REMARKS FOR INFORMATION OF THE GOVERNORS.

The first object of the Hospital is to make provision for the proper treatment of the numerous accidents that happen in the neighbourhood, the reception of medical cases into the house, though very desirable, being secondary.

Accident cases are received at any time, according to the general practice of hospitals, without recommendation.

Recommendations given by the Governors for in-patients are considered on Fridays at half-past three o'clock by the Weekly Board in the order of the dates when given. Governors are desired to impress upon the person to whom they give in-patient recommendations the necessity of ascertaining from the House Surgeon whether the case can be admitted BEFORE THE PATIENT IS SENT TO THE HOSPITAL.

As the numerous cases of accident patients require a large quantity of lint and cloth for rollers, if ladies and others would be pleased to send linen or calico they would confer a great benefit on the Institution.

Persons disposed to favour this Institution by bequests may express it in the following terms:—

FORM OF LEGACY IN WILLS.

“ I give and bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the ROTHERHAM HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY the sum of to be applied to the uses and purposes of the said Hospital and Dispensary, and I direct that such part of my personal estate as is by law applicable to the payment of legacies bequeathed to charitable uses shall in the first place, and before answering any other purpose whatever, be applied in discharging the said legacy.”

For want of this form this Hospital and many other charities have lost their legacies, the testators having charged them on their real instead of the **personal** estates.

PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

A Donation of Fifty Guineas entitles the Donor to one in-patient and five out-patient recommendations annually for life.

A Donation of Twenty-one Pounds or upwards constitutes the giver a Life Governor, and entitles him to two out-patient recommendations annually.

A Benefaction of Ten Guineas entitles the Donor to two in-patient and ten out-patient recommendations for the year of his donation.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea are entitled to two out-patient recommendations and a vote.

Annual Subscribers of Five Guineas are entitled to one in-patient recommendation in addition to five out-patient recommendations.

An Annual Subscriber of 10s. 6d. is entitled to one out-patient recommendation, but not to vote.

All Subscriptions are due on the First of January in each year.

The recommendations are available for twelve months from the date of issue.

Five out-patient recommendations may be exchanged for one in-patient recommendation of the same year, or vice versa.

The Weekly Board meet every Friday at 3 p.m.

The Committee meet on the last Saturday in the months of February, April, July and October, at 4 p.m., or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors is held on a Saturday in the months of February or March, or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

“Hospital Sunday” is the last Sunday in January.

The attention of the Governors is directed to the following amended Rule (64):—“A recommendation should not be given when the income of the head of the family exceeds £4 per week, unless under exceptional circumstances, when the Governor should initial the amount,” and also Rule 77, which is as follows:—“No person who is able to pay for medical aid shall be eligible for the benefit of this Hospital, except in cases of severe accidents, or for capital operations.”

All cases of severe accident or emergency are admitted without recommendations at any hour.

Friends are permitted to visit the patients on Sundays and Thursdays from two to four o'clock. Visits not to extend over half an hour.

Subscribers and the Public are invited to visit the Hospital when the Matron will be pleased to show them round.

CHILDREN'S COTS.

Annual Subscriptions of Twenty Guineas or a Donation of £300 will entitle the Donor to “name” a Cot during his or her life. A Donation of £500 will entitle the Donor to “name” a cot in perpetuity, it being understood that all the Cots are under the management and control of the Weekly Board and Medical Staff.

ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1936.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting their 65th Annual Report to the Governors of the Rotherham Hospital and Dispensary.

The total number of patients who have been treated during the past year is 12,481, as compared with 12,400 the previous year, a decrease of 63 In-Patients and an increase of 144 Out-Patients, making a total increase of 81.

Your Committee wish to put on record their appreciation of the work done by Mrs. G. H. Appleyard in organising a very successful Flag Day collection which resulted in a sum of £140 8s. 3d., being handed to the Hospital.

During the year Mr. Sandy Powell generously undertook the endowment of a children's cot, and on the 19th June his mother attended and formally presented a cheque for £30, the first instalment towards the total sum of £500.

Uncle Timothy and a group of the "Children's Ring" (Nig Nogs) organisation run by the "Sheffield Independent" visited the Children's Ward and paid their annual contribution of £30 towards the upkeep of their cot.

The proprietors of the "Sheffield Telegraph & Star" organised an entertainment at the Lyceum at which their "Gloops" organisation handed over to us a cheque for £30 for the maintenance of a cot in the Children's Ward.

Your Committee gratefully acknowledge the gifts of these young people and congratulate them on the kindly interest they take in the welfare of other children.

The Committee regret to record the comparatively early death of Dr. E. J. Chambers who was appointed Honorary Anaesthetist to the Hospital on October 26th, 1928. His usefulness and skill were invaluable to many patients and were highly appreciated by the Medical Staff.

Dr. Collinson resigned his position as Hon. Surgeon on 17th December. He had filled this exacting position since the 10th October 1903 with great success. His exceptional skill and enthusiasm for the work has been the admiration of all who worked with him, and his kindly interest in the welfare of the patients has been particularly noteworthy.

The Committee regret his retirement, but note with pleasure his promise to continue in close contact with the Hospital. The Committee has elected him since the close of the year an Hon. Consulting Surgeon and placed at his disposal two beds in the Hospital.

The Committee has also elected Dr. Anderson, who left the district last year, an Hon. Consultant and placed two beds at his disposal.

The Committee once more desire to express their thanks to the various Allotment Societies for the gifts of large quantities of potatoes and other vegetables.

Your Committee wish to record that under the direction of Mr. Stothard, a number of enthusiastic gardening friends of the Hospital have undertaken the task of keeping the grounds in good order. This is a much appreciated help.

The British Oxygen Company continue to supply free of charge all the oxygen required at the Hospital. This is a valuable contribution which is very much appreciated.

The Linen League is a very important body in connection with the Rotherham Hospital under the Chairmanship of Countess Fitzwilliam who is ably seconded by Mrs. Collinson in her excellent management as Secretary.

This League not only does a great amount of work for the Hospital by providing all the linen required, but is most useful in establishing a friendly feeling for the institution amongst the ladies of the District.

The Matron, Miss Powlesland, has had a busy and anxious year, but has fulfilled all her duties with great loyalty to the Hospital and entire satisfaction to the Board.

Numerous patients have as usual expressed their appreciation of the kindness she has shown them.

During the year the Board have been gratified by the receipt of a number of letters from relatives and friends of patients expressing their appreciation of the attention and kindness they have received from the Doctors and Nurses.

Mr. W. A. Heggie, M.B., Ch.B., resigned his position as House Surgeon on March 31st, and Mr. G. D. Rowley, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed to fill the vacancy, and still retained his post at the end of the year.

Mr. Wm. MacKendrick, M.B., Ch.B., resigned his position as House Physician on April 30th, and Mr. J. S. Cruikshank M.B., Ch.B., was appointed to fill the vacancy. On September 4th, Dr. Cruikshank resigned his position, and Mr. P. J. O'Flynn, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed, who still retained his post at the end of the year.

Mr. C. H. Thomson, M.B., Ch.B., the Casualty House Surgeon, resigned his position on March 19th, and Mr. Wm. MacKendrick, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed to fill the vacancy. On August 30th Mr. Wm. MacKendrick resigned his position; Mr. C. E. Gorrod, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed, who still retained his position at the end of the year.

Miss D. Sugden, the Dispenser, carries on her useful and important work very satisfactorily.

The Board wish to express their appreciation of the zeal and loyalty with which the whole Staff have responded to their efforts to make the Hospital worthy of the town and neighbourhood.

The Committee desire to express their thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical Staff for the splendid services they have voluntarily rendered during the year.

The Committee further desire to acknowledge the valuable help which, from time to time, has been rendered by those who give public entertainments for the benefit of the Hospital, and those, who from such receipts are accumulating funds eventually to endow cots.

The Board would like to mention here Miss Gwen Jones, who by the end of last year has given us £225 14s. 11d., as the result of three concerts.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the devotion of those gentlemen who have maintained the religious services during the year.

The Committee also desire to express their thanks to their supporters generally and to the numerous donors of gifts of all kinds which add so largely to the comfort and happiness of the patients.
