# **THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT**

OF THE

## **Royal Hospital, Richmond, Surrey.**

*Read at the Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers held  
at the Hospital, on Saturday, February 24th, 1900.*

IN THE CHAIR.

---

THE Report for 1899, which the Committee of the Royal Hospital have now the pleasure of presenting to the Governors and Subscribers, is the Thirty-Second since the foundation of the Institution, with 12 beds, in 1868, and the Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to the many friends and helpers who by their generous support have enabled them to maintain the efficiency and usefulness of the Institution.

The average daily number of In-Patients for the past year was  $43\frac{1}{2}$ , very nearly the same as last year, and the total number admitted into the Wards was 523 against 539. The Out-Patients show an increase of 300 on the previous year, while the Casualties attended by the House Surgeon and the Dental Cases run about the same.

The total Income of the year amounts to £4835 5s. 5d., against £3472 5s. 1d. received in 1898, but of this total the sum of £1374 10s. was derived from Legacies, including one of £1000 from Mrs. Eliza Roberts, which amount the Committee have transferred to a separate Account, established with a view to further extension of the Hospital, including a new Out-Patient Department.

The Committee are glad to be able to report that they have succeeded in effecting the purchase and enfranchisement of the two cottages in Kew Foot Road, adjoining the Hospital.



The Annual Subscriptions for the year show a small increase, while the Donations are about £76 less than those received in 1898. With regard to Hospital Sunday Collections, the Committee regret that, notwithstanding the exertions so kindly put forward by the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations on behalf of the Hospital, the response was £43 less than last year, but a welcome increase of £24 has been received from the Friendly Societies of the District.

The amount received from the Collecting Boxes has again proved highly satisfactory, the last year's total being £1129 16s. 9d., an increase of £140 10s. on the amount received in 1898, and as this money is almost entirely collected from Members of the Industrial Classes it is most gratifying to the Committee to see that the Hospital is valued by the working men of the neighbourhood. They also desire to warmly thank the Box-holders for their sympathy, and again wish to place on record their high appreciation of the success which has attended the labours of the Secretary in this direction. They also feel their thanks are due to the Collector for the energy he has displayed.

Among the larger Donations received for the general purposes of the Hospital during the past 12 months, the Committee are indebted to Mrs. Porteous for £43, Messrs. John Aird & Sons for £21, John Mowlem Burt, Esq., for £21, the Worshipful Company of Skinners, for £10 10s., P. B. Burgoyne, Esq., £10 10s., and the Worshipful Company of Girdlers, £10.

Although not occurring in the year to which this Report refers, the Committee feel they cannot close their Report without expressing their deep sense of the loss the Institution has sustained through the death of Major-General H.H. the Duke of Teck, G.C.B., &c., who, during his residence at White Lodge, was a patron of the Hospital, and never missed an opportunity of showing his interest in its welfare.

They have also received with much sorrow the intimation of the death of G. R. Cundell, Esq., M.D., one of the Medical Staff of the Hospital since 1893, who, during the year of his holding the



office of Mayor of Richmond (coincident with the Diamond Jubilee of Her most Gracious Majesty) initiated the Victoria Endowment Fund, and by his indefatigable labours raised the substantial sum of over £3000 which is now invested for the perpetual Endowment of the Royal Hospital.

The Committee desire to return their very grateful thanks to many kind friends whose gifts of Magazines, Books, Fruit, Flowers, &c., have been most acceptable and welcome to the Patients.

In conclusion the Committee desire to express their gratitude to the Medical Officers for the time and skill so freely bestowed by them, and their thanks to all the Members of the Staff connected with the Hospital for their efficient services.

## ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

---

79. In-Patients shall be admissable every TUESDAY in the year, on presenting their Tickets of Recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such Tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.

80. ACCIDENTS shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.

81. Persons labouring under violent inflammation, or other acute disease (being otherwise proper objects of the Charity and properly recommended), shall be admitted at any time, by the direction of the Medical Officer in attendance.

82. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.

84. No woman pregnant—no person disordered in their senses, subject to epileptic fits, suspected to have the smallpox or other infectious distemper, having habitual ulcers, confirmed consumption or any disease that may be judged incurable, shall be admitted as In-Patients; or if inadvertently admitted, shall be suffered to remain.

87. In-Patients may be visited on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions will be allowed to be taken into the Hospital. Should any visitors be detected taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, they will be strictly prevented from entering in future.

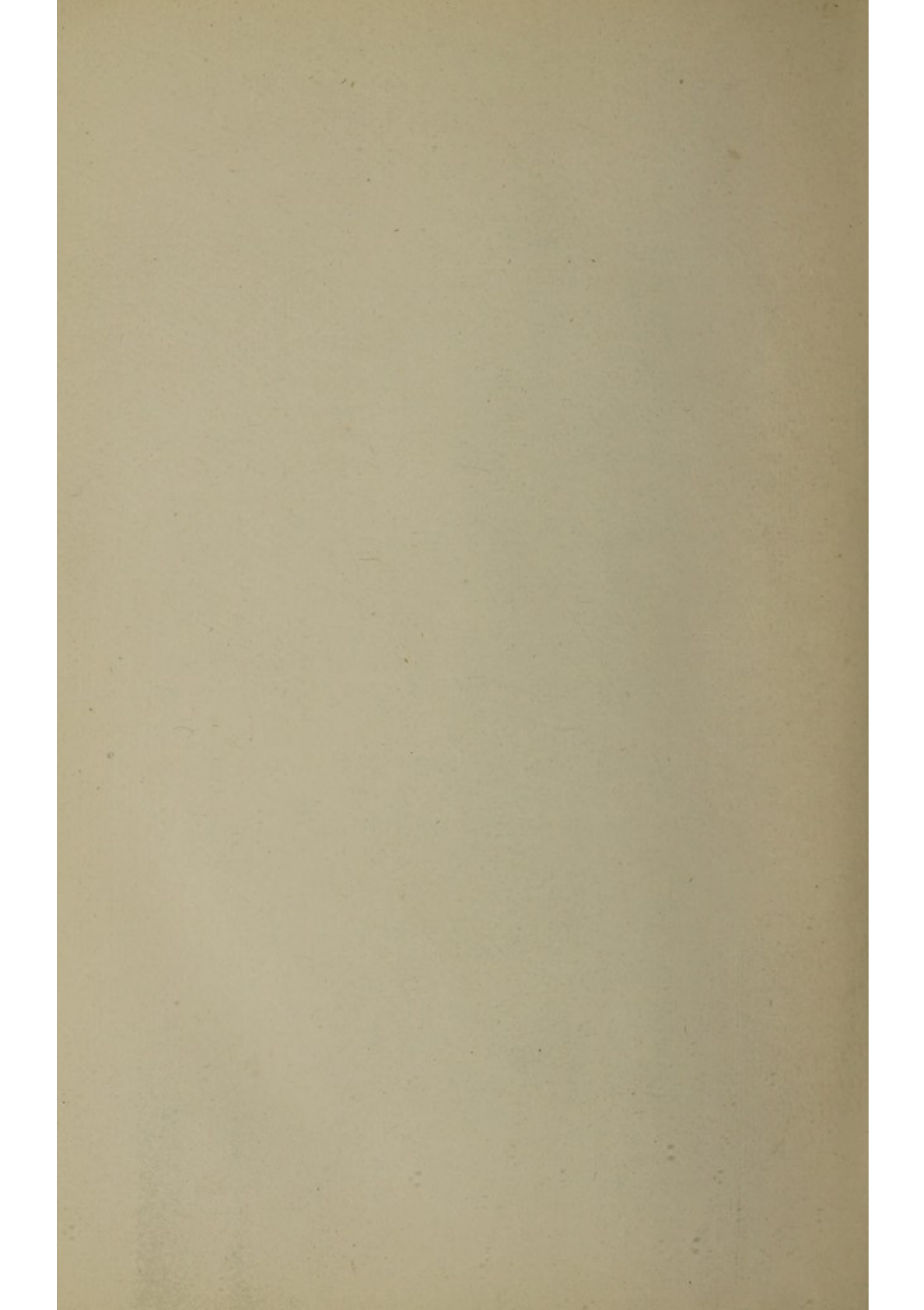




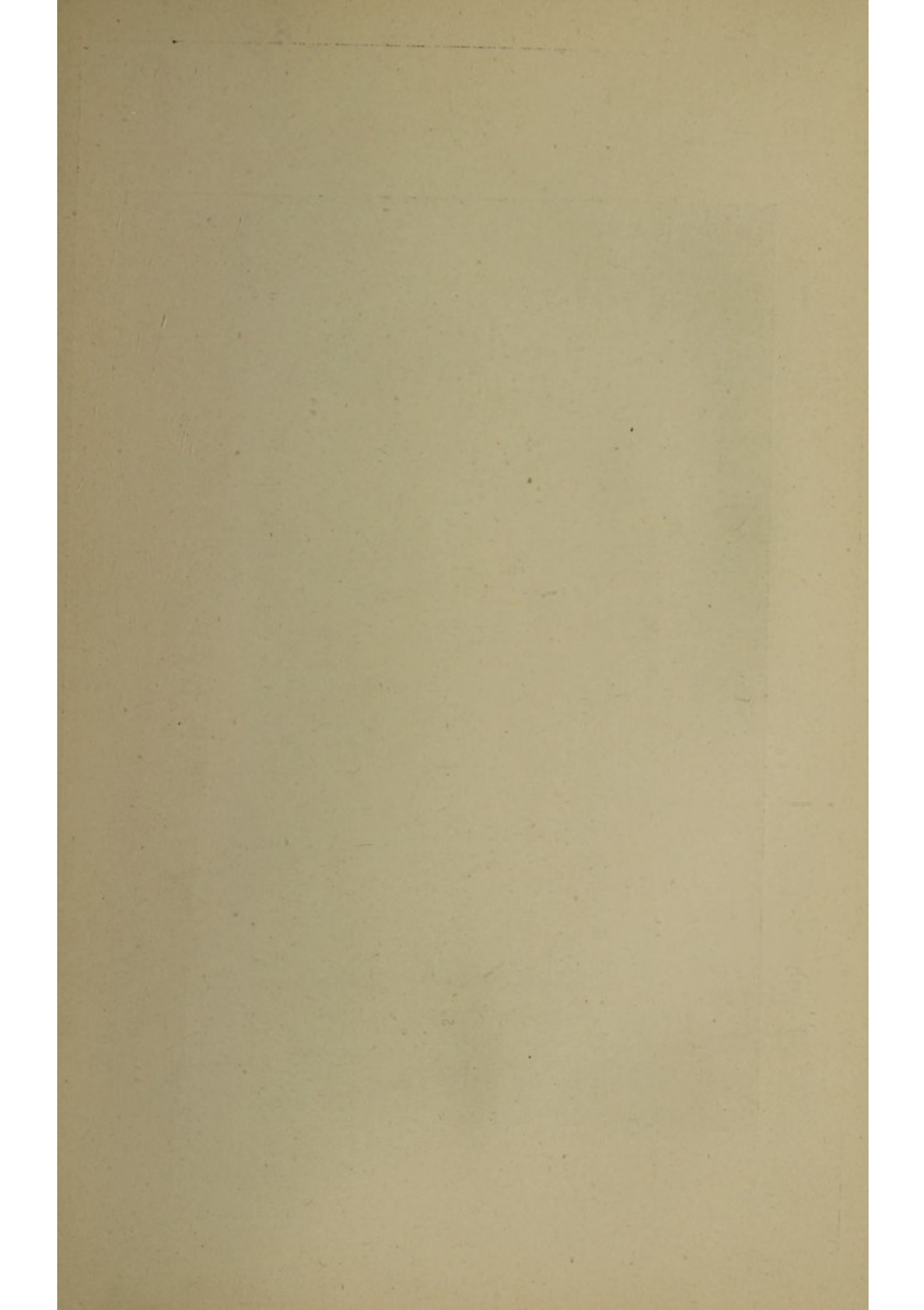




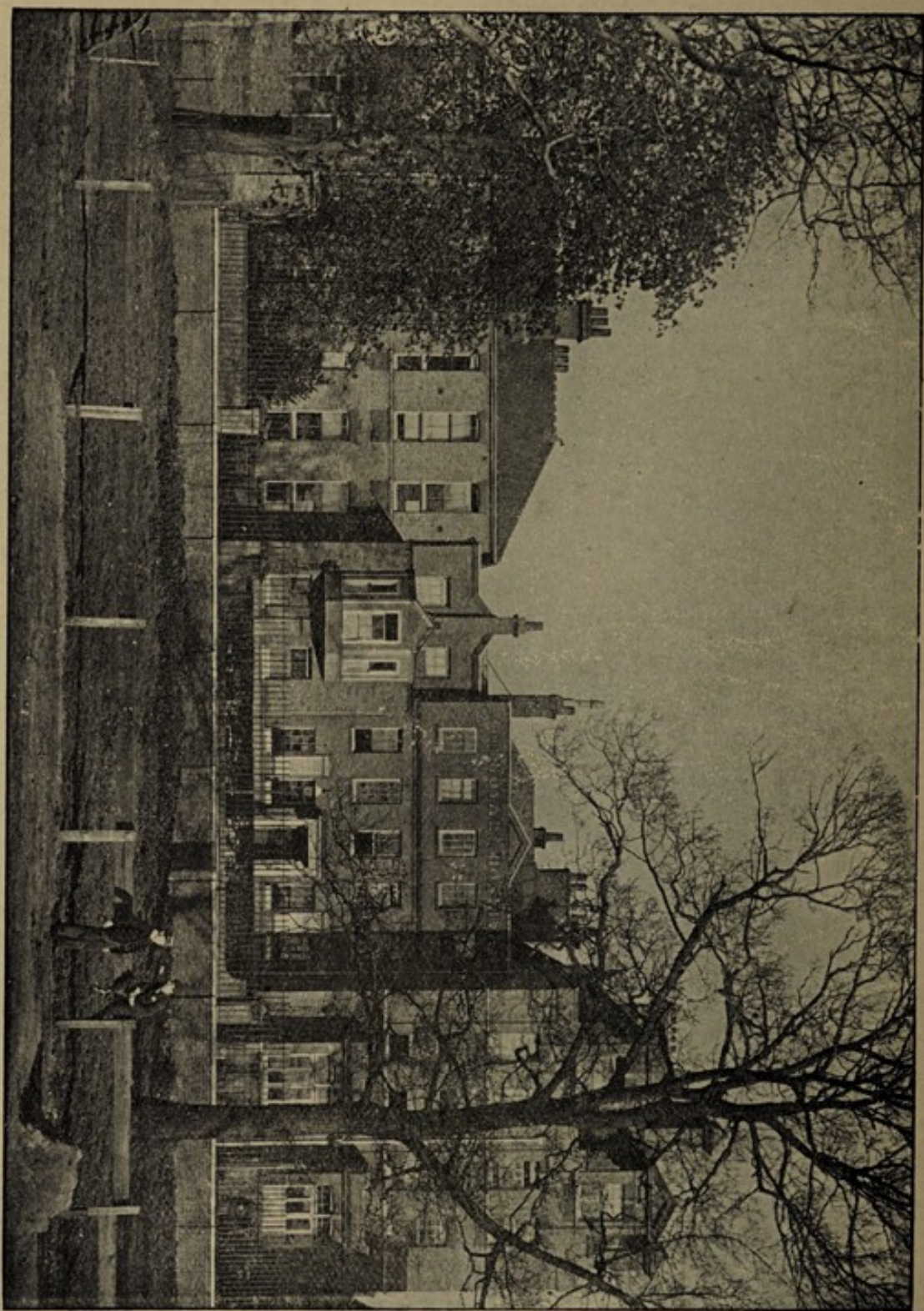
