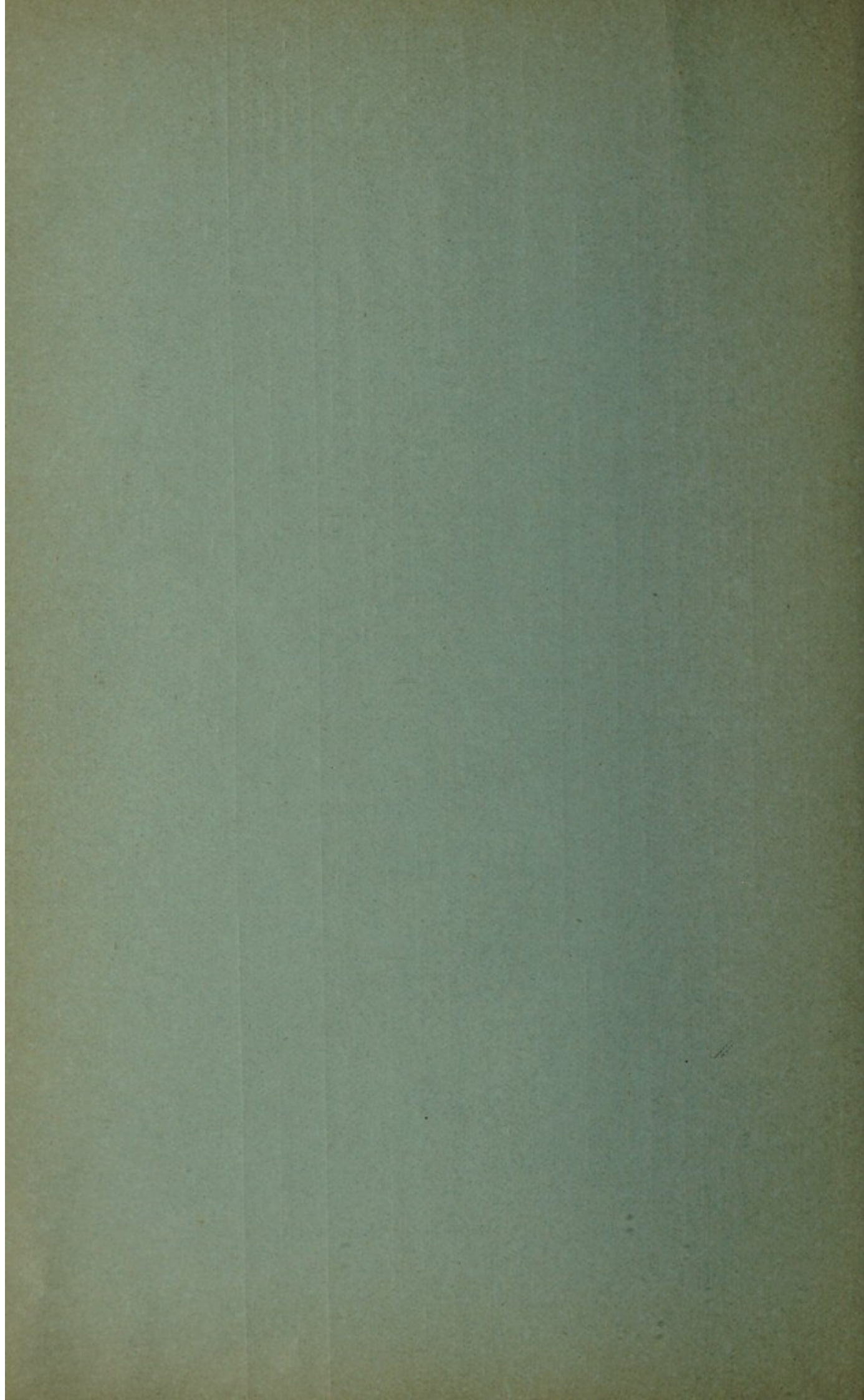

IN THE CHAIR.

THE Report for the year 1905, which the Committee of the Royal Hospital have now the pleasure of presenting to the Governors and Subscribers, is the 38th since the foundation of the Institution with 12 beds in 1868, in the old house, so long the home of the Shaftesbury family, and the Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to the many friends and helpers, who by their generous support have enabled them to maintain and extend the efficiency and usefulness of the Institution.

The total income of the year (including two Legacies amounting to £1,020 and a balance brought forward of £176 2s. 7d.) has been £4,780 17s. 1d., against £7409, 12s. 4d. received in 1904, but that amount included Legacies amounting to £3,789 4s. 10d., leaving little difference in the Income from ordinary sources. The expenditure for the same period has been £4,453 15s. 2d. in addition to which £500 has been invested in the purchase of £562, 10s. 8d. Consols.

It will thus be seen that the accounts for 1905 show a balance due to the Treasurers of £172 18s. 1d.

by which it will be seen that though the Subscriptions and Donations have remained about the same, the returns from the Collecting Boxes have more than doubled in ten years, thus showing that the Hospital is appreciated by the class for whom it was originally established, while the annual expense has necessarily increased very much by the addition of a Second House Surgeon, a largely increased Staff of Nurses and Servants, the New Ophthalmic Department and other causes.

The Committee much regret that notwithstanding the efforts of the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations on behalf of the Hospital, the Collections at the various Churches and Chapels still show a very considerable falling off.

The Committee would urge the Subscribers to induce their friends and neighbours to become Annual subscribers, as this source of income is the main stay of all Hospitals.

Dr. Eric Perkins, the House-Surgeon, resigned in May last, and he was succeeded by Dr. F. W. Davidson, the Junior House-Surgeon. The vacancy thus created was filled by the election of Dr. Robert Brown.

Mr. Edwin Picton, one of the Surgeon-Dentists to the Hospital, has resigned that appointment on leaving Richmond.

The Rev. Archibald Johnston and the Rev. Horace Warde, M.A., have been elected Vice-Presidents of the Hospital. c.

The following members of the Committee, viz., Mr. T. C. Brooks, Mr. E. Breton Osborn, Mr. Alfred Rixon, Mr. D. H. Scott and Mr. C. Westbrook, retire by rotation, but are eligible, and offer themselves for re-election, with the exception of Mr. D. H. Scott, who contemplates leaving Richmond shortly, and has therefore tendered his resignation.

Among the larger donations received for the general purposes of the Hospital during the past 12 months the Committee are indebted to Mr. George Dance for £127 1s. 6d., the result of a *Matinée* kindly arranged by that gentleman at the Richmond Theatre on the 30th of November last, on which occasion Mr. Dance paid all the expenses connected with the performance; £100 from the Friendly Societies' Committee of the Carnival and Fête held on the 23rd August; £96 received from Mr. W. G. East in respect of his Annual Cricket and Football Matches; the sum of £51 from Mrs. Porteous, the result of her annual Sale of Work, in addition to £6 12s. 6d. her annual half-crown collection; £19 8s. 6d. from the Mid-Surrey Golf Club; £15 7s. 6d. from Miss Dorothy Warner, proceeds of her concert at Kew; Ten Guineas each from Miss Mary Noverre (of the Richmond School of Art and Music) proceeds of a concert, A. J. Brink, Esq., and the Trustees of Mr. Henry Smith's Charity, and £10 from Lady Constance Monro.

The Committee again acknowledge, and desire to express their gratitude to many friends of the Hospital, whose names will be found at the end of this Report, for welcome and useful gifts.

In conclusion, they desire to record their grateful thanks to the Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution for their services, as also to the general Staff for the manner in which their several duties have been performed.

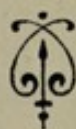

ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

87. In-Patients, if considered suitable by the House Surgeon, shall be admissible on presenting their tickets of recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.

88. ACCIDENTS and urgent cases shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.

89. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.

91. No woman pregnant (except in extraordinary cases, such as accidents, or [where some surgical operation is required), no insane person, no person subject to chronic epilepsy or suffering from any infectious disease, confirmed consumption, or any disease that may be judged incurable, shall be admitted as an In-patient.

92. Whenever any person, duly recommended as an In-Patient, cannot be admitted for want of room, or be either rejected as ineligible, or discharged for irregularity, a letter to that effect shall be sent to the person by whom the Patient has been recommended.

93. In-Patients may [be visited on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions shall be allowed to be taken into the Hospital, except by the permission of the House Surgeon. Should any visitor be detected taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, he or she will be strictly prevented from entering in future.

CONVALESCENT FUND.

Annual Subscriptions to this Fund are most earnestly solicited as, by its aid, Patients recovering from serious accident, or acute medical disease, are sent for three weeks to a Convalescent Home at the seaside, where they are likely to regain health and vigour sooner than in a Hospital Ward, while their removal leaves beds available for acute cases.
