THE QUEEN VICTORIA MEMORIAL COTTAGE HOSPITAL, HERNE BAY.

The Governors have pleasure in submitting their forty-second Annual Report, together with the Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1934.

WORK OF THE HOSPITAL.

There has been an increase of 21 in the number of patients admitted; the total 335 in-patients established a record. The complement of beds remained the same as last year. By saving a day here and there the patients' resident days were reduced by 280, which averages less than one day per patient and, it is interesting to note, that this enabled the Hospital to take these extra cases.

There were 319 Casualties, making a total of 654 patients All Grades, 1,159 attendances were made for dressings, and 304 operations were performed, 128 Major, 176 Minor. Particulars of the in-patients are as follows:—

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The cost of the 319 casualty patients cannot be accurately ascertained. It includes some minor operations, massage and X-Ray treatment, and is charged to that of the in-patients in the following summary.

Income.

The Ordinary Income for the year shows a satisfactory increase, the chief item being £1,150 from the Contributory Scheme account, against £900 received from the same source last year. The Contributory Scheme starts 1935 with a balance of £310, against a balance of £198 last year, and it may safely be assumed that this Scheme will be one of the main means of raising revenue for the support of the Hospital.

In making a comparison with other items of income for last year, while the amount received from Subscriptions shows an increase of £28 against a decrease of £73 from Donations, it is reasonable to assume that many special donations received from grateful patients, which in other years have been credited to the Maintenance Account, have been paid to the New Hospital Building Fund.

The Church Offertories have increased by £13, for which the Governors extend their grateful thanks. The receipts from patients' payments and Approved Societies show a fall in revenue of £27 due to a decrease in the amount from the Approved Societies.

An amount of £51 was received from additional Boxes other than those registered under the Contributory Scheme.

Alexandra Rose Day and Easter Saturday Flag Day reached the high standard set up last year, and the Governors express their warmest thanks to the Organisers and the Ladies who assisted on these days set apart for the sale of flowers.

There is no change in the income derived from investments.

Expenditure.

During the last few years the Governors set up various Committees to establish control of spending, and savings have been further effected this year. The expenditure as shown in the summary is £2,359 18s. 7d., a decrease of £41 7s. 0d.

POUND DAY.

The Matron's Pound Day is a popular institution, the amount of provisions brought to the Hospital increases each year, and materially assists in keeping the domestic expenditure at a low level. Ten pounds in cash was also received and was expended on extra comforts for the patients.

EGG WEEK.

The Egg Week Appeal brought 3,876 eggs to the Hospital Store cupboard, and the Matron desires to record her sincere thanks to all who so readily responded, to make her appeals such a success.

LINEN LEAGUE.

The work of the Ladies goes on with unabated vigour. The Linen of the Hospital has been supplied and maintained without any cost to the maintenance account since the inception of the League. The value of which the Governors much appreciate and express their gratitude.

NEW HOSPITAL FUND.

In order to expedite the raising of necessary funds to commence building the new hospital at an early date, two conferences of repre-

sentatives of all local bodies and institutions were held during the summer and autumn.

An Appeals Committee was appointed from the delegates, in order further to departmentalise and particularise effort and to work in association with the New Hospital Committee. As an outcome of their recommendations the building of the Hospital is adopted as the official recognition of His Majesty's Silver Jubilee, which happy event occurs this year.

The sustained interest and good-will shown towards this great object is exemplified by the fact that in spite of the many difficulties and other urgent local needs, a generous public materially assisted in the substantial progress seen by reference to page 16.

Special mention must be made of the intensive efforts of the Brotherhood of Cheerful Sparrows year by year to augment the Building Fund by their magnificent donations.

The proceeds of the Broomfield Fete, again organised under the auspices of Mrs. Lovegrove, assisted by Mrs. Ruding Bryan and a Committee of Ladies, added to those of previous fetes, amount to nearly £600, and more than covers the cost of one bed in the New Hospital. The Colleges and Schools, in their collective endeavours to follow this example, have touched the £300 mark. With such a good beginning, it is confidently believed the enthusiastic efforts of the young people of our district will supply the amount necessary to provide one cot in the Children's Ward by the time the Hospital is built.

With like enthusiasm, all Societies and Organisations, as well as individuals, rallied to the aid of the Hospital. Whilst congratulating all upon the successful outcome of their energies, the opportunity is afforded the Governors to express their gratitude for the valuable assistance received, and which they feel assured will continue to be received, until the hospital is completed.

NEW HOSPITAL SITE.

The Governors wish to express their grateful thanks to the Trustees of the Dence Estate, and especially to Mr. Alex H. Dence, for their generosity in regard to the site of the new Hospital. Not only have the Trustees consented to change the site originally given to one which will better serve the purposes of the new hospital, but have agreed to sell to the Governors an extensive open space in front of the Hospital, and further land for development at the back of the Hospital, at a greatly reduced price; and furthermore, Mr. Alex. H. Dence has promised to personally discharge the cost of these additional areas. It will therefore be seen that the whole of the new site is in reality a free gift to the Governors for the new hospital.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The Governors record their high appreciation of the splendid work performed during the past year, and are mindful of the devotion of these officers in their untiring efforts on behalf of the needy sick and suffering.

They have pleasure in announcing that Dr. C. E. Gaitskell and Dr. Quentin F. Evans were appointed, in March, Honorary Medical Officers, and elected to serve on the Governing Board.

NURSING STAFF.

The happy relations existing at the Hospital have been fostered by the unremitting services of the Matron and the devotion of the Sister and Nurses in the care of the patients; many messages of gratitude have been received and the Governors congratulate the Matron and her Staff upon the excellence of their work.

ST. JOHN AMBULANCE BRIGADE.

The Governors desire to express their thankful recognition of the efficiency, willing assistance and ungrudging service rendered by the Nursing Division and by the Members of the Brigade for the work of the transference of patients to and from the Hospital and for placing at the Governors' disposal the use of the Lecture Hall at the Ambulance Station for Meetings, which cannot be held at the Hospital owing to the Board Room being used as a Ward.

GENERAL THANKS.

The Governors tender their sincere thanks to the Hon. Organiser of the Contributory Scheme and the Hon. Collectors for their indefatigable services, who by their active co-operation have placed the Maintenance Fund of the Hospital on a firm basis. To all who have volunteered in the Blood Transfusion Service, their personal sacrifice is sincerely appreciated.

It is with gratitude the Governors offer their hearty thanks to Subscribers, Donors, the Clergy and Ministers of Religion, Schools, Societies, and all who have in the many ways recorded in this Annual Report assisted in the maintenance of the Hospital and have provided funds towards building a new one.

The retiring Governors are: Mr. G. H. Beetenson, Rev. W. R. Lloyd, Mr. A. J. Webb, Mr. W. K. Webb, all are eligible for re-election with the exception of the Rev. W. R. Lloyd, who has left the town.

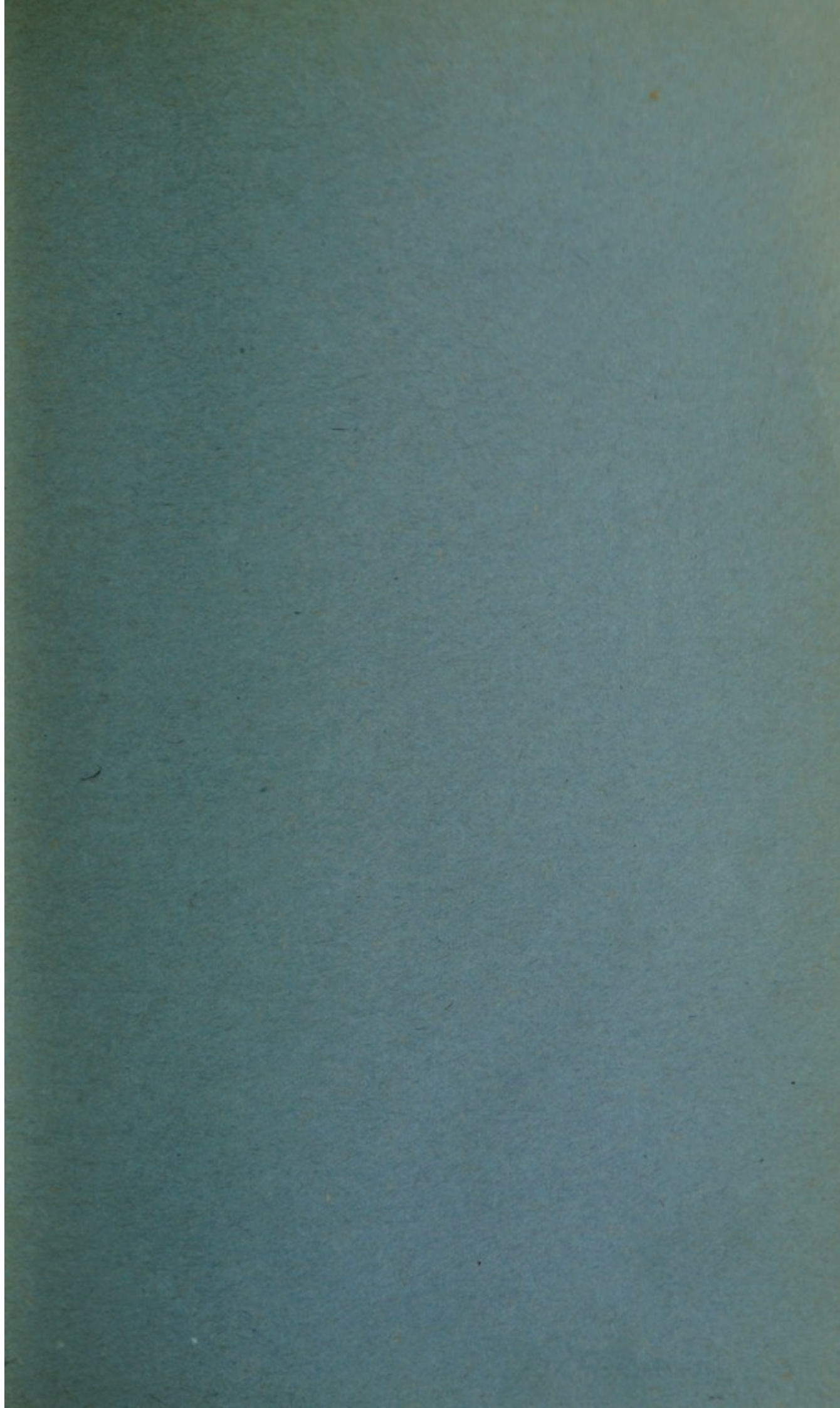
