

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.

THE Committee have much pleasure in submitting the 191st Annual Report of the Royal Hampshire County Hospital, for the year ended 31st December, 1928.

During the year the number of Patients treated to a

The total number of visits in the Out-Patient Department during the year was 20,300.

During the past year 141 Patients were admitted to the Maternity Ward, and the number of births registered was 118.

The average daily number of beds occupied was 136, as against 133 the previous year.

The highest number of Patients in the Hospital at any one time was 164 on the 18th July.

The average cost of each In-Patient per day was 8/5, compared with 8/7 in 1927; while the average total cost of each In-Patient was £9 7s. 5d., compared with £10 5s. 7d. in the previous year.

The accounts, together with the Treasurer's notes, accompany this Report, and give full details of Income and Expenditure.

The Earl of Northbrook again accepted the office of Chairman of the Court of Governors, and his valuable assistance and advice have been of the greatest service to the Hospital on many occasions.

During the year the resignation of Dr. Tullis was received, and in recognition of the valued services which he had rendered to the Institution since 1907, he was appointed an Honorary Consulting Physician to the Hospital.

Dr. C. B. S. Fuller has been appointed to the Honorary Staff, to fill the vacancy created by Dr. Tullis' resignation.

The opening of the new Out-Patient Department by His Worship The Mayor of Winchester (Councillor F. Webb Manley) on 9th June marks another step forward in the progress of the Hospital. The Department comprises an Operating Theatre, Consulting Rooms for the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, Dispensary, etc. The usefulness of the Department, together with the ease and comfort with which the work is now carried on, emphasizes the need for the same, and the Committee sincerely trust that funds will be forthcoming, in order that the debt on the building may be paid off. The gift of a Refreshment Counter by the Countess of Northbrook, enabling the Hospital authorities to supply refreshments to the patients at cost price, meets a much felt want, and is greatly appreciated.

Opportunity must here be taken to acknowledge the help rendered by the Ex-Mayor of Winchester (Councillor F. Webb Manley), who during his term of office as Mayor raised the sum of approximately £6,000 towards the cost

of the building.

The provision of other much needed improvements

must not be forgotten, viz. :-

Heating of the Hospital, which is inadequate and entirely out of date.

The Provision of an Isolation Block.

Enlargement of the Nurses' Home, in order that the nurses now accommodated in houses in the Romsey Road and St. James' Lane, may be lodged under one roof.

This will effect considerable economy in management, and be of real advantage to the Hospital.

The Committee regret to report the resignation of the Rev. E. A. Milne, and express to him their thanks for the able manner in which he ministered to the spiritual welfare of the patients and staff during his four years of office.

The vacancy has been filled by the appointment of the Rev. J. Mervyn Glass, M.A., whom we heartily welcome to the Hospital.

The Committee record, with sincere thanks, the receipt of the bequest of £3,245 7s. 10d. under the will of the late Mrs. Gertrude Blanche Fraser, to assist to maintain a bed, either medical or surgical, for the use of ladies in poor

circumstances. This money has been invested in 4% Consolidated Stock in the names of the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds. Nomination of patients for the bed is in the hands of the Committee.

The Committee also report the receipt of a Legacy of £6,000 from the late Miss Blanche Pyle, for the endowment of 6 cots in the Children's Ward, as follows:—

Mr. R. J. Harris, executor of the Will of Mrs. Fraser, and Mr. Frank Warren, one of the executors of the Will of Miss Pyle, have, in accordance with Statute 4, been appointed Honorary Governors of the Hospital.

Other Honorary Life Governors appointed during the year were Captain H. B. Blackett, executor of the Will of the late Rev. J. C. Blackett, from which the Hospital benefited by the sum of £450, and Mr. Herbert William Butler, executor of the Will of the late Mrs. M. A. E. F. Coombs, from whose estate the Hospital has, to date, received the sum of £3,957 11s. 6d.

Other Legacies received during the year were as follows:—

The Whist Drive Championship was held for the 6th season in succession, and the Committee were enabled to hand over the sum of £260 as a further contribution to the Hospital. This amount makes a grand total of £2,120 raised by this means since the inauguration of the scheme, and we take this opportunity of expressing to the Whist Drive Committee and to Mr. Maslen our very sincere thanks for their help.

The Committee again desire to express their gratitude to the members of the Ball Committee, and to all supporters for the success of the Hospital Ball held in January, 1928. The balance remaining after meeting the expenditure amounted to £482 16s. 6d., which was handed over to the Hospital.

Three branches were cancelled, and in each case the members were merged into other branches.

The total number of branches is now 288.

The approximate number of persons covered for Free Maintenance is now 30,000.

The total amount received from January 1st, 1928, to December 31st, 1928, is £9,958, an increase of £494 over the amount received from 1st January to 31st December, 1927.

A successful meeting of the Contributory Scheme Collectors was held in June last, and was very largely attended.

We must express our heartfelt gratitude to the hundreds of our helpers scattered throughout the county, and we can assure them that the help and assistance they give us are much appreciated.

The appeal by the Matron for eggs for pickling purposes was answered by the receipt of nearly 23,000 eggs, and the donors are hereby thanked most sincerely for their help, which has been the means of providing puddings, etc., made with eggs instead of egg substitute during the winter months. The Committee hope that the appeal to be made in the near future will be generously met.

Our thanks are due to the following who have rendered invaluable help during the year, namely:—

Miss M. Stallard and her helpers, who have charge of the Surgical Dressings; Miss M. F. Urmson and her helpers, who manage the Patients' Library; Mrs. Thoyts and her helpers, for the care of the Children's Ward Linen; Mrs. Courtney and Mrs. Clowes, for allowing the Nurses the use of their tennis courts during the summer; Miss Urmson and her helpers for marking all the blankets; and to all who in many other ways have assisted the Hospital still further to increase its sphere of usefulness.

Miss Freshfield again provided summer outings for the Nurses, and the Committee wish to record their deep appreciation of her kindness.

Thanks are due to Captain Sawyer and the members of the Winchester Fire Brigade for continued services in connection with Fire Drill for the staff of the Hospital, and for periodical inspection of the Fire Extinguishing Apparatus.

We acknowledge the great assistance rendered by the members of the Winchester County Hospital Linen Guild. They have again contributed their welcome gifts of linen and other articles for the use of the patients, and we express our thanks to all the members of the Guild and in particular to the President, Lady Northbrook; the Honorary Treasurer, Miss Gillson and the Honorary Secretary, Miss M. Urmson.

We also tender our thanks to the Proprietors of the Daily Telegraph for supplying copies of their paper for the use of the patients; and to the Proprietors of the Hampshire Chronicle and Hampshire Observer for publishing week by week the lists of gifts, notices, etc., without charge.

The appeal for Tinfoil has been a great success, resulting in an addition to our funds of the sum of £62 6s. 4d. Now that the usefulness of "waste foil" has become known it is sincerely hoped that further gifts will be received. They should be addressed to the Secretary at the Hospital.

The Anniversary of the Foundation of the Hospital was commemorated on the 18th October by a service in the Chapel, when the preacher was the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Southampton.

After the service the Chairman presented prizes to the members of the Nursing Staff, as follows:—

Nursing—Nurse Barker; Anatomy and Physiology—Nurse Walsham; Medicine—Nurse Sybil Hooper; Surgery—Nurse Fowgies; Nursing (1927)—Nurse L. E. Jones. It may be of interest to the Governors to know that this Hospital is the Headquarters of the Local Branch of the College of Nursing. The Hospital continues to be affiliated to the National Hospital, Queen Square, Bloomsbury, for the interchange of nurses for training with the Bromley (Kent) Cottage Hospital, and also with the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Heart and Lungs, for a similar purpose.

Thanks are due to those who contributed so liberally both in money and gifts of all kinds on Pound Day.

During the year a Scialytic Light, the ideal light for the purpose, together with a new operating table, have been provided for the main Operating Theatre, thus bringing the equipment of that department fully up to date.

The Committee again have to thank the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, the Resident Staff, the Chaplain, the Secretary, Matron and Nurses, and General Staff for the great care and attention shown by them in all departments towards the welfare of the patients.

Dr. Bassano continues to act as Honorary Medical Officer at the Bonchurch Convalescent Home, and to him we wish to offer our sincere thanks for his invaluable services.

We also record our thanks to Miss Pedler, the Matron of the Home, for her efficient management and her great kindness to the patients.

In conclusion, your Committee would earnestly appeal for increased numbers of subscribers. There must be many who do not realise our pressing needs. The extensions which are in hand will mean a very material increase in the annual expenditure of the Institution and to meet such expenditure additional subscribers are very much needed.

All who are interested in the work of the Hospital and would like to pay a visit of inspection should communicate with the Secretary, who is always ready to take them round.

The above report testifies to the continued good work and constantly increased needs of the Hospital, and the Committee venture to plead very earnestly for increased support, so that the Institution may be able to carry on its work in such a way as to meet the needs with which it is faced daily.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

The new uniform system of accounts adopted last year makes things still rather confusing for any one studying the balance sheet as certified when any attempt is made to compare with former years. I will not attempt to make things more confusing by attempting to explain the reasons for this but will endeavour to give you a general view of the actual state of affairs.

The overdraft is about £300 more than last year, while our endowments have gone up by £10,245. No Treasurer would be more grateful than I am for this excellent state of affairs. The certified accounts show we spent £666 less than our income, but the actual position is that we spent £334 more than our income, just the increase on our overdraft.

We spent approximately the same as the previous year, and the essential work of the Hospital showed a normal increase: a very happy position you will agree. The number of in-patients treated increased by 10 per cent; the outpatients in the same proportion; 23 per cent more Maternity cases. The X-Ray, Electrical and Massage Department shows an increase of 24 per cent in the number of treatments given to patients. Last year we had to thank the staff for their economy and from these facts we have still more reason to do so this year.

Economy is certainly shown in the housekeeping. This cost 2/6 less per week per patient and we have often been assured by our lady visitors that the staff and patients have never been better catered for. The real reason for this is that, though the number of patients treated have increased slightly, the number of staff fed to do this work decreased by 8 per cent, a point your Examining Committee have been hammering away at for some years.

The total cost per patient per day is shown by the accounts to have gone down 2d, it now stands at 8/5, but if the old system of accounts had been retained, I am quite sure the cost per day would have been reduced by at least 6d. Consider these two items (1) £500 for Gifts in Kind not included last year; (2) Nurses now train for four years instead of three; an extra cost of £372.

The accounts show a greatly increased revenue from the Contributory Scheme, but the actual increase is £549, and the treatment of the members cost £1,045 more than last year, so that this Scheme pays 89 per cent of the cost to the Hospital; a decline of 3 per cent on last year. It is to be hoped that Sir Skinner Turner's hard work in Eastleigh and other districts will show big returns next year. I leave to the Chairman the task of thanking the army of honorary collectors who achieve this wonderful work which produces such a large part of our income.

In comparing details of the accounts with former years it should be noted that some of the large increases are mainly due to the new method of accounting adopted last year, when arrears were not entered after the end of the year as in former times; this will right itself in time.

The accountants have appreciated our investments by £2,000 this year. This does not increase our income but would show that our investments seem to be well placed.

Our Private Nurses staff only made a profit of £53 this last year. They were as low in number as four, this has been put right but it is only in times of epidemics like the present that one finds the difficulty of getting trained nurses. A main part of the work of this Hospital is to train Nurses. I shall be glad if people who do not subscribe to the Hospital because it is of no use to them, will consider this point.

Gifts in kind is a new item started this year, they have been valued at £501. This is a large sum and it will be appreciated how much we owe to our friends who produce this result, especially the Linen Guild.

It is not generally known that Bonchurch Convalescent Home in the Isle of Wight belongs to this Hospital and is managed by a separate Committee who collect the funds to run the home. In-patients from our Hospital get a holiday for the nominal sum of 15/- per week. It is an excellent work for which the patients express much gratitude. The friendly feeling with the local Societies is shown by the donation of £15 15s. from the Ventnor United Friendly Societies. Miss Freshfield will be glad to hear from anyone who will help this branch of the work.

Our Provisions cost us £821 less last year, £410 represents the proportionate reduction in consequence of smaller numbers being fed, falling prices a little more, but mainly to the economy of the staff. For the same reasons we paid £37 less for water and £70 less for Gas. Reduced prices made a saving of £181 in coal and £52 in electricity.

Our cover for Insurance in buildings, stock, and furniture has gone up by £64,000 during the last two years, but our Insurance premium in future will show a reduction of £45, and we have to thank the Royal Insurance Company for this wonderful bargain.

Comparison with other Hospitals.

At the risk of making my report too long, but a point which is to me one of great satisfaction, is in comparison with other Hospitals of the same size we find that we are in agreement. The average cost per bed for Provisions, Surgery, Domestic and Salaries and Wages is £131.05 while our figure is £132.45.

THE CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

This report is of necessity brief, owing to the short time since I took up the work. My first word is one of thanks to my predecessors whose devotion to duty has paved the way for those who follow. As your Chaplain, my experience has not been long, still, long enough to tell of the love of service and of a deep sense of privilege in being charged by your Committee to direct the spiritual work and to minister to the sick and suffering.

Your beautiful Chapel is a real treasure, and many have gone away with its happy and holy recollections. It is daily cared for by the hands of those who love it. Our Services have been times of blessing, and the Communions in Chapel and Wards have brought spiritual vision and fellowship. Some who have "passed through" write to say that these times shall never be forgotten.

For all this we thank God and take courage. My work has been brightened by the kindly thought and unfailing courtesy of many. To the Secretary, Matron, Sisters, indeed, all the Staff, I owe a debt of thanks for their generous sympathy and support. If I may venture to add another name to the unwritten list, my thanks are offered to Sister Treble for her special help in the Chapel, and Miss Hicks at the Ward Services. Praying that the Divine blessing may rest on all our work.



EXTRACTS FROM THE STATUTES AND RULES

OF THE INSTITUTION.

GOVERNORS.

The regulation and government of the Hospital, with full power to enact, repeal, alter, and amend all Statutes and Rules, and to appoint and dismiss all officers and servants, shall be vested in Governors qualified as hereinafter described, and assembled in their General Courts or acting in Committee.

The Governors shall consist of-

- 1.—All Donors of £50 or more, in one sum, who shall be Governors for life; provided always that if such benefaction be given by a firm or partnership, one partner only shall be named by the firm within one month after the transmission of such benefaction, or in default of such nomination, the partner whose name shall stand first in the firm at that time shall be entitled to the privileges of a Governor; and it shall not be lawful for such firm to withdraw the name once entered on the list of Governors for the purpose of substituting another.
- ii.—All Subscribers of two guineas or more annually, who shall be Governors during the continuance of their subscriptions, provided always that if such subscription be paid by a Board of Guardians, Friendly or Charitable Society, Company or Firm, one representative only of such Board, Society, Company or Firm, selected as aforesaid, shall be a Governor; and it shall not be lawful for such Board, Society, Company or Firm to withdraw his name and substitute another, except at the end of any current year for which the subscription was due.
- Trustees of persons bequeathing legacies, and such Trustees of persons giving benefactions anonymously, to the Hospital, from which not less than £200, in one sum, shall be paid to the Treasurer, in each case, after all deductions for Legacy Duty, Succession Duty, or other outgoings, as any General Court shall, after due notice, think fit to elect, who shall be Governors for life, and shall be styled Honorary Governors; provided that no more than one person shall be so elected in respect of each such bequest or benefaction.
- iv.-The Chaplain and also all Members of the Honorary Medical Staff.

v.—Such Subscribers or Benefactors as a General Court shall, after due notice, elect, whenever the number of Governors duly qualified as aforesaid shall have fallen below 50, provided always that at the time of such election the number of Governors shall not be thereby raised over 50.

vi.—The Mayor and Ex-Mayor of the City of Winchester for the time being.

DONATIONS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.

It is requested that Donations and Subscriptions may be paid either to the Treasurer or to the Secretary at the Hospital; or to the account of the Hospital at one of the following Banks, viz.: Lloyds Bank, Ltd., Winchester; Messrs. Hoare, 37, Fleet Street, E.C.

The following Gentlemen and Firms have kindly consented and are authorised to receive and transmit to the above any contributions which may be entrusted to them to the Manager at the several Branch Banks of Messrs. Lloyds' Banking Company; the National Provincial Bank, Ltd., at Winchester, Alresford, and Alton; the Westminster Bank, Ltd., Winchester, and Petersfield; Messrs. Gunner & Co., Bishop's Waltham; the National Provincial Bank, Ltd., Newport, Isle of Wight.

All Subscriptions shall be paid in advance, becoming due at Lady Day, or Michaelmas, according to the date of the first payment; and each subscriber shall be taken to be under engagement to continue his Subscription from year to year unless he shall have given notice of his intention to discontinue the same at least one month before it shall have become due. A letter shall be sent by the Secretary to every Subscriber whose Subscription shall be one month in arrear; and no person shall be entitled to any of the privileges of a Subscriber or Benefactor, or to attend any Court or Committee, until after the payment of his Subscription for the current year, or of his Benefaction; nor shall any Governor or Member of any Committee be entitled to vote in any case unless he shall have been enrolled for three months previous in the books of the Hospital as a Subscriber or Benefactor to such an amount as would qualify him so to vote.

RECOMMENDATION OF PATIENTS.

Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend Patients according to the following scale in the course of any one year:—

For £0 10s. 6d. One Out-Patient;
,, £1 1s. 0d. Three Out-Patients;
,, £2 2s. 0d. One In-Patient and Three Out-Patients, or
Six Out-Patients without any In-Patients;
and at the like rate for each additional Subscription of Two
Guineas. For every single Guinea added to a Subscription of
Two Guineas, or any multiple of Two Guineas, Three Out-Patients.

Donors of Benefactions, paid at one time, and Honorary Governors shall be entitled for each such Benefaction to all the privileges of Annual Subscribers in the recommendation of Patients and otherwise, and shall be subject to the same limitations, according to the following scale:—

A Benefaction of :-

£25 shall be equivalent to an Annual Subscription of £1 1s. £50 ,, ,, £2 2s. and so on at the rate of £25 for every Guinea of Annual Subscription.

Persons giving both Benefactions and Annual Subscriptions shall be entitled to all the advantages, and be subject to the limitations of both, reckoned jointly, and not separately.

Ministers of Religion transmitting collections made in their Churches or Chapels, and Chairmen or Vice-Chairmen of Boards of Guardians, and the Chief Officers of Bodies Corporate or Societies transmitting the subscriptions of such Boards of Guardians, Bodies Corporate, or Societies, shall be entitled to recommend Patients at the rates hereinbefore fixed for Annual Subscribers.

Any subscriber may (on application to the Secretary of the Hospital) have One In-Patient in lieu of Six Out-Patient Letters of Recommendation.

ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

All communications regarding the Admission of Patients must be addressed to the Secretary.

The Admission of Patients shall be under the following regulations:—

IN-PATIENTS.

In-Patients will be received on any day of the week between the hours of 10 and 2, and preferably on Wednesdays, but in cases of accident or emergency one of the Resident Medical Officers, or in their absence, the Matron, shall admit Patients without recommendation, and without delay, at any hour of the day or night.

Except in cases of Emergency, every Patient will be required to obtain a Subscriber's Letter of Admission with the accompanying Medical Certificate signed by a Medical Practitioner. Members of the Contributory Scheme will obtain a Certificate from the Collector, which must be signed by their own Doctor. A note from the Patient's usual Medical Attendant will be considered sufficient.

All Letters of Admission with the Medical Certificate or letter must be forwarded beforehand to the Secretary, who will advise as to the date of the Patient's admission.

Every In-Patient Letter of Admission is available for six weeks only from the date of admission of the Patient. If it is necessary for the Patient to remain in the Hospital

beyond this period a fresh letter will be required.

No Person shall be received as a Patient, except in cases of accident or emergency, unless he or she be recommended by a Subscriber or Benefactor, qualified as aforesaid, whose subscription or benefaction is paid, and whose right of recommendation has not been exhausted; nor unless he or she shall comply with all the regulations and shall be free from all the disqualifications to be set forth from time to time in the Rules of the Establishment, and shall also be reported by the Physician or Surgeon as probably curable or capable of great benefit, and shall satisfy the Committee that he or she is a proper person for admission and unable to pay for medical or surgical attendance, medicines, and dressings except as provided by the Rules; nor shall any person be admitted into the house as an In-Patient unless the Physician or Surgeon shall also report that the case is one which cannot be equally relieved, so far as regards advice, medicines, and dressings, if the person recommended be made an Out-Patient.

Domestic Servants, while in place, may be admitted as In- or Out-Patients, and their employers shall be invited

to give a donation to the funds of the Hospital.

No Patient discharged for wilful non-attendance, irregularity, or disorderly behaviour shall be re-admitted into the house, or received as an Out-Patient, upon any recommendation whatever, unless by the special resolution of the Committee, entered upon their minutes with the reason assigned.

Whenever there shall be want of accommodation in the Hospital for the admission of such In-Patients as are qualified according to the Statutes and Rules of the Charity, the preference shall be given in accordance with the apparent

urgency of the case.

OUT-PATIENTS.

The following persons only may be admitted as Out-Patients:—

a. Those who require treatment for diseases of the eye.

For serious dental treatment.

For diseases of the ear, nose, and throat.

For treatment by electricity, X-Rays, or Finsen Light.

And similar persons whose cases need consultation, but not treatment.

b. Any persons who have been In-Patients of the Hospital, or who have been treated as Casualties, and whom the Honorary Medical Staff wish to treat during convalescence.

Letters of Recommendation for the admission of Out-Patients shall not be available (except for treatment in the Dental Department) unless signed by a Medical Practitioner, except in the case of Members of the Contributory Scheme, who will obtain a Certificate from the Collector, which must be signed by their own Doctor.

Out-Patient Letters are available for six weeks only from the date of admission of the Patient.

All Out-Patients shall provide all bottles and gallipots for the reception of medicines and applications prescribed for them, or shall deposit with the Dispenser such sums as may, from time to time, be ordered in respect of any articles of this kind which may have been lent to them from the Dispensary; from which deposit the Dispenser shall, at their discharge, deduct the value of any such bottles or gallipots as shall have been lost or damaged. It shall nevertheless be permitted to the Dispenser to lend such bottles and gallipots as may be required by an Out-Patient on his or her first admittance.

All Out-Patients shall attend at the times appointed by the Physicians or Surgeons, and, if they absent themselves twice together, without leave from their Physician or Surgeon, they shall be discharged. Out-Patients who are suffering from rupture may be supplied with a properly fitting truss on presentation of a Subscriber's letter of recommendation; in the case of young children the truss may be exchanged once or twice for one of a larger size, provided that the whole cost does not exceed seven shillings in respect of any one letter. If in such cases attendance and medicine are also required an additional letter of recommendation must be presented.

In the case of Children, School Inspection Certificates will not be accepted as sufficient; they will be required to produce a Note signed by their usual Medical Attendant.

New cases will be seen in the Out-Patient Department on Wednesdays only at 11 a.m.

ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT.

Patients requiring treatment in the Electrical Department must attend on Wednesdays at 11 a.m. to consult the Surgeon or Physician for the week, as the case may be, after which the times of attendance will be fixed by the Resident Medical Officers.

NOTE.—The times of attendance in the Out-Patient Department are subject to alteration, which will be duly announced in the "Hampshire Chronicle," "Hampshire Observer," and the "Andover Advertiser."

VISITS OF FRIENDS.

Visitors are admitted to see Patients under the following regulations:—

ADULTS.

Sunday and Wednesday from 3 to 4 p.m. Saturday from 2 to 4 p.m.

CHILDREN'S WARD.

Only in cases of serious illness, by arrangement.

Not more than two persons at any one visit to a Patient; one such visit only to be permitted in one day. No food shall be taken into any Ward without permission.

Visitors can see Patients on other than Visiting days only by permission of one of the Resident Medical Officers, or (except in individual cases where it is prohibited by the Medical Officers), of the Matron. Although a Chaplain is appointed to conduct religious services in the Hospital, and to attend as spiritual adviser upon Patients who are members of the Church of England, yet any Minister of Religion shall have all possible facilities given him for attending upon Patients of his own Denomination with the permission of the Sister of the Ward, and not against the wish of the Patient.

GRATUITIES.

No Hospital Official is allowed to accept any gratuity.

CONVALESCENT HOME.

Patients when convalescent, can be sent to the Convalescent Home at Bonchurch, now in connection with the Hospital. Particulars can be obtained from the Secretary.

ROYAL HAMPSHIRE COUNTY HOSPITAL PRIVATE NURSING INSTITUTION.

TERMS AND REGULATIONS.

Fees:—Medical and Surgical Cases, per week, £3 13s. 6d.; half-week (3 days or 3 nights), £1 16s. 9d.; per day not exceeding 12 hours, 15s.

Maternity Cases, per week, £4 4s.

Infectious Cases, per week, £3 13s. 6d., with an extra charge of 10s. 6d. for each additional case nursed. No Nurse is allowed to be responsible for more than three patients in one house.

Infectious Cases at Schools, per week, £3 13s. 6d. If there are more than three patients, £5 5s. per week. No Nurse is allowed to be responsible for more than ten patients.

Mental or Alcoholic Cases, per week, £4 4s.

For any period exceeding three days the full weekly charge will be made.

For short and special attendance, as in Operations and the like, special charges are made according to the circumstances of the case.

If from want of accommodation a Nurse is obliged to return to Hospital to sleep, an extra charge of £1 1s. to £1 15s. per week will be made, according to the number of meals supplied by the Hospital.

If there are more than three cases in the same family, an extra charge will be made.

For Massage the charge shall be as follows:-

Plain Massage in Hospital or Swedish Remedial Exercises: Half hour, 5s.; over half hour, 7s. 6d. With Electric Treatment or Radiant Heat, 7s. 6d. and 10s.

Massage at Home: Fees, 7s. 6d. for cases within the Borough boundaries, and 15s. for cases without in ordinary circumstances; Travelling Expenses extra; and for extraordinary and special cases special terms to be arranged with the Matron.

Accounts will be forwarded to the persons engaging them immediately on the departure of the Nurse or Nurses from the case, or, in the event of any case being of longer duration than 14 days, a statement of account will be rendered fortnightly. It is requested that the accounts be paid within seven days of the date of presentation. No remittances should be forwarded until an official account has been rendered.

Laundry Expenses should be paid to the Nurse by the family by whom she is employed.

Cheques, Postal, and Post Office Orders should be made

payable to the Secretary, and crossed Lloyds Bank.

Registered telegraphic address: "Nursing, Winches-

ter." Telephone: Nos. 750 and 751.

If after four weeks it be wished to retain the Nurse longer, a communication must be made to the Matron, either by letter or personally. A Nurse shall not be transferred from one Patient to another without the permission of the Matron.

AMBULANCE.

The Hospital Motor Ambulance is available for Patients in all cases of accident or illness, except infectious diseases. For Charges Apply to the Secretary.

Private persons, other than Hospital Patients, desiring

to hire the Ambulance, should also apply to the Secretary at the Hospital for terms.

Gifts of Game, Rabbits, Eggs, Vegetables, and Flowers are most acceptable presents to the Charity.

Old Linen and useful Cast-Off Garments to give to Poor Patients are most valuable.



Applications under B Class must be made to the Administrator, who will submit them to the Contributory Scheme Sub-Committee.

Members must remember that the Maternity Ward is not included in the Contributory Scheme; also that every case must be accepted by the Physician or Surgeon of the Hospital as suitable for Hospital treatment, and only genuine Hospital cases may be treated.

Treatment provided by the various Public Health

authorities is not included in the benefits.

The benefits of the Scheme apply only to cases which ARE, and only for as long as they REMAIN, suitable for Hospital treatment. Cases admitted and found to be, or after investigation in the wards or Out-Patient Department to have become, unsuitable cannot continue to receive Hospital treatment.

IF YOU ARE ORDERED TO THE HOSPITAL.

 Take or send your Contribution Card to your Collector, and obtain an In or Out-Patient Certifi-

cate as necessary.

2. If you are recommended to Hospital as an IN-PATIENT forward the In-Patient Certificate to the Administrator, Contributory Scheme Department, who will inform you when there is a vacant bed. If as an OUT-PATIENT, bring the Outpatient Certificate to the Out-Patient Department with you.

3. These certificates **must** be signed by your Doctor and must be renewed every six weeks of treatment.

NOTE.—As all Collectors give their services voluntarily, the Contributors are requested to assist them by making their work as easy as possible.

IF YOU ARE ALREADY A CONTRIBUTOR.

Please help the Hospital by telling everyone you can of this Scheme.

No application to join can be entertained when the applicant is needing Hospital Treatment.
