### ROYAL HALIFAX INFIRMARY.

HIS Institution was founded in the year 1807, and opened in 1808 as a Dispensary only, and as such it has since been continuously open for the treatment of Out-Patients.

In the year 1815 a few beds were first provided for the reception of severe accident cases and those requiring operations.

The Old Infirmary Building was opened for the reception of In-Patients in April, 1838. In 1863-4 the building was enlarged, and further enlarged in 1874, when the total number of beds was raised to 70. The adjoining Assembly Rooms were purchased in 1877, and provided accommodation for a Children's Ward, which was opened in 1881, with 16 beds. Some of the rooms so acquired were used for consulting and waiting rooms for Out-Patients, dispensary, and nurses' bedrooms. In 1883 the number of beds in the Infirmary was further increased by 13, and in 1891 one more bed was added, making a total number of 100 beds available for the use of In-Patients. The necessity for further accommodation, however, became extremely urgent, and as the old premises could not be enlarged, it was decided to build a New Infirmary, and for this purpose large sums of money were subscribed. The foundation stone of the present structure was laid on the 17th of June, 1893, with Masonic honours, by the Earl of Mount Edgcumbe. The New Infirmary was formally opened on the 25th of July, 1896, by their Majesties the King and Queen, (then their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York), and in declaring the same open His Royal Highness the Duke of York intimated that by command of Her Most Gracious Majesty (our late lamented Queen Victoria) the Institution would in future be called the "Royal Halifax Infirmary."

The Donations towards the erection of the Royal Halifax Infirmary Buildings have been most munificent and quite unparalleled in the district, and they have enabled the Committee to erect buildings which may be truly said to be in every way suitable for their purpose and worthy of their object, and of the important and populous district which the Infirmary has to serve.

Generous gifts of £5,000 each have been made to cover the cost of four of the six Ward Pavilions at present erected, the Donors being respectively Mrs. Williams, of Moor Park, Harrogate; Miss Rawson, of Mill House, near Halifax, and other members of the Rawson family; The Right Hon. Sir Savile Brinton Crossley, Bart., Somerleyton Hall, Lowestoft; and Messrs. John Baldwin and William Baldwin, of Halifax. These Pavilions are respectively known as "Joshua Appleyard Ward," the "Rawson Ward," the "Crossley Ward," and the "Baldwin Ward."

The Royal Halifax Infirmary was utilised for the reception of Patients in November, 1896, the whole of the Patients being removed to it from the old Infirmary on the 3rd day of that month.

In 1899 the Misses Porter, of Savile Royd, contributed  $\pounds 5,000$  to cover the cost of the Ward Pavilion which is known as the "Porter Ward."

In 1910, Mrs. Marke Wood, of Liverpool, (daughter of the late Mr. H. C. McCrea) contributed £5,000 to cover the cost of the Ward Pavilion which is known as the "McCrea Ward."

In 1921 an Open Air Ward was added, this being endowed by the Will of the late Miss Ann Holt by £5,000.

In 1925 the Linford-Moore Kitchenman Ward built from the proceeds of a Legacy of £5,000, and accumulations from 1907 to 1924, supplemented by donations of £2,000 from Mr. Frank Lee, J.P., and £1,000 each from Sir William Bulmer and Sir Harold Mackintosh, was opened as a Maternity Ward by H.R.H. Princess Mary, Vicountess Lascelles. The building contains four wards of four beds each and tour wards of one bed each.

The cost of the garden in front of the Ward (£500) was defrayed by Mr. John E. Whittaker of Halifax.

Also in 1925 a new X Ray Ward was built and equipped with the latest X Ray Apparatus through the generosity of Mr. Joseph Whitaker, J.P., who defrayed the cost of building new rooms for the Orthopoedic Department under the Ward, and new Nurses' Bedrooms over the Ward. The cost amounted to  $\pounds$ 7,500 and the gift was made by Mr. Whitaker in memory of his parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. Richard Whitaker, and his son, the late Dr. Frederick Whitaker, M.A., M.B., B.C. (Cantab.), who for some time prior to the Great War rendered valuable service to this Institution as a Member of the Honorary Medical Staff. The new X Ray Ward was opened on July 29th, 1925, by the Rt. Hon. Lord Somerleyton, G.C.V.O.

Also in 1925 a new Orthopoedic Department was equipped, and "The Ex-Mayors' of Halifax Fund" and accumulations amounting to  $\pounds 859$  17s. 3d., were used for this purpose.

In 1926 the Samuel Watkinson Operation Theatre was built and equipped with the latest appliances, the heating and ventilation forming a special feature. A donation of  $\pounds 5,000$  was given for the Building and Equipment of this Theatre by Mr. Samuel Watkinson, Senior, of Shelf Hall, near Halifax (in memory of his father and mother, his first wife, his eldest son James and his daughter Annie, as an expression of gratitude for the good health with which he has been blessed and the desire to help others) and the Theatre was formally opened on October 20th, 1926, by Sir Berkeley Moynihan, K.C.M.G., C.B., President of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.

In 1927 the late Mr. Ernest Shaw Redman, of Well Royd, Halifax, gave £ 10,000, to the Infirmary for the purpose of building a Pathological Laboratory and two Open Air Wards, and stipulated that any balance should be placed to the Endowment Fund. Unfortunately Mr. Redman died before the completion of the buildings. The cost of the buildings including equipment, was £7,000, leaving £3,000 to place to the Endowment Fund. On the day of the opening it was announced that Mr. Redman's Executors had given a further sum of  $f_{1,000}$  to the Endowment Fund, making in all £4,000 for that Fund. The formal opening of these extensions was carried out on October 24th, 1928. The Pathological Laboratory was opened by Professor Stewart, of Leeds; the Open Air Ward attached to Crossley Ward was opened by Mrs. Charles Robertshaw, wife of the President, and the Open Air Ward attached to MrCrea Ward by Mrs. Frank Lee, wife of the Ex-President.

In the seven Ward Pavilions and three Open Air Wards now in use there is accommodation for 228 In-Patients.

The Medical Staff consists of four senior Honorary Surgeons, one Physician, two Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeons, one Honorary Radiologist, two Assistant Honorary Surgeons, one Pathologist, two Honorary Dentists, and a Resident Surgical Officer, and three House Surgeons.

The income is derived from investments, annual subscriptions, workpeople's contributions, congregational collections, and donations.

Placed in the centre of a large town and parish, the Institution ministers to the wants of a district containing a population of upwards of 200,000, many of whom are exposed to special risks, and liable to accidents.

Great interest is taken in the welfare of the Institution, as is evinced by the liberal support it receives from all sections of the community.

### REPORT.

The Board of Management has pleasure in presenting to the Governors of the Royal Halifax Infirmary the Annual Report for the year ending 31st December, 1928.

The total number of persons who were treated during the year was 15,683, as against 14,795 in the previous year.

The number of in-patients in the Infirmary on January 1st, 1928, was 153, and the number of admissions during the year 3,878, making a total of 4,031 in-patients during the year, as against 3,765 in 1927, being an increase of 266.

The number of Maternity cases treated in the "Linford Moore Kitchenman Ward" was 371, and the number of children born was 344, as against 355 and 334 respectively in 1927, being an increase in the number treated of 16 and in the number of children born of 10. The number of attendances at the Ante-Natal Clinic was 1,886 as against 1,743 in 1927.

The number of beds available for patients during the year was 208 for 10 months and 228 for 2 months, and the daily average number of in-patients or beds occupied has been 184.5, as against 170.6 in 1927.

The average duration of treatment of in-patients during the year has been 17.4 days, as against 17.2 last year. The rate of mortality has been 4.3%, or deducting 45 patients who died within 24 hours of admission 3.2%, as against 4.6 and 3.6% respectively.

The average cost for the year of each in-patient treated and discharged was  $\pounds 6$  3s. 6d., as against  $\pounds 6$  7s. 1d. in 1927. The average cost per occupied bed per annum was  $\pounds 129$  6s. 7d., as against  $\pounds 134$  11s. 8d. in 1927.

Making a total of ... ... 11,652 as against 11,030 out-patients treated during the previous year. The number of Dental cases included in the above is 140, Orthopædic cases 976, and X-Ray and Sunlight cases 3,472. The number of pathological examinations since the appointment of the pathologist in July is 721.

The Board is pleased to report that the amount received from Workpeople has again provided a record, having exceeded the previous year's figure by £218. In view of the continued bad trade, the total £9,492 is very good indeed; but there are still some places where no collection is made. If these could be brought in, there is no doubt that the £10,000 figure would be reached. There is a falling off in Annual Subscriptions of £90. This is somewhat unsatisfactory and the Board is hopeful that new Subscribers will be found during the current year, There are many residents in the district whose names the Board would like to see included in the list of Annual Subscribers. The amount received from Grateful Patients shews an increase of £72. The payments for Coal, Gas, Water and Electricity shew a reduction of £594. This is partly due to lower prices of coal; but in view of the increased heating, hot water and electricity required owing to recent developments, the reduction is very remarkable and reflects great credit on the Mechanical Appliances Committee. The total ordinary income has increased by £345; but the ordinary expenditure has increased by £1,068. It has this year been possible to place only £200 to Renewals Account as against £600 in the previous year. As stated in the last Annual Report, it is desirable that £1,000 should be placed annually to Renewals Account in order to provide adequately for wear and tear of plant and other property of the Institution.

As is well known, numerous additions have been made to the Infirmary buildings during the past few years, notably the Linford Moore Kitchenman (Maternity) Ward, the Whitaker X-Ray Ward and Orthopædic Department, and the Samuel Watkinson Operating Theatre. During the year under review the generous benefaction of the late Mr. E. S. Redman has materialised in his wishes being carried out, and as a result the Pathological Laboratory and two open-air wards have been completed. The formal opening was carried out on 24th October, 1928, by Professor Stewart, of Leeds, in the presence of members of the late Mr. Redman's family and representatives of the public of Halifax. Provisional arrangements have been made whereby the Halifax Corporation is sending its pathological work to the new Laboratory instead of to Leeds as in the past, and a number of local Doctors are making use of the facilities offered. Dr. H. V. Phelon has been engaged as Pathologist, having been specially recommended for the post by Professor Stewart. As yet there is not enough work for a full time Pathologist, and Dr. Phelon only devotes part of his time to the work although

he attends every day. It is hoped, therefore, that the local practitioners will make more use of this department. It is unnecessary to enlarge on the very great benefits accruing to patients from the open-air wards, and it need only be mentioned that by the provision of Vita glass almost all of the violet rays of the sun are let into the wards.

The amount of the late Mr. Redman's gift was £10,000, and he directed that any sum not expended in the building and equipping of the Laboratory and open-air wards should be utilised in increasing the endowment fund. The cost of the buildings and full equipment was £7,000, and in additon his Executors have given a further generous donation of £1,000, with the result that a sum of £4,000 has been invested and added to the endowment fund.

It cannot be too strongly emphasized that while these improvements and additions have greatly increased the efficiency of the Institution, and made it second to none in the country, the cost of upkeep is correspondingly greater. The Board therefore makes a special appeal to those who do not already contribute to become regular subscribers. It feels that it is doing its part, to the best of its ability, by keeping the Institution thoroughly up-to-date, and it appeals to the Public to do their part by a still more generous response.

Apart from the result of the late Mr. E. S. Redman's generosity, the outstanding feature of the year under review, from the point of view of development, has been the erection of the new Nurses' Home. For some years the number of resident staff has increased regularly, but the accommodation has remained practically stationary. At the last Annual Meeting the President made an appeal for funds for a new Nurses' Home, and supplemented this with a subsequent appeal in the Press. The response was immediate and on a scale commensurate with the generous support always vouchsafed to the Institution by the public of Halifax. On closing the accounts for the year, the amount of subscriptions received towards the Nurses' Home Fund was £18,407 6s. 6d. The Board wishes to place on record its appreciation of the generous donations. It is estimated that the total cost of the new Nurses' Home including a connecting corridor to the main buildings, together with full equipment, will be approximately £20,000, and the Board appeals for the extra funds to be given so that the new Home can begin free from debt. The full list of donors to the new Home up to date, is set out later in this Report. When a definite decision was reached to proceed with the Home, it was decided to invite the Architects of Halifax and District to submit plans for competition, the adjudicators being the Building Committee. At the adjudication five plans were

submitted to the adjudicators. The plans were judged under numbers, the names of the authors not being known until after the judging. The unanimous decision was that Messrs. Walsh & Maddock were declared to be successful. Building operations were commenced in September 1928, and appreciation has been expressed on all sides at the speed with which the building is being erected. Appreciative references have also been made to the fact that the style of the new building will harmonise with that of the existing buildings. The main Hall of the new Home (to be called "The Robert Whitworth Hall") will supply a much needed addition ; it will prove of great benefit to the Nurses and Staff by whom it will be used for lectures, meetings and recreative purposes. There will be 40 bedrooms, each with running hot and cold water laid on. It only remains to add that it is hoped to complete the Home not later than the early, summer.

For a considerable time it has been felt that one of the most pressing needs in Halifax is the provision of accommodation for paying patients at the Infirmary. Between those who become patients in a private Nursing Home and the inmates of the Infirmary there is a large class of people who on the one hand cannot afford the facilities offered at the former, and on the other hand are not strictly eligible for treatment at the Infirmary as at present constituted. It may be of interest to know that in no less than 62 per cent. of voluntary hospitals in the country such accommodation is now provided, and at the time of writing this Report a sub-committee is in course of examining in detail the possibilities of such a scheme being adopted. No definite decision has, however, yet been reached, and all that can be stated at present is that the Board feels that some such provision is very desirable and hopes to be able to make a public announcement in the near future. Should such a scheme materialise, the Board does not intend to encroach on the present accommodation ; a new ward will have to be built.

It may be mentioned that the wireless installed by the Halifax Hospitals' Installations Fund Committee in 1927, has given every satisfaction and is proving a great boon to the patients.

The Gardens Committee are pleased to report another successful year. All the ground belonging to the Infirmary is now under cultivation, and, it is interesting to note, all vegetable plants (with the exception of celery) and all the flowering plants in the gardens have been raised from seed on the premises. The crops from the bush fruit trees and vegetables grown during the year amount in value to a sum of about £70. The Committee wish to thank all donors of bulbs, plants, trees, and gardening accessories. On the retirement of Mr. John Lord, Head Porter, after 36 years continuous service at the Infirmary, a presentation of a cheque for £100 was made to him, this amount having been subscribed by his numerous friends at the Infirmary, and his framed photograph was also handed to him. The ceremony was carried out by Lord Somerleyton in February 1928.

Dr. W. B. Wishart, M.B., Ch.B. (Edin.), whose period of office as Honorary Surgeon during the year had expired, was unanimously re-elected.

The Board regrets to have to record the death of Mr. A. R. Pollit, who rendered invaluable service to the Institution for many years as a member of the Board of Management, the House and other Committees. Reference must also be made to the death of Mr. Joseph Whitaker, J.P.; although Mr. Whitaker was never officially connected with the Institution, he will always be remembered for his generosity in providing the new X-Ray Ward and Orthopædic Department in 1925.

The Board is pleased to announce the receipt of the following generous bequests during the year : —

The Board desires to thank Lady Fisher-Smith and Members of the Yorkshire Voluntary Hospitals' Egg Collection Committee for the organisation of the "Infirmary Egg Day," which resulted in upwards of 37,000 eggs being handed over to the Infirmary. This is a record collection.

The Board desires to thank Mr. J. Standeven for the gift of a Centrifuge for the Maternity Ward.

The Board also wishes to thank the Collectors in Workshops, the Alexandra Rose Day Committee and Helpers, the Demonstration Committee, Infirmary Ball Committee, Ladies' Needlework Guild, the Promoters of Concerts, Operas, Cricket and Football Matches, Whist Drives and Dances, Toc H. for collecting silver paper for the Infirmary, the Local Press, and all others who have by their efforts rendered assistance.

In conclusion, in view of the increased cost of up-keep referred to above, the Board confidently appeals to the Public of Halifax for increased support. INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT.

## EXTRACTS

#### FROM THE

# Rules of the Institution.

(2). The object of the Institution is the provision of Medical and Surgical aid for persons suffering from illness or injury, who, after enquiry into their circumstances, are found unable to pay for medicine and medical attendance; and also for persons who, by reason of accident or sudden illness, are in urgent need of medical or surgical aid.

(3). Donors of £10 10s. and upwards in one Sum shall be Governors for life; and Subscribers of £1 1s. or more annually, shall be Governors during the continuance of their Subscription.

(4). Any Firm, Partnership, Society, Association, Body of Workpeople, or Body Corporate, making a Donation of Ten Guineas or upwards may, at the time of making such Donation, nominate one individual of their body to be a Governor by virtue of such Donation, at whose death such Governorship shall cease.

(5). The Clergyman or Minister (and in case there be no resident Minister, the representative) of every Church or Congregation making a Congregational Collection for the Institution of not less than One Guinea, shall be a Governor for the year ensuing.

(6). The Representative of any Society, Association, or Body Corporate, and the Representative of any Body of Workpeople of any one Employer, Firm, or Body Corporate, naking an Annual Contribution to the Institution of not less than One Guinea, shall be a Governor for the year ensuing.

(7). The Executors of a Testator making a bequest of  $\pounds 10$  10s. or upwards may, within twelve months after the death of such Testator, nominate in writing one of themselves, or the widow, or one of the children of such Testator, to be a Governor by virtue of such bequest, at whose death such Governorship shall cease.

(9). An Annual Subscription of One Guinea, or a Donation of Ten Guineas, shall confer the privilege of having on the books one Out-Patient at a time; an Annual Subscription of Two Guineas, or a Donation of Twenty Guineas, one In-Patient or two Out-Patients at a time, and so on progressively for every additional subscription or Donation. A Donor of Ten Guineas who Subscribes One Guinea annually, shall have the same right of recommending Patients, so long as he shall so subscribe, as an Annual Subscriber of Two Guineas. The above privileges shall only extend to patients eligible according to the Rules.

(10). Any Clergyman or Minister of any Church or Congregation (or in case there be no resident Minister, the representative of the Trustees of the Chapel), and the representative of any Society, Association, or Body Corporate, and the representative of any Body of Workpeople of any one Employer, Firm, or Body Corporate, making an Annual Contribution to the Institution, shall have the same privileges, in proportion to the amount of such Contribution, as are given to an individual Subscriber of the same amount by Rule 9.

(11). All Annual Subscriptions shall date from and become due on the 1st day of January.

(70). No person shall be admitted or be suffered to remain as an In-Patient who is capable of receiving equal or adequate benefit as an Out-Patient.

(71). No person chargeable to any Poor Law Authority shall be admitted as an Out-Patient, nor shall any such person be admitted as an In-Patient except in case of accident or emergency, or with the special permission of the Admission Committee.

(75). No person mentally disordered, suffering from infectious disease, in confirmed consumption, or in an incurable state shall be admitted as an In-Patient, and if admitted inadvertently, no such person shall be allowed to remain in the Infirmary except with the special permission of the Admission Committee.
