

## REMARKS FOR INFORMATION OF THE GOVERNORS.

---

The first object of the Hospital is to make provision for the proper treatment of the numerous accidents that happen in the neighbourhood, the reception of medical cases into the house, though very desirable, being secondary.

Accident cases are received at any time, according to the general practice of hospitals, without recommendation.

Recommendations given by the Governors for in-patients are considered on Fridays at half-past three o'clock by the Weekly Board in the order of the dates when given. Governors are desired to impress upon the person to whom they give in-patient recommendations the necessity of ascertaining from the House Surgeon whether the case can be admitted BEFORE THE PATIENT IS SENT TO THE HOSPITAL.

As the numerous cases of accident patients require a large quantity of lint and cloth for rollers, if ladies and others would be pleased to send linen or calico they would confer a great benefit on the Institution.

Persons disposed to favour this Institution by bequests may express it in the following terms:—

### FORM OF LEGACY IN WILLS.

*"I give and bequeath to the Treasurer for the time being of the ROTHERHAM HOSPITAL AND DISPENSARY the sum of to be applied to the uses and purposes of the said Hospital and Dispensary, and I direct that such part of my personal estate as is by law applicable to the payment of legacies bequeathed to charitable uses shall in the first place, and before answering any other purpose whatever, be applied in discharging the said legacy."*

For want of this form this Hospital and many other charities have lost their legacies, the testators having charged them on their **real** instead of the **personal** estates.

## PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

---

A Donation of Fifty Guineas entitles the Donor to one in-patient and five out-patient recommendations annually for life.

A Donation of Twenty-one Pounds or upwards constitutes the giver a Life Governor, and entitles him to two out-patient recommendations annually.

A Benefaction of Ten Guineas entitles the Donor to two in-patient and ten out-patient recommendations for the year of his donation.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea are entitled to two out-patient recommendations and a vote.

Annual Subscribers of Five Guineas are entitled to one in-patient recommendation in addition to five out-patient recommendations.

An Annual Subscriber of 10s. 6d. is entitled to one out-patient recommendation, but not to vote.

All Subscriptions are due on the First of January in each year.

The recommendations are available for twelve months from the date of issue.

Five out-patient recommendations may be exchanged for one in-patient recommendation of the same year, or vice versa.

The Weekly Board meet every Friday at 3 p.m.

The Committee meet on the last Saturday in the months of February, April, July and October, at 4 p.m., or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors is held on a Saturday in the months of February or March, or other convenient time to be fixed by the Weekly Board.

" Hospital Sunday " is the last Sunday in January.

The attention of the Governors is directed to the following amended Rule (64) :—" A recommendation should not be given when the income of the head of the family exceeds £4 per week, unless under exceptional circumstances, when the Governor should initial the amount," and also Rule 77, which is as follows :— " No person who is able to pay for medical aid shall be eligible for the benefit of this Hospital, except in cases of severe accidents, or for capital operations."


All cases of severe accident or emergency are admitted without recommendations at any hour.

Friends are permitted to visit the patients on Sundays and Thursdays from two to four o'clock. Visits not to extend over half an hour.

Subscribers and the Public are invited to visit the Hospital when the Matron will be pleased to show them round.

#### CHILDREN'S COTS.

Annual Subscriptions of Twenty Guineas or a Donation of £300 will entitle the Donor to " name " a Cot during his or her life. A Donation of £500 will entitle the Donor to " name " a cot in perpetuity, it being understood that all the Cots are under the management and control of the Weekly Board and Medical Staff.

The Chairman referred to the resignation of Mr. H. C. Snell, who had been Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon to the Hospital since 1914. His services during that period had been most valuable to the Institution, and will be greatly missed. Appreciation of his popularity and skill was expressed.

He also referred to Canon Morgan's resignation from the Weekly Board, on account of his leaving the district to become Rector of Stockport, and expressed their appreciation of his services rendered to the Hospital, and mentioned that Canon John Waring had been appointed in his place.

The Chairman mentioned that owing to advancing years, their much loved Secretary, Mr. G. W. Roberts, would be giving up the work this year. During the past 30 years he had been a guide and friend to the Hospital, and had made very big changes in the financial position of the Institution. They all deeply regretted Mr. Roberts had to leave them, and in their name he thanked him for all he had done for the Hospital.

With regard to the question of A.R.P. the Chairman said they were working in close touch with Dr. Barr, Medical Officer of Health for Rotherham who was in charge, and was doing excellent work in conjunction with the Honorary Staff.

When the payments are completed, each of these cots represents £500 which is placed to Capital Account and invested.

The Allotment Societies of the district have again supplied large quantities of potatoes and other vegetables which have proved very useful, and for which the Committee wish to express their sincere thanks.

The Linen League continues to supply all the linen and blankets for the use of the Hospital. This important organisation continues its successful career under the Chairmanship of Countess Fitzwilliam, whose friendship to the Hospital is very much appreciated, and Mrs. Collinson has as usual been most energetic in her efforts for the success of this good work which is so useful to the Hospital. The work which is being done by the members of the league is very beneficial and the friendly feeling which is thus created amongst the ladies of the district is in every way satisfactory and advantageous to the Hospital.

The Matron has had a very trying and difficult year owing to the increased amount of work in her department. Her energy and interest has never failed. The Board have great confidence in her and she has carried out her duties in a most satisfactory manner.

As usual a number of patients have written to the Board expressing their satisfaction with the way they have been treated by the Matron, Doctors, and nursing staff.

At the end of the year the Rev. Canon Morgan, Vicar of Rotherham resigned his position on the Hospital Board to become Rector of Stockport. He was appointed on the Weekly Board on 16th March, 1929, and for the past ten years he has been most helpful to the Committee and a friend to the patients.

The Weekly Board have elected Rev. Canon Waring to the vacancy, and they have also elected Mr. J. H. Allott to the Quarterly Committee, retiring in 1940.

The following changes have taken place in the Resident Medical Staff :—

Mr. G. A. Baker, M.B.B.S., resigned his position as House Surgeon on 27th June, 1938, and Mr. L. A. Schnipelsky, M.B.Ch.B., was appointed to fill the vacancy and still retained his position at the end of the year.

Mr. A. Esser, L.R.C.P. and S. (Ed.), resigned his position as House Physician on 23rd March, 1938, and Mr. J. Vahrman, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., was appointed and retained his post at the end of the year.

Mr. L. A. Schnipelsky resigned his position as Casualty House Surgeon on the 28th June, 1938, to take up the post of House Surgeon, and Mr. M. Sim, M.B.Ch.B., was appointed to fill the vacant post of Casualty House Surgeon and retained this post at December 31st.

The Hospital suffered a serious loss through resignation of Mr. H. C. Snell, M.B., who had filled the post of Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon with exceptional ability since he was appointed in 1914, serving a period of 24 years. He was always exceedingly popular and his skill as an Ophthalmic Surgeon was very much appreciated. Unfortunately, it was owing to ill health that Dr. Snell had to sever his connection with the Hospital as he was leaving the district.

The Pathological Laboratory has been carried on with success during the year under Mr. E. Vincent, and is doing very useful work.

Miss D. Sugden, the Dispenser, carries on her important work to the satisfaction of the Board and Medical Staff.

Miss V. Little, the Almoner, filled her important post with tact and ability.

The Committee wish to express their appreciation of the zeal and loyalty with which the whole staff have responded to the Board's efforts to make the Hospital worthy of the town and neighbourhood, and to express their thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical Staff for the splendid services they have voluntary rendered during the year.

The Committee further desire to acknowledge the valuable help which from time to time, has been rendered by those who give public entertainments for the benefit of the Hospital, in particular it might be mentioned here that Miss Gwen Jones has handed £72 1s. 9d. to the Hospital as a result of her last Celebrity Concert, making a total sum of £373 6s. 11d. during the last five years.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the devotion of those gentlemen who have maintained the religious services during the year.

They also wish to record their thanks to the supporters generally and to the numerous donors of gifts of all kinds which add so largely to the comfort and happiness of the patients.

Since the end of the year the New Kitchens, Laundry and Heating Apparatus have been practically completed, although several minor matters may have yet to be attended to. The official opening took place on April 13th, 1939, by Sir Walter Benton Jones, Bart., Chairman of the United Steel Cos., Ltd.

The total amount received towards the extension is £12111 14s. 9d. and it is expected that before everything is finally completed we shall probably need £20,000 0s. 0d., which shows a shortage of about £8,000 0s. 0d. still to be found, but the Board have every confidence that the friends of the Hospital will provide all that is required.
