

The total number of visits in the Out-Patient Department during the year was 37,688.

Ultra Violet-Ray Cases (Sunlight)

Out-Patient Operations

During the past year 106 Patients were admitted to the Maternity Ward, and the number of births registered was 71.

The daily number of beds occupied was 133, as against 121 the previous year.

The highest number of Patients in the Hospital at any one time was 153, on March 3rd.

The average cost of each In-Patient per day was 8s.  $7\frac{1}{2}d.$ , compared with 10s. in 1926; while the average total cost of each In-Patient was £10 7s. 1d., compared with £12 1s. 8d. in the previous year.

The Accounts accompany this Report, and give full details of Income and Expenditure.

The Earl of Northbrook again accepted the office of Chairman of the Court of Governors, and his invaluable assistance and advice have been of the greatest service to the Hospital on many occasions.

Owing to reasons of health, Mr. H. J. Godwin resigned his appointment as Surgeon to the Hospital after 24 years' service on the Honorary Medical Staff. As a mark of appreciation of his services, Mr. Godwin has been appointed Honorary Consulting Surgeon to the Hospital, with six complimentary beds in the Surgical Ward.

Mr. B. H. Pidcock, F.R.C.S., the Honorary Assistant Surgeon, has been appointed Honorary Surgeon to fill the vacancy thus created.

Mr. L. B. Keyser, who was for so many years Treasurer to the Hospital, felt it necessary to sever his connection with the Committee owing to ill health.

The invaluable services which he has rendered to the Hospital are greatly appreciated.

Owing to the many calls upon his time, Mr. Noel Hanbury felt compelled to resign his position as Chairman of the Committee. Mr. Hanbury was Chairman during the years 1921-1927, and we are deeply grateful to him for all he did for the Hospital during that period. We are pleased that Mr. Hanbury is continuing to serve as a member of the Committee.

Sir James Du Boulay also found it necessary to resign his membership of the Committee owing to other duties, and we accord him our sincere thanks for his assistance and sound advice during the time he was a member.

During the year the following gentlemen were appointed to fill vacancies on the Committee:—Sir Skinner Turner, and Mr. C. C. A. Hines, who was also appointed Assistant Hon. Treasurer.

The Committee record, with the greatest regret, the death of Capt. Clayton Mitchell, R.N., at one time Honorary Treasurer to the Hospital; and of Mr. John Nicoll, for many years a generous subscriber to its funds.

Miss N. Moore, the Matron, resigned her appointment, and Miss Agnes M. Tinsdeall, Matron of the Great Yarmouth Hospital, has been appointed to succeed her.

The Whist Drive Championship was held for the fifth season in succession, and the Committee were enabled to hand over the sum of £320, as a further contribution to the Hospital. This amount makes a grand total of £1860 raised by this means since the inauguration of the scheme, and we take this opportunity of expressing to the Whist Drive Committee our very sincere thanks for their help.

During the year Col. E. Lecky Pike made a donation of £1000 for the proposed endowing a bed in memory of his aunt, the late Marchioness of Winchester.

This endowment has been invested in Local Loans 3% Stock in the names of the official Trustees of Charitable Funds.

Col. Lecky Fike also presented the G.B.E. decoration of the late Marchioness, and this has been placed in a case and is hung above the bed. We are very grateful to him for his generosity.

The Prudential Assurance Company, by a second donation of £200, have named another Cot in the Children's Ward, and we are very grateful to the Directors of the Company for their generosity.

The Committee again desire to express their gratitude to the members of the Ball Committee and to all supporters for the success of the Hospital Ball held in January, 1927. The balance remaining over after meeting the expenditure amounted to £507 IIs. 4d., which was handed over to the Hospital.

Dealing with the Contributory Scheme, during 1927 two new Branches were formed, viz.:—

East Meon.

Messrs. Wm. Hayward, Ltd.

Three Branches were cancelled, and in each case the members were merged into other Branches,

The total number of Branches is now 283.

The approximate number of persons covered for Free Maintenance remains the same, 28,000.

The total amount received from January 27th, 1927, to December 31st, 1927, is £8100. (The new system of keeping the accounts is now to date from 1st January, 1928, to 31st December, 1928).

The number of Contributors admitted to the Hospital during 1927 was 919.

The Auditor has included in the accounts only the actual sums received up to December 31st. There has since been received £1287, making a total of £9387. This is £16 less than last year.

The cost of the treatment of 919 Contributors and the charges made for those who attended other Hospitals or Convalescent Homes was £10,421, which shows £827 to be the deficit. This is satisfactory, but it is hoped that, as the Scheme increases, it will pay its way.

A successful meeting of the Contributory Scheme Collectors was held in May last, and was very largely attended. The Committee take this opportunity of thanking the Secretaries and Collectors for their untiring efforts on behalf of the Scheme, and to assure them that their help is greatly appreciated.

It was with great regret that the Committee received the resignation, owing to urgent private affairs, of Miss Seager, Administrator and Lady Almoner. Her great industry her tact, and loyalty in all matters pertaining to the Hospital were greatly appreciated. The growth of the Contributory Scheme under her administration demonstrated clearly the success of her service. She has been succeeded by Miss Stuart James, who as a qualified Almoner and good organiser is well equipped to carry on the work.

Our thanks are due to the following who have rendered invaluable help during the year, namely:—

Miss M. Stallard and her helpers, who have charge of the Surgical Dressings; Miss M. F. Urmson and her helpers, who manage the Patients' Library; Miss Thoyts and her helpers, for the care of the Hospital Linen; Mrs. Courtney and Mrs. Clowes, for allowing the Nurses the use of their

tennis courts during the summer; Mrs. Hamblin, Mrs. Ashton Sawyer, and Mrs. Bosence, for their care of the House Linen; and to all who in many other ways have assisted the Hospital still further to increase its sphere of usefulness.

Miss Freshfield again provided picnics for the Nurses and we wish to record our deep appreciation of her kindness.

The Committee would warmly welcome any assistance to enable them to provide further picnics for the Nurses during the summer months.

Thanks are due to Capt. Sawyer and the members of the Winchester Fire Brigade for continued services in connection with Fire Drill for the staff of the Hospital and for periodical inspection of the Fire Extinguishing Apparatus.

We acknowledge the great assistance rendered by the Winchester County Hospital Linen Guild. They have again contributed their welcome gifts of linen and other articles for the use of the patients, and we express our thanks to all the members of the Guild and in particular to the President, Lady Northbrook; the Honorary Treasurer, Mrs. Barrow Simonds; and the Honorary Secretary, Miss M. Urmson.

We also tender our thanks to the Proprietors of the Daily Telegraph for supplying copies of their paper for the use of the patients; and to the Proprietors of the Hampshire Chronicle and Hampshire Observer for publishing week by week the lists of gifts, notices, etc., without charge.

The response to the appeal for Eggs was again most successful, and the Committee hope that the appeal to be made in the near future will be generously met.

The appeal for Tin Foil has been a great success, resulting in an addition to our funds of no less a sum than £54 15s. od. Now that the usefulness of "waste foil" has become known it is sincerely hoped that further gifts will be received. They should be addressed to the Secretary at the Hospital.

We record with very grateful thanks the gift of a Wireless Set by the Alresford Branch of the British Legion. This gift is very gratefully appreciated.

The Building of the Out-patient Department is now approaching completion, and it is hoped that the Opening Ceremony may be performed at an early date.

The Anniversary of the Foundation of the Hospital was commemorated on the 21st October by a Service in the Chapel, when the preacher was the Rev. Lenthall Trotman Dickenson, D.S.O., M.A.

Thanks are due to those who contributed so liberally both in money and gifts of all kinds on Pound Day.

After the Service in the Chapel on St. Luke's Day, the Chairman presented prizes to the members of the Nursing Staff, as follows:—

The Committee again have to thank the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, the Resident Staff, the Chaplain, the Secretary, Matron and Nurses, and General Staff for the great care and attention shown by them in all departments towards the welfare of the patients.

Dr. Bassano continues to act as Honorary Medical Officer at the Bonchurch Convalescent Home, and to him we wish to offer our sincere thanks for his invaluable services.

We also record our thanks to Miss Pedler, the Matron of the Home, for her efficient management and her great kindness to the patients.

In conclusion, your Committee would earnestly appeal for increased numbers of subscribers. There must be many who do not realise our pressing needs. The extensions which are in hand will mean a very material increase in the annual expenditure of the Institution and to meet such expenditure, additional subscribers are very much needed.

All who are interested in the work of the Hospital and would like to pay a visit of inspection should communicate with the Secretary, who is always ready to take them round.

The above report testifies to the continued good work and constantly increased needs of the Hospital, and the Committee venture to plead very earnestly for increased support, so that the Institution may be able to carry on its work in such a way as to meet the needs with which it is faced daily.

### TREASURER'S REPORT.

An endeavour is now being made to get all the Hospitals in Great Britain to adopt a uniform system of accounts, and, as far as possible, we have conformed. One of the features of the new system is that no money received as annual subscriptions or contributions is entered into the accounts unless it was paid in before the end of the year, even if due for the past year. For example, the collections for last year's contributory scheme are not yet all paid into the Bank. In 1926 these would have been credited, but for 1927 this has not been done, and this happens in the case of annual subscriptions. This prevents comparison with past years, from the accounts as certified, but as a matter of interest for this year I will make comparisons as if the accounts had been made up in the old method.

It is a great pleasure to be able to state that our overdraft has not gone up during the year, though it stands at the uncomfortable figure of £5400. Though the certified accounts show a loss on the work this year, the actual facts are that the ordinary income exceeded the ordinary expenditure by £446. When the extraordinary income and expenditure is added there is a loss of £404 on the year, I am sure you will agree that this is a much pleasanter state of affairs than the previous year.

The next item I should like to draw your attention to is the daily cost of in-patients. This stands at 8s.  $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per day, or 1s.  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d. less than last year. The coal cost £422 less, the salaries about £562 less, and repairs £796 less, and we had an average of 133 patients instead of 121 last year.

The essential work of the Hospital shows no diminution, the in-patients went up 10 per cent., the operations increased 15 per cent., the out-patients remained the same, and the X-ray department had 19 per cent. increase of cases, mostly ultra violet ray. An increase of £582 is shewn from the Maternity department; there were 20 extra cases. We have to thank the staff that this extra work was carried out more economically than in former years.

The annual subscriptions show an increase of £98 over 1926. The donations were £313 less, in-patients paid £117 more, out-patients also £43 more, while an increase in income of £201 was derived from war pensioners. Fêtes produced £161 more this year, and a new source of income was obtained from the sale of tinfoil, amounting to £55.

The contributory scheme shows at present in the accounts the same income as last year, though, as already stated, the collections are still coming in.

It is not probably realized that the expenditure of the Hospital is now  $3\frac{1}{2}$  times that of pre-war days, and we would have been in a sorry position had not this scheme provided one-third of our income.

It is perhaps not generally appreciated how much time and care are taken to check all expenditure. When possible, tenders are obtained for all supplies, and the Contracts Committee carefully consider these. The cost of provisions has been compared with those issued by the Ministry of Labour and found satisfactory. Tell-tale graphs of electricity, gas, drugs, etc., are carefully prepared and inspected regularly to see there is no chance of leakage in any department. No pains are spared to see that proper economy is exercised in every item of expenditure compatible with efficiency.

### CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

My report this year is brief, owing to the fact of my impending resignation. I am medically advised that the work of the Hospital Chaplaincy is more than I ought to continue to undertake, owing to the very early hours of Service, and the amount of standing involved in visiting the Wards.

I shall still be residing in Winchester, and shall therefore hope to see old friends sometimes.

I have to thank various friends, and especially Mrs. Tullis and the Misses Freshfield, for most valuable kelp in enabling repairs to be carried out on two of the Chapel Altar Frontals, which were practically worn out through age.

Mrs. Tullis' practical skill and advice were most valuable and helpful, and the Misses Freshfield made it possible to have the necessary work carried into effect, by supplying in each case the balance required to complete the sum needed for repairs.

Mrs. Tullis also did much valuable and greatly needed work, in herself doing repairs which were required, and in collecting subscriptions from various kind friends, to whom also our thanks are due. The Hospital Services, &c., have been continued on the usual lines during the past year. There have always been a fair, sometimes a large, number of Communicants at the weekly Ward Communions, and latterly, the number of Communions in Chapel, which had a decided tendency to fall off, have increased, with the exception of Saints' Days, when the attendance is generally small, and sometimes non existent, however, I hope that under a new Chaplain these may also improve.

My thanks are due also, as ever, to Sister Treble and the Nurses of the X Ray Department for their constant loving, and ungrudging care to all and everything pertaining to the Chapel and its Services. I owe them a debt which I cannot possibly repay. And also I should like to thank the Nurses in the Wards who have been responsible for the preparations for the Ward Communions—the reverence and orderliness of which are due to them. They have invariably done their utmost to carry out my wishes in every way—though I fear they must sometimes have thought me a very exacting and troublesome person!

And I cannot close without recognizing Miss Hicks' invaluable help in playing the hymn at the weekly Ward Services, sometimes, I fear, at considerable inconvenience to herself.

Finally, may the blessing of God rest, now and always, on the work of the Hospital, and may He forgive my many imperfections in its service during the past three-and-a-half years!

# ALMONER'S OR SOCIAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT.

The Almoner's Department is still in a pioneer stage, and needs a little encouragement and stimulus on the social service side of the work. There is perhaps some misapprehension in the minds of certain people as to the scope of the work in this busy unobstrusive little department, which is not only a wondrous money bag where thousands of pound notes presumably drop without effort from the sky, to be eagerly and rapidly swamped up by every other department crying out for funds. However, with the co-operation of the Honorary Medical Staff and the increased facilities offered in the new Out-patient Department, it is hoped that more use, of a non-financial kind, will be made of the Almoner who—to employ an American phrase-is perhaps more aptly described as a "welfare mother." Like all mothers, she does a great deal which no one knows anything about, and hopes in the future to do much more to provide a directly human point of contact in a necessarily impersonal system.

In these days of elaborate and prolonged treatment, the number of beds are inadequate. Time presses in a busy hospital, and yet a patient not only has to be restored to health but helped to re-establish himself after the dislocation consequent on illness or accident, which is more than an isolated factor in his life. Even in the pioneer stages of an Almoner's work a great deal falls within her scope which cannot be defined, and the constructive value of which cannot be estimated in actual cash in a ledger. We all know the immense psychological influence that an undefined fear and of an acute suppressed anxiety for a dim uncertain future may exercise on the nervous system during a long illness and convalescence. Obviously if there is no link between the Hospital and the social and industrial life of the patient, there is bound to be a heavy wastage of expert medical skill, apart from financial expenditure.

The day has passed when a Hospital was looked upon merely as a place to which people went when they were ill, and from which they escaped at the earliest possible moment, without thought for the future or any understanding of the Doctor's instructions, through no one being available to interpret them. We are thankful to know that in our own Hospital, of whose age and traditions we are proud, a beginning

has been made, which we hope will lead to wider fields. We must acknowledge that we have not the facilities of the Metropolis nor any large town, and that frequently machinery of an original kind must be created to meet the demands of cases needing special care. If therefore any friends of the Hospital, and particularly those living outside Winchester, are interested in this human aspect of the work and would sometimes like to get into touch with patients trying to cope with difficult conditions in lives already difficult, their personal service and sympathetic understanding in this direction would be much appreciated.

The transport and travelling expenses of patients coming for Out-patient treatment create many complications. Offers of cars in lieu of an uncertain 'bus service would greatly increase the benefit of treatment particularly in the X-Ray, Massage, and Ultra Violet Ray Departments.

We have much pleasure in reporting that during the year 269 patients have been sent away to Convalescent Homes, and returned with renewed health and courage. A number of surgical appliances have also been supplied. Our best thanks are due to the Matrons and their staffs of the Bonchurch Convalescent Home, Ventnor, the Home of Recovery, Stoneham, the Herbert Home, Bournemouth, the Wordsworth Home, Swanage, the Children's Convalescent Home, Shedfield, St. Catherine's Home, Ventnor, and the All Saints' Convalescent Home, Eastbourne. We must also tender our thanks to the Charity Organization Society, the Guardians, the Association for the Care of the Mentally Deficient and the Blind, the United Services Fund, the King's Royal Rifle Corps, and other charitable agencies, and military funds for their kind help and co-operation.

The following are a few typical examples of cases on which encouraging results have been obtained:—

E. is a young married woman admitted as an emergency with extensive burns on head and face, necessitating very prolonged treatment. After her admission, her young and harassed husband was seen trailing about the roads with three small children, aged respectively 2, 3, and 5. The Guardians were eventually persuaded to take charge of the children and their father obtained work at sea. The patient responded well to treatment, and is now going to St. Peter's Memorial Home, Woking, for six months, after which it is hoped difficult facial operations can be commenced.

G. aged 15, has been eighteen months in Hospital suffering from osteomyelitis of leg. Her home conditions were unsuitable, so on discharge convalescence was arranged pending a permanent plan for the future. Eventually arrangements were made for her to have one year's educational training followed by two years' industrial training in Dressmaking at the Cripples Home, Halliwick, to equip her to become a self supporting citizen instead of being permanently chargeable to the ratepayers. The reports on the girl's progress at Halliwick are satisfactory, and with the continued co-operation of the Children's Fund and the grant from the Guardians, the two years' industrial training commences this Spring.

C. was attending in the Out-patient Department suffering from continued eye trouble, which did not respond adequately to treatment. A change of air and freedom from work was recommended, but attendances in Out-patients ceased, and no reply to letters was received. Through the help of an outside agency, a home visit was paid, which divulged that the patient's mother-a widow-was dependent on her son's earnings. Also, that his situation had not only been kept open for him during the period he spent in Hospital, but that on his return to work, employment in the same firm but of a kind more suitable to his eyes had been offered. The patient therefore hesitated to ask such a considerate employer for leave of absence from work for several weeks which the suggested scheme for convalescence involved. A visit to the employer, explaining the medical and social needs of the case, produced a promise that the patient's work should again be kept open for him, and convalescence was successfully arranged.

X. was a girl of 15, suffering from general debility and slight chest trouble intensified by a long walk to her work night and morning, plus poor home conditions where there was an incapable and foolish mother. The patient spent several months in Hospital, but her general health needed building up prior to an operation. After over-ruling great opposition on the part of her parents, convalescence at St. Catherine's Home, Ventnor, was arranged, where splendid progress was made. On her return to Hospital the operation was performed, and although further convalescence may be necessary, it is hoped eventually to obtain a situation for her away from unfortunate home influence.

#### EXTRACTS

FROM THE

## STATUTES AND RULES

OF THE INSTITUTION.

#### GOVERNORS.

The regulation and government of the Hospital, with full power to enact, repeal, alter, and amend all Statutes and Rules, and to appoint and dismiss all officers and servants, shall be vested in Governors qualified as hereinafter described, and assembled in their General Courts or acting in Committee.

The Governors shall consist of-

- i.—All Donors of £50 or more, in one sum, who shall be Governors for life; provided always that if such benefaction be given by a firm or partnership, one partner only shall be named by the firm within one month after the transmission of such benefaction, or in default of such nomination, the partner whose name shall stand first in the firm at that time shall be entitled to the privileges of a Governor; and it shall not be lawful for such firm to withdraw the name once entered on the list of Governors for the purpose of substituting another.
- ii.—All Subscribers of two guineas or more annually, who shall be Governors during the continuance of their subscriptions, provided always that if such subscription be paid by a Board of Guardians, Friendly or Charitable Society, Company or Firm, one representative only of such Board, Society, Company or Firm, selected as aforesaid, shall be a Governor; and it shall not be lawful for such Board, Society, Company or Firm to withdraw his name and substitute another, except at the end of any current year for which the subscription was due.
- iii.—All such Executors of persons bequeathing legacies, and such Trustees of persons giving benefactions anonymously, to the Hospital, from which not less than £200, in one sum, shall be paid to the Treasurer, in each case, after all deductions for Legacy Duty, Succession Duty, or other outgoings, as any General Court shall, after due notice think fit to elect, who shall be Governors for life, and shall be styled Honorary Governors; provided that no more than one person shall be so elected in respect of each such bequest or benefaction.

- iv.—The Chaplain and also all Members of the Honorary Medical Staff.
  - v.—Such Subscribers or Benefactors as a General Court shall after due notice, elect, whenever the number of Governors duly qualified as aforesaid shall have fallen below 50, provided always that at the time of such election the number of Governors shall not be thereby raised over 50.
- vi.—The Mayor and Ex-Mayor of the City of Winchester for the time being.

## DONATIONS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.

It is requested that Donations and Subscriptions may be paid either to the Treasurer or to the Secretary at the Hospital; or to the account of the Hospital at one of the following Banks, viz.: Lloyds Bank, Ltd., Winchester; Messrs. Hoare, 37, Fleet Street, E.C.

The following Gentlemen and Firms have kindly consented and are authorised to receive and transmit to the above any contributions which may be entrusted to them: The Manager at the several Branch Banks of Messrs. Lloyds' Banking Company; the National Provincial and Union Bank of England, Ltd., at Winchester, Alresford, and Alton; the Westminster Bank, Ltd., Winchester and Petersfield; Messrs. Gunner and Co., Bishop's Waltham; the National Provincial Bank of England, Newport, Isle of Wight.

All Subscriptions shall be paid in advance, becoming due at Lady Day, or Michaelmas, according to the date of the first payment; and each Subscriber shall be taken to be under engagement to continue his Subscription from year to year unless he shall have given notice of his intention to discontinue the same at least one month before it shall have become due. A letter shall be sent by the Secretary to every Subscriber whose Subcription shall be one month in arrear; and no person shall be entitled to any of the privileges of a Subscriber or Benefactor, or to attend any Court or Committee, until after the payment of his Subscription for the current year,

or of his Benefaction; nor shall any Governor or Member of any Committee be entitled to vote in any case unless he shall have been enrolled for three months previous in the books of the Hospital as a Subscriber or Benefactor to such an amount as would qualify him so to vote.

## RECOMMENDATION OF PATIENTS.

Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend Patients according to the following scale in the course of any one year:—

For £0 10s. 6d. One Out-Patient;

, £1 1s. 0d. Three Out-Patients;

"£2 2s. 0d. One In-Patient and Three Out-Patients, or Six Out-Patients without any In-patients.

and at the like rate for each additional Subscription of Two Guineas. For every single Guinea added to a Subscription of Two Guineas, or any multiple of Two Guineas, Three Out-Patients.

Donors of Benefactions, paid at one time, and Honorary Governors shall be entitled for each such Benefaction to all the privileges of Annual Subscribers in the recommendation of Patients and otherwise, and shall be subject to the same limitations, according to the following scale—

#### A Benefaction of :-

£25 shall be equivalent to an Annual Subscription of £1 1s. £50 , , £2 2s.

and so on at the rate of £25 for every Guinea of Annual Subscription

Persons giving both Benefactions and Annual Subscriptions shall be entitled to all the advantages, and be subject to the limitations of both, reckoned jointly, and not separately.

Ministers of Religion transmitting collections made in their Churches or Chapels, and Chairmen or Vice-Chairmen of Boards of Guardians, and the Chief Officers of Bodies Corporate or Societies transmitting the subscriptions of such Boards of Guardians, Bodies Corporate, or Societies, shall be entitled to recommend Patients at the rates hereinbefore fixed for Annual Subscribers.

Any Subscriber may (on application to the Secretary of the Hospital) have One In-Patient in lieu of Six Out-Patient Letters of Recommendation.

## ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

All communications regarding the Admission of Patients must be addressed to the Secretary.

The Admission of Patients shall be under the following regulations:—

### IN-PATIENTS.

In-Patients will be received on any day of the week between the hours of 10 and 2, and preferably on Wednesdays, but in cases of accident or emergency one of the Resident Medical Officers, or in their absence, the Matron, shall admit Patients without recommendation, and without delay, at any hour of the day or night. Except in cases of Emergency, every Patient will be required to obtain a Subscriber's Letter of Admission with the accompanying Medical Certificate signed by a Medical Practitioner. Members of the Contributory Scheme will obtain a Certificate from the Collector, which must be signed by their own Doctor. A note from the Patient's usual Medical Attendant will be considered sufficient.

All Letters of Admission with the Medical Certificate or letter must be forwarded beforehand to the Secretary, who will advise as to the date of the Patient's admission.

Every In-Patient Letter of Admission is available for six weeks only from the date of admission of the Patient. If it is necessary for the Patient to remain in the Hospital beyond this period a fresh letter will be required.

No person shall be received as a patient, except in cases of accident or emergency, unless he or she be recommended by a Subscriber or Benefactor, qualified as aforesaid, whose subscription or benefaction is paid, and whose right of recommendation has not been exhausted; nor unless he or she shall comply with all the regulations, and shall be free from all the disqualifications to be set forth from time to time in the Rules of the Establishment, and shall also be reported by the Physician or Surgeon as probably curable or capable of great benefit, and shall satisfy the Committee that he or she is a proper person for admission and unable to pay for medical or surgical attendance, medicines, and dressings except as provided by the Rules; nor shall any person be admitted into the house as an In-Patient unless the Physician or Surgeon shall also report that the case is one which cannot be equally relieved, so far as regards advice, medicines, and dressings, if the person recommended be made an Out-Patient.

Domestic Servants, while in place, may be admitted as In or Out-Patients, and their employers shall be invited to give a donation to the funds of the Hospital.

No Patient discharged for wilful non-attendance, irregularity, or disorderly behaviour shall be re-admitted into the house, or received as an Out-Patient, upon any recommendation whatever, unless by the special resolution of the Committee, entered upon their minutes with the reason assigned.

Whenever there shall be want of accommodation in the Hospital for the admission of such In-Patients as are qualified according to the Statutes and Rules of the Charity, the preference shall be given in accordance with the apparent urgency of the case.

#### OUT-PATIENTS.

The following persons only may be admitted as Out-Patients:—

a. Those who require treatment for diseases of the eye.

For serious dental treatment.

For diseases of the ear, nose, and throat.

For treatment by electricity, X Rays, or Finsen Light.

And similar persons whose cases need consultation, but not treatment.

b. Any persons who have been In-Patients of the Hospital, or who have been treated as Casualties, and whom the Honorary Medical Staff wish to treat during convalescence.

Letters of Recommendation for the admission of Out-Patients shall not be available (except for treatment in the Dental Department) unless signed by a Medical Practitioner, except in the case of Members of the Contributory Scheme, who will obtain a Certificate from the Collector, which must be signed by their own Doctor.

Out-Patient Letters are available for six weeks only from the date of admission of the Patient.

All Out-Patients shall provide all bottles and gallipots for the reception of medicines and applications prescribed for them, or shall deposit with the Dispenser such sums as may, from time to time, be ordered in respect of any articles of this kind which may have been lent to them from the Dispensary; from which deposit the Dispenser shall, at their discharge, deduct the value of any such bottles or gallipots as shall have been lost or damaged.

It shall nevertheless be permitted to the Dispenser to lend such bottles and gallipots as may be required by an Out-Patient on his or her first admittance.

All Out-Patients shall attend at the times appointed by the Physicians or Surgeons, and, if they absent themselves twice together, without leave from their Physician or Surgeon, they shall be discharged.

Out-Patients who are suffering from rupture may be supplied with a properly fitting truss on presentation of a Subscriber's letter of recommendation; in the case of young children the truss may be exchanged once or twice for one of a larger size, provided that the whole cost does not exceed seven shillings in respect of any one letter. If in such cases attendance and medicine are also required an additional letter of recommendation must be presented.

In the case of Children, School Inspection Certificates will not be accepted as sufficient; they will be required to produce a Note signed by their usual Medical Attendant.

New cases will be seen in the Out-Patient Department on Wednesdays only at 11 a.m.

Patients must attend on Fridays, at 2 p.m.

## ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT.

Patients requiring treatment in the Electrical Department must attend on Wednesdays at 11 a.m. to consult the Surgeon or Physician for the week, as the case may be, after which the times of attendance will be fixed by the Resident Medical Officers.

Note.—The times of attendance in the Out-Patient Department are subject to alteration, which will be duly announced in the "Hampshire Chronicle" and "Hampshire Observer."

## VISITS OF FRIENDS.

Visitors are admitted to see Patients under the following regulations:— ADULTS.

Sunday and Wednesday ... from 3 to 4 p.m. Saturday ... from 2 to 4 p.m.

#### CHILDREN'S WARD.

Only in cases of serious illness, by arrangement.

Not more than two persons at any one visit to a Patient; one such visit only to be permitted in one day. No food shall be taken into any Ward without permission.

Visitors can see Patients on other than Visiting days only by permission of one of the Resident Medical Officers, or (except in individual cases where it is prohibited by the Medical Officers), of the Matron. Although a Chaplain is appointed to conduct religious services in the Hospital, and to attend as spiritual adviser upon Patients who are members of the Church of England, yet any Minister of Religion shall have all possible facilities given him for attending upon Patients of his own Denomination with the permission of the Sister of the Ward, and not against the wish of the Patient.

## GRATUITIES.

No Hospital Official is allowed to accept any gratuity.

## CONVALESCENT HOME.

Patients, when convalescent, can be sent to the Convalescent Home at Bonchurch, now in connection with the Hospital. Particulars can be obtained from the Secretary.

# ROYAL HAMPSHIRE COUNTY HOSPITAL PRIVATE NURSING INSTITUTION.

#### TERMS AND REGULATIONS.

Fees:—Medical and Surgical Cases, per week, £3 3s.; half week (3 days or 3 nights), £1 11s. 6d.; per day not exceeding 12 hours, 12s. 6d.

Maternity Cases, per week, £4 4s.

Infectious Cases, per week, £3 13s. 6d., with an extra charge of 10s. 6d. for each additional case nursed. No Nurse is allowed to be responsible for more than three patients in one house.

Infectious Cases at Schools, per week, £3 13s. 6d. If there are more than three patients, £5 5s. per week. No Nurse is allowed to be responsible for more than ten patients.

Mental or Alcoholic cases, per week, £4 4s.

For any period exceeding three days the full weekly charge will be made.

For short and special attendance, as in Operations and the like, special charges are made according to the circumstances of the case.

If from want of accommodation a Nurse is obliged to return to Hospital to sleep, an extra charge of £1 1s. per week will be made.

If there are more than three cases in the same family, an extra charge will be made.

For Massage the charge shall be as follows:-

Plain Massage in Hospital or Swedish Remedial Exercises:—Half hour, 5s.; over half hour, 7s. 6d. With Electric Treatment or Radiant Heat, 7s. 6d. and 10s.

Massage at Home:—Fees 7s. 6d. for cases within the Borough boundaries, and 15s. for cases without in ordinary circumstances; Travelling Expenses extra; and for extraordinary and special cases special terms to be arranged with the Matron.

Accounts will be forwarded to the persons engaging them immediately on the departure of the Nurse or Nurses from the case, or, in the event of any case being of longer duration than 14 days, a statement of account will be rendered fortnightly. It is requested that the accounts be paid within seven days of the date of presentation. No remittances should be forwarded until an official account has been rendered.

Laundry Expenses should be paid to the Nurse by the family by whom she is employed.

Cheques, Postal, and Post Office Orders should be made payable to the Secretary, and crossed Lloyds Bank.

Registered telegraphic address, "Nursing, Winchester." Telephone, Nos. 750 and 751.

If after four weeks it be wished to retain the Nurse longer, a communication must be made to the Matron, either by letter or personally. A Nurse shall not be transferred from one Patient to another without the permission of the Matron.

## AMBULANCE.

The Hospital Motor Ambulance is available for Patients in all cases of accident or illness, except infectious diseases.

For Charges apply to the Secretary.

Private persons, other than Hospital Patients, desiring to hire the Ambulance, should also apply to the Secretary at the Hospital for terms.

Gifts of Game, Rabbits, Eggs, Vegetables, and Flowers are most acceptable presents to the Charity.

Old Linen and useful Cast Off Garments to give to Poor Patients are most valuable.

#### MEMORANDUM.

It is much desired that the Clergymen of the different parishes from which In-patients come to the Hospital would communicate with the Chaplain of the Hospital in respect to any particulars of the cases with which it may be important for the Chaplain to become acquainted.



## CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

No application to join can be entertained when the applicant is needing Hospital treatment.

#### All Patients except :- 1. The Necessitous Poor,

2. Members of this Scheme,

are required to contribute, according to their means, towards their maintenance when in Hospital.

#### BENEFITS OF JOINING THE SCHEME.

- If you are sent to the Hospital as an In-Patient, you
  will receive the best of treatment without being
  required to contribute towards your maintenance.
- 2. If you are sent to the Hospital as an Out-Patient, you will receive the best of treatment and medicine without being asked to contribute towards the maintenance of the Hospital.
- Any money which you may receive under the National Health Insurance Act will not have to be used to meet the Hospital charges for maintenance.
- 4. Free maintenance in any General or Cottage
  Hospital in Great Britain is now guaranteed to
  Members of the Scheme. This benefit is
  intended only for contributors who are suddenly
  taken ill or meet with an accident when away from
  home, and are unable to come to the Royal
  Hampshire County Hospital.
- 5. Contributions to the Hospital Contributory Scheme cover Free Maintenance in any Convalescent Home, where such treatment is ordered for an In-Patient by the Hospital Authorities. Patients are asked to pay their own travelling expenses.
- 6. Persons are eligible as contributors as long as they are resident in the District. The benefits under rule "4" are applicable to those who are living temporarily in another district.

#### HOW TO JOIN.

- Communicate with the Collector for your parish or street, giving your full name and address, and obtain a Contribution Card.
- 2. If there is no local organisation, apply direct to the Administrator, Contributory Scheme Department, The Royal Hampshire County Hospital.

#### THE RATES OF CONTRIBUTION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

2. If you are recommended to Hospital as an IN-PATIENT, forward the In-Patient Certificate to the Secretary, who will inform you when there is a vacant bed.

If as an OUT-PATIENT, bring the Out-Patient Certificate to the Out-Patient Department with you.

3. These Certificates **must** be signed by your Doctor and renewed every six weeks of treatment.

#### REPORT, 1927-28.

A special appeal was made this year for a large supply of sheets and blankets. This appeal has been met by a most gratifying response and has resulted in the contribution of over 300 sheets, 70 blankets, and a large increase in money contributions for their purchase. The Committee would especially thank the members for so readily responding to this appeal.

The supply of bed linen and blankets can now be brought up to date in all the Wards, and the two remaining Wards can be equipped with mattress covers and tickings (two Wards were fitted up with these last year).

Of recent years, it has been found that the contributions of sheets and larger articles are usually insufficient. Will Vice-Presidents kindly note this and urge all who can to give one sheet or blanket rather than half-a-dozen smaller articles?

The Guild has lost a keen supporter through the death of Miss Sandford, Vice-President for Bishop's Sutton.

Miss Escombe, Mrs. Fowler, and Mrs. Godwin, are unable to continue to act as Vice-Presidents, and the Committee would thank them very much for all their help and support in the past.
