THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for the year 1908.

The most important event of the year was the Clarence Wing Fête, and the Board therefore place it first in order amongst the subjects to be dealt with in their Report.

The Clarence Wing Fête. like skill of vnomites winking

The Fête, the preliminary arrangements for which were published in the last Report, was held in the unoccupied Wards of the Clarence Wing on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 19th, 20th and 21st May, and was in every way successful.

On the first day it was opened by H.R.H. Princess Henry of Battenberg, on the second day by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress in State, and on the third day by the Countess de Grey.

The weather was very fine, and under these favourable circumstances the Wards of the Clarence Wing proved very suitable for the purpose.

The total receipts during the three days amounted to $\pounds_{2,249}$ 175. 10d. best out oals staw staff out to anshow themin


But the Fête, although the most prominent feature, was only the culminating scene of the movement which the ladies of the District, under the able leadership of Lady Dimsdale, so kindly organised for the benefit of the Hospital. The house-to-house collection which they had quietly but indefatigably carried on for several months was even more important, and produced much the larger result. The total proceeds of the collection and of donations given in connection with the Fête amounted to $\pounds 6,286$ 18s. od., making with the takings at the Fête itself a grand total of $\pounds 8,536$ 15s. 10d., of which $\pounds 290$ 3s. 6d. was received in 1907, and $\pounds 8,246$ 12s. 4d. in 1908. The Board desire to make special reference to one of these donations, and to record their most grateful thanks for it. They refer to a munificent gift of one thousand guineas by Mrs. Salting specially for the Gynæcological Department of the Clarence Wing.

The expenses came out at the small sum of £465 4s. 4d. only, so the net sum accruing to the Hospital was £8,071 11s. 6d., of which £70 1s. 6d. was in Annual Subscriptions, and £1,050 "ear-marked" for the Gynæcological Department as above mentioned.

That such a result was attained in a year of such great financial strain must be regarded as a remarkable achievement, and as a striking testimony to the skill and untiring energy of those who organised and conducted the movement. Chief among them were Lady Dimsdale, the President of the Fête, Mrs. George Byron, the Honorary Secretary, and the ladies and gentlemen who acted as honorary officials of the various centres. To all of these, as well as to those who contributed gifts in money or kind or gave personal service, the Board record their deep gratitude. As a mark of their appreciation they had the pleasure of electing Lady Dimsdale an Honorary Vice-President and Mrs. Byron, Mrs. Leonard Cohen, Mrs. Franklin, Mrs. Jardine, Mrs Lewis Hall, Mrs. Lidiard, Miss Elsie MacSwinney, Mrs. Gerald Maude, Lady Plunkett, Mrs. Paris Singer, Mrs. Alec Tweedie and Miss Urguhart Honorary Life Governors. Many of the most prominent workers for the Fête were also the leaders in the similar movement in 1899 which culminated in the Bazaar at the Hotel Great Central, and were elected Honorary Life Governors at that To these ladies and gentlemen the Board's thanks are time. doubly due and are most sincerely and gratefully offered.

Full particulars of the takings at the various stalls, of the names of the officials and contributors in the various "Centres," and a statement of the result, will be found on pages 108 to 123.





On 16th December a Sale of Work, consisting of stock remaining over from the Students' and Nurses' Stalls at the Fête, was opened in the Library of the Medical School by Mrs. H. A. Harben, in aid of the Students' Cot Fund. The Sale was well-attended, the whole of the stock was disposed of, and the financial result was highly satisfactory, no less a sum than $\pounds 67$ 9s. 6d. being realised.

Hearty thanks are due to Mrs. Harben, to Mrs. Lees who superintended the decoration of the stalls, to the Great Western Railway Company for lending the decorations for the occasion, to Mrs. George Byron for presiding over the tea-room, and to all the ladies who so kindly assisted in this most successful wind up of the Fête.

The Board are also indebted to Mrs. H. A. Harben for the inauguration during 1908 of a scheme for augmenting the funds of the Hospital, and for enabling even those whose means are very small to take a direct practical share in its maintenance. The Board are convinced of the great potentialities of this idea. It is, of course, obvious that in the district served by St. Mary's Hospital, on the inhabitants of which it has the strongest of claims—that of gratitude for benefits conferred—those who could afford to become regular annual contributors to a shilling fund are to be numbered by tens of thousands. Nor have the Board any doubt that if means can be devised for effectively attracting public attention, perhaps on a special day or days in the year, by proclaiming the cause in some striking manner throughout the district, great numbers would gladly respond.

Last year was not a favourable one for launching the scheme, as it clashed with the work of the Fête. Yet \pounds_{41} 12s. 8d. was raised. Now that the Shilling Fund has been started, it must be vigorously followed up if it is to succeed. The Board promise all the help in their power, and tender their grateful thanks to Mrs. Harben for introducing the scheme and seeing it through its initial stage.





The average number of in-patients under treatment daily in the wards was the highest on record, namely, 261'7, the total number of beds in the Hospital being 279. The average is computed on the whole year, including the months of August and September, when the wards are closed in turn for the annual cleaning and airing, upon which the well-being of the patients during the remainder of the year so largely depends. During these two months the number of patients under treatment day by day averaged only 221'3. It will convey a truer idea of the pressure at which the Hospital is worked if an average be taken on the ten months during which the wards were in full occupation. That average is 269'7. Inasmuch as pressure is very seldom evenly distributed over the various classes of wards, it should be explained that whenever the number of patients in the Hospital exceeds 260, and often when it is below that number, some wards are overcrowded, a condition which necessitates the putting up of extra beds. At a time, for example, when the Children's wards may be short of their full complement of patients, there may be extreme pressure, causing the fitting up of several extra beds in other wards. These facts will convey an idea of the pressure which a daily average of 269 patients represents. It will be further illustrated by the fact that during 1908 it was necessary to put up extra beds on 356 Board any doubt that if means can be devised swollof as syab

The aggregate number of extra beds put up during the year was 1,624, a daily average of nearly $4\frac{1}{2}$.

The Board take this occasion to point out to Governors and Subscribers the effect of these conditions on the admission of patients. With a frequent prevalence of congestion in the wards it must, and in fact does, frequently happen that patients cannot be admitted for some time after application is made. The putting up of extra beds is detrimental to the occupants of the wards generally, and only the most urgent necessity can justify it. The practice is, when the wards are full, to register the names of applicants and to admit them as vacancies occur, according to the order of application and the comparative urgency of the patient's state.

The Board realise how disappointing it is, not only to patients themselves, but to those interested in them, when admission is deferred, and they deeply regret the necessity. But Governors and Subscribers will recognise from the above particulars that it is often absolutely unavoidable, and the Board ask their kind consideration should such a case fall within their personal experience.

The total number of patients passing through the wards was 4,059, being 159 more than in 1907, and the average length of patients' stay was 23.6 days, compared with 24.3 days in 1907.

Several important improvements were made during the year, but before referring to them the Board desire to make some allusion to the progress of those introduced in the preceding year.


One of the most important of these was the employment of a Laundry Company to do the Hospital washing instead of continuing to have it done on the premises. Of the effects of this change it was too early to speak positively in the last Annual Report. So far as could then be seen it had been attended by an increased expense of \pounds 109 a year. The Board are now happy to say that the experience of a complete year has demonstrated that no increase of expenditure has resulted. The estimated annual expenditure when the washing was done in the Hospital was \pounds 1,139 a year. During the six months' trial of the new system, in 1907, the cost was at the rate of \pounds 1,248 a year, an increase of \pounds 109. Last year the cost was \pounds 1,128, or \pounds 9 less than under the old system, and in all other respects the change has been beneficial to the Hospital.

The scheme for the systematic **renovation** every year of the **furniture** of some of the wards has been continued. "Allcroft" and "Foresters" were the wards dealt with during 1908, and the results are very satisfactory.

Another important improvement partly carried out in 1907, the provision of new ward **bedsteads** of a modern type, has now been completed. In June Dr. Handfield Jones genercusly made the Hospital a present of the number necessary to equip "New Boynton" Ward, in which patients under his charge are accommodated, and, no further gifts for the purpose having been made, the Board, in view of the great desirability of completing the re-equipment of the wards, decided to draw on the proceeds of the Clarence Wing Fête for the purpose. The new bedsteads were accordingly ordered towards the end of the year, and shortly after its close were placed in the wards.

Of the improvements made in 1908 the most important was the equipment of the **New Operating Theatre** in the Clarence Wing. Representations had been repeatedly made by the Surgeons of the urgent need of a second Theatre, but the finances of the Hospital were at so low an ebb that the Board, although most anxious to see the Theatre in use, could not venture to incur the very considerable outlay required to equip it. The Board are now happy to be able to announce that through the kindness of Mrs. F. G. Henriques this difficulty has been removed. Mrs. Henriques most generously contributed the munificent sum of $\pounds 900$, which with the $\pounds 105$ given for this purpose in 1906 by





Mr. Herbert W. Page, F.R.C.S., then Senior Surgeon and now Consulting Surgeon, and smaller sums amounting to $\pounds 28$ 1s. 11d., not only provided for the complete equipment of the Theatre itself, but also of the Anæsthetic Room and the Sterilizing Room. The equipment is the very best of its kind, and leaves nothing to be desired.

A tablet, bearing the following inscription, has been placed on the wall of the Theatre to commemorate this generous and most valuable gift, for which the Board now place on record their best thanks:---

IN MEMORY OF FREDERICK GUTTERES HENRIQUES, OF 19, HYDE PARK SQUARE, LONDON, THE COMPLETE ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT OF THIS OPERATING THEATRE WAS PRESENTED BY HIS WIDOW. 27TH FEBRUARY, 1908.

In order to make better provision for the work of the X-Ray Department, it was decided shortly before the end of the year to make an alteration which had been in contemplation for some years, but which owing to want of funds had not been carried out, namely, the conversion of "Boynton" Ward, which contained 9 beds for female medical patients, into the X-Ray Department. It is proposed to defray the cost of this improvement out of the proceeds of the Clarence Wing Fête. This change will provide the X-Ray Department with the increased space which the growing extent of the work renders necessary, and it is hoped that the room will be found in every way suitable for the new purpose to which it is put. The fact that it is imperfectly ventilated and gets little sunlight rendered it by no means well suited for constant occupation by the sick, and this consideration reconciled the Board to a change which, involving as it does the loss of nine beds, is regrettable in view of the great and increasing pressure on the accommodation for patients.

The Board have to thank the Borough Council of Paddington for paving with cork asphalte the roadway of Praed Street in front of the Clarence Wing. The Board had represented to the Borough Council the seriousness to occupants of the Clarence Wing of the noise arising from the vehicular traffic in Praed Street, and gratefully acknowledge the sympathetic consideration which the Council gave to the matter. The new paving was laid down in the Summer Vacation and made a material improvement, though the noise and vibration are still very noticeable.

Finance.


Financially the year 1908 cannot be regarded as satisfactory, for although important further reductions were effected in the expenditure, the income was insufficient to provide for it, and consequently the Income and Expenditure Account shows an adverse balance on the working of the year of \pounds ,2,366. But for an anonymous donation of \pounds 5,000 from a friend who has generously helped the Hospital on more than one previous occasion, and to whom the Board again tender their warm thanks, the deficiency would have amounted to \pounds 7,366.

In order to make better provision for the work of the X-Ray

That part of the income which is described in the Income and Expenditure Account of the Uniform System as "Ordinary Income," shows an increase compared with 1907 of £3,613, chiefly because of the donation above referred to. The awards of King Edward's Hospital Fund and the Hospital Sunday Fund were respectively £500 and £64 higher than in 1907. Other variations in the "Ordinary Income" are small in amount, and call for no comment.

The "Extraordinary Income" exceeds that of the preceding year by $\pounds 3,415$, owing entirely to the inclusion of the proceeds of the Clarence Wing Fête. The objects of the Fête included, among other things, the equipment of the wards in the Clarence Wing, the making of urgently needed improvements in the old Hospital, and the reinforcement of the income for general purposes.





Towards the close of the year negotiations were in progress, which have since been carried to completion, by which the whole of the wards on the first floor of the Clarence Wing, accommodating 31 beds, will not only be completely equipped without having recourse to the proceeds of the Fête, but will be opened and maintained for patients without imposing any additional charge on the Hospital. The circumstances under which the Board are enabled to make this highly satisfactory announcement are briefly as follows. A Committee of influential gentlemen, of which the Right Hon. A. J. Balfour, M.P., F.R.S., is Chairman, greatly interested in the cause of therapeutic inoculation, offered, if the Board were prepared to devote the wards on the first floor of the Clarence Wing to poor patients for treatment by inoculation under Sir Almroth Wright, F.R.S., to equip the wards, and maintain them as a part of St. Mary's Hospital under the control and administration of the Board of Management. At the same time the Committee offered to maintain, and themselves administer, free, with certain limitations, from the Board's control, that part of the Clarence Wing which was placed at the temporary disposal of Sir Almroth Wright in 1907, if the Board were prepared to devote the buildings to the purpose of a Department for the treatment of Out-patients by inoculation and the preparation of Vaccines.

The Board having indicated their readiness to give a sympathetic consideration to these proposals, negotiations were opened as above mentioned, which terminated in the signing of an agreement for a term of years on 17th March, 1909.

It is long since the Board have made an announcement to the Governors and Subscribers of the Hospital which has given them such unmixed satisfaction.

This important matter had not, however, been settled at the close of the year, and the Board were, therefore, not in a position to decide on the appropriation of the proceeds of the Fête. The balance remaining after all expenses had been paid, was, therefore, carried to a Suspense Account and transferred to the Balance Sheet. Disregarding, therefore, the Fête proceeds, the extraordinary income—that is legacies—amounted only to $\pounds 4,137$. Seeing that the average yearly income derived from legacies during the preceding ten years was no less than $\pounds 12,283$, the seriousness of a fall to $\pounds 4,137$ will at once be realized. It was indeed the dominating feature of the year's finance, and under the circumstances it was a relief to the Board to find, when the accounts for the year were made up, that the ultimate deficiency was no greater than $\pounds 2,366$.

The "Ordinary Expenditure" was $\pounds 27,445$, $\pounds 806$ less than in 1907, although the number of patients, both in and out, including Casualty and Maternity Patients, was considerably higher than in that year. As a necessary consequence the average cost per in-patient fell from $\pounds 6$ 1s. od. in 1907 to $\pounds 5$ 12s. 8d. in 1908, and per Out-patient from 1s. 9d. to a little over 1s. $8\frac{1}{2}d$. Inasmuch as St. Mary's figures in 1907 were below the average of the 16 larger General Hospitals of London, as shown in the published Financial Returns of King Edward's Hospital Fund, these results must be regarded as very satisfactory. For full details of the Income and Expenditure, the Governors and Subscribers are referred to the Income and Expenditure Account, pages 28 to 31, and the Statistical Tables on pages 38, 39.



At the first meeting of the Board, after the Annual Election, Mr. H. A. Harben and Mr. James R. Mellor were re-elected Chairman and Deputy-Chairman respectively.

The Board deeply regret to have to announce the loss of two of their colleagues by death during the year—Colonel H. F. Blair and Major-General J. H. M. Shaw-Stewart.

Both gentlemen had been members of the Board of Management since its formation in 1891. They were regular in their attendance and unremitting in their devotion to the interests of the Hospital. Colonel Blair had been a member for three years of the House and Finance Committee, and had served on the Enquiry Committee for many years. General Shaw-Stewart became a member of the Enquiry Committee at its formation in 1897, and had but recently retired; he was also one of the most active members of the Extension Committee, from the acquisition of the Praed Street property in 1889 until the completion of the Clarence Memorial Wing.

The Board record with gratitude the many and valuable services rendered to the Hospital by Colonel Blair and General Shaw-Stewart, and express their sense of the great loss which has been sustained by their death.

In October and November respectively Mr. H. Percy Harris, L.Ç.C., and Mr. Berkeley Portman to the great regret of the Board resigned their seats as they were unable to be present regularly at the meetings. Mr. Portman was also a member of the House and Finance Committee.

The Board are glad to know that the interest of both gentlemen in the Hospital is continued although they are unable any longer to take part in the conduct of its affairs. The following new members of the Board have been elected :---

The death of General Shaw-Stewart caused a vacancy in the office of Trustee, which has been filled by the election of Captain G. A. Webbe.

The Board regret to report the retirement, through ill-health, of Mr. Henry Davis, Senior Honorary Anæsthetist.

In recognition of the valuable services rendered to the Hospital by Mr. Davis during the long period of 22 years, he was elected Consulting Anæsthetist to the Hospital.

The vacancy in the Staff of Anæsthetists was filled by the appointment of Mr. J. Henry Chaldecott.

The Board regret also to report the retirement of Dr. Scanes Spicer, Surgeon for Diseases of the Throat, on the completion of the limit of service prescribed by the Laws of the Hospital, viz., twenty years. In recognition of his services to the Hospital Dr. Scanes Spicer was elected Consulting Surgeon for Diseases of the Throat.

On the retirement of Dr. Scanes Spicer it was decided to amalgamate the Throat Department and the Ear Department into one Department for Diseases of the Ear, Nose and Throat, and to commit the charge of the combined Departments to Dr. William Hill, then Surgeon for Diseases of the Ear, Mr. C. I. Graham being elected Assistant-Surgeon.



In offering their thanks and congratulations on the Association's progress to Lady Dimsdale, Mrs. Harben and their colleagues, the Board are mindful of the fact that to the Ladies' Association was due in no small measure the success of the Clarence Wing Fête. That its members, while working so hard for that object, should have continued unrelaxed their attention to the work of the Association itself, shows a depth of interest in the welfare of the Hospital for which the Board cannot adequately express their thanks. They feel that it ensures the continued and increasing success of the Association.

The London Needlework Guild has again repeated its welcome gift of a large parcel of warm clothing, which it has now generously contributed at Christmas for so many years. The grateful thanks of the Board are given to the Guild for the continuance of this most valuable gift.

The Board sincerely thank **The Flannel Shirt Club** for the supply of men's flannel shirts again kindly sent to the Hospital, and desire to express their appreciation of the humane work in which the members of The Flannel Shirt Club are engaged.

The Ladies of the Flower Mission have continued their efforts to cheer the patients in the Hospital by visiting and singing to them, and by contributing flowers to brighten the wards. This kindness the Board again acknowledge with gratitude.

St. Mary's Soup Kitchen has during the year continued its most useful work of supplying nourishing food to many of the out-patients. It frequently happens that it is food rather than medicine that out-patients require, and the Kitchen herefore meets a very real want.

The Parkwood Convalescent Home.

The Trustees of the Home have continued throughout the year to place 15 beds at the disposal of the Hospital, 10 for men and 5 for women. The normal stay of the patients in the home is 19 days, the men going down on Thursday and leaving on the following Tuesday fortnight, and the women going down on Friday and remaining till the following Wednesday fortnight. Two hundred of our patients, 127 men and 73 women, have benefited by this invaluable provision during the year. The Board again express their grateful thanks to Mr. Peter Reid and his co-trustees for this great aid to the recovery of the Hospital's patients, and they rejoice to think that, through the princely liberality of Mr. Peter Reid, the permanent continuance of the Home is assured.


Enquiry-Lady Almoner.

The Board regret to report that Mr. Pincombe, their Enquiry Officer, who was appointed in 1898, when the system of enquiry was first introduced, died in March, 1908. Mr. Pincombe was a zealous and efficient officer, and the Board record their appreciation of the excellent work he did for the Hospital.

The death of Mr. Pincombe led to the immediate introduction of a development of this department of the Hospital which had been under consideration for some little time. Hitherto its operations had been exclusively confined to investigating the circumstances of out-patients, with a view to the exclusion of those whose means should enable them to pay for medical treatment. It was now decided to expand them by coupling with the work of excluding unsuitable persons the task of endeavouring to help more effectually the needy and deserving. In view of the fact that during recent years this field of work has been engaged in by ladies who have undergone a special course of training to fit them for it, the Board decided to appoint a Lady Almoner It is the duty of this officer, in





addition to conducting investigations, to endeavour, by association with other charitable agencies, to procure for our patients home nursing, special diets, surgical appliances, convalescent home or sanatorium treatment, and other similar advantages, by which the medical treatment received from the Staff of the Hospital may be furthered, and the patients' recovery expedited.

Miss E. A. B. Wilson was appointed to this office in October, and entered upon her duties on 1st November. The work of the Enquiry Committee has, for the present, been suspended.

The work in the several departments of the Medical School has been carried on in a most satisfactory manner during the past year, and it is encouraging to find that the decision to maintain the departments for instruction in Preliminary and Intermediate Subjects has again been fully justified by the increased entry of students for these portions of the curriculum.

A feature of the year has been the increased number of University students attending the Vacation Courses in Anatomy and Physiology, which are provided for their convenience both in the Easter and the Long Vacations. Special classes have also been instituted for the examinations for promotion in the Royal Army Medical Corps, and the attendance at these during the past year has been very good.

During 1908 the examination results have continued to be encouraging.

Five students have proceeded to the degree of M.D., four at London and one at Cambridge; ten to the degree of M.B., seven at London and three at Cambridge; and at the M.B. and B.S. examination of the London University in May Mr. A. Fleming obtained honours in Medicine, Pathology, and Forensic Medicine and Hygiene, and was bracketed for the University Gold Medal. At the Conjoint Board Examination 28 students obtained the diplomas of M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. In the Government Medical Services six commissions were obtained in the Royal Navy, three in the Royal Army Medical Corps, and Mr. R. Knowles obtained the second place in the examination for the Indian Medical Service.

A pleasing feature of the past year has been the institution of Emeritus Lectureships, which are held by the members of the Consulting Staff. Special Lectures were given by Dr. Cheadle on Medicine, and by Sir Malcolm Morris on Dermatology. The courses were largely attended by past as well as present students, and were highly appreciated.





Dr. Willcox has now undertaken the entire lectureship in Forensic Medicine, a matter of some importance to the Medical School, in view of his recent appointment as Senior Analyst to the Home Office in succession to the late Sir Thomas Stevenson.

Some important changes have recently been made in the courses of instruction in the administration of anæsthetics; the Medical School authorities rightly consider this a most important feature of the Student's curriculum, and the regulations recently adopted by the Board on their recommendation cannot fail to prove beneficial to this branch of clinical work in the future.

The Board regret that they are unable to report any improvement in the financial position of the Medical School. It remains much the same as last year.





Department for Therapeutic Inoculation. 10 Into A

The work of this department, of which a full description was given in the last report, has grown and developed during the year.

In addition to the regular staff of the Department, six gentlemen have worked during the whole or part of the year as assistants.

The patients have consisted, as in the past, of in-patients of the Hospital, under the care of the Medical and Surgical Staff, who have been treated by inoculation; and of the out-patients of the Inoculation Department exclusively under the care of the staff of the Department.

There has been a notable increase of both classes of patients during the year.

In view of the larger working staff the maintenance expenses

As in previous years, a majority of cases have consisted of local tuberculous infections: lupus, tuberculous glands, tuberculous joints, tuberculosis of the genito-urinary tract, tuberculous abscesses, and a few selected cases of pulmonary consumption. The remainder of the cases have been made up of patients suffering from septic wounds, carbuncles, boils, and pustular eruptions of the skin and other bacterial infections not falling under any of the above headings. Lastly, a number of inoperable cases of cancer have been treated, with a view to the alleviation of their symptoms. The results obtained have been extremely encouraging. A total of 17,035 estimations of the Opsonic Index have been made during the year. This represents an increase of 636estimations as compared with the number of the previous year.


Medical men and bacteriologists have come from all parts of the world to go through courses of instruction in the laboratories of the department. The number of such laboratory workers was 43. They may be classified as follows :—From the United States of America 11, Germany 10, United Kingdom 10, India 4, Canada 1, Finland 1, Greece 1, Jamaica 1, Holland 1, South America 1, Malta 1, Egypt 1.


In addition, the out-patient clinics have been attended by a number of medical men from the following countries :—Italy, Spain, Portugal, Austria, Switzerland, Australia, Russia, The Philippine Islands, Belgium, Sweden, and South Africa.

In view of the larger working staff the maintenance expenses of the department have considerably increased; these charges have however been more than met by the teaching fees, by the increase of the special donations, and by the new source of revenue which has been opened up by the sale of bacterial vaccines.

In view of the demand on the part of the Medical Profession for trustworthy vaccines, and of the possibility of obtaining a revenue from this source in aid of the therapeutic work of the department, arrangements were made in March last for the vaccines which are prepared in the department to be put upon the market. It will be seen on reference to the accounts (p. 126) that a revenue has already been obtained from this source to set off against the heavy expenses of maintenance.

As indicated in the Report of last year, the work of the department has been very seriously hampered by the fact that there were no beds for in-patients attached to the department. This drawback, as above stated, has happily now been removed, and the Board look forward with confidence to the rapid development and ever-increasing usefulness of this, the youngest of the departments of the Hospital.

The Lady Visitors (among whom are several new members) have been constant and devoted in their ministration to the sick throughout the year.

In conclusion, the Board earnestly call attention to the financial position of the Hospital. For the third year in succession 1908 closed with a deficiency on the year's working. Disregarding the Fête proceeds for reasons already mentioned, the amount of the deficiency was $\pounds 2,366$. In 1907 it was $\pounds 2,045$ and in 1906 $\pounds 4,017$. This represents a total in three years of $\pounds 8,428$. Meanwhile the total investments of the Hospital available for general purposes, the remains of accumulated surplus income in the past, amount to $\pounds 10,552$ only. If, therefore, securities were sold to wipe out the present deficit, there would be scarcely any left. In the hope that generous friends of the Hospital would come to its aid in this most critical situation the Board have hesitated to part with this last remnant of its invested savings. To this hope they still cling.


The founders of St. Mary's and those who succeeded them in the past gave superabundantly to it, so that the Board were able as time went on not only to maintain the Hospital in efficiency, but to raise a reserve fund against "hard times."

It was, however, but a slender reserve; "hard times" have succeeded "hard times," and now to have recourse to what remains of it to make good a thrice repeated annual deficiency will reduce it almost to the vanishing point. To avert this calamity the Board earnestly appeal for funds to wipe out the debt of $\pounds 8,428$, and thus obviate the necessity, otherwise imminent, for curtailing the beneficent work of the Hospital by closing some of the wards, and this at a time when working them at high pressure does not suffice to provide for all those who are fit objects of the Charity, for, even now, patients are constantly being denied admission for want of room.

The Board venture at the same time to recall the fact that the source which in the past mainly fed the Reserve Fund was legacies. They hope that the good example of former Governors and Subscribers, who not only contributed regularly to the Hospital in their lifetime but remembered it in their testamentary dis positions, will not be forgotten.

But not only is there a deficiency to be wiped out, the upkeep of the Hospital has to be provided for, to which end the best means to be adopted is to increase the number of its supporters. Large contributions are, of course, valuable, but in the nature of things they can be but occasional. The life blood of any charity is the stream of small regular contributions. An admirable means of enlisting the interest and support of a large number of the public has already been mentioned—Mrs. Harben's "Shilling Fund." The Board commend this scheme to the enthusiastic support of





every Governor and Subscriber. The number of persons who could contribute this small sum is practically unlimited, and, once their interest in the cause is excited and their knowledge of the work extends, many will, the Board believe, be found willing to make a larger contribution. The great thing is to increase the roll of the charity's supporters, and this the "Shilling Fund" is pre-eminently calculated to do.

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of Government is by a Board of Management, meeting fortnightly, and consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, and Treasurers, together with twenty-five Governors elected annually, of whom eight are Members of the Medical and Surgical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School; and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.





Subscribers of greater sums are entitled to recommend Patients in proportion to the amount of their subscriptions. Letters are not issued unless expressly desired, as many subscribers do not require them.

Governors have also the right to inspect the Hospital under regulations by the Board of Management, so that they do not exercise that right so as to inconvenience the Chaplain or any Minister of Religion, or the Medical or other officers, or the Patients.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by will are eligible to be elected. Honorary Life Governors.

Accidents and cases of urgency are admitted FREE at all times, on the approval of the Medical Officers.

Persons holding In-patients' letters and desiring admission, must present their letters at the Hospital at I o'clock (Sundays excepted). They will be admitted after examination by the Medical Superintendent, if suitable and there is room.

.. Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that Governors and Subscribers sending Patients from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, will give notice to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, and send a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

When there is not room for all who apply for admission as In-patients, those whose cases are most pressing are accepted, and the others are deferred or prescribed for as Out-patients. Notice of this is sent to the Subscriber, who can then recommend another patient.

The following cases are unsuitable for admission as In-Patients— Confirmed Consumption, Infectious Diseases other than Typhoid Fever, Delirium Tremens, Itch, Incurable Diseases, Chronic Ulcerated Legs more suitable for a Parish Infirmary, and those who are capable of receiving equal benefit as Out-patients. No person capable of paying for medical attendance is admissible.§

VISITING DAYS.—Adults : Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 5, and Sundays, from 3 to 4. Children under 15 : Wednesdays, 4 to 5, Sundays, 3 to 4. Except for urgent reasons visitors cannot be admitted at other times. *Out-patients* are attended DAILY (Sundays and Public Holidays excepted). The CLOTHING of many of our poor patients is of such a scanty and threadbare description as to afford them but the very slightest protection against the cold and the rain.



Special care has been taken to ascertain that Patients are really needy and deserving before assisting them, particularly those in Classes 2 and 3. Thorough enquiry into their means and deserts has been made in every case.


