REPORT 1927.

The Committee of Management of the Ripon Dispensary and Cottage Hospital have again to present their Annual Report of the Financial position, and of the work done in the Hospital during year 1927.

Though there has not been a very considerable increase in the number of Patients admitted to the Hospital since its enlargement, the increased accommodation, given by the New Wards and their accessories, has been of the greatest advantage, and has done away with the overcrowding, which not infrequently occurred in the Old Hospital Buildings, which not only caused great inconvenience, but was also a disadvantage to both Patients and Staff.

The alteration to the Old Building (which was always intended when the New Wards had been completed and occupied) so as to adapt it as the Residentiary Quarters of the Nursing and Domestic Staff, and for administrative purposes generally, has now been begun, and when completed will add greatly to the well-being of the Staff.

Several cases due to Motor Accidents were admitted; some of these were of a very serious nature, and entailed an expenditure of unusual labour and expense. As these Patients do not, as a rule, live in the district, they have not contributed to the Hospital Funds, and many of them are not in a position to do so. Even when insured, it is not always possible to recover any payment from the Insurance Company, and as payment is frequently made by the Companies when people are treated at their own homes, it would seem that the question is one that should be gone into with the Insurance Companies, and all those interested in motoring.

The number of Out-patients treated last year in the Dispensary was 104.

There were 279 In-patients in the Hospital during the year, as compared with 254 in the year 1926, which was then considered a record,

The new Contributory Scheme, as announced in last year's report, came into operation in April last, and the Organiser, Mr. James R. Jackson, reports that he has made a very good commencement; that the total number of registered contributors on the 31st December, 1927, was 1,023; that the amount paid into the Contributors' Account at the Bank (including payments made up to the second week in January) was £306 0s. 11d., of which £150 was transferred to the General Account of the Hospital before the close of last year, the balance being available for the Organiser's percentage and other initial expenses, the remainder being carried on to next year's account.

The number of Vouchers issued was 35, of which 33 were for In-patients, and 2 for Out-patients.

A separate statement of the Building Fund, prepared by Mr. C. B. Hutchinson, appears in this report, which brings it up to the completion of the New Buildings. It should be mentioned, that in addition to the Builder's contract, the items include New Heating Plant, New Boiler and Pipes for the Water Supply, Lighting, and other accessories which were introduced, and the following articles were provided, viz. : a new Operating Table for the existing Theatre ; and for the New Sterilizing Room in the corridor leading to the New Wards, a large Sterilizer for Dressings, etc., and Hot and Cold Water Boilers for Sterile Water.

A special fund to provide a Wireless Installation has been raised by a Sub-Committee of the Hospital Extension Committee. The contract has been let and the work is now being done, headphones being provided for the Wards, and a Loud Speaker for the Nursing Staff.

A fund having been raised as a Memorial to the late Mrs. Susan Owen, the wife of the Dean of Ripon, it was suggested, with his approval, that the money subscribed, viz. :— f_{500} , should be handed over to the Hospital for the endowment of a Cot in the Children's Ward. This was done in the month of July last, when, at a ceremony in this Ward, the Cot, with a Memorial Tablet, was dedicated by Dr. Charles Gore, a former Bishop of Oxford, in the presence of the Dean, Members of the Committee, and a large number of personal friends. The Chairman (Lieut.-Colonel Husband) received the Donation, and replied on behalf of the Committee. The Committe have to record, with deep regret, the death in the early part of the year, of their late Chairman, Mr. Oswald Hubert Wade. During the building of the New Wards, his great experience, and much of his time, were devoted to this work. The Hospital is deeply indebted to him for his labour, not only in this work, but also for that on the Committee for more than 20 years.

Another loss the Hospital sustained during the year, was that of Dr. William Dixon Jefferson, the Senior Honorary Surgeon. He was elected in February, 1880, and had thus seen the Institution pass through many phases of its career. He was one of the small Committee who organized "The Fancy Fair" in 1888, thus providing the fund which enabled the Old Dispensary to become a Cottage Hospital.

The Committee (subject to confirmation by the Governors at the Annual Meeting) have elected in his place Mr. A. Carnegie Brown, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P.

Miss Heslop still continues to give her valuable services as Matron, and is assisted by a Staff Nurse, a Night Nurse, an Hon. Masseuse, and 3 Probationers.

The Committee especially thank the Honorary Surgeons, and the Hon. Consulting Surgeons; and the Matron and the Nursing Staff for their increased work and constant attention.
