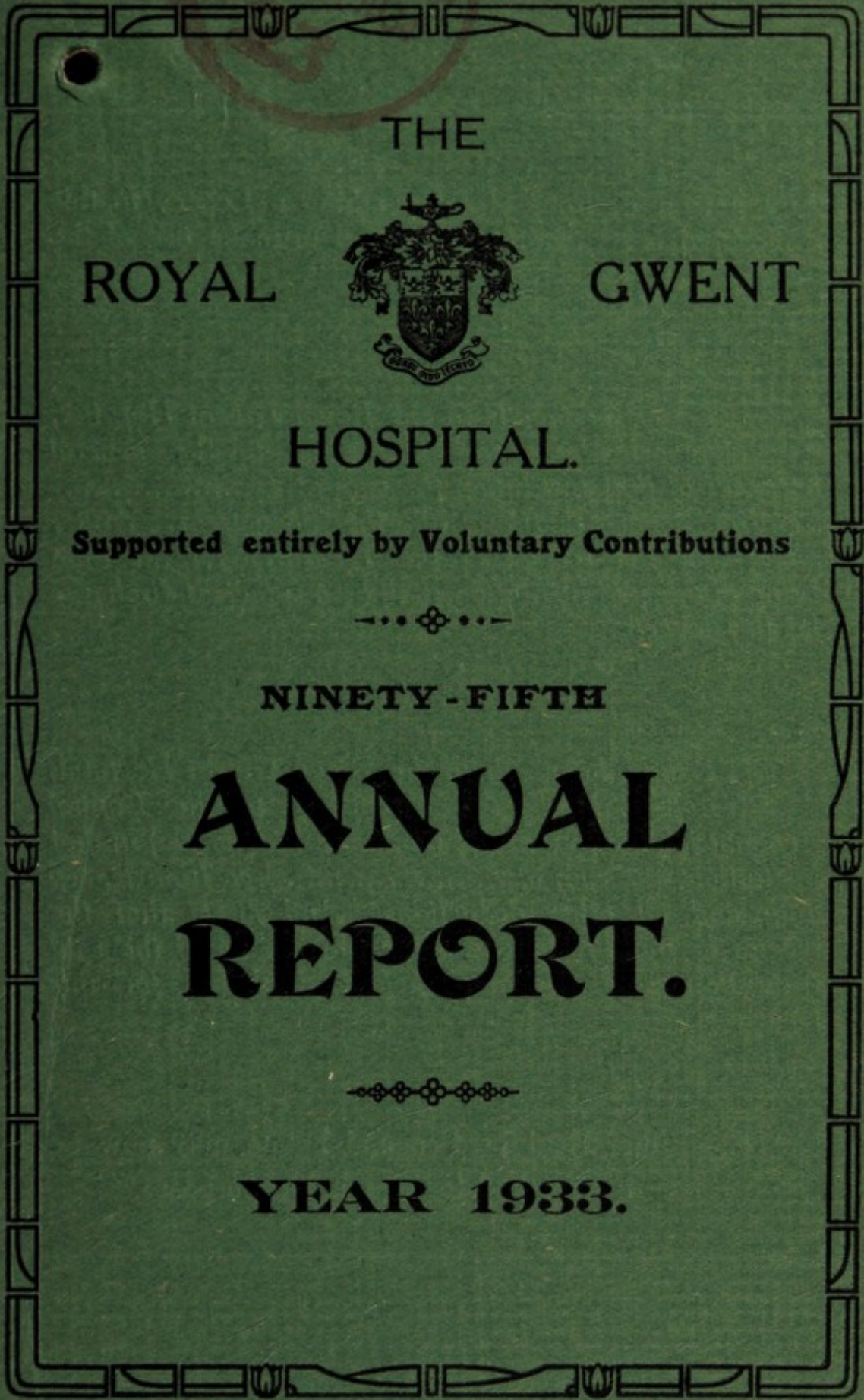
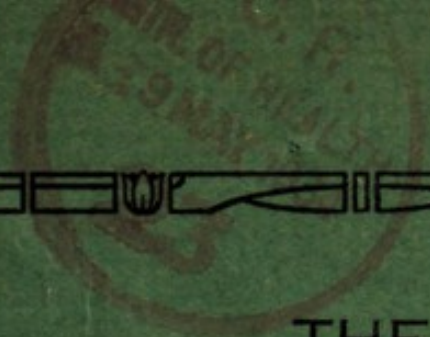

As the Income of Charities is exempt from Income Tax, the Hospital can recover the Tax which has been paid by the Subscriber and so increase the amount actually received by the Hospital by 33½ per cent., without increasing the amount payable by the Subscriber, upon the following conditions :—

1. The Subscriber must be one who pays Income Tax at 5/- in the £ on part of his income.

2. He must sign the form enclosed (or a similar one), and also each year, a form (which will be supplied by the Secretary Superintendent) stating that the promised subscription has been paid, and that he has paid the Income Tax stated.

On payment of an annual subscription of **Fifty Guineas**, a **Bed for Adults** may be named by the Subscriber.

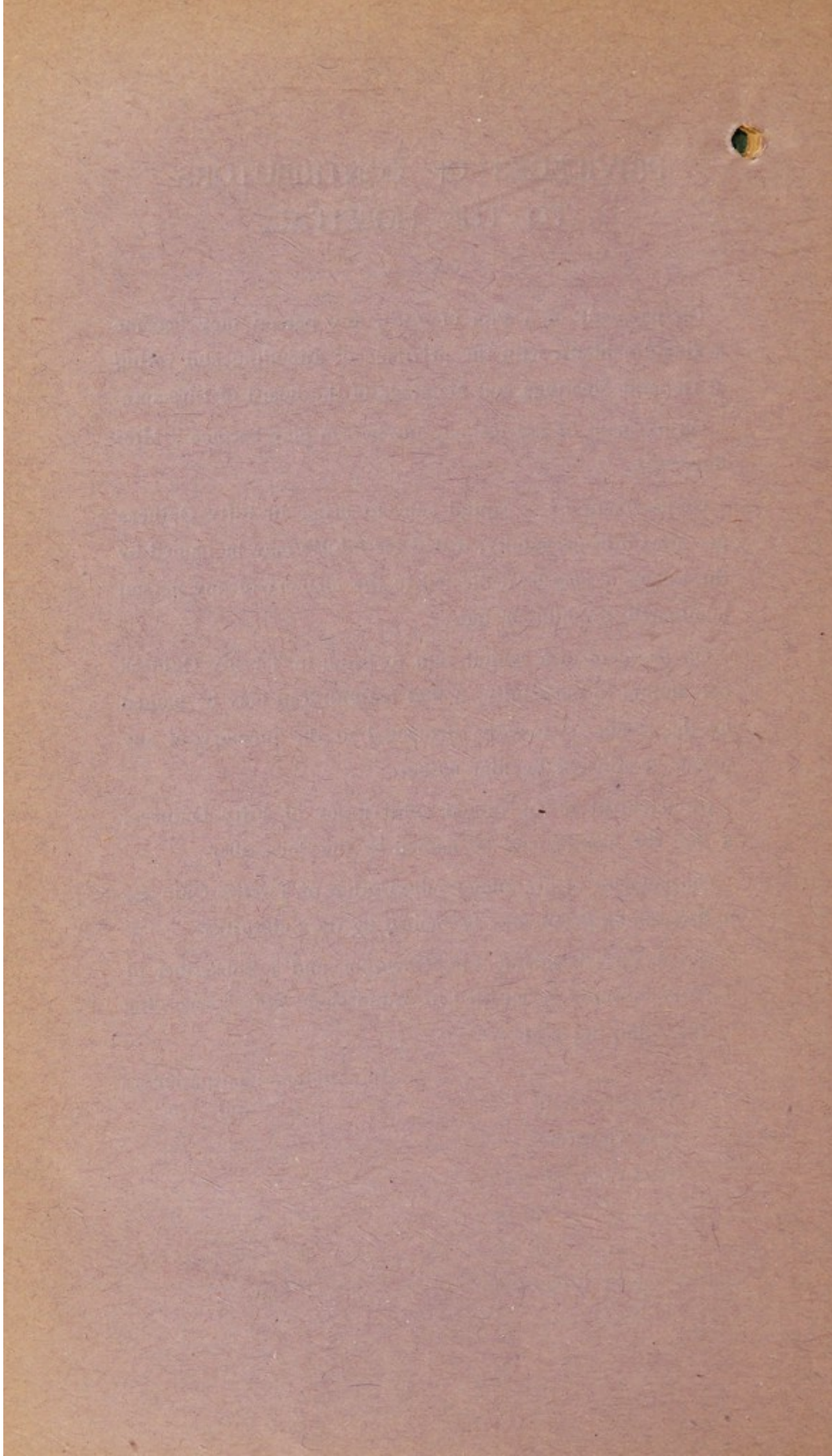

## DIRECTORS' REPORT.

### TO THE SUBSCRIBERS TO THE HOSPITAL.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We beg to present our Annual Report, with the Statements of Accounts, for the year ended 31st December, 1933.

Our first duty, a sad one, is to deplore the heavy losses the Hospital has sustained through the death of an unusual number of its chief supporters and friends; especially do we call to remembrance the following :—

The Right Hon. Lord Treowen, Lord Lieutenant of Monmouthshire, throughout his lifetime evinced a great interest in the welfare of the Hospital and its patients. He was ever ready favourably to respond to any appeal made to him for personal service, and could be relied upon to give his unfailing support to any effort which had for its object the well-being of the Hospital. In his last illness it was to him a matter of deep concern that he was unable to redeem the promise he made to the Hospital's President, the Right Honourable Viscount Tredegar, to perform the ceremony in connection with the Opening of the new Children's Ward Unit and the Nurses' Hostel.

Sir George Forestier Walker, Bart., for many years was one of the Subscribers' representatives on the Board. His regular attendance at the meetings, his unfailing courtesy and his anxiety "to do good for good's sake" endeared him to all those responsible for the administration of the Hospital and proved him to be a very sincere friend.

Mr. Peter Wright, when Mayor of the County Borough of Newport, in 1919, threw himself with unbounded enthusiasm into an appeal for donations to meet the capital expenditure which had been incurred in the erection of the Out-patient Department and other building extensions. It will be recalled that he was

so ably successful, and that, in acknowledgment, he was made an Honorary Life Vice-President of the Hospital.

Mr. T. Morris Prosser, J.P., for some years represented the Subscribers on the Board, and served the Annual Fete and Carnival Committee, in their early efforts, by undertaking, with Mr. E. G. Nicholls, the onerous duties of Honorary Treasurer to that Committee; in this capacity and as Chairman of the Machinery Committee he rendered great service to the Hospital.

Dr. S. Hamilton qualified as a Life Vice-President in the year 1907, and, although his professional duties prevented him from identifying himself closely with the activities of the Hospital, he was able in many other ways to assist its work.

Mrs. Percy Powell showed her sympathetic regard for the Hospital's welfare by becoming a Life Vice-President in 1917, and since that time by supporting the various efforts made to raise contributions.

Mr. Richard Jones, Building Contractor, Caerphilly, erected the Nurses' Hostel and the New Children's Ward Unit, and, by carrying out his contract for this work in a most conscientious, energetic and efficient manner, fully justified the confidence which had been placed in him by the Directors.

We have, with deep regret, to report another great loss which the Hospital has suffered since the closing of the year by the death of Mr. Sam G. Jones, the Assistant Secretary. Mr. Jones had been in the service of the Hospital—with a short interval—for the past 27 years. Largely by his enthusiastic activity, the Annual Hospital Fete became one of the most successful events of its kind in the Kingdom, and a most gratifying source of income, and his organizing ability and continual enthusiasm as Secretary to the Workmen's Hospital Fund caused that Fund to become the main source of the income of the Hospital. He had recently suffered severely from ill-health, but we shall always remember his untiring and cheerful activity for the welfare of the Hospital that he loved.

We have conveyed an expression of our sympathy in their great bereavement to the respective relatives of these friends.

Hearty congratulations have been tendered to the President of the Hospital, Viscount Tredegar, upon the high honour conferred upon him by His Majesty the King in appointing him Lord Lieutenant of the County of Monmouth.



Congratulations have also been tendered to the following Directors and Hospital's helpers who were recently appointed, by the Lord Chancellor, Justices of the Peace for the County Borough of Newport:—His Worship the Mayor of Newport, Councillor F. J. Humphries; Mrs. Tom Jones, Mrs. R. T. Mann, Mrs. Leslie Jacobs, Mrs. Markwell, Mr. W. J. T. Collins, Mr. G. E. Dibdin, Mr. E. G. Nicholls, Mr. A. Denys Phillips and Councillor J. H. Swallow.

We have also expressed our gratification that the Newport Borough Council have conferred the Freedom of the Borough upon Mr. H. S. Lyne, M.B.E., one of our Vice-Chairmen, who, by his splendid and well-known record of long public service, not least to the Hospital, has rightly earned this signal mark of distinction.

## FINANCES.

It is regretted that no improvement can be reported in the Income of the Hospital. The Accumulated Deficiency has reached the total sum of £6,812 18s. 7d. through the addition of £4,310 1s. 10d. the amount of last year's excess expenditure over income. The continued industrial stress, bringing in its train lessened employment and the consequent diminution of means, again has adversely affected the sources of income. Perhaps the most disappointing item was the greatly reduced proceeds of the Annual Fete and Carnival. Unquestionably, the organizers were as enthusiastic in their self-sacrificing labours as ever, but, circumstances over which they had no control, proved too great a handicap to permit of a result to their efforts equal to the splendid successes of previous years.

Unless the Income is substantially increased, the Hospital's financial position at the close of the present year will be serious indeed. It must be remembered that to maintain the additional beds provided for the accommodation of fifty more child and women patients, made possible by the erection of the new Ward Unit, the Expenditure will be permanently increased by, approximately, £5,000 a year. It is evident that this must be met by Income constant in character and chiefly derived from regular periodical subscriptions and contributions, if the Hospital's present extended activities are to be maintained and its efficiency to remain unimpaired.

We are deeply grateful to the Committee of the Workmen's Hospital Fund for the valuable and splendid contribution they have again raised. Their deep regard for the well-being of the Hospital, and the strenuous efforts they have made to improve upon past successes, is highly appreciated, and it is earnestly hoped that their continual labours will be rewarded by a larger measure of support, particularly from those who would expect to be able to avail themselves of the facilities of the Hospital should these at any time be needed.

We are thankful that in the Fete and Carnival Committee there exists a happy and willing band of workers who strive year by year to make an important addition to the finances. Before, and throughout the whole of August Bank Holiday week last year, as on former occasions, they carried out their arduous tasks with enthusiasm and energy. Although this popular annual event did not realise the profit hoped for, it provided a very substantial item of income.

We appreciate the kind endeavours of those Ministers of Religion who invited the members of their congregations to respond to the "Hospital Sunday" appeal. The total contribu-

tions did not reach the amount received for the previous year, but, the difference was not of a serious nature. We must sincerely thank all those who gave their support to this effort.

The contributions from Shipping and the proceeds of the Hospital Balls remain most useful and welcome sources of income.

Acceptable support has been received from the local Rugby and Association Football Clubs, also other Sports Clubs, and from sympathetic friends who have organized entertainments and dances in aid of the Hospital.

### GIFTS.

We wish to express our sense of deep thankfulness for the wonderful assistance given by the Ladies of the Needlework and Linen Guild under the guidance of their capable and enthusiastic Secretary, Mrs. Edward Coulman. In addition to the usual generous gifts of blankets, linen, and other necessities for the comfort and happiness of the patients, valuable gifts of quilts, curtains, and soft furnishings have been made towards the equipment of the new Nurses' Hostel. We appreciate very much the practical sympathy of the Guild, and wish them all success in their continued endeavours.

Numerous, too, have been those friends who have made acceptable gifts in kind. We recall the generosity of the Proprietors of the *South Wales Argus*, who, with the cordial co-operation and assistance of the members of their Staff, again appealed successfully for gifts of Eggs. We value, also, the interest taken in the Hospital by the members of the Old Patients' Association, and the endeavours they have made to retain the sympathy and help of ex-patients.

To all Subscribers, Donors, the Workmen's Hospital Fund, other Workpeople Contributors, Ministers of Religion, Owners of Shipping, the Hospital Fete and Carnival Committee, the Needlework and Linen Guild, the Hospital Balls Committee, Football and other Sports Clubs, and other organizations, and to the large circle of friends who by personal service and generous financial support have helped forward the Hospital's work, this opportunity is taken to convey our cordial thanks, and to express our warm appreciation of the many tokens of good-will received and the encouragement given in maintaining the efficiency of the Institution.

## HONORARY STAFF.

We have pleasure again to record our heartfelt gratitude to the members of the Honorary Staff for their inestimable services. The skilful care and attention they have given to the patients has been the means of restoring many to complete health and strength, and so bestowing renewed confidence and happiness in numerous homes.

Important changes have taken place in the personnel during the year.

Mr. R. J. Coulter, the Honorary Consulting Ophthalmic Surgeon, requested to be released from the active duties he had agreed to carry out in the Out-Patient Department in conjunction with Mr. F. W. Robertson, the Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon. His desire was acceded to. In order that Mr. Robertson should continue to receive competent help in his work, it was decided to appoint an Honorary Assistant Ophthalmic Surgeon. The successful applicant for this new position was Mr. W. J. Roche, M.D., M.Ch., B.A.O., D.O., D.O.M.S., who since his election in June last, has regularly attended the Out-Patient Department on each Monday afternoon.

In April last, Mr. J. A. Lee, the Honorary Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon, having reached the age limit, tendered his resignation. This was accepted with regret and he was warmly thanked for the conscientious and skilful manner in which he had discharged his duties, and the valuable service he had rendered to the Hospital during the past eighteen years. In acknowledgment of this, he was elected Honorary Consulting Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon. The vacancy thus caused was filled by the election of Mr. D. B. Sutton, M.B., B.S. (London), M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (London), F.R.C.S. (Edinburgh), D.L.O.

By the establishment of a Gynaecological Department it was necessary to appoint an Obstetric Physician and Gynaecologist. The situation was met by the appointment to this position of Mr. R. Glyn Morgan, M.C., M.B., B.S. (London), M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (London), one of the Honorary Assistant Surgeons. The vacancy caused by this appointment was filled by the election of Mr. J. Elgood, F.R.C.S. (England), L.R.C.P., M.B., B.S., one of the Honorary Anaesthetists.

The Staff of Honorary Anaesthetists has been augmented by the appointment of Mr. W. Verner, M.B., B.Ch., B.A.O. (Belfast), and Mr. H. A. Keane, M.B., B.Ch. (Dublin).

Mr. Magnus Mackay, M.C., M.B., Ch.B. (Edinburgh), of the Caerleon Mental Hospital, with the approval of the Directors, joined Dr. N. R. Phillips in the treatment of cases attending the Psychiatric Department.

We extend a cordial welcome to the newly elected members of the Honorary Staff.

The Directors have also to tender their grateful thanks to the Honorary Chaplains and the Honorary Organist for their continual services, to the Honorary Solicitors, whose assistance has been sought for and readily given, and to the Honorary Auditors for their careful attention to their very considerable work.

### NURSING STAFF AND TRAINING SCHOOL FOR NURSES.

There were at the close of 1933 sixty-six Probationer Nurses undergoing training. During the year, sixteen completed the three years' course, of these, four have been accepted for a fourth year and four were retained for a shorter period to replace some off-duty through sickness; eight left; two obtained Staff Nurses' posts at other hospitals and six are continuing their training elsewhere in special branches.

Applications for training numbered 342; of these 34 entered, 24 of whom signed on for training.

In the State Examinations thirteen candidates were entered and passed the Preliminary, and in the Final fourteen passed out of a total of fifteen who were entered.

#### BUILDING EXTENSIONS.

On the 5th October last, the new Children's Ward Unit and Nurses' Hostel was formally opened by the Right Honourable Viscount Tredegar, President of the Hospital, before a large and fully representative gathering of the Hospital's supporters and friends. By these new buildings the accommodation for patients was increased by fifty beds, and very urgently needed and more commodious quarters were provided for the comfort and convenience of the members of the Nursing Staff. The Hospital's bed accommodation for patients is now as follows :—

 Total 210 beds.

as compared with the following accommodation which previously existed :—

- Four Male Wards containing 82 beds.  
 Two Female Wards containing 40 beds.  
 One Children's Ward containing 24 beds.  
 "The Friars" containing 14 beds.  
 Total 160 beds.

The larger number of female beds which became available enabled the Directors to establish a Gynaecological Department, thus supplying a long felt need for that special branch of medical and surgical work which treats diseases peculiar to women.

## APPEAL.

In our earnest desire to benefit the community and relieve the suffering in our midst, we met insistent calls for more bed accommodation by incurring an expenditure on these building extensions amounting to approximately £65,000. Towards this, £19,329 10s. 11d. has been found, leaving a liability of approximately £45,000. In the short time which has elapsed since the new extensions were opened full use has been made of the additional accommodation provided. It is not an easy matter to appreciate fully the difficulties with which we were confronted in the immediately preceding years by the non-existence of this additional bed accommodation for patients. These difficulties, although somewhat lessened, are not ended. A long list of the names of patients, particularly male patients, needing treatment in the Wards still exists, but, until the present heavy financial burdens incurred on the recent extensions have been met, no further steps involving a large capital expenditure can be taken to remedy this. These financial burdens have now become a matter of the gravest concern to us and demand the most serious consideration of the general public.

In May next, an urgent appeal will be launched for contributions towards this huge deficit. The general public will be asked to decide by their support whether the Hospital is to continue its beneficent work at its present high level, or whether some of its activities are to suffer a curtailment. Any lessened facilities, reduced efficiency, or the closing of a Ward, is unthinkable, and must by every effort be avoided. Although times are depressed, and the area from which come the Hospital's patients is suffering most acutely, it is possible to raise the required sum, and thus remove all cause for anxiety for the Hospital's future, if all employers and employed will interest themselves in the proposed special effort and contribute to the best of their ability.

With the unfailing generosity which in the past has characterised the people of Monmouthshire, we confidently believe that we may rely upon a successful termination to the appeal.

## STAFF.

In conclusion, the Directors wish to express their entire satisfaction with the efficient manner in which the Secretary-Superintendent and the late Assistant Secretary, the Resident Medical Officers, the Matron and the Dispenser, and their respective Staffs, and also the Gardeners and Porters, and other employees of the Hospital, have carried out their duties.

We acknowledge with gratitude the valuable help received in both diagnosis and treatment from the X-Ray, Massage, Electro-Therapeutic, Bio-Chemical and Bacteriological Departments. It is due to this that we are enabled to make use of the advances in the investigation of disease.

A study of the above lists will shew there has been a considerable increase in the amount of the work done on the General Surgical side compared with last year. There have been more in-patients and more major operations considerably. Over 100 increase in each case. This can be accounted for by the increase in accommodation on the Children's side and the establishment of a Gynaecological Department. The waiting list is still disappointingly heavy in spite of these extensions. The cry of all Hospitals in these times must be inevitably for more and more and more accommodation as there are more people requiring their services.

## EAR, NOSE AND THROAT DEPARTMENT.

## SKIN DEPARTMENT.

3,788 patients attended this department during the year, the number being almost the same as that of the previous twelve months and the Department is still hampered by lack of accommodation.

We are again indebted for much help from our colleagues, particularly for the treatment given in the Electro-therapeutic department, for assistance in investigations by the department of Pathology.

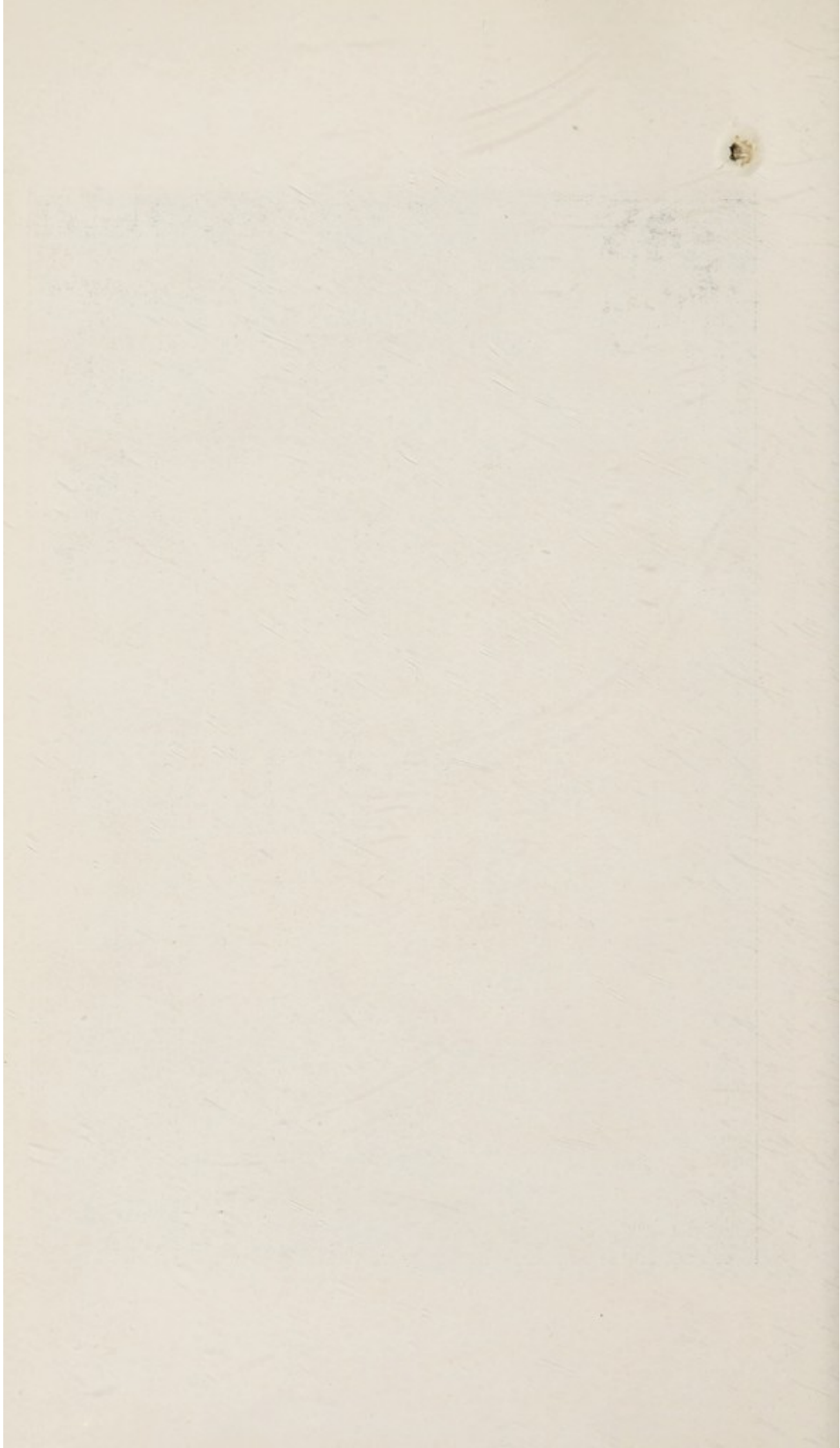

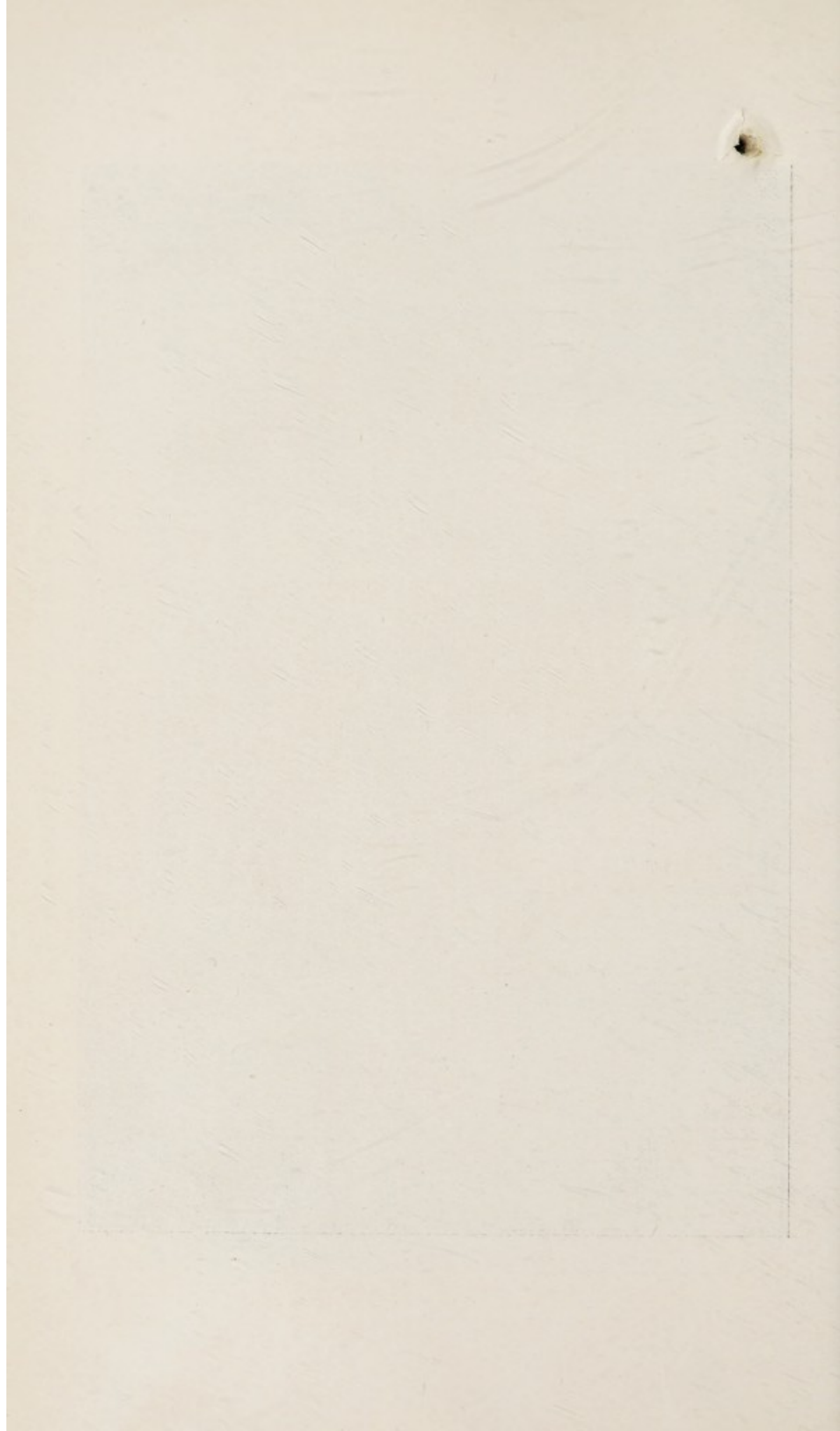

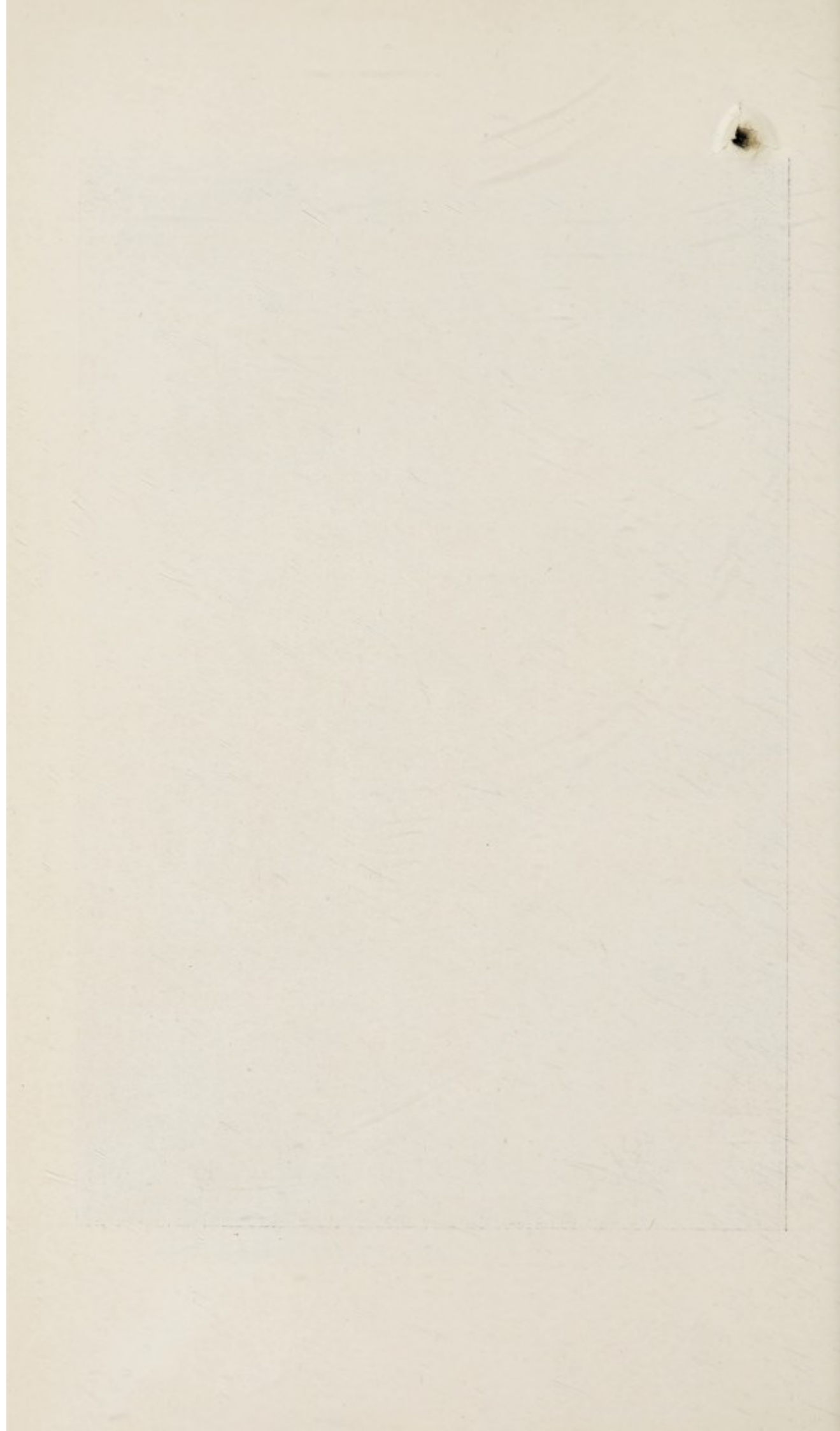




The President of the Hospital proceeding to the new Nurses' Hostel to perform the Opening Ceremony, October 5th, 1933.

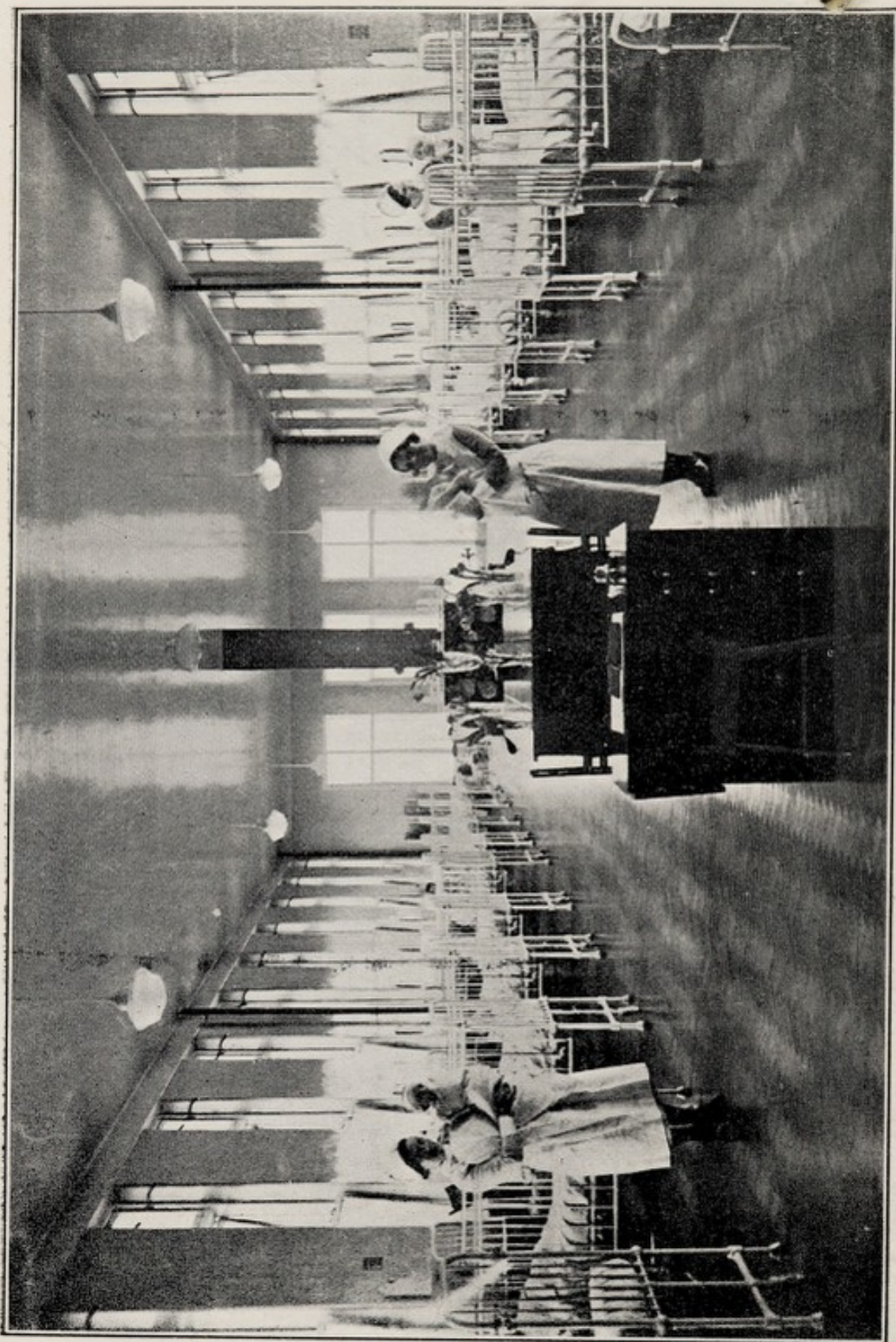

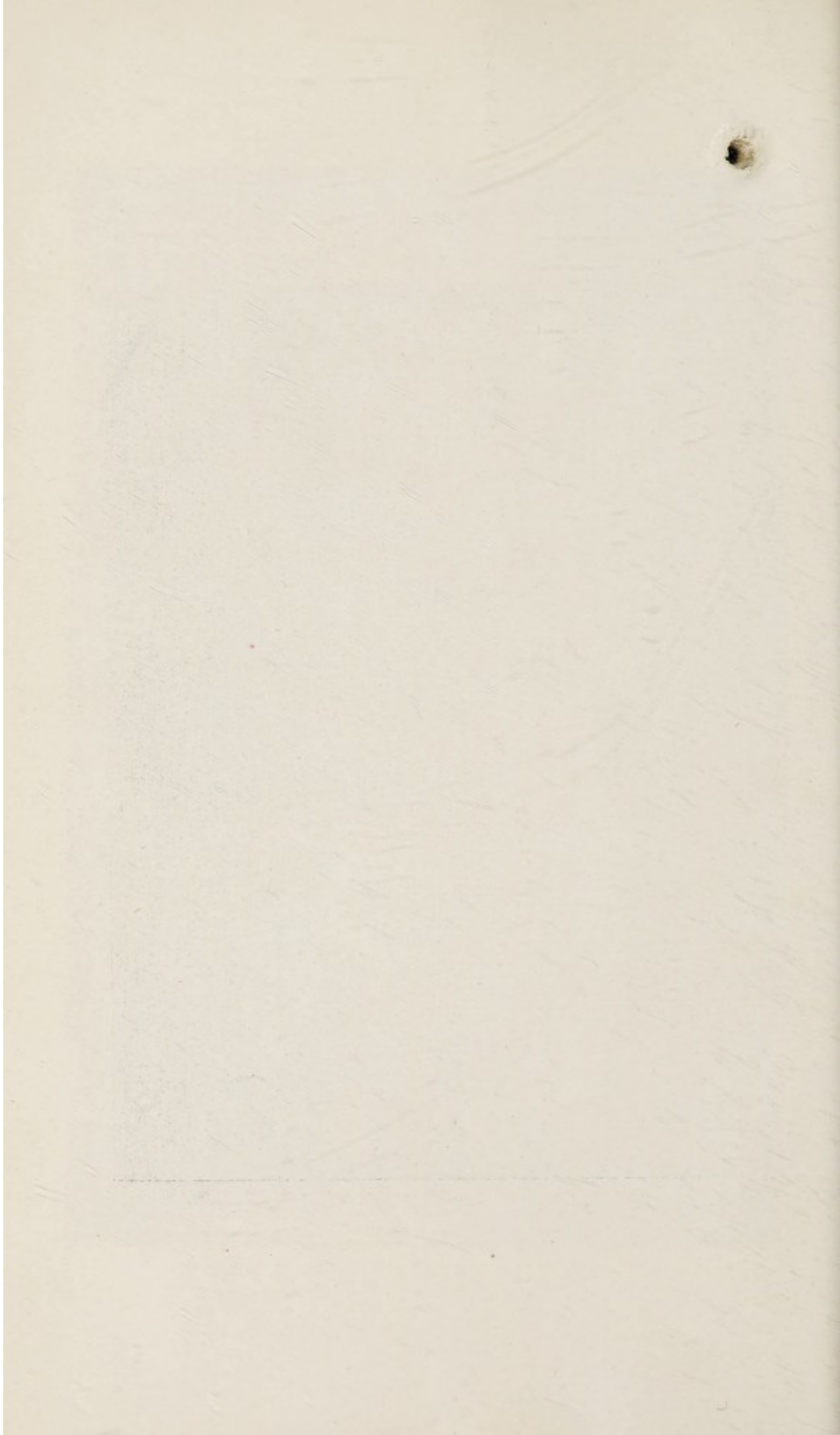


New Children's Ward Unit—Ward of 31 Beds.

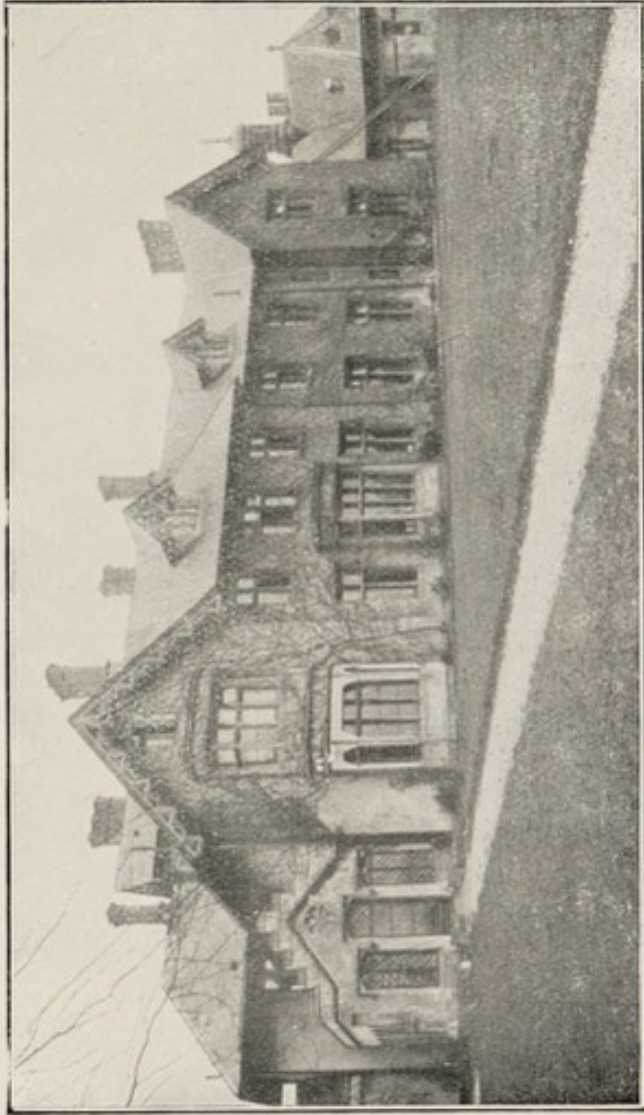

## INSTRUCTIONS.

---

**T**HE observance of the following Rules and Regulations will greatly assist the work of the Hospital :—

1. No Patient should be sent into Hospital without an In-Patient Note, except in cases of urgency where any delay occasioned in an effort to obtain a Note might be detrimental to the welfare of the Patient. The Note of Recommendation, however, must follow immediately.

2. Whenever a case has been treated previously by a Medical Practitioner, a short history of the case is likely to be greatly to the interest of the Patient and should be forwarded.

3. Acute cases for operation should be sent as early in the day as possible.

4. All persons requiring treatment must be seen in the first place by one of the Assistant Physicians or Surgeons in the Out-Patient Department, and the House Surgeon should be communicated with direct only when a case of urgency is being sent to the Hospital.
