INSURANCE SCHEME.

So far as accommodation will permit, patients who have not adopted the Insurance Scheme will be received as In-Patients, at a charge of £3 - 3 - 0 per week, and an additional charge for medical attendance by arrangement with the Doctor concerned.

The income of patients admitted under this arrangement must come within the limits laid down under the Insurance Scheme.

ADMISSION OF PRIVATE PATIENTS ABOVE INSURANCE SCHEME INCOME LIMITS.

Persons in receipt of incomes above the Insurance Scheme limits are not eligible for admission to the Private Wards, but may be admitted to Private Rooms, the charge for which shall be not less than £5 - 5 - 0 per week with a minimum of £1 - 1 - 0.

In the event of a Private Room not being available, such persons, if they so wish, may be admitted to the Private Wards but shall be requested to pay not less than £3 - 3 - 0 per week with a minimum of 10/6 for maintenance. Medical fees are in addition and must be arranged with the Doctor concerned.







Applications to be made on special forms (obtainable from Secretary's office), which, when completed, must be brought by the patient to the Royal Infirmary any morning at 11-30 a.m. Patients pay their own train fares to and from Harrogate.

SURGICAL TUBERCULOSIS.

Patients thought to be suffering from Surgical Tuberculosis must, in the first instance, be referred to the T.B. Medical Officer for the district in which they reside, who, if he considers necessary, will arrange for their admission.

PAYING PATIENTS. (See page 44.)

Paying patients are admitted on the recommendation of a Medical Practitioner.

ORTHOPÆDIC DEPARTMENT.

Paying patients requiring treatment in this Department should attend at 2-15 p.m. any Monday and bring with them a note from their Medical attendant.

PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

Facilities for Laboratory examinations are provided. Any form of Pathological examination will be undertaken by arrangement with the Pathologist.

AREA.

Patients will be admitted from any district if accommodation is available.

GENERAL.

Patients shall be admitted free. In all cases, however, in which there shall appear to the House Committee ability to repay to the Institution the whole or part of the cost, payment shall be demanded.

Accepted cases, for which there is not room, will be sent for by the Medical Resident Officers as vacancies occur.

Patients who have been recently discharged from this or other hospitals shall not be received unless suffering under some more recent accident or dangerous ailment. The following cases are also considered ineligible for reception as In-patients at this Institution:—

Those who upon examination are deemed incurable or not likely to receive considerable permanent relief.

Those suffering from an infectious disease, and those whose complaints are likely to be so tedious of cure as to preclude the admission of more urgent cases.

All patients shall be discharged within two months after admission, unless their Physician or Surgeon certify to the Board of Management that there is a probability of their being cured or receiving considerable relief, in which case the Board shall exercise its discretion.

VISITING DAYS.

Friends of In-patients are, subject to the Rules of the Royal Infirmary, allowed to visit between the hours of 2 and 3 o'Clock on Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday Afternoons.

Children's Hospital 2 to 3 o'Clock on Sunday Afternoons for adults only.

Not more than two visitors are allowed at the same time to each Patient.

Only those in possession of Visiting Tickets are admitted to the Royal Infirmary on ordinary Visiting Days.

Children under 14 years of age are not admitted to the Wards without special permission.
