Annual Report for 1907.

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for the year 1907.

Work.—The work of the Hospital has been carried on in undiminished activity throughout the year.

In-Patients.—The average number of in-patients under treatment daily in the wards was the highest on record, namely, 257·3, the total number of beds in the Hospital being 281. The average is computed on the whole year, including the months of August and September, when the wards are closed in turn for the annual cleaning and airing, upon which the well-being of the patients during the remainder of the year so largely depends. During these two months the number of patients under treatment day by day averaged only 217. It will convey a truer idea of the pressure at which the Hospital is worked if an average be taken on the ten months during which the wards were in full occupation. That average is 265·5. It should be explained that there can never be as many as 265 patients in the Hospital without some part being congested and the necessity arising for putting up extra beds. The reason is that pressure is seldom if ever evenly distributed over the various classes of wards. At a time, for example, when the Isolation wards and the Eye wards may be short of their full complement of patients there may be extreme pressure, necessitating the fitting up of several extra beds, in other wards. These facts will convey an idea of the pressure which a

daily average of 265 patients represents. It will be further illustrated by the fact that during 1907 extra beds were up on 326 days as follows :

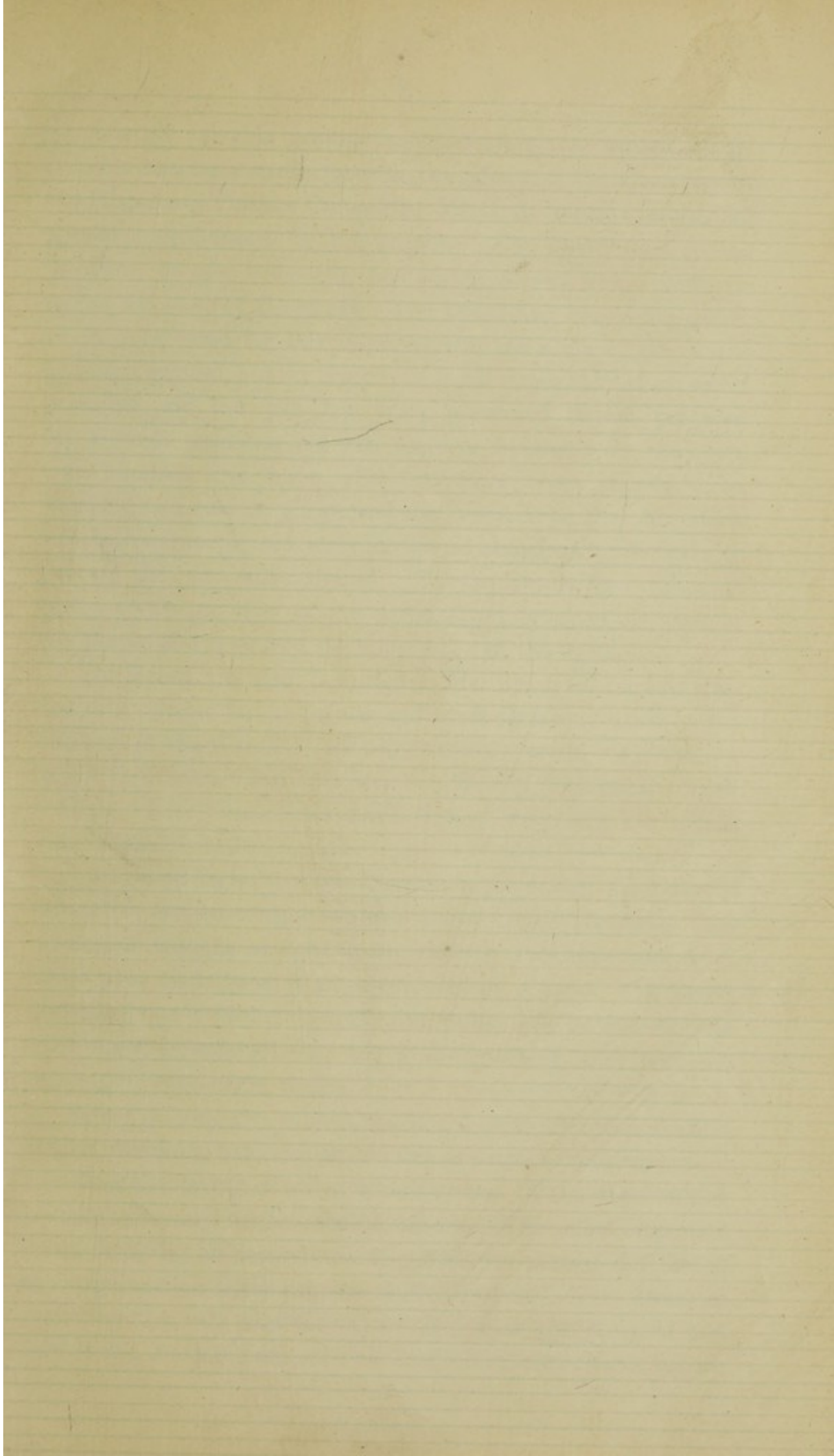

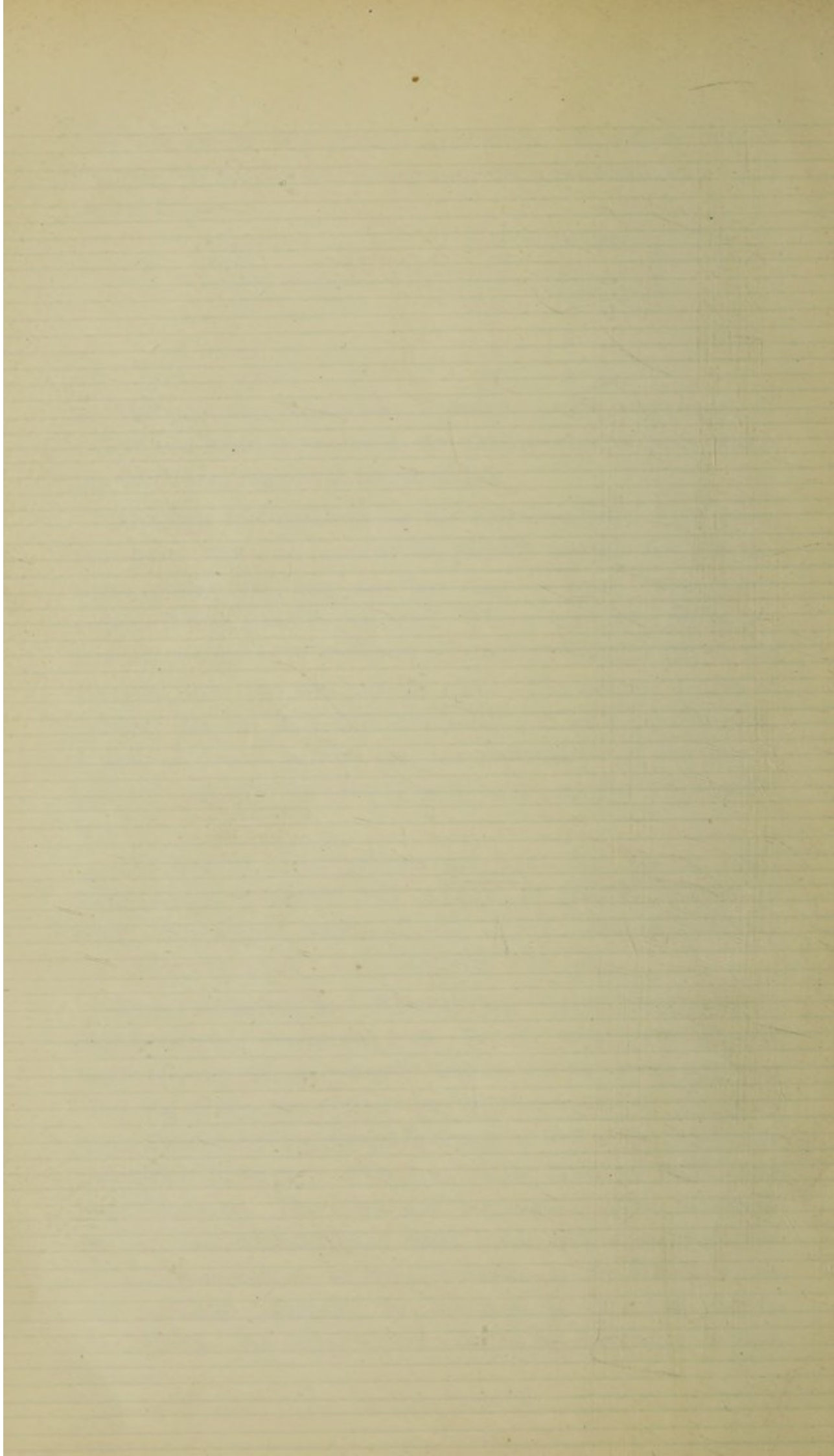
and that on 5 days the number of patients in the wards equalled, and on two actually exceeded the total number of beds which the wards are designed to accommodate.

Although the demands on the accommodation have been thus heavy the total number of patients passing through the wards during the year was less than in 1906, being 3,902 compared with 4,296 in that year. This is accounted for by the fact that the nature of the cases necessitated a longer stay in the Hospital than was the case in 1906. The average length of patients' stay was 24·3 days compared with 21·7 days in 1906. It will, of course, be seen that the prolongation of the stay of patients must have the effect of reducing the number it is possible to admit.

The number of out-patients was 1,350 less than in 1906, being 23,691 compared with 25,041; of casualty patients 46 more, viz. : 23,902 compared with 23,856; and of maternity patients 43 more, viz. : 1,084 compared with 1,045.

Improvements and Alterations.—Several improvements have been made during the year. For the most important and costly of these, the paving with terrazzo mosaic of the Entrance Hall and Stairs, the corridor leading therefrom, and the space under the dome of the Grand Staircase, as well as the painting of the walls of those parts of the hospital, the Board are indebted to their Chairman. The worn and time-stained stone pavement was not only unattractive in itself, but it also imparted a bare and dingy appearance to the approaches to the Wards, which was especially noticeable by strangers on their first visit to the hospital. The improvement effected by the change is most striking.





Another valuable improvement affecting the comfort of the patients has been made through the efforts of the Chairman of the House and Finance Committee, Mr. G. A. Byron, in obtaining special contributions for the purpose. The Board refer to the provision of new bedsteads, embodying several useful improvements, for some of the wards. The Board had long been aware of the great need for this improvement, and some of the wards had been refitted, but the scarcity of funds which has unfortunately prevailed for the last few years prevented further progress. Mr. Byron's exertions bid fair soon to surmount the difficulty. One hundred and seven new bedsteads have already been provided at a cost of £238, and the Board hope that his efforts will be rewarded by the early receipt of sufficient further gifts to procure the 100 still required. The bedsteads have not only added to the comfort of the patients, but lessened the work of the Nurses and improved the appearance of the wards.

The Board are also beholden to Mr. Byron for the introduction of a scheme for the regular and systematic renovation of the furniture of the Wards. The two children's wards, "Crawshay" and "De Hirsch," and two women's Wards, "Alexandra" and "Albert Victor," were refurnished during 1907, and the results are exceedingly satisfactory.

The Board regret that the necessity arose during the year for somewhat extensive repairs to the drains of the Hospital. An inspection brought to light many defects, the most urgent of which were made good at an expenditure of £573. The Board anticipate that a further considerable outlay will be necessary in 1908 for the completion of this work, involving, they fear, the relaying of some of the drains.

Before quitting this subject, the Board must refer to works of a similar character, but on a more extensive scale—nothing less in fact than the laying down of a new system of drainage—which became necessary in the medical school. This most important work, involving an expenditure of £890, was carried out during the long vacation at the expense of Mr. Harben. The Board, in recording this, are mindful of the fact that the Hospital and School are integral parts of one Institution, and that a benefit

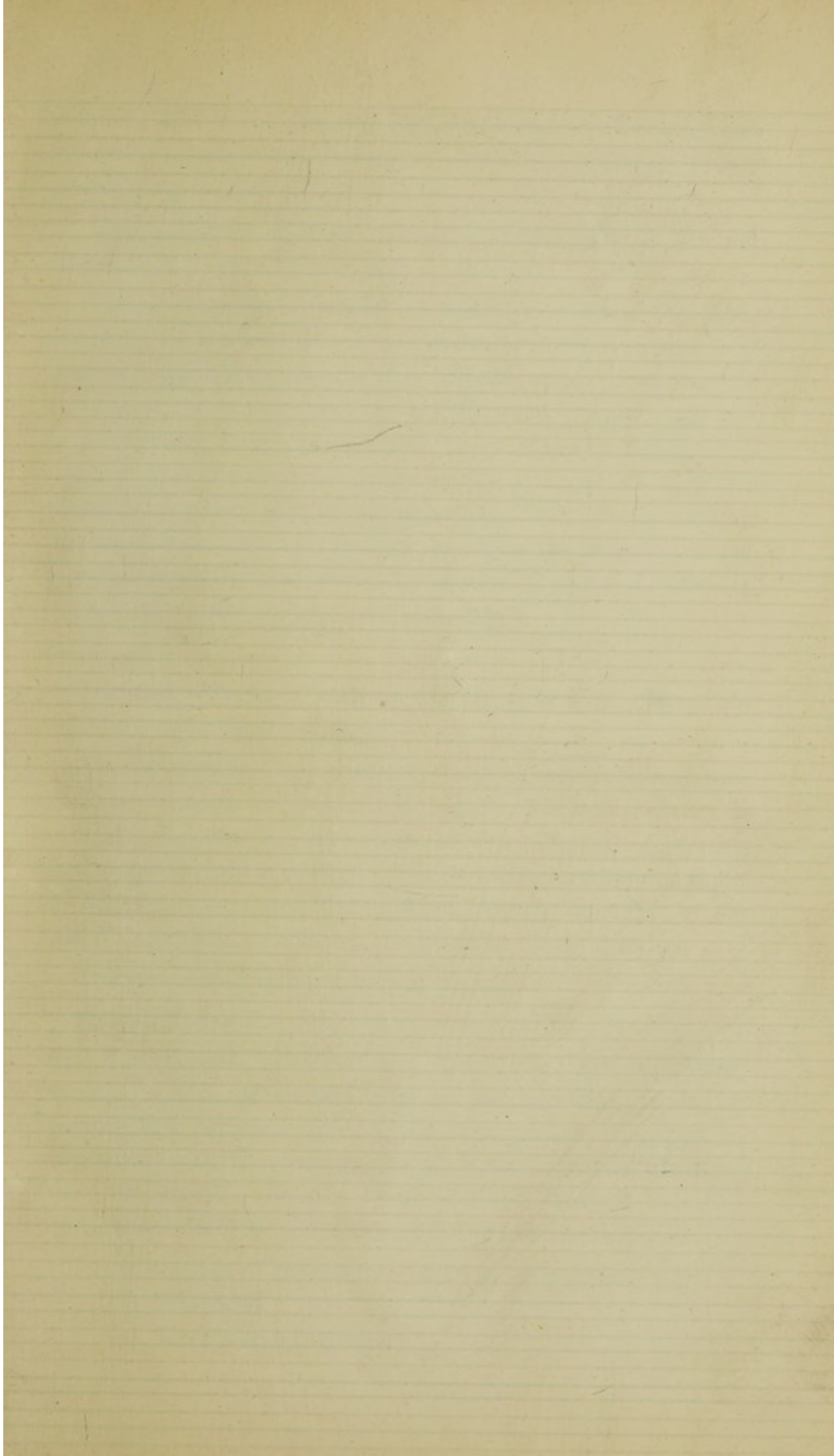
conferred on the Medical School, no less than on the Hospital proper, calls for the thankful recognition of the Board of Management.

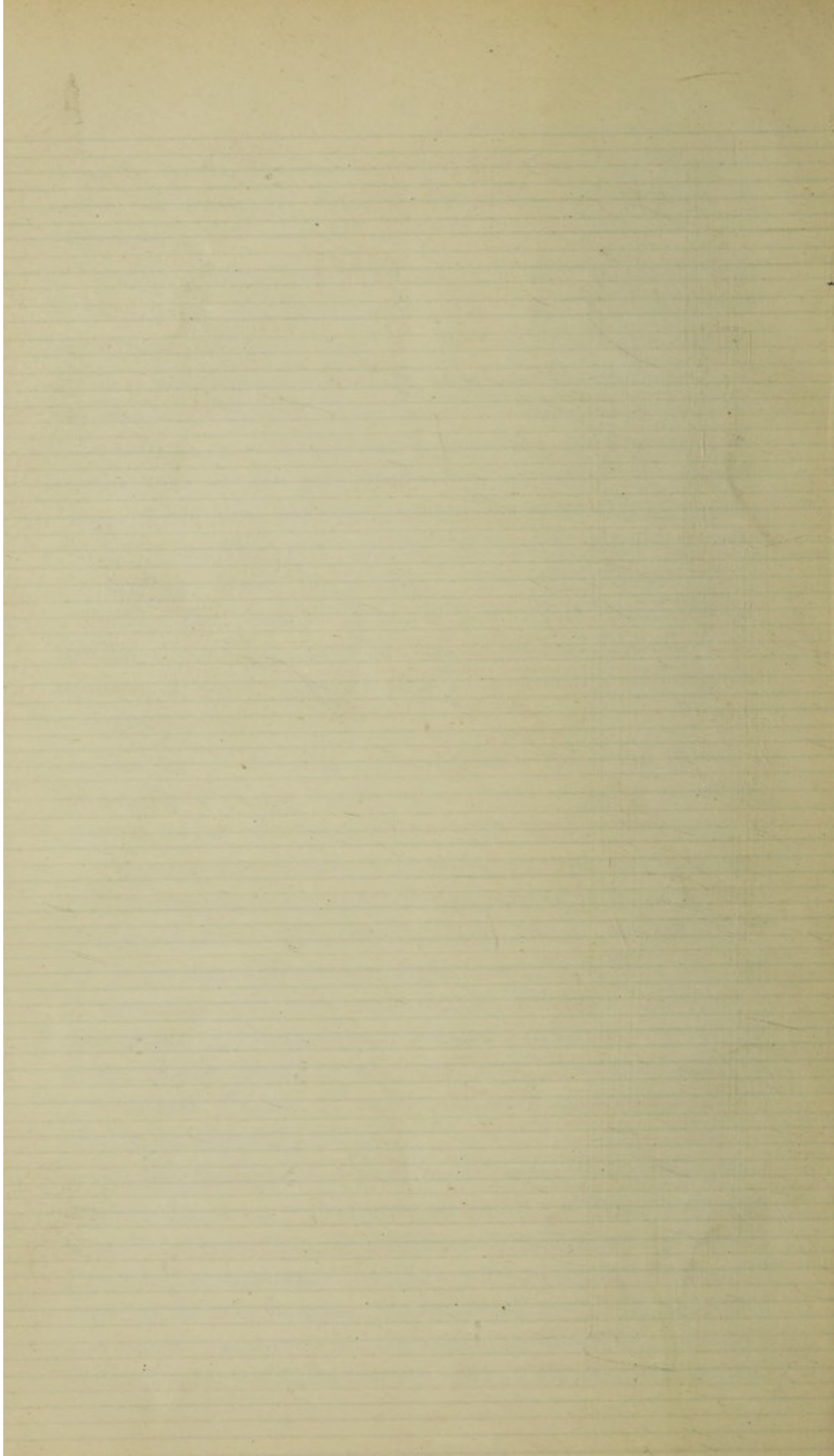
Another improvement which has been made during the year is the provision of a tradesmen's entrance, with a goods lift, for the delivery of stores direct to the basement. The expense involved was comparatively small, £50, and the convenience is considerable. Hitherto light stores have been brought in at the main entrance, an obviously bad arrangement, and one which the improvement of the hall rendered it necessary to prohibit. Heavy stores have hitherto been brought in by the Dispensary entrance, involving the carrying of heavy weights a long distance and down many stairs. The new entrance is in Cambridge Place, near the corner of South Wharf Road, through the long-disused gateway of the old out-patients' department, the existence of which rendered it possible to effect this improvement at so small a cost.

The last of the improvements which the Board record is the putting out of the laundry work, instead of doing it on the premises, as has been the practice now for many years.

The force of circumstances is really answerable for the change. The laundry machinery, most of it very old, had for some time been giving great trouble, breaking down first in one place and then in another at shorter and shorter intervals, until at the end of 1906 a general breakdown seemed imminent. Inspection showed that it was past repair and that a complete re-equipment of the laundry would be necessary, at an expense of between £1,500 and £2,000, to enable the work to continue to be done in the Hospital.

In the existing state of the Hospital finances such an expenditure was almost out of the question; and it was therefore decided to avoid the immediate necessity for it by putting out the washing for a time, a course which would have the additional advantage of revealing the relative expense of the two systems. A trial period of 6 months was determined on, extending from April to October. In the result it was found that the whole of the Hospital washing,





including that of the Nursing Staff, numbering in all about 9,000 articles per week, could be done by contract at an average weekly cost of £24 or £1,248 a year.

This compares with an estimated annual cost on the old system of £1,139, an increase of £109 a year.

Viewed from the standpoint of annual cost alone therefore, the result of the experiment was unfavourable to change, but bearing in mind the nuisances and inconveniences attending the carrying out of laundry work on the Hospital premises, and the fact that under expert management the work can be better done, together with the unpreparedness of the Hospital to meet the considerable capital expenditure necessary to lay down new plant, the Board were convinced that on the whole the interests of the Hospital would be best served by continuing to put the washing out and they made arrangements accordingly.

Finance—

Income.—There is little to call for remark in connection with the income for the year.

The ordinary income amounted to £17,339, compared with £16,793 in 1906, an increase of £546. Viewed, however, in relation to the ordinary expenditure of the Hospital (£28,251), its utter inadequacy is evident. The financial situation was saved by legacies, which provided £8,608—nearly one-third of the total sum required to maintain the Hospital during the year.

The year closed with a deficit of £2,045.

Expenditure.—Before commenting on the expenditure of 1907, it is necessary to explain that important alterations during the year in the system and form of the accounts, made by St. Mary's in common with all the Metropolitan Hospitals, in compliance with the requirement of King Edward's Hospital Fund, the Hospital Sunday Fund, and the Hospital Saturday Fund, render detailed comparison with the past impracticable.

The only heads of expenditure which are comparable are—

- (1) Provisions.
- (2) Surgery and Dispensary.

The expenditure under them for 1906 and 1907 was as follows:—

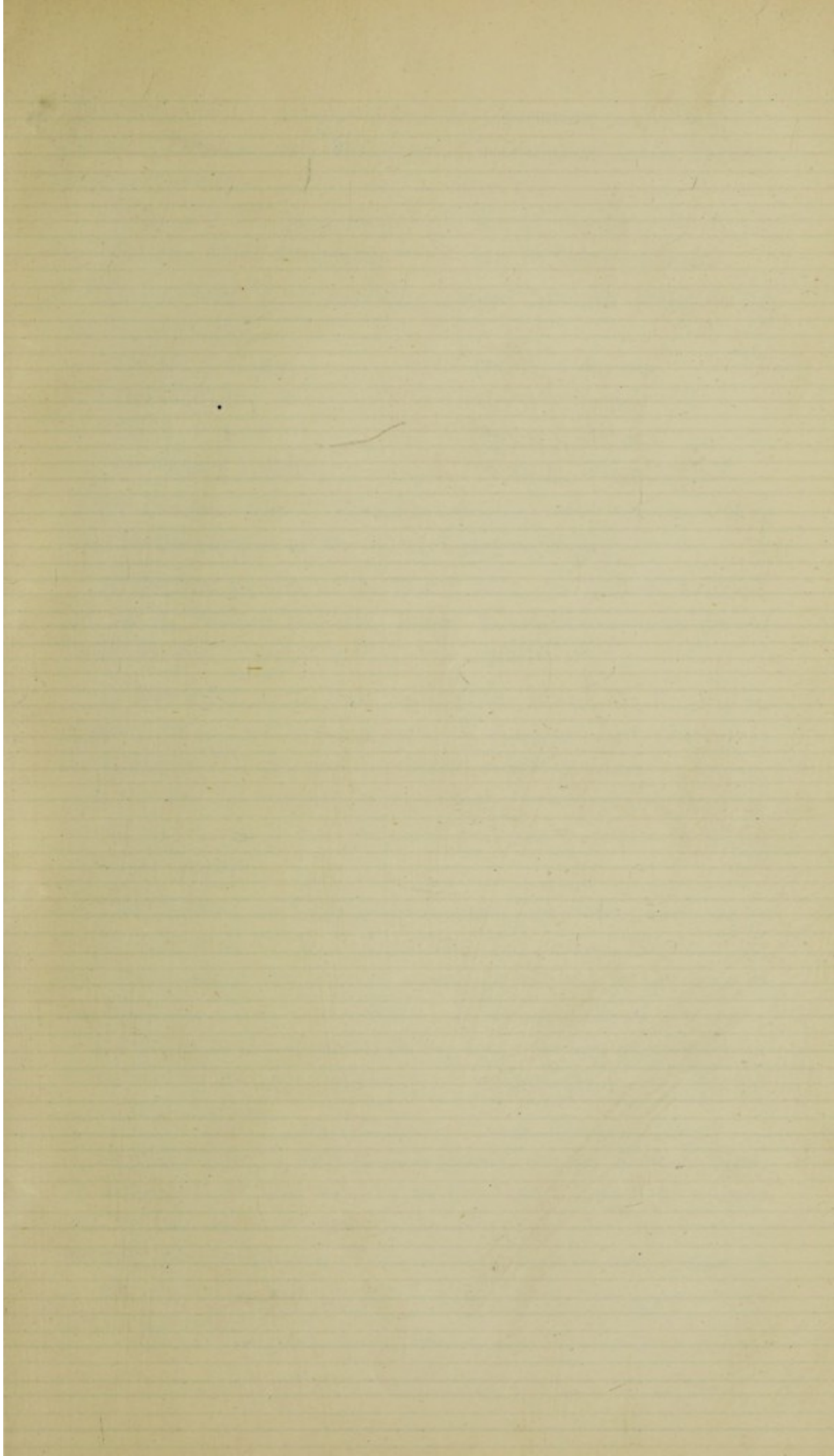
The total expenditure for 1907 was £1,201 in excess of that for 1906, the following special outlays having been made during the year:—

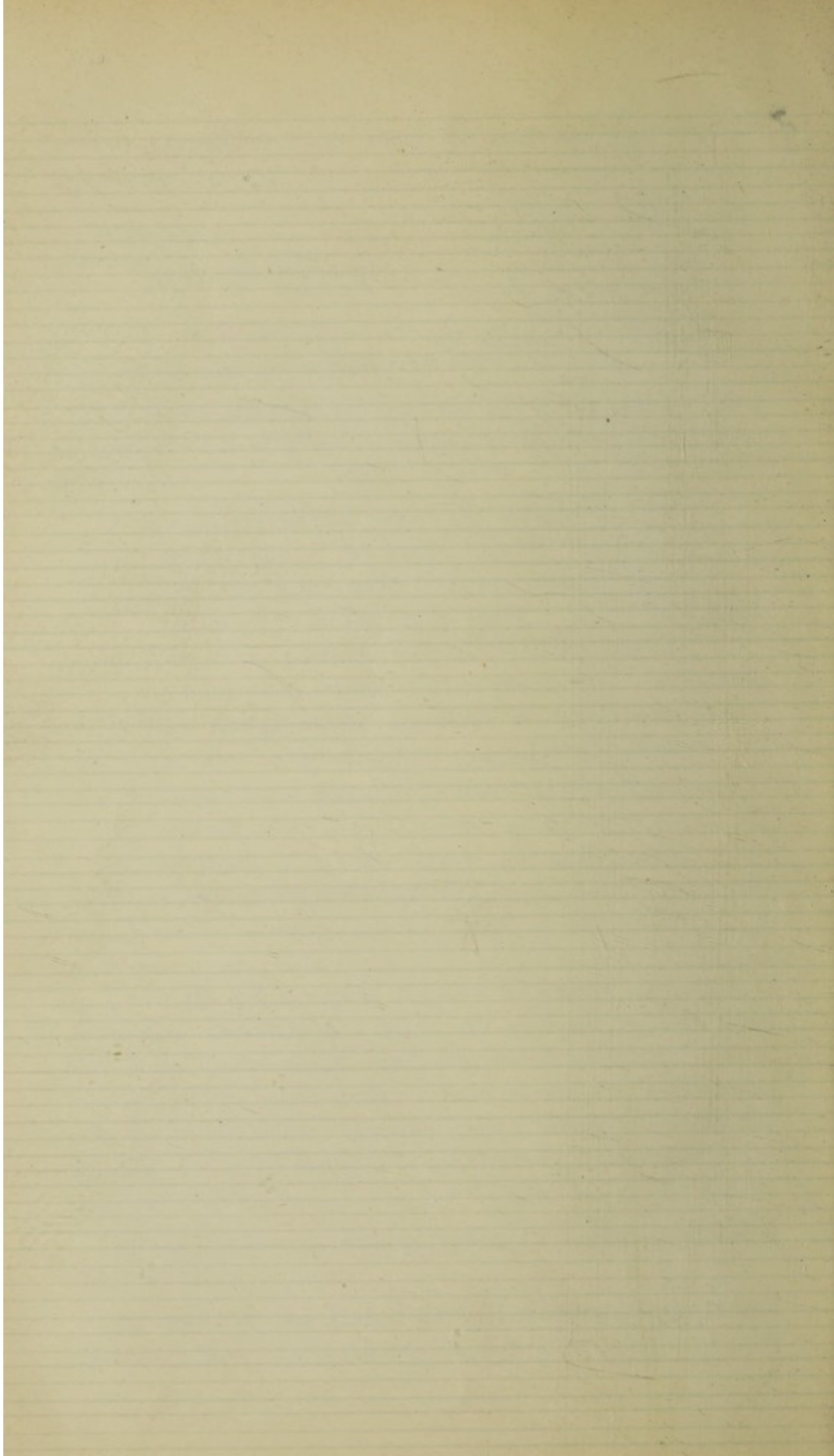

Under the old system of accounts the greater proportion of this outlay, including the £573 on drainage works, would have been shown under Extraordinary Expenditure. Now, however, all repairs, no matter of how exceptional a character, must be shown under "Establishment Charges—Renewals and Repairs," and so be included in the Ordinary Expenditure of the year, and affect the average cost per occupied bed or per patient.

Beyond this there is nothing calling for special comment in the expenditure for 1907.

Changes in the Board and Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff.—The Annual Election of the Board took place





as usual at the Quarterly Board of Governors in June. The following Ordinary Members retiring by rotation, being eligible, were re-elected :—

In October Mr. J. E. Lane resigned, and his place was filled by the election of Mr. W. H. Clayton-Greene.

At the first meeting of the Board, after the Annual Election, Mr. H. A. Harben and Mr. James R. Mellor were re-elected Chairman and Deputy-Chairman respectively.

In December, to the great regret of the Board, Mr. R. H. Foà, resigned his seat owing to his inability to be regularly present at the Meetings. It afforded the Board much pleasure to receive from Mr. Foà the assurance that, though he was retiring from the Board, his interest in the Hospital and his readiness to help it remained unabated.

The Medical Staff sustained a great loss during the year by the retirement of Dr. D. B. Lees from the post of Physician, on the completion of the limit of service prescribed by the laws of the Hospital, viz.—twenty years. In recognition of Dr. Lees' great services to the Hospital during this time and previously for seven years as Physician in charge of out-patients, he was elected Consulting Physician.

In addition to his services as a member of the Medical Staff, Dr. Lees, as a medical member of the Board, took a prominent part in the administration of the Hospital. In the hope of ensuring the continuance of his valuable counsel and assistance he was elected a Vice-President, which gives him a permanent seat on the Board.

The vacancy in the office of Physician was filled by the promotion of Dr. H. A. Caley, Senior Physician in charge of out-patients, whose place on the out-patient staff was filled by the election of Dr. W. H. Willcox.

The Board received with regret, at their meeting on 2nd May, Mr. Morton Smale's resignation of the post of Dental Surgeon, which he had held for 16 years. The vacancy was filled by the election of Mr. W. H. Dolamore.

Nursing.—The efficiency of the Nursing Staff has been well maintained during the year.

The Ladies' Association.—The invaluable work of the Ladies' Associations has been continued during the year, and an even larger contribution was made than in 1906 of linen and clothing for use in the wards.

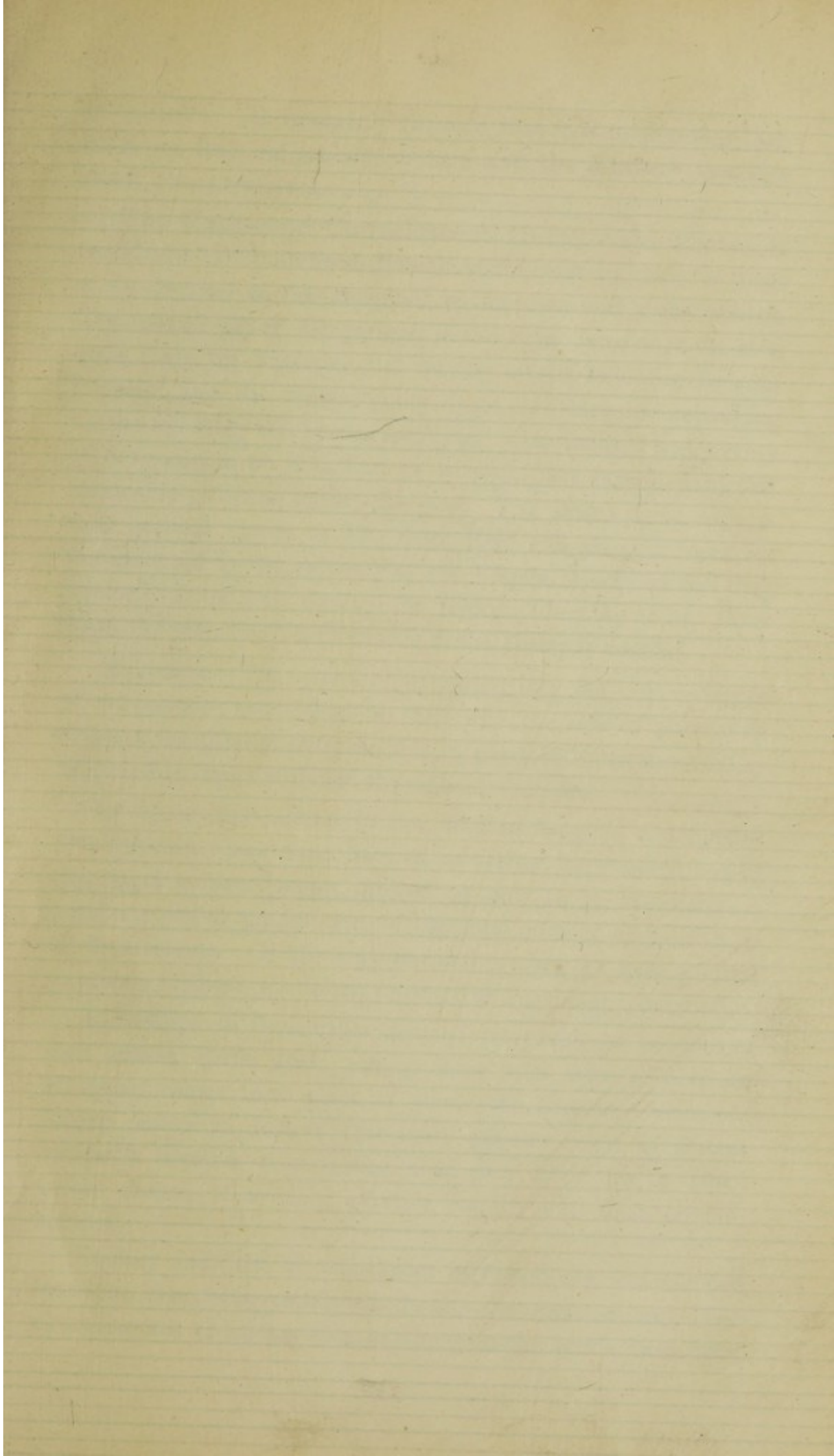
The Board again return their grateful thanks to Lady Dimsdale, Mrs. Harben and the ladies associated with them, for their very kind and persevering exertions for the good of the Hospital, and hope that the work of the Associations, which has already benefited the Hospital so much, will continue to grow year by year.

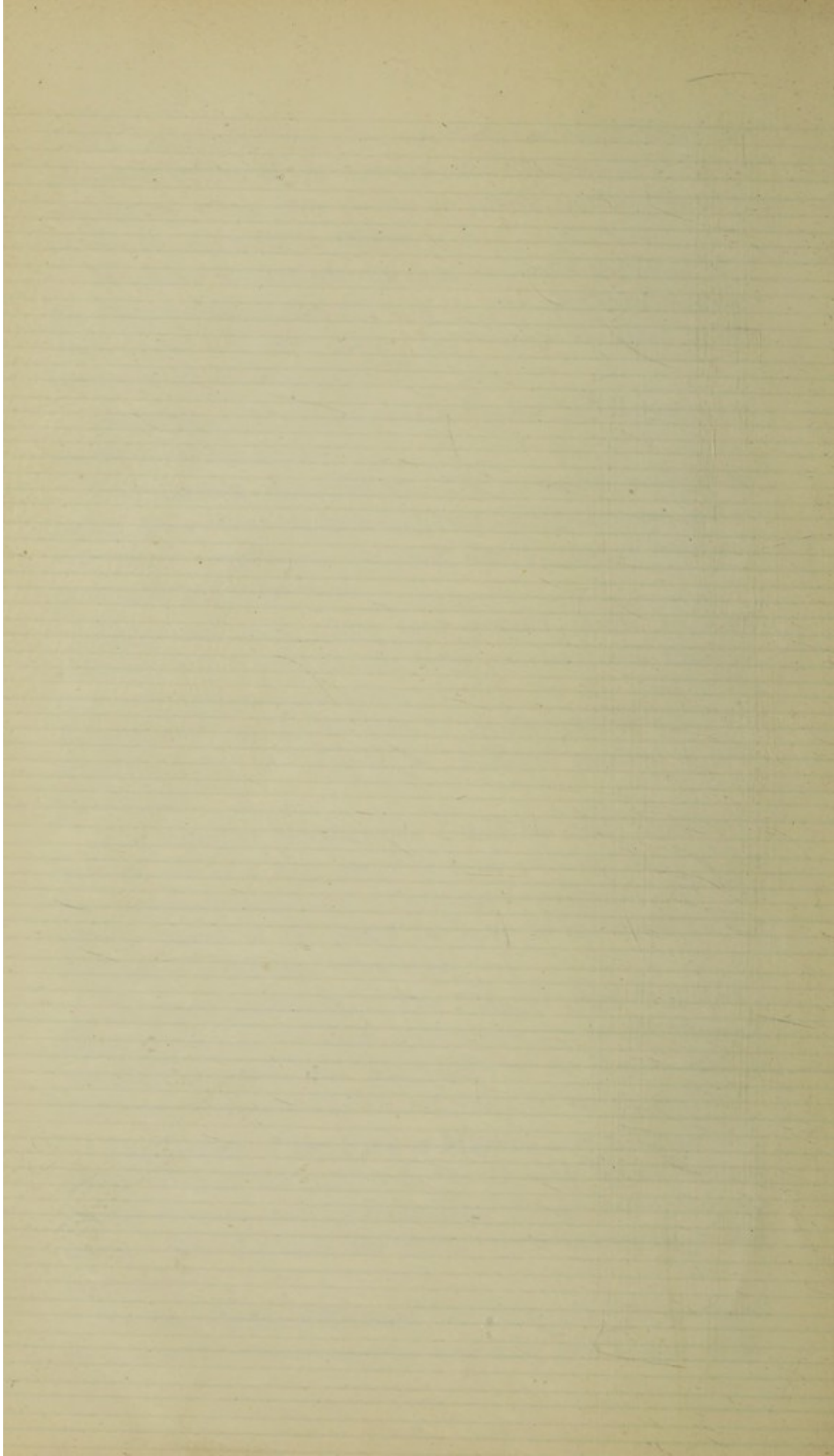
The London Needlework Guild has again repeated its welcome gift of a large parcel of warm clothing, which it has now generously contributed at Christmas for so many years. The grateful thanks of the Board are given to the Guild for the continuance of this most valuable gift.

The Board sincerely thank **The Flannel Shirt Club** for the supply of men's flannel shirts again kindly sent to the Hospital, and desire to express their appreciation of the humane work in which the members of The Flannel Shirt Club are engaged.

The Ladies of the Flower Mission have continued their efforts to cheer the patients in the Hospital by visiting and singing to them, and by contributing flowers to brighten the wards. This kindness the Board again acknowledge with gratitude.

St. Mary's Soup Kitchen has during the year continued its most useful work of supplying nourishing food to many of the





out-patients. It frequently happens that it is food rather than medicine that out-patients require, and the Kitchen therefore meets a very real want.

The Parkwood Convalescent Home.—The Trustees of the Home have continued throughout the year to place 15 beds at the disposal of the Hospital, 10 for men and 5 for women. The normal stay of the patients in the home is 19 days, the men going down on Thursday and leaving on the following Tuesday fortnight, and the women going down on Friday and remaining till the following Wednesday fortnight. One hundred and seventy of our patients, 99 men and 71 women, have benefited by this invaluable provision during the year. The Board again express their grateful thanks to Mr. Peter Reid and his co-trustees for this great aid to the recovery of the hospital's patients, and they rejoice to think that, through the princely liberality of Mr. Peter Reid, the permanent continuance of the Home is assured.

Enquiry.—The system of enquiring into the circumstances of out-patients, established in 1898 with the view of preventing abuse of the Charity by those able to pay for the treatment they require, has been continued throughout the year.

Of 23,691 out-patients in the Medical, Surgical and Special Departments, 1,932 were selected as calling for enquiry, and of that number investigation showed 93 only to be unsuitable, a number equal to .39 per cent. of the total number of patients in all departments. Of these 93 unsuitable cases 42 were referred to private medical practitioners and 51 to Provident Dispensaries.

In addition to these cases deemed unsuitable on account of their means, there were 106 patients who were referred to Hospitals nearer their place of abode, the Enquiry Committee having reason to believe that some patients resort to distant Hospitals because they realize that they have thus a much better chance of evading effective enquiry into their circumstances.

Enquiry into the circumstances of in-patients, commenced in 1904, has been continued during the year 1907. The circumstances of all patients admitted to the wards have been

systematically submitted to a cursory examination. Where this indicated that a more thorough enquiry should be made, it has been carried out. The number of such thorough enquiries was 231. The result continues to confirm the belief that the number of persons in a position to pay for the treatment they require, who gain admission to the wards, is inappreciable.

The Medical School.—During the year the work of the Medical School has been of a highly satisfactory character. The past results show a high percentage of successes, especially in the preliminary and intermediate subjects of medical study—results which are the more gratifying in the present uncertain state of medical education in London.

A larger number of students than usual have been successful in the final degrees of London University, nine having proceeded to the degree of M.B., B.S. (one with honours in medicine), five to the degree of M.D. (one obtaining the University medal in Pathology), and one to the degree of M.S.

Regular classes for the higher surgical examinations and for the promotion examination of the R.A.M.C. are now being held, and the number of students competing for surgical honours is higher than usual.

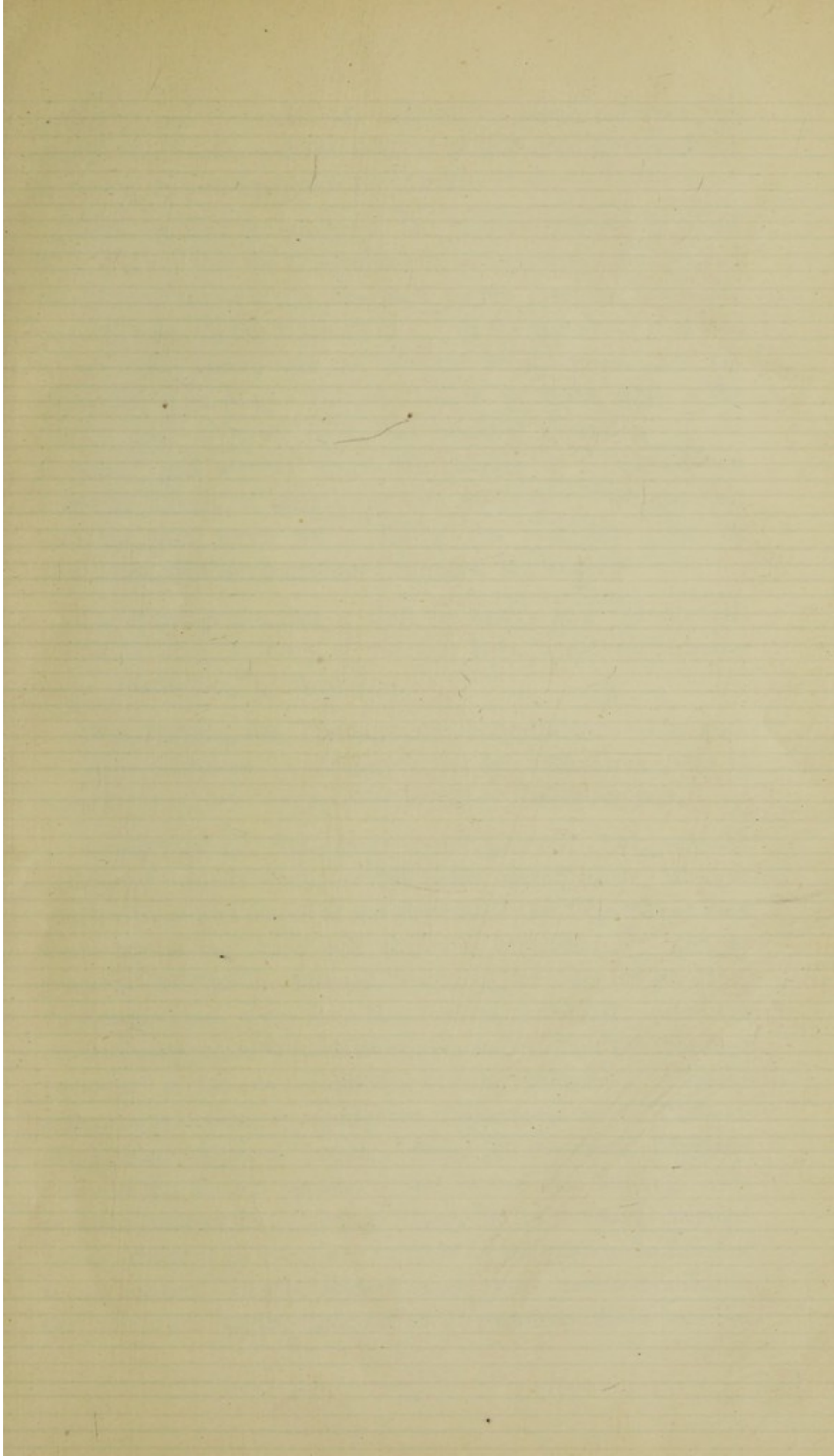
Dr. Caley has retired from the post of Dean after a period of nearly eight years' work, during which he rendered invaluable service to the Medical School.

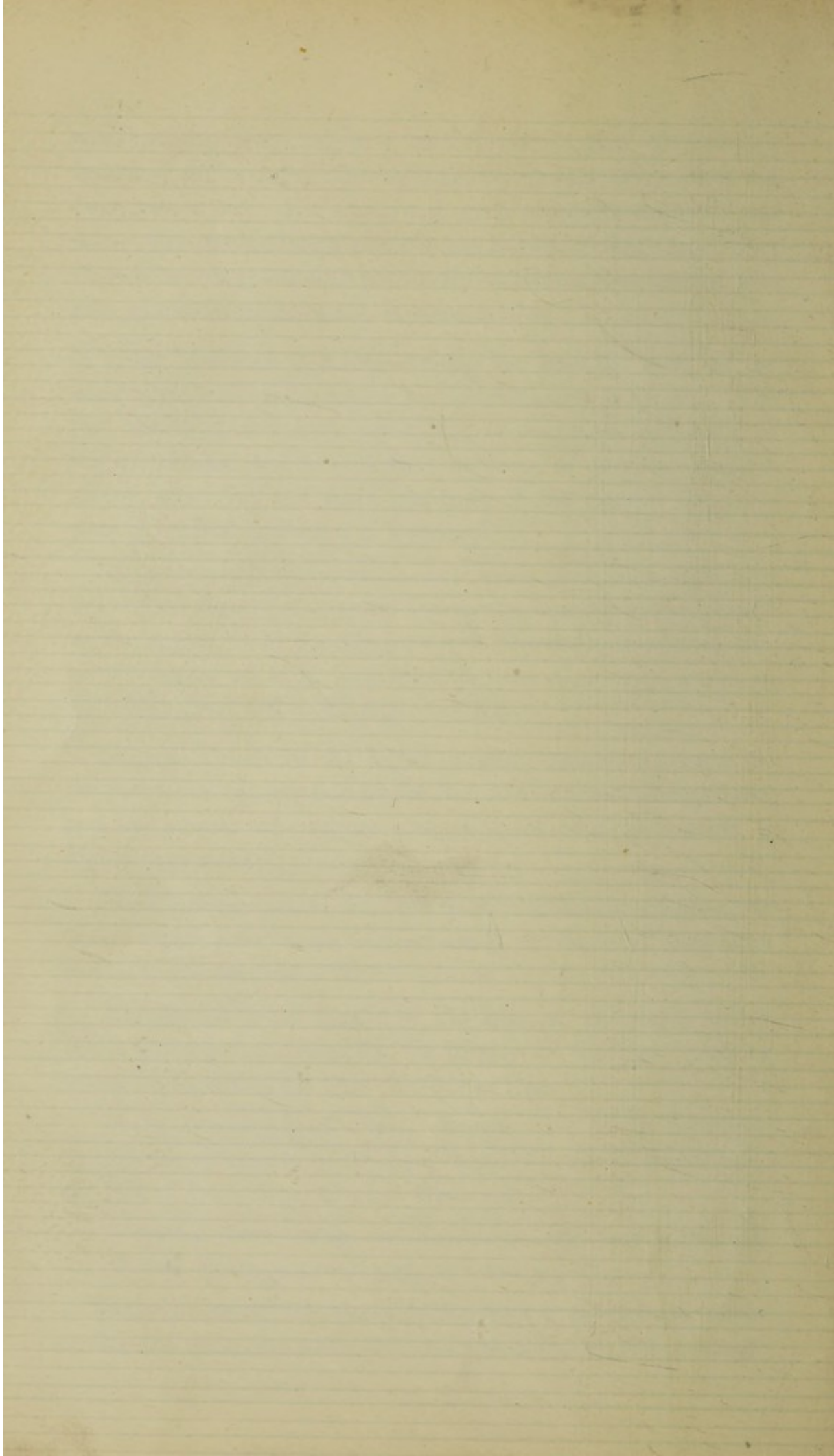
His election to the Senate of the London University opens out to him a wider sphere for the display of the high qualities which characterized his term of office as Dean.

In the Teaching Staff several changes have to be recorded, notably the retirement of Dr. Lees from the active staff and from the post of Lecturer on Clinical Medicine.

A special Lectureship on Neurology has been instituted. Dr. Wilfred Harris has been appointed to the post.

Many important structural improvements have been made during the year, including the reconstruction of the drainage





system by our Chairman, Mr. Harben, to which reference has already been made; and the Medical School must be considered as thoroughly well equipped and efficient.

Before quitting the subject of the Medical School, the Board think it is well that the Governors and Subscribers of the Hospital should know that it is not subsidized by the Hospital, nor is any payment made by the Hospital to it. At the same time it cannot be too widely known that the Medical School, which from the foundation of St. Mary's Hospital, has, to quote the words of the original code of laws, been "an essential appendage to the Hospital," and without which the prestige of the Institution would be lowered, is maintained with difficulty. Most generous help has been given to it during the past few years by Mrs. Thomas Wharrie and our Chairman, Mr. Harben.

The Board desire that it shall be known that the Medical School is in great need of financial help, and they earnestly invite contributions to its support.

Department for Therapeutic Inoculation.—The work of this new department, of which a full description was given in the last report, has been actively carried on during the year.

Transfer of the Department to the Clarence Wing.—As the number of patients rapidly increased, the rooms in the Museum which were at first placed at the disposal of the Department were found to be too small and otherwise inconvenient; and as generous gifts to Sir Almroth Wright (£500 from the Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, £500 from Mrs. Perkins, and smaller sums from other friends) provided funds more than sufficient for the thorough equipment of the laboratories and working rooms on an adequate scale, it was decided to transfer the Department to the Clarence Wing, where it is at present housed in the block originally designed for lying-in patients. This part of the building has a separate entrance in Cambridge Place, and its structural arrangements render it in every way suitable for the purpose to which it is now applied. In this block there are at the present moment in the occupation of the Inoculation Department, three spacious

laboratories, devoted respectively to research, to the examination of the bloods of the patients under treatment, and to the carrying on of the course of laboratory instruction. In addition there are incubating rooms maintained respectively at summer heat and at blood heat for the cultivation of micro-organisms, a room for sterilization and the preparation of media, a room for the preparation of bacterial vaccines, a small private laboratory, a small room containing what is hoped will prove the nucleus of a bacteriological library, a waiting room for out-patients, two rooms to which the patients come for inoculation, and a room devoted to office work and the keeping of records of the patients. In short this Department is housed and equipped in a manner which is probably without its equal anywhere.

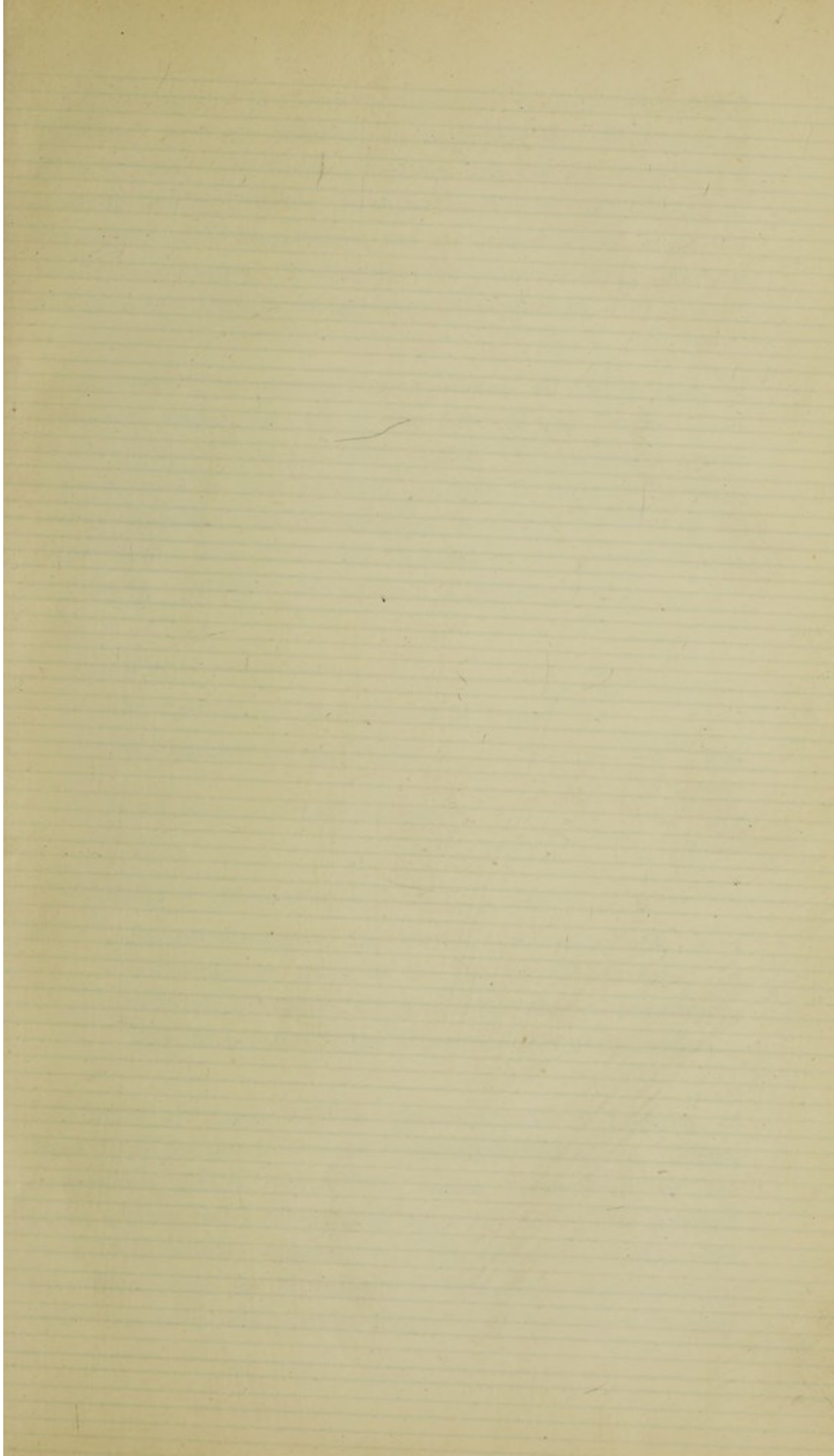

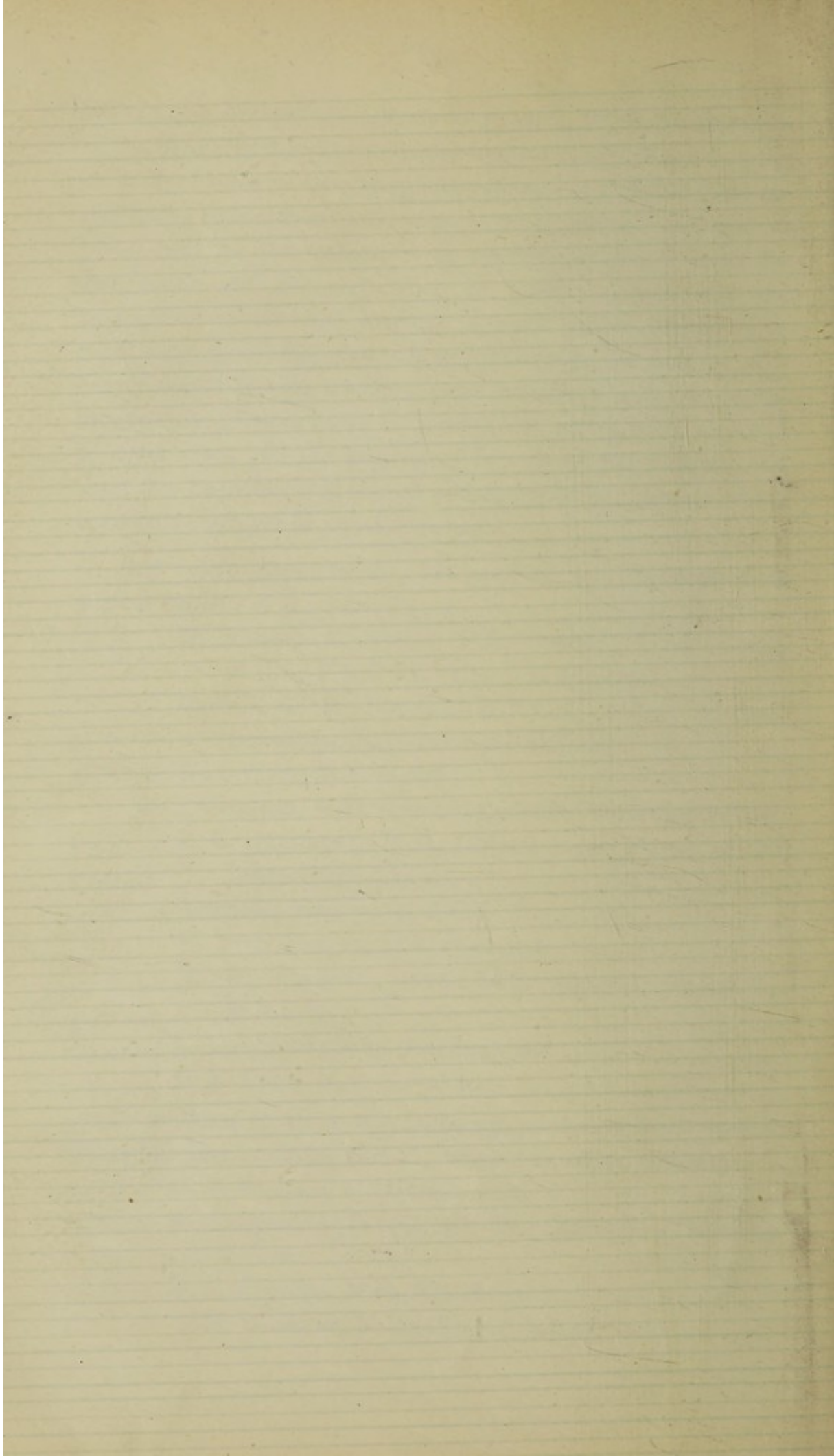

Maintenance.—The whole of the special contributions referred to above were not absorbed in equipping the Department in its new home. The balance, together with the fees received for teaching by the Director, Sir Almroth Wright, was devoted to the support of the Department, and has been sufficient to provide for its maintenance. Throughout the year, therefore, this new and important Department has been self-supporting.

Patients.—The patients have consisted, as during 1906, of in-patients under the care of the Medical and Surgical Staff of the Hospital who are being treated by inoculation (these are estimated to have averaged 20 daily throughout the year), and of out-patients exclusively under the care of the Staff of the Department. The former are included in the general returns of patients. Subjoined are statistics of the latter:—

Number of Attendances—

The attendances of the above 550 out-patients have amounted to 3,889 on the two out-patient days. In addition a large but unregistered number of attendances have been made on the other four days of the week.

Nature of Cases.—As in previous years a majority of cases have consisted of local tuberculous infections: lupus, tuberculous glands, tuberculous joints, tuberculosis of the genito-urinary tract, tuberculous abscesses and a few selected cases of pulmonary consumption; the remainder of the cases have been made up of patients suffering from septic wounds, carbuncles, boils, and pustular eruptions of the skin and other

bacterial infections not falling under any of the above headings. Lastly, a limited number of inoperable cases of cancer have been treated with a view to the alleviation of their symptoms. The results obtained have been extremely encouraging.

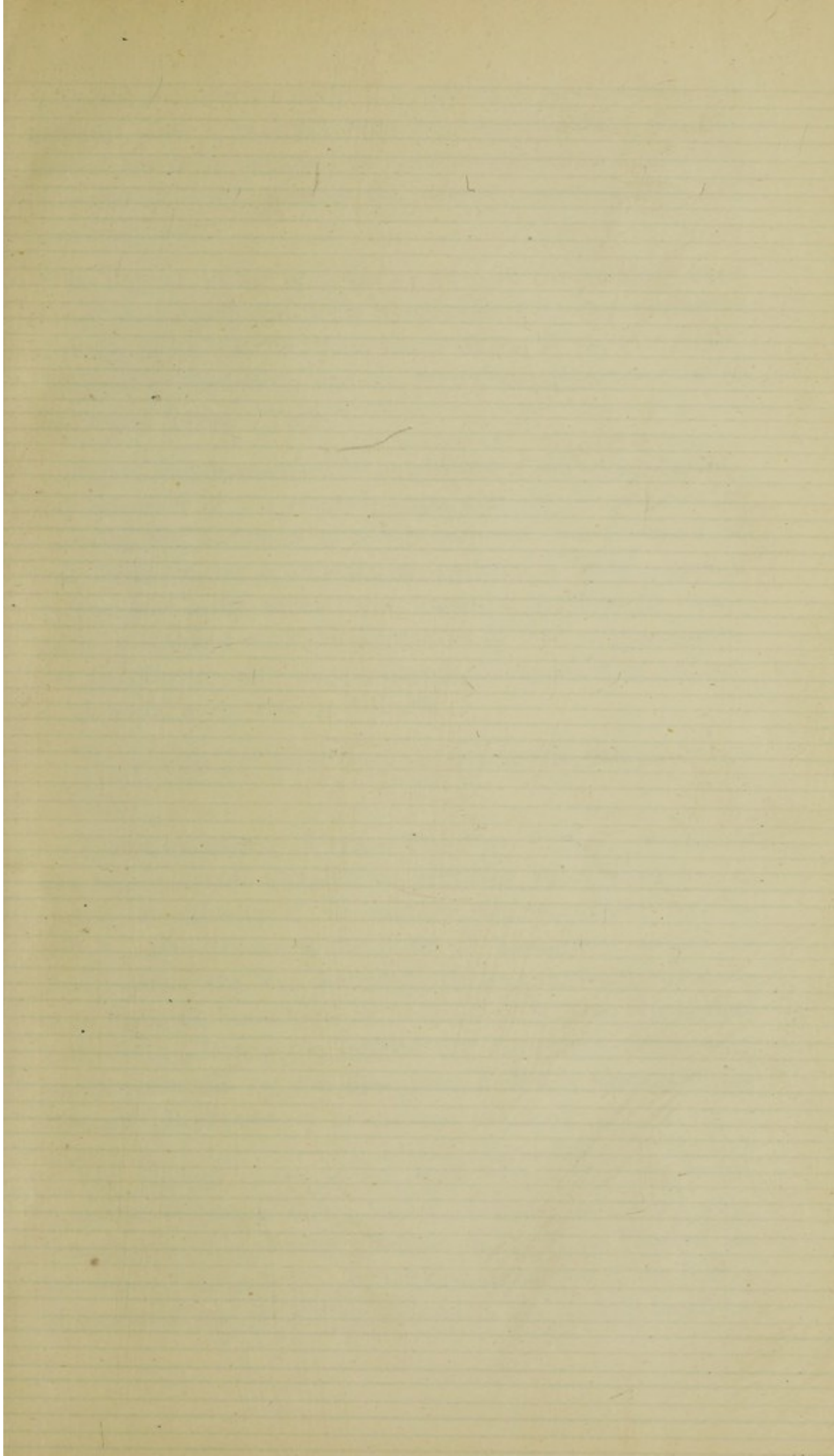
In connection with the treatment of these patients, and of the research work specified below, a total of 16,399 estimations of the Opsonic Index have been made in addition to an enormous amount of other bacteriological work.

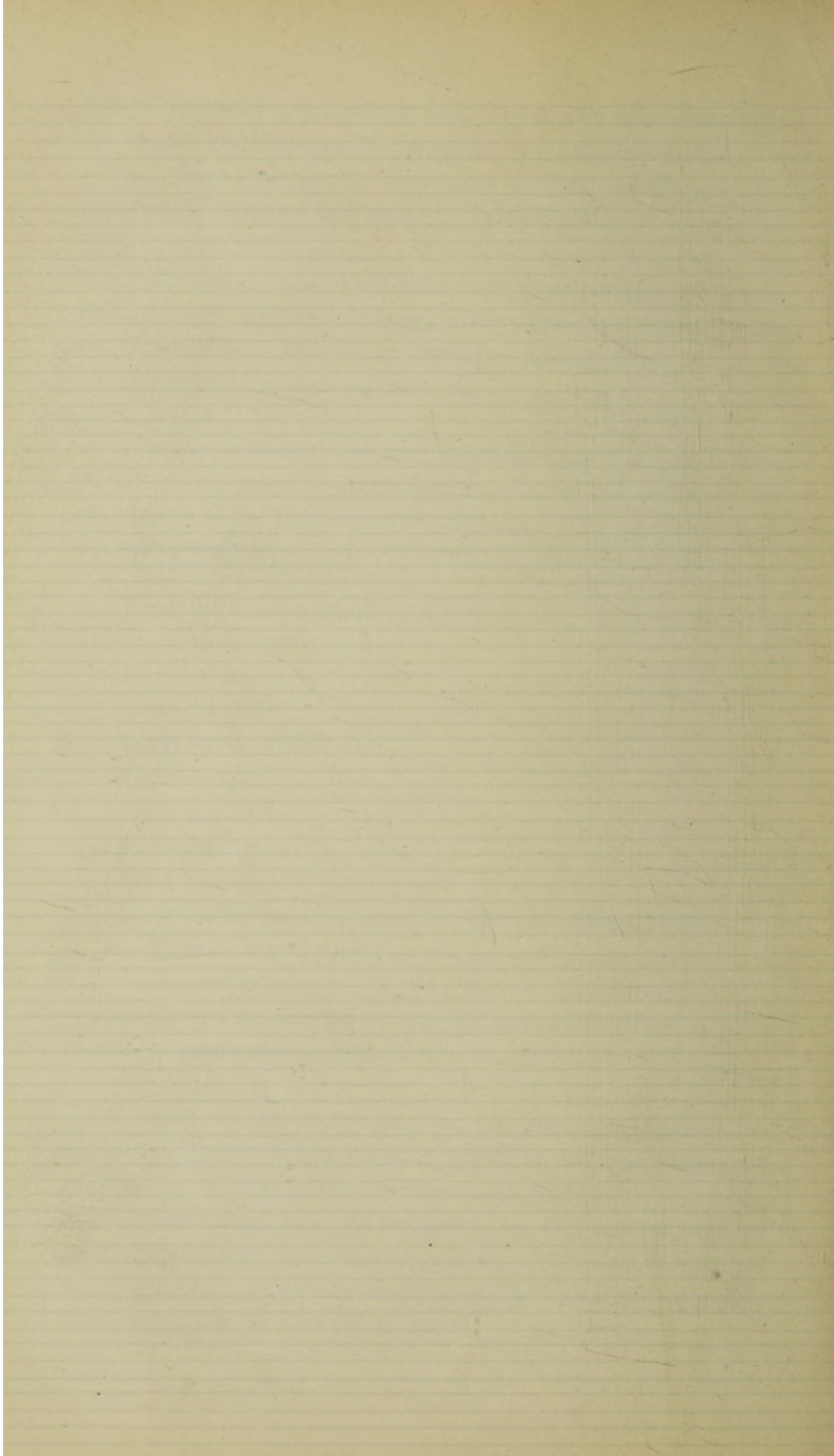
Teaching.—Medical men and Bacteriologists have come from all parts of the world to go through courses of instruction in the laboratories of the Inoculation Department. The number of such laboratory workers was 46. They may be classified as follows:—

In addition the out-patient clinics have been attended by a number of medical men from all over the world.

Research.—Research has been actively prosecuted throughout the year. The more important results which have been achieved have been the application of inoculation treatment to certain localised infections hitherto untreated by this method, and to certain general infective diseases; and the elaboration of methods for bringing the protective agencies of the blood into operation upon bacteria in the focus of infection.





A new and effective method of arriving at a diagnosis of the nature of obscure local infections has been elaborated, and this method has been employed for determining, before a patient is dismissed as cured, whether the infective micro-organism has been eradicated.

In addition to the members of the Staff the following have carried out research work in the laboratories of the Department:—
L. Noon, M.B., F.R.C.S., John Lucas Walker Research Scholar, University of Cambridge, and Dr. Max Cohendy, of the Staff of the Pasteur Institute, Paris.

Future Requirements.—For the purposes of further prosecution and extension of the research work, also for the purposes of extending the usefulness of the Department, the provision of beds for in-patients is very urgently required, it being necessary to turn away many patients who would be benefited by inoculation but whom it would be impossible to treat as out-patients, and to dispense with the continuous observations of patients which would in any case be desirable.

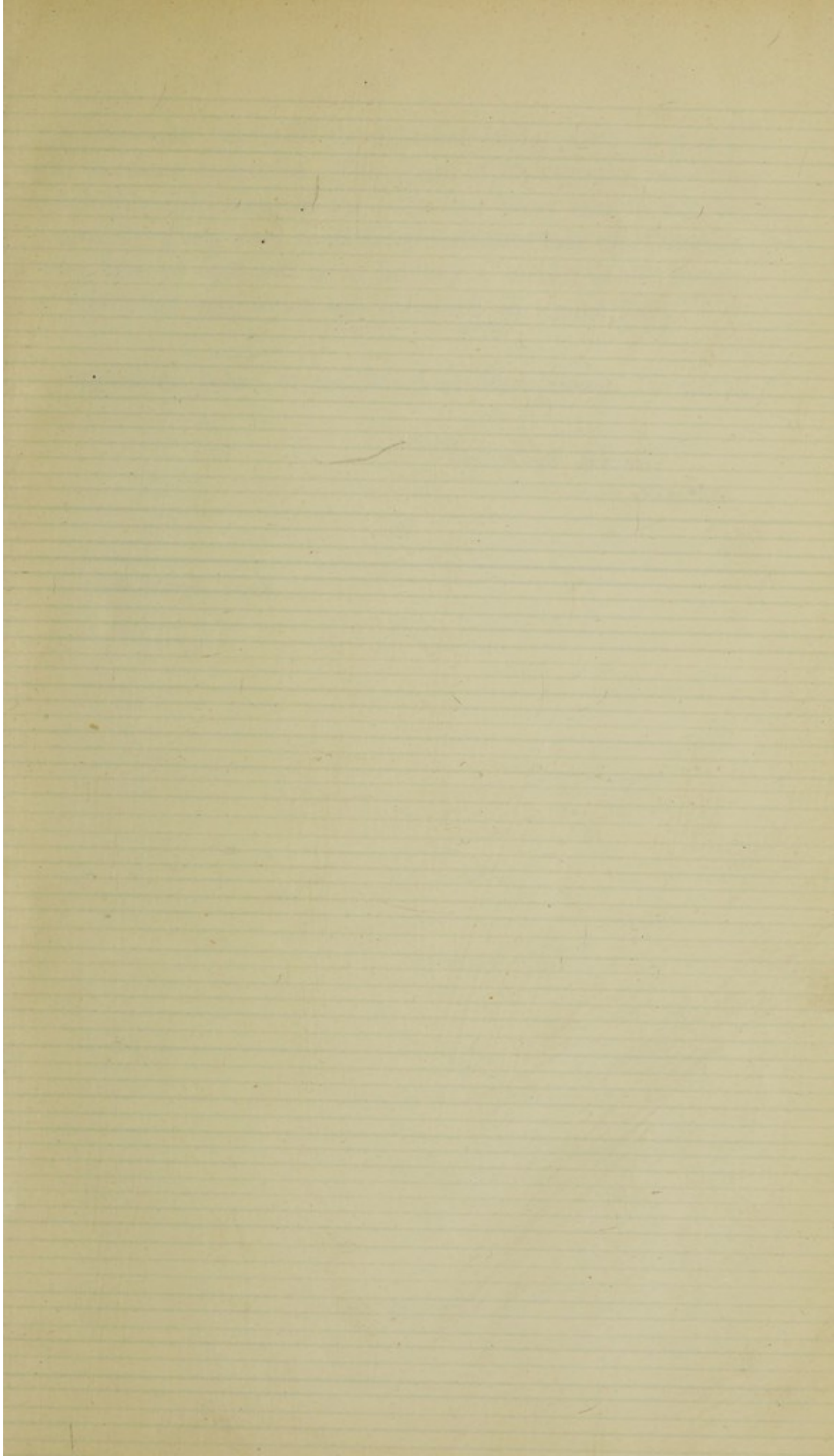
The Chaplain's Work.—The Rev. C. E. T. Whitfield, who was appointed Chaplain on 11th May, 1900, retired on the ground of ill-health at the end of August. Three months later, on 28th November, the Board of Management elected to the Chaplaincy the Rev. Robert W. Hudgell, Assistant Missioner of St. Barnabas, Southfields, in the Parish of St. Paul, Wimbledon Park, S.W. During the interval the Chaplain's duties were kindly performed by the Rev. John F. Webb, Curate of St. Matthew's, Bayswater.

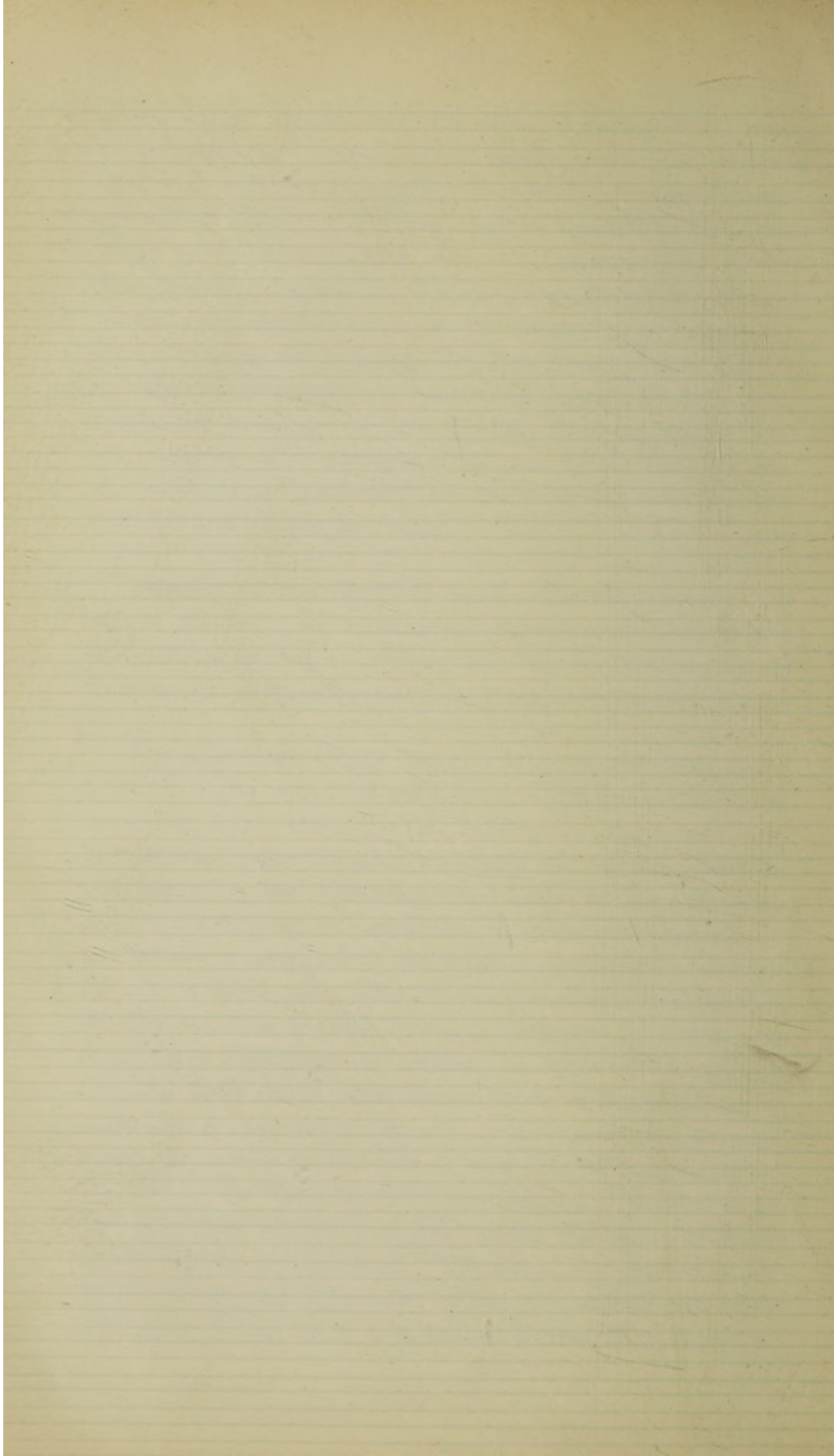
Mr. Hudgell comes to the work with a wide and varied experience of hospital duties both in England and abroad. He recently assisted as summer Chaplain of the Royal Hospital for Incurables, Putney, S.W. By the kind permission of the Bishop of Southwark and the Bishop of London, Mr. Hudgell began his

duties, except Sunday duty, immediately, visiting the wards, celebrating Holy Communion and administering Holy Baptism during the month of December. The Sunday duty from November 24th to December 29th was taken by the Rev. G. C. Wilton, Vicar of St. Mary's, Soho, and on Christmas Day by the Rev. John E. Edington, Curate of St. Mary's, Soho. Mr. Hudgell entered upon the full duties of the Chaplaincy on January 1st, 1908. During the vacancy, Mr. Fox, Licensed Lay Reader, rendered valuable and much appreciated help by his daily visitation of the wards, and the patients have also been regularly and systematically visited throughout the year by the Lady Visitors, who so kindly and generously gave their time and services to this Christian and humane endeavour.

Thanks to the Medical Staff.—The Board record their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their unremitting attention and kindness to the patients, and their great services to the Hospital during the past year.

The Clarence Wing Fête.—In conclusion, the Board invite the hearty support of the Governors and Subscribers in the movement which the ladies of Paddington, Marylebone and Kensington, under the able leadership of Lady Dimsdale, are now organizing for increasing the funds of the Hospital, and so developing its usefulness. A material increase in the income is essential to the efficient maintenance even of the old Hospital, and a still further augmentation is required if the Clarence Wing is to be opened for patients. In addition to this a large capital sum is necessary to equip and furnish the Clarence Wing and to make improvements to the old building which are an essential preliminary to the opening of the new wards. It should not be difficult in a rich residential quarter like that in the midst of which the Hospital is situated so to quicken public interest that the speedy realization of these objects may be accomplished. The active co-operation of all the Governors and Subscribers in this movement, which is to culminate in a Fête to be held towards the end of May next in





the unoccupied wards of the Clarence Wing, would go a long way to ensure its success. The Board of Management earnestly solicit this help, and, in the hope and belief that it will be generously given, they confidently anticipate that the Clarence Wing Fête of 1908 will be as brilliant a success as the Bazaar of nine years ago, which was organized on similar lines.

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of Government is by a Board of Management, meeting fortnightly, and consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, and Treasurers, together with twenty-five Governors elected annually, of whom eight are Members of the Medical and Surgical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School; and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.

Subscribers of greater sums are entitled to recommend Patients in proportion to the amount of their subscriptions. Letters are not issued unless expressly desired, as many subscribers do not require them.

Governors have also the right to inspect the Hospital under regulations by the Board of Management, so that they do not exercise that right so as to inconvenience the Chaplain or any Minister of Religion, or the Medical or other officers, or the Patients.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by will are eligible to be elected Honorary Life Governors.

THE MATERNITY.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or *Donors* of Ten Guineas to the MATERNITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually to that department; and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Accidents and cases of *urgency* are admitted FREE at all times, on the approval of the Medical Officers.

Persons holding In-patients' letters and desiring admission, must present their letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (Sundays excepted). They will be admitted after examination by the Medical Superintendent, if suitable and there is room.

Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that Governors and Subscribers sending Patients from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, will give notice to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, and send a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

When there is not room for all who apply for admission as In-patients those whose cases are most pressing are accepted, and the others are deferred or prescribed for as Out-patients. Notice of this is sent to the Subscriber, who can then recommend another patient.

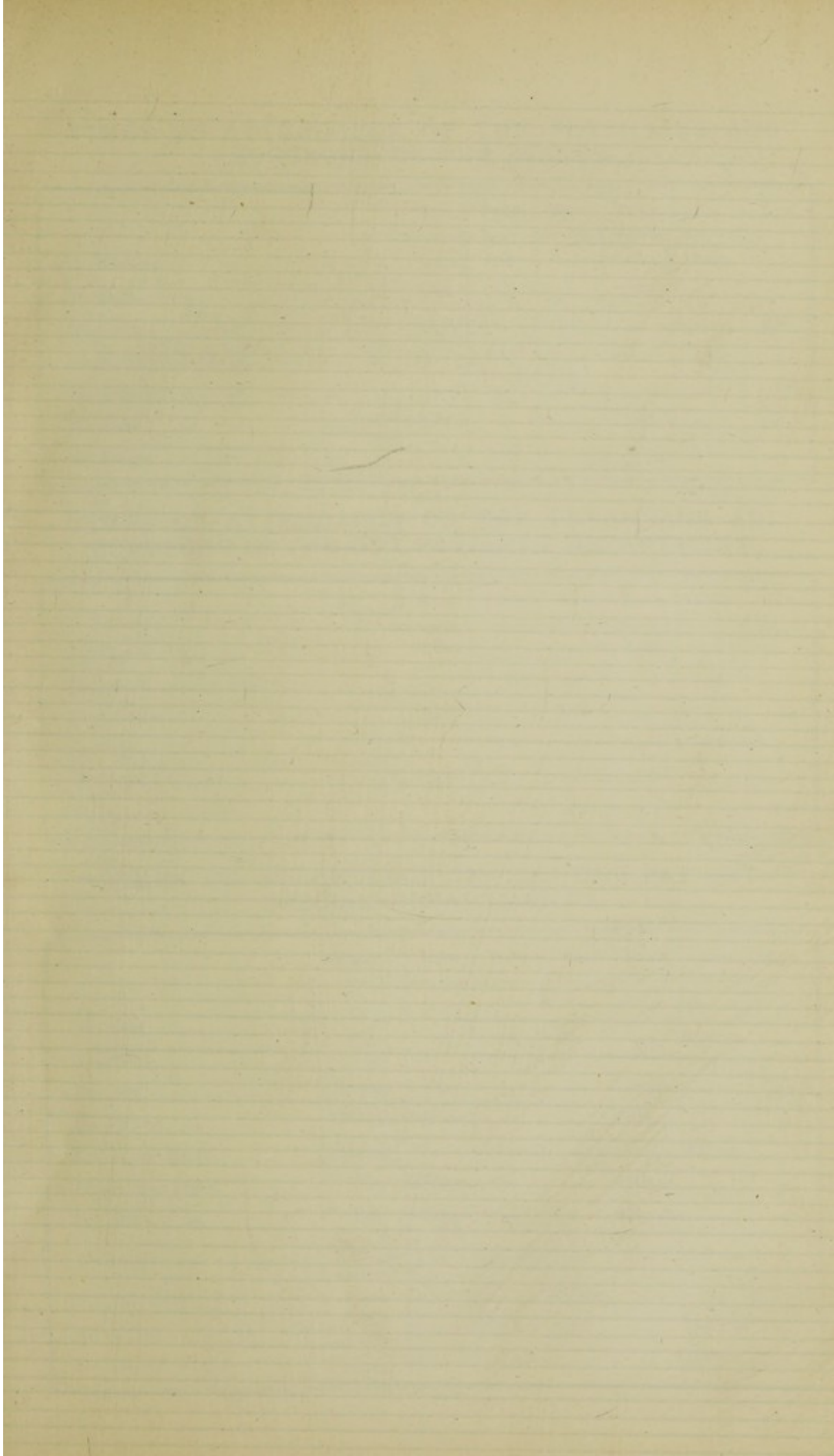
The following cases are unsuitable for admission as In-Patients—Confirmed Consumption, Infectious Diseases other than Typhoid Fever, Delirium Tremens, Itch, Incurable Diseases, Chronic Ulcerated Legs more suitable for a Parish Infirmary, and those who are capable of receiving equal benefit as Out-patients. No person capable of paying for medical attendance is admissible. §

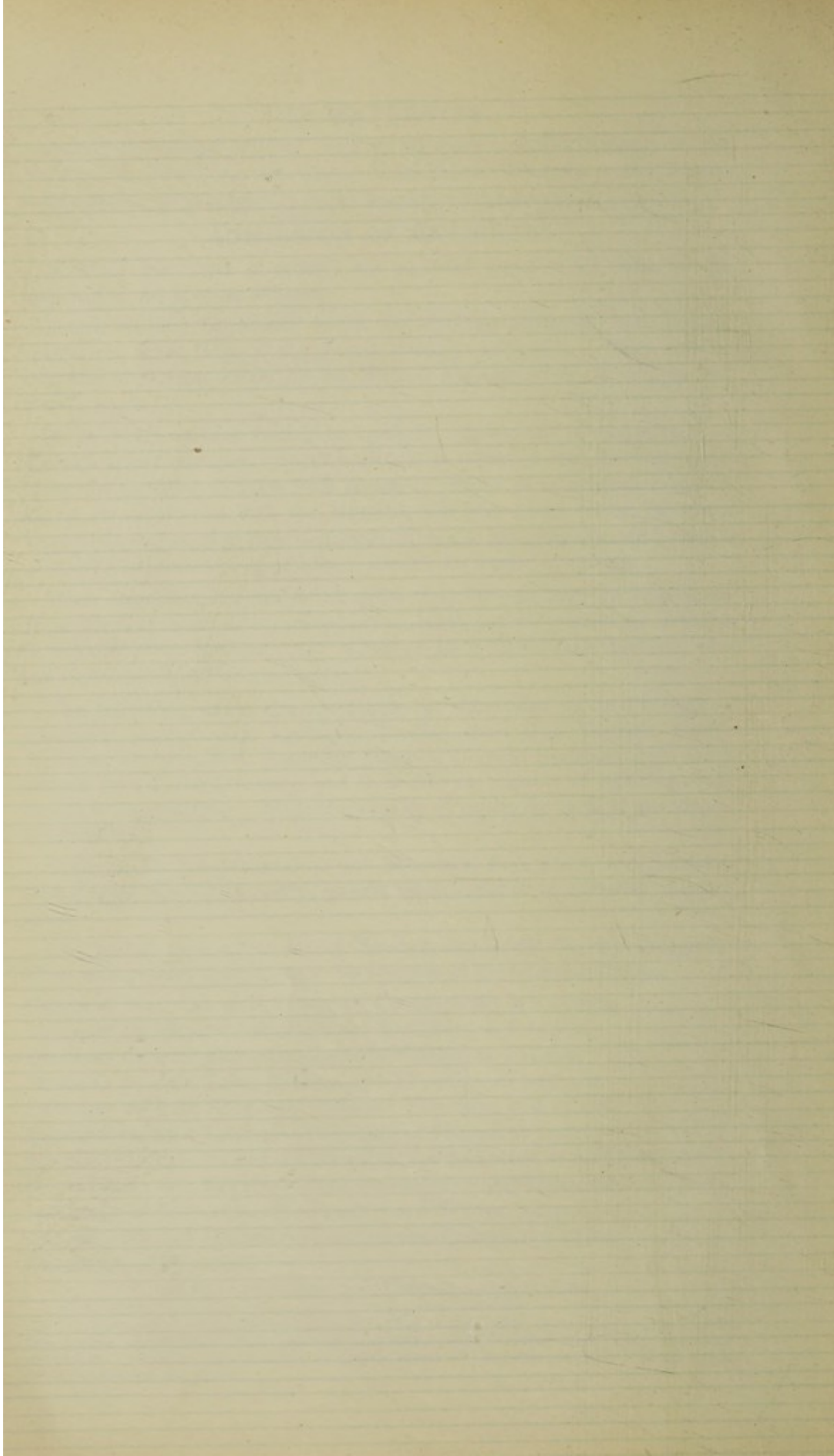
