

Forty-Ninth Annual Report

- 1. The Committee of Management has pleasure in presenting the 49th Annual Report on the work of the Hospital, very possibly the last as a voluntary institution.
- 2. We should like to bring it to the notice of our friends that Donations and Subscriptions may be made after the "Appointed Day" for the benefit of any individual hospital and will be used by the Management Committee, not for maintenance which will be provided for by the Exchequer, but for additional comforts for the patients and staff.
- 3. The Hospital could not have carried on without the continued help of the Contributory Scheme and owes a great debt of gratitude to the Committee and especially to the Voluntary Collectors. Mr. F. G. Leach, the invaluable Secretary, who has organised the scheme from its inception, has been a patient in the Hospital and has, we hope, appreciated the care and attention which his efforts for the Scheme have enabled so many people to share.
- 4. The Statistics show that there has been a slight increase over last year in the work done at the Hospital. The increase is especially noticeable in Maternity cases. The number of patients treated has depended, as in the last few years, in the number of nurses available. In this connection we would especially mention the part-time staff who have given willing and accommodating service and the domestic staff who in periods of acute shortage of nurses have given most willing help.
- 5. The shortage of staff and the necessity of employing parttime staff has thrown on Matron a great deal of additional work and worry and we are indeed lucky to have, in Miss Jackson, a Matron who can and has surmounted these difficulties.
- 6. The Committee has spent considerable capital sums of money in carrying out its policy of having the Hospital in as perfect condition as is possible against the 5th July, when it will be handed over to the Regional Hospitals Board. Romsey will have no need to be ashamed of its Hospital when this handing over takes place.
- 7. We record with regret the death of Admiral Sir Reginald Bacon, an old and valued friend of the Hospital, and who was, at one time, President.

- 8. Mr. and Mrs. Beer, members of the Management Committee for several years, resigned owing to taking up residence in Portsmouth. Mrs. E. Cuthbertson has resigned from the Management and House Committees after giving long and valuable service. Mrs. A. Lassell, an energetic worker on the House Committee resigned from that Committee, but still remains with us on the Management Committee.
- 9. We are pleased to welcome on both the Management and House Committees, The Lady Newton, and on the House Committee, Mrs. A. S. Burnett.
- 10. The Committee acknowledge and tender their sincere thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff, the Matron and Nursing Staff, the Domestic Staff, Gardeners and Porter, and Miss Lewis, Secretary and Almoner, the Hospital Car Service, for the valuable work which has been carried out during the year, and to our voluntary supporters: Subscribers to Hospital Funds, Gifts in kind, Mrs. G. Wills and members of the Linen League, Mr. A. R. Wills, Tadburn Nurseries, Mrs. J. B. S. Attlee, Honorary Librarian, Messrs. Bell, Pope and Bridgwater, Solicitors, Messrs. Spain Bros., Batchelor & Co., Auditors, Messrs. The Test Valley Iron Works Ltd., Messrs. Wrynams Ltd., Messrs. Purchase & Son, Messrs. W. Pink & Sons Ltd., Messrs. Iremonger & Son, Messrs. The Romsey Press, the Dominions and Colonies for cases of food received through the Ministry of Food, Mr. R. J. Cameron, Honorary Treasurer, who have given generous help in many ways.
- 11. We thank most sincerely the organisers and contributors of the Romsey Hospital Week by whose excellent efforts we received £640.
- 12. The following Members of the Committee of Management retire in accordance with Rule 7, and are eligible for re-election: Canon W. H. B. Corban, Mr. A. J. Ledger Hill, Mrs. A. Lassell, Major-General Sir Richard Luce, Miss Prince and The Rev. A. Macdonald Thomson. It is hoped that these members will allow themselves to be re-elected for the short period before July.
