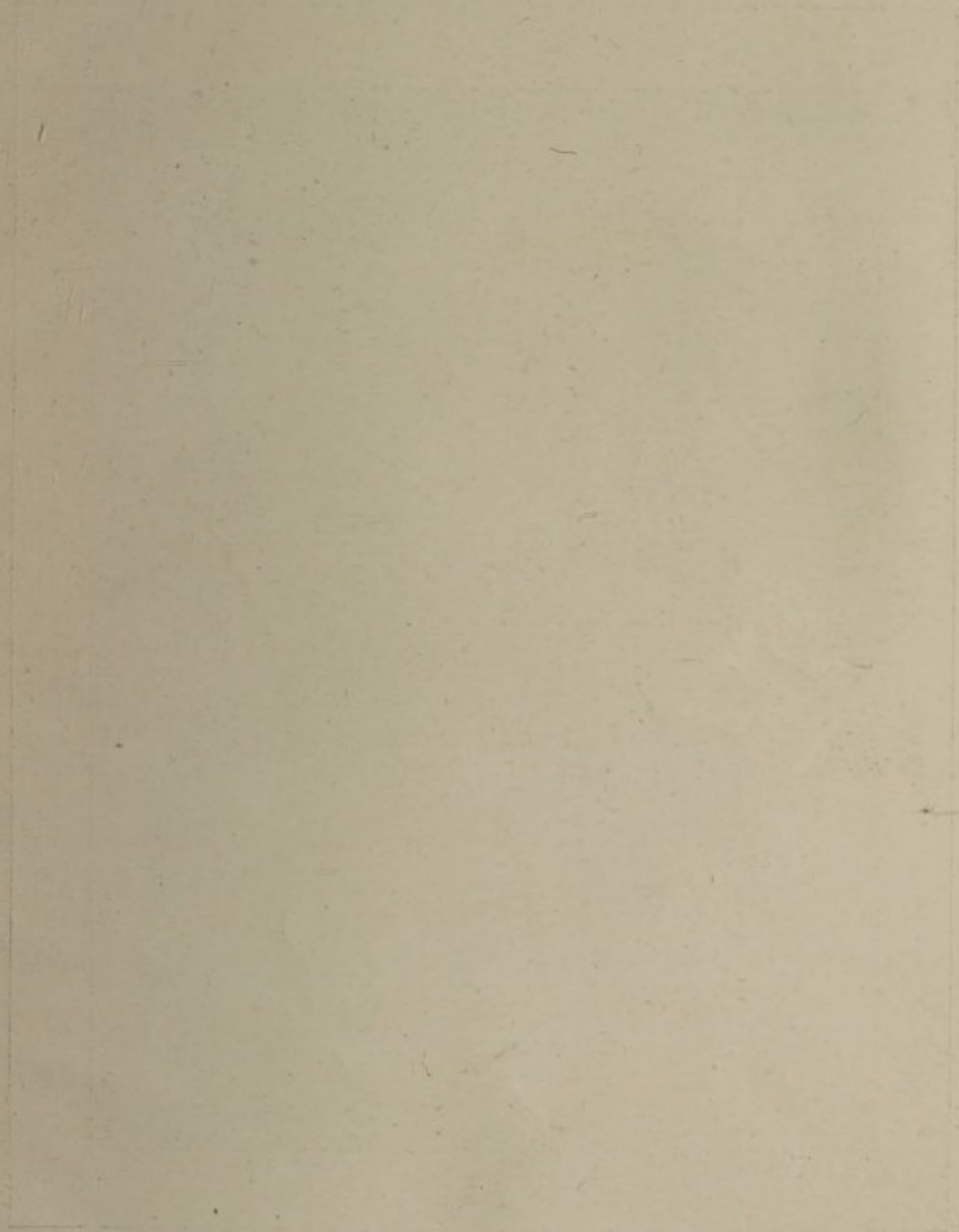

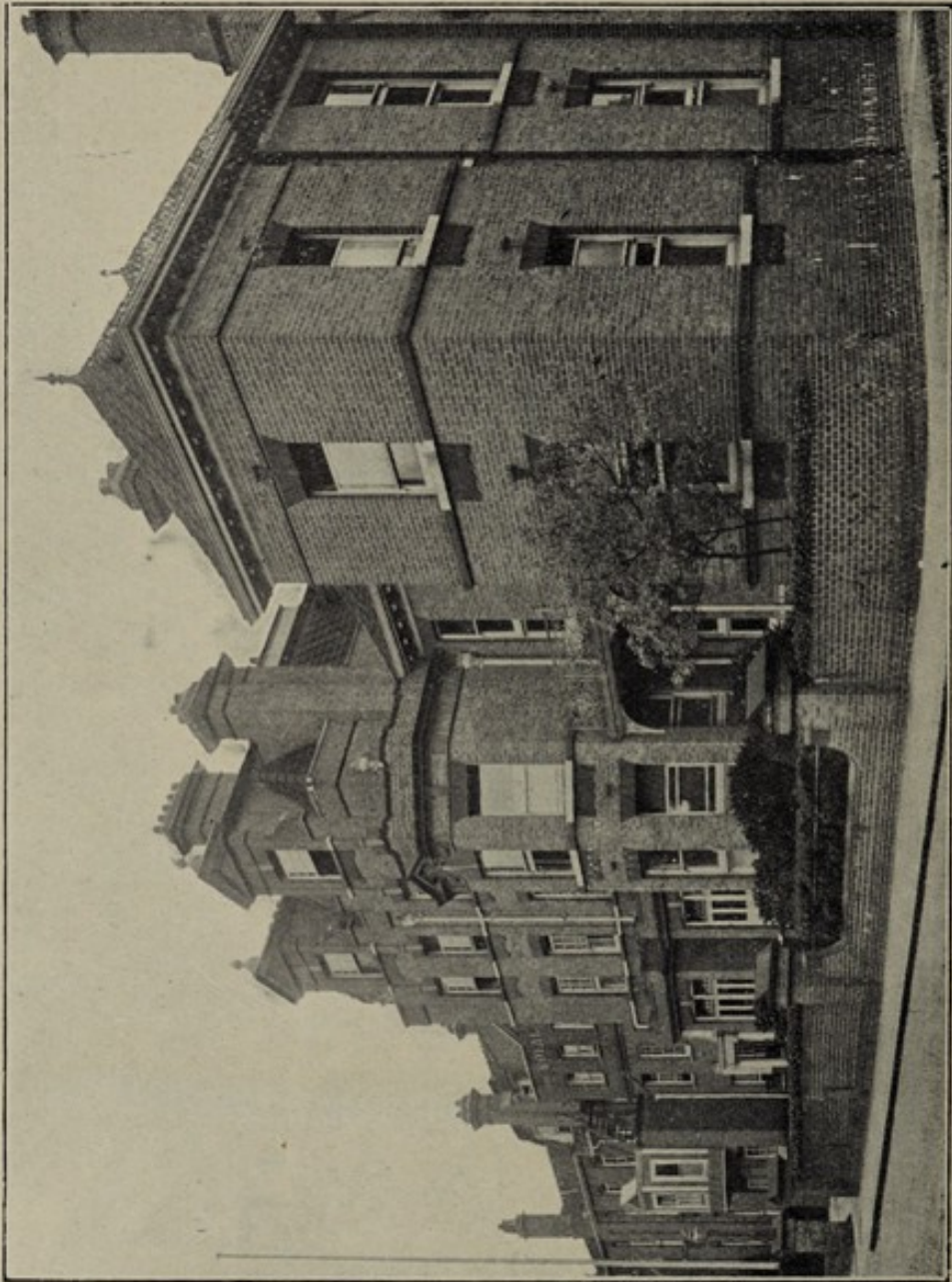

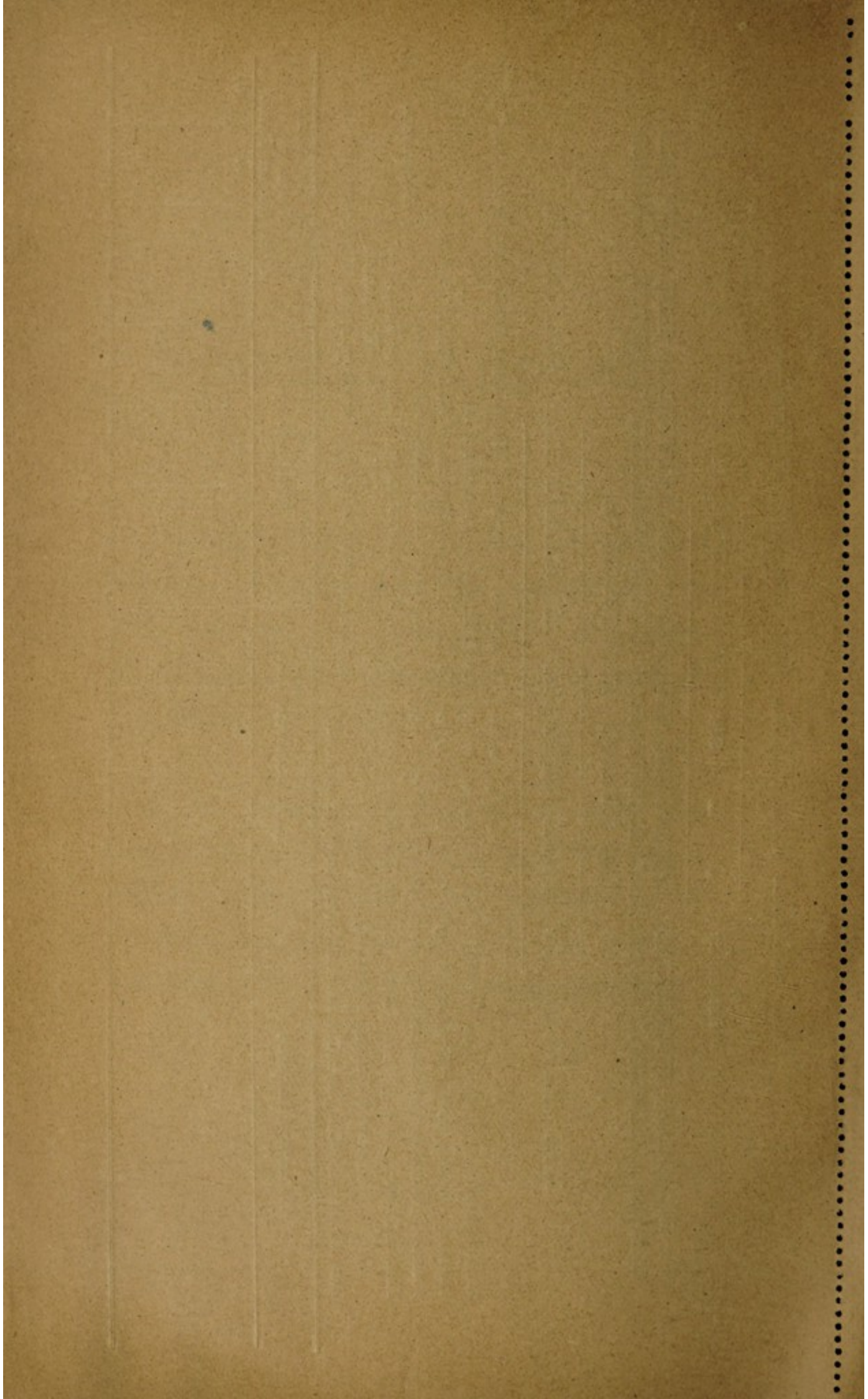

The Fifty-sixth Annual Report

of the Committee of Management to the

Annual Meeting of the Governors and Subscribers to be held at the Town Hall, Richmond, on Saturday, 15th March, 1924, at 4 p.m.

THE Committee of Management, in presenting their Report for 1923, again desire to call attention to the need for more ANNUAL SUBSCRIBERS, as the receipts from this source show a considerable decrease. The death of many subscribers of substantial amounts may, in a measure, account for this, and the Committee confidently hope that others will come forward to take their place.

The receipts from other items of income have not shown a corresponding increase, and, but for the Legacies bequeathed unconditionally, and a grant of £580 from the Hospitals Combined Appeal Fund, the Committee would have had to face a serious deficit.

As will be seen by the following tables, the expenditure shows an increase on the previous year. This is largely due to the necessity of having the whole of the Hospital drainage system overhauled and partly reconstructed, and to the renewal of piping, &c., in the hot-water supply system.

By the generosity of Sir John Archer, K.B.E., a central heating system has been installed throughout the entire buildings, which, while giving a more constant temperature to the Wards, &c., will considerably lessen the cost of fuel, &c. The same generous donor has also carried out extensive alterations to the kitchen and scullery and provided a new sitting room for the domestic staff. The Committee desire to place on record their high appreciation of Sir John Archer's liberality, which has resulted in greatly enhancing the attractiveness and usefulness of the hospital.

The Committee express their warmest thanks to the Ladies' Linen League for providing the necessary household linen, to the Subscribers, Friendly Societies, Boxholders, those responsible for Entertainments, &c., and to the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations for their collections.

The following have been added to the list of Vice-Presidents:—The Rev. C. H. Maxwell, M.A., Vicar of Holy Trinity, Richmond; The Rev. G. Weigall, M.A., Vicar of St. John's, Richmond, and the Rev. W. P. Cole Sheane, M.A., Vicar of Twickenham.

In order that the Hospital may retain its present position as a recognised Training School for Nurses, the Committee have been obliged to consider the question of extension of the Hospital premises, and have approved a scheme which includes the building of new rooms over the Out-patients' department for the accommodation of nurses, and an extension to the "Cambridge" and "Mary Adelaide" Wards, providing sixteen additional beds at a total cost of £10,000. The Committee have opened a Building Fund Account to secure the necessary funds to carry out the work, but have at present proceeded with only part of the scheme, viz., that dealing with the new rooms over the Out-patients' department, at an estimated cost of £4,200, and they trust that in the near future funds will be forthcoming to enable them to complete the whole. The Committee are greatly indebted to the Richmond and District Milkmen for their splendid effort which resulted in the substantial sum of £1,513 16s. 3d. being collected for the Building Fund. They also sincerely thank the other donors to the Fund, a list of which will be found on page 20.

Lectures and instruction, in accordance with the syllabus laid down by the General Nursing Council of England and Wales, have been given to the Nursing Staff by Mr. J. W. Heekes, Dr. Matthews, and a visiting Sister Tutor, to enable them to qualify for State Registration. These members of the staff are cordially thanked for their efforts in this direction.

The Committee also desire to express their thanks to all the members of the Hon. Medical Staff for their care

and skill in their treatment of the patients. Mr. R. Massie, O.B.E., F.R.C.S., having resigned his appointment as Hon. Surgeon to the Out-patients, Mr. Alan H. Todd, M.S. (Lond.), F.R.C.S. (Eng.), succeeds him.

The Committee record with great regret the death of Dr. Stacey Burn, for many years a member of the Hon. Medical Staff, and since 1920 one of the consulting surgeons. Dr. Burn will ever be remembered for his work for the Hospital, especially during the period of the Great War. In addition to Dr. Burn, the Committee deeply regret the death of Sir H. Evan M. James, K.C.I.E., Mr. Arthur Snow, and Mrs. Porteous. All had the interests of the Hospital at heart and gave valuable assistance in their respective spheres.

Thanks are due to the Hon. Masseuses, Miss Wolfgang and Miss Liversedge (the latter officiating in place of Miss Lang, who is at present on leave), for their work in connection with the massage department, which has proved a valuable adjunct to the Hospital.

The following changes have taken place during the year among the Committee of Management:—Mr. C. A. Sherring, M.A., J.P., has resigned, and Mr. John Warner and Mr. A. H. Etherington have been appointed members.

The members of the Committee retiring by rotation in accordance with the rules are:—Sir John Archer, K.B.E., Mr. Jacob Myring, and Mr. F. G. B. Trevor, C.I.E., J.P. Sir John Archer, K.B.E., being eligible, offers himself for re-election, but the other two members prefer, on the ground of ill health, not to seek re-election.

In July last, a Memorial Tablet to the memory of the late Mr. Joseph Culver, J.P., was erected in the entrance hall of the Hospital, and dedicated by the Vicar of Richmond (the Rev. J. F. Kendall, M.A.), Honorary Chaplain.

In conclusion, the Committee earnestly appeal for further help, as it is only by unremitting effort and the cordial co-operation of all classes of the community that the ever-pressing needs of those applying for relief can be adequately met.

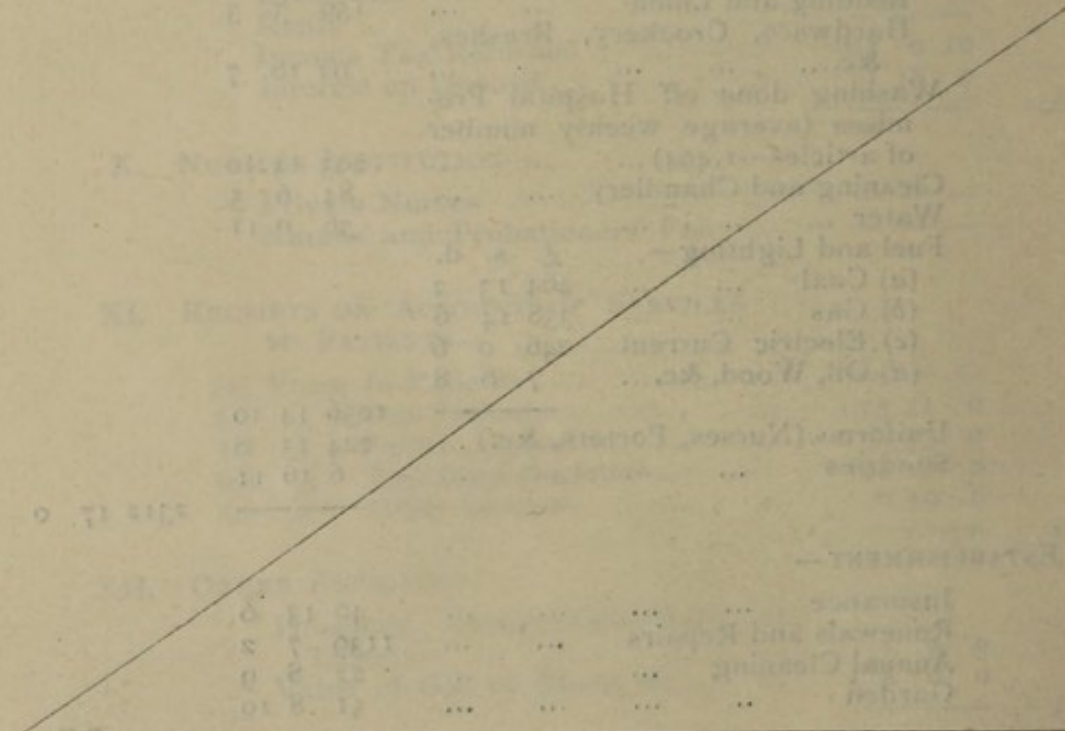

ABSTRACT OF RULES.

87. In-Patients, if considered suitable by the House Surgeon, shall be admissible on presenting their tickets of recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.

88. ACCIDENTS and urgent cases shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.

89. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.

91. No woman pregnant (except in extraordinary cases, such as accidents, or where some surgical operation is required), no insane person, no person subject to chronic epilepsy or suffering from any infectious disease, confirmed consumption, or any disease that be judged incurable, shall be admitted as an In-Patient.

92. Whenever any person, duly recommended as an In-Patient, cannot be admitted for want of room, or be either rejected as ineligible, or discharged for irregularity, a letter to that effect shall be sent to the person by whom the Patient has been recommended.

93. In-Patients may be visited on Sundays and Wednesdays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions shall be allowed to be taken into the Hospital, except by the permission of the House Surgeon. Should any visitor be detected taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, he or she will be strictly prevented from entering in future.

Annual Subscribers and Donors receive Tickets of Recommendation as follows according to the Rule :—

Rule 6. Subscribers or Donors shall be entitled to 3 Out-Patients' tickets for each £1 1s. given during the year, but any Subscriber or Donor may exchange at any time at the rate of 4 Out-Patients' tickets for 1 In-Patient's ticket. A Donor of £10 10s. or upwards, including Life Governors, may, if so desired, instead of receiving tickets to the full amount as above for the year in which such donation is given, receive the following tickets yearly during life-time, viz., for every £10 10s. 3 Out-Patients' tickets. A Subscriber or Donor of 10s. 6d. shall be entitled to 1 Out-Patient's ticket.

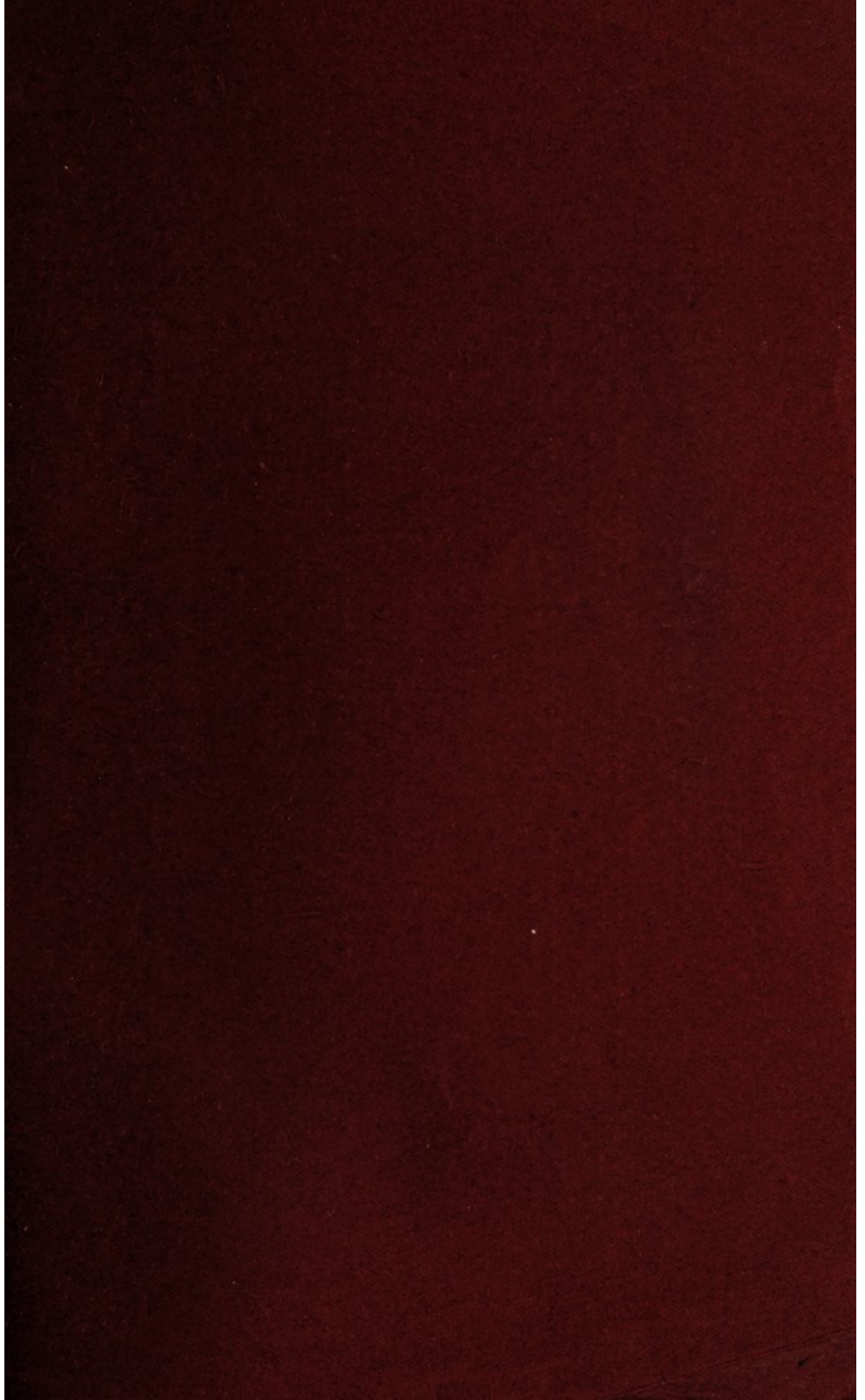
