

REMARKS FOR INFORMATION OF THE GOVERNORS.

The first object of the Hospital is to make provision for the proper treatment of the numerous accidents that happen in the neighbourhood, the reception of medical cases into the house, though very desirable, being secondary.

Accident cases are received at any time, according to the general practice of hospitals, without recommendation.

Recommendations given by the Governors for in-patients are considered on Fridays at half-past three o'clock by the Weekly Board in the order of the dates when given. Governors are desired to impress upon the person to whom they give in-patient recommendations the necessity of ascertaining from the House Surgeon whether the case can be admitted **BEFORE THE PATIENT IS SENT TO THE HOSPITAL.**

As the numerous cases of accident patients require a large quantity of lint and cloth for rollers, if ladies and others would be pleased to send linen or calico they would confer a great benefit on the Institution.

Persons disposed to favour this Institution by bequests may express it in the following terms :—

FORM OF LEGACY IN WILLS.

"I give and bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the ROTHERHAM HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY the sum of to be applied to the uses and purposes of the said Hospital and Dispensary, and I direct that such part of my personal estate as is by law applicable to the payment of legacies bequeathed to charitable uses shall in the first place, and before answering any other purpose whatever, be applied in discharging the said legacy."

For want of this form this Hospital and many other charities have lost their legacies, the testators having charged them on their **real** instead of the **personal** estates.

The first object of the Hospital is to make available the medical treatment of the pauper patients, & to diminish the neighbourhood the number of such cases in the house, though very deplorable, it is a fact that

Accident cases are treated at the Hospital, & the general practice is omitted, except in consultation.

The applications given by the paupers to the boards are considered in groups of half-past three o'clock in the Weekly Board in the order of the dates when given. Generally no charge is imposed upon the person to whom they give notice, nor do they consider the necessity of such charge, the question being whether the case can be referred to the hospital or to the non-medical part of the

As the numerous cases of married patients require a large quantity of fat and cloth for covering, it is desired to be pleased to send these articles they would render a great benefit on the hospital. ASSOCIATION FUND.

Persons desirous to visit this Institution by before may express it in the following terms:-

FORM OF LEGACY IN WILLS.

"I give and bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY the sum of £¹⁰⁰ per annum to be applied to the use and purpose of the said Hospital and Dispensary, and I direct that such sum be retained ~~as~~ in trust as is by my direction or in the name of the Hospital, to distribute and pay in the first place and before answering any other purpose directed by myself, to the Hospital.

PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

A Donation of Fifty Guineas entitles the Donor to one in-patient and five out-patient recommendations annually for life.

A Donation of Twenty-one Pounds or upwards constitutes the giver a Life Governor, and entitles him to two out-patient recommendations annually.

A Benefaction of Ten Guineas entitles the Donor to two in-patient and ten out-patient recommendations for the year of his donation.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea are entitled to two out-patient recommendations and a vote.

Annual Subscribers of Five Guineas are entitled to one in-patient recommendation in addition to five out-patient recommendations.

An Annual Subscriber of 10s. 6d. is entitled to one out-patient recommendation, but not to vote.

All Subscriptions are due on the First of January in each year.

The recommendations are available for twelve months from the date of issue.

Five out-patient recommendations may be exchanged for one in-patient recommendation of the same year, or vice versa.

The Weekly Board meet every Friday at 3 p.m.

The Committee meet on the last Saturday in the months of February, April, July and October, at 4 p.m., or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors is held on a Saturday in the months of February or March, or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

"Hospital Sunday" is the last Sunday in January.

The attention of the Governors is directed to the following amended Rule (64):—"A recommendation should not be given when the income of the head of the family exceeds £4 per week, unless under exceptional circumstances, when the Governor should initial the amount," and also Rule 77, which is as follows:—"No person who is able to pay for medical aid shall be eligible for the benefit of this Hospital, except in cases of severe accidents, or for capital operations."


All cases of severe accident or emergency are admitted without recommendations at any hour.

Friends are permitted to visit the patients on Sundays and Thursdays from two to four o'clock. Visits not to extend over half an hour.

Subscribers and the Public are invited to visit the Hospital when the Matron will be pleased to show them round.

CHILDREN'S COTS.

Annual Subscriptions of Twenty Guineas or a Donation of £300 will entitle the Donor to "name" a Cot during his or her life. A Donation of £500 will entitle the Donor to "name" a cot in perpetuity, it being understood that all the Cots are under the management and control of the Weekly Board and Medical Staff.

Mr. L. Hinchliffe, of the Silverwood Hospital Contributory Scheme, brought forward a resolution "that this meeting of Governors requests the Weekly Board of the Hospital to proceed immediately with the formation of a Hospital Contributors' Association," and stated that in his opinion the formation of such an association would bring about more co-operation between the public and voluntary hospitals in the district. After considerable discussion the Chairman suggested that the matter be adjourned for six months in order that representatives might get their views of their associations on the subject, and in the meantime the Weekly Board would examine the possibilities of such a scheme. This course was agreed upon.

The number of Motor Accidents was discussed, and the Chairman mentioned that we had received £171 12s. 9d. for these cases, and it was suggested that a comparison of the motor accidents with the previous year should be shown in the next year's Annual Report.

ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1937.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting their 66th Annual Report to the Governors of the Rotherham Hospital and Dispensary.

The total number of patients who have been treated during the past year is 13,812, as compared with 12,481 the previous year, an increase of 244 In-Patients and an increase of 1087 Out-Patients, making a total increase of 1331.

Each of the above represents a gift of £500, and when the payments are completed the sum is placed to Capital Account and invested from time to time.

The Allotment Societies in the town have again supplied large quantities of potatoes and other vegetables, for which the Committee express their sincere thanks.

The British Oxygen Company have continued to supply free of charge all the oxygen required by the Hospital, the gift of which is much appreciated.

As in previous years the Linen League has supplied the Hospital with most valuable practical gifts, which save the Hospital considerable expense.

It is very gratifying to the Committee that this League is continuing its useful work, and they appreciate the practical friendship of the Chairman, Countess Fitzwilliam, and also the unceasing energy with which Mrs. Collinson is continuing her excellent management as Secretary, and they lay great stress on the friendly feeling which is established between this Hospital and the numerous members of the League.

There has been more work done in the Hospital during the past year than ever before, and the extra work which the Matron, Miss Powlesland, has had to undertake has been considerable. The Committee have great confidence in their Matron, and thank her for the interest she displays in carrying out her duties and the kindness she shows to the patients, which is abundantly expressed in the numerous letters of appreciation which have been received from time to time.

Mr. G. D. Rowley, M.B.Ch.B., resigned his position as House Surgeon on February 28th, 1937, when Mr. L. D. B. Frost, M.B.B.S. (London) was appointed to fill the vacancy. Mr. Frost resigned his position on September 14th, and Mr. Griggs, M.D., was appointed. Mr. Griggs resigned his position on November 30th, and Mr. G. A. Baker, M.B.B.S., was appointed, who still retains his post.

Mr. P. J. O'Flynn, M.B.Ch.B., resigned his position as House Physician on February 28th, when Mr. A. Esser, L.R.C.P. and S. (Ed.) was appointed, and he retained his post at the end of the year.

Mr. C. E. Gorrod, M.B.Ch. B., resigned his position as Casualty House Surgeon on February 28th, when Mr. A. M. Beemer, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., was appointed. Mr. Beemer resigned his position on May 31st, and Mr. E. M. Mankin, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., was appointed to fill the vacancy. On November 30th Mr. Mankin resigned his position, and Mr. L. A. Schnipelsky, M.B.Ch.B., was appointed on December 1st, and still retains his post.

Miss D. Sugden, the Dispenser, still carries on her useful and important work to the satisfaction of the Board and Medical Staff.

During the year a Pathological Laboratory was instituted in the Hospital, and Mr. E. Vincent was appointed to take charge. This, of course, entailed certain additional outlay, which may increase considerably as time goes on, but the Medical Staff have confidence that some very useful work is being done.

The Committee wish to express their appreciation of the zeal and loyalty with which the whole Staff have responded to their efforts to make the Hospital worthy of the town and neighbourhood.

The Committee desire to express their thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical Staff for the splendid services they have voluntarily rendered during the year.

The Committee further desire to acknowledge the valuable help which, from time to time, has been rendered by those who give public entertainments for the benefit of the Hospital, and those, who from such receipts are accumulating funds eventually to endow cots.

Through the kindness of Mr. A. P. Harrop a collecting box has been fixed in the boundary wall near the main entrance. This is proving a useful source of income, and is a convenient way in which small contributions may be made.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the devotion of those gentlemen who have taken an interest in the religious affairs of the Hospital by their regular visitations.

For many years it has been the desire of the Board to improve the Kitchen and Laundry, and to considerably alter the Heating and Hot Water Installation throughout the Hospital.

Early in the year 1937 a public meeting of the supporters was held, at which the Mayor, Alderman F. A. Barlow, attended, and it was resolved that this important work be undertaken forthwith. A subscription list was opened, and at the present time promises of slightly over £9000 have been received. Building contracts have been entered into and the work is progressing satisfactorily.

It is not known what the ultimate cost will be, but it certainly will exceed the first estimate of £12,000, as several additional matters have suggested themselves in the course of planning, but the Board have every confidence that whatever is required will be provided by the generous public, who have hitherto so generously supported the work of the Hospital.
