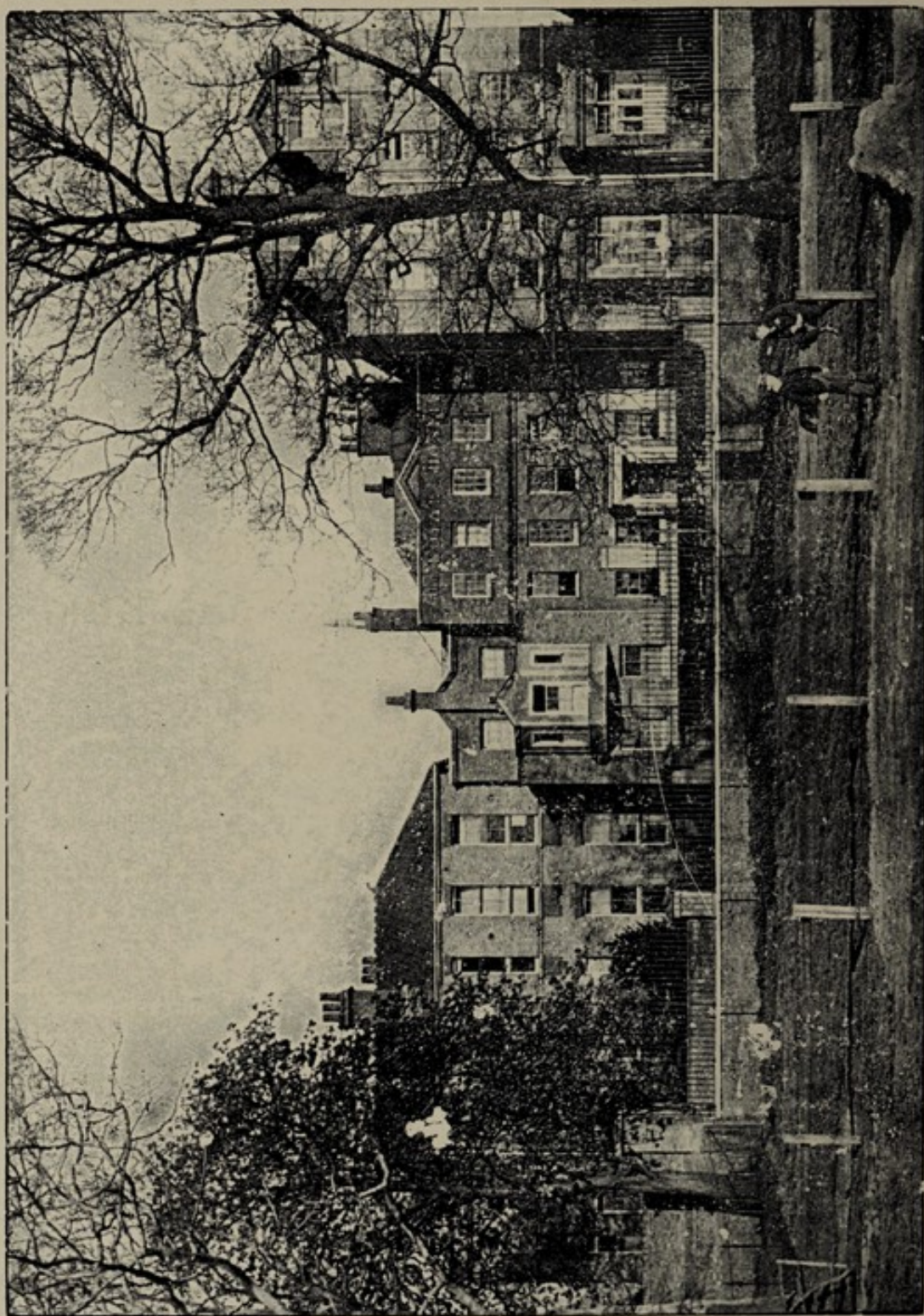

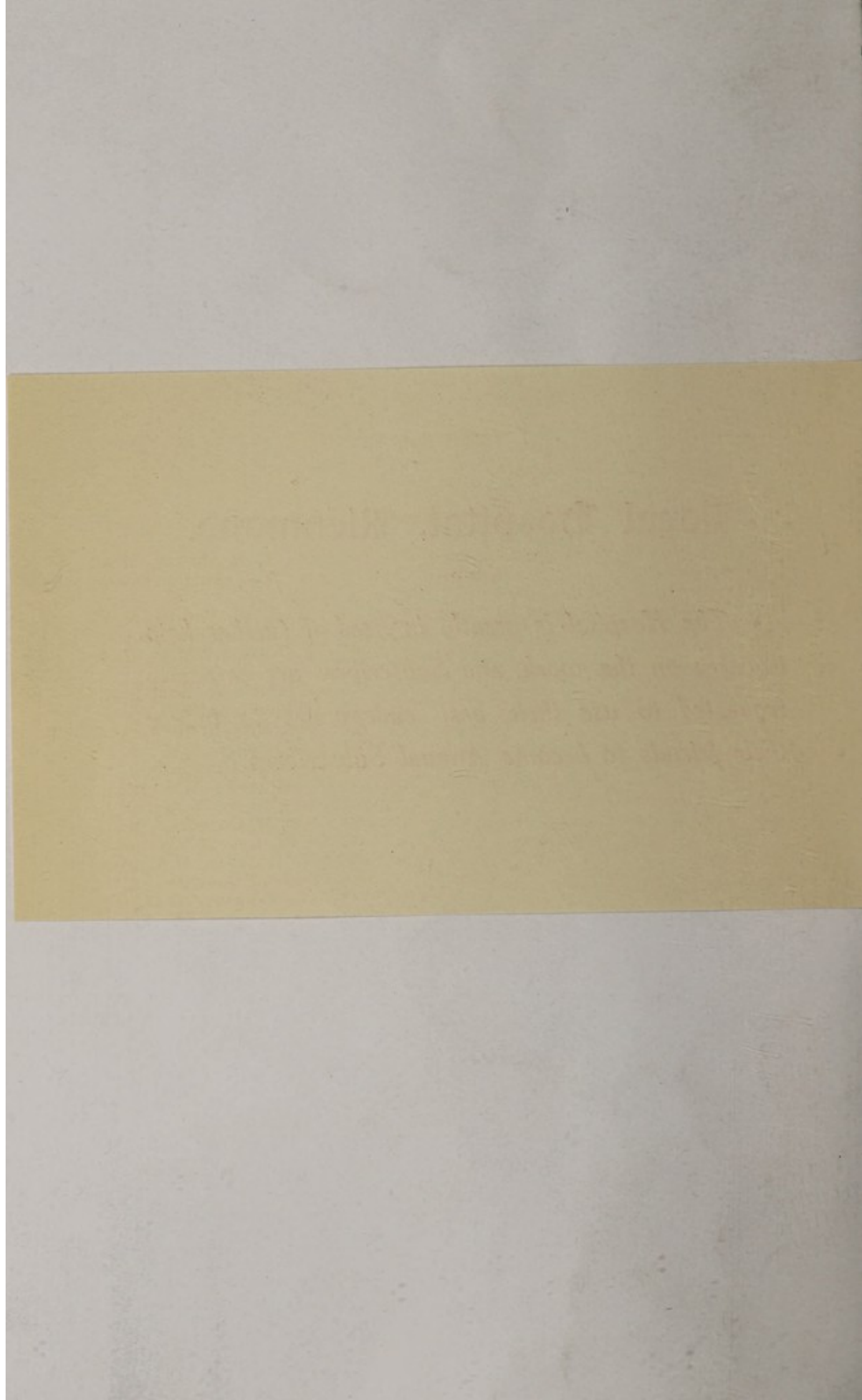

The Forty=Fourth Annual Report

OF

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

TO THE

Annual Meeting of the Governors and Subscribers, to be held on
Saturday, February 24th, 1912, at the Hospital.

The Committee of Management, in presenting their Forty-fourth Annual Report, desire to express their deep appreciation of the generous support which has enabled them to carry on the work of the Hospital.

The following comparative tables, giving the items of Income and Expenditure for the past four years, show that the Hospital continues to be managed with the strictest economy consistent with efficiency.

The Ordinary Income still falls below the requisite amount required for the Expenditure by some £700 per annum. The great need is new Annual Subscribers and Donors, and the Committee earnestly hope that subscribers will induce those of their friends who do not at present support the Hospital, to become subscribers, or to give donations in endowment of beds and cots, which yield a yearly income in perpetuity.

The Annual Subscriptions, Donations, and Boxes show a steady increase, which the Committee hope will be maintained. The receipts from Church Collections, however, show a slight decrease, and while the kind efforts of the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations, who so generously plead on behalf of the Hospital from year to year, are much appreciated, the Committee trust that this source of income will materially increase. The thanks of the Committee are also due to the Friendly Societies of Richmond and neighbourhood who have again substantially helped the funds of the Hospital.

The Committee record with much gratitude, Her Majesty's gracious gift of £700, to endow the "Queen Mary Coronation Bed" (the amount was collected at the instance of, and mainly through, the efforts of the Mayor of Richmond, Mr. Clifford B. Edgar, D.L., J.P., in Richmond and neighbourhood, and handed to Her Majesty as a Coronation Gift). The Committee have invested this sum in East India 3½ per cent. Debenture Stock.

Another generous donor to whom the Committee are much indebted is Mr. T. W. Stephens, of Downe House, Richmond, who gave 700 guineas to endow a bed in memory of his wife. The amount has been invested in Swansea Corporation 3½ per cent. Stock.

Mrs. Swan has again shown her appreciation by further donations amounting to £300 received during the year towards the expenses of the Swan Memorial Ophthalmic Wards. The following donations have also been received:—King Edward Hospital Fund, £290 (including £50 to the new Fire Escapes); Cricket Match, per Mr. T. Richardson, £54 15s. 1d.; Mrs. Porteous, £39 (in addition to £4 15s. 0d., her annual half-crown collection); Mrs. F. M. Hornby, £30; The Castle Electric Theatre, per Mr. L. Courlander, £21 4s. 8d.; Richmond Football Club Match, per Mr. L. P. Langton, £14 14s. 6d.; The Mid-Surrey Golf Club (Christmas Collection), £14 8s. 0d.; Mrs. Cockburn (in memory of her husband, the late Mr. Wm. Cockburn), £10 10s. 0d.; Mr. E. H. Leycester-Penrhyn, J.P., £10 10s. 0d.; Mr. Wm. Sandover, J.P., £10 10s. 0d.; Mr. W. Sharpey Seaton, £10 10s. 0d.; The Trustees of Mr. Henry Smith's Charity, £10 10s. 0d.; Mr. T. W. Stephens, £10 0s. 0d.; and the annual subscription of £20 from Sir Charles Burt, D.L., J.P.

The Fire Escape Staircases and Exits are now completed, and have cost £169 12s. 11d., towards which a special grant of £50 was received from King Edward's Hospital Fund. The addition was absolutely necessary to ensure means of escape for the staff in case of fire.

On December 11th last, Her Majesty Queen Amélie of Portugal visited the Hospital, and Her Majesty's presence and kindly interest was much appreciated by the patients and staff.

The Committee have to regret the loss by death of Mr. Albert Chancellor, J.P., who was assiduous in his work for the Hospital, and a valued member of the Committee for many years.

Mr. A. L. Weakley having resigned his appointment as House Surgeon, Mr. E. L. N. Rhodes was elected to succeed him, and Mr. H. W. Parnis was appointed Assistant House Surgeon.

The Members of the Committee retiring by rotation are Mr. G. H. Judd, J.P., F.R.G.S., Mr. Jacob Myring, Sir James Szlumper, D.L., J.P., Mr. F. G. B. Trevor, C.I.E., J.P., and Mr. W. H. Warner, who, however, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

The Committee thankfully acknowledge many generous gifts received during the year, a list of which will be found on pages 61 and 62.

The Committee also express their thanks to the Hon. Medical Officers for their valuable services.

In conclusion, the Committee would again impress upon all friends of the Hospital, the urgent necessity for further support, and sincerely hope that the Institution, which is so necessary to the suffering poor of Richmond and neighbourhood, will be endowed with the means of carrying on its work.

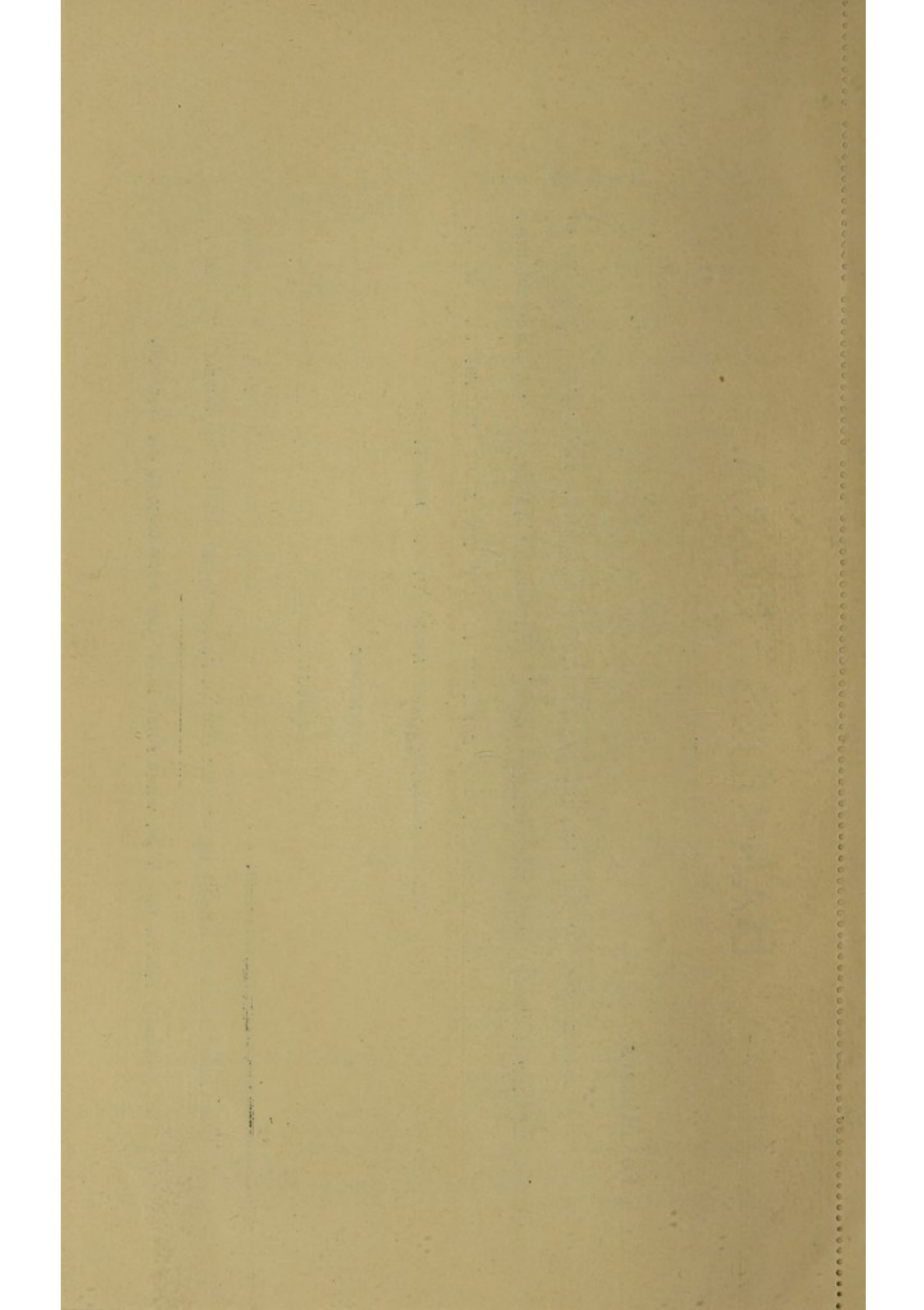

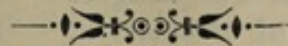

ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

87. In-Patients, if considered suitable by the House Surgeon, shall be admissible on presenting their tickets of recommendation at the Hospital before Twelve o'clock at noon, such tickets to remain in force for six weeks only.

88. ACCIDENTS and urgent cases shall be admitted at all times, without letters of recommendation.

89. When there shall be want of room in the Hospital for the admission of all persons duly recommended and qualified to be In-Patients, preference shall be given to cases admitting of the least delay.

91. No woman pregnant (except in extraordinary cases, such as accidents, or where some surgical operation is required), no insane person, no person subject to chronic epilepsy or suffering from any infectious disease, confirmed consumption, or any disease that be judged incurable, shall be admitted as an In-Patient.

92. Whenever any person, duly recommended as an In-Patient, cannot be admitted for want of room, or be either rejected as ineligible, or discharged for irregularity, a letter to that effect shall be sent to the person by whom the Patient has been recommended.

93. In-Patients may be visited on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and no provisions shall be allowed to be taken into the Hospital, except by the permission of the House Surgeon. Should any visitor be detected taking anything out of the Hospital, or introducing anything contrary to the rules, he or she will be strictly prevented from entering in future.
