



# REPORT FOR YEAR 1905.

## The NEEDS of 1906.

To efficiently carry on the work on its present Scale will probably cost about  $\pounds 29,000$ .

Regular sources of Income are expected to yield £13,000.

To maintain the Old Hospital during 1906 there is therefore needed a further sum of £16,000.

#### Meanwhile,

owing to insufficiency of beds, poor sick people, living in the Hospital's District, are denied admission daily,

and yet

Wards for 60 Beds lie empty in the Clarence Wing

## for Lack of Funds.

£20,000 would enable these Wards to be opened, providing for 1,000 patients every year.

 $\pounds$ 4,500 a year would maintain them.

#### FORM OF BEQUEST.

Annual Report for 1905.

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for the year 1905.

Work.-The work of the Hospital was greater in every department, except the Maternity, than in any previous year. The number of In-patients was 4,298, compared with 3,989 in 1904, an increase of 309. Out-patients numbered 23,347 in 1904, and last year 24,456, an increase of 1,109. The numbers of Casualty Patients in 1904 and 1905 were respectively 20,959 and 23,063, an increase of 2,104. This represents a gross increase of 3,522 in the number of persons benefited by the work of the Hospital. The number of Extern Maternity Patients was, however, less by 87 than in the preceding year, being 1,120, compared with 1,207. The nett increase in all classes combined was therefore 3,435. The increase in the number of In-patients necessarily had the effect of increasing the average number of beds occupied daily throughout the year, but this was to some extent neutralised by the fact that the mean duration of the patients' stay in the Hospital was rather less than in 1904 (21.5 days, compared with 23'I days). The average number of beds occupied was 254 compared with 249'3 in 1904.

Finance.—The financial position of the Hospital at the beginning of 1905, as pointed out in the closing words of the last report, was one of very grave difficulty.

There was a debt on the General Maintenance Fund of  $\pounds$  10,000, owing chiefly to a falling off in legacies during the preceding year; a liability of £35,000 had been incurred on the building of the Clarence Wing; and a further sum of about £15,000 was required to complete and furnish the building and to make those modifications of the old Hospital which are necessary to enable the combination of the old and new to be effected.

In addition to the need of this large sum of  $\pounds 60,000$  to clear off debt and meet Capital Expenditure, there was the even more important necessity of increasing the regular Income.


The Board lost no time in taking up their formidable task, and they have worked at it continuously and with varying success throughout the year.


The effort to raise funds to clear off the debt and complete the enlargement of the Hospital, produced  $\pounds 13,145$ .

In reporting this result, the Board desire to record their grateful thanks for the liberality shown by many old supporters of the Hospital, by whom the greater part of this sum was contributed. They also express their grateful acknowledgments to King Edward's Hospital Fund for a special donation of  $\pounds$ 1,300 towards the paying off of the Building Debt.

Of the above sum of  $\pounds$  13,145, part only had been raised by the end of October, when, as there was no prospect that the amount would be materially increased, it was felt that the remainder of the debt to the Bankers should be cleared off by a Sale of Securities. A Special Board of Governors was convened, the situation was reported, and it was decided to sell.

Thus, partly by special contributions, but mainly by a sale of Securities,  $\pounds 36,720$  of the above sum of  $\pounds 60,000$  was provided, leaving  $\pounds 23,280$  outstanding. Towards meeting this there was a balance in hand on the Building Fund Account at the end of





the year of  $\pounds 2,741$ , leaving  $\pounds 20,539$  finally unprovided for. Until this sum is available, the Wards in the New Wing cannot be used, even if the necessary additional income to maintain them were forthcoming, as the laundry, kitchen, and other parts of the old Hospital must be extended, and other alterations must be effected before the enlarged Hospital can be worked.

Before proceeding to speak of the Income of the year the Board pause to remark on the precarious position in which the sale of the above Securities has left the Institution. There are now left in reserve, to meet emergencies, Securities amounting to £10,660 only. The work of the Hospital costs about £30,000 a year, towards which assured sources of Income provide about £13,000. For the remaining £17,000 a year the Charity is dependent on legacies and donations, and if these variable and uncertain sources of Income fail to yield that large amount, there is but £10,660 in reserve on which to draw to make good the deficiency.

Income .-- In the important matter of augmentation of regular Income, the Board regret they have nothing of importance to record. The total receipts for the year were greater by  $\pounds_{2,858}$  than in 1904, but  $\pounds_{2,100}$  of this consisted of donations in response to the Appeal, and £,685 was an increase in the Award of the Hospital Sunday Fund, for which the Board take this occasion to record their grateful thanks. The Hospital Saturday Fund Grant, which the Board also gratefully acknowledge, was £24 higher than in 1904. The only other variation worthy of mention was an increase of £75 in Annual Subscriptions, the greater part of which, however, was due to the kindness of many Subscribers to the Convalescent Fund, in transferring, in compliance with the suggestion of the Board, their Subscriptions to the General Maintenance Fund. The explanation of this is that the Dresden Bequest, received the year before, for purposes practically identical with those of the Convalescent Fund, enabled the work of that Fund to be carried on in future


without help from Annual Subscribers. The Board take this opportunity to thank all those who so kindly acted on the Board's suggestion to transfer their Subscriptions to the General Fund.


Among the receipts the Board are glad to report two bed endowments of  $\pounds_{1,000}$ , one from Mrs. Alfred Scorer and her sons, in memory of the late Mr. Alfred Scorer, who was for many years a Member of the Board, and of the House and Finance Committee, and the other a bequest by the late Mrs. Deloitte.

The Board hope that their efforts to improve the regular income will meet with greater success during the present year. In particular they hope for good results from a new departure which they have just made. They have appointed a Secretary to the Appeal Committee, to organize and carry out a continual personal canvass for Annual Subscriptions in the districts served by the Hospital. It is obvious that there are thousands of persons resident in those districts, if not tens of thousands, who, if they could be effectively approached, could regularly every year give a small contribution to the Hospital which more than any other in this part of London has a claim on them. It was thought that perhaps what is needed to evoke the sympathy and support of these prospective friends of the Hospital, is a personal appeal, and it was therefore decided to appoint an Official whose sole duty it should be, at all events for the present, to engage in this work.

It is evident that one individual, even though his whole time be devoted to it, can make but slow progress with such a task, and it has been suggested that it might be rapidly and effectively completed by the formation of a St. Mary's Hospital League, with numerous branches. The Board think favourably of this suggestion, and they have already taken steps in the direction of forming such a League. They earnestly ask the Governors and Subscribers of the Hospital to exercise their influence in furtherance of this undertaking.





**Expenditure.**—Although the Board have no material success to record in the direct augmentation of Income, they are happy to be able to report very satisfactory progress in the reduction of Expenditure.

In their last Report the Board stated that they were giving their serious attention to the reduction of those items of expenditure in which the Hospital exceeds other hospitals, and to the maintenance of its relative position in regard to those items in which it compares favourably. They have continued that attention throughout the year, and thanks largely to the active co-operation of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, very substantial results have been attained.

The total reductions in expenditure amount to  $\pounds 2,566$ . There were, however, small increases in some items, and one of  $\pounds 324$  in extraordinary repairs. The nett reduction amounts to  $\pounds 1,940$ , lowering the total expenditure from  $\pounds 31,563$  in 1904 to  $\pounds 29,623$  in 1905. This reduction in expenditure, taken in conjunction with the increase in the average number of beds occupied during the year, means a diminution of  $\pounds 12$  in the cost per occupied bed; the actual cost being  $\pounds 88$  13s. 2d. for 1905, compared with  $\pounds 100$  13s. 2d. in 1904.

The Board hope to be able to effect still further economies in 1906, though they cannot be so large.

Nursing.—Important changes have taken place in the Nursing Department during the year, the first and most noteworthy being the occupation by the Sisters and Nurses of their new Home in the Clarence Wing. The quarters in the old Hospital, the two houses, 35, Cambridge Place, and 53, Norfolk Square, and the apartments in Southwick Street, were vacated in March. This, it may be remarked in passing, will result in a saving of  $\pounds 276$  a year in rent.

The Home comprises the three upper floors of the Clarence Wing. The top floor is reserved for the Night Nurses, the two lower floors being occupied by the Sisters and the Day Staff. Each Nurse has a separate room, which has hitherto been impracticable even in the case of some of the Sisters. The importance of this improvement it is difficult to over estimate. In the past, the fact that three Nurses were obliged to sleep in one room has frequently led to the withdrawal of good candidates, and has seriously increased the difficulties of maintaining an efficient Staff.


There are two spacious sitting-rooms, one for the Staff Nurses and the second for the Night Nurses and Probationers. The attractions of the Staff Nurses' Sitting-room received an important addition just before Christmas in the arrival of a handsome upright grand piano by Broadwood, presented by Messrs. Rothschild & Sons. There is also a large Class-room for private study, where the Lectures on Nursing by members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff are given, and the Nurses' Circulating Library is installed.


Next to the provision of a separate room for each Nurse, the most important improvement is the ample provision of bath rooms and other offices, the deficiency of which in the old quarters was such a serious drawback.

The Home is warmed chiefly by hot water radiators, and is lighted by electricity. The rooms are lofty, and the whole Home is light and well ventilated.

The improvement brought about by their new Home, in the conditions under which the Nursing Staff—now numbering 108 persons—live and work in the Hospital is very great, and the Board have every reason to believe that the arrangements have given general satisfaction.

It will be readily appreciated that the power to improve the Nursing of the Hospital, or to ameliorate the condition of the





Nurses in matters such as holidays, hours of relaxation and exercise, times of study, etc., etc., depends upon the practicability of effecting an increase in the number of the Staff.

On many occasions during recent years suggestions made by the Matron for improving the Nursing of the Hospital or the condition of the Nursing Staff, had to be disregarded because there was no available accommodation for more Nurses, and because the taking of additional premises outside the Hospital, and the consequent further scattering of Nurses in isolated parties, was held to be highly objectionable.

These were among the considerations which, so far ago as 1888, when the scheme for the enlargement of the Hospital was launched, rendered the Nurses' Home, in the view of many members of the Board, the most important and urgent feature of the scheme. Accordingly, as soon as the New Home was occupied and the accommodation available was increased from 97 beds to 118, these important questions were brought forward.

The extent to which the Board could even then effect improvement was unfortunately greatly limited by the financial difficulties encompassing the Hospital. They would gladly, had they possessed the means, have gone much further. Eleven Nurses were added to the Staff. Four of these were appointed in order to improve the nursing in the Lilian Holland Ward, the Ophthalmic Wards, the De Hirsch Ward, and the Operating Theatre, one as Sister in the Matron's Office, one as an additional Masseuse, and five in order to provide for a lengthening of the holidays of the Staff Nurses, a much needed extension of the hours of relaxation and exercise, and of time for study.

At the same time the Board re-arranged the salaries of the Nursing Staff, not materially increasing the sum payable in the total, but readjusting them to the advantage of the Sisters and Staff Nurses. By these means the Board hope to encourage Nurses to remain in the service of the Hospital after the completion of their training, thus greatly promoting the efficiency of the Staff.

The work of the Nursing Staff in a large general Hospital worked at high pressure as is St. Mary's Hospital, is onerous and exacting, and the hours of duty long; and the Board feel that every reasonable provision must be made for their health, comfort, and general well-being. They hope the steps they have been able to take have effected sensible improvements in all these respects, and they look forward anxiously to the opportunity to proceed further.


The Medical School.—The number of entries showed a slight falling off as compared with the improved figures of the previous year. The general record of work as evidenced by examination results at the Universities and Examining Boards has been good.


The Medical School, unlike some of the Metropolitan Schools of Medicine, continues to provide complete courses of teaching for the several phases of the entire curriculum—Preliminary Scientific, Intermediate and Final—and at the present time the organisation and practical working of the various departments concerned are thoroughly efficient, and equal to coping with a considerably larger number of students without any material addition to the equipment or Teaching Staff. In the interests of the Hospital some increase in the number of Students is desirable, since the supply of Clinical Clerks and Dressers available for the routine Medical and Surgical work of the Institution is barely

routine Medical and Surgical work of the Institution is barely sufficient for existing requirements, in view of the high standard of efficiency now demanded in the several departments.

At the same time the Board ecammed the

Department for Therapeutic Inoculation.—The Board of Management, recognising the importance of the investigations carried on for some time past by Dr. A. E. Wright, F.R.S., and





his Assistants in the Departments of Pathology and Bacteriology on the diagnostic and curative value of inoculations of specially prepared vaccines in certain Infective Diseases, resolved, on the recommendation of the Medical Committee, to establish a new department for treatment on these principles.

In deciding on this course, the Board had in view the twofold object of rendering practicable the application of this method of treatment for the benefit of patients, and of facilitating further and more extended investigations for determining the scope of such Therapeutic Inoculations.

Dr. A. E. Wright has been elected Director in medical charge of this department and has been provided with two expert assistants, Captain S. R. Douglas, I.M.S., and Dr. J. Freeman.

A considerable number of patients are now under treatment, and in view of the heavy expenses necessarily incurred in carrying out treatment such as this, which involves complicated technique and highly skilled assistants, the Board will be grateful for further special donations to be devoted to the organisation and development of the department.

It is a source of great satisfaction to the Board of Management that this line of treatment, which has in it the promise of important developments, should have been originated in the Pathological Department of their Hospital.

The X-Ray Department.—The X-Ray Department is now established in two rooms in the Out-Patients' Department, and in them a large amount of exceedingly useful, and indeed in the present day indispensable, work is done daily.

To give a general idea of the nature and great utility of the work done by the X-Ray Department, it may be mentioned that the surgeons send a large proportion of fractures to be examined before setting, and again afterwards to verify the accuracy of the apposition of the broken ends. Almost all tumours and deformities of bone are examined by X Rays, and a great many cases of disease of bone. Practically all metallic foreign bodies in the tissues have their position ascertained by X-Ray examination, as also stones in the kidneys or bladder. Many dislocations are examined both before and after reduction. The surgeons also send inoperable malignant growths for therapeutic X-Ray treatment, and recurrence cases after operation.


From the Physicians come cases of disease of heart and lungs for examination and verification, and especially cases of aneurism.


Turning to the Special Departments, metallic foreign bodies in the eyes are treated with considerable accuracy by means of X Rays, and on the other hand the absence of foreign bodies is ascertained in doubtful cases. The Skin Department sends cases for X-Ray treatment, especially lupus, rodent ulcer and ringworm. In fact there is no department of the Hospital that does not avail itself of the X-Ray Department, with resulting increased accuracy in diagnosis, and, in certain classes of cases, successful treatment not otherwise obtainable.

During the year 1905, over 500 cases were examined and about 2,000 treated in the Department, exclusive of the screen examinations made by the Out-Patient Surgeons and the Casualty House Surgeon by means of the separate apparatus provided in the Surgical Out-Patient Room.

A written report is made on each case sent to the Department for screen or skiagraphic examination; and a special point is made of keeping accurate records and filing all plates taken, so that they may be available for reference at any future date.

As regards the treatment side of X-Ray work, it should be said that while as much is done as time, material, and assistance permit, it is to be regretted that lack of funds does not at present





allow it to be developed to the extent that is desirable. There has, however, been considerable success of the treatment of rodent ulcer; but, until the Hospital is in a position to afford a Finsen lamp, with its heavy expenses for current, and a certain amount of additional assistance, the X-Ray Department will have to confine its operations mainly to X-Ray examinations and reports for diagnostic purposes.

The Annual Election of the Board took place as usual at the Quarterly Board of Governors in June. The Ordinary Members retiring by rotation were Colonel Bannerman, Mr. G. A. Byron, Mr. H. Percy Harris, L.C.C., Rev. C. J. Ridgeway and Mr. Edward Smith. Mr. Berkeley Portman, Dr. A. B. Rendel, and Rev. H. Russell Wakefield, who had been elected to fill vacancies during the year, also retired, as required by the Laws of the Hospital. All these gentlemen, being eligible, were re-elected.

At the first meeting of the Board after the Annual Election, Mr. H. A. Harben, L.C.C., and Mr. James R. Mellor were re-elected Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively.

The House and Finance Committee experienced two changes in its members during the year. The death of Col. Stanley G. Bird, which was specially announced in last year's Report, although it did not occur till 18th April, 1905, created one vacancy; and the other was caused by the retirement of Mr. Edward Smith, after  $29\frac{1}{2}$  years' very valuable service to the Hospital. The vacancies were filled by the election of Colonel Blair and Mr. Berkeley Portman.


The London Needlework Guild has again repeated its welcome gift of a large parcel of warm clothing, which it has now contributed at Christmas for so many years. The best thanks of the Governors are due to the Guild for the continuance of this most valuable gift; and to Mrs. Basil Ellis, to whose good offices for many years the Hospital is mainly indebted for it. The Board again desire to express their great appreciation of the valuable assistance rendered by the **St. Mary's Aid Society**, both in providing suitable gifts at Christmas, and in supplying the wards from time to time with flannel jackets, shirts, slippers, &c. They feel that most grateful thanks are due to Miss Enthoven, the Hon. Secretary of the Society, and to the ladies co-operating with her in this admirable work.


The Ladies' Association has not only flourished exceedingly during the year, continuing to make generous supplies of clothing of all kinds suitable for hospital needs, but it has experienced a very important development in the establishment, under the Presidency of Lady Dimsdale, of the Paddington Branch. It is a source of great satisfaction to the Board that the Association has proved so great a success, and they desire to record their very grateful thanks to all the ladies concerned for their generous exertions for the benefit of the Hospital.

The Parks Committee of the London County Council have, during the past year, sent many valuable supplies of fine fruit for distribution among the patients. This kindness has been very much appreciated.

The Board sincerely thank **The Flannel Shirt Club**, of which the Countess of Strafford is President, for the supply of men's flannel shirts again kindly sent to the Hospital, and desire to express their appreciation of the humane work in which the members of The Flannel Shirt Club are engaged.

The Ladies of the Flower Mission have continued their efforts to cheer the patients in the Hospital by visiting and singing to them, and by contributing flowers to brighten the wards. This kindness the Board acknowledge with gratitude.





St. Mary's Soup Kitchen has during the year done much to alleviate the sufferings of many of the Out-Patients attending the Hospital, by supplying nourishing food to them at a time when they need it most.

The Trustees of the Hospital Convalescent Home, Parkwood, Swanley, Kent, have continued during the year to place 15 beds at the disposal of the Board for the benefit of patients of St. Mary's Hospital. Full advantage has been taken throughout the year of this valuable provisision, 193 of our patients having spent 19 days, or more, at the Home. It is impossible to over estimate the value to the Hospital of these 15 beds for convalescent patients, and the Board repeat the thanks they have expressed in previous Reports for it. Without these beds the great majority of these 193 patients would have had to return, on their discharge from the Hospital, direct to their own homes, to resume their avocations in an enfeebled state.

Enquiry.—The system of enquiry into the circumstances of Out-Patients established in 1898, with the view of preventing abuse of the Charity by those able to pay for the treatment they require, has been continued throughout the year.

Of 24,457 Out-Patients in the Medical, Surgical and Special Departments, 1,508 were selected as calling for enquiry, and of that number, investigation showed 79 only to be unsuitable, a number equal to '32 per cent. of the total number of patients in all departments.

It was announced in the last Report that the scope of the Committees' work had been extended to include In-Patients. The circumstances of all patients admitted to the wards throughout the year have accordingly been systematically submitted to a cursory examination, and where this indicated that a more particular enquiry should be made, it has been carried out. These investigations conclusively prove that the number of persons able to pay for the treatment they need, who gain admission to the wards, is inappreciable. It has repeatedly happened that at several successive meetings of the Committee there has not been one case presenting *prima facie* grounds for thorough enquiry.

The Chaplain's Work.—A weekly celebration of the Holy Communion is held regularly in the Chapel; additional celebrations on the greater Festivals, and on special days such as "St. Mary's Day," "St. Luke's Day," etc.; a monthly celebration for students only is also held. Morning Prayer and Sermon every Sunday.

Special Services in 1905 were held as follows :--St. Mary's Festival, special music and preachers, viz. : the Rev. H. Dening, M.A., Holy Trinity, Brondesbury, and the Rev. H. Russell Wakefield, St. Mary's, Bryanston Square; 25th October (the Annual Service), Preacher, the Ven. W. Sinclair, D.D., Archdeacon of London; St. Luke's Eve, 29th October, the Harvest Festival.


A Nurses' Branch of the Medical Missionary Union was formed in November.


Prayers are read weekly in the wards by the Chaplain and Lay-Reader, and half hour services held on Sunday evenings in the Adult Wards. Each ward is visited weekly by the Chaplain, special cases more frequently.

A series of Lantern Services conducted by the Church Army, with musical solos, etc., by friends, was a special feature of Advent, 1905.

Full details of all the Chapel Services are published monthly, in the Hospital "Church Magazine."

The Chaplain gratefully acknowledges the great help afforded him by Mr. Fox, licensed Lay Reader, and the Lady Visitors. Miss Sadler and Mr. Goff have once more kindly given their help with the music at the Ward Services.





Thanks to the Medical Staff.—The Board conclude their Report with the expression of their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their constant attention and kindness to the patients, and for their great services to the Hospital throughout the year.

#### GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of Government is by a Board of Management, meeting fortnightly, and consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, and Treasurers, together with twenty-five Governors elected annually, of whom eight are Members of the Medical and Surgical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School; and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.



Subscribers of greater sums are entitled to recommend Patients in proportion to the amount of their subscriptions. Letters are not issued unless expressly desired, as many subscribers do not require them.

Governors have also the right to inspect the Hospital under regulations by the Board of Management, so that they do not exercise that right so as to inconvenience the Chaplain or any Minister of Religion, or the Medical or other officers, or the Patients.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by will are eligible to be elected Honorary Life Governors.





#### THE MATERNITY.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or *Donors* of Ten Guineas to th MATERNITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually to that department; and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

#### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Accidents and cases of urgency are admitted FREE at all times, on the approval of the Medical Officers.

Persons holding In-patients' letters and desiring admission, must present their letters at the Hospital at I o'clock (Sundays excepted). They will be admitted after examination by the Medical Superintendent, if suitable and there is room.

Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that Governors and Subscribers sending Patients from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, will give notice to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, and send a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

When there is not room for all who apply for admission as In-patients those whose cases are most pressing are accepted, and the others are deferred or prescribed for as Out-patients. Notice of this is sent to the Subscriber, who can then recommend another patient.

The following cases are unsuitable for admission as In-Patients— Confirmed Consumption, Infectious Diseases other than Typhoid Fever, Delirium Tremens, Itch, Incurable Diseases, Chronic Ulcerated Legs more suitable for a Parish Infirmary, and those who are capable of receiving equal benefit as Out-patients. No person capable of paying for medical attendance is admissible.§

VISITING DAYS.—Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 5, and Sundays, from 3 to 4.

Out-patients are attended DAILY (Sundays and Public Holidays excepted). They must present their letters at the Hospital at the following times :---GENERAL MEDICAL AND SURGICAL CASES—Daily at I p.m.



When the Wards in the Clarence Wing are occupied, two of the Wards in the Old Hospital are to be devoted to other purposes. The nett increase in the number of beds in the Hospital will therefore be 61 only, not 74 as above. There are now 281 beds in all; there will then be 342.

As some of the expenditure of the Hospital would not be increased by an addition to the number of beds, and a further part only slightly, it is estimated that the addition to the maintenance charges of the Hospital by the opening of the Clarence Wing would be about £4,500 a year, equal to about £75 per bed, whereas the cost per bed in the Hospital at present is almost exactly £80.


### FIRST ANNUAL REPORT.

Under the Will of the late Mr. Edmond Dresden, of 36, Curzon Street, Mayfair, proved 2nd February, 1904, there was bequeathed to St. Mary's Hospital, in addition to a legacy of  $\pounds 5,000$  for general purposes, one-fifth of his residuary estate, to be invested to form a permanent fund to be known as the "Dresden Assistance Fund," the income to be devoted to assisting needy and deserving In-Patients on their discharge from the Hospital. Within six months of the proving of the Will two or more Trustees were to be appointed by the Governing Body of the Hospital to administer the fund, and a Declaration of Trust was required to be executed to give effect to the Testator's intentions.

The Board of Management, on the 25th February, 1904, resolved to accept the Bequest under the conditions named, and appointed three Trustees, viz. : Colonel P. W. Bannerman, Herbert W. Page, Esq., and Captain G. A. Webbe ; and the Declaration of Trust was in due course drawn up and executed. These proceedings were formally approved by the Quarterly Bo ard of Governors on 24th March, 1904.

The realisation of the Estate took some time, and it was not until the beginning of 1905 that the legacy came to hand.  $\pounds 27,128$  18s. 6d. was then received in payment of the Hospital's share of the capital sum, and  $\pounds 606$  1s. 6d. as its share of Income accrued while the Estate was being realised.

The Capital Sum was invested in the purchase of £9,110 Midland Railway  $2\frac{1}{2}$ % Debenture Stock, £10,289 Metropolitan Water Board (B) 3% Stock, and £11,019 Middlesex County Council 3% Stock; producing £865 a year.





A further sum of between  $\pounds 9,000$  and  $\pounds 10,000$  will eventually become payable to the Hospital out of the Estate, increasing the Income of the Fund by some  $\pounds 300$  a year.

Some of the objects to which the Trustees have devoted the funds at their disposal are :--

- I. Sending Patients to Convalescent Homes.
- Contributing to the support, during convalescence, of In-Patients who do not go to Convalescent Homes.
- 3. Giving pecuniary assistance to Patients on discharge, to enable them to obtain food and lodging while seeking employment, etc., etc.
- 4. Clothing indigent Patients on discharge.
- Providing surgical and optical appliances for patients needing them on discharge.
- 6. Paying fares of Patients to and from Convalescent Homes.
- 7. Paying fares of Patients to their own homes on discharge from the Hospital.

Special care has been taken to ascertain that Patients are really needy and deserving before assisting them, particularly those in Classes 2 and 3. Enquiries as to their means and character have been made in every case.


In addition to the 114 Patients sent to Convalescent Homes at the expense of the Fund, 148 were received free at the Hospital Convalescent Home, Parkwood, Swanley, Kent. The Trustees take this occasion to gratefully acknowledge the great benefit which has thus been conferred on so many Patients of the Hospital.


The Trustees have decided that the financial year of the Fund shall end on 30th September. There is such a pressure of work in the early months of the year that it will be much more convenient that the year of the Dresden Assistance Fund shall not coincide with that of the other Departments of the Hospital. This first Report therefore deals with a period of nine months only.

The Committee of the Convalescent and Patients' Aid Fund, and of the Sturge Fund, have pleasure in presenting their report of the work done during the past year, accompanied by the usual account of Income and Expenditure.

The income of the Dresden Assistance Fund—established 1905, see p. 104—being sufficient to supply those needs of In-Patients hitherto provided by the Convalescent Fund and the Sturge Fund, it was decided to ask the Subscribers to the Convalescent Fund to transfer their subscriptions to the General Fund ; and this the Committee are pleased to be able to report, most of them very kindly consented to do.

The work and needs of the Convalescent Fund have thus been considerably reduced. The income, about £39 a year, derived from the Sturge Fund will be applied as required by the Testator, for the benefit of In-Patients; and that received from the Convalescent Fund Investments, about £80 a year, to assist Out-Patients.

During 1905 pecuniary assistance was given to 58 patients, consisting in most cases of fares to their own homes. Surgical and optical appliances were supplied to 308 patients.

The CLOTHING of many of our poor patients is of such a scanty and threadbare description as to afford them but the very slightest protection against the cold and the rain.


