ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1910.

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for the year 1910.

With deep regret the Board place on official record the death on May 6th of the Patron of the Hospital, HIS MAJESTY KING EDWARD VII., whose personal interest in the institution, extending over many years, and evinced by gracious acts in connection with important incidents in its history, was of such signal advantage to the Hospital.

The incidents to which the Board refer occurred in the years 1865 and 1892. In the former year HIS MAJESTY, then PRINCE OF WALES, laid the foundation stone of an enlargement which is now the centre of the main building; in the latter, he laid the first stone of a New Wing, which by HIS MAJESTY'S special permission was named the "Clarence Memorial Wing," in memory of His Royal Highness the late DUKE OF CLARENCE.

The great interest in the Hospital thus practically evinced by His Majesty had much to do with its success in securing, in 1901, for the completion of the Clarence Memorial Wing, first the ZUNZ BEQUEST of £25,000, and then the public subscription of a further sum of £25,000, on the raising of which the Zunz Trustees had made their handsome gift conditional.

The memory of these signal marks of His Majesty's favour will ever be cherished by all who take an interest in the welfare and progress of St. Mary's Hospital.

The Board have the honour to announce that HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE V., and HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, have been graciously pleased to become Patrons of the Hospital, and

His Royal Highness PRINCE ARTHUR OF CONNAUGHT has consented to accept the post of President which was held by His present Majesty when Prince of Wales.

Work.

The work of the Hospital was carried on under high pressure in all departments throughout the year.

In-Patients.

The number of beds, which had been increased to 300 in July, 1909, by the opening of the Inoculation Wards—the “ANNIE ZUNZ” Wards in the Clarence Wing—stood at that number throughout 1910. The number of In-patients was higher than it has ever been, viz., 4,318. In the preceding year it was 4,242. The average stay of patients was somewhat longer than in 1909, viz., 23.5 days against 22.6; and the average number resident daily in the Hospital throughout the year was 275.6 compared with 260.3 the year before.

Although the “Average number of patients resident daily throughout the year,” or, as it is sometimes expressed, the “Average number of occupied beds,” is the commonly accepted measure of the extent of In-patient work in a given period, an alternative and perhaps a clearer one, is afforded by adopting as a unit “one patient for one day.” Applying this formula to the work of 1909 and 1910, we find that the number of “patient days” in 1909 was 95,026; and in 1910, 100,584. The excess of the In-patient work of 1910 over 1909 may therefore be alternatively expressed as equivalent to 15.3 beds in constant occupation all the year round, or as 5,558 patients for one day.

Inoculation Wards.

The arrangement, described in the Annual Report for 1908, under which the “ANNIE ZUNZ” Wards in the Clarence Wing, containing 31 beds, have been devoted to the reception of patients for treatment by Inoculation, has continued to work satisfactorily

It will be remembered that the cost of the maintenance of these Wards is not a charge on the funds of the Hospital, but that an independent Committee contribute an annual sum in respect of them, the amount being based upon the average cost of an occupied bed in the Hospital during the preceding year. The actual sum paid in 1910 was £2,611 1s. 5d. The number of Inoculation In-patients during the year was 214.

Improvements.

Owing to lack of funds there still remained in the Clarence Wing, after the occupation of the Inoculation Wards, 3 empty Wards with accommodation for 18 beds. Two of these Wards, containing 13 beds, have been brought into use by the transfer to them of the Obstetric patients, who had previously for many years been accommodated in the "New Boynton" Ward (12 beds) in the Mary Stanford Wing. The Operating Theatre adjoining that Ward was inadequate in size and otherwise very unsuitable, and by transferring the patients to the Clarence Wing, the new Operating Theatre, so admirably equipped in 1908 by Mrs. F. G. Henriques, became available for Obstetric operations.

There still remain in the Hospital two empty wards, the "NEW BOYNTON" Ward in the Mary Stanford Wing, containing twelve beds, and the "WILLIAM JOHN BELLVILLE" Ward in the Clarence Wing, containing five beds.

The room formerly used as the Obstetric Theatre having been vacated, the space thus freed was added to the adjoining Ophthalmic Ward, and small structural improvements were made in the other Ophthalmic Ward at the same time.

A sum of £204 has been very usefully spent on the installation of hot water radiators in four wards in the Mary Stanford Wing, which stand in particularly exposed situations, and in which the need of supplementary heating had long been felt.

The Board record their hearty thanks to Lady Carbutt for her thoughtful kindness in building a portico at the main entrance in Cambridge Place, for the protection in inclement weather of the friends of patients on Visiting Days. There is unfortunately no accommodation in the Hospital for Visitors who arrive before the visiting hour, or who are waiting to take their turn on the departure of other visitors. For all such the shelter which Lady Carbutt's generosity has provided has proved a great boon.

There is no other point in connection with the buildings of the Hospital which calls for special mention, except the very serious condition of the Casualty Department, to which attention was drawn in the last Annual Report. The Board are bringing this subject specially to the notice of the Governors in a separate communication.

The Medical Treatment of Elementary School Children.

At the invitation of the London County Council, and in the interests of the health of the rising generation, the Board in March made arrangements for the treatment in the Hospital of a certain number of the children of Elementary Schools in the neighbourhood, suffering from diseases of the Eye, from diseases of the Ear, Nose, and Throat, and from Ringworm. The arrangements are that the children shall attend and be treated at special times, and by Medical Officers connected with the

Hospital but not members of the Medical Staff; that the Medical Officers shall be paid by the London County Council; and that a capitation payment shall be made by the Council to the Hospital of 7s. for children suffering from Ringworm, for whom expensive X-rays treatment is required, and of 2s. for all other children. The arrangements have worked smoothly and well from the beginning, and the Board have every reason to believe that the work done in St. Mary's Hospital has been such as to give satisfaction to the parents of the children and to the London County Council.

Finance.

Expenditure.

Although the extent of the work of the year materially exceeded that for 1909, the total cost of maintenance and administration was but £251 more, viz: £28,102 compared with £27,851. An obvious consequence of this economy is a further fall in the average cost per patient. In the case of In-patients the cost per patient per week has fallen from £1 14s. 6d. in 1909 to £1 11s. 10d. in 1910 (see Statistical Tables p. 30) and per day from 4s. 11.1d. to 4s. 6.6d., a saving of 4½d. per patient per day. In the case of Out-patients, as the number of attendances per patient was much higher than in 1909, the average cost per Out-patient was slightly increased, viz: 1s. 10.88d. compared with 1s. 8.39d. in 1909, but the cost per attendance, which is the true basis of comparison, fell from 7.56d. to 7.13d. This represents a saving of nearly ½d. per attendance, and as there were 175,002 attendances the amount saved will be seen to be considerable.

The Board are happy again to be able to state that the Annual Statistical Report of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, issued in August last for 1909, shows that St. Mary's still maintains a very satisfactory position among the General Hospitals of London in the matter of economy in expenditure. While the average cost per occupied bed in Hospitals in its class was £80 9s. 6d., the cost in St. Mary's was £79 8s. 5d., or £1 1s. 1d. below the average.

The Board regret to have to record, in relation to Expenditure, a circumstance which will cause a permanent rise of some £90 a year. This circumstance is the increase, at the Quinquennial Valuation, of the Rateable Value of the Hospital from £1,500 to £1,750, which will raise the sum payable annually in Parochial Rates to £635. But for the favourable consideration kindly given by the Assessment Committee of the Paddington Borough Council to the Board's representations on the subject, the Rateable Value would have been increased to £2,084.

Income.

For the first time for eleven years the Income exceeded the Expenditure, the chief cause being a great increase in Legacies, which amounted, in the total, to £11,045. But there was also a considerable improvement in the yield of Donations, which provided £6,168, a result largely due to a special appeal issued in the Spring. The average annual income from this source for the preceding ten years was £3,058.

The total income was swelled by a generous gift from King Edward's Hospital Fund for London of £2,500 to reduce debt. This gift was an addition to the regular annual award, and the Board take this occasion publicly to record their grateful thanks for it.

The balance of Income over Expenditure at the close of the year amounted to £7,750, a sum but £981 short of the accumulated debt with which the year commenced.

Satisfactory as is this respite from the financial embarrassment which has hampered the work of the Hospital for several years, and which threatened to necessitate the closing of some of the Wards, it is far from restoring the Hospital to the moderate degree of financial stability which it formerly enjoyed. The enforced repeated sales of investments to cover deficiencies of Income have resulted in ten years in the sale of £34,500 of the invested Capital of the Hospital, and the reduction of that Capital to £9,852. Nor should the welcome increase in this year's receipts be permitted to obscure the fact that the ordinary income

of the year, swelled though it was by the increased yield of Donations owing to the appeal, yet fell short of the regular and necessary expenditure by no less than £5,795. This shortage of ordinary income, of which the inadequacy of the amount of Annual Subscriptions is the worst feature, is the most serious part of the financial situation. The remedy lies in the increase in the amount of Annual Subscriptions, which are the backbone of Hospital finance. Taking into consideration the extent of the area served by the Hospital, and the importance of the residential quarter in which it is situated, the Board feel that the number of Annual Subscribers ought to be far larger than it is. They would urge all supporters of St. Mary's to induce such of their neighbours as do not at present subscribe annually to make a beginning in the present year.

Changes in the Board and Medical Staff.

The Hospital suffered a most grievous loss in the course of the year in the death of Mr. H. A. Harben, whose retirement from the Chairmanship of the Board was announced in the last Report.

Mr. Harben's death, which was quite unexpected by his many friends at St. Mary's, took place in the summer holidays, on 18th August.

The services which Mr. Harben rendered to the Hospital were exceptional. Not only was he for many years one of the most generous benefactors it has ever known, but his great administrative gifts and ripe experience, unsparingly devoted to the benefit of the Hospital during the six years he was our Chairman, have left an indelible mark on the Institution, while his modest and conciliatory bearing (though it may sometimes have induced strangers to underrate his great abilities), made for peace and endeared him to his fellow-workers.

Great as was his interest in the Hospital itself, it was equalled by his exertions on behalf of the Medical School.

Mr. Harben had also made his influence felt in the general

management of the Charitable Medical Institutions of the Metropolis, and he was a prominent member of the Central Hospital Council.

At the first meeting of the Board after the sad event, the following Resolution was moved from the Chair and unanimously adopted :—

“That the Board have heard with profound regret of the death of Mr. Henry A. Harben, and desire to place on record their appreciation of his eminent services as Chairman of the Board for a period of six years, and their admiration for the ability, diligence, and generosity with which he furthered the interests of the Hospital and Medical School.”

Mr. Harben bequeathed a legacy of £1,000 to the Hospital for the Endowment of a bed, and £1,000 to the Medical School.

The Board have named the central Surgical Ward on the ground floor the “HARBEN” Ward, as an abiding memorial of Mr. Harben's great services, and have selected one of the beds in this Ward as the bed to be endowed by his last gift.

The vacancy in the office of Treasurer caused by the death of Mr. Harben was filled by the election of Mr. Arthur R. Prideaux.

Lady Members of the Board.

At the meeting of the Board on 16th June, the following important Resolution, proposed after due notice by the late Mr. H. A. Harben, was carried: "That it is desirable that the Board of Management should consist partly of women." It was believed that in several branches of Hospital administration, notably Nursing and Domestic Management, ladies are specially qualified to take part; and although there was nothing in the laws of the Hospital, as they stood, to prevent the election of ladies as members of the Board, it was deemed expedient, as such election would be a new departure, to have the question specially considered, with the above result.

The Ladies' Association.

Once again the Board record their warm thanks to the Presidents, Vice-Presidents, Members and Associates of both branches of the Ladies' Association, who have continued their most helpful exertions for the benefit of the Hospital with undiminished energy and success during the past year.

The thanks of the Board are due not only for the very substantial direct benefits received from the Association, but also for the constant increase in the friends of the Hospital, which is a happy result of its operations.

The London Needlework Guild once more repeated, at Christmas, its welcome gift of a large parcel of warm clothing for the patients. The grateful thanks of the Board are given to the Guild for the continuance of this valuable help.

The Board again sincerely thank **The Flannel Shirt Club** for the supply of men's flannel shirts, kindly sent to the Hospital.

The Ladies of the Flower Mission have continued their efforts to cheer the patients in the wards by visiting and singing to them, and by contributing flowers to brighten the wards. This kindness the Board again gratefully acknowledge.

St. Mary's Soup Kitchen has continued during the year its useful work of supplying nourishing food to many of the Out-patients. It often happens that it is food rather than medicine that our Out-patients require, and the Kitchen therefore meets a very real want.

The Parkwood Convalescent Home.

The Board again record their grateful thanks for the beds continued to be placed at the disposal of the Hospital during the year at the Hospital Convalescent Home, Parkwood, Swanley. Two hundred and eighteen In-patients—128 men and 90 women—enjoyed the inestimable advantage of a stay in this admirable Convalescent Home, free of expense to the Hospital.

Out-Patients. Enquiry.

The work of the Lady Almoner, which consists not only of enquiries into the circumstances of applicants with the view of excluding those who ought not to receive free Hospital treatment,

but they are well sustained by medical treatment. It should also be proper objects of the charity for their treatment throughout the year.

In addition to these, Medical and Surgical Appliances were obtained for 405 patients. The Convalescent Fund of the Hospital assisted many to pay for these appliances, and the aid of the Hospital Sunday Fund was invoked in a still larger number of cases. Wherever the patient was in a position to contribute he was required to do so, £81 of a total cost of £217 being furnished by patients' payments.

The Medical School.

The general work of the School has been satisfactory, and a gratifying feature has been the high percentage of passes in the

Preliminary and Intermediate subjects at the Conjoint Board Examinations, the results in Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Anatomy and Physiology being much above the average.

At the University of London Mr. D. W. Daniels took the Gold Medal in Midwifery at the examination for the degree of Doctor of Medicine. Mr. E. T. H. Davies passed the examination for the degree of Master of Surgery, he being the only candidate of those competing who attained this distinction.

Five members of the School obtained the degree of Doctor of Medicine at the London University, and Mr. Senter, that of Doctor of Science.

In the final examination for the degree of M.B., B.S., five gentlemen were successful.

At the examinations for the Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons, three candidates passed the Primary, and three obtained the Diploma of F.R.C.S.

At the Conjoint Board of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, 13 candidates obtained the diplomas of M.R.C.S., and L.R.C.P., and at the Society of Apothecaries, three passed the qualifying examination.

The ever increasing work in the Anatomy Department, and the consequent demands upon the time of the teachers, have made it necessary to appoint a whole-time lecturer on Anatomy. The Committee have been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. J. Ernest Frazer, F.R.C.S., whose long experience in teaching Anatomy at St. George's and at King's College Medical Schools, should ensure that the present efficiency of this Department shall be successfully maintained.

The Lectureship in medicine is now held jointly by Dr. Luff, Dr. Wilfred Harris and Sir John Broadbent.

The new Athletic Clubs' Ground, purchased in 1909 jointly with Middlesex Hospital, was opened for football in October last. The ground is seven acres in extent, provides space for Cricket, Lawn Tennis, and Football, and possesses a fine and well equipped pavilion.

Chaplain.

The Board conclude their Report with the expression of their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their constant attention and kindness to the patients, and for their valuable services to the Hospital throughout the year.

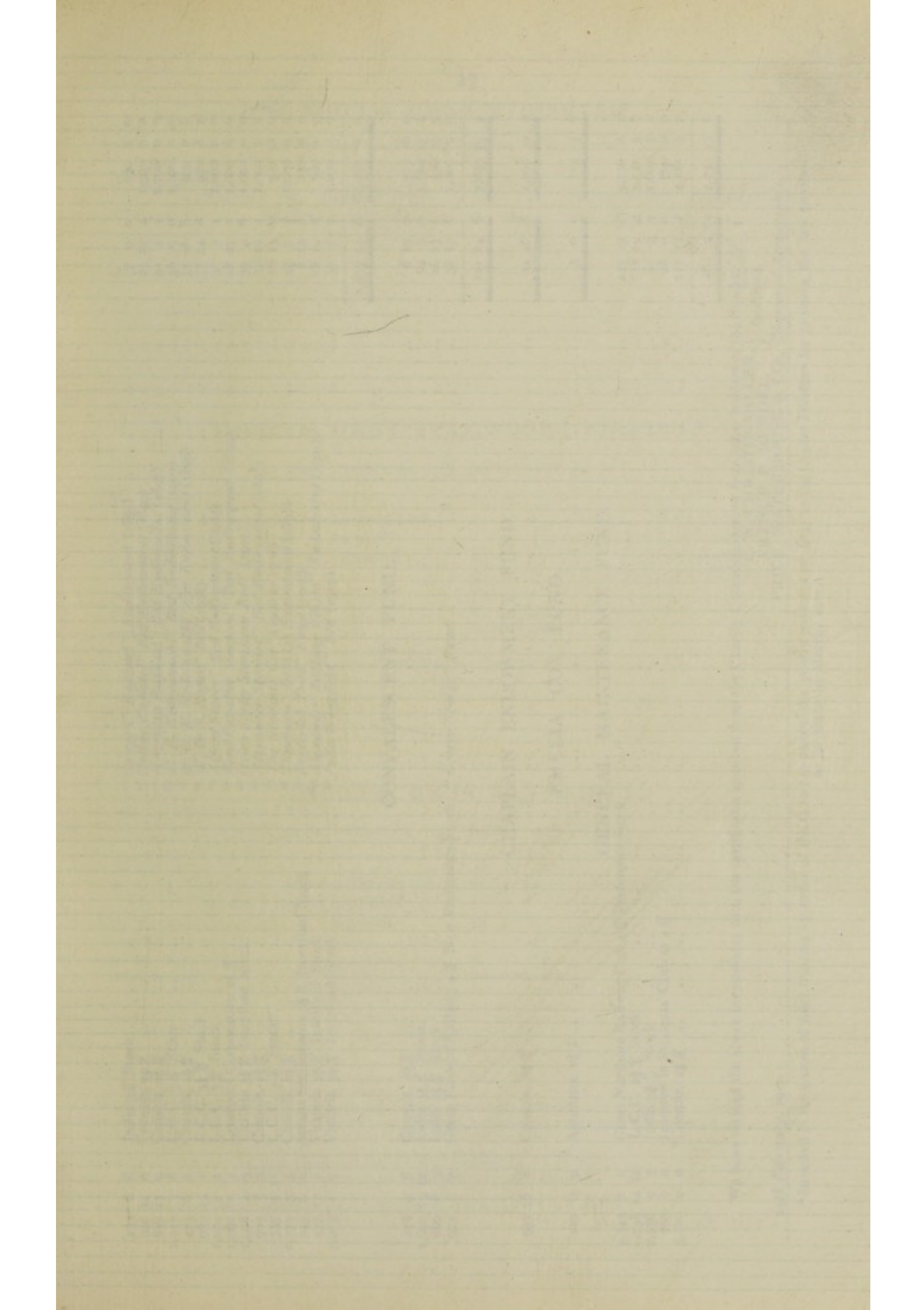

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of Government is by a Board of Management, meeting fortnightly, and consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers and Trustees, together with twenty-five Governors elected annually, of whom eight are Members of the Medical and Surgical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School; and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.

Governors have also the right to inspect the Hospital under regulations by the Board of Management, so that they do not exercise that right so as to inconvenience the Chaplain or any Minister of Religion, or the Medical or other officers, or the Patients.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by will are eligible to be elected Honorary Life Governors.

THE MATERNITY.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or *Donors* of Ten Guineas to the MATERNITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually to that department; and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Accidents and cases of *urgency* are admitted FREE at all times, on the approval of the Medical Officers.

Persons holding In-patients' letters and desiring admission, must present their letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (Sundays excepted). They will be admitted after examination by the Medical Superintendent, if suitable, and there is room.

Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that Governors and Subscribers sending Patients from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, will give notice to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, and send a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

When there is not room for all who apply for admission as In-patients, those whose cases are most pressing are accepted, and the others are deferred or prescribed for as Out-patients. Notice of this is sent to the Subscriber, who can then recommend another Patient.

The following cases are unsuitable for admission as In-patients—Confirmed Consumption, Infectious Diseases other than Typhoid Fever, Delirium Tremens, Itch, Incurable Diseases, Chronic Ulcerated Legs, more suitable for a Parish Infirmary, and those who are capable of receiving equal benefit as Out-patients. No person capable of paying for medical attendance is admissible. §

VISITING DAYS.—Adults: Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 5, and Sundays, from 3 to 4. Children under 15: Wednesdays, 4 to 5, Sundays, 3 to 4. Except for urgent reasons visitors cannot be admitted at other times. Children are not allowed to visit the Children's Wards without special permission.

Out-patients are attended DAILY (Sundays and Public Holidays excepted). They must present their letters at the Hospital at the following times:—

DEPARTMENT FOR NERVOUS DISEASES—Tuesdays and Fridays, at 9.15 a.m.

“ In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the General Funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall be paid to, or applied for, such In-Patients as may be necessitous, and within three months from their discharge from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having necessary nourishment, clothing, or change of air.”

THE HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES

CHAPTER I
THE EARLY HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Dresden Trustees have the honour to present their report for the twelve months ending 30th September, 1910, together with the accounts for the same period.

The objects to which the Trustees have continued to devote the funds at their disposal, and the number of Patients benefited under each head, are:—

1. Sending Patients to Convalescent Homes (including 205 sent to Parkwood)	372
2. Giving pecuniary assistance to Patients on discharge ...	135
3. Clothing indigent Patients on discharge	16
4. Providing Surgical and Optical appliances for Patients needing them on discharge	85
5. Paying fares of Patients to and from Convalescent Homes	280
6. Paying fares of Patients to their own homes on discharge from the Hospital	483

Special care has been taken to ascertain that Patients are really needy and deserving before assisting them, particularly in Class 2. Thorough enquiry into their means and deserts has been made in every case.

During the year the Trustees of the Hospital Convalescent Home, Parkwood, Swanley, Kent, have continued to place 15 beds at the disposal of the Hospital. The Trustees of the Dresden Fund have therefore been enabled to send 205 Patients to this Home for a period of 19 days or more, at no expense to the Fund except the fares of the Patients. The Trustees gladly take this opportunity to repeat their thanks to the authorities of the Hospital Convalescent Home for the great benefit which the use of these 15 beds has enabled the Trustees to confer on so many Patients of the Hospital.

During the year the Trustees have received a further sum of Stock, valued at £11,759 2s. 6d., being a one-fifth share of the investments divisible, under the Will of the late Mr. Edmond Dresden, on the death of Miss Mathilde Dresden.

This addition increases the Capital of the Dresden Fund to £39,056.

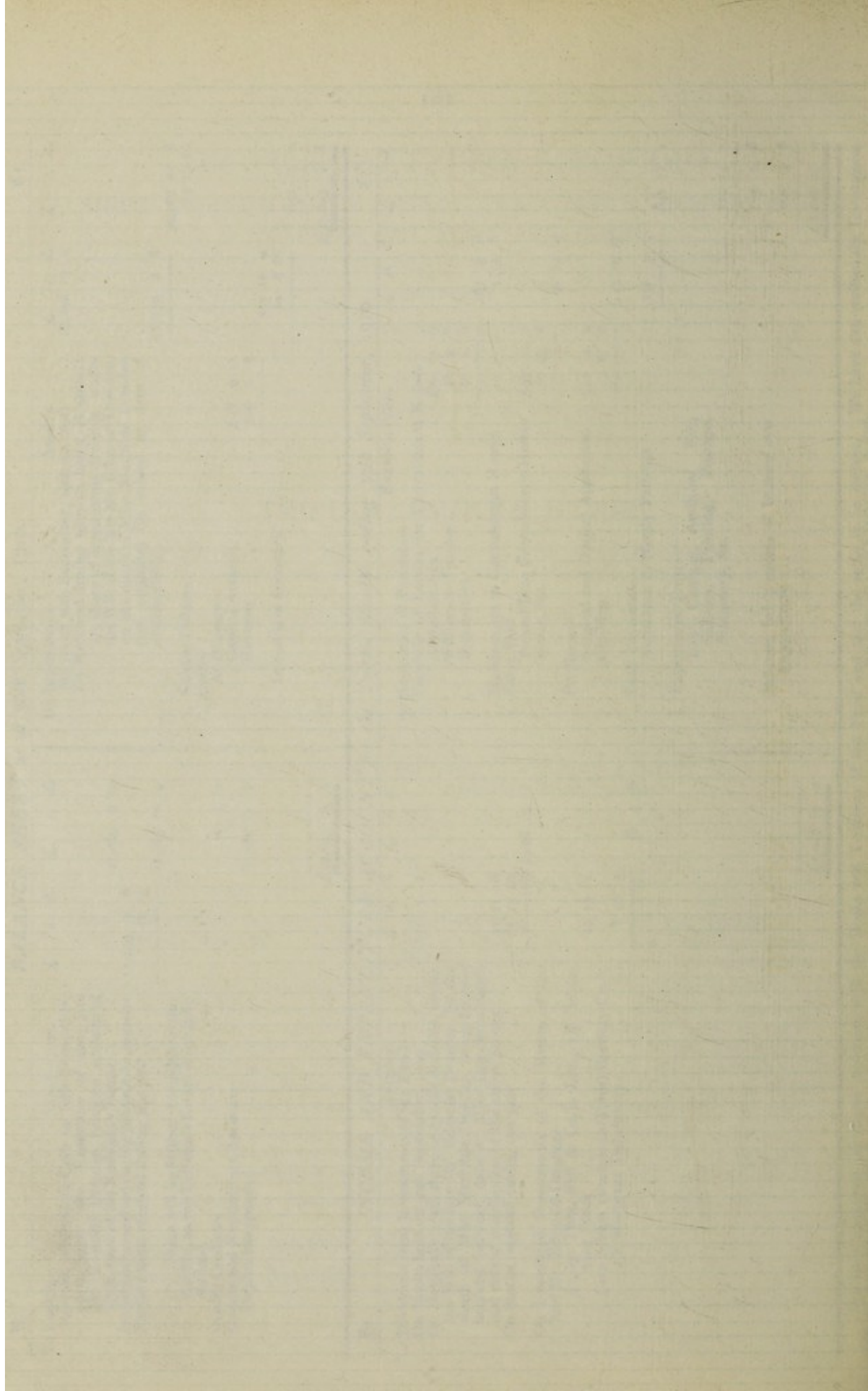
