

Read at the Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers, held at the Hospital on Saturday, February 28th, 1903.

HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR OF RICHMOND

(Albert Chancellor, J.P.)

IN THE CHAIR.

In presenting to the Governors and Subscribers of the Royal Hospital their Thirty-fifth Annual Report, the Committee of Management are again able to congratulate them on the financial position of the Hospital, which remains in a satisfactory state.

They much regret that the annual subscriptions for the year have fallen off by about £25, but the donations show a gratifying increase of over £60, the Committee of the Richmond Coronation Festivities Fund having, out of their balance, kindly presented to the Hospital one hundred guineas. The Hospital Sunday Collections show an improvement of £28. The amount received from the Friendly Societies is slightly less, but the amount received from the collecting boxes, £1,183 18s. 1d., shows an increase of £70 over the previous year.

The serious illness of His Majesty the King, Patron of the Hospital, induced the Committee to address letters to Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, and their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, expressing their profound sorrow and deep sympathy, to which gracious replies were received.

By the death of Mr. R. Alex. Smith in January, 1902, the Hospital lost a most valued friend and supporter. Mr. R. Alex. Smith had been associated with the Institution since its inception in 1868, had been a very liberal contributor to its funds, and served the post of Treasurer since March, 1883.

At a Special Meeting of the Governors held in February last, Col. Leslie G. Powell was elected a Treasurer of the Hospital in succession to Mr. R. Alex. Smith, deceased.

The Committee have to regret the loss by death of Mr. B. Corben, who for six years was a valued member of the Committee of Management.

The following legacies were received by the Committee during the past year, viz., Mr. Edward Hawes, from the estate of the late Mr. E. A. Newman, £500; Mr. R. Alex. Smith, £100; Miss Charlotte Harding, £100; Mrs. Eliza Nutt George, £90; and a further sum of £20 on account of Mr. Parfrey's estate. Out of these legacies £700 has been credited to the Extension and Building Fund, which enabled the Committee to purchase for £610 Shaftesbury Villa, at the corner of Kew Foot Road and Shaftesbury Road. The Governors of the Hospital are now in possession of the Freehold of the whole block, with frontage on the two roads above mentioned, required for the future extension of the Hospital.

Dr. E. B. Hill, who had held the post of House Surgeon to the Hospital since 1889, was compelled, owing to ill-health, to resign his appointment in August last, and in September the Committee appointed Mr. Eric M. Perkins, M.R.C.S.E., and L.R.C.P., of the London Hospital, as his successor.

At a Special Meeting of the Committee, held on the 30th September, it was resolved that, owing to the increased work thrown upon the Institution, both in respect of In and Out-Patients, an Assistant House Surgeon and an Assistant Dispenser were absolutely necessary. In October Dr. J. Gellie Davidson, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed Assistant House Surgeon, and in November Miss Clara B. Lloyd was appointed Assistant Dispenser.

At a Meeting of the Committee, held in October, a Sub-Committee was appointed to revise the Rules of the Hospital, and such revised Rules have been submitted to the Governors this day for approval.

Among the larger donations received during the year, the Committee most gratefully acknowledge the One Hundred Guineas from the Treasurers of the Richmond Corporation Festivities Committee previously referred to; a further sum of £50 from Mrs. Porteous, the result of her annual sale of work; Twenty Guineas each from Arthur Gard, Esq., J. Wilson Carillon, Esq., and Alfred Rixon, Esq.; Ten Guineas each from Chichester A. Bell, Esq., "Our Band Concert," the Grand Junction Water Works Co., and Mr. Henry Smith's Charity; and £10 each from Col. Reeves, C.B., and from S.D.R.S.D.

Mr. J. B. Hilditch, realizing the urgent necessity of a new and improved Out-Patient Department, generously promised the sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS towards carrying out the object.

The Committee have the pleasure to report that during the past year a third Cot has been endowed in the Princess May's Ward for Children, through the generosity of Mrs. Owen, of Richmond Park, in memory of two loved sons.

The following members of Committee, viz., Mr. T. Meadows Clarke, Mr. S. T. Gascoyne, J.P., Mr. J. H. Master, J.P., and Prof. F. E. Hulme, retire by rotation, but are eligible, and offer themselves, for re-election. Col. Powell having been elected a Treasurer of the Hospital, causes a vacancy on the Committee, while the death of Mr. B. Corben, and the resignation of Mr. Andrew Pears, J.P., on his leaving Isleworth, leave two other vacancies on the Committee to be filled up.

The Committee have great pleasure in thankfully acknowledging many gifts of old linen, magazines, &c., a list of which will be found at the end of this report.

In conclusion, the Committee desire to thank most heartily the Medical Officers for their valuable services, as also the rest of the staff of the Royal Hospital.

ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

- 87. In-Patients, if considered suitable by the House Surgeon, shall be admissible on presenting their tickets of recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such Tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.
- 88. ACCIDENTS and urgent cases shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.
- 89. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.
- 91. No woman pregnant (except in extraordinary cases such as accidents, or where some surgical operation is required), no insane person, no person subject to chronic epilepsy or suffering from any infectious disease, confirmed consumption, or any disease that may be judged incurable, shall be admitted as an In-Patient.
- 92. Whenever any person, duly recommended as an In-Patient, cannot be admitted for want of room, or be either rejected as ineligible, or discharged for irregularity, a letter to that effect shall be sent to the person by whom the Patient has been recommended.
- 93. In-Patients may be visited on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions shall be allowed to be taken into the Hospital except by the permission of the House Surgeon. Should any visitor be detected taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, he or she will be strictly prevented from entering in future.
