THE ANNUAL MEETING of the Governors of the Sussex Eye Hospital was held at the Hospital, Eastern Road, Brighton, on Tuesday, 18th March, 1947.

The Rt. Hon. Lord Denman, P.C., G.C.M.G. presided at the Meeting, supported by Admiral H. d'E. Skipwith (Chairman).

It was moved by Admiral Skipwith that the action of the Board of Management in summoning the Annual Meeting of Governors in March, be confirmed.

The adoption of the Report and Accounts was moved by Lord Denman, and seconded by Admiral Skipwith.

Mr. R. A. Dendy moved, Mr. S. J. Matthews-Hughes seconded, and it was carried that Their Graces the Duke and Duchess of Richmondand Gordon, the Right Hon. the Countess of Chichester, Lepel, Lady Barrett-Lennard, the Right Hon. Lord Leconfield and the Rev. Sir Frederick Sullivan, Bart., be elected Patrons of the Hospital; and the following be re-elected Vice-Presidents for the ensuing year: the Mayor of Brighton, the Mayor of Hove, the Vicar of Brighton, the Vicar of Hove, Mrs. A. W. Groom, Mrs. Warren Pearl, Mrs. Percival White, and Mrs. Robert Woodhouse.

It was moved by Mr. G. A. Strickland, and seconded by Mr. W. G. Macgregor, that Mr. B. Y. Bevan be thanked for his services and re-appointed Treasurer, and Barclays Bank, Ltd., be the Bankers for the ensuing year.

On the motion of Lady Barrett-Lennard, seconded by Mr. C. G. Schurr, the following Governors were elected to the Committee: Lady Sullivan, the Hon. Mrs. Mitchell Anderson, Mrs. A. W. Groom, Mrs. Anthony Marlowe, Mrs. MacManus, Mrs. Padday, Mrs. Percival White, the Rev. H. F. Tomkinson, Vice-Admiral H. d'E. Skipwith, Messrs. R. A. Dendy, J. Grosvenor Ellis, W. G. Macgregor, M. A. Palmer, and G. A. Strickland.

The Rev. H. F. Tomkinson proposed a vote of thanks to the Appeal Committee, and all voluntary Workers, including those who give their time in mending the Hospital Linen, etc., for their valuable services during the past year, also to the Matron (Miss

E. Cadman) and Nursing Staff, for their loyal and efficient services during the year. This was seconded by the Hon. Mrs. Mitchell Anderson.

On the motion of Mrs. A. W. Groom, seconded by Mrs. Padday, it was resolved that sincere thanks be conveyed to Mr. C. G. Schurr, Mr. J. P. Spencer Walker, and Mr. T. Keith Clifford, Hon. Surgeons; Mr. F. H. Fuller, Hon. Dental Surgeon; Mr. H. Downer, Hon. Rhinologist; and Mr. A. H. Osmond, Mr. B. Thorne Thorne and Mr. D. G. S. Macpherson Hon. Assistant Surgeons; for their valuable services during the past year.

It was moved by Mr. C. G. Schurr, and seconded by Lady Barrett-Lennard, that Statute 34 be amended by deleting the following words—'The Junior Surgeon shall take entire charge of all casualties admitted on Sundays'.

At the conclusion of the Meeting, Mrs. Percival White paid a tribute to the work of the late Mrs. H. d'E. Skipwith, the President of the Hospital.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded on the motion of Admiral Skipwith to Lord Denman for presiding.

The Annual Report of the Committee of Management for the Year 1946

On 6th December, 1946, the Hospital sustained a very sad loss by the death of Mrs. H. d'E. Skipwith, who had been the President of the Hospital since 1939. By her gracious service and whole-hearted interest in its welfare, Mrs. Skipwith had rendered most valuable service to the Hospital.

The Committee of Management in submitting its 114th Annual Report is pleased to be able to state that the work of the Hospital in Brighton, Hove and throughout the County of Sussex during the past year, has again increased as the following figures reveal:—

The Rev. Sir Frederick Sullivan, Bart., who had been a Member of the Board of Management and for many years its Vice-Chairman, tendered his resignation. In recognition of his invaluable services the Board have unaminously elected Sir Frederick a Patron of the Hospital, and desire to place on record heartfelt and sincere appreciation of his kindly and never failing interest for so long a period.

Mr. M. A. Palmer has been elected Vice Chairman.

Mr. C. J. M. Whittaker has resigned and Mr. W. G. Macgregor and Mr. G. A. Strickland have been elected to fill the vacancies on the Board.

The total Ordinary Expenditure has reached the record sum of £19,325 3s. 11d., an increase of over £3,500 on the previous year. This is due to expenditure beyond the control of the Board, such as further increases in the Salaries of the Nursing and Domestic Staffs and the completion of the interior decorations of the Hospital.

Happily, the Ordinary Income has been maintained—an increase of £800 has to be recorded—but in order to meet the heavy expenditure, the whole of the free legacies amounting to £3,373 2s. 6d. have been absorbed, a very regrettable necessity.

The work of the Appeal Committee is gratefully and thankfully acknowledged. Undeniably the satisfactory financial position of the Hospital is entirely due to the magnificent results achieved by the Appeal Committee. The 80,000 Shilling Fund has again proved most successful, the net proceeds being £2,415 12s. 2d. The outstanding and substantial assistance rendered to the Hospital by this Committee is greatly appreciated and the Board congratulate and warmly thank the Chairman (Mrs. A. W. Groom), the Members of the Committee and Mrs. Finney (the Appeal Secretary) for their very valuable service.

The Christmas Stocking Fund, which has been organised for many years by Mrs. A. W. Groom, realised a further record sum of £240. Most grateful thanks are tendered to Mrs. Groom for this much appreciated annual collection, and also to Mr. B. L. Gullen, who so ably assists with the collection.

Pound Day was again held in June. The sum of £297 was raised in cash, as well as a substantial quantity of gifts in kind. Congratulations and thanks are accorded to the Matron and her helpers and to the many friends and former patients, who helped to make this annual effort so successful.

Matron's 'At Home' again proved most successful. Many friends availed themselves of the opportunity of visiting the Hospital and as a result of the sale of gifts, etc, a total of £183 18s. od. was raised. The Committee offer to the Matron its sincere thanks for this much appreciated help.

Cordial thanks are accorded to the Sussex Provident Scheme for the sum of £1,989 5s. od. towards the cost of the treatment for their Members.

Grateful thanks are again tendered to the Members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, for the continuance of their devoted and efficient service.

Mr. E. V. Oulton tendered his resignation as an Honorary Surgeon after 24 years most valuable service rendered to the Hospital. In recognition of his devoted work, the Committee have unaminously appointed Mr. Oulton a Surgeon Emeritus to the Hospital, and have given him the right to use the Private Wards.

Dr. Mantell Daldy who had served the Hospital most efficiently for many years, and on his retirement had been appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon, passed away in January.

Mr. T. Keith Clifford has been appointed an Honorary Surgeon.

Mr. A. H. Osmond and Mr. B. Thorne Thorne have been appointed Honorary Assistant Surgeons.

Dr. Rex Binning has been appointed an Anaesthetist.

In consequence of the increase in the work of the Hospital a second House Surgeon was urgently needed and Dr. Davies has been appointed to fill the position.

In common with many Hospitals in the County, the Appointments' System for Out-Patients has been instituted and has proved most successful.

The loyal service of the Nursing Staff has continued during the year and the Committee extends grateful thanks to the Matron (Miss E. Cadman) and the Members of the Nursing Staff for maintaining so efficiently the work of the Hospital.

The Committee record with gratitude the continued support of the many friends, who by Annual subscriptions, donations, collections, gifts in kind and personal service, have helped to maintain the work of the Hospital. Thanks are especially accorded to the Rev. A. J. Williams (the Hon. Hospital Chaplain), to Mrs. Lyall for voluntarily carrying out the mending of the linen etc., and to the Voluntary workers in the administration of the Hospital.

The National Health Service Bill, which became an Act in November 1946, will create many changes in all Voluntary Hospitals and the Committee trust that the spirit which created and inspired them, and which is so vital for the benefit of the patient, will be maintained.

For 114 years the members of the Committee have earnestly endeavoured to provide an efficient service for the treatment of those afflicted with disease and injury to the eye, and to-day, the Governors can be justly proud of the up-to-date building with its modern equipment, and the efficient service rendered by the Surgical and Nursing Staffs. The Committee therefore hope that the Hospital will be the centre of Ophthalmic Service and Training for the South Eastern Region in the New Service, for which it is so eminently fitted.

Rules and Regulations

UNDER WHICH PATIENTS ARE ADMITTED INTO THE HOSPITAL.

- I. The Hospital shall be opened with the approval of the Committee of Management for the reception of such Patients as are entitled to advice, medicine and treatment at 1.30 p.m. every week-day except Saturdays, when the Hospital shall be open at 11 o'clock. All Accidents and Urgent Cases shall be treated at any hour on all days (Sundays included).
- II. Patients are requested to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance according to their means, but the Indigent Poor are admitted free.
- III. The Medical Officer, with the Lady Almoner, shall decide upon the propriety of admitting such cases as may apply.
- IV. Patients being eligible, shall be admitted according to priority of application. 'RECENT ACCIDENTS' and 'URGENT CASES' take precedence of all other cases.
- V. Patients who do not reside in Brighton or Hove, and who are unable to present themselves at the Hospital, shall send a statement in writing, signed by their Medical Practitioner, of his or her case, for the information or guidance of the Medical Officer on duty who will immediately reply to the same, stating the day on which such person (if deemed a proper subject) will be received into the Hospital. The Medical Officer will still be at liberty to reject such patients on their arrival, if, upon examination, he sees fit to do so.
- VI. Women advanced in pregnancy, or persons disordered in intellect, or labouring or suspected to be labouring under any infectious disease, shall not be admitted into the Hospital as In-Patients.
- VII. No Patient shall continue in the Hospital longer than one month, unless the attending Medical Officer shall deem it necessary.
- VIII. The Medical Officer will give his written orders for diet and treatment.
- IX. A Member of the Committee will visit and inspect the Hospital once at least in every week.
- X. No fee, reward, or gratuity shall be paid by, or on behalf of any patient to any employee of the Hospital for the benefit of such employee, or other person, directly or indirectly, for any services done or to be done, on account of the Hospital.
- XI. All records, reports and notes relating to Patients are the property of the Hospital and shall be deemed to be private and confidential.
