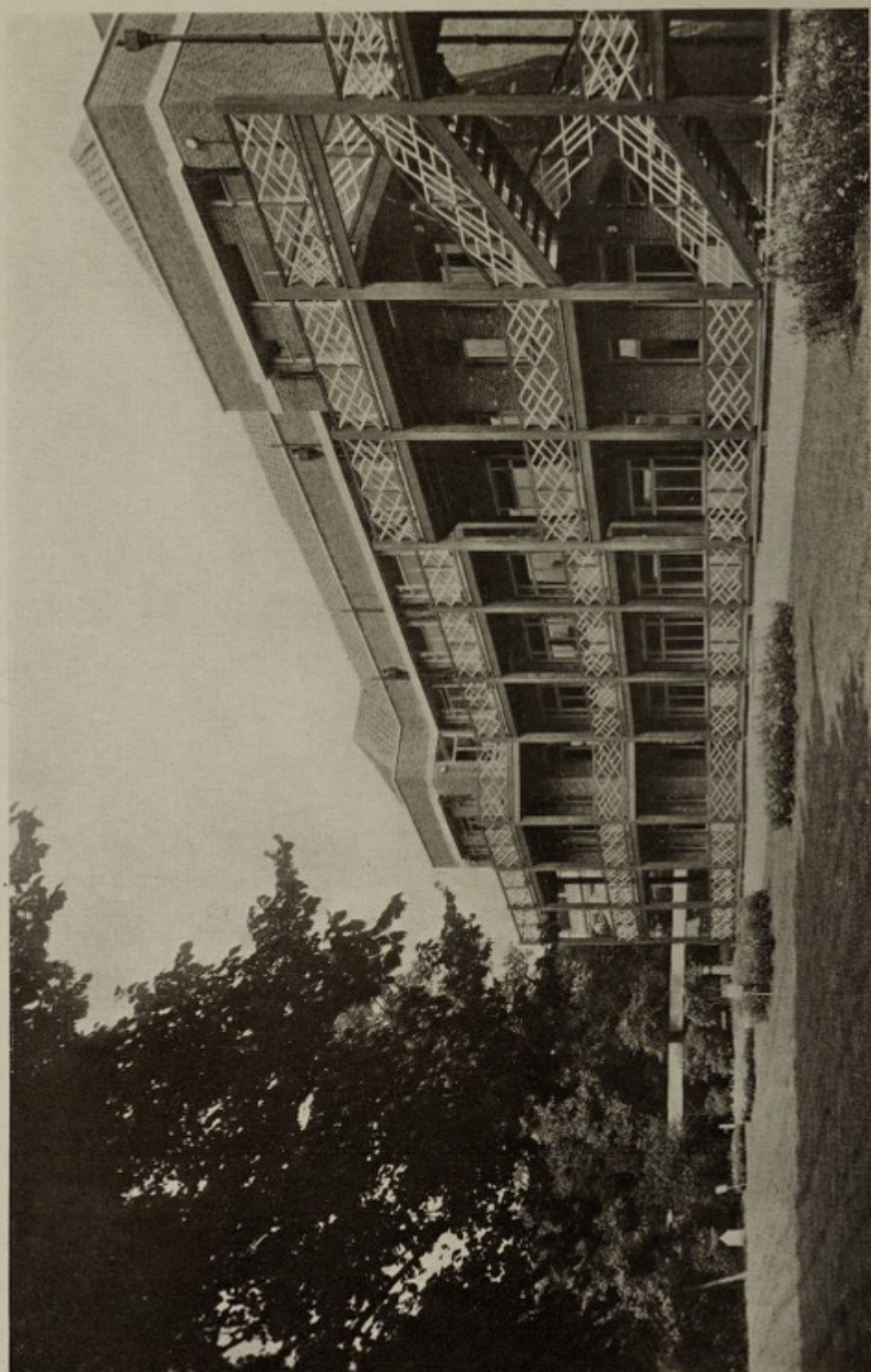

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1930.

During the past year a new era in the history of the Hospital was inaugurated when the Isolation Block for puerperal fever and puerperal pyrexia, and the Research Laboratory in connection with it, were completed upon the new site in Hammersmith, and opened for patients and research work.

The Opening Ceremony of the Isolation Block was performed by H.R.H. Princess Mary, Countess of Harewood, on Thursday, 10th July, in the presence of a large number of Governors and supporters of the Hospital. After Sir Almroth Wright had spoken on the value of the special facilities which would now, for the first time in medical history, be provided for intensive investigation into the causes of puerperal fever, Her Royal Highness proceeded to declare the building open, and made an inspection of the new Hospital, the Nurses' Home, the "Invermead" Auxiliary Hospital, and "Longthorpe" Ante-natal Department, and evinced the greatest interest in all branches of the Hospital's work.

The Committee have the gratification of reporting that subsequently Her Royal Highness graciously consented to become Vice-Patron of the Hospital.

The Research Laboratory was completed and equipped by the end of the year, and research work was at once commenced. The Committee desire to express their grateful thanks to the Medical Research Council for the keen interest they have shown and for the practical help they have given in providing the services of the Director of the Research Laboratories and of one of his assistants; the help given by the Council is warmly appreciated.

The first patient was admitted to the Isolation Block on the 6th September, and by the end of the year 53 had been received. It is gratifying to be able to report good results, the mortality rate being far below the rate in these cases throughout the country, showing that many lives have been saved.

Additional premises have been provided for an Auxiliary Hospital, Nurses' Home for the Isolation Block, District Nurses' Home for Hammersmith, two new Ante-natal Departments, and accommodation for the porters, engineers, &c., at Goldhawk Road.

AUXILIARY HOSPITAL ("INVERMEAD").

One of the houses existing on the new site at the time of purchase has been adapted as an Auxiliary Hospital for ordinary cases of labour. It provides 20 beds and has been of the greatest possible use in relieving the constant pressure on the accommodation of the Main Hospital in Marylebone. It was opened on 10th July, and 146 patients were admitted by the end of the year. The Committee are greatly indebted to Lady Howard de Walden and the Ladies' Association for providing the funds for the necessary alterations, etc., and especially to Lady Howard de Walden for her generous additional contribution towards the maintenance of this Auxiliary Hospital. This small Hospital, although temporary, is very well equipped, and owing to its pleasant position overlooking the garden, is very popular with the patients.

NURSES' HOME FOR THE ISOLATION BLOCK ("OAKBROOK").

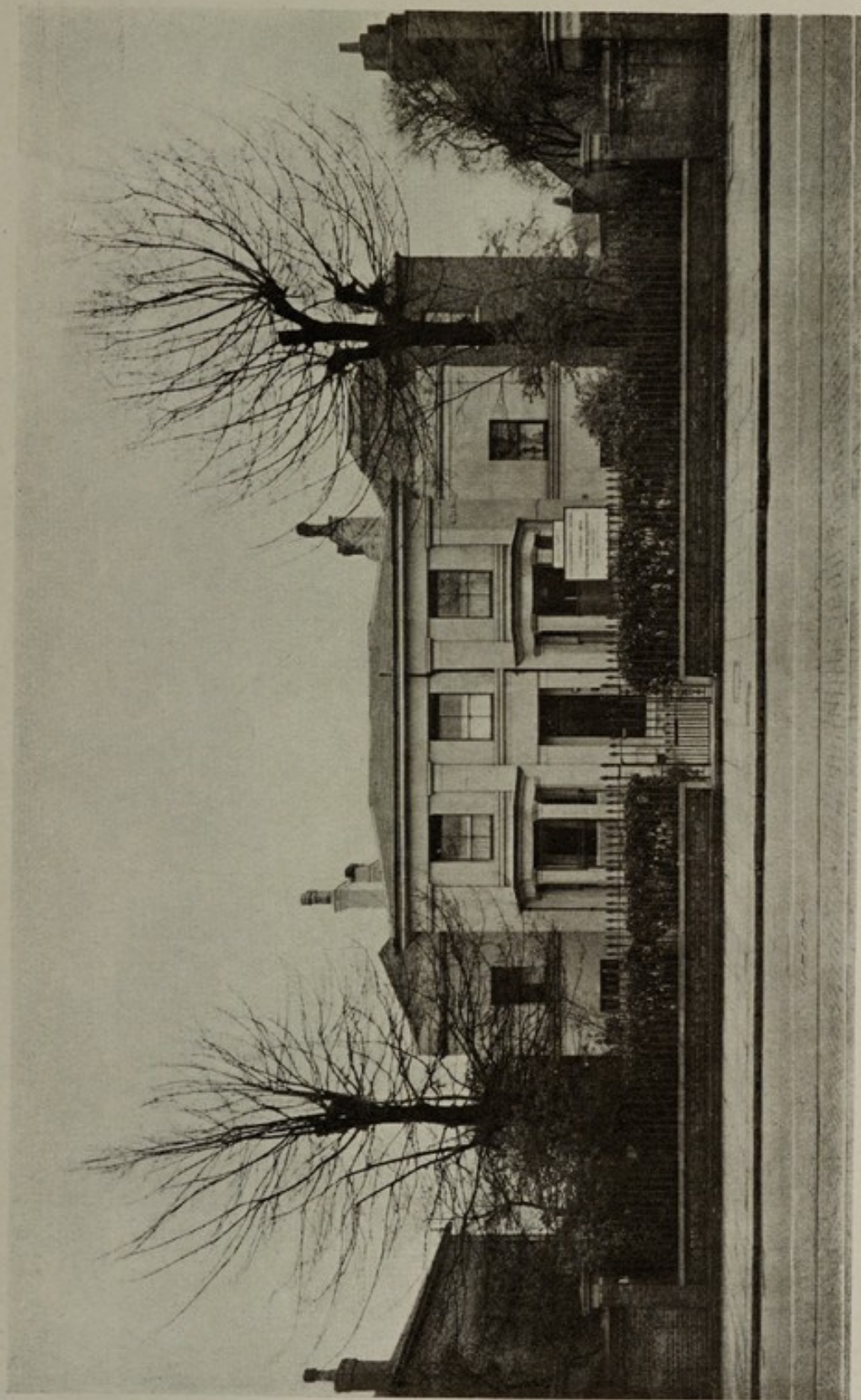
The largest house on the new site, which adjoins the Isolation Block and "Invermead," has been adapted and thoroughly renovated for use as a Nurses' Home to accommodate the Nursing Staff employed in the Isolation Block. The central kitchens are here, and all food for the Isolation Block and "Invermead" is cooked here and conveyed by electrically-heated food trolleys, passing along covered ways, to the two Hospitals. A total of 22 Nurses and domestic staff reside here.

ANTE-NATAL DEPARTMENT AND DISTRICT MIDWIVES' HOME FOR HAMMERSMITH ("LONGTHORPE LODGE").

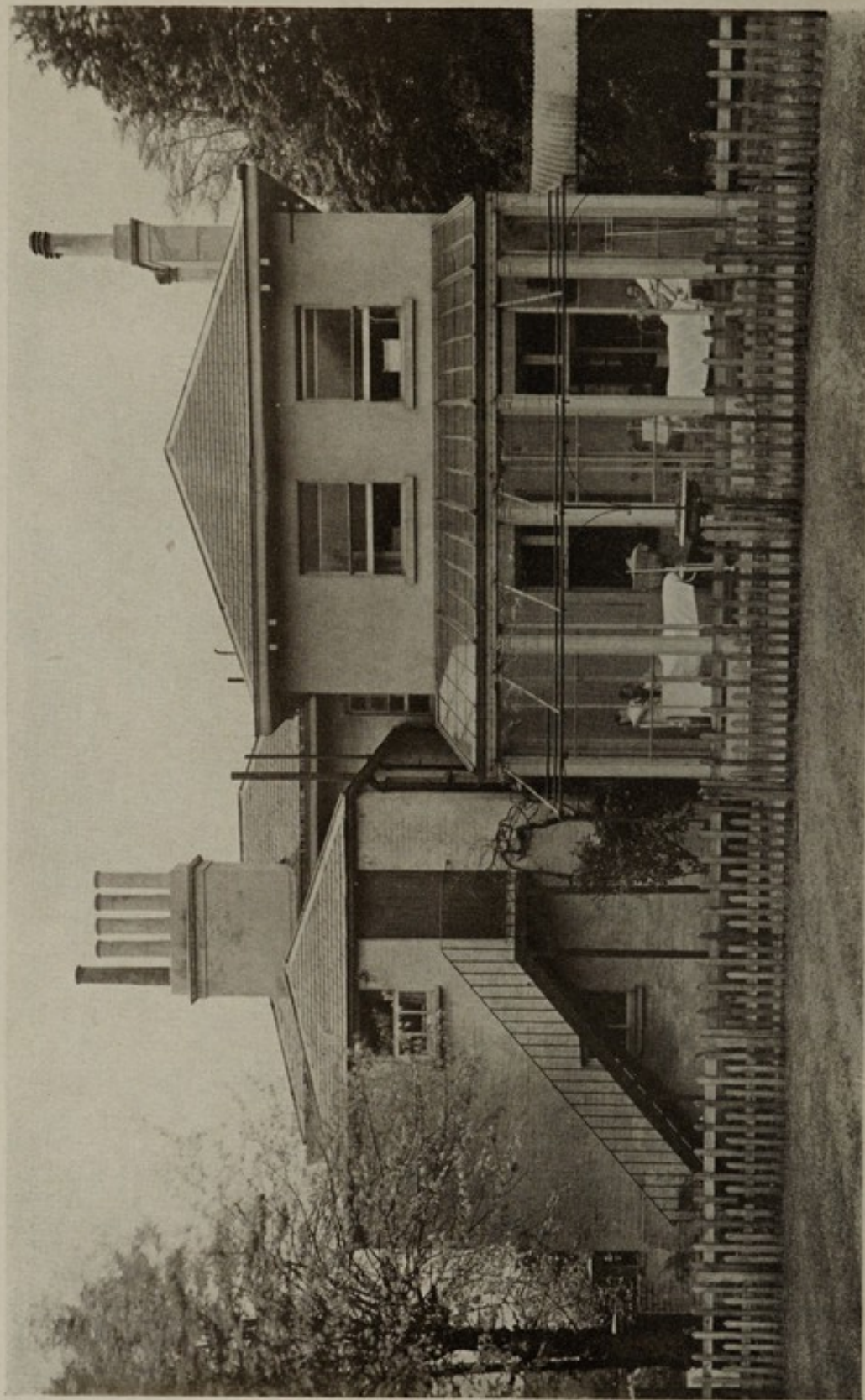
Another house existing on the new site was opened on 28th April after adaptation for the above uses. There is now an average attendance of 20 at each Ante-natal Session, and the District Midwives attend about 20 women per month in their own homes. In addition, a part of the house provides accommodation for the nurses working in the Auxiliary Hospital.

NEW ANTE-NATAL DEPARTMENT AT NORTH KENSINGTON.

These new premises are at 240 Ladbroke Grove, and were provided to replace the very limited and unsuitable premises at the District Nurses' Home (176 Ladbroke Grove). This Department was opened on the 23rd May and has proved of great value in providing adequate accommodation for this growing work. Two sessions per week are now held here, the number of patients during the year being 905.

COMPLETION OF SCHEME OF REBUILDING.

The first portion of the great scheme for rebuilding the Hospital has now been completed, but the works have absorbed most of the funds contributed for the purpose, and it will not be possible to proceed with the major portion of the scheme until a large sum—at least £200,000—is available. It is estimated that with that sum it would be possible to build one-half of the new Hospital, say 100 lying-in beds, 24 labour and ante-natal beds, and about half of the Nurses' Home, and Administrative Block, etc. On the completion of this part of the scheme, the Hospital in Marylebone could be removed to Hammersmith and the existing buildings sold. The money realised by the sale would go a long way towards meeting the cost of the remaining half of the new Hospital.

This is the position with which the Committee now have to deal, and they earnestly ask for generous support in their endeavours to bring the scheme to completion at as early a date as possible. The removal of the Hospital to Hammersmith is of the utmost importance from the point of view of the cost of maintenance, for it will be readily appreciated that a very great economy must be effected when the whole establishment is on one site. At present a heavy extra charge is entailed in having to run the Hospital in two parts, several miles from each other.

PATIENTS.

The total number of beds now available for patients has been increased from 80 to 130. This number is represented by 80 in the Main Hospital at Marylebone, 20 in the Auxiliary Hospital, and 30 in the Isolation Hospital. The total number of In-Patients during the year was 2,444 (2,245 at the Main Hospital, 146 at the Auxiliary, and 53 at the Isolation Block).

Of the 2,391 women admitted to the Main and Auxiliary Hospitals, 2,002 were married women, and 389 were single women with their first child. In considering the results, it is important to bear in mind the difference between "booked" patients and "emergency" patients—the latter being those sent to the Hospital at the last moment, generally in a critical or even moribund condition. There were 2,174 "booked" patients, of whom 7 died, giving a mortality rate of 3.2 per thousand. There were 217 "emergency" patients, of whom 6 died, giving a mortality rate of 27.6 per thousand. While this latter rate is considerably lower than in the previous year, the difference in the mortality rates shows the great importance of the ante-natal care and treatment which all "booked" patients receive for many weeks before their confinement. The value of ante-natal

care is also shown by a comparison of the infant mortality rates, for whereas in the "booked" cases the rate was 22 per thousand only, in the "emergency" cases the rate was 96 per thousand. It is for this reason that the Committee decided to further increase the facilities for ante-natal examinations, especially for out-patients. The new Departments at Hammersmith and Kensington have therefore been provided.

ANAESTHESIA FOR PATIENTS.

The Committee are very glad to report that they were able to appoint a second Resident Anaesthetist in April last, and since then nearly every patient at Marylebone Road has had an anaesthetic in her confinement. It has not hitherto been possible to provide similar facilities at the Auxiliary Hospital, owing to lack of funds, and the Committee earnestly appeal for further contributions to the Anaesthetic Fund, to enable patients at the Auxiliary Hospital to have the same advantages as those at the Main Hospital.

DISTRICT OUT-PATIENTS.

There are now four District Homes dealing with out-patients. The Hospital Midwives attended 1,771 women in their own homes (including, since May, 106 on the new Hammersmith District) as compared with 1,546 in the previous year. There was only one maternal death, being at the rate of 0.5 per thousand. There were only 10 deaths of infants, being at the rate of 5.6 per thousand.

ANTE-NATAL DEPARTMENTS.

At the three Centres (Marylebone, North Kensington, and Hammersmith) nine sessions are held weekly. The number of patients during the year was 4,873, and the total number of attendances 17,968. The patients consist of those who are booked for admission to the Hospital, or for attendance by the Hospital Midwives in their own homes, and of patients sent by doctors and midwives.

INFANT CONSULTATION CENTRE.

The work at this Centre in Marylebone continues to grow, there being 3,964 attendances with an average of 39.5 per session, as compared with 3,721 attendances and an average of 37 per session in the previous year.

TREATMENT OF INFANTS.

During the year Dr. Eric Pritchard, the Paediatrician, has re-organized the methods for the treatment of infants, with excellent results. In this work Dr. Pritchard has had the assistance of Dr. J. H. Gibbens, who was appointed Assistant to the Paediatrician early in the year.

THANKS TO THE STAFF.

The Committee desire to express their cordial thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for their valuable services during a particularly arduous year.

They also thank the Staff generally for their loyal service.

GRATITUDE OF PATIENTS.

Many grateful letters have again been received from patients and a selection is given on page 16.

THE MIDWIFERY TRAINING SCHOOL.

The Report of the Training School will be found on page 17. The number of entries of students shows a decrease, but the Committee are glad to report a considerable increase since the end of the year.

PRIVATE NURSING STAFF.

The services of the Nurses on the Private Staff have been in great demand, which testifies to the excellence of the training given by the Hospital. The total number of private cases attended was 414.

DRESDEN ASSISTANCE FUND.

As in previous years, a considerable number of patients, on leaving the Hospital, were assisted by this Fund; 205 mothers with their infants were sent to Convalescent Homes as follows:—

Other patients were helped by gifts of meat, milk, eggs, bread, etc., and clothing, while dental treatment was given whenever necessary. In other cases surgical appliances were supplied.

To cope with the great increase in the work of the Lady Almoner an Assistant has been appointed.

SAMARITAN FUND.

This Fund provides the only means which the Hospital has for assisting patients who have been attended at their own homes. It was not possible to help more than a small number, as the total income of the Fund amounted to only £59. Six mothers were sent with their babies to Convalescent Homes, and gifts of food and clothing were made to a few of the more necessitous patients.

The need of further contributions to this Fund is really great. Patients attended at home frequently have large families and very limited means. It is often difficult for them to obtain even the necessary food and clothing during their confinement.

LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

Very valuable assistance has again been given by the Ladies' Association. In addition to contributing £1,120 14s. 5d. for the cost of the conversion of "Invermead" Auxiliary Hospital and £330 4s. for the alterations and equipment of the new Ante-natal Department at North Kensington, furniture, bedding, and linen to the value of £832 1s. 6d. was provided for the Hospital. The Committee are most grateful to the members for the help they have given in this and in many other ways.

OBITUARY.

The Committee deeply regret to report the death of one of their colleagues—Mr. Alexander Balfour Williamson—for many years a generous supporter of the Hospital. He was also a valued adviser, and his loss is especially felt on the Finance Committee, where he gave so much assistance.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

Mr. Frank Morley, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., who had held the office of Honorary Dental Surgeon since 1899, retired during the year, and the Committee wish to place upon record their appreciation of his valuable services during this long period.

Mr. J. Draper Cambrook, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., has been appointed to succeed Mr. Morley.

FINANCE.

With the opening of the Isolation Block and of the Auxiliary Hospital the Committee had naturally anticipated a considerable increase in the expenditure, but unfortunately the maintenance of the Isolation Block has proved to be much more costly than was expected. The result is that the total Income of the Hospital fell short of the total Expenditure by no less than £6,670. The accounts show that the ordinary income was about the same as in the previous year, but that the receipts which could be allocated to the General Account from Legacies, were much lower than the corresponding amount last year. This serious position is causing considerable anxiety to the Committee, for although fresh sources of income are anticipated, there are great financial difficulties to be overcome in the immediate future. The Committee earnestly appeal for increased support to enable them to carry on the new work, which in spite of the expense is fully justified.

REBUILDING FUND.

The net proceeds of the Fund for the year amounted to £16,017 5s. 2d., which with the grant of £15,000 from the Ministry of Health, promised on the completion of the Isolation Block, brought the total up to £31,017 5s. 2d. The expenditure during the year on the new buildings and equipment at Hammersmith has absorbed the greater portion of the Building Fund, and as already stated, it will not be possible, therefore, to take any steps towards the removal of the Main Hospital to Hammersmith until the necessary amount of money has been raised. As mentioned earlier in the Report, £200,000 will be required to build a 100-bed Ward Unit with labour and waiting wards, Nurses' Home and Administrative Block.

The Committee desire to express their most grateful thanks to all those who have so generously contributed to the Appeal Fund, and they hope that any who have not yet visited the new buildings at Hammersmith will take an early opportunity of doing so. They feel sure that they will appreciate what has already been done, and that they will be moved to do their utmost, both themselves and through their friends, to bring about the completion of the rebuilding at the earliest possible date.

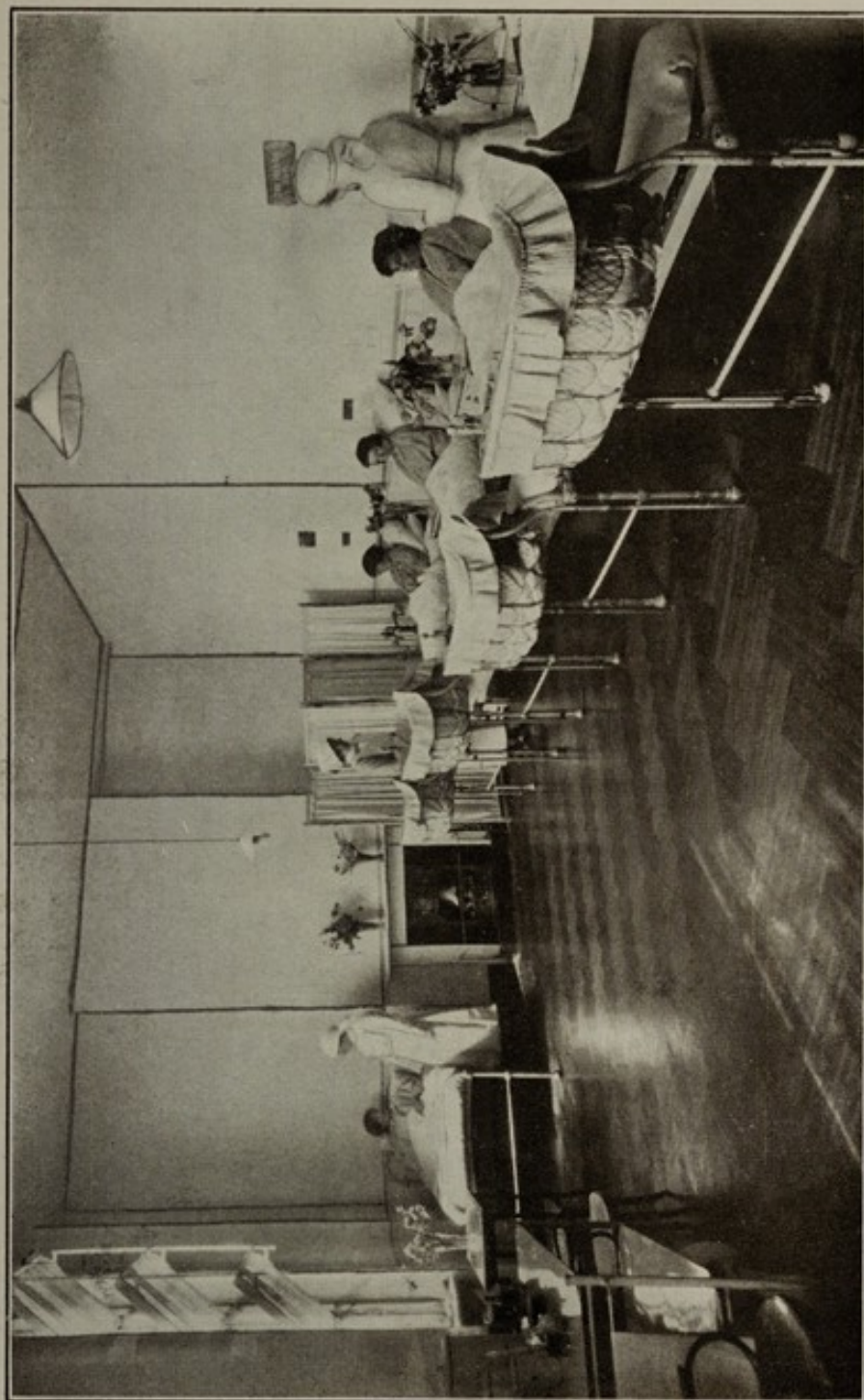

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR
ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1930.

The past year was specially notable in that it witnessed the completion and opening of the Isolation Block at Hammersmith, and of the Auxiliary Hospital ("Invermead") also on the new Site; and the Executive Committee rejoice that the Association was able to render valuable assistance in connection with the conversion of "Invermead" by contributing £1,120 14s. 5d. towards the cost. Since the opening on July 10th it has been of the greatest possible use in relieving the pressure on the accommodation in the main Hospital.

Another important improvement during the year was the provision of adequate accommodation for the Ante-Natal work in North Kensington. The Hospital was fortunate in being able to obtain suitable new premises and the Ladies' Association provided the funds, amounting to £330 4s. 0d., for adapting them to the purposes of the Hospital.

The Annual Meeting was held in December, in the Nurses' Home of the new Hospital at Goldhawk Road, Hammersmith. In the unavoidable absence of Lady Howard de Walden, the Chair was taken by Lady FitzGerald, who was subsequently elected Treasurer in succession to Mrs. Christie-Miller. After the meeting members were much interested in going over the new Isolation Hospital and the Nurses' Home, the "Invermead" Auxiliary Hospital and the Ante-natal Department and District Midwives Home at Longthorpe Lodge.

Mrs. S. S. Lazarus has resigned from the Executive Committee, and Mrs. Haldin has been elected a member.

Ethelwyn, Lady Pease, has been nominated as one of the representatives of the Ladies' Association on the House Committee.

Members and friends again took a very active part in the sale of flowers on Alexandra Day, with excellent results. A grant of £500 was received from the Fund.

A very successful Matinée performance was given at the Haymarket Theatre on Dec. 2nd, resulting in the sum of £731 15s. 0d. The Committee are very grateful to all those kind friends who helped to make the Matinée such a tremendous success.

The help of the Ladies' Association is therefore more than ever needed, and the Executive Committee earnestly appeal to Members to do their utmost to increase the number of subscribers to the Association during the coming year.

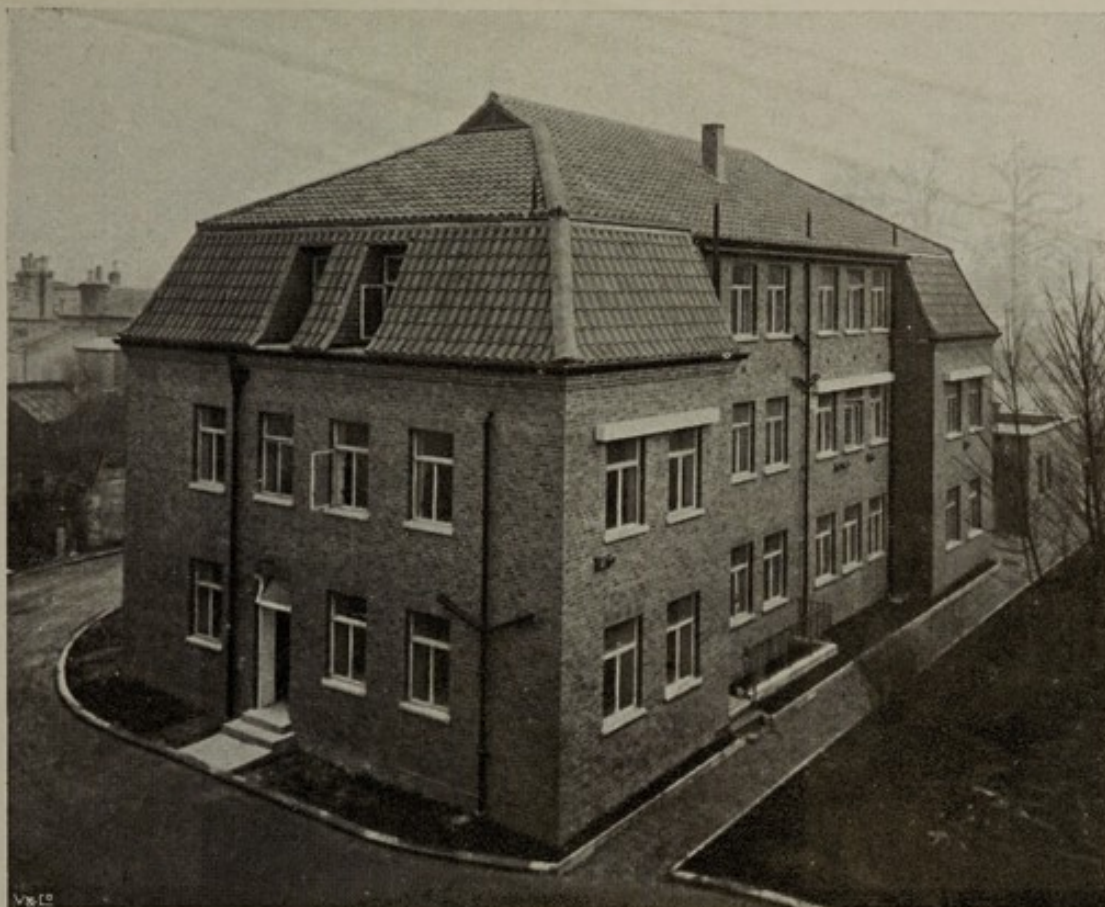

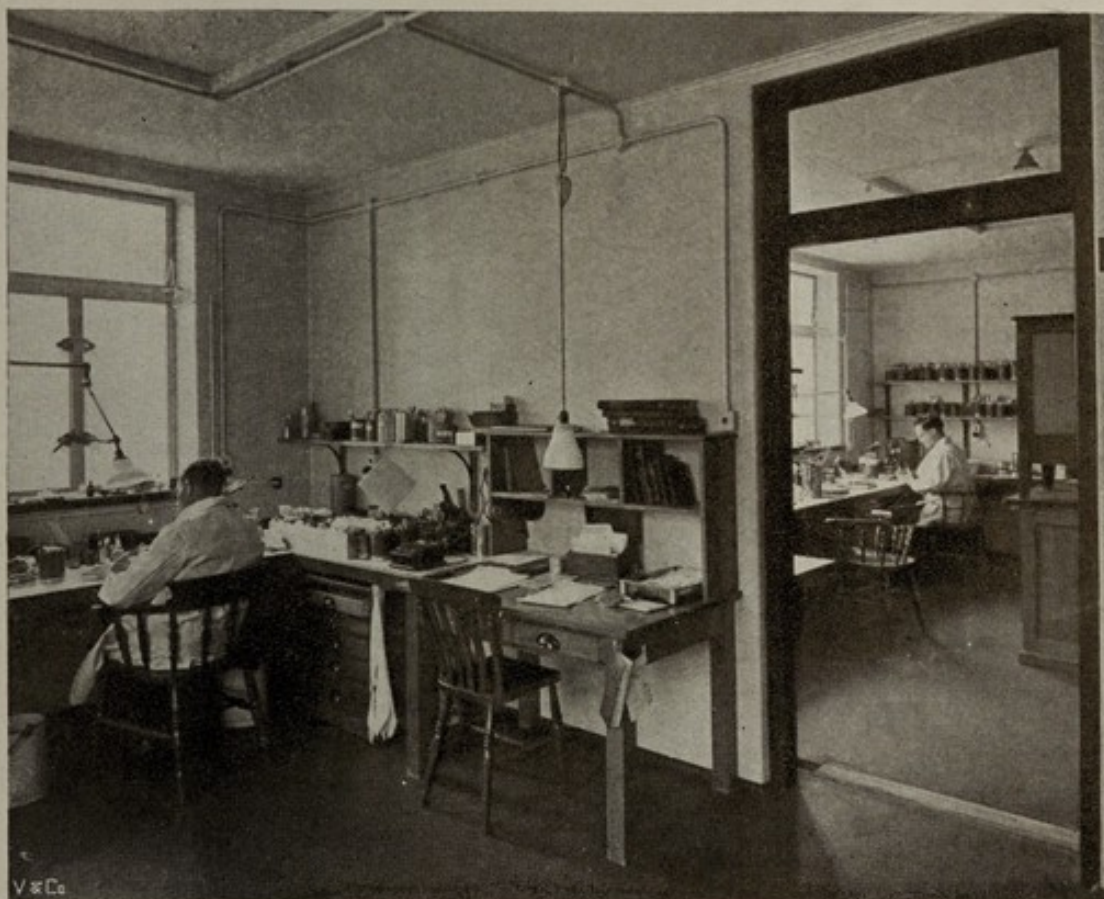

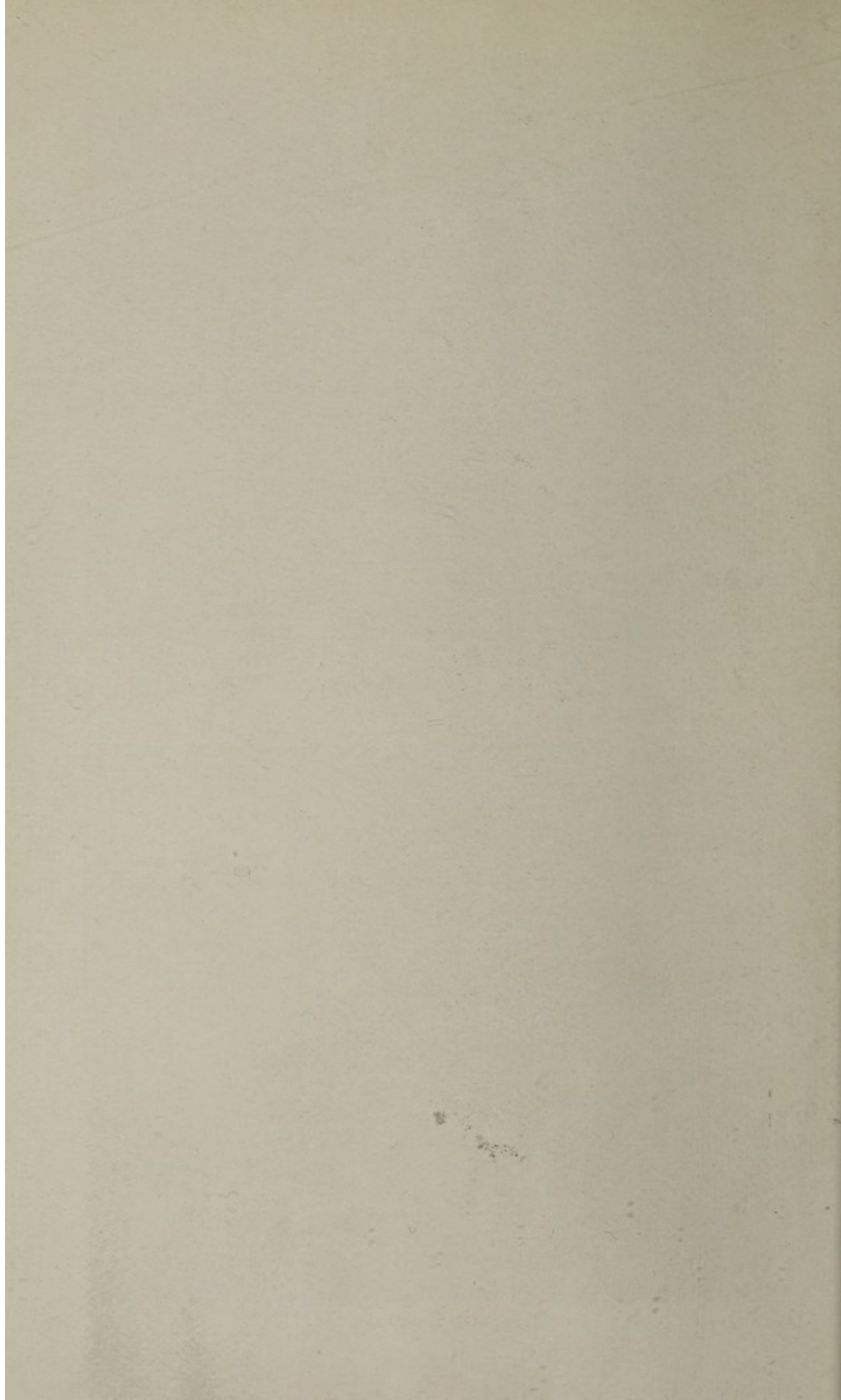

Frequent application is made at the Hospital for Orders, both for In and Out-door treatment, by poor women who have been unable to obtain a "Subscriber's Letter." Any spare "Letters" the Governors or Subscribers may have will be very gladly received by the Secretary, and judiciously distributed. All "Letters" require a Signature of the Governor or Subscriber.

PRIVATE NURSING STAFF.

A certain number of certificated Maternity Nurses and Midwives trained at Queen Charlotte's Hospital reside at the Nurses' Home and are available for private cases on application to the Matron by letter, telegram or telephone.

TELEPHONE—AMBASSADOR 2266 (3 lines).

(1) The fees for the case are payable to the Nurse and in addition she must be paid her railway, cab and other travelling expenses, and an allowance of 3/6 per week for washing.

(2) Nurses must wear dresses of a washing material during the whole time of their attendance.

(3) Nurses must carefully carry out all the instructions of the Patient's Medical Attendant and do everything possible for the comfort and well-being of the patient and infant. Everything in the sick-room should be kept scrupulously clean and orderly.

(4) Nurses are enjoined to hold sacred the knowledge they obtain of the private affairs of the family in which they are engaged and to adapt themselves as far as possible to the usages of the household.

(5) While the Committee will use every endeavour to supply only thoroughly trained and suitable nurses, they will not be responsible for any failure on the part of the Nurse to carry out her duties in a satisfactory manner.

(6) The Matron will be glad to receive reports from those engaging Nurses trained at the Hospital. Such reports will be treated as confidential.

(7) Ladies and Doctors wishing to engage the same Nurse again or to recommend her are desired to do so through the Matron of the Hospital.

REGULATIONS FOR PATIENTS.

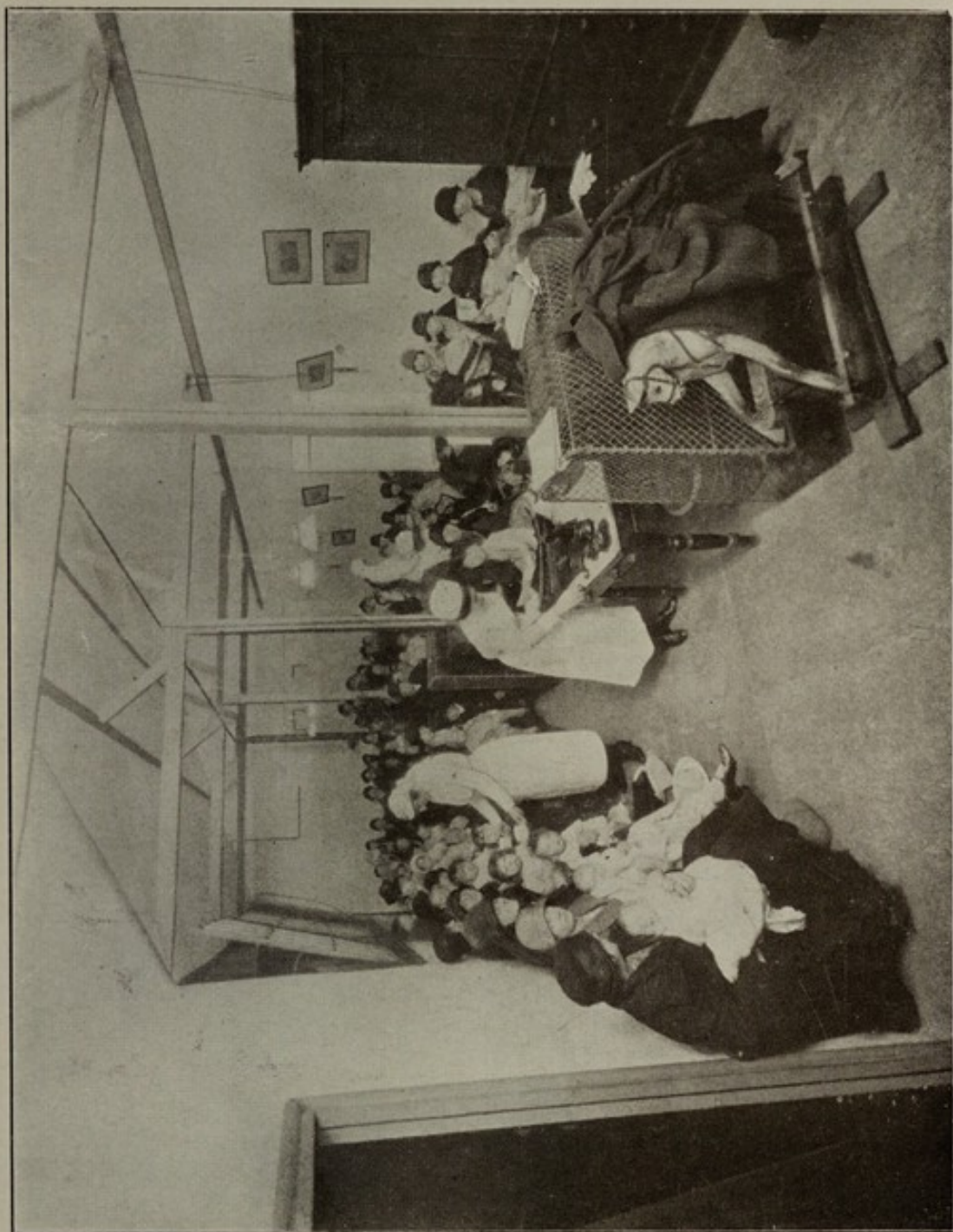
IN-PATIENTS

- 1.—Married women, single women with their first child only, and widows giving birth to posthumous children, irrespective of religion and nationality, are eligible for admission.
- 2.—Every patient must obtain a letter of recommendation from a Governor or Subscriber.
- 3.—Upon the receipt of a letter of recommendation, every patient must appear at the Hospital to have her name entered on the Register, and receive from the Secretary an order for admission, or for a midwife to attend her, as the case may be.
- 4.—A patient is only admitted when in labour, and must bring with her a suit of clothes for her child when leaving, the Hospital providing the necessary linen during her stay.
- 5.—All mothers are required, when capable, to nurse their infants whilst in the Hospital.
- 6.—All children born in the Hospital will be vaccinated before leaving, unless objection is made by the parent.
- 7.—The Visiting Day is Wednesday, between the hours of three and four p.m., when patients, if well enough, are permitted to see Visitors as follows :—

Married women from the fifth day after delivery, and single women from the eighth day. Only one visitor is allowed each day, and the duration of the visit may not exceed half-an-hour. Children cannot be admitted. Husbands only may also see their wives on Sundays between three and four p.m., subject to the above conditions.
- 8.—No patient is admitted suffering from any infectious disease ; if found to be so she is to be removed as soon as possible.
- 9.—Every patient is discharged by the Obstetric Surgeons, her length of stay in the Hospital being determined by her condition. Before leaving, the Committee satisfy themselves that each patient has had no reasonable cause of complaint. Upon this a letter of thanks is issued to the recommending Subscriber.
- 10.—All patients—both In and Out—who are able to do so, shall be invited to contribute something, according to their means, towards the funds of the Hospital, subject to such Rules as the Committee of Management may make from time to time.

OUT-PATIENTS.

- 1.—All married women, and widows giving birth to posthumous children, living within the Hospital District, are eligible for attendance at their own homes by a midwife, upon the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber.
- 2.—Every patient must attend at the Hospital after her convalescence to return thanks, and to satisfy the Committee as to her treatment by the midwife before the latter can be paid.

Ante-natal Department.

The Ante-Natal Department is intended for patients who are coming into the Hospital or to be attended by the Hospital in their own homes. Applicants for In-Patient or Out-Patient treatment may attend on any week-day, except Saturday, at 9 a.m.

Other patients sent by Doctors or Midwives for examination are also eligible and should attend on Tuesday, Thursday or Friday, at 9 a.m.

Infant Consultation Centre.

Similarly the Infant Consultation Centre is open to all children from infancy to the age of five years. The days and hour of attendance are Mondays and Wednesdays at 2 p.m.

RULES.

1.—That the Association be called the "Ladies' Association of Queen Charlotte's Hospital" and consist of Ladies willing to promote the objects of the Institution by

(a) Spreading a knowledge of the claims and needs of the Hospital.

(b) Obtaining increased financial support for the Hospital.

(c) Obtaining gifts of Ward Linen, clothing for the use of mothers and infants in the Hospital, vegetables, fruit, flowers, poultry, game, eggs, etc.

2.—Candidates must be proposed by Members of the Association, and Ladies desirous of joining the Association are requested to send in their names to the Secretary.

3.—Members of the Association shall either

(a) Subscribe 5/- annually to the funds of the Association and provide some garments of regulation pattern and material for the use of the Hospital patients.

or (b) Subscribe 21/- annually to the funds of the Association.

All Subscriptions shall be paid, and all gifts of linen and clothing be sent to the Hospital not later than the 15th November in each year.

4.—If any Member shall be in arrear with her subscription for two consecutive years, after due notice has been given, she shall cease to be a Member of the Association.

5.—There shall be a President, an Honorary Treasurer, one or more Honorary Secretaries, a Secretary, and such other Officers as may be decided by the Executive Committee, and such Officers shall be elected annually.

6.—The Secretary of the Hospital for the time being shall act as the Secretary of the Ladies' Association.

7.—An Annual Meeting of Members of the Association shall be held in the month of January or February, when reports shall be made as to the subscriptions and gifts received during the year. A special Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or at the request of not less than 20 Members.

8.—There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of not more than 45 nor less than 10 Members elected annually. The Executive Committee shall have power to co-opt Members to fill vacancies that may occur. Five Members shall form a quorum.

9.—A Banking Account shall be opened at the Martin's Bank Ltd. (Cocks, Biddulph & Co. Branch), 43 Charing Cross, S.W., in the name of the Ladies' Association of Queen Charlotte's Hospital and all monies received be paid into this account. All cheques shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the Secretary of the Association.

10.—The accounts of the Ladies' Association shall be audited annually and a statement be submitted to the Committee of Management as soon after the 31st December as possible, so that they may be included in the Annual Report of the Hospital.

11.—The Association shall have power to alter and add to these rules, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management.

12.—The Association and the work of Members of the Association within the Hospital shall in all respects be subject to the control of the Committee of Management.

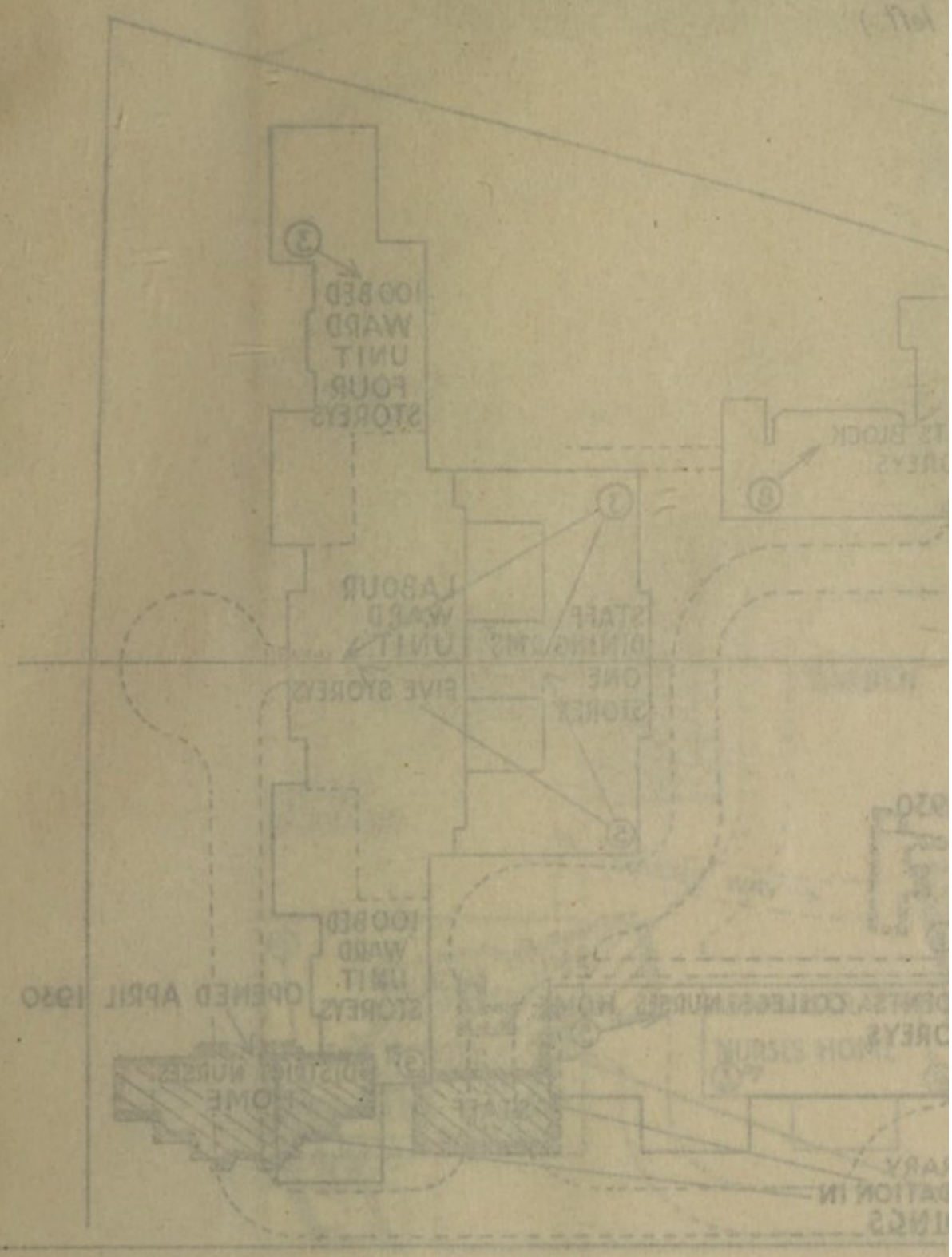

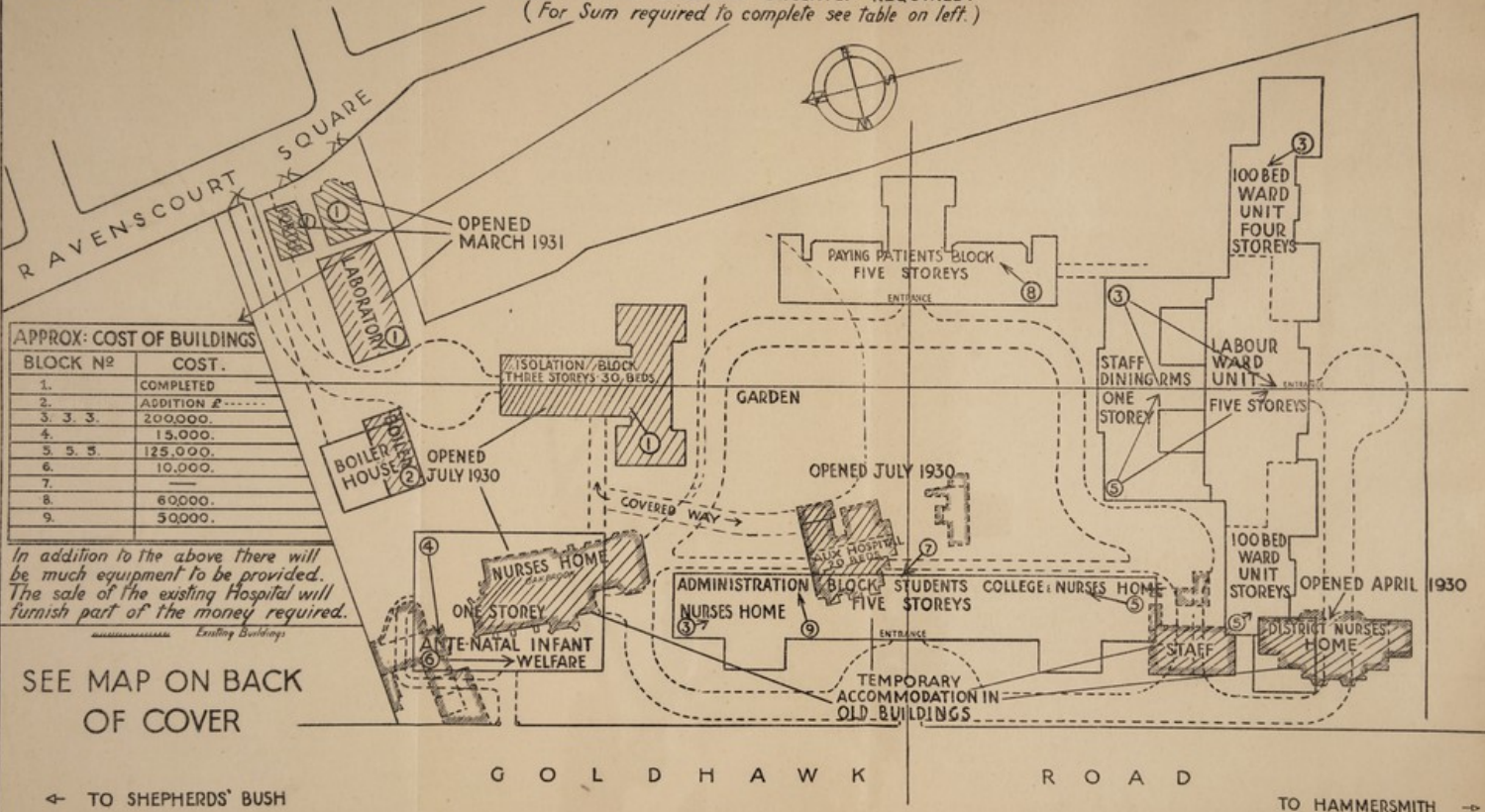


HOSPITAL

- 1739. Foundation of the Charity under the title of the General Lying-In Hospital.
- 1791. The Hospital removed to Bayswater.
- 1809. His Royal Highness the Duke of Sussex became president for life, and the Hospital was re-organised and re-established under his direction.
- 1810. Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Charlotte became Patron, and the name of the Hospital was changed from the General Lying-In Hospital to the Queen's Lying-In Hospital.
- 1813. Removal of the Hospital to Lisson Green, Marylebone.
- 1838. Her Most Gracious Majesty the Dowager Queen Adelaide became Patron of the Hospital.
- 1843. Death of His Royal Highness the Duke of Sussex.
- 1844. His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge became President.
- 1850. Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria became Patron.
- „ Death of His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge.
- 1856. Re-building of the Hospital on the site of the Manor House of Lisson Green.
- 1866. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales became Vice-Patron.

- 1879. Her Royal Highness the Crown Princess of Germany again visited and inspected the Hospital.

- 1885. Incorporation of the Hospital by Royal Charter.
- 1886. New Wing built and opened by their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales.
- 1887. Her Royal Highness Princess William of Prussia visited and inspected the Hospital.
- 1888. Her Royal Highness Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein again visited and inspected the Hospital.

- 1899. Nurses' Home built, and opened by their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York, who also visited and inspected the Hospital.
- 1901. Death of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria.
Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Alexandra became Patron.
- 1904. Death of His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge.
- 1908. Extension of the Nurses' Home and Residential College for Students opened by Her Royal Highness Princess Alexander of Teck.
- 1910. Her Majesty Queen Mary became Patron.
- 1919. Her Majesty Queen Mary visited the Hospital.
- 1921. Her Majesty Queen Alexandra visited the Hospital.
- 1925. Death of Her Majesty Queen Alexandra.
- 1927. Her Majesty Queen Mary again visited the Hospital.
- 1929. Decision to rebuild the Hospital on a new site at Goldhawk Road, Hammersmith. Foundation Stone of first block of the new hospital (the Isolation Block), laid by H. H. Princess Marie Louise.
- 1930. Isolation Block at Hammersmith opened by H.R.H. Princess Mary, Countess of Harewood.
- 1931. Research Laboratories at Hammersmith opened.
