THE Sixty-Ninth Annual Report 1936.

1936 marked another eventful era in the history of the Royal Hospital. The extensions and improvements that were commenced in 1935 were finished by the end of August, 1936, and on October 29th were duly opened by Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Gloucester, who was accompanied by the Marchioness of Cambridge, the Lord Lieutenant of Surrey (Lord Ashcombe, C.B., M.A., T.D.), Lady Ashcombe, the High Sheriff of Surrey (Captain C. E. Hoskins Master), Mrs. Hoskins Master, His Worship the Mayor of Richmond (Councillor P. H. Goodwin, J.P.), and the Mayoress, the President of the Hospital (Sir John Archer, K.B.E., J.P.), Lady Archer, the Lord Bishop of Kingston, the Chairman of the Hospital (Mr. Walter Sanderson, J.P.) and Mrs. Sanderson, and members of the Committee of Management, the Honorary Medical Staff, and many ladies and gentlemen from Richmond and the large area in the Thames Valley served by the Hospital.

In addition to the various alterations and extensions, the new porch, the cost of which was so generously defrayed by the President of the Hospital (Sir John Archer, K.B.E., J.P.), was also declared open by Her Royal Highness.

The new kitchens have proved a great success, and have ensured the efficient service of the meals for the patients and staff, and the many improvements and alterations in the wards have materially assisted the Nursing Staff in their work. The Nurses' New Home and the various sitting rooms which have been much appreciated, and the House Laundry recently opened, in addition to doing finished articles, has also relieved the Nursing Staff of a good deal of rough washing which they previously had to undertake.

The new Administrative Offices have enabled the Board Room to be kept for Meetings, and greatly added to the efficiency of that important side of the Hospital work.

Sir John Archer, K.B.E., J.P., once again showed his interest in the Hospital by defraying the cost of extensive alterations to the existing cloakroom for the Administrative Staff, and the enclosing of the Iron Staircase leading to the Nurses' Home, which now forms a continuous enclosed passage from the Hospital.

A considerable portion of the interior of the Hospital has been repainted, and the whole of the exterior. The Ophthalmic Theatre has been repainted, and the former scullery and domestic staffs' dining room has been converted into mending and storage rooms for the Hospital Linen.

A new sterilizer and high pressure boiler had to be installed as the old one was no longer safe.

Pay Beds.—Since the opening of the new extension in 1931 the pay beds have been well occupied, and from the time of the opening to the end of 1936 have yielded no less than £1,830 17s.

Vice-President.—The Marchioness of Cambridge has been appointed a Vice-President.

Resignations.—During the year Mrs. Lionel Warde and Councillor Harry Hedderly, S.C.C., have resigned from the Committee of Management.

Brig.-General the Hon. Robert White.—A great loss was sustained by the death of Brig.-General the Hon. Robert White, who for many years had been a very generous supporter of this Hospital.

Committee of Management.—Members retiring this year in accordance with the Articles of Association, and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election, are:—Mr H. E. Hornby, Alderman P. Hamilton Hughes, J.P., and Major W. L. Sandover. Mr. A. H. Etherington, J.P., also retiring this year is unable to offer himself for re-election owing to ill-health, and Mr. A. H. Dixon does not seek re-election as he has left the district.

Resident Medical Staff.—Dr. D. S. Hiddleston and Dr. E. A. Beet have been appointed to succeed Dr. E. D. Falconer and Dr. Keith F. Stephens.

Training Department.—Lectures in accordance with the Syllabus of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales have been given throughout the year, and Examinations have been held at the end of each course. Medical Lectures, Dr. T. A. Matthews; Surgical and Gynaecological Lectures, Mr. J. W. Heekes, M.B., B.S.; Anatomy and Physiology, Dr. D. Dunlop; Hygiene, Dr. C. S. Brebner, D.S.O. (M.O.H.); Practical Nursing, tests and revision, Matron.

Thanks are due to the Examiners for setting papers and conducting viva voce examinations. Examiners: Dr. T. A. Matthews, Mr. J. W. Heekes, M.B., B.S., Dr. C. S. Brebner, D.S.O., and Miss Scott Riddell, A.R.R.C.

Lecturers for the coming year: Dr. T. A. Matthews, Mr. J. W. Heekes, M.B., B.S., Mr. Alex Cruickshank, M.A., M.B., Ch.B., F.R.C.S., and the Sister-Tutor.

Ten Nurses have completed training and gained the Hospital Certificate and Badge, of these some are holding appointments at home and abroad, and some are filling senior posts here as staff and charge nurses.

Thirteen Probationers have entered the Hospital since January 1st, 1936; of these three left, as they were unsuitable

for the strenuous duties; eight have signed for the full period of training, and two are still on probation.

Linen League and Ladies' Working Party.—The Committee desire to express thanks to the Linen League and Ladies' Working Party for the valuable work which they have continued for so many years, and this assistance is a source of great encouragement to the Committee. In 1936 they gave £50 towards the Linen League Bed in the Women's Ward, £30 towards the maintenance of a cot in the Children's Ward, and £129 11s. to provide house linen, &c. To Mrs. William Sandover, the Hon. Secretary, the members of the Linen League, and the members of the Working Party, the Committee take this opportunity to express their sincere appreciation of their splendid work and unfailing support.

Junior Branch of Linen League.—The Junior Branch, which was formed in September, 1935, for children of all ages, with Lady Mary Cambridge as the president, has increased in numbers, and it is hoped that during the coming year the membership will reach 100. The Committee express their thanks to the Chairman, Miss Sandover, the Hon. Secretary, Mrs. R. Sandover, Hon. Treasurer, and the members of the Committee for the work they have done for the Junior Branch.

Friends of the Hospital.—The Committee of Management very much appreciate the continued help received from the Friends of the Hospital Association, and desire to express their thanks to all those who have assisted in its work.

The Association has now completed its fourth year, and

once again the policy has been to help and increase the existing Hospital functions, such as Pound Day, Rose Day, and the Christmas Stocking Collection, and has been most successful.

In addition, the sum of £217 has been raised by a Bridge and Whist Drive, and the Garden Fête held at the Hospital in June. The Committee of the Friends of the Hospital are most grateful to the Girls' County School, the Old Vicarage School, and Broomfield House School for their kindness in holding concerts, sales of work, &c., and to Mrs. Riley for a sale of work, all of which brought in welcome donations to the funds.

The Associates now number 230, and all of them have been called on for help from time to time. The Committee consists of representatives from Richmond, Kew, Kew Gardens, North Sheen, East Sheen, St. Margaret's, East Twickenham, Twickenham, Barnes, and Petersham. The aim of the Committee is to extend its representation to all districts served by the Hospital, and the hon. secretary, Mrs. J. H. Houghton, 5, Holmestad Road, Kew Gardens, will be glad to have the names of any ladies who would be willing to join the Association. There is no subscription, and Associates may choose when, where, and how they like to help.

Pound Day.—The Committee are very grateful to Councilor Mrs. Ellen Edwards and all those who so generously assisted her. The quality of the goods received was better than in previous years. The Hospital was honoured by an inaugural visit from the Mayors and Mayoresses of Richmond and Twickenham and the Mayor of Barnes. In the afternoon the Arthur Rees Players came to present their gifts.

Hospital Cricket Match.—The efforts of the Hospital Cricket Match Committee once again proved most successful. A very enjoyable afternoon was spent watching the excellent cricket, played by a team of local cricketers against the team brought by Mr. "Patsy" Hendren, and resulted in a sum of no less than £165 15s. 10d. being added to the Hospital funds. The Committee are very grateful to all those who once again helped us organise this successful function.

Blood Transfusion Service.—During the past year the London Blood Transfusion Service have supplied many donors to this Hospital, without fee or cost, and the Committee are very grateful to both the donors and the Service for this assistance.

Gifts in Kind.—The Committee are particularly grateful for the many valuable and useful gifts in kind, a list of which appears on pages 80-83. The fund for the entertainment of the patients at Christmas received generous support, and the arrangements made by the staff to brighten the wards were much appreciated by both patients and visitors.

Special Departments.—The Massage and Electro-Therapeutic Department and X-ray Department continue to afford facilities for the treatment and care of the patients.

Endowment of Bed.—Mrs. J. P. Houghton generously gave £1,000 to endow a bed in the men's ward, in memory of John Pounds Houghton and their son Charles William Houghton.

THE REPORT OF THE ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

In spite of the rebuilding which went on for nine months in 1936, the Hospital continued to carry out work in all its departments, and very few less patients were treated than in our busiest year, 1935. As a result 8,874 new patients passed through the Almoner's Department, compared with 9,046 in 1935, a figure, however, which shows a large increase on that of preceding years. Of these 1,673 were In-patients and 7,201 Out-patients, 3,217 being members of the H.S.A. and 646 of the H.S.F. The amount contributed towards the treatment of patients was £6,003 10s. 2d., showing a slight decrease on the total, but an increased contribution in respect of each individual patient.

During 1936 62 motor accident cases were admitted, and the total cost of their treatment, with that of the seven patients still in at the beginning of the year, amounted to £556 9s. 2d., £177 19s. 10d. less than that of 1935. Of this total only £77 18s. has so far been recovered from Insurance Companies, the remaining £173 4s. 11d. being received in respect of ten 1935 patients. As in previous years, the Hospital's Honorary Solicitors have dealt with all outstanding cases, and their very valuable assistance is greatly appreciated.

The After-care work of this Department has again shown a considerable increase. Assistance and advice is frequently necessary in order to carry out the Doctor's recommendations, and to enable treatment begun in Hospital to be continued at home; help and advice is also needed when a patient is suffering from a chronic disability and is no longer able to carry on his work. An analysis of some of the ways in which patients have been helped is given below, and may be of interest:—

HON. CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

The patients are visited every Friday afternoon, and services are held in the wards every Sunday from 5—6 p.m. The clergy are available for special calls at all hours. Holy Communion is celebrated in the wards at the greater festivals, and the Blessed Sacrament is brought to individuals at any time as need and opportunity arise. A number of children have been baptised and when possible a service is held in the Children's Ward.

The clergy are always glad to be notified of people going into Hospital, and especially of those desiring to receive the Holy Communion there, so that there may be no fear of their being missed, as may happen through their being asleep or receiving medical attention at the ordinary visiting time.

The Rev. W. S. Bastow has done the greater part of the work throughout the year, with some assistance from the other clergy of the Parish Church and St. Matthias' ; the Rev. V. A. Demant, Vicar of St. John's, still gives valued help.

ABSTRACT FROM ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

52. The Governors shall have the privilege of recommending poor persons as patients, and although the Hospital shall be open to all suitable cases, preference in admission shall be given to such recommendation should the number of patients in the wards or circumstances generally, make a selection necessary.

53. Patients shall not be admitted to the Hospital, even on a recommendation, without the sanction of one of the Honorary Medical Staff or Resident Medical Officers unless in case of accident, or of special emergency.

54. No patients shall be admitted whose circumstances are such as to enable them to pay for their treatment, except upon payment of such sum weekly as may be fixed by the Committee, and all patients shall be expected to contribute as they may be able to the funds of the Hospital.

55. Patients receiving compensation for accidents or any patients receiving money benefit under the National Insurance Act, 1911, or any subsequent or amending Act or for special treatment to other than Hospital patients shall make such payments as the Committee may require.

56. Accommodation may be set apart for private patients on terms to be fixed by the Committee not being less than £5 5s. per week, but in no case should this be done to the exclusion of the poor.

57. Assistance shall be afforded at the Hospital to persons suffering from minor casualties, in the department specially provided for out-patients. A charge to cover the cost of surgical dressings shall be made in all cases where such out-patients are able to pay therefor.

FORM OF LEGACY AND DEVISE.

To those benevolent persons who may be charitably disposed to become Benefactors by Will, the following forms are recommended as perfectly simple, yet answering every purpose.

For a Bequest of Money.

I bequeath to Royal Hospital, Richmond, Surrey, the sum of £
(free of duty) for the general purposes of that Institution ; and I declare that the receipt of one of the Treasurers for the time being of such Institution shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

For a Devise of Land or Houses.

I devise and bequeath all that

unto the Trustees for the time being of Royal Hospital, Richmond, Surrey, upon trust, to sell the same within one year from the date of my decease and to apply the proceeds for the general purposes of that Institution.

Signed by the Testator (or Testatrix) as and for his (or her) last will and Testament, in the presence of us both present at the same time, who in his (or her) presence at his (or her) request and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses.

N.B.—*Land and Houses, etc., can now be given by will for charitable purposes (as well as money, stock, and other personal property), but any Land or Houses, etc., so given must be sold (notwithstanding anything in the Will contained to the contrary) within one year from the death of the testator (or testatrix) and the proceeds applied for the purpose of the charity.*
