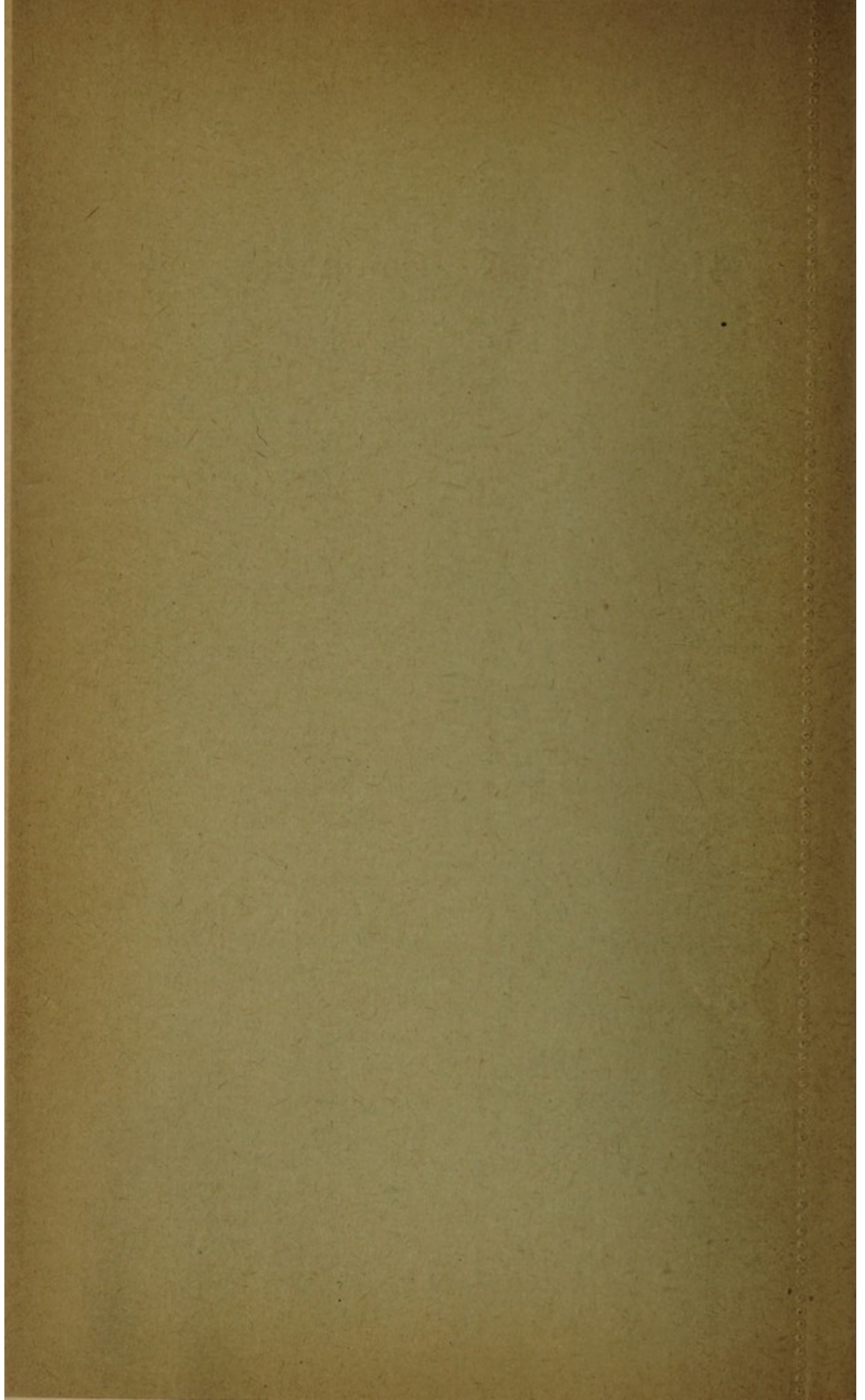

Twenty-Eighth Annual Report

OF THE

ROYAL HOSPITAL, RICHMOND, SURREY,

*Read at the Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers held
at the Hospital, on Saturday, February 29th, 1896.*

SIR JOHN WHITTAKER ELLIS, BART.,

IN THE CHAIR.

IN submitting to the Governors and Subscribers their 28th Annual Report, the Committee are pleased to note that the past year has been a prosperous one for the Royal Hospital.

Commencing with a balance in the hands of the Treasurers of £210 17s. 11d., the accounts at the close of the year show a balance of £338 16s. 4d. This satisfactory result is due to legacies left to the Hospital by the late Miss Thuillier £200, and £90 from the late Mrs. Sculstrop, of Twickenham; and the handsome gift of £500 from Mrs. de Wette, (in remembrance of her late father, Thomas Twining, Esq., by whose death the Hospital lost a very old friend—one who since the establishment of the Hospital had frequently presented large sums as donations). £250 of this sum was, at the donor's request, placed to the credit of the Building Fund.

It is with great regret the Committee have again to report a serious falling off in the annual subscriptions, amounting this year to nearly £50. The Hospital Sunday Collections also show a slight diminution, as well as the amount contributed by the Friendly Societies of the neighbourhood. On the other hand it is with great pleasure the Committee are able to announce an increase of £67 9s. 4d. from the Collecting Boxes throughout the district.

It was reported last year that the Princess May's Ward for Children and the Isolation Ward had been built, and that a further sum of at least £2,000 was required to complete the scheme of enlargement. H.R.H. the Duke of Cambridge, K.G., having again graciously consented to preside at a public dinner in aid of the Building Fund, a very successful banquet was held at the Star and Garter Hotel on the 18th November, which resulted, after payment of all expenses, in over £1,500 being added to the Building Fund. Towards this very satisfactory result the Committee are largely indebted to the liberality of Andrew Pears, Esq., who at the close of the dinner announced his intention of presenting £500 to make up the sum of £1,500 that had been asked for by His Royal Highness the Chairman.

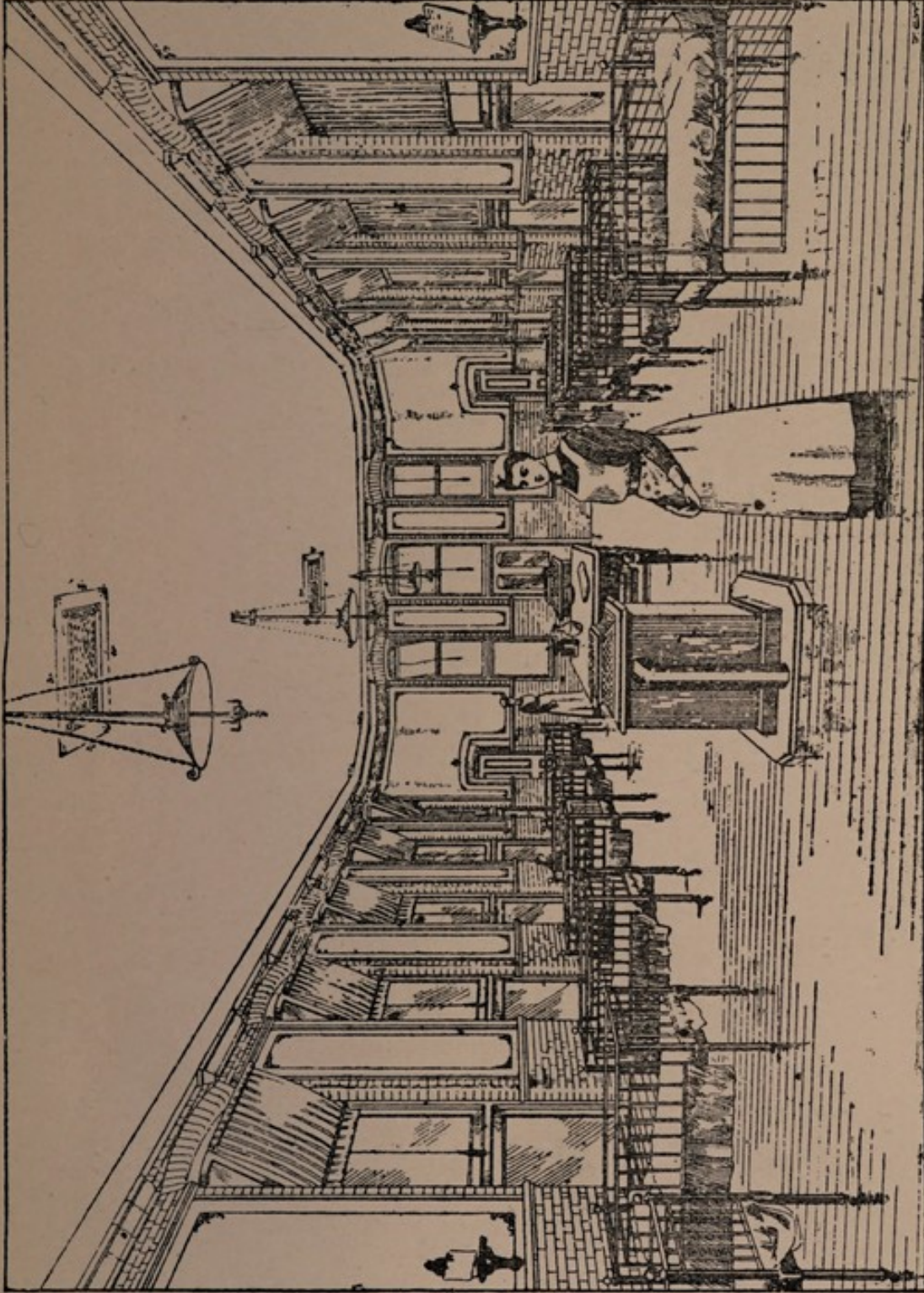
The executive portion of the new buildings is now approaching completion, and it is hoped that a public opening of the new ward, under Royal patronage, will take place during the summer.

The friends and supporters of the Hospital must bear in mind that the opening of the Children's Ward will entail considerable addition to the expenses of maintenance, but they will remember that the establishment of such a Ward had long been pressed upon the Committee by the Medical Staff, as a necessary adjunct to the existing accommodation of the Hospital.

In addition to the names of Mr. Thomas Twining, Miss Thuillier, and Mrs. Sculstrop already alluded to, the Committee have lost in the Rev. T. G. P. Hough, the late Vicar of Ham, a valued friend and supporter of the Hospital, and one who took great interest in its welfare from its earliest days.

To further secure the safety of the inmates of the Hospital in case of fire, the Committee have during the past year erected an iron staircase from the Mary Adelaide Ward to the garden, which is also a great convenience for convalescent patients who are well enough to enjoy the open air.

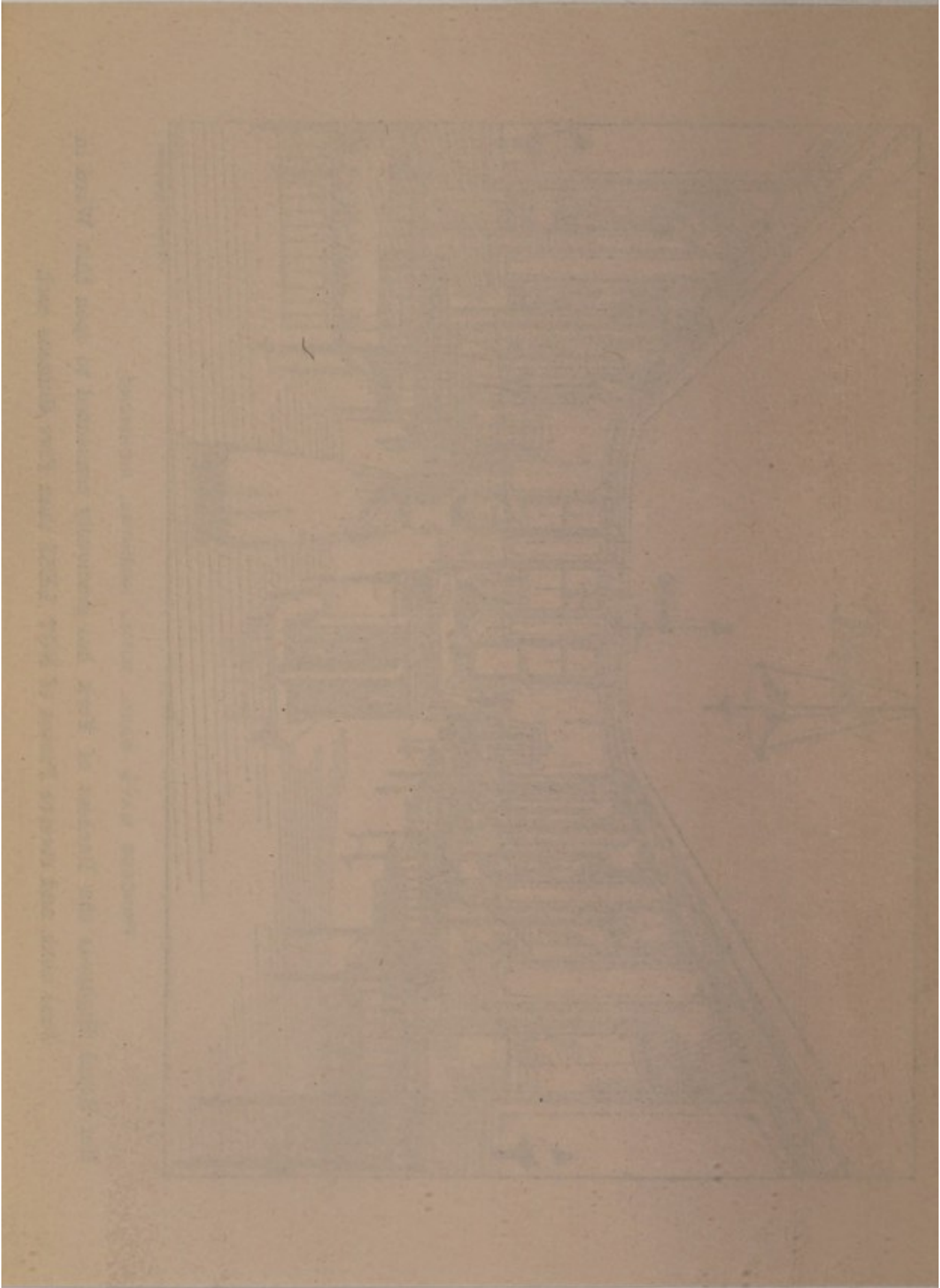

ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

79. In-Patients shall be admissible every TUESDAY in the year, on presenting their Ticket of recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such Tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.

80. ACCIDENTS shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.

81. Persons labouring under violent inflammation, or other acute disease (being otherwise proper objects of the Charity and properly recommended), shall be admitted at any time, by the direction of the Medical Officer in attendance.

82. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.

84. No woman pregnant,—no child under six years of age (except in extraordinary cases, such as accidents, or where surgical operation is required),—no person disordered in their senses, subject to epileptic fits, suspected to have the smallpox or other infectious distemper, having habitual ulcers, confirmed consumption, or any disease that may be judged incurable, shall be admitted as In-Patients; or if inadvertently admitted, shall be suffered to remain.

87. In-Patients may be visited on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions will be allowed to be taken into the Hospital. Should any Visitors be detected in taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, they will be strictly prevented from entering in future.
